Rufus, Chapple, Sturgess, Robinson, Pardew, Bowyer, Mortimer, Leaburn, Nelson and Chandler.

All but Dean Chandler have played in the first team this season.

This threw up the chance for some young players to gain some more experience. Although we like to blood young players, as has been shown over the years, it is not right to blood them all at the same time. I imagine Southend must have felt it was their lucky day. DIFFERENCE



What a contrast to Saturday's match against Wolves. We all knew it was a big game, with both sides needing to win, and no quarter was given or asked for. I felt we deserved to come in at half time well in front but only had a 1-1 scoreline to show for our efforts.

What a difference in the second half there was as Wolves came out and went for our throats. We replied with some great attacking football and produced two superb goals from Colin Walsh and Paul Mortimer, only for Wolves to rally as in their two previous away games when they pegged back a 3-1 disadvantage to draw 3-3. The pressure they put us under in the final 15 minutes was something that, perhaps, the young players like Mike Ammann, Richard Rufus, and Jamie Stuart, have never experienced before, especially with the Wolves fans

behind our goal desperate for their team to get back in the game.

SWOPPED



As I have said previously about inconsistency if you look back over the season, the teams that have managed to keep settled sides are generally the ones that do well. So far this season all three keepers



UNDERSTANDING THE OFFSIDE LAW

BY KEN RIDDEN OF THE FA.

The guidelines circulated by FIFA to all referees have certainly resulted in more goals being scored this season. Spectators have been quick to welcome fewer 0-0 drawn matches and have been pleased to be able to applaud goals being scored through skilful play, arising from players being more able to hold and dribble the ball much more safely.

This season players have been protected more securely from foul, violent tackles from behind and, also not been needlessly denied exciting goals scored, even when teammates have been standing in offside positions but, more importantly, when those teammates have not been committing an offside offence.

BALANCE



In the past there was always a perceived tendency to find in favour of the defence when a marginal offside decision was made. The old philosophy of rather have a doubtful offside punishment than allow a doubtful goal has been replaced with a new emphasis on moving any fine balance slightly in favour of the attacking player.

The mood to encourage attacking play actually started in 1991 when the offside law was amended marginally so that a player level with the second last defender (the goalkeeper normally being the last defender) became not offside. Prior to 1991 level was offside.

This season referees and linesmen have been instructed to recognise more strictly that a player commits an offside offence only

an offside position. Play should proceed and the attack, down the right, should continue uninhibited.

INDICATE



As any offside judgement is made solely in terms of relative positions of players at the moment the ball is played, a player who is not in an offside position when one of his colleagues passes the ball to him, also does not become offside if he goes forward into an offside position during the flight of the ball.

In order to know accurately the direction and speed of the ball after it has been played a linesman must delay his judgement of offside, or not, a couple of seconds and spectators should not take any minor delay as a sign of indecision. The pause before waving the flag, or otherwise, is more likely to ensure a correct decision.

HEAD2HEAD with ALAN PARDEW

We often refer to unsung heroes in football. Players who graft, week in week out, without getting the recognition that is festooned upon others. These players are often the backbone of a team, and one such player is Alan Pardew.

Pards entered professional football later than most. He worked as a glazier and played non-league football for on the famous Huish slope for Yeovil Town before a £7,000 transfer to Crystal Palace. He will always be remembered as the scorer of the winning goal in the 1990 F.A. Cup semi final against Liverpool, but that counted for nothing when he was given a free transfer to Charlton in November 1991.

Pards was straight into the action. On his full debut for the Addicks, he scored in our 2-0 win over Bristol City but was later sent off, and he has scored consistently for the club ever since. In fact, he was leading scorer with nine in the 1992/93 season, and hit 11 last term. This season though, he has found the goals a little harder to come by, with just three so far.

"I like to think that I've taken on more defensive responsibilities", said Alan. "We were leaking goals left, right and centre early on, and it was felt that the midfield had to protect the back four. I had to adjust my game, although I feel that I've been getting forward more often in recent games."

Although results haven't been as we'd hoped for much of the season, Alan feels that his own form has been good.

"Since Christmas, I feel I've done reasonably well, but the results haven't been as good as we would have liked."

TRANSITIONAL



Clearly, the results have lacked consistency, and Alan feels that the signs were there as early as late August.

"The first game can often indicate what sort of season you may have and when you look at our first game we played some great football, and lost 5-2."

He also accepts that this has been a largely transitional season for the team, but although he is full of praise for the youngsters in the squad, he does not feel that the increased size of the squad is to blame for the inconsistency that has been a feature of our results this season.

"I don't think that the size of the squad has caused problems - the more players the better!"

Pards also feels that his experience may have helped in the development of some of our young talent.

"I like to think that I can influence the youngsters, and it's something that I enjoy", said Alan. "They're on the first step of the ladder with lots to learn, but this season may stand them in good stead." He continued, "youth is the way forward, but you need other players to influence the youngsters, both on and off the field. Brownie is a good example, he's gone on a stage, and he's now an established first team player."

From the way he speaks, it is clear that Alan is a potential coach or manager, and those who know him reckon he's excellent management material, it is something that the man himself is very keen on.

"I'd like to go into coaching", he said, "but there's a lot of playing in me yet!"

Talking of playing, and how much more there is, Alan is one of the players at the club who is presently out of contract at Charlton. He was reluctant to elaborate on his situation, but feels that he's got plenty more to offer.

"If you're playing well, then the contractual side of things should take care of itself", he said.

At present time, Pards is one of the senior pros at the club, and has seen many changes in his four years among the Addicks.

