From the manager's chair

TONIGHT we turn our attentions to the second round of the Coca-Cola Cup against Derby County, which gives us a chance to pit our wits against Premier League opposition and in particular a team that has made such a good start to the season.

Derby earned promotion to the Premier League last season, and deservedly so, under the guidance of one of the shrewdest, most experienced and astute managers in the game - one Jim Smith - and we warmly welcome him and his players, and the club's officials and supporters this evening.

From my point of view it was very pleasing to see an older manager gain more success, and I'm sure that having survived many ups and downs in management over the years, success was all the more sweet for Jim.

Derby come to us on the back of a good start and a good set of results so far, but we can take heart from the fact that we played very well at Derby in February in Division One to deservedly draw 1-1, and many of the same players, from both sides, will be on view tonight.

As far as we are concerned, if individually and collectively we play to the

very best of our ability, and for some reason Derby are slightly below par, there is every chance we can get a result.

Should Derby be at their absolute best and we have two or three players below par, as we did last Saturday, then the result will be a forgone conclusion.

However, with hopefully a good crowd and a decent atmosphere, it is a good chance for a manager, coach and players to pit their wits against the Premiership, and it is to be hoped that we can produce a performance and result that keeps us alive for the second leg next week.

At this stage last year, when I was at Bradford, we played a Nottingham Forest side that had not lost in the league for six months, and

were in Europe, and we managed to triumph over two legs.

This group of players at Luton have it in them to produce such a result if they can apply themselves consistently, individually and collectively, over 90 minutes.

Saturday's result against Chesterfield was a massive disappointment, and also a great surprise that we could fall so flat on our faces after the last three performances in the league.

For us to win games we have to play at a high tempo and we are only as good as our weakest player.

We are a side as yet unable to win if we play badly.

I have had promotion teams that have played at home in a promotion campaign on a few occasions like that and managed to draw to keep the momentum going.

We are unable to do that, and if we can learn to take something from a game when we have not played well we can only improve.

The physical demands of two games a week seem to have affected one or two players adversely, but is something that they must come to terms with as I expect most of these senior players to play 40 or 50 games this season.

I am sure that it will not

be a problem tonight, and hopefully we can take advantage of the atmosphere of a night game under lights.

We have to pick ourselves up and dust ourselves down, and go again.

The players want to do well, and their frustrations and disappointments can match those of the supporters. Hopefully both can put Saturday behind them tonight and between us fashion a victory.

After tonight's game, Kim Grant jets off to South Africa for a four-team tournament between Ghana, South Africa, Australia and Nigeria.

He is hoping to stake a claim for a place in Ghana's squad for their World Cup qualifying campaign and we wish him well. He will miss Saturday's trip to Bury, and hopefully he can make it a good send off tonight.

Two of the most experienced managers in league football, Luton's Lennie Lawrence and Derby's Jim Smith (RIGHT) pit their wits against each other tonight.

PENALTIES decided both weekend matches involving tonight's teams, with Luton going down 1-0 at home to Chesterfield, whilst Jim Smith's Rams beat Sunderland 1-0 at the Baseball Ground courtesy of an 84th minute spot-kick by Croatian midfielder Aljosa Asanovic.

The summer signing from Hajduk Split had himself been fouled, by Gareth Hall, and the goal gave Derby their second win in five days.

Smith said afterwards: "I'm just so glad and relieved that I signed Asanovic when I did.

"If I had left it until after his brilliant performances in Euro 96 everyone would have wanted him, and I would not have been at the races."

Meanwhile at Kenilworth Road, Luton went down to a 26th minute penalty converted by Chesterfield's Tom Curtis - after Marvin Johnson had been penalised for handball.

David Oldfield was close to an equaliser in the second half, with Chesterfield keeper Billy Mercer saving well from Graham Alexander.

Elsewhere in Division Two, Brentford stayed top despite being held 1-1 at home by Blackpool.

Watford moved into second place with a 1-0 win at Bristol Rovers - Devon White netted the winner after 17 minutes - with Chesterfield's win moving them up one place to third.

