

IT WAS A TREMENDOUS FIGHTBACK LAST WEEK TO BEAT GRIMSBY

LAST week's hard fought victory against Grimsby Town saw us take another large step towards our target of survival in the First Division.

Indeed if we can get the three points today and get something from our next two difficult away games at Sunderland and Derby, we can perhaps start looking up the table instead of over our shoulders at the bottom positions.

We have given ourselves a great chance with our efforts in recent weeks but there is a hard programme of games to negotiate in the next few weeks, and it is vital that we continue to apply ourselves as we have done, because, to be sure, the moment we do not we can slip back into trouble.

We have got ourselves to a position of five off the bottom, and we need to make sure that we do not drop down below that position from now until the end of the season.

It is important psychologically as well as statistically that we do not slip backwards, and a win today will put us in contact with several teams with a points tally in the mid-thirties and give us a little bit of breathing space from the bottom three.

The game against Grimsby was a difficult one. As we expected they caused us as many problems as anyone we have played since I have been here, and that is something which apparently Grimsby have done to Luton on a regular basis in recent years.

Graham Alexander's early goal got us off to a good start, but Grimsby's equaliser was not totally unexpected, although the manner in which it came was massively disappointing.

Once we had gone 2-1 down after an hour, two things became necessary in a bid to salvage the three points.

Firstly, the effective use of substitutions which we managed successfully, and

secondly, a concerted effort from all the players, which was also forthcoming.

Two terrific goals from Bontcho Guentchev and Dwight Marshall, together with Grimsby perhaps tiring slightly in the last 15 minutes after their cup exertions in midweek, enabled us to snatch three points.

Defensive stability had been a keynote of our successful run until last Saturday, but this time it was the ability of individual players to come up with a goal when it mattered.

That was the key to success over Grimsby, and it is very heartening that if, for once, the defensive stability is not quite as it has been, then there are players who are capable of remedying the situation at the other end by scoring goals.

Of course if we can display both the defensive solidity that has been our hallmark recently and the ability to score goals of the quality of last week's game, then we will almost certainly win more than we lose.

This afternoon we extend a warm welcome to Millwall, their players,

officials, directors and supporters.

They are a club against whom I enjoyed many local derbies in my time as manager of Charlton, never managing to win though, and I had to wait until I came up against them with Middlesbrough to record a victory over the Lions.

A special welcome today to their new manager Jimmy Nicholl who, after doing a tremendous job on limited resources in Scotland with Raith, has now moved south to England. We wish him well, after today!

On the injury front, at the time of writing, Scott Oakes is nearly ready to resume training, and Marvin Johnson is back in training with the first-team group, although neither are likely to figure this afternoon.

Also at the time of writing, unless there are any last minute hitches, Gavin Johnson is set to join Wigan Athletic in a permanent deal, after a two-month spell on loan. We wish him well.

Finally, thank you for the warm applause which greeted the presentation of the Manager of the Month Award last Saturday. It was much appreciated.

Goal-den Graham delighted to net against 'trawlermen'

AS Graham Alexander celebrated his first goal for the Hatters last week against Grimsby, he was confident that a glass or two was being raised in his name at his former club Scunthorpe.

"Grimsby and Scunthorpe are big local rivals, and I'm sure I made a lot of Scunthorpe fans very happy as well with that goal," Graham told ClubCall this week.

"It has been a long time in coming, and in fact it has been the longest I have ever gone without scoring, but it was a good one to start off with and hopefully there's more to come.

"I usually get my fair share of goals, and used to get about seven or eight a season at Scunthorpe, and usually I scored in the first two or three games of every season, certainly that has been the case for the last four seasons I have played.

"The lack of goals this time around didn't really worry me, I was just keen to get my form back because I certainly haven't been at my best.

"Hopefully the form is coming now, and hopefully the goals will come with it."

Saturday's opener came after seven minutes, as

the Hatters weathered Grimsby's early pressure and then broke out to score.

"Mitchell Thomas played a great ball to me in our half, and I just went straight at their centre-backs," said Graham. "I was expecting to play Bontcho in or John Taylor, but the centre-backs just kept on backing off, so I had a sight of goal and I thought I would have a pop and in it went.

"If you don't have a go you never score, and Wayne Turner is always telling me to shoot.

"I'm sure the fans at Scunthorpe would have been pleased with it, because they are Grimsby's arch rivals, and I got quite a lot of stick when I was sitting on the bench during the cup game up at Blundell Park last month.

