
It emphasises the point of competitive away, with flair at home, but always remembering that you can't afford to give away goals and must base things on achieving a clean sheet.

achieved but needs further inclusions, that of top quality, and this is one of the reasons I shall be flying out after today's game to Denmark to watch a Danish midfield player who is reportedly in the mould of a playmaker, a gifted passer, and maybe the link between the back and the front players.

On the goings side since my appointment, we have obviously lost David Preece and Paul Telfer - two influential players over recent seasons - and this week Juergen Sommer has signed for Queens Park Rangers.

We wish him well, and hope he furthers his career and ambitions. We know that Luton Town and the previous management have given Juergen a marvellous platform on which to start his career, and although he had his critics amongst some sections of the crowd he has the attributes to be an outstanding goalkeeper.

The only decision then is whether the

price is right for Luton Town, and considering Juergen cost the club nothing and within a short period of time has moved for over £600,000 we consider this to be good business.

We are now looking at replacements, and this week welcomed Boskovic Bosko, the Slovenian national keeper, to Kenilworth Road for a trial period.

He has played for Hajduk Split, and in World Cup matches for Slovenia.

It has been a demanding first two months as manager regarding the outgoings and incoming of players, but the main priority is, and will always remain, the football and the coaching of the players. We now look forward to the return of one of the outgoing players.

I have been informed that there has not been a home win since April 8 when we beat Notts County.

Let's hope that today the team performs to its full capabilities and sends you away with that home win.

LUTON Town defender David Greene has been included in the Republic of Ireland's Under-21 squad for their UEFA Championship clash in Austria on Tuesday.

Centre-half David was a regular in Eire's matches last season, and captained the side against England at St James' Park, Newcastle. But new signing Darren Patterson is set to pull out of the Northern Ireland senior squad for their match against Portugal.

## Town chairman questions transfer tribunal rulings

LUTON Town chairman David Kohler is appealing to the Football League against the transfer tribunal decision which valued Steve Davis at £750,000.

The move follows an earlier decision to value Southend centre-half Andy Edwards at £400,000 for a transfer to Birmingham.

Southend have complained to the league that if £750,000 was right for Davis, they deserved the same for Edwards, whilst Mr Kohler is pointing out that if the valuation for Edwards was right then the figure for Davis should be similar.

"Andy Edwards is a centre-half, and so is Steve Davis," said Mr Kohler. "Edwards is nearly 25 and played around 150 games for Southend, whilst Davis is 26 and played about 170 games for Burnley.

"Where's the difference? We say the players are very similar, and if £400,000 was right for Edwards, we are losing out."

Commenting on the departure of Juergen Sommer, Mr Kohler said: "We were faced with a situation where Juergen was out of contract.

There was a possibility over the summer of him going back to America, in which case the fee we would have received for him would have been a pittance compared to what we value him at.

"Queens Park Rangers offered us a fee which we felt would not be bettered at a tribunal, and was one we felt we should accept."



## 'BALD EAGLE' SPREADS HIS WINGS AND LANDS IN DERBY!



TO cap it all..... Jim Smith has the task of returning Derby County to the top flight.

JIM Smith, the 54-year-old no-nonsense Yorkshireman, signed a two-year contract with Derby County in mid-June after giving up his role as chief executive of the Football League Manager's Association.

The highly experienced Smith, who has been a league manager for almost 23 years, took over his eighth league club after spells at Colchester United, Blackburn Rovers, Birmingham City, Oxford United, Queens Park Rangers, Newcastle United and Portsmouth.

He is no stranger to success under difficult circumstances having guided Colchester to promotion from the old fourth division in 1974, and then taking Birmingham City into Division One in 1980.

The undoubtedly highlights of his career arrived during his days at the Manor Ground when Oxford were crowned as champions in successive seasons in the mid-80s as they stormed their way out of the old third division into the top flight.

A League Cup losers medal followed in 1986 with Queens Park Rangers as Smith's side were ironically beaten 3-0 by Oxford just one season after he had left the club to take over at Loftus Road.

When the former Sheffield United, Aldershot, Halifax Town and Lincoln City player moved on to Portsmouth in 1991, he came within a whisker of taking the coast side into the Premiership in his second season in charge.

Portsmouth missed out on promotion by one goal, having been pipped by West Ham, and then were beaten in the play-off semi-finals by Leicester City.

Smith is ready for what he describes as a "new and exciting challenge" in hoping to guide Derby back into the top flight after what will be a five-year absence.

