## MESSAGE

Good afternoon and welcome to Dean Court for today's match against Luton Town. This is our second game against Luton in just over a month, and since that game, they have been doing very well and are now fourth. This is very much in keeping with recent games we have played against in-form teams - Bury, twice against Brentford and at Burnley who I'm sure will be near the top come the end of the season. The last month has been quite hard for us, mainly against sides in the top six.

### TURNING POINT

When we played at Luton, we can look at the save before the break as the turning point in the game, after playing well. Again last Saturday at Burnley I felt we performed well in the first half, but when Fletch went off, we didn't have anybody to hold the ball up, we didn't have anybody with any strength. We missed that as it was a game we deserved to get something from. In the first half we made some chances and we still created a few in the second half. If you look at the amount of chances Burnley had, we probably had more than them and we outplayed them at times in the first half. Despite our second half performance, I really felt that we did enough to gain a draw.

### REVENGE GAINED

It was atrocious conditions for the Brentford game, but we got our revenge after losing the cup game and because of that, I really fancied our chances going to Burnley on the back of three league games unbeaten - and we

really should have got something out of the game, but once again it was the same old story. We created good chances but we didn't take them.

### SUPERB CROWD

Against Brentford it was the same where we created a number of chances, yet we had to rely on a penalty to get us a deserved win. I would like to say here how much I appreciated the crowd against Brentford. You all got behind the lads giving them tremendous vocal backing. I don't know whether it was because they were top or because they had just beaten us in the cup, but we could do with that sort of backing week in, week out. For you all to come out on a night like that was tremendous and you all deserve medals. The players certainly appreciated your efforts.

### WELCOME REST

We have a free Saturday coming up and with players like Steve Fletcher, Owen Coll, Russell Beardsmore and Steve Robinson all carrying injuries, it will give them a little more time to recover. The break will be good for all the players who have had some hard games in tough conditions and they are becoming a little jaded. It's a break from routine which will do the team good.

**Luton travel to Bournemouth today with a fine run of form behind them - a run of form that has taken them from the bottom of the division to fourth after last Saturday's last gasp 2-1 home win over Bristol Rovers. That win means that they have tasted defeat in the league just once in their last 12 matches.**

### POOR START OVERCOME

After finishing bottom of the First Division last season, The Hatters faced life in the Second Division for the first time since 1970. Early weeks of the season were a struggle for the side and three straight league defeats saw them bottom of the table. Since then, just two defeats in the league have seen them steadily climb the table. After a last minute penalty from Tony Thorpe earned them the three points last Saturday, they were in fourth place with a game in hand over second placed Brentford.

### FORTRESS KENILWORTH ROAD

After two early home defeats at the hands of Burnley (1-2) and Chesterfield (0-1), they have become invincible in the league at home. Between those two defeats, Rotherham (1-0) and Gillingham (2-1) were both beaten. Since then they have gone on a run of 6 consecutive home wins. Blackpool (1-0), Walsall (3-1), Peterborough (3-0), Notts County (2-0), Bristol Rovers (2-1) and of course the Cherries have come away from Kenilworth Road with nothing.

### SAME STORY ON THE ROAD

Away from home, Luton recovered from two early defeats at Brentford (2-3) and Bristol City (0-5) to go six away games without defeat. Points were gained at Wycombe (1-0), Bury (0-0), Shrewsbury (3-0), Stockport

(1-1), Watford (1-1) and Plymouth (3-3) before going down to their first away defeat since August 27 when they lost 3-2 at Preston on November 19.

### CUP SUCCESS

After the Cherries halted Luton's progress in the Coca-Cola Cup last season, Luton more than made up for it this time with a good run. In the first round, Bristol Rovers were beaten 4-2 on aggregate. Premiership side Derby were the next opponents and a Julian James goal gave them a slim advantage to take to the Baseball Ground. A superb performance at Derby saw the Hatters record a giant killing after a 2-2 draw earned them a place in the third round. In that round they faced in-form Premiership side Wimbledon and again they upset the form book by gaining a 1-1 draw at Selhurst Park. In the replay, they were leading right up to the last minute before Wimbledon struck, and then won the tie in extra-time. Out of the cup but certainly not disgraced. In the FA Cup they are through to the next round thanks to a 1-0 win at Torquay.

