Six of the best! Patterson joins Westley's recruits

DEFENDER Darren Patterson joined Luton Town on Monday, from Crystal Palace, for an initial fee of £150,000 which could top the £200,000 mark depending on appearances.

Patterson became manager Terry Westley's sixth signing, and the Luton boss said he had been trailing the Northern Ireland international for some weeks.

"We have been monitoring the situation for over a month, and Darren is a centre-back who has been on our minds since pre-season," said Mr Westley.

"He has been out of contract, and having spoken to a lot of people we decided that he was one of the players we wanted to bring to Luton.

"We had to wait for the tribunal hearings for Paul Telfer and Steve Davis to see where we stood regarding finance," said Mr Westley, "and when that was completed we stepped up our efforts to sign Darren.

"The fee has changed several times, but we delighted that it has been sorted out. The boy is an out-and-out winner, a determined young man, who has progressed into the Premiership and played 40 times for Crystal Palace last season.

"They had a good defensive record despite being relegated, so maybe it was the front players who

let them down, and yet they have gone for the big money."

The 25-year-old Patterson admitted he felt the time was right to leave Selhurst Park, and was relieved to have his future sorted out.

"I came to meet Terry Westley, Mick McGiven and the chairman, and they all impressed me," said the Northern Ireland international.

"I was pleased about what they said about where they wanted me to play, and the whole set-up seems right for me.


"Palace had made me an offer, but with a change there I felt the time was right to go. We were all disappointed to go down last season, but I'm looking forward to the fresh challenge with Luton now.

"I've only played at Luton a couple of times, but the more I spoke with Terry the more I was impressed and think we can make a good go of it."

He has played eight times for Northern Ireland, and started his league career with Wigan before moving to Selhurst Park. He is in the Irish squad for their latest European Championship match, and will hope to line-up alongside former Luton duo Iain Dowie and Phil Gray for Bryan Hamilton's side.







MARK BLAKE - Former club record signing at £360,000, Nottingham-born Mark is equally at home at either right-back or in midfield after joining the club on transfer deadline day in 1994. Formerly with Aston Villa, Wolves and Portsmouth.

BRIAN CAREY - Republic of Ireland international central defender who failed to break into the first team at Manchester United, but came to prominence on loan at Wrexham. Cost City £250,000 in the summer of 1993.

PHIL GEE - Long-time favourite at Derby County, Phil had a loan spell with Plymouth last season but not before he had struck City's first ever Premiership goal. Moved to Filbert Street in March 1992 in an exchange deal also featuring Ian Ormondroyd and Paul Kitson.

SIMON GRAYSON - Player of the Season in 1994 and City's victorious Wembley skipper, Yorkshire-born Simon continued to operate at both fullback and in midfield last season. A £50,000 signing from Leeds in March 1992 and the brother of Yorkshire cricketer Paul.

EMILE HESKEY - YTS striker who was given his chance at QPR last season during an injury and illness crisis.

COLIN HILL - Uxbridge-born Northern Ireland international who has been with City since 1992, initially on loan from Sheffield United, and then the subject of a £200,000 permanent move. Central defender formerly with Arsenal and Colchester, who also played for Maritimo in Portugal.

JULIAN JOACHIM - Now an England Under-21 international, Julian missed much of the Premiership season with a foot injury. Signed a new three-year contract in the summer.

ZELJKO KALAC - Born in Sydney and nicknamed "Spider", he stands 6'7" tall and dominates the goalmouth. Signed for £760,000 from Sydney United during the summer and is already a regular choice for the Australian national team.

JAMIE LAWRENCE - A £125,000 signing from Doncaster in January 1995. Luton fans may remember him playing against the Hatters for Sunderland in October 1993.

NEIL LEWIS - Highly-rated midfielder and a product of the YTS scheme.

DAVID LOWE - Moved to Filbert Street from Ipswich in July 1992 for £200,000. Operated in midfield last season, but usually plays up front.





When Goals were scored at Filbert Street




When Goals were scored away from home




Average Goals per Match

SAM McMAHON - Made his debut from the bench last season and almost scored instantly with a spectacular long range effort. Classy midfielder who hails from Newark.

GARRY PARKER - Signed from Aston Villa in February 1995 in a deal involving Franz Carr, Garry started his career at Luton and also played for Hull and Nottingham Forest. Experienced midfielder hoping to be a major influence in 1995/96.

LEE PHILPOTT - Signed from Cambridge for £350,000 in November 1992, having started his career with Peterborough. Skilful left winger who has also filled in as an emergency left-back.

KEVIN POOLE - Goalkeeper who was voted Player of the Year last season, when his displays kept City in the Premiership for longer than they might have expected. Formerly with Villa, Northampton, Middlesbrough and Hartlepool and a bargain £40,000 signing in July 1991.

IWAN ROBERTS - Welsh international striker who topped City's scoring charts last term. Cost £300,000 from Huddersfield in November 1993, having started his career with Watford.

