



PLEAT'S PERSPECTIVE

WE MUST AVOID ANOTHER SLUGGISH START TODAY

WELCOME this afternoon to Derby County, one of the pre-season favourites for promotion. We extend a warm Sunday greeting to all their supporters, players and officials. Also today we are fortunate to have present the cameras of LWT which will provide the pictures for several ITV regions.

Naturally we trust that our performance will not fall below par, and we will show the armchair viewers that our principles are still being upheld after the difficulties of the last couple of seasons, and that we can move the ball around the field as well as most Premiership teams.

Today's game revives memories of last season's match here, when against all the odds, after Ceri Hughes was sent off, our ten men produced an incredible winning goal scored by Scott Oakes.

Last Saturday, we had the situation once again of having a player sent from the field, with Gary

Waddock shown the red card. His offence has resulted in a one-match suspension, and I have to say I have some sympathy with Gary because although Andy Scott of Sheffield United had got into a good position, I felt that the covering defender Trevor Peake may have had the opportunity to make a challenge.

However, the mountain to climb was clear. Already 2-0 down, and with Waddock off, the sequence of black events was compounded when David Preece and Des Linton both had to leave the field.

I would like to thank our supporters for their amazing passion and support that was generated to the team. The team fought as hard as they could, but in the last five minutes, after Kerry Dixon had a marvellous opportunity to make an amazing 4-4 score, Sheffield United scored two further goals.

One can look at the rollercoaster events of last Saturday's game with all sorts of views. However, the only important reflections I can take from the game was the first 20 minutes before our catalogue of woe, and in that period when Sheffield went 2-0 up we started sluggishly, Sheffield United were bright, and a repetition today would put us in trouble.

Let us hope it was a one-off occasion even though we were probably the first two clubs in the country to enter into the Christmas spirit.

The result of last Saturday's endeavours were a groin strain for Des Linton which will probably keep him out for two or three weeks, a twisted ankle for David Preece which hopefully may not be as bad as first feared, and a suspension for Gary Waddock which means he will miss next Sunday's match at West Bromwich.

However, we are delighted to confirm that Gary will be staying with us for the rest of the season, joining on a free transfer from Bristol Rovers, and he will be looking forward to us entertaining Bristol in the FA Cup third round.

Our other senior player with injury, Ceri Hughes, is possibly two months away from fitness. He is working hard and we hope that the

ligaments will strengthen quickly and that he will come back towards the end of January. The injuries have left us a little bit shorn in the midfield area. Jamie Campbell is on loan at Mansfield. Tony Thorpe and Aaron Skelton, full of promise, but fluctuations in form, are currently in the reserves' midfield positions.

The league is as tight as ever with Notts County's win in midweek putting them within 14 points of a play-off place. The positions change spectacularly from week to week. The one statistic so far in our favour is that our monthly position has improved each time, as has Barnsley's and Sheffield United's. It is vitally important that everyone retains a realistic chance which should make the league exciting right to the last day of the season.

In this respect many clubs are now urgently looking at loans because money is so tight, to maintain their positions, and also to have some confidence for the forthcoming cup ties. So far, in the last ten days, I have procluced both Tony Adcock and David Greene going on loans until we can strengthen our own squad. By the same token we have also attempted to secure a couple of loan signings, thus far without success.

However, I am looking at the possibility of bringing an experienced Spanish player over soon, provided there are no complications, to add some strength to us until the end of the season. He is currently playing at Oviedo in the

Spanish first division, the team who are managed by our former player Raddy Antic.

Our game today will be the last here before December 27. I trust all our supporters will make the most of the festive period, and have an enjoyable rest and hopefully look forward with optimism to the New Year. When we reflect on the improvement in our fortunes, I think it was December 19 last year when we went to Watford and came back from 2-0 behind to draw 2-2. Since that game we established a pattern of play which suited and was good enough to take us to within 90 minutes of a Cup Final place.

This season, away from home some of our play has been top class. We have not matched that result wise at home, and we have to keep working on this unusual imbalance.

Today would be a wonderful appetiser for Christmas if we could not only produce good form but also get a positive result to set everyone in the right frame of mind for another relatively successful year.

We wish all our supporters good wishes and good health for a happy Christmas.

Enjoy the game.

Waddock's happy to sign up for Hatters

MIDFIELDER Gary Waddock has completed a free transfer from Bristol Rovers, after a successful three-month loan spell at Kenilworth Road.