### EXCELLENT GAME IN PROSPECT

With the recent meeting between the two clubs, both sides will know all about each other. That could be said about the last match here at Dean Court, and if it's anything like that, then we are in for another excellent game.

## MEET THE MANAGER



**LENNIE LAWRENCE**  
*Lennie took over at Luton in December 1995 and although he couldn't prevent Luton escaping relegation last season, he lay*

***firm foundations which are paying dividends this time round. As a player, he played non-league football, serving Carlshalton, Croydon and Sutton United before moving into management as assistant at Plymouth where he was also caretaker manager. He then moved to Lincoln as assistant before becoming manager at Charlton Athletic in 1982 after initially joining as reserve team manager. In his time at Charlton, he guided the club to the first division in 1986, keeping the club in the top flight until 1990. He left Charlton in 1991 and his next post came at Middlesbrough where he led the side into the Premier League. He left Ayresome Park in 1994 and took over at Bradford City where he lay the foundations for last season's promotion before replacing Terry Wesley at Kenilworth Road a year ago.***

***His experience and know-how in the game looks likely to help Luton to a challenging position at the end of this season.***

## THE PLAYERS

**IAN FEUER** - 6' 7" Las Vegas born goalkeeper who Cherries fans will remember well for his superb double save against Bournemouth last month. He was spotted by West Ham whilst playing in Belgium, but was actually signed for £70,000 from Los Angeles Salsas in 1994. His first taste of football league action came whilst on loan at Peterborough where he made 16 appearances. He signed for Luton in December 1995 for a fee that could rise to £580,000 and is ever-present this season.

**JULIAN JAMES** - Tring born defender who worked his way through the ranks at Luton to become a first team regular. He made his Luton debut in 1988 and was a regular at left-back in the 93-94 season and then made the right-back position his own the following season, winning the player of the year award. Has now made over 250 appearances for the club and also 6 for Preston during a loan spell in 1991. Scored the winner in this season's 1-0 win over Premiership side Derby in the Coca-Cola Cup.

**MICHELL THOMAS** - Luton born defender who started his career as an apprentice at Kenilworth Road where he made over 100 appearances before following David Pleat to Tottenham in 1986 for a £233,000 fee. After a 5 year spell at White Hart Lane, he moved to West Ham in 1991 for a £525,000 fee. He moved back to Luton on loan before making the move permanent in 1993. After losing his place in the side, he was recalled by Lennie Lawrence and is ever-present this season and has scored twice.

**STEVE DAVIS** - Started his career at Southampton, but his appearances were limited to just 6. He served both Notts County and Burnley on loan before making the move to Turf Moor permanent in 1991. He was part of the Clarets side that rose up the leagues and made 152 appearances for them, scoring 18 goals. Luton paid £750,000 for his services in 1995

and he has become a commanding figure since joining. Recently scored two goals in two games against Stockport and Peterborough.

**MARVIN JOHNSON** - Defender who is now in his tenth season as a professional at Kenilworth Road. He made his Football League debut in 1988 against Wimbledon and quickly established himself as a versatile defender. He celebrated his 200th full league appearance in October in the 3-0 win at Shrewsbury. Marvin scored Luton's equaliser in last season's Coca-Cola Cup clash here at Dean Court.

**CERI HUGHES** - Pontypridd born midfielder who has represented Wales at full international level. Has spent his entire career at Luton, signing professional forms in July 1989 and he made his debut at Aston Villa in 1990. Last season was blighted by injuries for Ceri, and he made just 25 appearances. He had a trial period at Crystal Palace during the Summer, but the deal didn't go through and he has established himself back in the first team and scored in the side's recent 2-0 win over Notts County.

**GRAHAM ALEXANDER** - Coventry born defender who started his career with Scunthorpe United. He spent over 5 years with The Irons and made 150 appearances, scoring 18 goals before joining Luton in 1995 for a £100,000 after being watched closely by the Luton coaching staff. Made 41 appearances last season and has missed just one game this time out.

