PLEAT'S PERSPECTIVE

IT IS VITAL THAT WE BETTER OUR HOME TALLY

A WARM welcome to this afternoon's visitors from Yorkshire. We welcome their supporters, directors and players, and a particularly affectionate 'hello' to Danny Wilson who served this club well and must be looking forward to a sound first season in club management.

Barnsley will present a real test for us today. They have not conceded a goal for three league games, and took Newcastle to two very tight Coca-Cola Cup games. They play football, and will be looking to derail our present momentum.

Once again it was a smiling party that returned from an away game last Saturday. Maybe we are now beginning to gain that self-belief that one needs when travelling to either intimidating grounds or good teams away from home.

We set the standard in the resilient early games, and our attacking play has been precise and accurate. It is bound to be difficult to maintain the per-

centage success rate so far achieved whilst travelling, and what is going to be vital is to better the home tally.

For the first time for many months we have a shade of a cushion to enable us to take the strain a little easier.

Every game is tough, and as our regular supporters would know, in recent seasons Barnsley, and our next visitors Grimsby, have managed to take points away from us.

Last Saturday we had one or two injury scares, but in the end John Hartson, who showed his potential in the previous week's game with Middlesbrough, was the only casualty.

His inactivity led to another game for Kerry Dixon, and once again Kerry produced sensible front-running leadership. It is worth recalling that in the wins at Port Vale, Watford and now Sheffield, Kerry led the line, whilst at Derby he showed a good relationship with Dwight Marshall.

There is no better feeling for the outfield players of any club than to have confidence that there are front players who can take a goal.

Dwight Marshall is now settling well, and was a constant thorn last week in Sheffield United's side.

Further down the scale, Jamie Woodsford has just received selection for the England Under 18s, who play Latvia and Slovenia in November. Well done Jamie! I am quite surprised that the FA have found a better centre-back and goalkeeper than Paul McLaren and Kelvin Davis.

The next test away from home will be our trip to Wolverhampton. They now of course have a magnificent stadium, and it will be the most severe test of our progress so far. Graham Taylor's men are still heavy favourites for promotion, but I would consider that in view of recent results the league is wide open and has a healthy look about it.

Our recent progress has persuaded the television cameras to return to Luton, and we look forward to seeing them on December 11 when we play Derby County, which is thus now a Sunday game.

Hopefully the viewers will see a good pitch with plenty of grass. It pleases me that with the reserves now at Hitchin we can look forward to a winter on a

good surface, so important for a passing team.

Cyril Beech is still scouting for us in that part of Wales, and we are forever indebted to him for some of the fine talent that he has brought to Luton Town.

One of his boys, Ceri Hughes, has had a succession of influential games in the middle, with Gary Waddock too has shown an attitude and application to the job which has meant a valuable midfield contribution, whilst David Preece keeps the possession well in that area.

Every away result has been gained in the new Luton second strip..... Aaron Skelton, out with injury, sees a specialist next week, but Tony Adcock starts full training next week..... Des was also the special guest at the recent prizegiving for youngsters involved in the Marsh Farm Road Safety Project, organised by the Bedfordshire County Council.



STRIKER Jamie Woodsford has been selected for the England youth squad for two European Championship qualifying matches next month.







VISITORS ON PARADE

LEE BUTLER - Goalkeeper who enjoyed spells at Lincoln, Aston Villa and Hull before arriving at Oakwell in July 1991.

DAVID WATSON - A Barnsley boy who signing pro forms in May 1992. Made 12 first-team appearances last season, and his fine goalkeeping has already seen him reach England Under 19 and Under 21 squads.

CHARLES BISHOP - Defender who joined Barnsley in July 1991 for £90,000 from Bury.

STEVE DAVIS - A former England youth international who made 140 appearances for Burnley, captaining the Turf Moor club in his last season there.

NICKY EADEN - Defender who signed professional on leaving school in May 1991, and became a regular last season making 44 appearances.

GARY FLEMING - Gary's move to Oakwell during March 1990 for £65,000 was the second time former manager Mel Machin had signed the Londonderry born player. Whilst at Manchester City, Machin had paid Nottingham Forest £150,000 for Fleming - now a regular member of the Northern Ireland squad.

GLYNN SNODIN - Much travelled defender who has played at Doncaster, Sheffield Wednesday, Leeds, Oldham and Hearts.

GERRY TAGGART - Northern Ireland international who signed from Manchester City for £70,000 in 1990. He now holds the record as the most capped player while playing for the Oakwell club, with 29 appearances up to the start of this season.

OWEN ARCHDEACON - Glaswegian midfielder who joined Celtic on leaving school and made his debut in 1984, winning two Scottish Premier Division medals. He joined Barnsley in 1989, and has been a virtual ever-present for the past three seasons.

MARTIN BULLOCK - Midfielder bought from Eastwood Town in September 1993 for £15,000, making just one appearance last season.

MARK BURTON - A former captain of the club's youth team now back to full fitness.