He admitted: "Derby is a football city with a great tradition and deserves the sort of championship success which Brian Clough and Dave Mackay brought to the club.

"Like them, I believe in winning with quality and style.


"I would not have given up my position with the Managers' Association for any other club but Derby County. I had one or two other offers, but I was in a position to be selective and for me, Derby was the one."

Derby County Football Club is a club steeped in history and tradition. Formed 110 years ago as an off-shoot of Derbyshire County Cricket Club, Derby County were among the 12 founder members of the Football League when it was initiated in 1888.

At the end of last season the Rams parted company with manager Roy McFarland, now boss of Premiership side Bolton Wanderers, and appointed Smith to the hot-seat.

The 95/96 season promises excitement off the pitch as well, for Derby are redeveloping their famous Baseball Ground at a cost of £10 million into a 26,000 all-seater stadium.



STEVE SUTTON - Signed for Derby in March 1992 although he made his debut in 1985 when he spent 14 matches on loan from Nottingham Forest. Was also on loan at Kenilworth Road before the permanent move to the Baseball Ground, and returned to the Rams first team in October last year after Martin Taylor broke a leg.

RUSSELL HOULT - Injuries to both Martin Taylor and Steve Sutton prompted the Rams to take Russell on loan from Leicester City towards the end of last season, and Jim Smith made that move permanent in the close season with a £300,000 transfer.

JASON KAVANAGH - A product of the FA School at Lilleshall, Jason has continued to develop at the Baseball Ground following his tribunal fixed move from Birmingham City while still 16.

SHANE NICHOLSON - Despite being only 21 when Derby signed him from Lincoln City, had already played 150 league games for the Red Imps following his debut as a 17-year-old.

DARREN WASSALL - Seen as Des Walker's replacement at Nottingham Forest when the England defender left for Sampdoria at the end of the 91/92 season, but opted to join Derby in a £550,000 deal.

GARY ROWETT - Came to Derby at the start of the season as part of the deal which took Craig Short to Everton. The former Cambridge midfielder is valued at over £200,000 and has played at sweeper for the Rams in the opening games.

DARRYL POWELL - Jim Smith went back to Portsmouth to sign Powell for £750,000. The 23-year-old can play in defence or midfield.

DEAN YATES - Former Notts County centre-half joined Derby earlier this year and had to undergo a cartilage operation in the close season.

ROBIN VAN DER LAAN - Jim Smith's fifth signature in as many weeks came from Port Vale in a £675,000 deal which saw Rams striker Lee Mills travelling in the other direction. The 26-year-old was made skipper by Smith on his first appearance.

LEE CARSLEY - Former youth team skipper at the Baseball Ground, who broke into the first team last season making 28 appearances.

KEVIN COOPER - Turned pro in the summer of 1993 after a successful stint in the youth team, and was a consistent player in the reserves last season.


JOHN HARKES - Versatile midfielder and USA international who joined Derby from Sheffield Wednesday for £800,000 in August 1993.




MARCO Gabbiadini v Port Vale

## When Goals were scored at The Baseball Ground




## When Goals were scored away from home




## Average Goals per Match

# DERBY COUNTY 1995/96

WAYNE SUTTON - Derby-born and in his second year as a pro. Made his senior debut as a midfielder in the FA Cup third round tie at Everton earlier this year.

PAUL TROLLOPE - A recent £100,000 acquisition from third division Torquay United, Paul started his first senior game for the Rams at Sunderland on New Year's Eve whilst on a month's loan. Started his career with Swindon Town.

SEAN FLYNN - The 27-year-old midfielder arrived at the Baseball Ground just before the start of the current season from Coventry City, in a £1 million exchange deal involving last year's Derby club captain Paul Williams. Flynn was valued at £250,000 in the deal.

DAVID PREECE - Needs no introduction to Town fans. The 32-year-old midfielder spent 10 years at Kenilworth Road, and is on a month-to-month contract with the Rams, notching his first goal for the club in the recent 3-2 defeat at Reading.

WILL DAVIES - Derby-born striker who got his first-team chance last season when injuries stretched the resources of Roy McFarland's squad.

MARCO GABBIAUDINI - Derby broke the seven figure transfer barrier for only the second time in their history when they lured the England B striker from Crystal Palace in February 1992. The £1 million fee equalled the price paid to Oxford for Dean Saunders in 1988, but within six months of Marco's arrival the Rams wrote seven-figure transfer cheques a further four times! Formerly with York and Sunderland before his move to Palace.

