## From the manager's chair

AFTER the hope and expectation that resulted from our pre-season programme, Saturday's defeat against Burnley was a bitter pill to swallow, especially as having virtually lost the game in the first 30 minutes by conceding two goals we proceeded to lose it a second time when, having fought our way back into the game, we missed a penalty and squandered several other chances.

Burnley were workmanlike and took advantage of the chances that came their way, but failed to threaten in the second half, and on chances alone it was a game we could have at least drawn, and maybe won.

Nevertheless it represents a setback to us, as we were all hopeful of a first day victory.

But although some changes will need to be made as a result of our performance, we must not panic as what we saw in the six weeks of pre-season was pleasing.

On the other side of the coin however, the longer it takes to gain our first victory, especially at home, the more frustration will set in, so in a way tonight's game against Bristol Rovers gives us a chance to remedy the situation as, although it is a Coca-Cola Cup tie, they are in the same division.

Thus we welcome Bristol Rovers, their players, staff and supporters, now under

new player/manager Ian Holloway.

They made a winning start to the season on Saturday, with a 1-0 victory over Barry Fry's Peterborough.

I still believe that the aims and ambitions we had for the season, before Saturday, remain very much realistic propositions providing we have learned from our performance against Burnley, especially in the first half hour.

After the events of last season it was never going to be easy to turn things around, but a couple of wins and confidence and belief will replace fear and frustration, and hopefully we can enjoy a little bit of fortune in the game tonight that seems to have deserted us in recent months.

I understand fans' frustrations with a defeat on

the opening Saturday after the promise of pre-season and the wins here against West Ham and Norwich in particular.

But the temptation to smash things down and start again must be resisted as we need to work with the existing players who, I am sure, with the confidence of a couple of good results, can get us to better things.

As I write these notes, John Taylor is on the verge of signing for Lincoln City following several days of talks.

I have a great deal of time and respect for John, but at this time a move is probably in the best interests of both club and player.

Also, by the time you read this, Paul Showler should have completed his transfer from Bradford City, and could make his debut this evening.

He will give us a good option on the left side which, as I have said many times before, has been in short supply here.

Richard Harvey's unfortunate injury increased still further that requirement, and Paul is a player who worked with me at Bradford, and also impressed for us during pre-season.

We welcome him to Kenilworth Road and wish him every success with Luton Town.

THE Football League announced during the close season that they have seeded the five English clubs playing in European club competitions this season through to the third round of the Coca-Cola Cup.

This decision by the League is designed to reduce the fixture burden on those clubs involved in UEFA competitions, thus enhancing the chances of success in Europe for Manchester United, Liverpool, Arsenal, Newcastle United and Aston Villa.

The initiative means more clubs being involved in Round One of the Coca-Cola Cup competition, in order to achieve the right number at both the Second and Third Round stages.

Although the basic format will remain unchanged, the participating clubs during the earlier rounds of the competition will be readjusted as follows: Round One (two legs): 66 clubs (18 Division One, 24 Division Two and 24 Division Three).

Round Two (two legs): 54 clubs (33 qualifiers plus 6 Division One and 15 Premier League).

Round Three: 32 clubs (27 qualifiers plus 5 Premier League).

The Football League have also confirmed that for the first time in the competition's 36-year history, this season's Coca-Cola Cup will have a self-contained disciplinary system.

Players accumulating three cautions will be suspended from the next match

# New structure confirmed for Coca-Cola Cup

in the competition, whilst a player who subsequently records two further cautions will suffer another next match suspension.

A player sent off for a second cautionable offence or for preventing an obvious goalscoring opportunity will miss his side's next Coca-Cola Cup game, and red cards for foul or abusive language carry a two-match ban.


The only exception to this new format is for a player sent off for violent conduct or serious foul play who will miss his club's next three matches in all domestic league and cup games starting on the seventh day following the offence.





**ANDY TILLSON** - Formerly with Kettering, Grimsby and QPR, Andy Tillson is Rovers record signing at £375,000, joining the club in November 1992 from Loftus Road. Captains Rovers from centre-half.

**PETER BEADLE** - Joined Rovers in November 1995 in a £50,000 transfer from Watford, and scored both goals in a 2-0 win over neighbours Bristol City in January 1996. Previous clubs include Gillingham, Bournemouth, Southend and Spurs.

**ANDY COLLETT** - Goalkeeper who joined Rovers in March 1995, and made the number one jersey his own last season ahead of Brian Parkin.