**DAVID OLDFIELD** - Australian born midfielder who has represented England at Under 21 level. Started his career in 1986 with Luton before he was signed by Mel Machin at Manchester City for £600,000. From City, he moved to Leicester where he enjoyed a highly successful spell. He rejoined Luton in July 1995 for a £150,000 fee and he certainly enjoyed fine form at the start of this season, scoring 4 goals in the opening 8 games.



# THE PLAYERS



**Gary Waddock**

**GARY WADDOCK** - Experienced midfielder who joined The Hatters in December 1994 from Bristol Rovers. He started his League career at QPR and spent 8 years at Loftus Road before moving to Charleroi in Belgium. His next move was to Millwall in 1989, a spell that included a period on loan at Swindon. After another spell at QPR, he moved to Bristol Rovers in 1992 before moving to Luton. He has missed just one game this season.

**KIM GRANT** - Ghana born forward who started his league career under Lennie Lawrence at Charlton before moving to Luton for a £250,000 fee in March this year, scoring on his debut against West Bromwich. He was selected for the Ghana national squad during the summer and played against Egypt and Denmark and is a regular member of their squad in the World Cup and the African Nations Cup.

**TONY THORPE** - A player who is showing fine form in front of goal this season. Scored both Luton goals in the recent win over Bournemouth and followed that with a hat-trick against Plymouth. He joined the club at the start of the 92-93 season following a spell at his home town club, Leicester and made an immediate impact in the Luton side scoring on his debut in the FA Cup against Newcastle.

**BONTCHO GUENTCHEV** - Bulgarian international who signed for Luton at the start of last season after being released by Ipswich. He played in the 1994 World Cup Finals when Bulgaria reached the semi-finals and also appeared in

last summer's European Championships. He made 58 appearances for Ipswich in the Premier League and his wife's employment at the Bulgarian Embassy means he is free to continue playing in the UK.

**DWIGHT MARSHALL** - Jamaican born forward who started his football career with non-league Grays Athletic. His chance in the league came when Plymouth paid £35,000 for his services and he certainly paid them back with 35 goals in three years. After a loan spell at Middlesbrough, he joined Luton in 1994 for a £150,000 fee. He scored 13 goals last season, including the goal against Bournemouth in the Coca-Cola Cup at Kenilworth Road, before a broken leg left him on the sidelines. Has now got over that injury and has recently appeared as a substitute.

**PAUL MCCLAREN** - Midfielder who joined Luton from school and has represented England at Youth level. Signed professional forms in May 1994 after making his senior debut on the final day of the 93-94 season at Stoke City. Started as a centre-half before switching to midfield in the reserve side. Came on as a substitute in last month's match against Bournemouth.

**STUART DOUGLAS** - London born striker who joined Luton as a YT, signing professional forms during the summer. After an impressive scoring run for both the youth and reserve sides, he was given his first team chance against Oldham last season, and scored Luton's goal in the 1-1 draw.







## Luton Town

## THE LAST TEN YEARS

**86-87**

*It was a tremendous season for The Hatters as they finished in 7th place in Division One. Some notable results were gained such as Liverpool beaten 4-1 at home, champions*

*Everton beaten 1-0 at home and Manchester United beaten 2-1 at home.*

*Liverpool were also beaten in the FA Cup in a second replay, but further progress was halted by QPR. They were knocked out of the Littlewoods Cup by Cardiff with a ball being kicked! Because of Luton's no away fans policy, they were disqualified from the competition.*

**87-88**

A very busy season for the Hatters as they not only performed well again in the league, finishing 9th, but also played in a total of 14 cup ties. In the FA Cup, Hartlepool, Southampton, QPR and Portsmouth were beaten until Wimbledon knocked Luton out at the semi-final stage. The side were covered in glory though in the Littlewoods Cup. Wigan, Coventry, Ipswich, Bradford and Oxford were all beaten before beating Arsenal 3-2 at Wembley in a memorable final to lift the trophy.

