

**Coca-Cola Cup 3rd round replay
Tuesday, November 12, 1996, kick-off 7.45pm**

From the manager's chair

THIS evening we welcome the players, supporters and officials of Wimbledon FC, for our long-awaited replay in the third round of the Coca-Cola Cup, the winners of which can look forward to entertaining Aston Villa in round four.

Since that first game at Selhurst Park, we have played four times and Wimbledon have played only twice, and it will be interesting to see whether that has any effect on tonight's proceedings.

Our confidence remains high after we extended our unbeaten run to 13 matches against Notts County on Saturday, although, as I reminded the players after the game, tonight's encounter will be a vastly different proposition.

It is often in the nature of the professional footballer to do just enough, and to be fair we never looked in danger of defeat in the second half on Saturday.

Also, the players have been able to raise their game individually and collectively in previous cup games this season.

Make no mistake, it will be necessary for us to do so again if we are to succeed tonight.

Home advantage will bring some benefits for us, but will also I believe

benefit Wimbledon in some respects as a near capacity crowd and a better atmosphere than a three-quarters empty Selhurst Park may well help them as well as helping us.

However, our home record has been very good in recent weeks and if we treat Wimbledon with respect and not fear, work as hard as we did in the first game, pass the ball as well as we can when we can, and concentrate absolutely on set plays, then there is no reason why we cannot achieve a famous victory.

On current form, beating Wimbledon tonight would be as big a scalp as we could take at the moment, possibly outside of beating Newcastle, Manchester United or Liverpool.

Certainly on current form, Wimbledon are anybody's equal.

But we also have an unbeaten record, albeit against inferior opposition to that which the Dons face every week, so something has to give.

I just hope we do ourselves justice, as we have done in the earlier cup games against higher opposition, and the players must take heart from the fact that we nearly gained a narrow victory in the closing 10 minutes of the first tie.


If we are at our absolute best, individually and collectively, we have a fair chance.

Failing that there can be only one result and it will not be in our favour.

But this is what cup football is all about, and I hope that we can benefit from the same levels of vocal support that we received at Watford two weeks ago.

On the injury front, David Oldfield is still not quite right after hamstring trouble, and Andrew Fotiadis is back in light training.

Tony Thorpe came off on Saturday with a slight thigh strain but should be fit, likewise Paul Showler who missed the Notts County game with a combination of injury and illness.




On Saturday we continue with cup football at Torquay, before resuming league action at Preston a week tonight.

LUTON moved into fifth place in Division Two with Saturday's 2-0 win over Notts County, writes SIMON OXLEY. (See page 46 for table).

First-half goals from Tony Thorpe, his 11th of the season, and Ceri Hughes, secured the points for Lennie Lawrence's side.

Notts keeper Darren Ward had earlier denied the Hatters with three saves in the opening six minutes, and he was busy after the break denying Hughes and sub Stuart Douglas.

At the top, Millwall stayed two points clear with a 1-1 draw at Bristol City in front of the Division's best crowd of the day, 12,326.

Brentford are second after a 2-2 home draw against Stockport. David Webb's side were 2-0 in front with 12 minutes to go.

Bury beat York 4-1, and Wrexham won 2-1 at Gillingham, to both stay above Luton, but Crewe went down 2-0 at Burnley where ex-Hatters Kurt Nogan and Damian Matthew were on the scoresheet.

Watford were held to a 0-0 draw at Rotherham, with Wycombe recording only their third win of the season with a 2-1 home victory over Plymouth.

In Division Three, our cup opponents next week, Torquay, lost 2-0 at home to Colchester, with the visitors including on loan John Taylor in their starting line-up (see page 23).

Tonight's opponents Wimbledon were of course without a game, due to the World Cup qualifying matches.

Vinnie Jones was in the Welsh side that lost 7-1 in Holland, but Oyvind Leonhardsen grabbed the winner as Norway won 1-0 in Switzerland.



ALAN KIMBLE - Joined the Dons from Cambridge in the summer of 1993 for £175,000, having started his career at Charlton, with a loan spell at Exeter.

VINNIE JONES - Welsh international recalled to the squad for the weekend game in Holland. Now in his second spell with Wimbledon after completing a £700,000 move from Chelsea in September 1992. Joined the Dons from Wealdstone, before moving on to Leeds and Sheffield United.

DEAN BLACKWELL - A product of the club's youth policy, and a former England Under 21 international who missed the whole of the 94/95 season with injury.

BEN THATCHER - Bought from Millwall in the summer of 1996 for a record £1.84 million, almost double the previous record paid for Efan Ekoku. England Under 21 international, and a former FA School of Excellence pupil at Lilleshall.





