and Andy Hessenthaler pulled them round and they had a memorable run of clean sheets which is the sound basis for any team.

There is no pattern to predict any outcome, we are hoping for a double and also a return to the form of the last home game when John Moore and Wayne Turner looked after the side for such an admirable win against Tranmere.

Sadly of course we returned to the Jekyll and Hyde syndrome, failing to capitalise on a goal lead at Burnley.

As an avid reader of other manager's programme notes, I could not help but be impressed by the thoughts of Graham Taylor in his Wolverhampton notes the other night.

It was Graham's expertise at Watford that helped motivate ourselves at Luton to stay with the game in the 1980s, but nothing much changes on the field.

Injuries, loss of form, suspensions, fixture congestion, refereeing decisions, political problems are the same, but it's off the field where the game has changed so drastically in the last 20 years.

Outside influences like agents and media demands have had a great impact on a profession that remains reactive as opposed to being proactive.

The game's leaders continue to be fragmented and the formation of the Premiership has complicated the situation further as we try to pull football under one banner, where clubs are autonomous by nature anyway.

We would also wish Kerry Dixon every success having gained a short-term contract with Millwall.

Kerry has helped the development of Dwight Marshall, and indeed enabled us to play John Hartson sparingly.

His heart will always be in Luton, but at 34 we could not guarantee him a contract at the end of this season, and we have helped him to help himself, and wish him every success.

Let us hope that today's game is a worthy 'derby' and that all our supporters will return and get behind the team in the forthcoming home games against Wolves and Notts County.

Finally, a reminder that the final game of the season against Stoke could still be played on Saturday, May 6, providing both sides are not involved in play-off or relegation possibilities.




Wayne returned to the Stoke line-up at Southend on Tuesday, scoring a penalty before being sent-off in the 4-2 defeat.



I KNOW this is an eagerly anticipated fixture by supporters of both sides, and certainly our players are keen to carry on the excellent home form we showed against Tranmere.

That must rank alongside the defeat of Middlesbrough as one of the best performances of the season, but sadly we couldn't follow it up with three points at Burnley on Tuesday.

Having seen dropped home points cost us dear earlier in the season, we are now left to reflect on what might have been away from Kenilworth Road, with points having slipped away at Portsmouth, Bristol City and certainly at Burnley.

The atmosphere of a 'derby' match should certainly raise our spirits, and Watford will no doubt be keen to avenge our 4-2 at Vicarage Road in September.

They are a strong side, who enjoyed a good cup run, and are still in with a chance of the play-offs. Our chance appears to have gone, but we must maintain our efforts and we can still have a say in the championship and relegation issues.

This week has provided some personal milestones for me, with Tuesday's game at Turf

Moor my 600th league appearance, for Lincoln, Coventry and Luton, with this afternoon, so I'm told, my 700th senior appearance in all.

It's certainly not something I keep tabs on, but it's a nice milestone to achieve, and I can certainly say I'm enjoying my football as much as ever. It seems a long time ago when Colin Murphy signed me for Lincoln. I played four seasons there, before signing for Bobby Gould at Coventry where I played for eight seasons.

Funnily enough my last game at Highfield Road was against Luton, before I made the move to Kenilworth Road.

The figures show I have been fortunate with injuries, touch wood, and I've never had an operation. But, I have never played right through an entire season so it would be nice to do that in the current campaign.

I was asked recently if I could remember my senior debut, and I can very clearly because I scored! Lincoln beat Barnsley 2-1 in a League Cup tie.

The highlight over the years is without doubt the 1987 FA Cup Final, while the biggest disappointment would be our relegation from the 'old' Division One.

I would love to stay another year and see us back in the top flight.

ON THE OTHER SIDE

PHILLIPS ON THE GOAL TRAIL AS HORNETS CHASE PLAY-OFFS

KEVIN Phillips is Watford's new scoring sensation with four goals in five games, including the equaliser in last Saturday's draw at Wolves, and the winner in Tuesday night's 3-2 success over Barnsley.

The Hertfordshire-born striker stayed within the county when he joined Watford from non-league Baldock Town in December 1994.

A former youth player with Southampton, for whom he appeared at fullback, he joined Baldock in 1991 where he was converted to a striking role with tremendous success.

Kevin scored 29 league and cup goals for Baldock last season and was voted their supporters' Player of the Year.

Speaking to Watford Clubcall after Tuesday's win over the Tykes, he admitted it was a pretty good start.

"It's going well and I'm grateful to the boss for giving me a good run in the team," he said. "I've slotted in well, but it's all down to the team. Watford play good football, and I like to get the ball at my feet."

"It was a great run from Gerard Lavin which set me up for the winner, and although I enjoyed the equaliser at Wolves it was special to get the winner in front of the home crowd."

"Now everyone is looking forward to the game against Luton, and with live television it's a great stage for all the players."

"I've got a point to prove, and I would love to get the winner against Luton too!"

Goals from the 21-year-old could yet push Glenn Roeder's side towards the play-offs, as they look to have shaken off the disappointment of that extra-time FA Cup exit at Crystal Palace.

