

We've certainly played better than that this season and not won, so maybe there's a moral there somewhere about not playing to the best of our ability if we want to win. We did score two quality goals though. Jon Goodman's was a quality finish, waiting for the keeper to go down before dinking it over him and Mark Kennedy's was a blistering shot.

I've no argument about the two goalkeeping incidents. Tony Norman was rightly booked for bringing Dave Mitchell down where he did because it couldn't really be construed as a goal scoring opportunity. Kasey I'm afraid had to go off for handling the ball outside the box when Phil Gray was through on goal as the laws stand. Perhaps the ridiculous thing is that Norman really clattered into Dave Mitchell whilst all Kasey did was catch the ball and gets sent off for serious foul play which must be a nonsense. Perhaps this needs to be looked at again by the game's authorities.

It looks like Kasey will probably miss the Bristol City game now, but I'm not unduly worried from the point of view that in Tim Carter we have a more than able deputy for Kasey. When I had to bring Tim on against Sunderland, some people were evidently surprised that I took Mark Kennedy off, but at 2-1 up with ten men and seven minutes left it was a question of sacrificing a player who had no defensive duties, and the one man in the side that applies to is Mark. He'd been playing well, had scored a great goal but it was simply a question of making sure we won the game, and Mark for one understood that.

Back to the League today, and with three away games coming up, two in the First Division, it's vital that we pick up another win against Luton. Their away form's not bad and if I remember rightly they got a draw here last season in a game that included some more comic cuts goals, so I'll settle for another 2-1 result. They'll play football and give us a hard game, but we've got to feel that we're capable of beating Luton at our place. Andy May and Rhino are not quite ready yet so we'll probably have an unchanged side and I'm happy enough with that.

DON't be surprised if midfielder Steve Forbes forces his way into the first team reckoning before too long.



On the Ball

Dawsey sees the light at the end of the tunnel



"I think my injury first occurred after about ten games last season. There's a bone that runs parallel to the cartilage which has a tendency to flake and that's been the problem basically. I had an operation which we thought would clear it up but it was painful to run afterwards and so I went back and had another one. I was then able to come back for a period of time, but obviously the wear and tear of playing two games a week took its toll. It flared up again and I missed the last few games of the season.

"I had a third operation in the summer, and we're hopeful that the problem has been sorted out once and for all, but I can tell you this has been the most frustrating year of my career. I find it very difficult to watch games, and there have been times when my head's gone a bit and I've phoned Pete Melville and said 'I just can't face coming in today'.

"Thankfully, I'm now back in full training again, but after all this time I'm not rushing back because the last thing I want is the knee to go again because I am in too big a hurry to play again. The real test will be when I have to twist, turn and tackle in a game situation, but as you know I don't tackle anyway if I can help it.

I'm training with Ian McDonald and the Reserves now, but I've also done some with the Youths which I've really enjoyed and it's made me think about whether I might like to do a bit of coaching with youngsters when I finish playing. To be honest, it's not something I'd really considered before, so who knows, in the long term perhaps some good will come out of my injury lay-off.

I've also spent a bit of time in my flower shop, which has helped to take my mind off things a little. It's called ASTORS and it's in Old Lodge Lane, Purley. If I'm in the shop when any Millwall fans come in I'll do them a discount. I'm not ready to work there full-time yet though, I'm looking forward to playing again before too long."

Welcome LUTON YOUNGSTERS OUT TO FULFILL POTENTIAL

LUTON's appearance at Wembley in last season's FA Cup semi-final highlighted the enormous potential of David Pleat's squad. Luton dumped Premiership Newcastle and West Ham out of the competition before eventually being beaten 2-0 by Chelsea at Wembley. Unfortunately converting his youngsters' potential into consistent, week-in-week-out League performances has proved something of a problem for Pleat, one of the First Division's most experienced and respected managers. Despite their FA Cup heroics they escaped relegation by the skin of their teeth last season, and until last Saturday the new campaign had provided their fans with little to cheer about. Luton finally put that right at Watford when they fought back from behind to win 4-2, and they'll be looking to maintain that sort of form against us this afternoon.