- Striker Kim Grant heads for South Africa after tonight's game, to join the Ghana squad playing in a four-team tournament. He will miss Saturday's game at Bury.





LUTON'S first round win against Bristol Rovers in this season's Coca-Cola Cup ended a barren spell of 13 matches without a victory in the League Cup competition, writes SIMON OXLEY.

Since appearing at Wembley in the 1989 Littlewoods Cup Final, the Hatters had won just one round in the League Cup, beating Mansfield in both legs of the second round the following 89/90 season.

They won 4-3 at Field Mill, with two goals apiece from Roy Wegerle and Lars Elstrup, and then won the second leg 7-2 at Kenilworth Road with Danish international Elstrup hitting a hat-trick.

But the 3-0 third round defeat at Everton, when ex-Hatter Mike Newell was among the scorers, started a run of 13 matches without a win.

In season 1990/91 Jim Ryan's side went out in round two to Bradford City, with both legs finishing 1-1, and

the Yorkshire side going through after a penalty shoot-out at Valley Parade.

In 1991/92, the Hatters, now under David Pleat, went out in round two to Birmingham, drawing 2-2 at Kenilworth Road but then losing 3-2 at St Andrews.

In 1992/93 it was a similar story against Plymouth Argyle - the home leg drawn 2-2, with both Luton goals scored by Steve Claridge, but the away leg lost 3-2.

In 1993/94, the Hatters found themselves in round one, but lost to Cambridge in both legs - 1-0 at the Abbey Stadium, and 2-0 at Kenilworth Road - with Claridge scoring in both matches against his old club.

In 1994/95, Fulham were Luton's first round conquerors. Both legs finished 1-1, with the Town going out on penalties at Craven Cottage.


In 1995/96, with Terry Westley at the helm, Bournemouth provided the opposition.

A 1-1 draw at Kenilworth Road was followed by a 2-1 extra-time defeat at Dean Court, but the 13-match run was ended earlier this season with the 3-0 win against Bristol Rovers.

RUSSELL HOULT - Injuries to Martin Taylor and Steve Sutton prompted the Rams to take Houghton on loan from Leicester, and that move was made permanent at the start of the promotion season with a £300,000 transfer. Now established as the club's first choice keeper.

MARTIN TAYLOR - Signed from local club Mile Oak Rovers as a youngster, and quickly established himself in the first team. Suffered an horrendous double fracture of the leg in an away game at Southend in the 1994/95 season which kept him out of the game for 18 months.

JASON KAVANAGH - Defender who is a product of the FA School at Lilleshall. Made his debut as a central defender, but now operates mainly at right-back.

CHRIS POWELL - Left-back signed at the end of January for £800,000 from Southend, and now revelling in a new wing back role.

DARREN WASSALL - Central defender who was signed from Nottingham Forest at the end of the 91/92 season for £550,000.

GARY ROWETT - Came to Derby in the summer of '95 as part of the deal which took Rams record buy Craig Short to Everton. Former Cambridge midfielder who became a regular in central defence during the promotion campaign.

IGOR STIMAC - The Rams' second highest ever signing at £1.57 million, the 28-year-old defender is one of the most highly rated players in the Premiership. Signed from Hajduk Split last October, and a key member of the Croatia side at Euro 96.


DEAN YATES - Former Notts County centre-half who was voted Player of the Year for 95/96 by the fans.

JACOB LAURSEN - Was one of the new signings for the 96/97 season who came to the Rams from Silkeborg for £500,000. Played for Denmark in Euro 96, and usually plays on the left of defence.

PAUL PARKER - Former England defender freed by Manchester United. Signed a two-month contract for the Rams at the beginning of August, having played under Jim Smith at QPR.








Average Goals per Match

MATT CARBON - Became Jim Smith's 11th signing for Derby when he joined the Rams at the beginning of March 1996 for £400,000 from Lincoln City. Played in defence, midfield and up front for the Imps, and made his Derby debut as a striker, but the Rams see his long-term role at centre-half.

ROBIN VAN DER LAAN - Dutch midfielder who signed from Port Vale for £675,000 last summer, with striker Lee Mills travelling in the opposite direction. Skipper last season, but plagued by pre-season injuries he has yet to command a regular Premiership place.

