



From the manager's chair

OUR last two away games have been played in different and difficult circumstances, with the end result, in terms of points total, just about what we deserved.

The game at York was spoilt by a strong wind and an indifferent playing surface.

In the first half with the wind at our backs, we went a goal up, were rarely threatened, and had Ceri Hughes' shot not hit the post but gone in, the outcome may have been different.

That near miss, plus Mitchell Thomas's enforced substitution soon after, plus conceding a goal early in the second half - albeit slightly unfortunately - were major turning points in the game.

Without any of these occurring I feel sure we would have won.

However, the goal from Neil Tolson really got York and the crowd going, and although I felt we just about deserved a win, a draw was not a totally unfair outcome.

On Tuesday at Chesterfield, the problem was a sticky pitch, foggy conditions, and consequently a virtual lack of atmosphere.

Conversely to York we started dreadfully, improved towards the end of the first half, and were much better in the second period.

However we were slightly fortunate not to lose, and this perhaps bears out the slight injustice of Saturday's result.

In truth, apart from the tremendous goalscoring spell

in the last 25 minutes of the first half against Preston, we continue to fire on three cylinders.

But apart from the first half hour at Chesterfield we have not played that badly in recent games, and apart from that 25-minute spell against Preston we have not played that well.

I think it also be fair to say that these comments probably apply to most teams in the top part of this league.

If we can turn these performances into better results, for example turn draws into wins especially away from home, we have a chance to pull away from the chasing group.

I feel what the team needs is a spark, and there may have to be one or two changes from Tuesday night's line-up in order to provide it.

If we can ignite that spark, then this coming seven days

could prove to be a really crucial week.

We have further away games at Wrexham on Wednesday, and at Crewe next Saturday, but this afternoon we welcome the players, supporters and officials of Millwall.

They have definitely enjoyed a resurgence of form in recent weeks, obtaining three wins and a draw in their last four games since the return of John Docherty as manager.

This sequence has put them right back into play-off contention.

After a long spell out of the game, John Docherty will no doubt be hoping to repeat the success he enjoyed at Millwall in the late 1980s, when they were promoted to the 'old' Division One.


For sure, after two 1-0 defeats against us in the last two meetings between the sides, they will be out for revenge today.

We will still be missing Mitchell Thomas, who suffered a broken nose at York, was due to have an operation on Thursday, and will be out for a couple of weeks.

We have considered a loan deal, as we are a little short of cover down that left hand side of the team.

But Julian James coped very well at left back on Tuesday, and at this moment I would not want to make a loan for a game or two, with Mitchell due to return in a week or so.

But obviously that policy will be re-assessed after today's



game with the Lions.

Also on the injury front, young defender Chris Willmott has suffered a cruciate ligament injury, and will be out of action for some time.

We wish him a speedy recovery, but he can take

heart from the return to fitness of Richard Harvey, who is set to play his first competitive game of the season in the reserves at Ipswich on Monday, following a similar injury suffered pre-season against West Ham.



ONLY 13 points cover the top 12 teams in Nationwide League Division Two after Tuesday night's round of matches, writes SIMON OXLEY.

Brentford and Luton still fill the automatic promotion places, but with both held to draws there was an opportunity for the chasing pack to close the gap.

Bury and Walsall made best use of that opportunity with home wins, but Watford's long unbeaten league run ended at Peterborough. (See page 54 for current league table).

Following their draw at lowly Notts County on Saturday, Tuesday night saw leaders Brentford held 0-0 at home by struggling Wycombe.

It was the Bees' 13th draw of the season.

Meanwhile, the Hatters were drawing 1-1 at FA Cup quarter-finalists Chesterfield, and the details that follow are for the benefit of those who were there, as well as those who weren't!


With mist and fog sweeping around the Saltergate ground, Chesterfield took the lead on 16 minutes when Kevin Davies headed home Chris Beaumont's cross.

Steve Gaughan hit the post for the home side seven minutes later, but Luton were level on 40 minutes when Tony Thorpe was adjudged to have been fouled and the same player netted the resulting spot-kick for his 23rd goal of the season.

The start of the second-half was then delayed for 15 minutes by referee Phil Richards, to see if the fog would clear.

It did, just, with Chesterfield having the better second-half chances as Ian Feuer saved well from Davies and Jamie Hewitt.