The 32-year-old has proved a steady influence for the Hatters and has been an ever-present in the number four shirt since his arrival here.

Gary made no secret of his wish to stay at Luton, getting the chance of first-team football and being much closer to his London roots.

It was in the capital that he made his name with Queens Park Rangers, making over 200 appearances for the Loftus Road side. A spell abroad came in Belgium with Charleroi as he battled back from serious injury, with spells at Millwall, QPR again and

Swindon before his move to Bristol Rovers.

"I am delighted to be staying for the rest of the season, and I hope we can make a real push for a top five place," said Gary.

"I have certainly enjoyed my first three months here, and everyone at the club has made me very welcome.

"Luton have given me the opportunity to play first-team football, and I have been pleased with my form thus far.

"We have shown what we can do away from home, and I'm sure the home form can turn round."

The former Republic of Ireland international will miss next Sunday's game at West Brom through suspension, but will look forward to an early re-uniting with Bristol Rovers in the cup!

LUTON travel to United Counties League side Kempston Rovers tomorrow (Monday) in the second round of the Beds Premier Cup. Kick-off at Hillground, the turning for which is at a set of traffic lights on the main Bedford to Kempston road, is 7.30pm. The Hatters are the cup holders, and beat Wootton Blue Cross 2-1 in the first round.

A NUMBER of supporters arriving at the ticket office to purchase tickets for our Sheffield United fixture were surprised and annoyed to find "Sold Out" notices displayed some 15 minutes prior to kick-off.

It is obvious that people are not aware just how few seats are now available for purchase on a match-day.

Since the conversion this season to all-seater, some 3350 fewer tickets are available, as the capacity now is reduced to 10,037. Deducting from this figure season ticket holders, disabled areas, executive suites and Oak Stand visitors, there remains only 3,679 saleable seats. (Included in this figure are a number with restricted views).

Price structure of those available: 1,410 at £14.50; 1,574 at £11.50; and 695 at £7.50.

It is important if supporters do not wish to face disappointment (either on prices available or non-availability of tickets) when arriving on the day of a match that they purchase in advance.

Tickets are always available one month prior to the fixture date and bookings can be made on our 24-hour credit card line, by postal application or telephone.

All purchases made 14 days prior to a fixture receive a discount.

It is also important to mention that whilst the Oak Stand may have seats available on most games, our safety certificate for the ground will not permit selling to home supporters in this area.

Gary is an experienced player and will put that behind him, and his expertise will be vital in the coming weeks.



ON THE OTHER SIDE

PLAY-OFF AGONY DRIVES RAMS TO PREMIER PUSH

DERBY County Football Club is a club steeped in history and tradition. Formed 109 years ago as an off-shoot of Derbyshire County Cricket Club, Derby County were among the 12 founder members of the Football League when it was initiated in 1888.


The Rams have always had a reputation for playing entertaining football, although that has not always brought the club success.

The Rams have reached four FA Cup Finals, but won the famous cup only once, in 1946. Since then, the Rams won the League Championship twice during the 1970s, firstly when Brian Clough was the manager, but also tasted life in the lower reaches of the league too, having played in the old Third Division in the 1950s and, during the club's centenary season, in the early 1980s.

It was during Derby's last spell in Division Three that the club appointed Arthur Cox as manager with Roy McFarland as his assistant and, under their guidance, the Rams were promoted into the old First Division in successive seasons.

Success appeared to be just around the corner again with players like Peter Shilton, Mark Wright and Dean Sanders at the club, but financial restrictions placed by former chairman Robert Maxwell caused the team to wither and, after four years in the top flight, Derby were relegated in 1991.


A change of ownership from the Maxwell family to a board of local businessmen meant that Wright and Saunders had to be sold to Liverpool for a combined fee of £5.1 million, but in November 1991 Lionel Pickering, a Derbyshire millionaire, bought a controlling interest in the club and since then around £11 million has been



spent in bringing new talent to the club. However, even with that outlay in the transfer market, promotion has eluded the Rams, although only defeat at the hands of Leicester City in last season's promotion play-off final at Wembley prevented Derby taking their place in the FA Premiership this year.

This season has produced a mixed bag of results, and also the sale of striker Paul Kitson to Newcastle.

Two weeks ago the Rams shocked high-flying Wolves, winning 2-0 at Molineux, but were frustrated at home by Notts County last Saturday, drawing 0-0.





