

## PLEAT'S PERSPECTIVE


### WE NEED A COUPLE OF PLAYERS AND TOTAL COMMITMENT

**WELCOME** to all supporters, players and officials of newly-promoted Burnley. They have found their first couple of games difficult, but I'm sure once they find their feet they will be strong opponents for anyone in what is a very even league.

So far, apart from Middlesbrough, most teams' results have been erratic, which gives one the impression that an unfancied side could steal through the pack.

We showed enough determination and resilience last week to be quite optimistic about the immediate future.

I believe at this moment we need a couple of players in important positions. In the summer Ceri Hughes decided that he didn't

wish to be part of Luton's future and we are not going to stand in the way of a player whose head isn't on the same level as the others.

With our young staff this season we need total commitment. We will have to replace Ceri who has played on the left-hand side of our five-man midfield quite successfully.

I was delighted last Saturday with the efforts of our group at Port Vale, particularly in view of John Hartson's achilles niggle and the stomach bug suffered by Julian James. With the absence of Linton, Adcock and Harvey it placed a little strain on our resources.

Burnley today could well be playing Alan Harper who did a good job for us in the 'holding' position in midfield last season. His experience was invaluable. His departure to Burnley, who gave him more permanent terms and a happier geographical situation, was disappointing but inevitable.

I am quite sure that Aaron Skelton will be able in time to command a first team spot. Last Saturday he had a poor first half at Port Vale on a very wide, big pitch, but showed his character in the second as he came through with flying colours.

It is not easy for youngsters to learn in the fierce environment of the Endsleigh League. David Greene and John Hartson are also very young. So we are looking for another body who can not only do a job in midfield but give a rest to the younger element.

The last two named players were both called up for international duty last week, John Hartson missing out with injury, but David Greene travelling to Latvia.

Prior to the Port Vale game we had experienced a difficult week and it was with some concern with the amount of games

played recently that I finally allowed David Greene to travel.

After the late goal that robbed us of two points against Southend we had further disappointment at Tranmere when we succumbed to an excellent few minutes attacking by a very talented Tranmere team. We have to hope that John Aldridge is suspended or injured when Tranmere come to Luton!

In view of this setback and the reserves disappointing display at Charlton, after two excellent results, I was delighted with the youth team's response at Coventry. Here was a first class team performance, where all the boys played for each other and they were a credit to their coach.

With injuries and stomach bugs Port Vale was always going to be difficult, but everyone acted responsibly and I was pleased for Jamie Woodsford that he was able to enjoy the bus trip home after his first away

outing. We have not travelled well in the last two or three seasons, and that is to do not only with ability but with application and character. This afternoon we expect an attractive game. Burnley have several talented and experienced players and we will have to be at our best to gain the points. Next Tuesday I hope that our supporters who have come today will have seen enough to encourage them to return and bring that vital friend.

Once again I cannot over estimate the importance of helping the club commercially. Our supporters that come are appreciated but we need more. We were all delighted with the gain in the rain last Saturday, and warmed to the tremendous effect several hundred supporters can give us when we are away from home.

Enjoy the game.



AFTER the disappointments of Southend and Tranmere it was a relief to get our first three-pointer at Port Vale.

We looked more than capable of taking three points against Southend in the first-half, but had only one goal to show for our efforts, and it was especially disappointing to concede the first equaliser from a set-piece.

Again we looked sound in the first-half at Tranmere, but John Aldridge then enjoyed a real purple patch and although we hit back there was too much ground to make up.

But there are plenty of positive points to come out of those games, notably the return of John Hartson and the reliable form of Julian James and Marvin Johnson.

Julian, Marvin and Mitchell Thomas were certainly kept busy at Port Vale, along with David Greene and myself, where we had to survive an anxious last 15 minutes after Dwight Marshall's fine header.

But while Port Vale might have felt hard done by in

seeing two efforts hit the woodwork, and another two cleared off the line, it should be remembered that these things even out over a season.

After all, it was only a few weeks ago that we were bemoaning our luck against West Brom and Fulham.

We need to start taking advantage of some battling displays away, with victories here at Kenilworth Road.

But Burnley will be tough opponents today. We haven't played the Clarets in recent seasons, but know plenty about one of their players! Alan Harper was a very important player for us last season, and has proved hard to replace.

There is though plenty of competition for places here, and the manager showed last week that he is prepared to bring players straight from the youth team into the first-team squad. That will serve as a reminder to the established players, and an incentive to the youngsters.

