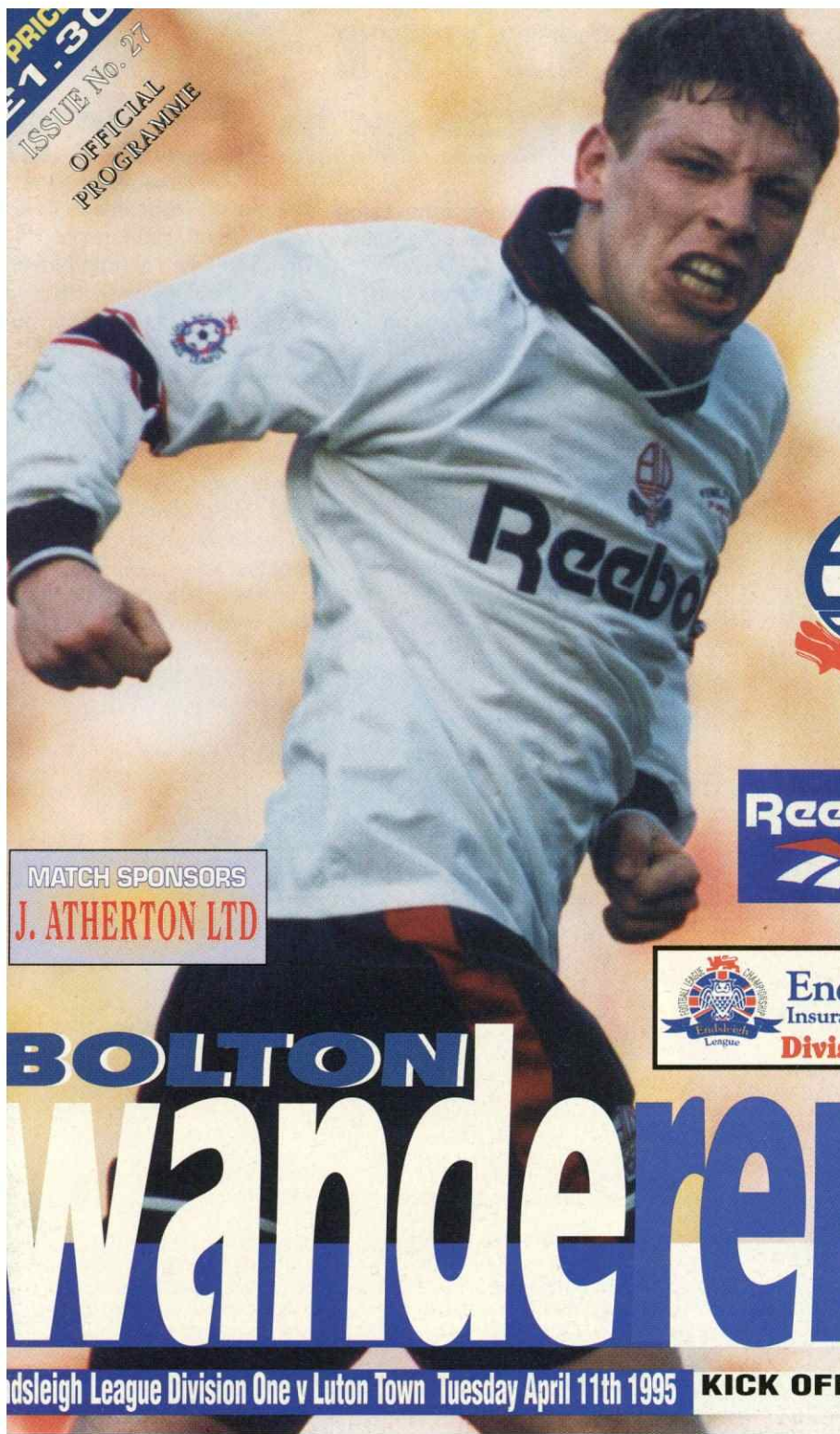

from the bench

It's a personal pleasure to welcome Luton Town Football Club to Burnden Park this evening - the Chairman, Mr David Kohler, and his fellow Directors and, from the manager's office here, an especially warm welcome to David Pleat and his staff.