VISITORS ON PARADE

STEVE SUTTON - Signed for Derby in March 1992, although he made his debut in 1985 when he spent 14 matches on loan from Nottingham Forest. Was also on loan at Luton from the City Ground prior to his joining Derby, and returned to the Rams first team in October this season after Martin Taylor broke his leg at Southend.

ANDREW QUY - 18-year-old former Spurs trainee who made his senior debut as a sub for the injured Sutton in the Coca-Cola Cup at Portsmouth.

GARY CHARLES - Became Derby's third signing from Nottingham Forest in the space of 16 months when he arrived at the Baseball Ground for £750,000 last year. Capped twice by England in 1991.

MICHAEL FORSYTH - Rams longest serving senior player who joined the club in 1986. Has won England U21 and B honours.

JASON KAVANAGH - Product of the FA School at Lilleshall, and after making his debut as a central defender has played mainly at right-back.

SHANE NICHOLSON - Played 150 games for Lincoln after making his debut as a 17-year-old, before signing for Derby at 21.

CRAIG SHORT - Most expensive defender in British football history when he joined Derby from Notts County for £2.5 million in September 1992. Formerly with Scarborough.

DARREN WASSALL - Talented defender who was earmarked as Des Walker's replacement when Walker left Nottingham Forest for Sampdoria in 1992. But Wassall too departed, joining Derby for £550,000.

PAUL WILLIAMS - His switch from midfield to the centre of defence was one of the highlights of Derby's season last year. Was leading scorer from midfield in 1991-92 with 16 goals.

LEE CARSLEY - Former youth team skipper was the club's 1993 Young Player of the Year. Enjoying extended first-team run in midfield.

GORDON COWANS - Was in his third spell with Aston Villa when Derby invested £75,000 in bringing the experienced midfielder to the Baseball Ground in February 1994. Former England international who won League Championship and European Cup honours with Villa.

JOHN HARKES - Joined Derby from Sheffield Wednesday in August 1993 for £800,000. Starred for the USA in the summer World Cup Finals, having initially caught Wednesday's eye in the 1990 competition.


STEVE HAYWARD - England youth international, now a regular member of the Derby first-team squad.

MARTIN KUHL - Arrived at the Baseball Ground from Portsmouth in September 1992, with the task of guiding the young team to success from midfield.

MARK PEMBRIDGE - Joined Derby from Luton in the summer of 1992 for £1.25 million. Welsh international who progressed through the junior ranks at Kenilworth Road, and a regular scorer of spectacular long-range goals. Scored 16 goals for Derby in his first season, and hit double figures again last term.



TOMMY JOHNSON - Was only 21 when Derby splashed out £1.3 million to sign him from Notts County in March 1992. Key figure in last season's finale, scoring in each of the last five games - including the play-off final.

PAUL SIMPSON - Free-scoring winger formerly with Manchester City and Oxford.

MARK STALLARD - Only 16 when he made his league debut for Derby in 1991-92. Has come through the Derby youth ranks to claim a regular first-team place.

DEAN STURRIDGE - Regular scorer for the reserves who made first-team debut in 92-93.





"I can remember Mitchell making a break into the box and playing the ball through to me on the left, but as I made the run I felt my ankle go, and perhaps I should have stopped then.


"But I carried on and tried to cross the ball, and I probably turned the ankle again. I had to come straight off or I would have been out for a long time!"





Luton defender **JULIAN JAMES** reflects on last Saturday's 6-3 defeat by Sheffield United at Kenilworth Road..... as told to **CLUBCALL 0891 121 123**



Q: An eventful game to say the least, but the Town on the wrong end of a 6-3 score-line.

A: Yes, it was very disappointing, again. We were certainly expecting to get something out of the game, but we started poorly and I think they deserved their two-goal lead.

We did try and get back into the game, and showed some good touches in the second-half at times, but we let ourselves down again.

Q: Looking back at the first-half, they started brightly, but at 1-0 Scott Oakes had a chance for an equaliser.

A: We were talking about that afterwards, and I think it came to him a bit quick, but he's disappointed and that could have changed things.

Q: At 2-0 Gary Waddock was sent off, but no real argument about that?

A: I think the manager was a bit displeased about it, because he thought Trevor would have been able to get across, but it was partly my fault because I shouldn't have lost it on the edge of their box.

Q: You had been booked just before that, and was that in your mind as you chased back with Andy Scott, that bringing him down wouldn't be a red card offence, but a second yellow one?

A: It did cross my mind, but to be quite hon-

est I couldn't get my foot round to the ball without it being a diabolical challenge, but Gary came across and looked as though he was going to get there, but unfortunately for us he didn't.