DEAN HOLDSWORTH - Scored Wimbledon's goal in the first meeting last month. Started his career at Watford, with loan spells at Carlisle, Port Vale and Swansea, before moving to Brentford. Joined the Dons from Griffin Park for £720,000 in the summer of 1992, and netted 16 league and cup goals last season. England B international.

MARCUS GAYLE - Another import from Brentford, who joined the Dons in March 1994. Former England youth international whose first goal for Wimbledon was in the Coca-Cola Cup against Torquay in September 1994.

CHRIS PERRY - Former youth team skipper who broke into the first team midway through the 94/95 season. Born and brought up close to the Plough Lane ground where he used to watch the Dons play.

PAUL HEALD - Goalkeeper who joined Wimbledon three weeks before the start of last season from Leyton Orient, for an initial fee of £125,000, following a tribunal decision.

JON GOODMAN - Joined with Kenny Cunningham from Millwall, having started his career in non-league football with Leyton Wingate and Bromley.

ALAN REEVES - Centre-back signed from Rochdale for £200,000 in September 1994.

BRIAN McALLISTER - Glasgow-born defender who enjoyed loan spells at Plymouth and Crewe before breaking into the Wimbledon first team.

NEAL ARDLEY - Another youth product who has won England Under 21 honours, making his league debut in April 1991.

MICK HARFORD - Needs no introduction to Luton Town fans after two spells at the club. Joined the Dons from Coventry just before the start of the 94/95 season, having started his league career at Lincoln. England international who scored twice on his 'second debut' at Kenilworth Road in 1991, and has made over 550 league appearances, scoring nearly 200 goals.

DUNCAN JUPP - Scottish Under-21 international fullback who was signed from Fulham during the summer for £125,000.

ANDY CLARKE - Made his name in non-league football for Barry Fry's Barnet, and joined the Dons for £150,000 in February 1991. At the beginning of this season had started 86 league and cup games, but had come on as a sub in 87.

JASON EUELL - Young striker who made his Premiership debut last season, scoring against Southampton. Later netted against Manchester United.

PETER FEAR - Former England Under 21 player, who has progressed through the junior sides at Wimbledon.

ANDY PEARCE - Centre-back who signed for the Dons in November 1995, for £600,000, from Sheffield Wednesday. Started his career at Coventry.



MEET THE MANAGER

Former Republic of Ireland international JOE KINNEAR was talked about as a probable successor to Jack Charlton as Eire manager, but decided to stay with the Dons, where he has become one of the most respected managers in the country.

Wimbledon lost their first three matches this season, but then chalked up seven straight wins in the Premiership to earn a place in the top three, and Kinnear the Manager of the Month award.


Born in Dublin, he started his league football career a Tottenham joining them from St Albans, and played for Spurs from 1965 to 1975 winning domestic and European honours.

From Spurs he moved to Brighton, but his playing days were cut short by injury and he turned to coaching, initially in the Middle East and Malaysia.

After a brief spell at Doncaster he moved to Wimbledon, becoming manager after the departure of Peter Withe, who had a short spell in charge after the departure of ex-Luton boss Ray Harford.

Lincoln-born CLIVE GOODYEAR joined the Town as a junior in October 1978 and eventually made his debut in a home game against Wrexham in April 1980.

He became a regular in the side following the bad injury suffered by Mike Saxby in our promotion season from Division Two, and in total made 90 league appearances for the Town.


He also weighed in with four goals, including the effort that saw off Watford here over Christmas 1982.

Inexplicably he was allowed to leave Kenilworth Road in August 1984 and had three years at Plymouth before coming back to Division One, this time with Wimbledon where he was the proud winner of an FA Cup medal following the Don's 1-0 victory over Liverpool at Wembley in 1988.

To quote the Wimbledon programme from the original third round meeting last month: "His well-timed tackle on John Aldridge, which led the referee to award an undeserved penalty to Liverpool, will be long-remembered along with the Dave Beasant penalty save."

A bad knee injury cut short his career in the top flight and after a short spell at Brentford, he enjoyed two seasons in Hong Kong playing for Ernest Borel who he helped to win the Viceroy's Cup.

Returning to these shores in 1993, Clive acted as player/physio for St Albans while helping out with our reserve side at the same time, taking on a full-time post at Kenilworth Road two years ago, making good use of his physiotherapy qualification. - ROGER WASH.




ABOVE: Clive Goodyear at Kenilworth Road in 1980. (See page 27 for 1996 version!)






Average Goals per Match




Average Shots and Corners




Tony Thorpe levels for the Hatters at Home Park with five minutes to go, to complete his first ever hat-trick in the 3-3 draw.

Supporters who were here on Saturday would have seen Dwight Marshall back in the squad for the first time since breaking his leg in February.