Away day double

LUTON's impressive 4-2 victory at Watford last weekend must have surprised even their most fervent supporters. The Hatters away form during the last couple of seasons has meant plenty of long, unrewarding journeys for Luton's travelling fans.

During the 1993-94 campaign they won away from home just twice, and only Peterborough who finished rock bottom had a worse record on their travels.

Those away wins came at Oxford and Notts County, but it's worth noting that 10 of Luton's 14 away defeats last season were by a single goal so they certainly weren't a pushover away from Kenilworth Road.

That win at Watford last weekend will have done their confidence a power of good, and they'll be looking to pull off a very rare away win double this afternoon.

ODDS ON A DRAW?

David Pleat

DAVID Pleat must have experienced just about every emotion possible last season as his side pieced together a thrilling FA Cup run and struggled to preserve their First Division status.

With no cash available for new signings, Pleat was forced to rely on the club's crop of talented, but inexperienced and inconsistent youngsters. Luton could hardly have had a better man in charge of such a side and Pleat used all his football know how and powers of inspiration to eventually steer Luton clear of the relegation zone.

Now the experienced Luton boss - in his second spell at Kenilworth Road - is hoping that his side can put a disappointing start to the season behind them and establish themselves as promotion play-off candidates.

After an eight year spell at Luton between 1978-1986, Pleat left to take charge at Spurs and led them to an FA Cup triumph before making way for Terry Venables.

He resurfaced for a season at Leicester, before Luton offered him the chance to return to Kenilworth Road.



RICH VEIN OF TALENT

SCOTT Oakes hit the headlines in spectacular fashion last season when he scored a hat-trick during Luton's 3-0 FA Cup quarter-final victory over West Ham.

Great Scott and Hearts of Oakes screamed the following morning's papers, and the 22-year-old striker started to attract admiring glances from a handful of Premiership clubs.

Despite speculation that one of them would come in for him during the summer, Oakes has just signed a new two-year contract and Luton boss David Pleat has made it clear he's in no rush to lose any of his top youngsters.

Oakes, who has already been capped by England at Under-21 level, was recruited by Pleat from his former club Leicester in a player exchange deal which took midfielder Steve Thompson to Filbert Street.

It looks an increasingly astute bit of business.

Pleat's rich crop of promising youngsters includes John Harton, a prolific scorer for Luton's reserve and youth teams, who stepped up to senior level last season and scored on his full debut against Nottingham Forest.

He has represented Wales at youth and Under-21 level, and weighed in with seven goals last season as Luton clung on the their First Division status.

During the summer Pleat increased his attacking options by signing Dwight Marshall from Plymouth for £150,000.

The 28-year-old striker scored 14 goals for Peter Shilton's side last season as Plymouth narrowly missed out on promotion, and Marshall's form during the last few weeks has delighted Pleat.

Pleat can also call on the vast experience of former Chelsea star Kerry Dixon who proved that he still knows where the goal is by scoring during that 4-2 win over Watford.

Dixon joined Luton in October last year after a five month loan spell and rewarded Pleat's faith in him with 10 goals.

Millwall will also have to keep an eye out for Paul Telfer, an attacking midfielder who likes to get his name on the scoresheet.

Telfer was also on target during Luton's win over Watford and the Scottish Under-21 international is looking to improve on last season's eight goal haul.


Diminutive midfielder David Preece is another one of those players who always seems to have good games against the Lions.

A bargain £150,000 signing from Walsall in 1984, he has now played in two League Cup finals for the Hatters and has won three England B caps.

At the back, Luton are marshalled by Trevor Peake, who won an FA Cup medal during his time with Coventry, before moving to Kenilworth Road for £100,000 in August 1991.

Peake's performances last season earned him the club's Player of The Year award.

Like Oakes, Des Linton was part of the exchange deal which took Thompson to Leicester, and he's developed into an exciting prospect under Pleat's guidance establishing himself as Luton's regular right-back.

