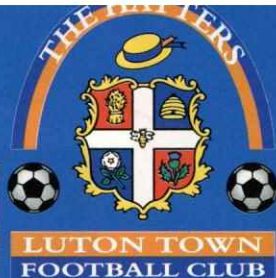

KEEP FOCUSED, KEEP BELIEVING, AND YOU WILL GET THROUGH THE DARKEST TUNNEL

I WRITE these notes the morning after the disappointing 1-0 defeat at Millwall which adds to the three previous defeats against Reading, Perugia and Derby. It is certainly a testing time in what you would call the baptism of management for me and those people closest to us.

Today's game will be no easier, in many ways harder, because we have the pressure of being at home and the expectations of our own supporters so we are fully aware and expect a very competitive and testing match. We welcome Sunderland, their players, officials, directors and supporters.

We can look back, and we could even dwell on the past results, but nothing can be gained from talking about, moaning about and criticising what has gone on in the past.

We have to learn from the past and work hard at putting these things right in the future. The future is the important aspect; the future holds all the keys; and the future will determine success or failure.

We have if you like reached the tunnel on the long road to what we would consider to be success. At the present time the tunnel is dark and people can see no light.

We must remain focused, keep believing in the things that we are doing, and you will burst from the darkness of the tunnel and the future can and will be bright.

We have played what at this early stage are the first and second placed teams in the division, in Millwall and Leicester.

For long periods we outplayed Leicester at home and drew the match on a deflection, and I'm sure those supporters who went to Millwall would agree that we dominated the majority of the game and had more flair, better shape, and in my opinion were better organised, and with a shade more quality with our finishing could have, and possibly should have, run out comfortable winners.

Both of these matches convinces me that the team is not a long way from breaking out of that dark tunnel.

Over the last few weeks there has been much talk about systems of play with Terry Venables trying to effect his Christmas tree,

Middlesbrough playing their diamond, and Chelsea playing with a defensive five with the genius of Gullit as sweeper. The important issue is systems have never won any game.

Players win matches, making the right decisions, when to shoot, when to cross, and when to clear.

These are the real issues and your mind must not become confused with systems of play. Yes we are trying to play slightly differently to last year's formation but the understanding does take time. New players brought to the club, the moving of houses and families, the settling down period does take time, hence results will take time.

But we have now played seven league matches. There is still a massive 39 matches to go, equalling 117 points to fight for.

We must remain strong, committed and not show negative vibes which altogether make the situation harder rather than better. We want encouragement, the players need your vocal support and confidence is a marvellous recipe for success.

You as supporters and me as the manager can help the players' confidence. This is a vital issue.

On the issue of new arrivals we have one permanent arrival and one loan arrival to report this week.

The first arrival follows a hectic trip to

Denmark to watch our now latest signing Johnny Vilstrup. I saw a highly technical player, wasted no time in putting the wheels in motion, and the Chairman and directors of the this club have once again shown their commitment to the team, which enables me to welcome Johnny to the club.

We wish him a long and successful stay here, and hope the promising start and style he showed at Millwall will continue to further our progress, and further his progress to become a full international.

The second arrival, Ian Feuer has come on loan from West Ham, and is a huge man who at 6ft 7ins tall has real presence. We welcome him too. It gives him an opportunity to show what he can do in the Football League, and gives us the opportunity to look closely at our goalkeeping situation.

I am determined to look positively at today's game, the players will be determined to win the match, determined you all go home thinking the team is better equipped, that things are getting better, and that we start to climb and claw our way back up the table.

Your support is vital. Criticism is easy. It is harder sometimes to support your team when things are going wrong.

But this is exactly when we will require your support. So please let's all get behind the team and cheer them all the way to victory.

Hot-shot Vilstrup aims for international place

DANISH midfielder Johnny Vilstrup arrived at Kenilworth Road this week, hoping for a successful career in England to further press his claims to play for his country.

The 28-year-old made his debut at Millwall on Wednesday, following the £205,000 transfer from Lyngby, and a fee which was not greeted with much enthusiasm across the North Sea.

Danish Premier league side Lyngby rate Vilstrup in the £500,000 category, but as Luton manager Terry Westley explained, the player had a clause in his contract which allowed him to move.