"Things have certainly changed since then, and we had the confidence to come from behind on Saturday.

"But we can't get carried away, we've done nothing special, just won games like we should have done from the start, and we have to keep going and really pull away from the relegation zone."

Oxford and Derby on the move

OXFORD United have signed a £15.3 million contract with Taylor Woodrow Construction to build a new 15,000 all-seater stadium in the Minchery Farm area of the city in time for the start of the 1997/98 season.

The decision came following discussions between the Second Division club's directors, the Football Trust and Oxford City Council who have already granted planning consent for the project, set to proceed in April 1996.

Oxford United's director with responsibilities for the new stadium venture, Keith Cox, commented: "I am delighted that the contract has been signed as it marks an important milestone in our proud 102-year history.

"We have fought long and hard for nearly a quarter of a century to build a new stadium and now it is becoming a reality."

Meanwhile Derby County have confirmed that they have agreed in principle to move to a new 30,000 all-seater stadium in the Pride Park area of the city in time for the start of the 1997/98 season, rather than redevelop their existing Baseball Ground.





CHRIS MALKIN - Signed for the Lions in July 1995 for £400,000 from Tranmere, after scoring 19 goals for Rovers last season. Scored Millwall's last minute winner in their 1-0 win over the Hatters at the New Den in September.

LEE McROBERT - Another graduate from non-league Sittingbourne, who scored his first league goal on his full debut against Charlton last season.

RICKY NEWMAN - Joined the Lions from Crystal Palace at the start of the season, having made 35 first team appearances for the Eagles last term. Scored Millwall's equaliser against Reading last Saturday.

PHIL O'NEIL - Left-sided midfielder/ defender who was a regular in the reserves last season whilst still a youth team player.

ALEX RAE - Highly-rated midfielder who has been the Lions top scorer for the past two seasons, who has won Scottish caps at both Under 21 and B level.

DAVE SAVAGE - Ireland Under-21 international who has established himself as a first-team regular since joining the Lions from Longford Town the season before last.

KEITH STEVENS - Has made over 400 appearances for the Lions since breaking into the first team in 1981 at the age of just 16.

SCOTT TAYLOR - Striker who joined the Lions late last season from non-league Staines.

BEN THATCHER - A product of the FA School of Excellence at Lilleshall, he made his league debut at the age of 17, and has gone on to make appearances for England at Under-21 level.

JASON VAN BLERK - Signed for the Lions from Dutch side Go Ahead Eagles in 1994. Since Mark Kennedy's departure to Liverpool, has played a key role on the left flank.

DAMIAN WEBBER - Defender who signed for the Lions from non-league Bognor Regis during the middle of last season.

DAVE WIETECHA - Goalkeeper who was a reserve team regular last season.

TONY WITTER - Centre-half who signed from QPR for £75,000 last November. Previously had loan spells at Plymouth and Reading.

SERGUEI YURAN - Russian international striker who signed from Spartak Moscow recently until the end of the season. Made his 30th appearance for Russia/CIS last week against Malta, and has played in Europe for Benfica and Porto.

VASSILI KULKOV - Joined the Lions with Yuran (above) from Spartak Moscow, after appearances in this season's Champions League. Midfielder capped 45 times by Russia/CIS.

TIM CARTER - Left during the close season, but returned to the New Den from Oxford to play in goal during Kasey Keller's absence on international duty.

GERARD LAVIN - Right back who signed for Millwall in November from Watford for £300,000 - a fee which will rise depending on appearances.

Meet the Manager

JIMMY NICHOLL was appointed Millwall manager last week, in succession to Mick McCarthy who is the new manager of the Republic of Ireland.

Nicholl joined the Lions from Scottish Premier Division side Raith Rovers, having guided them to Scottish League Cup glory last season with a dramatic win on penalties against Celtic.

Jimmy Nicholl played 73 times for Northern Ireland, and at club level for Manchester United, Sunderland, Rangers and West Brom, with spells in Canada at Toronto Blizzard.

A Hatter and a Lion.....

Born in Hyde, Cheshire, **ALAN WEST** was playing for his local school side as a 14-year-old when he was asked by a Burnley scout to attend trials at Turf Moor.

At the time Burnley had one of the best youth set-ups in the country and Alan joined in a side that eventually won the FA Youth Cup in 1968 appearing with the likes of Dave Thomas, Steve Kinton and Mick Docherty.