MILLWALL fans could be forgiven for letting their heads rule their hearts and putting down today's game as a score draw. Three of our last four meetings have ended in draws and the fourth was heading that way until a late goal by Jamie Moralee earned us the points. Greg Berry's first goal in a Lions shirt rescued a point for us at the New Den last season after Luton had hit back to lead after falling behind to Moralee's opener. The two sides' most recent meeting was at Kenilworth Road at the end of April when both sides were desperate for points - Millwall to clinch a play-off place and Luton to avoid relegation. Predictably the result was a stalemate, John Kerr earning us a share of the spoils with a cracking late strike.

Star VISITOR

FRIENDLY RIVALS

LUTON keeper Juergen Sommer and Lions ace Kasey Keller will renew their friendly rivalry at The Den this afternoon.

Juergen edged Kasey out of the reckoning for a place in the United States World Cup squad at the end of last season, and played for them against England at Wembley recently.

But despite the heartbreak of missing out on USA 94, Kasey is quick to stress that he and Juergen are still good mates.


"I've known him for quite a while," explained the Lions star. "We talk on the phone pretty regularly and he gave me plenty of good advice and encouragement when I came over here."

"Missing out on the World Cup was real disappointing. I was very down for a while because to take part in the World Cup in my own country had been a dream of mine."

"But there was never any question of me falling out with Juergen over it. It was the selectors' decision."

Juergen had to be content with a place on the substitutes bench during the World Cup, but he was called up to the side as substitute for that clash with England at Wembley and was one of the few American players to distinguish himself during his sides 2-0 defeat.

He joined Luton in 1991 and had to wait two years for his debut, but like Kasey, he is now firmly established as their first choice keeper.


Old Gold

The programme for this Second Division match measured 8 1/2" x 5 1/4" and had a light blue cover featuring unidentifiable players in action. It cost 1/- (5p). Included in addition to the programme itself was the 20 page 'Football League Review' on general football topics, but which on the week in question featured Millwall in its 'Groundcall' slot and contained a picture of The Den taken from a corner flag at the Cold Blow Lane end, and also a picture of the main entrance. The Review



also had a picture of the late comedian Eric Morcombe, a Luton director of course, making off with manager Alec Stock's gallon bottle of whisky he had received as Second Division Manager of the Month.

The programme itself featured the half-time scoreboard on page 2, and the matchball donor, Mr Harry Hill of the supporters club. Benny Fenton's notes were on page three along with a player portrait of Billy Holmes.

The Lions shop were selling T-shirts for 40p and ties for 75p (page 5), and a full page map for the trip to Blackburn was on page 7. Action photos from the

recent Charlton game were on page eight, featuring Barry Kitchener, and Dougie Alder followed by Luton pen pics on two pages. Their 'star player' was Malcolm MacDonald who had scored 25 goals in 47 games since converting from full-back to centre-forward.

Page 15 featured a list of match ball donors, including one John Monks of programme printers Ward and Woolverton. John, now with another company, Sports and Leisure Print, still produces our programme today. Isn't it about time he sponsored another matchball I hear you ask?

On a sad personal note, page six 'Colts News' featured write ups of matches against West Ham and Chelsea in which a couple of my old classmates, Alan Ballard and Andy Bushell played. Both are sadly now dead but their families are still regular fans at The New Den.

The back page featured the teams, and in the Luton line-up that day were Peter Anderson and Alan Slough, both well known to Millwall supporters of course.

The game itself was watched by a crowd of 13,842 who saw The Lions beat promotion candidates Luton 4-0 with goals from Possee (2), Bridges and B. Brown. We finished the season in eighth place.