David is a former colleague of mine in our playing days together in the 60's at Luton. He has had to work miracles on occasions as manager at Kenilworth Road - on transfer's for instance. Some clubs in the country are buying clubs and most of us are selling clubs.

The situation has been such at Luton down the years that they have had to

sell players from time to time. Obviously supporters get annoyed when certain players are sold but it's often the case that not only the manager but also the directors don't want to sell but they are forced into it by circumstances.

For his part, David has bought and sold players very wisely in his managerial career. Another very good friend of mine attached to the Luton club is John Moore. We started our careers together back in 63 so our friendship goes back a long way.

On the league front, the season is getting to be a very exciting stage. Games are running out fast and the temperature is starting to rise. It only seems a couple of weeks since we were looking at 20 games to go. Now we're down to seven.

If you're at the bottom end of the table these can be desperate times. If you're at the top you just keep driving on, maintaining the momentum. As Kenny Dalglish said the other day, after two successive away wins, it's not necessarily performances that count. It's results that matter.

That was our view of the game at Swindon last week.

We've been predicting it for ages and now we know for sure, the race for the

Premiership is going to go down to the wire. There are seven or eight club's entering the final bend and heading for the home straight and, it goes without saying, we aim to be there at the finish.

I've targeted a win in every game - why settle for anything less? You need targets in life. The centre-forward should be looking for goals - if he has seven games left, he should be looking at say ten goals. Defenders should be looking for clean sheets. Seven would be nice!

But we know every game from now on is going to be a big game - a cup final!

Trevor Peake

Club captain Trevor Peake has now passed his 38th birthday and he brings to Luton Town all the vast experience he has acquired from sixteen seasons in the Football League.

At six foot and nearly thirteen stone he has a commanding presence in the middle of the field. Until the age of 22 he played non league football for his local club Nuneaton Borough. He then moved to Lincoln City for nearly £30,000. This proved to be a great piece of talent spotting by manager Colin Murphy because four years later Peake moved into the top flight with Coventry City for £100,000. He stayed there for eight years and made over 300 cup and league appearances.

He gained an FA Cup winners medal in 1987. Luton paid £100,000 for Peake in 1991 and extended his contract last summer.

Luton Town's impressive performances this season have surprised many people. David Pleat has built up a good side and young players at the club like Paul Telfer are linking successfully with the veterans such as Trevor Peake and David Preece. Pleat uses the loan system for strengthening the side without spending money and Paul Allen came from Southampton for a month to give the club the benefit of his vast experience. Luton won 5-1 against Middlesbrough and have had good away victories at Stoke and Sheffield United.

David Pleat said of the win against Middlesbrough, "we won with a thoroughly professional victory. Anybody in this division can be beaten." At Stoke the victory came despite a 25th minute penalty miss. Carl Muggleton saved brilliantly from David Preece at the bottom of his right hand post. The scoreboard flashed up "maybe later, lad." Preece later got the winner.

At home though little has gone right. They lost 3-0 to Bolton despite completely dominating the first half. The same thing happened against Burnley, who snatched a 1-0 victory when Jurgen Sommer helpfully dropped the ball at the feet of Adrian Heath who passed for Liam Robinson for score. In mid season Welsh international forward John Hartson left for Arsenal at a price of £2.5 million but the club survived a scare when Spurs offered manager David Pleat the post of general manager. Pleat prefers to be involved with players and decided to stay at Luton. Former striker Kerry Dixon (who left for Millwall on transfer deadline day) said "David Pleat has made Luton his club. The style he plays brings everybody into the game. It is something special he has

got control of and deserves to take Luton Town to promotion or a Wembley Cup Final."

Off the field the club have been under scrutiny by a dietician who is taking an in-depth look at the team's eating habits. "She has banned cups of tea from the dressing room at half time" says Kerry Dixon. The players now have a glucose drink, jelly cubes, raisins and chocolate. If the players have beer, they have a pint of water afterwards because beer dehydrates them. The players say that it may all sound a little strange, but they are all feeling a lot fitter.

The club has transformed their stadium into one with an all-seater capacity of around 10,000. The club reached the cup final in 1959 and recently had a decade in the top flight. While David Pleat stays in charge, there is a good chance of even more glory to come.

