

VITAL HOME RUN STARTS TODAY AGAINST OLDHAM

THE disappointment of the failure at Stoke was felt by everyone connected with the club.

It was a difficult few days following the defeat at the Victoria Ground, especially with the manner in which we conceded those late goals and it really knocked the stuffing out of us when Stoke went two-nil and then three-nil in front.

The players were despondent after the game and at training on Monday, and everyone was very disappointed and hurt by the criticism.

But when you lose like that these are things that you have to expect, and we have worked hard on regenerating the atmosphere and belief, because results like that are disappointing for staff and players as well as supporters.

With this in mind we took a young squad to Italy for Wednesday's Anglo-Italian Cup game in Cesena, with Dwight Marshall the oldest player in the party, as the likes of Ben Chenery, Paul McLaren and 16-year-old Matthew Upson were included to mix with the first-team group.

It proved to be an interesting few days, especially for those supporters who were staying in the same hotel as the players, and they were able, I expect for the first time, to watch the training and preparation work.

Several people remarked on the desire and the determination the players have to do well for the club, and by Tuesday and Wednesday we were concentrating on the game ahead.

The opportunity for the likes of Upson to play alongside Steve Davis can only be beneficial for this club in the long term, and Luton of course has a long tradition of producing and bringing through young players. In Italy the young players have shown that this trend will continue.

Darren Patterson also made his debut and his willingness to be a winner on and off the pitch means he is a great person to have around. He did well for 45 minutes, and will now probably need a couple of reserve games before coming into the Division One reckoning.

After going 1-0 down we were able to manufacture through slick passing a marvellous equaliser, with Richard Harvey's cross from the left headed in by Dwight Marshall. We had peppered the Cesena goal for much of the game but could not force a late winner we needed to

progress in the competition.

With two minutes to go we won a corner for which Kelvin 'Schmeichel' Davis went up, and from which we hit the post.

But from the rebound we conceded a free kick which the Italians took quickly, with a marvellous long-range chip beating Kelvin who was barely back in his goal.

The young team had performed magnificently well for the club only to have the stuffing knocked out of them at the end, but it was 'do or die' and we had to win to progress.

With the Italian adventure now over we once again turn our attentions to league points.

We must, and do continue to do the right things in training, and must believe that things will turn in our favour. I must keep believing that and most importantly so must the players.

Speaking to those supporters in the hotel in Italy, it was evident that the game is an opinion, and after one evening meal there were six people who could not agree on one simple issue. Final decisions though are the responsibility of the manager, and the manager has to be accountable for those decisions.

At the moment, as a young manager, being in the firing line is difficult, but again with the belief and the knowledge that the players are 100 per cent behind what you are trying to achieve gives you the courage to continue looking forward and be positive.

What makes a good team? Should you play the ball early to the front men? Should you be patient and play the ball across the back four players, trying to induce your opponents out? Should you play with out-and-out wingers - a

dying breed. Liverpool against Brondby was a classic example of one team overpassing, but then again Forest against Wimbledon was a classic example of a team giving away possession too quickly.

In my opinion you have to play slick, quick passing with players interchanging positions to create space for others, and wide players crossing the ball in to brave front players to get on the end of these opportunities.

Opportunities are difficult to create in the modern game, so when they are presented we must take our quota.

We can't change the past only look forward, and try to put these things we believe in into action.

With that in mind we turn our attentions to this afternoon, and welcome Oldham Athletic, their players, supporters, directors and officials.

Oldham you would class as a 'footballing' side, but with strength and power, added to by the on-loan signing of Paul Wilkinson.

With two home matches to come, followed by the 'derby' at Watford, and we all know how important that game is to everyone, we search for those elusive two wins on the trot.

Confidence has a major part to play, and is generated by winning matches.

The rebuilding of confidence and the start of a good run of results will start somewhere, and with the right commitment shown by everybody that can be today.

A personal thanks to all those supporters who made the journeys to Stoke and Cesena. Brighter times are around the corner.

DARREN'S BACK IN ACTION

"It's the longest I've been out in nearly 10 years!"

DEFENDER Darren Patterson resumed full training last week after the ankle injury which has kept him out of the Town side since his summer move from Crystal Palace.

And the Northern Ireland international was due to play his comeback game on Wednesday, in Italy with the first team in their Anglo-Italian Cup clash at Cesena.

"Darren is conscious that he was a key signing during the summer and is desperate to play in the side, especially as results have not gone our way," said Town manager Terry Westley.

The player himself admits it has been a "nightmare" start but is ready to resume his league career and press for a recall to the Northern Ireland squad.

"I can't wait to play again, and it seems like an age since the start of the injury problem," admitted Darren this week prior to departing for Italy.

"It will be good just to get 45 minutes under my belt, because this is the longest that I have been out of the game since I started playing.