**JOHN FRENCH** - Signed professional following a successful two-year spell as a YTS. Can play either up front or in midfield.

**MATTHEW HAYFIELD** - Former Chelsea schoolboy, but born in Bristol, and was given professional contract in July 1994 following consistent performances at youth and reserve team level.

**PAUL MILLER** - Striker who joined from Wimbledon for £100,000 in August 1994. Scored 22 goals in his first season with Rovers, but adopted a midfield role last season. Whilst at Wimbledon, played on loan for Bristol City, Newport and Yeovil.

**SHANE HIGGS** - Oxford-born goalkeeper who is yet to make his first-team debut.

**BILLY CLARK** - Joined Rovers in 1988 and completed his century of appearances in 1992-93. Previously with Bournemouth, he forms a key centre-half pairing with skipper Tillson.

**JUSTIN SKINNER** - Midfielder who arrived at Rovers in August 1991 as a club record signing for £130,000 from Fulham.

**MARCUS BROWNING** - Another product of Rovers youth policy who signed professional in 1989. Midfielder who is a regular member of Bobby Gould's Welsh squad, and made his debut against Italy.

**ANDREW GURNEY** - Versatile player who operates in defence or midfield. Scored Rovers winner in Saturday's 1-0 victory over Barry Fry's Peterborough.





John Hartson (9), in his last appearance for the Hatters before moving to Arsenal, scored for the home side, with Marcus Stewart, now at Huddersfield, scoring for Rovers. Luton won the replay 1-0 at Twerton Park, with a second-half winner from Dwight Marshall.

**TOM WHITE** - Defender who made his first-team debut at Bradford in February 1995.

**LEE ARCHER** - Winger who missed large periods of last season with a troublesome knee injury, but returned in the latter part of the campaign to provide several goals for Peter Beadle.

**DAVID PRITCHARD** - Defender who arrived at Rovers after spells with West Brom and Telford. Right back who was troubled with a knee injury last season.

**GRAHAM POWER** - Defender who became Ian Holloway's first signing after being released by QPR.

**STEVE PARMENTER** - Another ex-QPR player, who was released by Ray Wilkins.

The return leg of this Coca-Cola Cup tie, in two weeks time, will give Luton fans the opportunity to add another name to their list of grounds visited, as Bristol Rovers begin a ground-sharing scheme with Bristol Rugby Club.

Rovers' home ground has been a problem throughout their history. In 1940 they were forced for financial reasons to sell their 'home' at Eastville to the Bristol Greyhound Company.

Then in 1986 the level of their rent forced Bristol Rovers to leave Eastville and start a ground-sharing agreement with non-league Bath City, at Twerton Park some 15 miles away.

The club have worked extremely hard to find a new site in Bristol but a planning application for a ground in Mangotsfield was turned down. An area in Severnside, near the second Severn Bridge, is still being considered for the new ground, and negotiations are continuing with the various interested parties.

But the return to Bristol, to share Bristol Rugby Club's Memorial Ground is set to increase support, as the ground undergoes major improvements to accommodate professional rugby and football.

The move coincides with the arrival of player/manager Ian Holloway, who moved quickly to appoint Geoff Twentyman as his assistant. A former Rovers player, Twentyman had been watching the Pirates from the press box in his role as Sports Producer for BBC Radio Bristol.



The club's financial stability was also ensured during the summer, with the £1.2 million sale of striker Marcus Stewart to Huddersfield Town.

## MEET THE MANAGER

IAN HOLLOWAY was appointed player/manager in May, following the departure of John Ward.

This is his third spell with Rovers, the club he joined as a schoolboy.

His first period at Eastville ended with a move to Wimbledon, but Gerry Francis brought him back to Rovers in 1987 and he played a key role in the 1989/90 championship success.

Holloway joined Francis at QPR in 1991, and remained a key member of the Rangers side, under both Francis and Ray Wilkins, before his return to Bristol in May.

Former player, Geoff Twentyman is Rovers' assistant manager, with ex-Bristol City player Phil Kite the new physio.

## A Hatter and a Pirate.....

STEVE WHITE joined his local side, Bristol Rovers, as an 18-year-old and scored two goals on his home debut against Sheffield United only a year later.


An ex-England schoolboy international, he continued to knock in the goals, including two against the Town in August 1978, and was eventually enticed to Kenilworth Road for £195,000 just before Christmas 1979.