LEE CARSLEY - Former youth team skipper who broke into the senior squad last season, and is an Eire Under-21 international.

DARRYL POWELL - Midfielder who was signed from Portsmouth, where he played under Jim Smith, for £750,000. Scored against Luton in the 1-1 draw at the Baseball Ground last season.

PAUL TROLLOPE - A £100,000 acquisition from Torquay two seasons ago.

SEAN FLYNN - The 27-year-old midfielder arrived at the Baseball Ground just before the start of the promotion season from Coventry in a £1m exchange deal involving former Derby club captain Paul Williams.

ALJOSA ASANOVIC - Vast experience in Europe with Metz, Cannes and Montpellier in France, and Real Valladolid in Spain. Like his Croatian team-mate Stimac, he signed for Derby from Hajduk Split - for £960,000 in the summer following impressive displays in Euro 96.

CHRISTIAN DAILLY - Signed in the summer from Dundee United for £1 million. Capped for his country 33 times, being the youngest international player ever at 16 years in the Scotland Under 21 side. Started in midfield in the Premiership, and scored his first league goal against Tottenham.

MARCO GABBIADINI - Signed for £1 million from Crystal Palace in February 1992. Started at York City, and then moved to Sunderland where he was leading scorer for four successive seasons - earning the nickname 'Marco Goalo'. Moved to Palace in September 1991, but failed to settle in London.

PAUL SIMPSON - Made his league debut aged 16 for Manchester City, before moving to Oxford. Regular scorer from the left wing, and joined Derby for £500,000 in February 1992.

ASHLEY WARD - Joined the Rams in a £1 million deal from Norwich in March. Had spells at Manchester City and Leicester, before making a name for himself at Crewe. His scoring record there persuaded Norwich to pay £350,000 for his services.

RON WILLEMS - Dutch striker, formerly with Ajax, who joined the Rams last summer for £300,000 from Zurich Grasshoppers.

DEAN STURRIDGE - Product of Derby's youth policy who scored 20 goals last season, including both at Kenilworth Road in a 2-1 win. Bagged two in the Premiership opener against Leeds.




MEET THE MANAGER

JIM SMITH became Derby County manager in June 1995, and less than a year later they were in the Premiership.

One of the most highly respected managers in the game, Smith has been a league manager for 25 years - Derby is his eighth club - after spells at Colchester, Blackburn, Birmingham, Oxford, QPR, Newcastle and Portsmouth.


He is no stranger to promotion, having guided Colchester out of Division Four in 1974, and then Birmingham out of Division Two in 1980.

Oxford were champions in successive seasons in the mid 1980s, as they marched from Division Three to the top flight, but then Oxford inflicted a Wembley defeat on Smith as his QPR side lost the 1986 League Cup Final. When the former Sheffield United,



Aldershot, Halifax and Lincoln moved on to Portsmouth in 1991, he was close to taking them to the Premiership in his second season, and they enjoyed a memorable FA Cup semi-final against Liverpool.

How Goals have been Scored



A Hatter and a Ram.....

IAN BUXTON signed on full-time for Derby County in March 1959 after impressing as an amateur in the reserve side at the Baseball Ground.

He made a sensational league debut in November of that year scoring two late goals in a 3-0 home win over Ipswich but, surprisingly, it was a couple of years before he could regard himself as a regular part of the side.

When Brian Clough became manager at the Baseball Ground in 1967 and almost immediately signed John O'Hare, Ian knew the writing was on the wall and decided to join the Town for, a then, massive £11,000.

We were probably lucky to get him as Luton manager Allan Brown apparently tried to sign the local news reporter who had turned up to witness the event!

Ian made his debut at Kenilworth Road against Southend in a 3-1 win and made a further 35 appearances, scoring 13 goals, that season as we walked away with the Fourth Division title.

Despite his classy inside forward displays he made only 11 appearances the following season making his final outing in a Luton shirt in the infamous 2-1 home win over Watford in April 1969.

After leaving Luton in July 1969, Ian made a few appearances for Notts County followed by a spell at Port Vale before hanging up his boots to concentrate on cricket.