**88-89**

Only a tremendous finish enabled Luton to keep their first division status. When Middlesbrough were beaten 1-0 on February 18, they were comfortably in mid-table. The next league win was not to come until April 29. Two further wins in May saw the side finish in 15th place. The highlight of the season again was the Littlewoods Cup. Burnley, Leeds, Manchester City, Southampton and West Ham were all beaten until Luton lost the Wembley final to Nottingham Forest.

**89-90**

A superb run-in to the end of the season preserved Luton's First Division status. It was a season of struggle with no cup glory to detract from the relegation dog-fight. By the end of October, the side were in 10th place, but the next win was not to come until February. Going into the last three games, it was between Luton and Sheffield Wednesday who would be going down. Wednesday lost 3-0 at home to Nottingham Forest, and Luton won 3-2 at Derby to secure their place in the division on goal difference.

**90-91**

The Hatters were grateful that the first division was to be expanded and only two clubs would be relegated as they finished 3rd from bottom. A win at Aston Villa on March 9, their 3rd win out of 4, looked set to ensure safety, but just two points out of the next 27 left them in trouble, safety being assured with a last day 2-0 win over Derby.

**91-92**

Luton's long association with the top flight which had lasted a decade, finally came to an end after recent

seasons of struggle. The entire season was spent in or around the relegation zone and apart from a good spell at Christmas when Coventry, Arsenal and Chelsea were beaten, there was little to cheer about and the side finished in 20th place.

**92-93**

With just 10 wins achieved all season, Luton spent much of the campaign in or around the relegation zone. It was a frustrating time at Kenilworth Road as the first victory didn't arrive until November 29. As the side lost at Southend in the final game of the season, Luton were thankful that both Sunderland and Brentford also lost, securing their first division status.

**93-94**

It was another close call for the Hatters as disappointing league form saw them avoid relegation by just two points. The FA Cup proved to be the most successful time for the club. Southend, Newcastle, Cardiff and West Ham were beaten to set up a Wembley semi-final match against Chelsea. Two goals from former Bournemouth player Gavin Peacock though were enough to dash Luton's dreams.

**94-95**

A final position of 16th in the First Division represented an improvement, but it could have been better if it wasn't for a poor run in. This was to be David Pleat's final season in charge as he left for Sheffield Wednesday. The play-offs were still possible going into the last few games, but two draws followed by four defeats finished the season on a low note.

**95-96**

After escaping the dreaded drop in recent seasons, Luton lost their First Division status, finishing bottom of the league. The side had to wait until the end of September for the first home win, and in that time, the Cherries beat the Hatters 3-2 on aggregate in the Coca-Cola Cup. Manager Terry Wesley was replaced by the experienced Lennie Lawrence and results improved as the side lifted themselves out of the relegation zone. Just two wins in their final 17 games though condemned them to Division Two.

# RUSSELL BEARDSMORE FIGHTING BACK



*After a fine run of form, it has been a frustrating time for Russell*

*Beardsmore as he had to undergo a hernia operation which has seen him out of the side in recent weeks. It was a good sight then for the*

*Bournemouth fans at Burnley last week as Russell warmed up with the rest of the team as he is now fighting back to fitness and ready to stake his claim for a first team place.*

#### **A KNOWN PROBLEM**

I asked Russell when he knew that there was a problem? "It was after the Gillingham game when I arrived home. I felt something but I thought that was due to the nature of the game, but I then started feeling it over a few games and I knew I had a problem. I've had a hernia problem before on the other side so I knew something was wrong. A hernia was diagnosed so I had to stop playing. If I had a choice I would have carried on, but it was too painful, and with the pitches getting heavier, it would have been impossible to carry on."

That was really confirmed with the last two games against Brentford and Burnley, played in atrocious conditions. "That's right, so I'm really glad I've got it done and got it out of the way and I should now be back for the Christmas period when we need a large squad because of the amount of games coming up."