"The club has really moved forward in the last four years", said the 33 year old. "The board is good, the ground is good, the pitch is excellent, and all we need now is success. Next season will be the time to go for promotion." He went on, "with the squad we had this season, we should have done better, but we're all to blame. Maybe we would have gone up last year with Whytey up front, but we had him in our side this year and it still hasn't worked. We're in a good position, given our youngsters, but I feel we may need another experienced player, and by that, I don't mean an old player, but someone who is in their prime."

With four clubs coming down for next

season, and two potentially strong sides coming up, Pards feels that it will be hard next season, but we could still do well, providing we perform better against the top sides. He also reckons that our home form must improve, whilst at the same time recognising how difficult it can be against unadventurous teams.

"Look at Stoke", he said. "They came to The Valley and stuck eight men behind the ball. Mind you, the pitch at The Valley is so good, it can sometimes work against us. Teams come to us and know that if they can't play on our surface, they can't play at all."

But Pards knows that the bottom line is how we play, not how the opposition perform, and he is as enthusiastic as ever about the club's prospects. Whether he is part of our push for promotion next season remains to be seen, but whatever happens, the football world is sure to hear more of Alan Pardew.







FIRST FOCUS

Steve Dixon rounds up the latest First Division news

Easter, as everyone knows, is a crucial period in the football season. A couple of good results at this time of year can make a big difference to the League table - just ask Stoke City, who picked up maximum points from two vital relegation battles against Bristol City and Swindon.

Barnsley are involved in what seems to be a straight fight for the final play-off place with Reading, and both clubs have a tough game this weekend. Reading faced Bolton last night in a match that both sides had to win and it is a similar situation at Oakwell this afternoon, where Middlesbrough are the visitors. Barnsley did themselves a power of good last week with a slender win over Portsmouth, but were undone last week by a clever back heel by Neil Woods which sent them slipping to defeat at Grimsby.

If either Barnsley or Reading make the play-offs it will be a marvelous achievement for their inexperienced managers. Danny Wilson is in his first season as boss at Oakwell, while Jimmy Quinn and Mick Gooding have only been in charge of Reading for five months. Both clubs will need to do major ground redevelopment if they win promotion.


The match against Bristol City was particularly dramatic as Stoke came from behind to win with an 89th minute goal from Paul Peschisolido, a goal which may well have condemned the Bristol club to Division Two.

And Swindon will probably be joining them, after Toddy's Orlygsson's cracking drive won the match on Monday at the County Ground. Swindon are now facing a second successive relegation and Lou Macari, the Stoke boss who once managed Swindon, offered some sympathy to his former club.

"I didn't want to be here. I'd sooner have been somewhere else doing Swindon a favour," he said: "You don't spend five and half years with a club and not have any feeling for them."

Wolves recovered from their 3-2 setback at The Valley last Saturday to resume their chase for a play off slot with a home win over Oldham. It wasn't all plain sailing for Wanderers, even after David Kelly had given the home side a 32nd minute lead. Wolves, who were well beaten by Charlton last Saturday, conceded an equaliser to Paul Bernard before half time, but Kelly grabbed the winner with just eight minutes remaining to secure three priceless points for Graham Taylor's two men.

With just four to play, the title may be out of Wolves' reach, but there could still be a great deal riding on that final game of the season, against Swindon at Molineux.

TARGET



Last term saw The Hatters battling against relegation for much of the season but they gained recognition with a great run in the F.A. Cup beating Newcastle and West Ham before eventually going out in the semi-finals at Wembley 2-0 to Chelsea.

This season has seen the sale of youngster John Hartson to Arsenal for £2.5 million and Kerry Dixon to Millwall but David Pleat has strengthened his squad with the signing of target man John Taylor from Bradford City for £200,000.

Goals have not been a problem for the Bedfordshire side, with Dwight Marshall netting 13 times and midfielders Paul Telfer

A LATE CATCH

If you had told Luton Town boss David Pleat at the start of the season that his side would have been safe from relegation with eight matches to go he would have settled for that situation. It wasn't a case of not being ambitious, just realistic, the club had financial problems and a number of players were out of contract.

Now Pleat can look back on a reasonably satisfying season that has had mixed fortunes and has again seen his astute management keeping the club afloat on the pitch and also solving some of the financial problems with the £2million plus sale of John Hartson to Arsenal.

PROBLEM

"We have missed a number of players, like Ceri Hughes and Des

Linton, at key times and have been disappointing at home on occasions but we have produced some excellent away performances", said Pleat.

"Our biggest problem has been giving away late goals and in too many games we have not shown enough resolve."

After bankrolling the Hartson money, Pleat signed striker John Taylor from Bradford City and midfielder Rob Matthews from Notts County for £260,000 so he is well in credit. "We certainly have some pounds in the bank but not enough points on the board to have made an impression", he said.

"We are very much like Charlton", said Pleat. "but we do not have a lovely stadium like them."

STRENGTHEN

The Luton boss had the opportunity earlier in the season to return to his former club Tottenham Hotspur but he decided to stay with Luton and he will be looking to strengthen the team next season for a promotion push.

His team will be looking for revenge this afternoon having been beaten 1-0 by Charlton at Kenilworth Road earlier in the season and they will want to bounce back from a 1-0 defeat against Reading at home on Monday.

Matches between the two clubs usually provide plenty of good football - so let's hope today's match lives up to expectations.

Paul came to The Valley as an apprentice and signed professional forms in October 1979. He was capped 10 times for England youth and soon established himself in the Charlton forward line alongside Derek Hales.

His 18 goals in 1980-81 made a large contribution to our promotion to Division Two. He followed that up with 13 strikes in the following campaign and the First Division club's were lining up to sign him. Paul's Charlton career totalled 100 matches in which he netted 31 goals.

Luton signed him in July 1982 for £250,000 plus striker Steve White in part exchange. His career continued to blossom at Kenilworth