The decision was not taken lightly, but with the seasons for the two sports now overlapping, coupled with his appointment as captain of Derbyshire, it was probably an easy choice for the 32-year-old.

Ian Buxton is still involved with sport, owning a sports shop in Chesterfield. - ROGER WASH.




ABOVE: Ian Buxton in action against Rochdale.






SPOT THE GROUND



DAVID Oldfield's return to centre-forward from midfield is paying dividends - to the delight of manager Lennie Lawrence.

Now the 28-year-old who started his career up front for the Hatters back in the 1980s, before moving to Manchester City and Leicester, has the opportunity to test himself once again against a Premiership side.

Manager Lennie Lawrence has been pleased with Oldfield's performances to date.

"David, like Ceri Hughes for example, is a player who needs 50 games this season," the manager told ClubCall.

"He has scored four goals so far, which is a healthy return. I think he's in his right position at long last and obviously his confidence is growing.

"It's hard work for him up there and he needs to keep working hard, but he has the physical capability to do that.

"His touch, link up play and belief that he is going to score is improving every week, and he has

to make the position his own, get us 15 or 20 goals, and play 45 to 50 games."

The manager has been pleased with the performances of 18-year-old Andrew Fotiadis up front alongside Oldfield.

"Obviously you worry about

young players, but at the moment Andrew is not showing any signs of fatigue," said Mr Lawrence.

"We may have to take him out sooner or later, but that is to be expected for someone who has only been with us on a full-time basis since July."

Ex-Hatter Wegerle's rapid rise

FORMER Luton striker Roy Wegerle has joined the list of ex-Town players to move into management.

Wegerle has been appointed caretaker coach of the US Major League Soccer side Colorado Rapids.

Wegerle joined Luton from Chelsea, and left Kenilworth Road in 1989 to join QPR in a £1 million deal. He later played for Blackburn and Coventry, before returning to the United States to join the professional league established after the 1994 World Cup.

Bad break for Preece!

FORMER Luton and Derby midfielder David Preece has joined Cambridge United as player/coach - but his debut last Saturday lasted just 60 minutes, before he was stretchered off with a broken leg!

But the injury wasn't as bad as first feared, and after seeing a specialist this week the 33-year-old was told he could be back in action in six or seven weeks.

"There's no good or bad time to get injured, but obviously it was disappointing for this to happen on my debut," reflected Preece. "But it has been about seven years since I had a really bad injury and you know they are part of the game."

After spending 10 years at Kenilworth Road, Preece moved to Derby last summer, and later in the season spent periods on loan at Birmingham and Swindon.

A move to Cambridge had been on the cards for a while, and the player/coach role was finally confirmed earlier this month.

"A coaching role was something that I was looking for, and there isn't a great deal of travelling involved with the family firmly settled in Luton," he pointed out.

But he will still keep a close eye on both the Hatters and the Rams, and feels both could be in for a good season.

"Having played in Division Two with Swindon last season, I would say Luton have a great chance," said Preece. "When Dwight is fit again there will be a very strong choice of strikers, and the defence looks sound.

"And I think Derby can do well in the Premiership. Stimac is the player for them, and Asanovic looks a quality signing by a very shrewd manager."

Those were the days

WHEN, at the Football League's AGM in May 1960, it was voted that a League Cup competition be inaugurated the clubs agreed in favour by 31 votes to 15.

There was a certain amount of apathy at the start and it was to be nine years before every club took part, and that was only due to the decision, in 1967, to start playing the final at Wembley. Certainly the initial view was "Not more football!"

The Town entered right from the start and, on October 19, 1960, earned a creditable 1-1 draw at Liverpool, in a second round tie, in front of an Anfield crowd of 10,502.

David Brogan, on his Luton debut, scored our goal while at the other end 16-year-old goalkeeper Mike O'Hara performed miracles.

Unfortunately he was unable to repeat those heroics a week later in the replay as we went down 5-2.


We were included in the first round draw the next season but recorded our first victory in the competition when a last minute goal from Gordon Turner helped see off Northampton 2-1. Our interest ended at the next stage, however, when we went out to Rotherham after a replay.