Q: It was 3-0 just after half-time, but we pulled one back as you set up a goal for John Hartson.

A: The manager had told us to get the ball to Dwight as much as possible and try and get him running at the fullback, and I made a run on the inside for Dwight and put the ball across - John scored and it certainly raised our spirits.

Q: Again they hit back, but then an incredible passage of play with Brian Gayle's own goal and then the penalty.

A: At that time we were trying to play football and create some chances, which we did, and the crowd really got behind us which was great.

But the unfortunate thing was at 4-3, we were still in the game and then Juergen and I had a mix-up. Before that Kerry had a chance, if that had gone in who knows. If they hadn't scored soon after.... but it's all ifs and buts.

Q: One or two injuries picked up, notably for David Preece and Des Linton, but you collected a knock late on, but were able to continue.

A: Hopefully David and Des will be fit for the next game..... I was just bruised..... again!

Harford scores..... for the Hatters!

ON March 9, 1991, the Town won away at Aston Villa to record their third win in four games and, with 10 games to go, were in a comfortable 13th position in Division One.

As we came away from Villa Park a fight against relegation was far from our minds and thoughts of a possible top ten position were fixed in our sights. Unfortunately the remainder of the season turned into a nightmare.

From the next seven games only two points were won as we slipped nearer and nearer the relegation zone with a young side lacking any real striking power; Lars Elstrup with his mind probably set on a return to Denmark, and Iain Dowie having been sold to West Ham.

The Town were ahead at both Coventry and Sheffield United but lost both games, went down at home to Norwich and Wimbledon after having all the play, drew 0-0 at Kenilworth Road against Tottenham - John Dreyer missing a penalty, and were three-up at Chelsea only for the Blues to level the score.

Only two teams were to go down that season and immediately below the Town were Derby and Sunderland, who had both suffered equally poor

runs, and as the fixture list had panned out our last two home games were against these two sides.

With three games to go Sunderland were visitors to Kenilworth Road, and a Luton victory would have gone a long way to easing our fears of a return to Division Two.

Sunderland had won only one away game that season, but they seemed to have more of a will to win that day and took the lead through Gordon Armstrong after 22 minutes, only for the Town's best attacker, centre-half Graham Rodger, to level the score 10 minutes later.

In the second half there was only going to be one winner, and Colin Pascoe duly obliged for the visitors on the hour, catching the Luton defence on the break.

Manager Jim Ryan kept the players locked in the changing room for 80 minutes after the game and emerged a bitterly disappointed man due to the fact that the Town had blown their chances of avoiding a last-match-of-the-season show-down once again.

The penultimate game of the campaign was away at Everton and the Town put on an ultra-defensive performance but still lost out to a second-half strike from Tony Cottee.

Injury problems and suspensions had meant that no recognised central attacker was included in the line-up, while Jim Ryan was forced to call up and use the previously untried Paul Telfer as substitute.

Since beating the Town, Sunderland had drawn two home games and were now level on points with us, with the same goal difference, although we had scored more goals.

The situation was now simple. We had to beat already relegated Derby at Kenilworth Road and hope that Sunderland did not run up a cricket score in their final game at Manchester City.

All very well, but we had got out of the habit of winning and it was over two months since we had last picked up three points. Also, although Derby were already relegated, we could not expect them to roll over and die, especially with the likes of Peter Shilton, Mark Wright, Dean Saunders and old Town favourite Mick Harford in their side.

A best-of-the-season crowd of 12,889 turned up to see if another 'great escape' could be engineered and they were delighted to see that nerves were not a part of the Town's make-up that afternoon as good football flowed.

A great roar went up when it was learned that Sunderland had gone behind at Maine Road, then the euphoria died when news came through that the Weariders were now 2-1 ahead.

A win was now vital and the breakthrough came just before half-time when a perfectly flighted free-kick from Jason Rees skimmed off the top of Mick Harford's head straight into the net.

What turned out to be the deciding goal came almost immediately after the start of the second half, when a clever passing movement ended with a corner which was taken by David Preece.

His accurate cross found John Dreyer who headed the ball across the box to Kingsley Black who headed it back the opposite way, to Lars Elstrup who scored with Shilton wrong-footed.

Derby had a couple of chances after that, but the clearer opportunities came the way of the Town and a 2-0 win was sufficient to ensure Division One football for another season.

And all this after that heart-stopping afternoon at the Baseball Ground the previous season when Luton won 3-2 to send Sheffield