## ON THE OTHER SIDE

### CLARETS CLIMBING BACK TO THE TOP FLIGHT

FOUNDER members of the Football League, Burnley FC actually started life as a rugby club. Burnley Rovers switched codes and became Burnley FC in 1882 and moved to their Turf Moor home, at the invitation of the Town's cricket club, shortly afterwards.

FA Cup campaigns gave way to organised football in 1888 with the foundation of the Football League, and since then Burnley have claimed every major honour with the exception of the League Cup.

The first honour was a Second Division title in 1897-98 and the club's improved fortunes were reflected in an FA Cup triumph in 1914 - the 1-0 win against Liverpool coming just months before the outbreak of the Great War.

After that conflict, the Clarets continued to make their mark on the domestic game and in the 1920-21 season they enjoyed a 30-match unbeaten run, a record which still stands to this day, on their way to a first-ever First Division title, having been runners-up the previous season.

They were FA Cup runners-up to Charlton in the first season of organised football after World War Two, and there followed the most exciting 24 seasons in the club's history.

After several near misses the First Division title again came Burnley's way on the very last day of the 1959-60 season and two seasons later the Turf Moor club claimed the double nobody wants - runners-up to Ipswich in the league and Tottenham in the FA Cup Final.

The 1960's also saw two European campaigns, but that exciting decade ended with Burnley starting to struggle and they were eventually relegated in 1970-71.

Two seasons later they were back in the highest echelon after winning the Second Division title, but only three seasons were to follow in the top flight and four seasons on from there Burnley were relegated to the Third Division for the first time in their history.


1981-82 saw the Clarets win that division, but they found life in the Second Division tough and were relegated again straight away despite reaching the semi-finals of the League Cup and quarter-finals of the FA Cup.

Two seasons later the unbelievable happened and Burnley found themselves in the basement division - just 10 years after their last game in the top flight.

Their second season in the Fourth Division saw the introduction of automatic relegation to the Vauxhall Conference and Burnley had to win their last game of the season to avoid the drop.

They beat Leyton Orient 2-1 to send Lincoln down, and spark a revival which saw them win the Fourth Division title in 1991-92 and claim promotion from the new Second Division with a 2-1 win over Stockport at Wembley in May.


Left: Burnley's league form last term





## VISITORS ON PARADE

ANDREW BANNISTER - strong, pacy attacker who scored more than 20 goals last season.

MARLON BERESFORD - talented young goalkeeper, 24, who joined Burnley from Sheffield Wednesday in September 1992 for just under £100,000.

STEVE DAVIS - central defender who signed from Southampton for £60,000 at the start of the 91/92 season. Has since proved an influential figure in promotion winning sides, and can provide goals from set-pieces.

JOHN DEARY - the midfielder is now in his sixth season at Turf Moor, and has been almost an ever-present at the heart of the midfield since joining the club for £30,000 from Blackpool.

DAVID EYRES - a striker who bagged 27 goals in all competitions last term, including the equaliser in the Wembley play-off final against Stockport. The Liverpudlian joined Blackpool in 1989, before following manager Jimmy Mullen to Burnley.

ANDY FARRELL - the 27-year-old has played over 200 games for Burnley, and in the play-off final he became the first ever Burnley player to represent the club twice at Wembley.

JOHN FRANCIS - likely to miss the start of the season through injury, following a successful return to the club from Cambridge.

ALAN HARPER - needs no introduction to Luton fans following his influential role last season for the Hatters. Alan won a variety of honours with Everton in the 80s, before going on to Manchester City and Sheffield Wednesday.

ADRIAN HEATH - an Everton team-mate of Harper's, who scored 23 goals for Burnley in his first season at Turf Moor. He hit double figures again last term.

WARREN JOYCE - the midfielder signed from Plymouth for £150,000 in the summer of 1993, and scored twice on his Burnley debut. His father Walter played for the Clarets in the 1960s.

TED McMINN - winger who has enjoyed spells at Queen of the South, Glasgow Rangers, Derby and Birmingham. Joined Burnley for £70,000 from St Andrews.

GARY PARKINSON - the fullback signed in January for £80,000 from Bolton. He made over 200 appearances for Middlesbrough before following Bruce Rioch to Burnden Park.

JOHN PENDER - central defender who led Burnley to the fourth division title.

TONY PHILLISKIRK - much-travelled striker who signed from Peterborough for £80,000 in January.