MARK ROBINS - City's second million pound man when snapped up from Norwich last January. Always a prolific scorer who first came to prominence with Manchester United. Capped at Under 21 level by England.

RICHARD SMITH - Local born defender who can operate either in central defence or at fullback. Suffered a string of injuries last season, culminating in a hernia operation.

SCOTT TAYLOR - One of Mark McGhee's protegees from Reading, who moved to Filbert Street for £500,000 in July this year. Key player for the Royals in their push to the play-off final last term.


STEVE WALSH - Central defender who was converted into a striker, and missed most of each of the last two seasons with knee injuries, but earned his place in City folklore by netting both goals in the 1994 play-off final victory over Derby. Set to reach 300 appearances and 50 goals for the club this season, since his £100,000 move from Wigan in June 1986.

MIKE WHITLOW - Left back who joined Leicester from Leeds for £250,000 in March 1992.

JIMMY WILLIS - Central defender who hails from Liverpool, and has gained experience with Stockport, Darlington and Bradford. A £200,000 signing in December 1991.

STEVE CORICA - Summer signing from the Marconi club in Sydney.

Meet the Manager



MARK McGHEE was the man charged with keeping Leicester City in the Premiership midway through last season, when Brian Little left Filbert Street for Aston Villa.

McGhee arrived at Leicester from Reading, having taken the Royals into Division One and set them up for a further promotion challenge last term.

The former Aberdeen striker couldn't keep Leicester in the top flight, and this season's campaign has seen the Foxes win at Sunderland but lose at home to Stoke.

A Hatter and ...a Fox

Although born in Liverpool, **MIKE NEWELL** made his league debut for Crewe in 1983 before joining Wigan on a free transfer during the same year.


After enjoying some success at Springfield Park, including scoring against Brentford in the Freight Rover Final win at Wembley in 1985, David Pleat brought him to Kenilworth Road for £90,000 in January 1986 as a replacement for the injured Emeka Nwajobi.

Newell went straight into the Division One side and scored a highly respectable six goals in 16 outings in 1985/86 before being ever-present the following season and ended top scorer as the Town finished in their highest ever position of seventh.

The highspot of his career at Kenilworth Road was a hat-trick in the 4-1 thrashing of Liverpool at Kenilworth Road in October 1986 (seems like yesterday!) in front of an incredulous crowd of 13,140.

It came as a surprise when new manager Ray Harford allowed him to go to Leicester in September 1987 for a fee of £350,000 (a Leicester record), but he explained that we had an embarrassment of riches at the time and he did not like playing Newell and Mick Harford together!

After a successful spell at Filbert Street,




where he eventually joined up with David Pleat again, the First Division beckoned and he joined Everton in 1989 in a player exchange deal which valued him at close to £1 million.

His last move, two years later, took him to Blackburn where he scored the penalty in the play-off final, against Leicester, that took Rovers back to Division One in place of the Town.

Although now looked upon by Ray Harford as cover for Shearer and Sutton at Ewood Park, it is generally regarded that he would walk into most Premiership sides. - *Roger Wash.*


Goal Scorers


TOWN keeper Juergen Sommer beats Dave Regis to the ball.




THE Hatters defend in depth as Southend step up the pressure during the second-half.





Please leave the area of the ground as quickly as possible by the route directed. Your co-operation will be most appreciated.







McBride lifts the gloom

SEASON 1959/60 was not a good one for the Town. After reaching the FA Cup Final the previous campaign, regular Luton followers realised that this was probably the club's 'swan song' and that new manager Syd Owen was likely to have problems achieving good results with a rapidly ageing squad.

No new signings of note had been made and after a surprising opening day draw at Everton the team went into rapid decline, losing 11 and drawing four of their next 18 games. By the time of the visit to Leicester at the beginning of December it was no surprise to see the Town propping up Division One.

Leicester were also struggling and they were immediately above us in the table so the crowd of 16,700 that gathered at Filbert Street were about to witness an early 'four pointer'.


As well as having a leaky defence we were encountering problems in scoring goals and decided to move veteran Allan Brown back to the forward line and recall record goalscorer Gordon Turner, even though he had been going through a lean patch over the previous two years.

The game opened at a furious pace with Luton winger Billy Bingham a constant threat and it was that player who gave us an interval lead with a ferocious shot. The second half was only seconds old when Leicester bagged the equaliser with Appleton beating Alan Collier in the Luton goal from close range.

From then on it was end to end stuff with Brown restoring Luton's advantage only to see Wills level once again for Leicester. When Dave Pacey made it 3-2 with 10 minutes remaining it looked likely that a rare victory was about to be achieved, but Leicester redoubled their efforts and in the onslaught that followed the Luton defence could not hold out and McDonald scored the third equaliser with only a couple of minutes left.

After the game the local press talked of the "vastly improved performance", "turned corners" and the like, but it proved to be false optimism as the Town lost at home to Newcastle the following week.