"Lyngby gave Johnny a new contract last year, but he insisted on a clause stating a price at which he could leave, and that is the price Luton will pay.

"I know his club aren't very happy, and I don't blame them, but they signed the contract and it just shows you what a talented and highly-rated player we have secured.

"A lot of observers in Denmark are surprised that he isn't already in the national side, and we hope he fulfills that ambition at Luton Town."

Infact, when international clearance was granted, the Danish FA insisted that he be released for internationals if required, a further sign that the Hatters could be adding the name of Vilstrup to that of Lars Elstrup on the club's international

honours list for Denmark.

Terry Westley watched Vilstrup two weeks ago, when he bagged two goals in a league game, and the 28-year-old was on target again in his final match for Lyngby on Sunday, to take his tally this season to seven in eight games.

"I was very pleased when Terry came over to watch me, and meeting him afterwards we got on very well," said Vilstrup.

"It is a dream move for me to come to England, because the game here is followed very closely in Denmark and now I have the opportunity to be a part of that."

He has built a reputation as one of the hardest strikers of a ball in the Danish game, and is a free-kick specialist and penalty taker.

Vilstrup didn't get many opportunities from set-pieces at the New Den on Wednesday, but came close to a goal just before half-time with a fierce left-foot shot deflected just wide.

Fellow debutant Ian Feuer, in goal, also stood out with two fine first-half saves from Keith Stevens and ex-Hatter Kerry Dixon. But he was finally beaten just a minute from time, as Millwall grabbed all three points with Chris Malkin's late winner. - SIMON OXLEY.