PAUL SIMPSON - Made his league debut for Manchester City aged just 16, and joined Derby from Oxford in February 1992 for £500,000. A prolific scorer from the wing, with his nine goals last term being the first time for several seasons he had failed to notch double figures.


MARK STALLARD - Has progressed through the junior ranks at the Baseball Ground, and made his league debut aged just 16. Scored four goals in 15 starts last season, and is rated a top prospect.

DARREN WRACK - Came into the first team during last season's Christmas and New Year programme, as has recently signed a three-year contract.

RON WILLEMS - Striker who joined the Rams in July in a £300,000 deal with Zurich Grasshoppers. The 28-year-old had played in Zurich for a couple of seasons, and before that was with Ajax.


DEAN STURRIDGE - Speedy striker who has made infrequent first team appearances since his debut in 1990/91. Scored at Reading this season, and has been a regular scorer for the Rams' reserves in the Pontins League in recent seasons.


## A Hatter and ...a Ram

One of the best left-backs in the Town's history, STEVE BUCKLEY, became a firm favourite at Kenilworth Road before moving to Derby in a big money transfer and earning cult hero status on the terraces at the Baseball Ground.

Born at Brinsley in October 1953, Buckley was signed by Luton boss Harry Haslam for a nominal fee from Burton Albion in April 1974 although it was reserve team coach David Pleat, using his knowledge of Midlands non-league football, who could be given all the credit.

It was not long before Buckley was given his debut in October 1974 in the away game at Leicester, and his cultured left foot and surging runs down the wing soon became a feature of the Town's play as he remained virtually ever-present until being transferred to Tommy Docherty's Derby for £165,000 in January 1978.

"I have now got the two best young fullbacks in the country at Derby in Buckley and David Langan," enthused Docherty, and Buckley for one proved him right by making 323 league appearances at the Baseball Ground to add to the 123 he




earned at Luton.


Finally released by Derby in August 1986, Buckley had one final season, at Lincoln, where he made 36 appearances before hanging up his boots.


### Goal Scorers

## INJURY UPDATE.....

GOOD news for Scott Oakes! He had a scan on his troublesome hamstring last week and it showed no major damage, so hopefully he should be able to make his seasonal debut soon.

As I said last week, it is just too risky to rush a player back after this type of injury, but it was nevertheless a boost to receive the specialist's verdict.

I also mentioned Ceri Hughes last week and his hard work over the summer. He returned with a goal against Leicester, but then tweaked an ankle in training and missed the trip to Grimsby. It's nothing serious, but his suspension means there is a useful recovery time for him.

Supporters will no doubt have seen two players suffer injuries against Leicester - John Taylor and Julian James.

John received a bruise on the calf and was fit to play at Grimsby, as was Julian despite his three stitches over the right eye.

We have been working this week with Darren Patterson to overcome his achilles injury, which is really a case of wear and tear caused by the hard grounds.

Darren has been running, and at the time of writing was due to rejoin full training later this week.

One or two players have complained of aches from the hard grounds. Nothing serious, but we could do with some rain!

On leaving the stadium, you will find some roads closed to pedestrian traffic, to enable swift and unobstructed arrival of the emergency services.





# Clashes with the Rams

CONSIDERING both Derby County and ourselves have long since past seen out centenary celebrations it is surprising to note that our league meetings only commenced as relatively recently as 1953.

Our first clash took place at the Baseball Ground on November 14 of that year when newly-relegated Derby were beaten 2-1 with both goals coming from that prolific marksman on the wing, Bert Mitchell. The scoreline was repeated in the return with the goals this time coming from Bob Morton and John Downie.

At the end of the following season both clubs went their separate ways with the Town being promoted to Division One and Derby suffering relegation to Division Three North. It is no surprise, therefore, that we held the upper hand in the clashes, winning 2-0 at Kenilworth Road and coming back from the Baseball Ground with a point following a 0-0 draw.

One of the Luton goalscorers in the game at Kenilworth Road, Jesse Pye, caused a major upset at the time by demanding a transfer after the meeting and ended up being signed by Derby. Unfortunately he was unable to provide the spark that Derby needed to avoid the drop and was

reported to be 'anonymous' in the game against the Town later on in the season which was watched by a crowd of only 5,987.

We did not meet again until our relegation from Division One but this time the boot was on the other foot as we were thrashed 4-1 at Derby on October 15, 1960, in a game marking the last appearance of goalkeeper Alan Collier. The next season we did a little better in only losing 2-0 at the Baseball Ground but followed it up with a crushing 4-2 home win with goals from Harry Walden, Alec Ashworth and a brace from Tom McKechnie to send the crowd of 15,380 home happy.