"My previous longest spell out was three weeks, and I've been playing nearly 10 years now.

"It's difficult to describe how frustrating it's been, and the whole situation has been a nightmare and through nobody's fault.

"An injury that was supposed to be two or three

weeks has gone on for 12 weeks or so, but everyone at the club has been very helpful and supportive, and I'm just glad that now it seems to have healed and I will be playing football again.

"I'm not a good watcher and with things not going that well at the minute you really just want to get your boots on and help."

Would it be a case of gently easing himself back in?

"I'm afraid I'm not the type to be able to take it easy unfortunately," said Darren.

"I have got 12 weeks of frustration inside me and I will be raring to go. I'm not 100 per cent fit yet, so I need games, and I've no idea when I'll be back in the first team.

"Maybe the manager will put me in fairly soon, and as soon as I'm able, I'm available and up for it!"

He is also aiming to win back his place in the Northern Ireland side. Bryan Hamilton's team still have an outside chance of qualifying for the European Championship finals, and entertain Austria on Wednesday.

"I was beginning to get a regular slot in the Northern Ireland side, but hopefully the lads can get through and I can push for a recall," added Darren.





PAUL GERRARD - Goalkeeper who came through the junior ranks at Boundary Park, and is one of the most highly-rated keepers outside the Premiership. Has made 15 consecutive appearances for the England Under-21 side, and captained his country twice last season.

JON HALLWORTH - Signed for Athletic from Ipswich Town for £125,000 in February 1989, and has since made over 250 appearances.

GUNNAR HALLE - Norwegian international and scorer of a hat-trick for Norway in their World Cup qualifier against San Marino. Was dogged by injury in the World Cup Finals though, playing only 50 minutes. Signed for Oldham from Lillestrom in 1991 for £280,000.

CRAIG FLEMING - Missed much of last season through injury, but is recognised as one of the best man-to-man markers in English football. Signed by Joe Royle for just £150,000 from Halifax Town.

RICHARD GRAHAM - Midfielder who made his Oldham debut against Manchester United in 1994. Last season was selected for the Endsleigh League XI and the England Under-21 side.

NICK HENRY - Oldham captain who has made over 200 appearances for the Latics. Liverpool-born midfielder who has progressed through the junior ranks at Boundary Park.

IAN OLNEY - Luton-born striker who was the Latics record signing at £750,000 when he moved from Aston Villa at the start of the 1992/93 season. Former England Under-21 international who suffered a setback on his return from injury in July, breaking his ankle in a pre-season friendly.

LEE RICHARDSON - A £350,000 signing from Scottish Premier League side Aberdeen, who started his career at Halifax Town, and moved on to Watford and Blackburn Rovers before joining Aberdeen.


NEIL POINTON - Vastly experienced defender who started his career with Scunthorpe, before moving to Everton and Manchester City. Joined the Latics for £600,000 in August 1992.



When Oldham have Scored and Conceded




When Players have been Booked




Average Goals per Match

STEVE REDMOND - England international at all levels of youth soccer, but never received a full cap. The Latics paid £600,000 for the ex-Manchester City captain in August 1992, and now has extra responsibility at the heart of the Oldham defence following Richard Jobson's departure to Leeds. Was Oldham's Player of the Year last season.

DARREN BECKFORD - A £300,000 buy from Norwich City in March 1993, had joined the Canaries from Port Vale for £900,000, but suffered with injury at the end of last season.

MARK BRENNAN - A £100,000 signing from Manchester City, the ex-Middlesbrough and Ipswich player has been a virtual ever-present since Graeme Sharp took over the managerial reins.

CHRIS MAKIN - A 22-year-old fullback who spent three months on loan at Wigan during the 1992/93 season, making 15 appearances and scoring twice. Wigan wanted to keep him, but Joe Royle wasn't keen to let him go, and he went on to become a regular at Boundary Park and was picked for the England Under-21 side in May.

SEAN McCARTHY - The 27-year-old striker signed from Bradford City in December 1993 for £450,000. A prolific goalscorer with his previous clubs - Bradford, Plymouth and Swansea - he ended last season with 18 goals to become the Latics top scorer.


PAUL RICKERS - 20-year-old Yorkshireman, who broke into the first team last season, winning the man-of-the-match award for two of his three appearances.

SCOTT McNIVEN - Leeds-born defender who made his debut at the end of last season.

DAVID BERESFORD - Forward who hails from Middlesbrough, and has progressed through the junior ranks at Boundary Park.

PAUL WILKINSON - Currently on loan at Oldham from Middlesbrough. Experienced striker formerly with Grimsby, Everton and Watford. Scored an own goal in Boro's 5-1 defeat here last season.

VIC HALOM, although born in Burton-on-Trent, signed for Charlton Athletic from school and was awarded a full professional contract by manager Bob Stokoe in January 1966.