#### **A POOR SPECTATOR!**

It is well known that many professional players are the worst spectators and I asked Russell if he was any different. "It is so frustrating. You see a lot of things when you're watching, but you can't beat being out there. I'm not the best of watchers, but you do see things that you take note of, but I'd definitely rather be out there".

#### **PLEASED WITH FORM**

Before this enforced time on the sidelines, Russell was showing fine form, something he agrees with, "Yes, I have been pleased with my form. I was pleased with it before I was dropped at Preston when the manager changed the system. When I came back we gained a couple of wins straight away and the team were playing well. I felt the team were playing well when I was in, but now I'm out, I just hope the team can start picking up more points to move us away from where we are in the table."

#### **NO WORRIES**

With the current league position, I asked if there is any concern in the changing

room. "No, and there never has since I've been here. Even when we were bottom for a long time, there wasn't really any panic shown by the players because we all believed that we'd be OK. This season it's more a feeling of disappointment because we all feel we are better than our current position. If we had the goals compared to the possession we've had we'd be in the top 8 easily. There's hardly any teams that have looked better than us - so it's more frustrating than worrying."

#### **FIRST MAJOR INJURY**

Russell will be in contention for a first team place again soon as his progress is going well. "During the last week I've stepped up my training and it's feeling OK. The last time I was injured like this, I came back after 3 weeks which was too soon. This is my first major injury since I've been at Dean Court. The longest I've been in the treatment room before is 3 days, so I've done alright and I can't wait to get back". Patience is a virtue, but footballers who are recuperating from an injury are anything but patient as Russell testifies, "I find it frustrating because the more you're out, the more fitness you lose and that makes it harder when you get back. You get used to training every day and it only takes a week to lose your fitness. As long as you can work hard when you are fit then you will be all right. Steve puts us through it and makes sure that you don't rush back too quickly. I do find it frustrating not being able to train but mind you, it must be awful for other players like Adrian Pennock when he was here, being out for weeks and weeks".

#### **GOOD PROSPECTS**

Although Russell may not really enjoy watching this afternoons match, I asked him what he thought our prospects were considering that he played at Kenilworth Road in last months meeting. "I remember looking at the clock and it said 44 minutes when the goalkeeper made a brilliant double save from Matt Holland and Steve Robinson and that changed the game. I felt we played well but were caught in the second half. I fancy us to do well today and to carry on from the form we showed against Brentford and it should be a good match." We hope that Russell can enjoy today's match and hopefully we'll see him back in contention very soon.

**1972**

*On this day, Sir Stanley Rous, weary of the fall in attendances at football matches put forward the idea that no-one under the age of 17 should be allowed to go to football unless accompanied by an adult due to rising hooliganism.*

**NOVEMBER 30 1974**

The Cherries put a poor run of form behind them to record their second consecutive home victory. Local rivals Aldershot visited Dean Court as Bournemouth looked to build on a 2-1 win over Bury and a 5-0 cup success over Southwick. The only goal of the game in front of a 5,210 crowd came mid-way through the first half through Alan Welsh - his first goal of the season.

Luton were propping up the First Division as they played Burnley at Kenilworth Road. Despite goals from John Faulkner and Peter Spring, it was the Clarets who went home with points, winning 3-2.

Stoke were leading the First Division after gaining five points out of six since signing Peter Shilton. Manchester United's game with Sunderland attracted a crowd of 60,585.


**NOVEMBER 30 1982**

The Cherries made the short trip to Eastville to take on Bristol Rovers in a Third Division match nicely placed in their first season back in the division - that calm was soon to be shattered though as boss David Webb was about to lose his job. A crowd of 6,263 assembled to watch a good exciting match that was goalless at half time. Two goals in the second half, including one from Kevin Dawtry gave the two sides a deserved share of the points and left Bournemouth in 12th place in the division.

**NOVEMBER 30 1991**

The Cherries travelled north to Gigg Lane, Bury on 13th place in Division Three. Bury had been struggling all season and just 1,886 turned up. Bournemouth lined up on the day with Vince

Bartram, Kevin Bond, Keith Rowland, Mark Morris, Brian Statham (On loan from Spurs), Sean O'Driscoll, Denny Mundee, Paul Wood, Jimmy Quinn, Jimmy Case and Matty Holmes. It was the Bournemouth fans in the sparse crowd who were cheering early as the side made all the early running, finally taking the lead through the persistence of Denny Mundee.