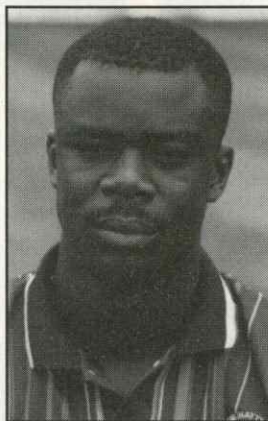
Tony Adcock was top scorer for Peterborough in their two season's in division one and joined Luton last summer.

Oldham born midfielder Steve Thompson progressed through Bolton's junior ranks, being a member of the team that won promotion from the second division of the Central League 1983.

He had signed professional forms in November 1982, making his league debut in a scoreless second division draw at Derby County the same month.

He made just three league appearances that term but became a regular in the side during 1983-84 - scoring his first league goal at Bournemouth in November 1983.

Although the club struggled at league level during this period he made a Wembley appearance in the 1986 Freight Rover Trophy final. In 1987/88 he missed just two games as the Wanderers won promotion from division four and in 1989 he tasted success at Wembley in the Sherpa Van Trophy final.

After 342 league games for the Trotters, Luton Town secured his signature in August 1991 for a £220,000 fee. His first league appearance for The Hatters came in a 2-1 first division win over Oldham at Kenilworth Road.

He made just five appearances for Luton before moving to Leicester City in October 1991 where he helped them win promotion to the Premier League last term.

Thompson returned to the North West last month when he became another ex-Trotter to sign for Burnley.

Alan Thompson produced another piece of magic last night to boost Bolton's promotion hopes.

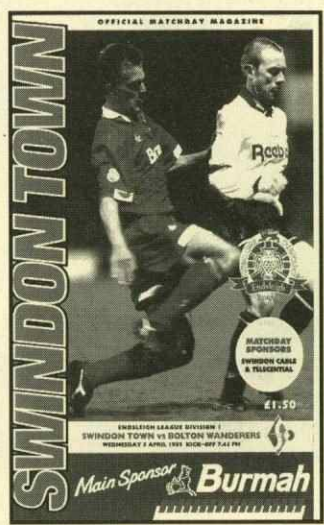

Every match Sunderland play from now until the end of the season is like a cup final. At the end of March with seven matches left to play they replaced their manager Mick Buxton following six defeats in seven games.

Peter Reid, the ex Wanderers favourite, is the manager Sunderland hope will help them beat the drop. If Reid manages to keep the Roker Park outfit in Division One he will be offered a new contract during the summer. If he fails Sunderland could look elsewhere.

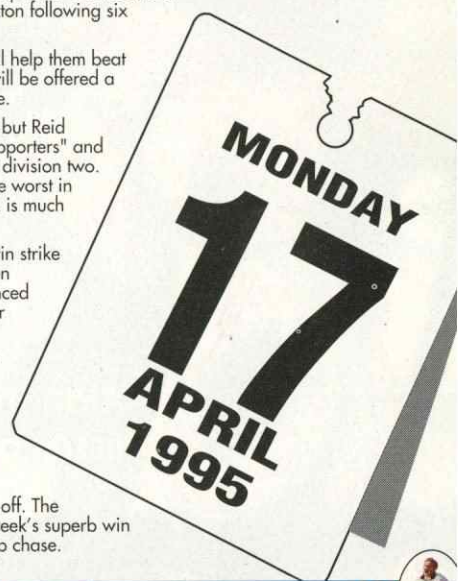
At the moment fallen giants Sunderland are hovering close to the drop zone but Reid insisted "I'm confident of keeping them up with the help of the clubs loyal supporters" and he seems to think that there's enough quality at the club to avoid the drop to division two. The corresponding fixture last season was Bolton's biggest crowd of the season.

Alan Thompson may not know it, but he joined a list of 'greats' who have scored for the Trotters in a major Wembley cup final. What would these players be worth today?

David Jack - scorer of the first ever goal at Wembley in 1923. Won FA Cup winners medals both that year and in 1926, when he hit the winner, before becoming the first player to be transferred for over £10,000 when he joined Arsenal in 1928.

John Smith - hit Bolton's second goal in the 1923 FA Cup final and also won another medal three years later. Also won a Scottish Cup winners medal in 1920 with Kilmarnock.

