





Introducing...

Tonight we welcome Luton Town to Blundell Park for our second home League game of the season. The 'Hatters' under new manager Terry Westley, a former coach at Kenilworth Road, are hoping for a better campaign than they had in 1994-95 which saw them finish a rather disappointing 16th in the final First Division table - ten points clear of the relegation zone but 18 points short of a play-off place.

Since the end of last season there have been a few changes at the club. Former boss Pleat moved to Sheffield Wednesday while one or two players also departed, including Paul Telfer to Coventry City and David Preece to Derby County. Luton therefore have had to rebuild, and into the camp have come four useful players: David Oldfield (from Leicester), Gavin Johnson (from Ipswich), Bontcho Guentchev (from Ipswich) and defender Steve Davis (from Burnley), the latter for £500,000.

Still at the club are experienced goalkeepers Fred Barber, now 32 and The American Juergen Sommer (26) plus young 19 year-old 'keeper Kelvin Davis, who is highly rated at Kenilworth Road. In defence Luton can call on the services of David Greene, an Eire U/21 international; Richard Harvey, who agreed a new contract in

the summer; Julian James, a former England U/21 player; Marvin Johnson who has been at the club 10 years; Des Linton, once of Leicester; the veteran Trevor Peake who won an FA Cup winners medal with Coventry in 1987, new man Steve Davis and Mitchell Thomas, ex-Tottenham and West Ham.

To do battle in the midfield, manager Westley can choose from Welsh international Ceri Hughes; the versatile Gavin Johnson; Tony Thorpe, recruited from YTS in 1992; Gary Waddock, ex-Q.P.R. and Bristol Rovers; Scott Oakes, son of the Showaddywaddy star Trevor, who can also play up front; Matt Woolgar, a graduate from the YTS; David Oldfield, in his second spell at the club and Graham Alexander who can also defend if required.


The Hatters' attackers will be chosen from Guentchev, a Bulgarian international; Jamie Woodsford, who made his debut last season; Dwight Marshall, who cost £150,000 from Plymouth; Rob Matthews, secured from Notts County and £200,000 acquisition John Taylor from Bradford City, who hit three goals in nine games at the end of last season. Luton will be a difficult side to beat. They enjoy attacking but defend well. It should be an interesting contest.

The Manager

Terry Westley, the former coach at Kenilworth Road, was appointed team manager of Luton Town (in succession to David Pleat) in July of this year. He had been on the 'Hatters' coaching staff since 1991 and is now the club's 20th manager.

Once a player with Ipswich Town, Terry played non-League football for Bury St. Edmunds and also for Diss Town, being player-manager of the latter.

He returned to Portman Road in 1988 to take over their School of Excellence before Pleat persuaded him to join Luton. Since then he has been responsible for the youth set up at the club and has seen the likes of John Hartson and Kevin Davis progress in the game.

Culture Corner



This is a must for every statistical-minded football fan - it's the 1995-96 official PFA Footballers Factfile which gives you pen-picture biographies of over 2,000 professional footballers.

The book comprising 256 pages is edited by Barry Hugman and published by Stanley Paul. The selling price is a bargain £8.99 and it's available from all leading bookshops.

Over 100 contributors have sent in information for the book and I will admit, it's a blessing in disguise for all the folks who have to compile programme notes on the visiting teams.

There aren't too many photographs contained in the book, but who wants pictures when there are so many facts and figures to digest. It's a good read, and a must for everyone who dabbles in individual players' facts and figures.

This evening we take a look at how the opening few fixtures of this new season have gone (last weekend's games have not been included).

MARINERS IN THE LIONS' DEN

Current leaders Millwall defeated the Mariners 2-1 at home on the first Saturday and then followed up with a hard-earned, but deserved, 1-0 victory at Port Vale a week later, when veteran striker Kerry Dixon found the net shortly after the hour mark.

WOLVES HOLD ROVERS



Mariners' magical moments

Mariners had beaten both Southend United (4-1) and Notts County (2-1) at home and away and had gained a 1-1 draw at Middlesbrough.

David Pleat's Luton side were out for revenge after Dave Gilbert's last minute free-kick had given the Mariners a 2-1 victory at Kenilworth Road back in November. But it was to be no revenge mission at Blundell Park!

A pre-match downpour had turned the pitch into something of a quagmire hardly comparable to the passing game and consequently the 4,615 fans may not have expected the feast of quality football, the Mariners were about to serve up.