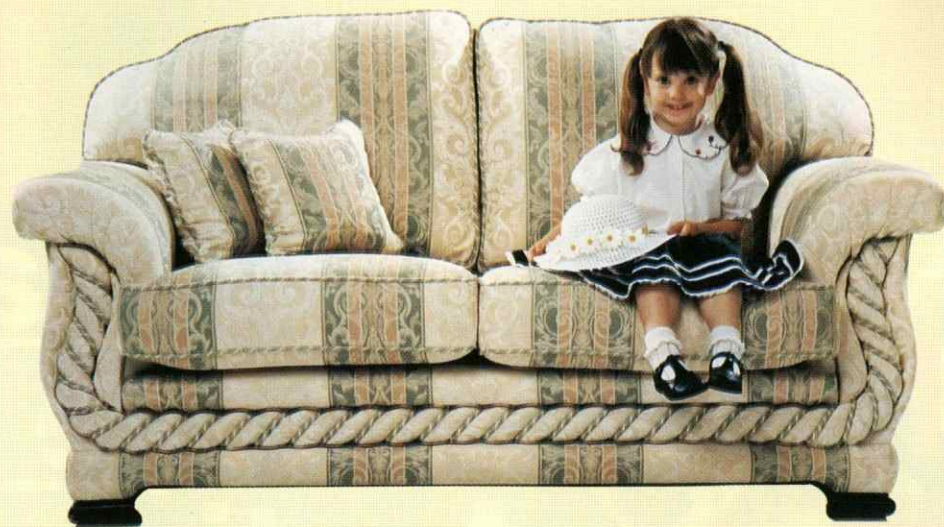

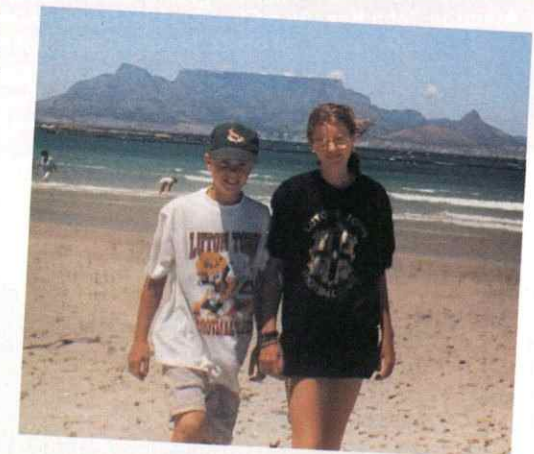

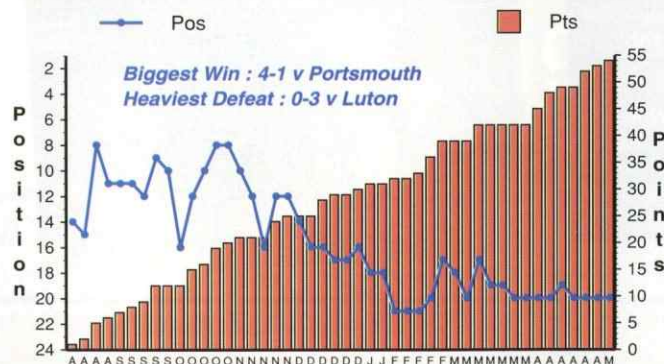

ALEC CHAMBERLAIN - Goalkeeper who ended last season on loan to Liverpool and was one of their subs in the Coca-Cola Cup Final against Bolton. Joined Sunderland from Luton in the summer of 1993, and kept 19 clean sheets in his first season at Roker, the highest number kept by a Sunderland keeper for almost 30 years, but spent much of last year on the bench.

JOHN KAY - Right back who has been out of action since October 1993 with a twice broken leg, and is hoping to prove his fitness in the first half of this season. Joined the club from Wimbledon for a bargain £20,000 in 1987 after starting his career with Arsenal, making his debut for the Highbury club in Pat Jennings' 1000th game.

DARIUSZ KUBICKI - Polish international defender with over 40 caps, who joined Sunderland from Aston Villa in July 1994 for £100,000. Made his international debut aged just 19, and played in the 1986 World Cup Finals. Sunderland's only ever-present last season, and was voted Player of the Year.

MARTIN SCOTT - Bought from Bristol City for £750,000 including Gary Owers as part exchange two days before Christmas 1994, and has made the left back position his own. Previously with Rotherham, and was on loan at Nottm Forest.

GARY BENNETT - At the start of this season, only six players had played more games for Sunderland, and with an extended run this term he could become the club's highest ever outfield appearance maker. Signed for Sunderland in July 1984 from Cardiff for £65,000.

RICHARD ORD - Centre-half and former England Under-21 international, who impressed Peter Reid at the end of last season and was rewarded with a new contract.

KEVIN BALL - Club captain, signed from Portsmouth for £350,000 in the summer of 1990. Started his career at Coventry, but moved on without appearing in the first team.

ANDY MELVILLE - Welsh international bought from Oxford for £800,000 including Anton Rogan in part exchange in August 1993. Began with Swansea, before joining Oxford for £275,000 in July 1990.

MICHAEL GRAY - Sunderland-born player who scored in the first minute of his home debut. Versatile player who can play at left-back or in midfield.

STEVE AGNEW - Signed from Leicester for £250,000 in January. Became Blackburn's record signing when they paid Barnsley £750,000 for him in 1991, but injury restricted him to four league and cup appearances for Rovers. (cont. on p14).

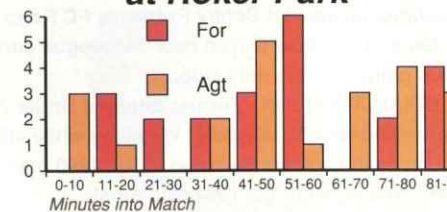

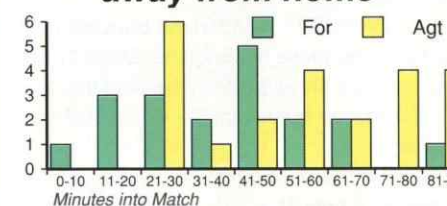

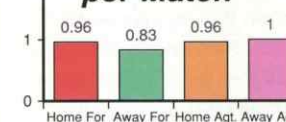
When Goals were scored at Roker Park



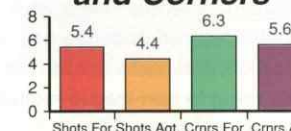
When Goals were scored away from home



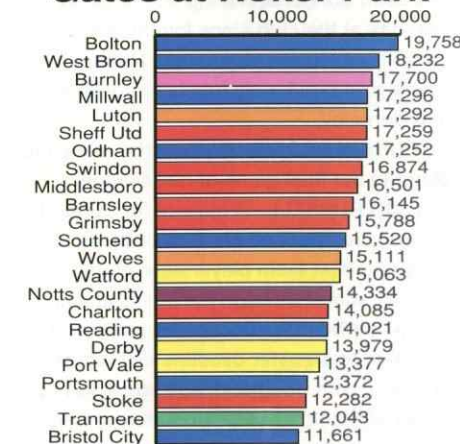
Average Goals per Match

GORDON ARMSTRONG - Started the season on a week-to-week contract after a couple of years of niggling injuries. He enjoyed a testimonial against Bobby Robson's FC Porto in 1994 and has now played over 400 league and cup games for his only club.