Roeder took over as Watford manager during the 1993 close season, when his predecessor Steve Perryman resigned to return to Tottenham

as assistant manager.

Roeder had previously played for Watford, and captained the Hornets, having signed in June 1989 on a free transfer from Newcastle United.


Highly-respected as a player at Orient, QPR, Newcastle, Notts County and Watford, he made nearly 650 senior appearances, and earned six international caps for the England B side.

He took his first managerial appointment in 1991, joining Gillingham whom he guided to safety before his return to Vicarage Road.

Former England international Kenny Sansom is player-coach at Vicarage Road, having been a team-mate of Roeder's at Newcastle.





PERRY DIGWEED - Goalkeeper who joined Watford from Wimbledon, having previously played for Fulham, Brighton, West Brom, Charlton, Newcastle and Chelsea.

KEVIN MILLER - Joined from Birmingham for £250,000 in August 1994, having started his league career at Exeter.

PAUL WILKERSON - Turned pro in 1993, and was a regular member of the senior squad last season.

DAVID BARNES - London-born left-back who signed from Sheffield United in January 1994.

GARY FITZGERALD - Central defender who signed as a full professional in November 1994. Made his debut against Luton in September.

COLIN FOSTER - Experienced central defender who joined the Hornets from West Ham for £100,000 just prior to last season's deadline.

NIGEL GIBBS - Club captain who has missed almost two seasons due to a severe knee ligament injury. Returned to the starting eleven recently, and is close to 350 appearances for the club.

DAVID HOLDSWORTH - Former England youth and under-21 international, who signed as a Watford professional with brother Dean - now at Wimbledon. Started his Watford career alongside Glenn Roeder in the centre of defence.

DOMINIC LUDDEN - Signed from Leyton Orient in August 1994, having represented England Schools at under-18 level.

KEITH MILLEN - Signed just before the transfer deadline in March 1994 from Brentford, in an exchange deal which took Barry Ashby in the opposite direction - the Bees also receiving £65,000.

ROBERT PAGE - Promising central defender and former captain of Wales Under-18, now a regular in the Wales Under-21 squad.

MARK WATSON - Canadian international who joined Watford at the start of December 1993.

ANDY HESSENTHALER - Battling midfielder who joined the Hornets from GM Conference side Redbridge Forest in September 1991.

GERARD LAVIN - Scotland U-21 international, and Watford's only ever-present during the 93/94 season.

RICHARD JOHNSON - Australian midfielder, who paid his own way to UK aged just 16, in a bid to break into professional football.

DEREK PAYNE - Joined the Hornets from Southend during the close season, together with striker Tommy Mooney, while defender Keith Dublin, plus £95,000, made the opposite journey. Previously with Barnet.


GEOFFREY PITCHER - Summer signing from Millwall, who arrived at Vicarage Road with striker Jamie Moralee.

GARY PORTER - Now in his 11th senior year with Watford, after England youth and Under-21 appearances.


CRAIG RAMAGE - Midfielder who earned England Under-21 honours whilst at Derby, and signed for the Hornets in February 1994.





IT could be quite a week for Luton's teenage goalkeeper Kelvin Davis, writes *Simon Oxley*.

The 18-year-old is set to make his home debut this afternoon, and his first appearance of the season, as David Pleat allows Juergen Sommer to represent the USA against Uruguay.

And then on Tuesday, Kelvin flies out to Hungary with the England youth side for the UEFA Championship qualifier - the first time he has been included in the national squad.

"It would certainly be a great double for me to play in both games," admitted Kelvin, who has chosen to represent England despite being courted by Wales.

"When I was on loan at Torquay earlier this season, the Welsh enquired about me because of my grandad being from Wales, but I have always thought of myself as English," he pointed out.

That loan spell at Torquay gave him vital league experience, with matches against Colchester and Barnet, and an impressive display in the first leg of a Coca-Cola Cup tie with Premiership Wimbledon.

His Luton debut came on the last day of last season at Stoke, when he was just 17, and he starred in a 2-2 draw.

"I only knew that I was in the side a matter of hours before the kick-off," said Kelvin, "so at least I have had plenty of time to think about the Watford game.

"The fact that it's a derby, and one the fans desperately want to win does put a bit of pressure on, but I will just have to block out all the distractions like the TV cameras, and I'm really looking forward to the game.

"I was pleased with the performance at Stoke last season, and I certainly have confidence in myself to play at this level.

"Juergen has been a great help, and we get on very well and spend a lot of time training together, and with Peter Bonetti."

Yet the Bedford-born youngster, who went to school in Leighton Buzzard, could have been wearing the number nine shirt this afternoon.

Whilst playing in goal for Luton's junior sides he was still playing at centre-forward for Leighton Corinthians, and certainly isn't afraid to mention his 'outfield' performances now in the five-a-side training games.

Kelvin's job today though is to stop the goals going in, and take another step on the road to the career predicted by manager David Pleat and youth coach Terry Westley.



Striker Payne stings the Hornets

AFTER finishing as runners-up to Coventry in 1935/36, and thereby narrowly missing out on promotion from Division Three South, it was generally reckoned that the Town would go one better in the new season aided by our new goalscorer supreme, Joe Payne.