Despite our terrible form in 1962/63, when we ended up being relegated from Division Two, we actually reached the fourth round of the League Cup competition.

We had an easy 3-1 win at Southport, followed by a far from simple 2-1 victory at Barnsley, before going out to a solitary goal at Manchester City in a game where the normally reliable Turner missed a couple of sitters.

We went out at the first time of asking, to Coventry, in 1963/64, and only went one stage further the next season before losing to a Tony Hateley goal in a 1-0 home defeat by first division Aston Villa.

The next two seasons saw us go out in the first

round, after replays, to Brighton and then Aldershot, but in 1967/68 we saw off second division Charlton at the Valley with an extra-time goal from Bruce Rioch, before putting up a good performance at Leeds and going down fighting against, arguably, the strongest team in the country at the time. Due to the euphoria surrounding Kenilworth Road following our promotion from Division Four, and the fact that we were drawn against local rivals Watford at home in the first round of the competition in 1968/69, a crowd of 20,167 turned up to witness a 3-0 thrashing of the Hornets.

A crowd of 18,679 was at Kenilworth Road to see us beat Brighton in a replay in the next round, while a 'massive' 30,405 saw us go out to Everton at Goodison Park in round three.

Although we were beaten 5-1 by the Toffees there was no disgrace in defeat as we were again up against a side that was on top of its form, and which included the famous half back line of Ball, Kendall and Harvey.

In 1969/70 we secured a famous victory at Millwall after another replay, with Malcolm MacDonald scoring the all-important goal, before losing 3-0 to Sheffield United in a limp performance at Bramall Lane, while in the following season we saw off Gillingham and Workington before losing 1-0 to 'lucky' Arsenal who were on their way to the double.

A record Kenilworth Road crowd in the competition of 27,023 saw George Graham score a scruffy goal to secure the win, while at the other end Gunners goalkeeper Bob Wilson brought off a series of wonder saves.

We went out at the first time of asking over the next two seasons, but in 1973/74 we equalled our best ever run in reaching the fourth round.

We made hard work of it though, in taking three

games to dispose of Grimsby and two to see off Bury, before losing at Millwall in a game played on a midweek afternoon because of the power workers dispute.

We went out before we had really started over the next three seasons, including an embarrassing 2-1 defeat at Darlington in 1975/76, before making a fist of it in 1977/78 when we firstly went to Wolves and won at a canter 3-1, and then took a strong Manchester City side to three games and in all of them failed to take our chances.

After two low key home wins over Wigan and Crewe in 1978/79 we were drawn away to first division Aston Villa in round four and, in front of a

record crowd in the competition to watch the Town, excluding the final, of 32,737, goals from Bob Hatton and Brian Stein secured a brilliant win and an away draw at Leeds in round five.

We now had dreams of Wembley, due to the fact we had never reached this far in the competition before, but in a disappointing performance a rampant Leeds side were well worth their 4-1 win.

Just at the stage when we thought we had the competition cracked we entered into a few seasons of decline and some embarrassing defeats, notably to Gillingham in 1979/80, Wrexham in 1981/82 and Rotherham in 1983/84.




League clubs continue ground developments

WITH the Hatters currently awaiting the verdict of a public inquiry into their plans to move to a new stadium, and tonight's visitors Derby County soon to leave the Baseball Ground, other league clubs across the country continue to announce ground development plans.

The long wait for **Sheffield United** supporters to see the final phase of redevelopment at their Bramall Lane ground is nearly over, with the completion of the eagerly anticipated John Street Stand just two weeks away.

This new £4 million development at their 107-year-old home - which is expected to be officially opened for the Blades' crunch Nationwide Football League fixture with Manchester City on Saturday, September 28 - will seat 8,000 fans of the South Yorkshire club bringing the all-seated capacity at Bramall Lane to 32,000.

The John Street stand will boast some of the finest corporate

entertainment facilities in the country with over 600 commercial clients catered for in the new complex.