BRIAN ATKINSON - Former England Under 21 international who played at Wembley while still in his teens against Swindon in the 1990 play offs, and again in the 1992 Cup Final.

SHAUN CUNNINGTON - Signed from Grimsby Town for £600,000, but has had a terrible time with injuries since being hurt in an Anglo-Italian match in August 1993.

MARTIN SMITH - Sunderland born midfielder/winger, who made his England Under 21 debut last season. Three goals in the final three games of last season made him the club's second top scorer.

MARTIN GRAY - No relation to Michael or Phil, Martin is a tigerish midfielder who can also operate in the back four.

PAUL BRACEWELL - Began his third period at Roker when Peter Reid appointed him player/assistant manager on the day he signed his own contract in May 1995. Reid and Bracewell were midfield partners in Everton's successes in the 1980s. Played in three FA Cup Finals for Everton, and captained Sunderland in the 1992 Cup Final before joining Newcastle.

LEE HOWEY - Brother of Newcastle and England defender Steve, who can play at either centre-forward or centre-half. Lee began with Ipswich, and had a spell in Belgium before returning to non-league football, and then on to Roker.

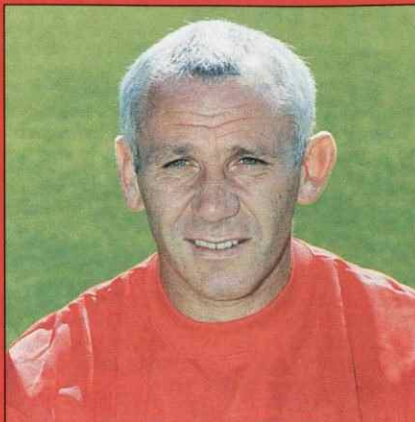
PHIL GRAY - The Northern Ireland international has been Sunderland's top scorer in his two seasons at the club since joining them from Luton for £800,000. Joined the Hatters from Spurs, and previously had loan spells at Fulham and Barnsley.

STEPHEN BRODIE - Striker who made his full debut in the final game of last season.

CRAIG RUSSELL - A mascot for Sunderland against Liverpool on his 10th birthday, Craig became a first team player as a 17-year-old. Regular scorer through the junior teams.

BRETT ANGELL - Bought from Everton for £600,000 on transfer deadline day last March. Formerly with Southend, and has also had spells at Stockport, Portsmouth and Derby.

Meet the Manager



PETER REID was bought in to replace Mick Buxton for the last seven games of last season, and guided Sunderland to safety in Division One.

The former England international, with 13 caps, twice won the championship at Everton, with whom he also played in three consecutive FA Cup Finals, a League Cup Final, and Cup Winners' Cup Final.

He also played for Bolton, QPR, Manchester City, Southampton, Notts County and Bury, and managed Manchester City between November 1990 and August 1993.

His assistant is former Blackburn manager **BOBBY SXTON**, who was Reid's chief scout at Maine Road.

A Hatter and ...a Rokerite

Born in Belfast in August 1931, **BILLY BINGHAM** started his football career with Glentoran and attracted the scouts of second division Luton as an 18-year-old, but he opted for Sunderland who were then in the top flight.

Following Sunderland's relegation in 1958 a fee of £15,000 brought him to Kenilworth Road where he enjoyed some of the best football of his career.