SCENE ONE

WOLVES BEGIN TO BITE

The last couple of League fixtures have resulted in a modest reshuffle at the top of the table. Big spenders and pre-season favourites Wolves have taken over the leading spot. Last Saturday they took three points from their visit to Turf Moor, thanks to a goal by local hero Steve Bull on the hour. For all the money spent on the side, Wolves are not as effective without Bull, who cost a modest £35,000. His goal ended Burnley's winning sequence and left the locals frustrated. Promotion was won by the Clarets last year on the back of a superb home record, 17 wins and four draws, but so far in 1994-95, they have failed to win at the Turf in four starts. Days earlier, Wolves had shown their class by crushing Southend 5-0 at Molineux, making it four home wins out of four, and ten goals without reply.

It was a first defeat of the season for Middlesbrough that let Wolves leapfrog to the top. Despite taking the lead just before the interval through Jamie Pollock, Boro went down 1-2 to an impressive Port Vale side, for which Naylor and Glover scored. Robson's men have struggled to find the momentum of their opening games. They had to come back from a two goal deficit to retrieve a home point against Sunderland and then only a penalty ten seconds from time won them the game at Ayresome against bottom of the table West Brom in midweek.

Any hopes Swindon had of joining Wolves and Boro on 17 points died after 13 minutes at the Valley when David Whyte scored his sixth goal of the season for Charlton. This proved to be the only goal of the game. It was a single goal, by the inevitable Fjortoft, that separated Swindon from near-neighbours Reading in midweek, although the gap in skill was apparently much wider. Reading bounced straight back, however, Jimmy Quinn's goal on the hour enough to see off Sheffield United and keep his side in third place.

THE 0 SIDES

There is just one club left without a win and one still unbeaten. At the bottom are West Brom, who beat the drop last season only on the final day. They have yet to win this year, but in fairness, they have played two games less than the rest of the division, and only one of the six fixtures has been at home. This came last weekend when Grimsby were the visitors. Albion took a first-half lead through Lee Ashcroft, but the Mariners equalised through Craig Shakespeare. This disappointment followed hard on the unlucky 1-2 defeat at Middlesbrough, and Albion, who have only been beaten twice, are probably not as bad a team as the table implies.


The last unbeaten side in the division is Sunderland. By defeating Barnsley 2-0 at Roker last Saturday, the Weariders stretched their unbeaten run to 11 games (three last season), and once again, the reliable Don Goodman and Phil Gray were on the mark. That Sunderland are not higher than ninth is down to the fact that whilst they are unbeaten, they have only won twice, having drawn six times.

ANOTHER ONE BITES THE DUST

Last season, Notts County surprised many people by finishing just one place outside the play-offs. This reflected well on Mick Walker in his first full season as manager. Any credit he had built up quickly disappeared, when, after only seven games this season (of which four were lost), he and the club parted company. Walker's assistant, Russell Slade (a former schoolteacher who never played League football) took over, and ironically, his first game in charge was at home to Stoke, who had dispensed with their manager (Joe Jordan) the previous week. For Stoke's acting manager, Asa Hartford, it is three wins out of three. He followed a debut win over Southend with a victory against Charlton in midweek. Last Saturday two Peschisolido goals beat County, earned Stoke their first away win of the season and lifted them up to sixth.


ODDS AND ENDS

A new name appeared on the Southend scoresheet last weekend. Former Liverpool skipper Ronnie Whelan scored the goal which proved to be the winner at home to Bristol City. According to press reports, one of Whelan's Anfield team-mates, Steve Nicol, is wanted by Oldham, whose bright start has faded somewhat. In the 0-2 home defeat by Watford, they had goalkeeper Gerrard sent off for the second time in three matches, which was followed by a 1-2 defeat at improving Derby. Finally, Watford's mini-revival ended in a local derby with Luton, who put two defeats behind them. At Vicarage Road, the Hatters beat the Hornets 4-2.

Gavin Maguire got his marching orders at Wolves, Alex Rae saw red at Charlton, keeper Carl Emberson went at Crystal Palace in the Anglo-Italian Cup and Keith Stevens during our 0-0 draw with Derby.

Those four red cards in Millwall's first nine games contributed to the Lions' poor start, and Andy May joined the red card club in January when he was sent off at West Brom for two bookable offences.