BRENDAN O'CONNELL - Scored eight goals in 45 appearances last season. Joined the Oakwell club from Burnley in March 1990, having started his league career with Exeter.

NEIL REDFEARN - Scored 12 goals in 54 appearances last term and was voted supporters' Player of the Year. Has previously played for Nottingham Forest, Bolton, Lincoln, Doncaster, Crystal Palace, Watford and Oldham.

DARREN SHERIDAN - Former Leeds United trainee who was offered a two-year contract by Barnsley, following a trial last summer.

GARETH WILLIAMS - Joined Barnsley from Aston Villa in August 1991 for £150,000, but has made just 36 appearances in the past three seasons.

CHRIS JACKSON - Barnsley boy who played for England at Under 16 level.

ANDREW LIDDELL - Recovered from a broken leg sustained in March 93, to make 12 full appearances and 13 as sub last season.

ANDY PAYTON - Arrived at Oakwell in November 1993 from Celtic in a part exchange deal which took Wayne Biggins to Glasgow. Was top scorer last season with 13.

ANDY RAMMELL - Scored 16 goals for Man Utd reserves in 89/90, joining Barnsley for £150,000 in September 1990. Scored seven goals in 40 appearances last term.

MEET THE BOSS


DANNY WILSON started his career with his home town club Wigan Athletic, and also played for Bury, Chesterfield, Nottingham Forest, Brighton, Luton and Sheffield Wednesday, before joining the Oakwell club as player/coach in July 1993.

He has made over 700 first team appearances during his career, including 142 for the Hatters, for whom he also scored 30 goals.


A Northern Ireland international with 24 caps, he has also played in two league cup winning sides - for Luton in the 1988 win over Arsenal, and for Sheffield Wednesday in their victory over Manchester United.

Danny was appointed player-manager in June this year, following the departure of Viv Anderson to Middlesbrough, to become assistant to Bryan Robson.





KERRY DIXON returned to the Hatters first team at Sheffield on Saturday, and marked his return with a goal.

It is proving quite a battle for the number nine shirt between former England striker Kerry, and Welsh Under-21 international John Hartson.

"I was glad to be back," said Kerry. "It was disappointing for John that he was injured, but that's the way football is. One week you're a hero, and the next week you're a villain or out of the side.

"It was up to me to take my chance, and I felt that I did that, culminating with a goal.

"There is a great spirit in the camp which is transmitted onto the field, and even when we have gone behind away at Watford and Sheffield we have come back to score convincing wins.

"In previous seasons we would have settled for draws in those situations."

Kerry admitted it had been frustrating to miss out in recent games, but is experienced enough to accept the situation.

"I have been in the game long enough to understand that although I felt I was playing OK, I wasn't scoring goals and the manager needed to do something" he said.

"I have to sit tight and wait for my chance, and keep the pressure on the way it has been put on

me. It's the same throughout the squad."

Several of the newspapers highlighted his performance at Bramall Lane, and a number made him man-of-the-match.

"I want to do well for Luton, stay here and indeed finish my career here," said Kerry, "and I feel that I have plenty to offer, even if it's just keeping the pressure on John and keeping him up to the standards he set against Middlesbrough.

"I do feel there have been some unfair criticisms, but everyone has their own opinions of who should be in the team, not just up front, but in every position.

"It's the same all over the country, everyone has their favourites and highlights their good points, but I'm prepared for that, it's the way football is.

"That's why the hardest job of all is the England manager's," he added, "because we all pick the England team every day of the week.

"Some people will say Shearer, some Cole, some Wright, and others Sheringham."

Now Kerry will wait to see if he stays in the Luton team, but should John Hartson return then how reassuring it is to have such experience waiting in the wings, and raring to go!

The coaches use this competition to assess possible apprentices for next season, and five 15-year-olds were included in the Luton line-up, pitched in against seven 18-year-olds in the home team.

Matthew Upson, Kendrick Dyer, Paul Dillon, Andrew Barr and Steve Augustine all gave a good account of themselves, with Barr and Augustine scoring the Luton goals, as Saffron bagged a winner with just two minutes to go.

These five, together with the three 15-year-old subs, have spent this half-term week at the club to further their football experience.

"It was a tough game for the young lads on a heavy pitch that had been played on the day before," said Terry, "and looking back on both matches last weekend, players have to realise the importance of keeping a clean sheet."

So with two cup disappointments back-to-back, the youth team are now looking forward to the start of the FA Youth Cup campaign on November 7 with renewed vigour.

Rioch scored from half-a-mile!

AS has been written before in this column, the fourth division championship-winning season provided a whole generation of Luton supporters with their first taste of success.

The stories of course get embellished with the re-telling with the result that most of us want to believe that the squad of 1967/68 would hold its own in today's Premiership, and the players were all unforgivably overlooked from their respective international sides.

That particular season in fact started off rather tamely, but what made it different was that in the early games we were actually picking up the occasional point, which was a far cry from the previous campaign where we were normally lucky to come away with only a good hiding.