LIAM ROBINSON - striker who became Burnley's record buy when he joined for £250,000 from Bristol City in July.

CHRIS VINNICOMBE - fullback who spent five years at Glasgow Rangers after being snapped up as a teenager from Exeter. Joined Burnley in June for £200,000.

PAUL WILSON - attacking fullback who joined the Clarets for £90,000 in February.


MARK WINSTANLEY - central defender who signed from Bolton in the summer, after 10 years with the Wanderers.







DWIGHT Marshall is already repaying the £150,000 Luton Town invested in him during the summer, with some impressive displays and vital goals in the first month of the season.

And the Jamaican-born striker has had to show some real strength of character as he bids to win a permanent starting place in the first team.

It's never easy to settle at a new club, with competition for the forward places from the likes of Kerry Dixon, John Hartson and Scott Oakes, and with Tony Adcock soon set to figure.

And Dwight also had to cope with the agony of a penalty shoot-out miss that saw the Hatters lose at Fulham.

But he bagged a vital first league goal at Port Vale on Saturday to secure a first

win of the season for David Pleat's side.

"I was obviously very pleased to get my first league goal, and let's hope it will be the first of many," said Dwight.

"Kerry Dixon and David Preece did well to create the opening, and as the ball came over I got to the near post, got the header in, and in it went.

"I am pleased for the whole side, because Port Vale had a good home record and we battled well



to hand onto that lead.

"We had drawn our other games and lost to Tranmere, but there was no real feeling of pressure building up.

"You have to think positive, it's early days and the three points away from home gives us a good boost for the home games against Burnley and Bolton.

The former Plymouth favourite had opened his Luton account to level the scores at Fulham, but then saw Jim Stannard save his penalty in the sudden death shoot-out.

"I scored at Fulham but then we went out on penalties," said Dwight.

"But as I said you have to think positive, that's in the past, and while I'm in and out of the side at the moment because there's a good squad here, I will have to be patient and take my chance when it comes."





# Birchenall sparkles in home debut as Hatters stop the rot

WE were in trouble. David Pleat's first full season in charge at Kenilworth Road had seen many traumas and by April 1979 we seemed to be tumbling down on a collision course with relegation to Division Three.

The sad thing was that it had all started so brightly with early home wins of 6-1, 7-1 and 6-0 being recorded over Oldham, Cardiff and Notts County respectively and the new look squad, which included seven players making their debut for Luton, gelling into a potent attacking force.

The trouble started just before Christmas when Lil Fuccillo had his leg badly broken at Brighton, and this followed two straight home defeats. Pre-season signing from Peterborough Chris Turner was keen to

return to the USA, and David Moss was suffering from a deep seated pelvic injury and was not firing on all cylinders.

By the time of the visit of Burnley to Kenilworth Road on April 7, the situation was beginning to look desperate as only two wins had been recorded since the beginning of February and the previous four games had all ended in defeat, including a 3-0 hammering at fellow strugglers Leicester.

Burnley were in a safe mid-table position and had beaten the Town a fortnight earlier at Turf Moor, and were looking to add to a six-game unbeaten run.

It was a new look Luton side that ran out to be greeted by a Kenilworth Road crowd of 6,466 as home debuts were given to Alan Birchenall, signed on loan from Blackburn, and Forbes Phillipson-Masters

(imagine that on the back of a shirt), on loan from Southampton as a replacement for Turner who had returned to the States. David Moss also made a welcome return after eight games out.

Inspired by Birchenall, who was turning out for his eighth league club, we got off to a flying start and scored twice in the first seven minutes. Bob Hatton got on the end of a through ball from fullback Kirk Stephens and hammered the ball home, and shortly afterwards Brian Stein was on the receiving end of a superb pass from Ricky Hill to put the Town two-up.

The Town continued to have more of the play until Burnley forced themselves back into contention on the hour when Birchenall was harshly adjudged to have pulled down Paul Fletcher in the box, and Peter Noble scored with ease from the spot.

The game then hinged on a disputed goal six minutes later. The Burnley players felt that Stein had handled the ball when he passed to Hatton who converted the chance, and Steve Kindon was booked for pressing home the argument.

The goal finished Burnley off and substitute Steve Taylor, who was later to give sterling service to the Clarets, netted the fourth goal with two minutes to go and set us up for the final games - which saw the dreaded drop avoided, albeit narrowly.