When Stokoe was replaced by Eddie Firmani, the new man at the top had a clear-out with Halom being one of the casualties joining Orient for £3,000 in October 1967.


He soon made a name for himself at Brisbane Road with his goalscoring exploits and Fulham stepped in with a bid of £35,000 in November 1968 which came too late to save their second division status.

With the Town selling Malcolm MacDonald in the summer of 1971, manager Alec Stock was on the lookout for a 'safe' replacement and tabled a £30,000 bid for Halom who made his Luton debut against Birmingham in a 0-0 draw at Kenilworth Road in September 1971.

Sometimes compared unfairly to MacDonald, Halom was a steady performer and the highlight of his stay here was a hat-trick against Sheffield Wednesday at Kenilworth Road over Easter 1972.

In his second season he had scored a creditable 10 goals in 25 league appearances, winning over the fans in the process, when Bob Stokoe signed him for Sunderland which we were not happy about at the time.

At Roker Park, Halom enjoyed a cup run to Wembley, beating the Town along the way, in his first season, but on promotion to Division One




three years later Sunderland off-loaded him to Oldham where he had almost four years as a regular in the side.


After a final move to Rotherham, a bad knee injury finished his playing career and after coaching in Norway he had spells as manager of both Barrow and Rochdale.

Vic Halom now works for an Oldham plumbing firm. - *ROGER WASH*.





HUGHES CELEBRATES WELSH CALL UP



HATTERS midfielder Ceri Hughes has made the first step towards resurrecting his international career with a place in the Welsh squad for Wednesday's European Championship qualifier in Albania.

Having overcome injury to regain his place in the Luton side, Ceri is now hoping to win a place in Bobby Gould's new-look Welsh side.

Gould has named an unchanged starting line-up for the game in Tirana, following Wales' narrow defeat by Germany in Cardiff last month, with ex-Hatter Mark Pembridge, amongst others, keeping his place.

By naming the same side Gould has omitted the fit again Ian Rush and Mark Hughes, with Rush included alongside Ceri in the players vying for a place on the bench.

Also in the travelling group is another former Kenilworth Road favourite, John Hartson.

"By all accounts it was a good performance against the Germans, so it's up to the rest of the squad to force their way back into the side," said Ceri.

"I'm obviously delighted to be included again, and it's a real boost after the injury problems with my knee."

"I was in the standby squad for the game against Germany, and was due to play for a Welsh XI in a testimonial game the same week, but unfortunately I had to miss that game after pulling out of our match at Tranmere through injury."

"The knee is getting stronger all the time now, and I'm pleased that my career seems to be looking up once again."

Luton manager Terry Westley has been pleased with

Ceri Hughes' return this season.

"His selection for an international squad can only serve as a boost to everyone at the club," said Mr Westley.

"Personally I'm delighted for Ceri, who has worked hard this season after his knee injury and the early sending off against Southend."

"He has shown everyone what a good player he is, and that is why Bobby Gould has selected him."

Since making his Luton Town debut at Aston Villa in 1990, Ceri has made four appearances for the full Welsh side - in 1992 v Holland (sub), and in 1994 against Norway (sub), Sweden (sub) and Estonia.

Mick of the Hatters is 'Roy of the Rovers'

A LOT happened in the summer of 1991. After the last game win over Derby to secure safety at the end of the previous season, we looked forward to a period of consolidation. Some chance!

A change of manager was the first news to hit the streets of Luton, with Jim Ryan departing to be replaced by David Pleat. The chairman resigned, the physiotherapist moved on, while the youth team coach left with the players having not yet come back from their summer break.

On the playing front, record signing Lars Elstrup had not returned from Denmark and was reported to have taken a job as a bank teller while threatening to turn out as an amateur for Odense.

Clubs were queuing up to buy local-born crowd favourite Kingsley Black, but we were pleased to see the return of old boy Brian Stein, even though he was 33.

The Town kicked off the season at newly promoted West Ham, and I think we were all heartened by a battling performance in a 0-0 draw.

Pleat had made his first big signing when he went back to one of his old clubs, Tottenham,

and spent £275,000 on Phil Gray, but unfortunately we went down 5-0 in the next game at Coventry with Sean Farrell sent off for a bad foul on Trevor Peake.

A 0-0 draw at home to Liverpool followed with Pleat making the announcement that Peake was to join the Town - presumably to keep a close eye on Farrell!

Two further away defeats were suffered at Arsenal (2-0) and Chelsea (4-1) before our first win of the season was recorded with a 2-1 victory over Southampton at Kenilworth Road.

The previous week Pleat had bowed to the inevitable and sold Kingsley Black to Nottingham Forest for £1.5 million, but had taken forward Lee Glover on loan from the City Ground. As if to typify the club's fortune at that time Glover was injured on his debut never to return.