Despite paying all that money out, David Pleat only gave him two full games over the remainder of that season and he was only a bit player during the next campaign.


In our promotion winning season of 1981/82 he was finally given his head and he responded by playing in all 42 games scoring 18 goals, including four in a 6-0 home thrashing of Grimsby.

It was a surprise, therefore, when he was allowed to go to Charlton as part of the deal that brought Paul Walsh to Kenilworth Road, but he did get a chance of playing in Division One coming back to Luton on loan during the 1982/83 season appearing four times.


After 12 months at Charlton he rejoined Rovers for £35,000 before moving to Swindon on a free transfer in 1986. He had eight happy years at the County Ground before signing for Hereford in August 1994, where he was still banging in the goals last season at the age of 37.

## Average Shots and Corners






Those were the days

ALTHOUGH we have met Bristol Rovers once before in this competition - an instantly forgotten 1-0 win in a second round tie in 1974 with Adrian Alston scoring his first goal for the club - it is in the FA Cup that we have been involved in rather more memorable clashes.

In 1966/67 we had reached the depths and were struggling to avoid seeking re-election.

Only seven years after appearing in the FA Cup Final we were scratching around at the bottom of Division Four with a mixture of wizened old pros and not so bright youth players. Our home form was mediocre and away from Kenilworth Road the opposition were winning the easiest two points they were likely to gain that season.

At the beginning of November, following a dismal 2-2 home draw with the mighty Bradford Park Avenue, manager George Martin decided to throw in the towel and resigned.

He was replaced by ex-Luton favourite Allan Brown who, after watching the 1-0 defeat at Port Vale the following week, was heard to say, "I have a lot of work to do."

One of Brown's first tasks was to take his team to Exeter for a first round FA Cup tie and amazingly we came away with a draw. In the replay we finished with nine fit men in a bruising encounter and a makeshift side went down 8-1 at bottom club Lincoln on the following Saturday. We never played a cup replay on a Thursday night again!

New signing Max Dougan from Leicester shored up the defence in the next game when we saw off Chesterfield 3-2 at Kenilworth Road, and after ex-England centre forward Derek

Kevan joined us the following week, our second away point of the season was secured in a 1-1 draw at Halifax. Some supporters were now talking of a late run for promotion! Crowds started to increase, with 9,001 turning up to see the Christmas win over Tranmere and 8,531 on New Years Eve to see Brentford thrashed 3-0. After seven years of struggle you really had to be around at the time to sense the feeling that, at last, we had a manager who was going to put us back where we belonged. Our next task was to see off Third Division Bristol Rovers in the FA Cup at Eastville and, filled with euphoria, I joined a huge crowd of Town fans to see if we could get to Wembley as well as walk away with the Fourth Division title!

All went to plan with the Town taking a 2-0 lead midway through the first half when Kevan, taking advantage of a hesitant defence, scored with two well-placed headers.

Rovers' debutant keeper Larry Taylor was a bag of nerves in this opening period and was certainly at fault with one of the goals - only 19, Taylor took over from the long-standing Bernard Hall, who had been badly injured in a clash with Middlesbrough's ex-Town centre-forward John O'Rourke the previous week.

The Town defence, with Dougan, Fred Jardine and John Moore outstanding, kept what little the Rovers forwards had to offer at bay, and when the half-time whistle sounded we all thought the game was as good as over.

All the Town supporters changed ends at the interval (as you did in those innocent days) fully expecting more of the same, but Rovers had obviously received a rocket from manager Bert

Tann and attacked with more purpose with the result that most of the play was at the other end!

Even so the Luton defence did not seem to be in too much trouble until, with 20 minutes to go, Rovers winger Harold Jarman switched wings and put over a cross which was hammered home from 25 yards out by John Williams.

Inexplicably the Town players began to suffer a fit of the jitters and with Rovers taking full advantage the game began to turn, but two goals within 90 seconds five minutes from the end made a complete mockery of what had gone on before.

Firstly, makeshift winger Ray Mabbett (father of Gary), saw his corner jabbed into the net by skipper Joe Davis, and then a mis-hit shot from Jarman slithered through the mud past despairing Luton legs for the winner.

Manager Brown said after the game: "It was an astonishing result. We should have won with ease."

As a postscript, Rovers lost in the next round, 3-0 at home to Arsenal, and we narrowly failed to win the championship, finishing eighth from bottom! We had to wait another 12 months before winning the title but the FA Cup still eludes us. We were right about the manager though!