Things went from bad to worse during our stormy 0-0 draw with Leicester in March when Terry Hurlock and Pat Van Den Hauwe were both ordered off.


It meant that Millwall's disciplinary record made pretty grim reading, but the Lions have certainly put that right during the first few weeks of the current campaign.

At the risk of tempting fate, the Lions have only picked up a couple of bookings during the first few weeks of the season despite the much talked about; 'clampdown' by referees.

Naturally we do not want to see an influx of players from other countries just because they are cheaper to buy than those from our own shores, but most fans enjoy seeing at close quarters the skills that the better of the foreign players bring to our game.

Surely this would help improve the skills of young players here as they rub shoulders with the Klinnsmans of this world and also bring out the best of established players.

We have seen that imported players have not had an adverse effect on other national sides, in fact British players who have gone abroad to ply their trade have improved themselves by playing alongside the best in the World.

As previously mentioned it would be easy to buy abroad purely because of cost and the football authorities must not allow players below a certain standard to flood into our game. However, if he has been good enough to represent his country at any level, this must show that the player concerned must at least have some skill and club managers should be able to judge whether someone is capable of improving his squad.

If necessary limit the number of foreign players at any one time from playing in a match as in European games but don't stop them coming here altogether.

SCHOOLBOYS SEASON UNDERWAY



on past Millwall
'Keepers**

JOHN SUTCLIFFE took over from TINY JOYCE for season 1902-03 and stayed for one term with MILLWALL.

He was born in Shibden (York) in 1868 and started his sporting career by playing rugby at school in Bradford.

In 1889 BOLTON WANDERERS talked him into playing soccer. His first position in the game was at centre-forward, before taking up goalkeeping.

SUTCLIFFE went on to make over 350 appearances for the Lancashire side during his thirteen year stay.

Whilst with the 'Trotters', he gained four England international caps, and also represented the Football League.

In 1902 he surprisingly joined MILLWALL, making his Southern League debut at SWINDON TOWN on September 6th 1902.

He played in all but two of the thirty League matches.

He also featured in seven London League matches and twelve Western League, and was ever present in MILLWALL's successful FA Cup run.

MILLWALL reached the semi-final of the competition. Unfortunately SUTCLIFFE had a poor game by his standards and MILLWALL lost 0-3 at Villa Park against DERBY COUNTY. A fifth England cap was gained whilst playing for the docklands side.

In May 1903 SUTCLIFFE returned north to MANCHESTER UNITED for one season. PLYMOUTH was his next stop, where he stayed eight seasons.

He died in Bradford in July 1947.

Deputising for the absence of SUTCLIFFE was CHARLES JAMES AMBLER, who was also born in 1868, at Alverstone and had spells at WOOLWICH ARSENAL, SPURS, GRAVESEND and WEST HAM before signing for MILLWALL in September 1902. He

made his debut in the home game against SWINDON TOWN on December 20th 1902. Credited with nine appearances, not retained and moved on to CLAPTON at the end of the season.

JOYCE returned to MILLWALL, but the club kicked-off the new season (1903-04) with HAROLD GEORGE DUGGAN in goal.

Prior to coming to the Isle of Dogs, DUGGAN had been with CHATHAM.

He spent a total of nine seasons at MILLWALL, but was limited to just seventeen League outings due to the excellent form of JOYCE, then CARMICHAEL and SHAW.

DUGGAN made his debut on September 5th 1903 at North Greenwich against WEST HAM.

JOHN WILLIAM ROBINSON: 5'10", 13st5lbs.

Born Derby 1870.

A much travelled player throughout his career. Previously with DERBY MIDLAND, LINCOLN CITY, DERBY COUNTY, NEW BRIGHTON TOWER, SOUTH-AMPTON, PLYMOUTH, MILLWALL ATHLETIC (three League games), GREEN WAVES (Plymouth), EXETER and STOKE.

He made his debut for MILLWALL versus NORWICH CITY November 25th 1905. Died 1931.