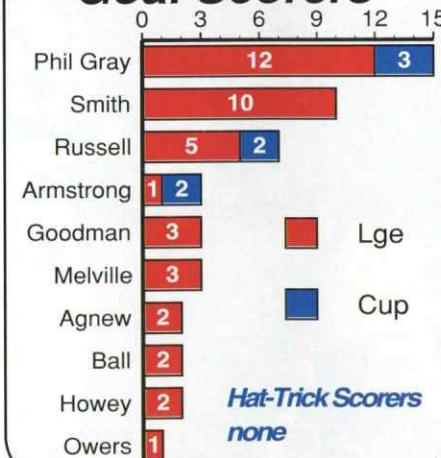
A fast, direct and tricky goalscoring right winger he was instrumental in getting the Town to the FA Cup Final in 1959, not least for scoring the only goal in the semi-final replay at St Andrews, Birmingham, against Norwich.

Soon after the Town's own relegation in 1960 he was on his way again, this time to Everton where he won a championship medal three years later.

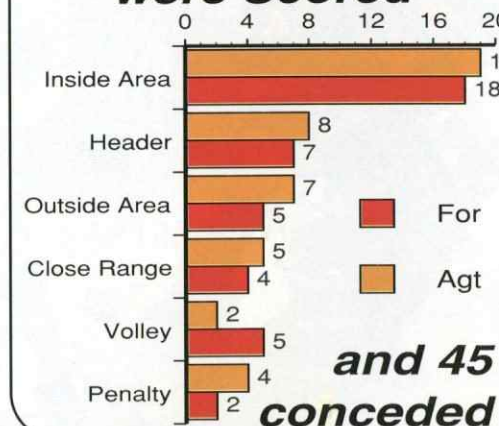
After finishing his playing career with Port Vale he enjoyed several managerial roles culminating in the job of national team manager with Northern Ireland, with whom he had won 56 caps (14 whilst with the Town). - *Roger Wash*