The first away win did not arrive until October 7 when, aided by new signing from Derby, Ian Buxton, we triumphed 3-1, and I was one of the 47 Luton supporters who, according to the Evening Post, clapped the Luton players back on to their coach at the end of the game.

This win inspired an eight-game string of victories which included a 5-0 thumping of Exeter at St James Park, and 4-0 beatings of

Workington and Swansea at Kenilworth Road, although in the latter game all the goals came in a six-minute spell late on with the Swans players protesting that two were offside, with the others the result of fouls by Luton defenders in the build-up!

The winning run came to an end in the mud of Valley Parade, Bradford, when we went down 2-0 to a good City side which included Paul Aimson, who Luton manager Allan Brown had tried to sign earlier in the season.

The setback was shortlived however, when Wrexham were seen off at Kenilworth Road the following week, although the winner didn't come until the last minute, from skipper Terry Branston.

The next away game, on the Saturday before Christmas, took us to Barnsley which was not one of our happy hunting grounds. The Tykes were enjoying a good spell, and were destined to join us in promotion at the season's end, and, although Christmas shopping was the general order of the day, a crowd of 8,704 gathered at Oakwell to see what turned out to be a classic.

The game opened at a frantic pace, with Buxton heading against the bar, and Barnsley's Earnshaw hitting the post. The breakthrough came on 19 minutes when

Earnshaw's accurate centre was thundered home by Hamstead, with the Luton defenders caught upfield chasing an opening.

An equaliser came though on the stroke of half-time from the trusty boot of Bruce Rioch, and here comes the 'time dulls the memory' bit. The ball was headed out from a corner by a Barnsley defender straight to Rioch, way out of the penalty area, who hit it on the volley straight past the bemused Ironside in the Barnsley goal.

It was the sheer velocity, which saw the ball never rise more than a couple of inches off the ground, that made the goal special, and even the home supporters were forced to applaud. People who still talk about the goal have moved Rioch further and further back over the years, but the match reports from the Green 'Un and Evening Post confirm my memories of 35 to 40 yards.

Peter Graham, who was drafted in at centre-forward that day, and is now a sub-postmaster near me in Newmarket, did not see the goal as he was trying to get out of the way of Luton skipper and centre-half Terry Branston who was being a bit of a bully!

The half-time whistle followed, but straight into the second period, winger John Ryan, in the side in place of Graham French, nipped smartly between two defenders to head in a cross from Ray Whittaker. We hardly had time to draw breath though before Barnsley equalised, when Bettany slammed the ball past Tony Read from four yards out after a goalmouth scramble.

The game continued in the same vein until the final whistle, amazingly without further score, and both teams went in to a standing ovation.



THE NEW STADIUM - A MOVING STORY by David Kohler



THE pitch is divided into nine large trays each capable of being moved by four small hovercraft manoeuvring under the corners of each section, raising it up, and floating it out of the stadium on a cushion of air.

AS many of you know, we at Luton Town have a dream that one day we can move from Kenilworth Road, our home for the past 90 years, into a new stadium. The reasons for the move, apart from our lease running out in 1996 are obvious to all who have visited our ground.

I have on numerous occasions talked of the financial realities of playing football at this level, so if and when we move, it needs to be to a home that can be used far more frequently than the 25 or so home football league and cup matches every season.


TOWN fan Mr E Collins, from Nottingham, has contacted the club to say he has a number of pictures for sale, dating back as far as 1900! He has team groups and individual pictures from 1900 to 1994, and anyone interested can contact Mr Collins at 40 St Albans Road, Bestwood Village, Nottingham, NG6 8TR, enclosing a SAE for picture list.

We could not afford to build a standard four stands and grass pitch football stadium, like Millwall, and I would not be party to any scheme that would place a heavy debt burden on this football club which already struggles financially.

The **'Kohlerdome'** dream has evolved because of the necessity to utilise the facility for more than just football, provide better facilities, both for the team and you as a supporter, and as a consequence provide the much needed leisure facilities that the town of Luton currently does not possess.

Football stadia in this country are in the main used only for professional football. This is because of the unpredictability of the weather. Even if the occasional pop concert is held, it normally results in damage to the playing surface.

We are now able to pioneer the future. To solve the weather problem is easy, put the



TO solve the weather problem is easy, put the stadium indoors. This has worked effectively for many years in America and other far thinking countries.

stadium indoors. This has worked effectively for many years in America and other far thinking countries.

This problem solved, we are only left with how do we provide a top quality playing surface for the football team.

I am delighted to advise you that we at Luton Town Football Club have patented the first commercially viable moveable sectioned natural grass playing surface.

The essence of the system is that the pitch is divided into nine large trays (each measuring 34m x 24m, and weighing approximately 375 tonnes), and each capable of being moved by four small hovercraft manoeuvring under the corners of each section, raising it up, and floating it out of the stadium on a cushion of air.

It is intended that the pitch will actually live outside of the stadium and will be floated in, taking approximately five hours to set up for football matches, or indeed any other activity requiring natural grass.

This system of course has many uses and I have already had considerable inter-