Those were the days

WE have only met Wimbledon once before in cup competition and that was back in 1988 when our FA Cup semi-final defeat came in the midst of a marathon campaign which looked, at one stage, highly likely to include four trips to the 'twin towers' in one season.

Our FA Cup marathon began at fourth division Hartlepool in January 1988, and it must be admitted that we were not looking forward to the trip. We had not visited the Victoria Ground for almost 20 years, but memories of defeats on each of our four previous encounters there were still in the back of our minds.

With the wind whipping in off the North Sea, a highly partisan crowd and physical opponents, we were under the cosh for the opening 20 minutes but once the storm was weathered we started to dictate play.

We opened the scoring through Micky Weir, in his last game for the club, just after half-time, and added a second when Darron McDonough smacked a long shot past the Hartlepool keeper. The home side's reply came too late to have any effect, but the gate receipts enjoyed by Hartlepool for reaching this stage in the competition for the first time since 1979 was some consolation.

The cup games were now coming thick and fast on all fronts, and Southampton were our visitors in round four. At least we knew what to expect against a side from our own division, but what we did not expect was a speculative cross from Colin Clarke going in off the post with only 20 minutes left.

With the Saints coasting to victory we came up with extra reserves of effort and turned the game around with two goals in the final 10 minutes to secure a rather fortunate victory.

More first division opposition was our lot in round five, and we had to make the short trip to QPR where a Mick Harford equaliser, in a poor game, brought Rangers back to Kenilworth Road.

In the replay, again a scrappy affair, Rangers fullback

Warren Neill put through his own net, in similar fashion to his effort earlier in the season that gifted us the points in a league encounter. Our luck was still holding and we earned another tie against first division opponents in the quarter final, with Portsmouth the visitors to Kenilworth Road. The game lacked a certain amount of build-up due to our exploits in the Littlewoods and Simod Cups, and whereby in any other season the town would have been cup mad this encounter had the air of 'just another game'.

Danny Wilson shot us into an early lead, and when Mark Stein put us 2-0 ahead after 20 minutes the game looked as good as over, even after Mick Quinn reduced the deficit before half-time.

Quinn was sent off just after the interval and the remainder of the game was played in an unreal atmosphere more akin to a pre-season friendly, rather than a game

that would see us through to an FA Cup semi-final for only the third time in our history.

The semi-final clash against Wimbledon had to be put out of our minds as we had a lot of football to come in the intervening weeks.

We had won through to the Littlewoods Cup Final after seeing off Oxford over two legs, and had fought our way through to the final of the Simod Cup after beating Swindon in a surprisingly tense semi-final.

We were also due to appear at Wembley as part of the Football League's centenary celebrations and were falling behind in our league games.

The Simod Cup Final is best forgotten, as was our short appearance at Wembley in the grandly named Mercantile Credit Football Festival, while in the league we had scraped together a couple of home wins that had taken the heat off us a shade.

In the week leading up to the FA Cup semi-final we had lost goalkeeper Les Sealey, who was badly injured in a clash with Sheffield Wednesday's Lee Chapman, which meant he would join Ricky Hill and David Preece as a long term absentee.

16/11/91: The Town had taken a 1-0 interval lead at White Hart Lane against Tottenham, when the lights went out. On the restart Spurs hit four without reply, with future Luton player Scott Houghton hitting two.

half and we were rather fortunate to go in at the interval still level.

Our failing was to be sucked into trying to play the Dons at their own game, which we were not very good at, and four times in the first half stand-in goalkeeper Andy Dibble made brave saves when faced with one on one situations.

The second half was barely a couple of minutes old when Tim Breacker's diagonal ball found Mick Harford, who glided in to score his 21st goal of the season. Perhaps our name was on the cup after all!

Our lead was shortlived however, as ten minutes later Dibble was harshly judged to have fouled Terry Gibson, and John Fashanu calmly stroked home the equaliser from the spot. The Dons' winner came with ten minutes to go when Dennis Wise was first to a cross from Alan Cork and slid the ball home two-footed.

Luton manager Ray Harford, later to manage Wimbledon, conceded that we were second best on the day and hoped the Dons would go on to lift the trophy which they did, beating Liverpool in the final.

We of course did not finish the season empty-handed either, and both teams can look back on 1988 with some satisfaction.




During the last decade family sections at grounds have increased dramatically and represent a safe and supervised area for young fans to start watching league action.


LTFC EVACUATION PROCEDURE

- Ensure the safe and controlled evacuation of the ground.*
- Ensure the dispersal of the crowd from the area to allow the emergency services to carry out their tasks.*

Stewards will direct you to the nearest exit. It may be that your normal exit route will not be available. On leaving the stadium, you will find some roads closed to pedestrian traffic, to enable swift and unobstructed arrival of the emergency services.


