

PLEAT'S PERSPECTIVE

OUR EFFORTS FELL WELL BELOW PAR ON SATURDAY

WELCOME to our visitors from Humberside, their supporters, officials and players. They have been one of the most successful 'football' sides over the past few seasons in this division, and I am sure that was in no small measure down to the influence of Alan Buckley, who has just left the club for West Bromwich Albion. He will have left the team in good shape.

Our visitors last Saturday, Barnsley, spoiled what we had hoped would be our fourth successive victory. Sometimes in football we don't give enough credit to the opposition when we are disappointed. Suffice to say, our efforts on

Saturday fell well below par and we all did ourselves a dis-service.


But Barnsley were excellent. They played economically, with a system that suited their players and a determination that made their recent record stand up. In the last five games now, they have conceded only one goal.

During the game we took several knocks, and I am hopeful that the players concerned will be fit for this evening's game.

The players have much to put right, but I shall not be making any wild changes. The players that have carried the flag in recent weeks are the most well-equipped to do that. Sometimes during a game we all get frustrated at the efforts of individuals at any one time, but for sure it is counter-productive when things go wrong to turn on players. It must be remembered that apart from the experienced players such as Trevor Peake and David Preece it is still basically a group of players who are young in terms of league experience.

Trevor Peake, our most experienced player, almost succumbed to a niggling knee injury on Saturday, and had a late fitness test. It would have been a debut for young Paul McLaren, the captain of the youth team. He was disappointed that he didn't get the nod, but I'm sure his time will come. It could have been a big chance for him because other defenders were inactive on Saturday. Des Linton, Aaron Skelton and Richard Harvey with injury, and David Greene through a one-match suspension.

The difference between playing at home and away is still giving me much

cause for thought. Sometimes, I believe players' mental strength is as important as their physical conditioning and ability. Away from home maybe they feel there is less pressure to get a result. We must get rid of any doubts about the ability to perform and win well at home.

One would have thought that the super performance against Middlesbrough broke the hoodoo, but football is a strange game and it sometimes it makes your hair fall out!

Anyway, all those who saw the game on Saturday would be disappointed, but would know that there can be no complaints. We try to avoid complaining about referees' decisions, or indeed standards.

Suffice to say, their job is so pressurised very few people want to take it up, and that is some kind of proof of the difficulties and indeed ignorance that these guys have to accept. I have to say that in the many games I have seen, the overall standard is good, and it is of course a shame that under the new directives the attitude towards producing a yellow card has become more widespread. Therefore, it appears, the game

has become more physical and fierce. This is not the case.

Finally, there was speculation in the press at the weekend regarding my situation here at Luton, and talk of Tottenham. I always feel that is unfortunate. Football is a cruel game which causes all sorts of pressures, discussions and difficulties when clubs are not winning.

If I believed the journalists, then my name is being considered. But until such time as the chairman and the board here hear something official then there is really no comment to make. So many football stories are created to be knocked down, which gives vital media space which the game enjoys, needs, but sometimes can be a disturbing influence.

Let's get on with the football, and hope that we can put right what went so badly wrong on Saturday. Enjoy the game.



However, there is cup action here at Kenilworth Road on Monday, November 7, when we start our FA Youth Cup campaign at home to Staines Town.


Kick-off is 7.45pm, and in the event of a draw, the replay will be at Staines on Wednesday, November 9.



Paul Futcher - 20 years at the top

NO sooner had promotion back to Division One been achieved in 1974 than manager Harry Haslam announced that the club's transfer fee record was about to be broken, with the signing of 17-year-old Paul Futcher from Chester City.

The eventual fee agreed was £100,000, to be paid over a four-year period, for a teenager who, according to Chester manager Ken Roberts, was a certainty to play for England. Even so this was a massive price to pay for a virtually untried teenager who had only played 20 league games for Chester.

Harry Haslam, in snatching Futcher from under the nose of Manchester City, declared that he was buying for the future and was confident that the youngster would be worth three times the amount paid in 12 months. Haslam was obviously hoping that Luton Town would achieve the same result as the last time they raided Chester, for in 1962 they paid £10,000 for Ron Davies and

then sold him for four times the amount to Norwich a few months later.

To us Luton supporters this came as a strange departure, as we were normally sellers of promising talent and this purchase came hot on the heels of big money signings, in Luton terms, of Alan West and Jim Husband for a combined fee of £150,000.

Soon after the signing it was announced that Paul's twin brother Ron would be joining the Town for £25,000 in order to "keep him company" although we all knew that Harry Haslam was not daft, and that he had other reasons for the signing which were eventually shown with the almost telepathic understanding between the two brothers on the pitch.

Ron actually made his league debut for Luton before Paul, coming on as a substitute during the 1-0 home defeat by Sheffield United in November 1974, but by the time he came back into the side his twin was taking Division One by storm.

Things were not working out for Harry Haslam

and by early December the Town were rooted firmly on the bottom of the table after nine games without a win. He decided, for the trip to Chelsea, to blood his secret weapon and Paul was given his debut playing in a back four which included Steve Buckley, who was making his second appearance.

Although we lost 2-0, those of us that were at Stamford Bridge that overcast day saw a shining performance from a player who was desperate to seize his chance with both hands.

Playing with a maturity that belied his tender age he stroked the ball about like a veteran, and on one occasion, when facing his own goalkeeper, hooked the ball over the heads of several advancing Chelsea forwards as well as his own before turning and retrieving to play an inch-perfect pass upfield. Paul was joined by his brother for the Christmas games and the fun then really started, as all balls played out of defence seemed to home in on Ron who became an instant terrace hero when scoring a hat-trick against Wolves on his home debut.


As has been well recorded before, the Town almost escaped the drop and although wise with hindsight you can't help wondering what would have happened had the Futcher twins been given their chance earlier.

As it was, the performances in the second half of the season gave promise for the future and as the Town attempted to regain their lost status at the first time of asking in 1975/76, Paul Futcher continued to receive rave reviews and became a regular in the England Under-21 set-up.

The transfer speculation started but the Town were in no hurry to sell, with promotion back to Division One the main priority. We missed out narrowly for two consecutive seasons and were in a strong position once again in November 1977 when disaster struck, with Paul being badly injured in a road accident which kept him out of the side for three months, during which time we slipped down the table.

Other supporters may disagree, but when Paul returned to the side he did not seem the same player and we all thought it was a sound piece of business by new manager David Pleat when he was sold to Manchester City, who had eventually got their man, for £350,000.

Paul lasted two years at Maine Road, before starting on a tour of five league clubs which has ended with tonight's visitors Grimsby Town, for