After making his first team debut in the 1969/70 season in Division One, Alan went on to make over 50 appearances for the Clarets as well as earn England Under-23 caps before agreeing to a transfer to Sunderland in 1973.


Unfortunately, Sunderland called off the transfer when their medical officers felt that Alan had a back problem which could have left him crippled within a couple of years.

Luton manager Harry Haslam had no such worries and stepped in with a £100,000 bid that took West to Kenilworth Road and a debut in a 2-0 defeat at Orient in October 1973.

This defeat proved a minor setback as the Town, aided by the midfield skills of West, went on to win promotion to Division One at the season's end.

For West that formed the first part of a career that was to see him turn out in a Luton shirt over 300 times.

The Town were relegated after one season in the top flight and for the remainder of the




decade tried to fight their way back.

After yet another near miss, in 1981, Alan decided, at the age of 30, that it was time to move on and he joined his old team-mate Peter Anderson who was then manager of Millwall.


Anderson did not last long at The Den, and when George Graham took over Alan's days were numbered, and he then spent four years as player/manager of Hitchin Town.

Now a minister, Alan still lives locally and is an occasional visitor to Kenilworth Road. - **ROGER WASH.**

How 31 Goals have been Scored




Goal Scorers



JOHN Taylor sandwiched between Grimsby's Paul Groves and Mark Lever





KERRY DIXON GIVES HIS THOUGHTS ON TODAY'S MATCH

STRIKER Kerry Dixon has played for both Luton and Millwall in the past 12 months, and the experienced ex-England man who is now battling to help Watford avoid the drop, says today's game could go either way.

"Luton have put together a terrific run since Lennie Lawrence took over and the club must be congratulated," said Kerry this week.

"I know most of the players at Kenilworth Road and they are too good to go down.

"Lennie was the right appointment at the right time because he knows what a relegation scrap is all about.

"And he has good back-up men in Wayne Turner and Trevor Peake.

"Wayne knows the players and has worked with many of

them in the reserves, and he can be tough when he has to be.


"The important thing is that Luton seem to have got the right management team at the right time and are definitely moving in the right direction.

"They have got their confidence back. It's amazing what a win or two can do, and the players are desperate to be in the team.

"They all want to be in the first team, and often it's not like that when a club is going through a bad patch."

"Watford are in the middle of just such a bad run after being hit by a string of injuries," Kerry pointed out, "and Glenn Roeder has not been able to field the same side twice and we're in a perilous position.

"But I feel, like Luton, Watford are good enough to stay up and I just hope I can help them along the way with a

goal or two."

First though Kerry must recover from an achilles tendon injury which kept him out last Saturday against Charlton, and threatens his place this weekend at Crystal Palace.

He moved to Vicarage Road last month for £20,000 having been unable to command a regular place at the New Den under Mick McCarthy.

He bagged nine goals in 24 games for Millwall after moving from Luton on deadline day last March for £5,000, and played for the Lions in their 1-0 victory over the Hatters in September.

The 34-year-old, who has also enjoyed spells with Reading, Chelsea and Southampton, since moving into the big time from non-league Dunstable, has friends in both camps, and adds diplomatically that it will be a "very tight game".

But Kerry pointed out: "Millwall are a very good side, quite capable of getting back into the play-off picture, but they have had a disappointing run and, of course, they have to reorganise with a new manager at the helm.

"Luton have turned their season around and are playing with confidence, and they were also very unlucky to lose 1-0 at Millwall earlier this season.

"But the Hatters, as the home side, won't have it all their own way, because Chris Malkin is a dangerous striker, as Luton know from September, and Alex Rae knocks in a lot of goals from midfield."

Kerry also highlighted the threat posed by German striker Uwe Fuch, and Russian duo Sergei Yuran and Vassili Kulkov, the international duo on loan from Spartak Moscow.

But the ex-Hatters and ex-Lions striker is concentrating his mind on playing at Kenilworth Road in April, when Watford play Luton in a derby clash which could be so vital to both sides.

The Hornets are currently bottom of the table, with the Hatters having pulled clear with a run of 14 points from 18 since Lennie Lawrence took charge.

"I am desperately keen to see both clubs stay up," said Kerry.

"I was born in Luton, watched the club as a schoolboy and later played for them. Now I am a Watford player and I don't want to lose the derby fixture.


"It's a special occasion and very important to the fans. They love it and so do the players, who always look for that game first when the fixtures come out.