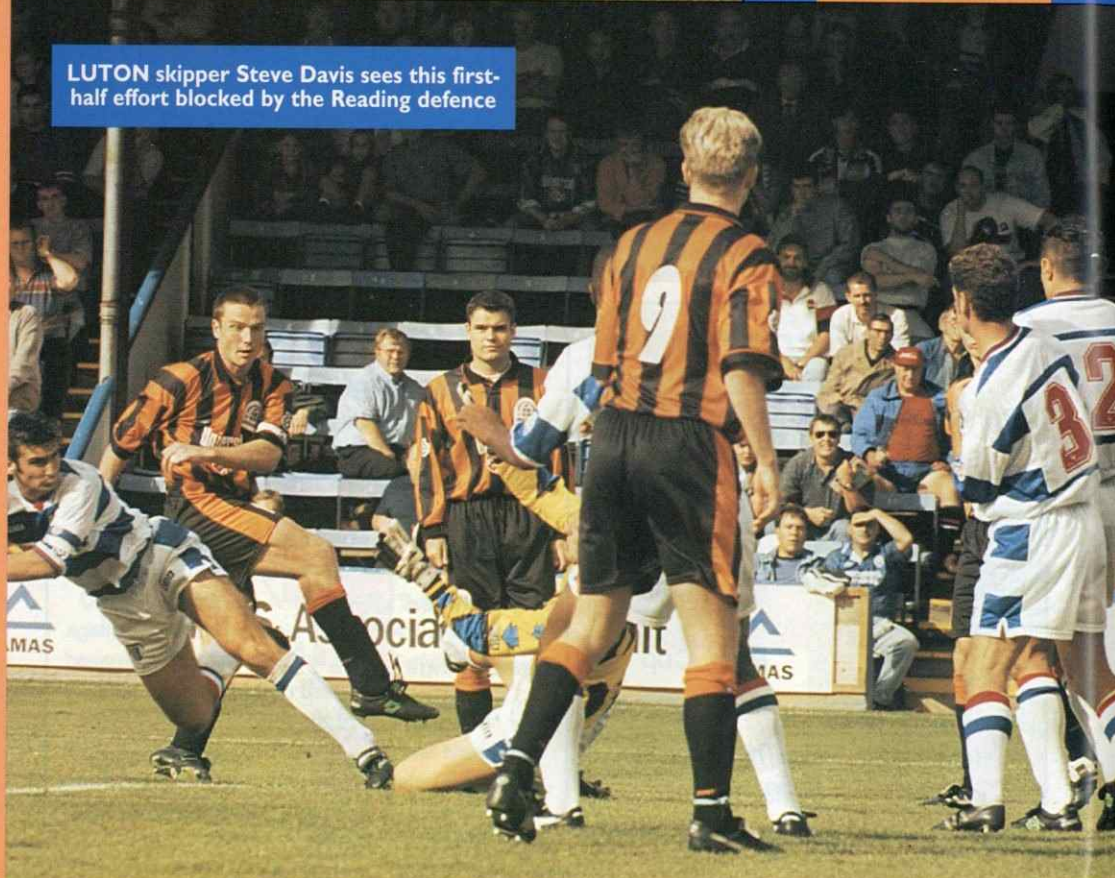

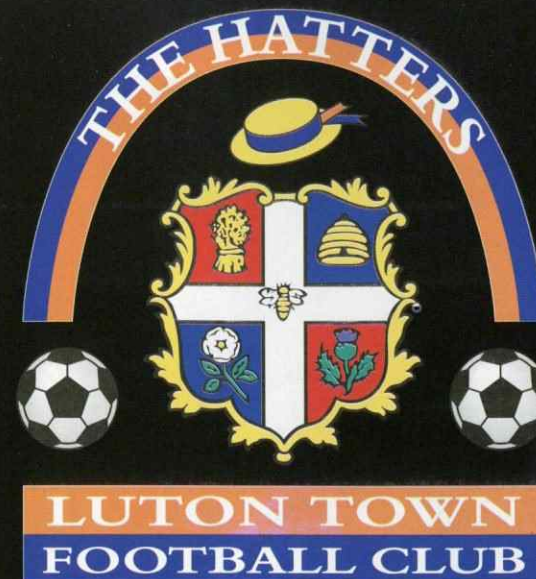

IT'S been a case of good news, bad news on the injury front, with our two long-term absentees **Scott Oakes** and **Darren Patterson**.

Scott could be in contention for place shortly after having a minor operation on his hamstring problem.

There was a tear in the muscle which was hidden by a pocket of fluid, hence it not being discovered earlier.

Scott had the operation on Friday, has the stitches out next week and he should be back in action soon.

But Darren Patterson has received a setback, and is currently in plaster.

His achilles tendonitis, soreness caused by training on hard grounds, has not eased, and the specialist felt it would be best to put his ankle in plaster to prevent any pressure at all being placed upon it.

Of course he hadn't been training fully, but just walking or driving even was not allowing the ankle time to rest, so he will be in plaster for about three weeks.

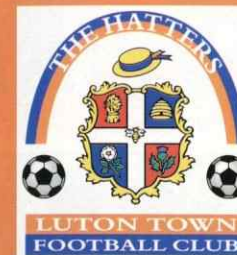
OUR current Assistant Manager Mick McGiven was a visitor to Kenilworth Road with Sunderland in October 1970 for a Division Two match.

Persistence keeps promotion dream alive

FOLLOWING the Town's relegation from the top flight in 1975 we were all disappointed with the circumstances but settled down to a further spell of football in Division Two, safe in the knowledge that the team was virtually unchanged and a quick return was a distinct possibility.

As it turned out we did not set the football world alight, and a string of inconsistent performances saw us in a fairly safe mid-table position as Christmas approached, although three straight defeats in November was certainly not promotion material!

Then, as if to add some interest to what was becoming a humdrum season, it was announced that the club was severely in debt and unless an injection of cash was made quickly then professional football in Luton would become a thing of the past.

Although we had survived crises like this before, and had become a little cynical, this time it was really serious as tales of Electricity Board switch offs and the like swept through the town.

The players and supporters responded in a tremendous manner as everyone rallied around the club, but perversely one of the first recipients of this groundswell of support was ex-player Alan Slough who luckily attracted 9,450 to his testimonial game at Kenilworth Road when he could normally have expected to attract half that number.

On the pitch the players won eight games in a row which pushed them up to eighth place in the league including a 5-1 thrashing of Charlton at The Valley, where Peter Anderson signed off his Luton career with two goals before being transferred to Antwerp for a cut price, albeit financially necessary, £80,000.

The turning point in the surge of matchwinning performances on the field came in a lacklustre display at Norwich in the fourth round of the FA Cup where we went down 2-0, and as the immediate threat of closure diminished then so did our exhibitions in the league which went back to early season inconsistency.