A solid start was made to the campaign, and by the time of the visit of Watford to Kenilworth Road on October 17 we stood in second place in the table, one point behind leaders Cardiff City who had played one game more.

We had won all our home games at that point in the season, and fresh from a 4-0 victory over Bristol City the previous week, a best-of-the-season crowd of 20,569 turned out to see if the run of home wins could be extended to six.

Watford had the best of the early play and Devan scored with an opportunist effort with the Town defence all over the place. For a time it looked as though they would increase their lead, but gradually the game turned and shortly before half-time Jack Ball managed to throw off his marker, Armstrong, and hit a

fierce shot past McLaren in the Watford goal. The Town now attacked with a purpose and only desperate defending prevented Payne adding to the 12 goals that he had already put away that term. In one assault on the Watford goal, Payne was bowled over in the area and McLaren fell on him and appeared to be trying to push his face in the mud.

The referee had a long chat with McLaren before restarting play, but 'Crusader' of the Luton News was moved to say: "Why did the referee not give a penalty if there was a foul? Why did he lecture the goalkeeper if there was not a foul?"

Despite all the rough treatment, Payne made the second half his own as he scored a hat-trick, with all three goals the result of balls played through the middle. Payne's sheer speed and deadly finishing did the rest and his record was now a remarkable 15 goals from only nine starts.

By the time of the return, on February 20, 1937, Watford were in third position with the Town one place below, although we had two games in hand on the leaders.

Such was the interest in the match that a record crowd of 27,461 (including my grandfa-

ther who cycled to the game from Luton) packed into Vicarage Road to see if Watford could extend their unbeaten run to seven, or whether Payne could add to his goal total which by then extended to 33 from 26 games.

First blood went to the Town, with Payne the inevitable scorer, getting on the end of a perfect corner kick from winger George Stephenson.

Watford equalised almost immediately when Barnett put over a good centre for Fletcher to score with ease, and for a time the Luton defence was under a certain amount of pressure and conceded six corners in succession.

Gradually the storm was weathered and it was time for Payne to show that not only was he a natural goalscorer, but also a good leader of the line and a goal provider.

Firstly he set up Albert Dawes, after a flowing move, to put the Town ahead and then, when surrounded with three defenders who all expected him to shoot, he played a clever ball to Fred Roberts who put the game out of Watford's reach.

"When the histories of Watford and Luton Town come to be written, Saturday, February 20th 1937 may prove to have been a turning point in the career of one of the two clubs," so said the introduction to the special souvenir programme for the game.

Prophetic words indeed as Watford's promotion push fell away after this defeat, while the Town used the victory as a springboard for a run which finished in eventual promotion to Division Two.


20 YEARS AGO



VIEWROUND SPORT - LISTENING TO YOU LUTON TOWN FC... FANS SURVEY RESULTS

OVER two thirds of Luton Town fans have given their backing to the idea of an extra official sitting in the stands who could help with decisions - such as penalty and red/yellow card offences.

That was one of the results from our latest telephone poll, with 130 supporters questioned after last Saturday's game against Tranmere, when views were also sought on the previous home game against Port Vale.

The idea of an extra official, as used in international cricket, was given a "definite" yes by 45% of fans, with 22% saying "probably". 10% said "probably not" and 22% said "definitely not".

Concerns in football today:

We also asked about the recent developments in the investigations into match-fixing and financial irregularities, and approaching one in three (29%) believe this may be so, with two-thirds believing these are just isolated cases and the problems are not rife in the game.

We also asked questions about supporters' concerns in football today. The top three were: Inconsistency of officials 88%, size of transfer fees 83%, and the split between the Endsleigh and Premier leagues 72%.

Who will contest the FA Cup?

The overwhelming view of supporters was that the FA Cup Final will be between Manchester United and Tottenham.

Less than 5% feel that Everton, Wolves or Palace will make it to Wembley, with only one in five giving their backing to Wembley being used as a semi-final venue.

The matches:

Supporters were asked to score games in terms of excitement, performance and value for money.

The 2-1 win over Port Vale was very much 'a game of two halves' with the second providing the excitement.

But the 2-0 win over Tranmere was seen as much better value for money with an 8/10 rating. Luton's performance against Port Vale was

given 6.78, compared to an 8.46 against Tranmere. Vale received 5.89, with Tranmere disappointing with 4.24.


The highlights of the Tranmere game were the Luton goals - the first by Julian James mentioned by 61%, and the second by Wayne Biggins by 48%. Other mentions were the Biggins near miss midway through the second half, and Dwight Marshall hitting the post in the first period.

The overwhelming supporters' choice for Luton's player of the match against Port Vale was Dwight Marshall (38%), with Scott Oakes (23%) second.

For the Tranmere game, Oakes received 22%, James 20% and Preece 18%. Eric Nixon, the Tranmere keeper, was the overwhelming choice for Rovers with 43%.

The referees gained ratings of 6/10 for Port Vale, and 7/10 for Tranmere.