"We come to Luton on April 20, and I just hope both clubs are clear of trouble by then.

"It would be awful if we arrived at that day with one or other of the clubs still battling against relegation.

"There's no doubt in my mind that both clubs are good enough to stay up."







Over 100 years of playing the Lions

TODAY we welcome back to Kenilworth Road a club that can surely be labelled as being amongst our oldest opponents in competitive football.

Millwall and ourselves were amongst the founder members of the Southern League in 1894, and for its first two seasons the pair of us were head and shoulders above the rest but, unfortunately, we were beaten to the post, finishing runners-up on both occasions to the Lions.

After our brief period in the Football League at the end of the last century, our regular meetings with Millwall were resumed in the Southern League in 1900 with results tending to favour the London side in the period leading up to the First World War.

We also met twice in the FA Cup around this time, with Millwall coming out on top, winning 3-0 in 1902/03 and 2-1 in 1908/09.

Despite all these setbacks we gained the upper hand as both teams became founder members of the Football League Division Three in 1920.

We went 10 consecutive games unbeaten against the Lions before going down 7-0 at the Den in December 1925. Millwall repeated this scoreline a year later but this came two days after the Town had beaten the Londoners 6-0 at Kenilworth Road - with the Town fielding the

same eleven on both occasions!

Millwall won promotion to Division Two in 1928 but came back down six years later just as the Town were beginning to have promotion aspirations themselves.

The clashes in our promotion season of 1936/37 both created headlines, the first for the wrong reason.

When the teams met at the Den on November 21, 1936, a best-of-the-season crowd of 33,000 gathered to see if the high-flying Town could be toppled.

Goals from Joe Payne and Fred Roberts gave the Town a rather easy win, but bookings for Luton centre-half Jack Nelson and Millwall centre-forward Dave Mangnall for fighting almost caused a riot.

After the game a large crowd gathered to have words with Nelson, but the situation was diffused by Mangnall who deliberately escorted Nelson to the Luton team bus before warmly shaking his hand.

Unfortunately the matter did not end there because Secretary of the Football Association, Stanley Rous, was at the game and, after witnessing the altercation on the pitch, subsequently arranged for both players to attend a hearing where they received lengthy suspensions. The ramifications of this 'underhand' punishment reverberated around the football world for weeks afterwards.

The return match at Kenilworth Road that season came at a time when the Town's promotion hopes appeared to be slipping but with seven home games from the remaining nine fixtures hopes were there of a late surge.

As it turned out the Town were emphatic 5-0 winners against a side that perhaps had one eye on their forthcoming appearance in the FA Cup semi-final, the first side from Division Three to reach that stage of the competition.

Millwall joined us in Division Two a year later, but after their relegation in 1948 regular meetings did not take place again until 1970 with both sides enjoying varying fortunes in the intervening period.

In season 1970/71 a disastrous Easter for the Town, which included a 4-0 thrashing at the Den, effectively put paid to our promotion hopes, but in the following campaign goals from Chris Nicholl and Peter Anderson gave us a 2-1 home win, while two goals from Anderson earned us a draw at the Den. Millwall would have won promotion that season had they gained one more point!

A double for the Town was achieved in our promotion season of 1973/74 with a 3-0 home win almost ensuring our rise to the top flight.

The Lions gained their revenge three years later however, with a double of their own but two seasons after that suffered relegation and a further parting of the ways.

Our meetings resumed in 1988/89 following Millwall's promotion to the 'old' Division One, and the Lions quickly made up for lost time by beating the Town 2-1 at Kenilworth Road and 3-1 at the Den.

As if to prove there has never been much to choose between the sides we took four points off the Lions the following season as the London side slipped back to Division Two.

Since our own relegation in 1992 we have met Millwall on seven occasions and have yet to win. Our three meetings at Kenilworth Road have all ended in 1-1 draws, so based on the sequences of results over the past 100 years we are due a win this afternoon!



Terriers' keeper claims award


HUDDERSFIELD Town goalkeeper Steve Francis is the winner of the Wilkinson Sword Portector Award for January.







In the event on an evacuation of all or part of the stadium, you will receive instructions over the public address system on how you should leave the stadium. Stewards will direct you to the nearest exit. It may be that your normal exit route will not be available.

On leaving the stadium, you will find some roads closed to pedestrian traffic, to enable swift and unobstructed arrival of the emergency services.

Please leave the area of the ground as quickly as possible by the route directed. Your co-operation will be most appreciated.