By the time of the visit of Sunderland to Kenilworth Road in late February our promotion tilt had stuttered to a halt and we were fast running out of games. This match was therefore seen as a last

chance at making a final push in the bid to get back to Division One.

Sunderland were having a good season and were sitting in second place in the table only one point behind leaders Bristol City, but with two games in hand. They were also through to the FA Cup quarter-finals.

Match-winning winger John Aston was missing from the Town line-up through injury but we did welcome back striker Ron Futchter after a two-match suspension. The best crowd since the visit of Chelsea the previous August, 15,338, also gave a warm hand to Sunderland's Tom Finney who had started his Football League career at Kenilworth Road.

It soon became obvious that the Wearsiders were happy to settle for a draw and they soaked up the pressure as the Luton forwards had most of the first half play but most of the chances that came our way fell to Futchter who, after missing two games, was trying a little too hard.

As the second period wore on it looked as though the Town would be robbed of a victory by the all too familiar shortage of good finishing and Sunderland, sensing this, started to come out of their shell a little and cause a few frights at the other end.

The breakthrough, after 65 minutes, was rather fortunate as a mis-hit shot from Jim Husband seemed to be drifting harmlessly wide when it was diverted into his own net by Sunderland defender Bobby Moncur.

The game obviously opened up after this and the Luton forwards suddenly found more space as Sunderland tried, without success, to press for an equaliser.

The killer goal came five minutes from the end when clever interplay between Brian Chambers, Futchter and Husband saw the latter player hit a shot that was deflected towards the net by Sunderland goalkeeper Jim Montgomery with Futchter adding the finishing touch.

Persistence and determination had won the day and the crowd gave the players a standing ovation as they left the field with the promotion dream still intact.

Sunderland toast stadium success



SUNDERLAND'S proposed relocation plans have taken a giant leap forward.

The Tyne and Wear Development Corporation have been notified that Secretary of State, John Gummer, will not intervene regarding the Roker club's planning application for a 34,000 all-seater stadium on the former Wearmouth Colliery site.

Tyne and Wear Development Corporation are now authorised to approve the application and Sunderland are currently in discussions to agree specific planning conditions with consent expected at some stage this month.

John Fickling, Chief Executive of Sunderland, said: "This is absolutely tremendous news for the football club and means that

we have successfully cleared yet another important hurdle.

"Work will now continue with the detailed specifications for the new stadium to ensure that our tight deadlines continue to be met."

The Hatters meanwhile are still waiting to hear from the Department of Environment regarding the 'Kohlerdome' proposals for land by junction 10 of the M1.

Town chairman David Kohler said: "We expect to hear from Mr Gummer shortly, but in the meantime we offer our best wishes to Sunderland on their plans for a new stadium.

"This decision, and Southampton's recent go-ahead for a move from The Dell, are encouraging signs for us.

"Football clubs realise the need to move into purpose-built stadiums, and it is good to see they are receiving the backing from the various authorities."

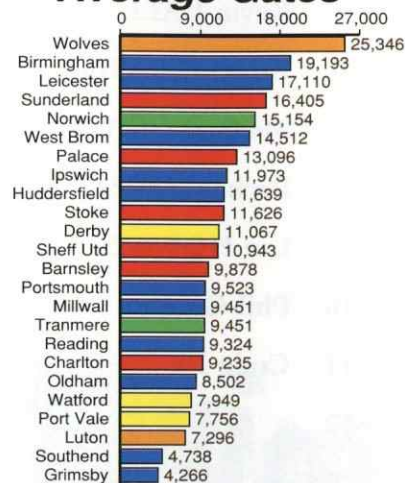

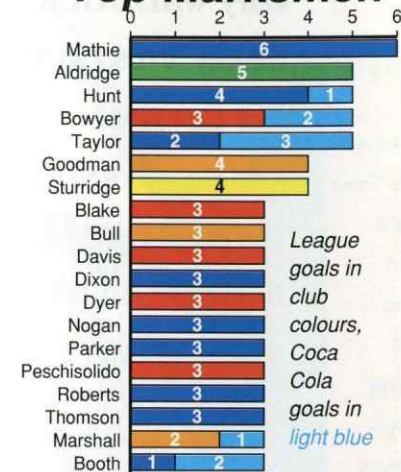