The goal was to mark the start of complete dominance by the home side. Mundee limped off to be replaced by Efan Ekoku, and the side were left to hang on grimly for the points. A mixture of poor Bury finishing and a superb display from Vince Bartram saw Bournemouth taking the points south and Bury wondering how they got nothing from the game.

Luton were struggling at the foot of Division One and they went into their game at Sheffield United with just 3 points from their previous 9 games. A Paul Telfer goal gave them a much needed point in a 1-1 draw.

**Roy O'Brien:** Has had a recurrence of his ligament problem and has been instructed to strengthen his knee. Even our loan players don't escape.




## JOHN HUGGINS



# STAFF FEATURE

## MORE THAN A SATURDAY JOB

*Today, a party of youngsters from Luton will be entertained by our Junior Cherries - just one of the many tasks organised by Shirley Del Sette - a hard working and vital member of the AFC Bournemouth staff.*



Most people see Shirley going about her duties on match days, but that really is the tip of the iceberg for her task here at the club. In her role in charge of the Junior Cherries, she puts in long hours to ensure that our younger supporters are well catered for, and Shirley agrees that most of her work is done during the week. "Yes it is. During the week I organise the memberships, fixing up away trips for us and organising other clubs coming to us and also at this time of year, a lot of my time is taken up organising the Christmas parties. The football teams take up a lot of time as well. That has really snowballed from the original 2 or 3 teams which I envisaged 6 years ago. We now run 10 teams from Under 7's right through to Under 16's and next year we are talking about introducing an Under 18's team. So yes, it certainly is far more than just a match day job!"

### **VITAL PART OF CLUB**

The Junior Cherries is undoubtedly one of the most important part of the club as the young fans are the supporters of the future and I asked Shirley how the Junior Cherries came into being? "Last season we had a membership of close to 600 which is the most we've ever had and this season we have nearly 400, but some members from last season have now joined the Young Cherries. When I first started, I organised ball boys for matches and we had around 35 for our first two seasons and all they did was to be a ball boy on a rota basis. Then I started looking after the mascots and it gradually increased and increased and then we had a meeting and the Junior Cherries were formed. We started with around 100 members under the original name of 'AFC Bournemouth Junior Supporters Club'. I thought 'Junior Cherries' sounded nicer - and that's how it was born".

### **EXCELLENT FACILITIES**

With the large membership, the club now has the facilities to match the demand, "For a long time we had wanted somewhere for the children to meet before matches. We used to have a little room under A Block which is now part of the gymnasium. Then, when we moved to F Block, thanks to Jewsons and the Directors, we now have a lovely family room. The family enclosure really is just that now, only used by

families and it is always the one section that's full. We are going to try and make it a bit noisier though and we are trying to get a club song. We have thought of one that goes, 'We're Junior Cherries, we're football mad, this football club has taken away the wee bit of sense we had'!!!!!!

### **AN IMPORTANT JOB**

Nowadays, you can just switch on your TV set to see live football - often clashing with Bournemouth games and this has put much more importance in Shirley's job here at Dean Court, to encourage the children to support their local club, "No-one can underestimate any job that's dealing with children and families. It is important in any sphere, not just football. What we have to accept nowadays is that children who come here support other clubs as well. Usually Premier League Clubs or people who have moved to the area and used to follow their home town team. But they love football and they want to come. Their main loyalty may not lie with us, but it is surprising that after a couple of seasons, it changes and they really are Bournemouth supporters.

I don't like the children coming to matches wearing other teams shirts though, I think that's very rude and I'm not shy in telling them so. If they come to watch us, they should wear something in the club colours, not Man United, Arsenal, Spurs etc. I think it's ill-mannered and we have a fine system for anyone wearing a shirt of another club, unless it's the team we're playing, and that fine is 10p. We do have one gentleman who insists on wearing a Man United shirt and he now walks in on a match day carrying his 10p! The Juniors feel responsible if the team loses and this is because they feel part of the club, something which is very important."