Season 1962/63 was the Town's turn to suffer relegation and by way of revenge Derby went on to do the 'double' winning 2-1 at Kenilworth Road and 1-0 at the Baseball Ground although we were down to 10 fit men for the final hour following an injury to Brendan McNally.

It was to be 11 years before our paths crossed again but this time both clubs were in Division One, albeit for only one season as far as the Town were concerned. Derby visited Luton just before Christmas 1974 chasing the Championship, which they eventually won, while we were rock bottom after a run of six straight defeats.

It was therefore seen as a major surprise when the Town won 1-0 courtesy of a Jim Ryan penalty to

spark off a Luton mini-revival. The penalty came about when Peter Spiring was fouled in the area, breaking his toe in the process, thus leaving the way clear for Lil Fuccillo to come on as substitute for his first Luton appearance. When the return was played, over Easter 1975, both the Town and Derby were going through 'purple patches' but it was our record that went when we were thrashed 5-0 with all the goals coming from Roger Davies.

Another gap of five years was to elapse before the clubs met again, this time in Division Two, and in an early season game played on August 23, 1980, the Town went down rather unluckily 2-1 at Kenilworth Road especially as we had been in the lead. In the return both teams put on a treat for the TV cameras with David Moss and Godfrey Ingram scoring crackers in a 2-2 draw.

Season 1981/82 saw the Town win the Second Division Championship and a further parting of the ways. In the home game that season the Town won 3-2 in a contest more one sided than the scoreline suggests with goals from Moss, Clive Goodyear and Mal Donaghy followed by a 0-0 draw at the Baseball Ground in a game marking the debut of Richard Money.

With Derby eventually returning to Division One in 1987 we have met every season since apart from one and the highlights have come thick and fast starting with the opening day of the 1987/88 season when Derby scraped a 1-0 win at the Baseball Ground, with the Town down to 10 men from the early minutes when Mick Harford was sent off.

In the following season Harford scored with a tremendous long range shot in a 1-0 revenge win at the Baseball Ground, while the 3-0 home victory in the return set us up for our end of season spurt which saw us avoid the drop. Relegation was again avoided the following season after our never to be forgotten 3-2 win at the Baseball Ground on the final Saturday when all seemed lost, and to make a hat-trick of great escapes we saw off the Rams here at Kenilworth Road on the last day of 1990/91 with Lars Elstrup and an own goal from, of all people, Mick Harford earning the 2-0 win.

Last but by no means least we must remember the goal Scott Oakes scored here two seasons ago during a 2-1 win which set off much discussion as to the greatest Luton goal of all time. As supporters will no doubt recall Oakes set off on a run from deep, leaving defenders in his wake, before scoring with an unstoppable shot. More of the same please!

The crowd disturbances by Chelsea supporters seemed to affect their own players more than those of the Town, and Peter Anderson, Steve Buckley and Ron Futcher all scored in an easy victory.

# Sommer in the City! Juergen joins QPR

A WEEK certainly is a long time in football. In last Saturday's match programme we featured an interview with goalkeeper Juergen Sommer, reflecting on his summer with the USA national squad, and looking forward to the new season with Luton Town.

A week on we are reporting the transfer of the 26-year-old New Yorker to Premiership side Queens Park Rangers for a fee of £600,000.

QPR had watched Juergen since his return from the States, and their former goalkeeper Phil Parkes was among the crowd on Saturday to watch the American against Leicester.

He missed the game at Grimsby, with the deal completed on Tuesday and Wednesday, although not in time for Juergen to be considered for Rangers' midweek trip to Liverpool. And as there are no Premiership matches this weekend, due to next week's

internationals, he faces a wait for his debut.

His Luton Town debut came in August 1993, two years after he arrived at Kenilworth Road, and he made his Luton bow against Watford.

He was a virtual ever-present that season, playing a key role in the FA Cup success which saw him make a Wembley semi-final appearance.

He started last season as the first-choice keeper, and was an ever-present until opting to play for the USA against Uruguay in Dallas, which gave Kelvin Davis his opportunity ironically against Watford.

Juergen was on the bench for the remainder of the season, but was re-instated following the opening match of this season playing the league matches against Southend and Leicester, and both Coca-Cola Cup matches against Bournemouth, taking his tally to 101 senior appearances. - SIMON OXLEY.