By the time of the return, both sides had fought

through FA Cup runs, with the only difference being that we had been thrashed in round five by Wolves, while Leicester were through to the quarter-finals coincidentally against the team from Molineux. But whereas the Town were still bottom of the table, Leicester had enjoyed a revival and were now six places above us and eight points better off.

In a desperate bid to bolster the forward line the Luton directors dug deep and spent £12,500 on Wolves forward Joe McBride, who had been at Molineux only three months following a transfer from Kilmarnock for a similar figure. As it turned out, it was revealed that we had tried to secure McBride the previous December along with Birmingham City, and were obviously pleased that he did not appear to fit in at Wolverhampton.

Despite the 5-1 defeat in the FA Cup the previous Saturday a loyal crowd of 18,691 turned

up at Kenilworth Road to have a look at McBride, and see whether the apparently hopeless position could be turned round. The supporters were not disappointed with the early effort, but nothing seemed to be going our way when goalkeeper Ron Baynham received a shoulder injury which clearly affected his performance.

After 15 minutes we were given a penalty for handball, but the normally reliable Turner saw his spot-kick saved by Banks in the Leicester goal. The players kept on battling away however, and as the game wore on the ball rarely left the Leicester half with Banks and the wayward finishing of the Luton forwards the only things in the way of a landslide victory.

The crowd had immediately taken to McBride who showed some good touches as well as a willingness to get into the thick of the action, and it was some clever play by the new boy that finally earned the breakthrough with 15 minutes left on the clock.

After a tenacious dribble down the wing he found enough space to send over a tantalising cross that was headed home by Turner. The fairy tale start for McBride was completed however, in the final minute, when he passed to George Cummins and raced upfield for the return which he threw himself at, and ended up in the net alongside the ball! A new hero had arrived.

McBride said afterwards: "It was great to be on the winning side in my first game here. I found the pace a bit faster than I've been used to lately, but playing with such grand team-mates helped a lot."

GETTING married, seeing a change of manager for both club and national team, and all this whilst representing your country in both North and South America, meant it was quite a summer for Hatters' American keeper Juergen Sommer.

Now he's back in England, and looking forward to the new season with Luton Town, realising there's real competition for places at Kenilworth Road especially for the number one shirt.

The summer excursions have taken him to four different countries and five different cities in the USA, as the United States built upon their World Cup showing in 1994 to finish fourth in the Copa America in Uruguay.

Juergen missed out on the US Cup in May opting for a break from football after his wedding, and rejoined the national squad in

Uruguay before playing an active role in a four-team tournament played in the USA in August.

"With a new manager in charge of the national team, I felt it was important to stay and play as much as possible, especially with competition from Kasey Keller and Brad Freidel," said Juergen.

"I didn't play in the first tournament of the summer because it was just after we had got married, and I decided to have a break which I didn't really have last summer.

"I felt that caught up with me by mid-season last season and I didn't want that to happen again, so I didn't join up with the team until the Copa America.

"The team performed very well, finishing fourth after we had lost narrowly to Brazil in the semi-finals, and we all gained great experience from playing the likes of Argentina, Chile, Brazil and Mexico."

Then it was back to the States for a four-team tournament where the USA were joined by Italian side Parma, Boca Juniors from Argentina, and Portugal's Benfica.

The Giants Stadium in New Jersey was one of the venues enjoyed by Juergen as he played in all the matches.

"It was a chance for me to establish myself in the squad in front of the new manager," he pointed out, "although it meant delaying my return to England until just before the start of the season."

And so back to Luton, where the summer had seen one or two changes at Kenilworth Road!

"New faces and a new atmosphere, and Terry has done a tremendous job and there's a lot of excitement and desire amongst the players."

He is well aware too of the competition for places throughout the squad, and especially for the number one shirt.

"Kelvin played some great matches at the end of last season and there's competition for every place now which is a good environment to be in, because it makes you want to train and work harder," said Juergen.

"We need that depth in the squad because I don't believe you can ask 11 players to play in all the league and cup games for the whole season.

"I don't take anything for granted, and the manager has made it clear that he would go out and look for another goalkeeper if he is not happy with Kelvin or myself."

"I will do my best to keep my place, and if not included will work hard to stay in the picture."

So quite a summer, and the South American weather seems to have followed the giant American back across the Atlantic.

Once back in the UK, Juergen was on the bench for the opening game against Norwich before being recalled for the Coca-Cola first leg against Bournemouth.

He will be looking forward to the forthcoming trip to the New Den when Keller will be in opposition, but may not meet up with Freidel as the keeper has been refused a work permit to enable him too to play in Division One, at Sunderland.

Freidel encountered similar problems when Newcastle were interested in signing him, and the breakdown of his move to Roker Park has meant a starting place this season for former Hatters favourite Alec Chamberlain. - SIMON OXLEY.