### **"WE'LL SUPPORT YOU EVER MORE"**

Encouraging people to attend football matches is high on the priority of any club now outside the top flight, and Shirley is one of the many hard working people up and down the country who never gets the praise they deserve. Shirley's philosophy on attending football matches is a fitting end to this piece - "You can watch 100 matches on television and they're great and you see your Premier League club play and you enjoy the match - but one live match is better than all the TV matches put together. Many youngsters can't afford to get to these clubs because they are too far away, so they can all come to Bournemouth and support us! The enthusiasm for watching any team - good or bad - grows on you and even if you're not winning matches, you still love them. We'll support you ever more - it's true and it is contagious. Children start here in another teams shirt, but they're soon a Bournemouth fan, and they're proud of it."

## Trust us to help football

# EXILES CLUB

*It's that time of year again. The time when football fans have to keep a careful eye in the weather forecasts. One thing Exiles don't have to worry about too much is the risk of travelling to Dean Court, only for the game to be postponed for bad weather.*



*"You have to be mad to support Boscombe". True. And given that premise, we should probably be nicknamed the Hatters rather than our visitors today, Luton Town.*

## THE VIEW FROM POKESDOWN

In addition, not many players have been mad keen to move between our two clubs in the last forty years, but there are strong links concerning two

players who starred in Harry's team which took Boscombe to the Promised Land.

The two players were Trevor Aylott and Richard Cooke. Trevor had played for Luton in the early eighties, before moving to Crystal Palace and then to us at the start of that famous season. As he did for Luton, Aylott continued to score a goal every three games or so for

Boscombe - not that good for a central striker, but there was more to his game than that. Trevor, despite being tall and rather awkward looking when running, was a master at holding

this season, I'll be mad if Boscombe don't beat them today - even without the likes of Trevor and 'Cookie'.

in January of 1971 when we were in Division Four. Phil Boyer had just arrived from York to Partner Ted MacDougall in attack. On January 16 Oldham were thrashed 5-0, on the 23rd Cherries beat Northampton 4-2 in a high scoring thriller and four days later they blasted another 4 against Exeter, who replied with 1. All three of these consecutive games were played on atrocious surfaces. The conditions for the Oldham match were similar to last weeks against Brentford and the pitch never had time to recover.

Not that it bothered the team, they were untouchable scoring 19 goals in six matches during January. Ted scored the nine league goals in January, including four penalties, which went to prove that we were getting into some good scoring positions.

Although Ted was later to return to Dean Court, the prospect of seeing him play live one more time was too great to resist and I went to Luton in the late 70's to see him play for Southampton who were about to clinch promotion to Division One. Apart from the greatest imbalance of home to away supporters I had ever seen, estimated at 4,000 Luton and 10,000 from Southampton, I was rewarded by a classic Ted goal.

When Ted went for headers he really went for them and he was going full tilt when he stooped slightly and met a right wing cross about 8 yards from the line. I'd seen Ted score with some powerful headers but this was the hardest of the lot. The net bulged as if Bobby Charlton had let fly with one of his specials. A combination of timing, power and technique gave Ted the rare distinction of being one of those players who could head the ball almost as hard as some could kick it. GORDON BUCHAN



Not only a fast and tricky winger, he was an excellent crosser of the ball and scored his fair share of goals - some quite spectacular. The partnership between Aylott and Cooke was instrumental in gaining us promotion, especially in the last five or six games when they both scored a number of vital goals.

Richard was to move to Luton a few seasons later for £100,000, but returned sometime later only for his career to be cut short by injury. Well, that's the Luton connection, and despite their reasonable start to

the season, I'll be mad if Boscombe don't beat them today - even without the likes of Trevor and 'Cookie'.



With the youngest side fielded by Larry Clay, they faced a City fielding their full Youth squad and came out of the fixture with a great deal of credit.


### COMPETING WELL


### CAUGHT ON BREAK