Lying in 8th position with 41 points to their credit, Grimsby kicked-off towards the Osmond End and by half-time were two goals to the good.

Jim Dobbin rolled in the first on eight minutes after Woods had sprung the Luton offside trap and then Gilbert rammed home from close range just before the half-hour mark.


The boys in black and white had controlled the game and the second half was to continue in that pattern. Woods looped in a fortunate third, the ball flying off the striker's knee and over the luckless Sommer in the Luton goal on 73 minutes and within four minutes it was 4-0 with the classic Watson goal which we review in detail below.

Luton's misery was completed when Tommy Watson was again on hand to put the finishing touch to a good build up. Grimsby Town's classical football in attack coupled with an immaculate performance by Peter Handyside and Paul Crichton's two fine reaction saves deservedly gave them their biggest win of the season. Tommy Watson's first goal of the season followed an intricate bout of passing and movement involving McDermott, Dobbin and Mendonca. As the diagram shows, full-back 'Macca' plays the ball in to Mendonca's feet. His one touch lay-off sets up Dobbin to knock a first time ball into the 'channel' with Neil Woods already spinning into space.

The Luton defence struggling to cope with the split runs of Mendonca, after his lay-off, and Woods synchronizing with Dobbin's perfectly weighted pass. Meanwhile Tommy starts his run in from the touchline and is found with a backheel by Neil 'Eyes in the back of my head' Woods. With the goal at his mercy the Town No.7 takes the ball on, before a confident finish in the corner of the net. The perfect end to a great team move!





Q - If Alan Buckley became England manager would Tony Rees play for England?

A manager is someone who gets results from people. In all professions, managers need to have employees who can understand instructions and put them into practice effectively. When a boss moves on, he (or she) often takes their most effective staff with them.

In football it is no different and sometimes players who are more naturally skilful are not picked ahead of players who can carry out the manager's instructions.

Look at the England side of the early 1980s, when the manager was Bobby Robson, he had a few Ipswich players in the team that surprised a number of people at the time.

Although the last two England managers' selections have not been littered with ex-Villa and/or Spurs players, Graham Taylor always got the best out of David Platt, and Darren Anderton has been in fine form under Terry Venables.

Probably the best example of an effective, but not overly skilful or flamboyant, player scaling great heights is John McGovern. In the late '70s, McGovern helped win the old First Division championship and European Cup with Nottingham Forest.

He was often seen as being Brian Clough's most effective 'foot soldier.'

Another ex-Forest player managed by Cloughie is Brian Laws. Some fans hope he will build a 'North East connection' at Blundell Park.

Certainly the signing of Middlesbrough-born Nicky Southall from Hartlepool and the return to goalscoring form of Steve Livingstone (also born in Middlesbrough) is both ironic and impressive.

Our next away game will be against Wolverhampton Wanderers on Saturday 9th September, 1995, kick-off 3.00pm. Already marked down as favourites to win the First Division title this season, Wolves drew their opening two League games of 1995-96, 2-2 at Tranmere and 1-1 at home to Black Country neighbours West Bromwich Albion, before playing at Roker Park against Sunderland last Saturday.

We lost narrowly at Molineux last season, and no doubt this time round the Mariners will be aiming to reverse that scoreline (at least).

Unless something dramatic happens during the course of the next seven months or so, Wolves should be in with a shout when the prizes are being handed out at the end of the season. But football is a funny game. They looked all set to win promotion last term only to lose out to Bolton Wanderers in the play-off semi-finals.

Will they go one better this time round. We shall see.

NB.....Molineux has a capacity of 27,500 and 24,000 fans are expected when the Mariners go there next month.



On this day in history ...

AUGUST 29th

1931

Forward Bill Chalmers, Town's new signing from Newcastle, makes his debut v. Huddersfield Town. Chalmers made only six appearances for the Mariners, though after the war he went on to manage Italian giants, Juventus.

1951

An early 'local derby' brings Lincoln City to Cleethorpes. Jimmy Herton and recent signing Fred Marlow both find the net over the eventual Third Division North champions, with Town finishing runners-up.

1962

Ron Rafferty, in his last season with Grimsby, scores Town's goal in a 2-1 home defeat by Portsmouth. The Mariners' return to Second Division soccer was proving hard, with this game marking the start of six successive defeats.

1964