A disastrous 3-0 drubbing at Wimbledon lead Pleat into the transfer market once again and Steve Thompson joined us from Bolton for £180,000. By this time our heads were spinning with all the comings and goings and we were told that even more signings were in the offing.

Pleat had talked about a 'Mick Harford type' of player to lead the attack, and it was therefore

not a surprise when a fee of £325,000 was spent on the best Harford-type in the business..... Mick himself!

The second coming of Mick Harford was greeted by a rapturous Kenilworth Road crowd who had turned up to see one of the promoted sides, Oldham, beaten out of sight and the season transformed just as it had in 1984 during Harford's first spell at the club.

As it turned out the game against Oldham started off in less than sparkling fashion with the Town pulling back defenders to counter the threat of the Latics strikeforce of Ian Marshall and Graeme Sharp, which resulted in few chances at the other end.

The only shot on target by the Town in the first half saw David Preece hit the crossbar with a volley but the players had to come out of their shells when Oldham took the lead with Marshall's header after 52 minutes.

Despite throwing everyone forward in search of an equaliser, the Town did not look like scoring until a double substitution was made with Paul Telfer and Kurt Nogan coming on for Brian Stein and Darren McDonough.

The two, fresh youngsters turned the game on its head with their enthusiasm and willingness to run at the Oldham defence, but as the minutes ticked away it looked as though the Latics would escape with all three points.

With five minutes to go the ball was worked down the right by Matthew Jackson and Telfer, for Nogan who put over a low cross for Harford, who had got in front of his marker, to tap in.

The crowd went wild and in true 'Roy of the Rovers' style Harford was on hand to take advantage of some hesitancy in the Oldham defence to hit a sweet overhead kick into the roof of the net in injury time and secure an unlikely victory.

Pleat said afterwards: "I have to be mean with Luton's money, and I think I paid about £75,000 over the odds for a man of 32, but I knew what Mick had to offer and what he was really worth to us."

The only question of Harford was: "Who writes your script?"

Swift action against fouls, bad fouls & even worse fouls

PLAYERS - and especially skilful players - must be protected from being unfairly damaged. For players, the consequences of foul tackles are injuries, pain, months out of the game and, in some cases, total loss of career. Even worse, occasionally, permanent disablement.

The correct application of Law 12 (Fouls and Misconduct) in every match is, therefore, of prime concern.

A recent re-wording of this law should lead to a more ready acceptance of the correct punishing of unfair challenges and, in particular, help spectators understand the degrees of punishments and their dependence upon the nature of the foul acts.

For years, match officials have had to make an enlightened guess concerning the true 'intention' of a player in making a challenge.

The words "intention" or "intentionally" figured prominently in the law. Now the terminology is easier to understand, with unfair pushes, trips and kicks, etc, being judged in terms of whether they are seen, in the context of a game, as being merely careless, decidedly reckless or involving an excessive amount of force.

In each case, the basic punishment for the offender will be the award against him of a direct free kick (or a penalty kick if committed on an opponent by a player of the defending team in his own penalty area) but the direct free kick may also be supplemented with a further punishment of a caution (yellow card) or dismissal (red card) depending on the perceived nature and intensity of

In the third of a series of articles, the FA's Director of Refereeing, KEN RIDDEN, looks at topical issues, this week dealing with the application of Law 12 (Fouls and Misconduct).

the unfair attack.

A simple trip will result in a free kick; seen to be sufficient punishment for the crime.

However, a reckless trip might be considered to be not sufficiently punished by a free-kick alone. A referee may, therefore, deem such a challenge to be a case of ungentlemanly conduct too, deserving additionally of a caution for this further offence.

Even more extreme would be the wild, brutal, excessively violent trip, as committed (thankfully, only rarely) by a harassed defender, racing from behind a speedy, skilful attacker.

For such an unacceptable violation, the offender, guilty clearly also of serious foul play, must be dismissed from the field.

In addition to the introduction of the qualifying terms, careless, reckless or the use of disproportionate force, in each case as considered in the opinion of the referee, in relation to pushing, tripping, and kicking an opponent, etc, the revised law also includes an aspect highlighted by FIFA last year and designed to further deter players from inflicting damage on opponents, ie "when tackling an opponent makes contact with the opponent before contact is made with the ball".

This further offence, quite understandably, also brings an automatic award of a direct free kick against an offender.

Some time ago, a prominent coach observed that while good, competitive tackling is a very important part of football, tackling requires great judgement, precise timing and intense concentration to take the ball away fairly from an opponent. How true are those views!

Carelessness, recklessness and excessive force and brutality in making challenges can only lead to fouls, bad fouls and even worse fouls.

Referees must ensure that players are protected from unfair behaviour by applying the sanctions offered by Law 12 firmly and swiftly for the benefit of all in and who watch our national sport.