Billy Butler - Played in all three cup winning sides of the 1920's scoring the first goal against Portsmouth in 1929. **Harold Blackmore** - hit the second goal in 1929, one of his 122 Bolton goals in 165 appearances.

Willie Moir - Scottish international who notched Bolton's second against Blackpool in 1953. **Eric Bell** - wing half who scored twice in 118 appearances - one coming at Wembley in 1953 when he was injured.

Nat Lofthouse - scorer of Wanderers first goal in 1953 and both goals in the 1958 success along with 30 goals in 33 England appearances.

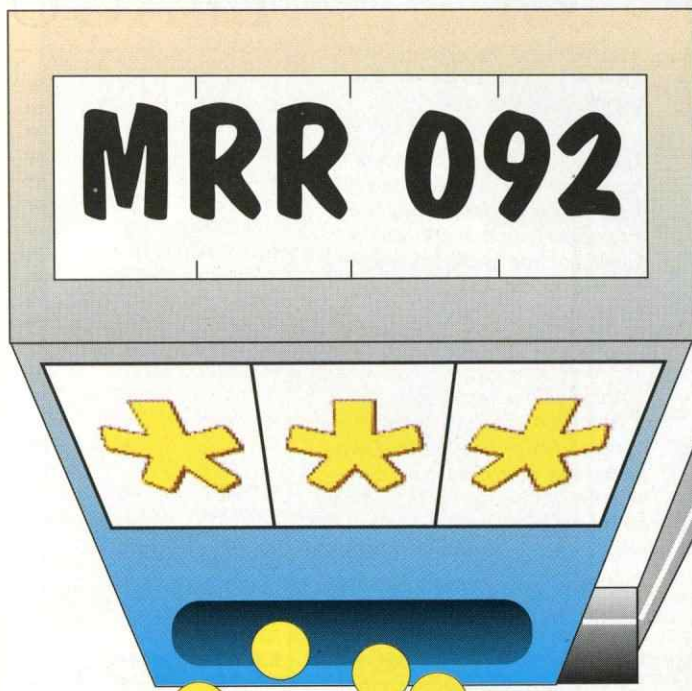

BLACKBURN ROVERS

The Ewood Park club were formed a year after the Wanderers (then known as Christ Church) in 1875. The first competitive match between the clubs came in what was the opening season of the Lancashire Cup in 1879/80. Having beaten All Saints in the first round by 5-2 Bolton then travelled to Blackburn only to go down 4-0.

In 1885 the Wanderers defeated Rovers by 5-1 in the semi final of the competition only to be disqualified for fielding ineligible players. A year later the Trotters won the prestigious trophy for the first time with a single goal victory over Rovers at Deepdale. Bolton's first FA Cup defeat came at the hands of Blackburn in November 1882. Since then the Wanderers have twice ousted their near neighbours on the way to winning the competition.

In 1929, after a 1-1 draw in the sixth round at Ewood before crowd of 62,522, Bolton ran out 2-1 winners in the replay before an even larger crowd of 65,295. Two Billy Butler goals won the day and he also went on to score in the semi final and final victories over both Huddersfield and Portsmouth.

In 1958 a crowd of 74,800 saw two goals from Ralph Gubbins send the Wanderers to Wembley with a 2-1 semi final defeat of Rovers at Maine Road. The sides were both original members of the football league with the first game ending in a 4-4 draw at Rovers in December 1888. A month later Bolton won the return 3-2 at Pikes Lane.

The first 90 league games all took place in the first division, the last being in February 1964 when Rovers registered their best win in Bolton with a 5-0 success. By the early seventies both Lancashire clubs were in the third division but were chasing promotion in 1972/73.

Former Rover John Byrom netted one of Bolton's goals in a 3-0 win at Ewood, whilst a Burnden crowd of 33,010 saw Rovers become the only side to defeat the Wanderers in the league on home soil in what was a championship term.

The club's haven't crossed paths in the league since 1982/83 when, in the old second division, a Tony Henry goal won the points for the Wanderers at Burnden.

Our overall record in the league against Rovers is Played 116 won 50 drawn 23 lost 43 for 188 against 186