The stand will have 31 private boxes, two restaurant areas, bars, lounge facilities and an extensive suite complete with a solid glass wall running the full length of the structure giving members the choice of seating behind or in front of the glass.

Meanwhile, construction has started on **Oxford United's** new stadium at the Minchery Farm site in the city.

The initial capacity of the new development will be a 15,000 all-seater structure which is sufficient to satisfy current demand.

However, to accommodate the demands of a team playing in the higher reaches of the First Division and beyond, the club has contingency development plans which would allow the U's to reconstruct the open corner segments of the new stadium thus increasing the capacity.

Access to the Minchery Farm Stadium, which will have almost 2,000 car parking spaces, is via vastly improved road links in the area, together with a special direct bus service from the city centre, Headington and the Manor Ground - so no one will be forgotten!

Promotion chasers **Carlisle United** have unveiled a new all-seater East Stand offering some of the most up-to-date features of any construction in the country to give the Cumbrians' Division Three campaign an extra boost.

Mervyn Day's side are now playing in front of a magnificent £3 million structure which boasts 6,000 seats, all with an unobstructed, panoramic view.

This new development, which is spread over three floors and incorporates 18 executive box facilities, was generously supported by The Football Trust to the tune of £1.125 million.





In 1984/85 we went out to a hat-trick of penalties scored by Andy Blair of Sheffield Wednesday, after losing Paul Elliott with a broken leg in the home win over Leicester in the previous round.

In 1985/86 we went out to Norwich at Kenilworth Road, while in the following year, the first under the sponsorship of Littlewoods, we were not allowed to take part due to our refusal to relax our ban on away supporters and allow Cardiff fans into Kenilworth Road.

As if to prove the authorities wrong, we set out the following season with a sense of purpose and exceeded our wildest dreams.

Wigan were seen off over two legs in round two, while Coventry were soundly beaten in a third round tie played at Leicester (a hang up from our supporters ban).

An early goal from Brian Stein settled a tricky tie at Ipswich, before we met Bradford City in round five, progressing through, courtesy of goals from Steve Foster and Mick Harford, in another difficult game.

We had now reached the semi-final for the first time and were paired against Oxford who we had beaten 5-2 and 7-4 in the league that season.

The first leg was played in a rapidly thawing, snow covered pitch at the Manor Ground, where a crowd of 12,943 saw Brian Stein give us the lead only for Dean Saunders to equalise from the spot and then miss another penalty.

But we won the second leg at Kenilworth Road at a canter and were through to the final at Wembley where our opponents were to be Arsenal.

The date, April 24, 1988, will be forever etched in the minds of all Luton supporters as we won a

memorable game against the Gunners 3-2, with the winner coming in the final minute in true fairy tale fashion.

My son, in his first season watching the Town had seen them play three times at Wembley that year and probably thought it normal, while I had been waiting 28 years!

I, along with most other Town fans thought we could now die happy, but amazingly we fought our way to Wembley again the following season.

Burnley, Leeds and Manchester City were seen off in the early rounds before we won away at Southampton in a round five replay, after a 1-1 draw at Kenilworth Road.

West Ham were to be our opponents in the semi-final and in a very one-sided first leg we won 3-0 at Upton Park in front of the TV cameras.

The second leg was a formality and we were on our way again to our 'second home' in north-west London with our opponents this time Nottingham Forest.

Despite going in with a half-time lead we fell apart in the second period and could not really complain at the eventual 3-1 defeat.

Since Littlewoods started sponsoring the League Cup in 1986 we had achieved a proud run of 16 undefeated games spread over three seasons.

Our record since those heady days has been, to put it mildly, poor and before our first round win against Bristol Rovers this season we had not won a game since thrashing Mansfield over two legs in 1989.

For six seasons running we went out at the first hurdle to lower league opposition and I think we have now suffered enough, and are more than ready for another trip to the Twin Towers!

For the record: We have played 106 games in the

competition, winning 44 and losing 37. We have met 51 different opponents before tonight, including Aldershot, Southport and Workington who are no longer in the league. We have been drawn out of the hat with Manchester City four times, while Sheffield United and Leeds are next in line with three each.






LTFC EVACUATION PROCEDURE