Bury moved into third place with a 2-0 win over Shrewsbury at Gigg Lane, and

Walsall continued their climb up the table, moving into sixth place with a 2-0 home win over fellow promotion chasers Bristol City.

Kyle Lightbourne bagged both goals for Chris Nicholl's side.

But after two successive wins at Vicarage Road, Watford slipped up on their travels with a first league defeat since September.

They lost 2-1 to Barry Fry's Peterborough, despite taking a second minute lead through Tommy Mooney.

Former Hornets striker Ken Charlery

was one of the Posh scorers.

In the northern section semi-final of the Auto Windscreens Shield, Stockport added to their fixture congestion with a win at fellow Division Two side Crewe.

The scores were level at 1-1 after extra-time, with Stockport winning 5-3 on penalties.

Stockport still have 15 league games to play, and now have two legs of the northern area final to fit in, as well as the second leg of their Coca-Cola Cup semi-final!




His previous spell in charge, from 1986 to 1990, coincided with the club being in the top flight, in the last years of the original Den ground.

A Hatter & a Lion

PETER ANDERSON was earning rave reviews while turning out for Hendon in the Isthmian League, and on being enticed to Kenilworth Road in February 1971 he went into the first team almost straight away, making his debut in a 1-0 home victory over Watford in the same month.

A tenacious and tireless midfielder, with a unique line in anguished looks at the referee and pitch thumping, he weighed in with more than his fair share of goals, knocking in 34 in 181 league appearances, including two in his final game against Charlton at the Valley in a 5-1 win in December 1975.

Anderson was unfortunately sold to Royal Antwerp for a reputed knock down figure of £40,000 to keep our creditors happy, and after his spell in Belgium he went to the




ABOVE: Peter Anderson (back centre) in action for the Hatters against Millwall in 1973.

USA, turning out for both San Diego Sockers and Tampa Bay Rowdies.

He returned to these shores for a reasonably successful spell at Sheffield United, then it was back to the Rowdies, before a surprise return to England and Millwall, where he was appointed player-manager in 1980.


Despite spending a fair amount of money at the Den he was not regarded as a success and was forced out less than two years later.




Average Shots and Corners



DAVID Oldfield bagged the first hat-trick of his career against Preston, and then set his sights on an even bigger goal - a place in Australia's World Cup squad under the management of Terry Venables.

The 28-year-old told reporters that he would love to play for the country where he spent the first four years of his life.

David was born in Perth, but his hopes have been complicated by one appearance for the England Under-21 side.

That was against Sweden in 1989, during his first spell at Kenilworth Road.

"I have tried, unsuccessfully, to see if I qualify for Australia," said David, "but I am going to make new enquiries as the rules are always changing."

"I would love to be part of what is going on in Australia."

His hat-trick against Preston was the first of his career (apart from "in the back garden" as he joked afterwards), and was netted in 15 first-half minutes as the Hatters raced to a 4-0 interval lead.



INJURY UPDATE

Mitchell's nose..... We can rebuild it!

MITCHELL THOMAS was due to see a specialist on Wednesday night, regarding surgery to repair and rebuild his broken nose suffered at York last week.

Mitchell was involved in a first-half collision with Gary Bull, and his nose was literally shattered, with multiple fractures. (Editor's note: Please do not read on if you are eating!)

When I first arrived at the scene, it was difficult to ascertain exactly where on the head the injury had occurred because there was so much blood everywhere. But we were able to prevent too much blood loss and Mitchell received further treatment at York's First Aid centre before being taken on to hospital.


The swelling is now going down, but he faces a lay-off of two to three weeks after surgery.

Reserve team defender CHRIS WILLMOTT is set to miss the rest of the season after suffering a knee injury in the reserve game at Arsenal.

Chris was stretchered off with a torn medial knee ligament, and at the time of writing we were waiting on the result of a scan to determine the extent of damage.

AS has been said before in this column, Easter has often proved to be the graveyard of the hopes of Luton Town in the past, and season 1973/74 seemed set to test that theory to the full.

We were lying in second position in the old Division Two as Easter 1974 approached but with half a dozen teams snapping at our heels, the three holiday games were vital to a club that was hoping to be the first to slide down through all four divisions and then climb all the way back again.

Thousands of us travelled to the Manor Ground, Oxford, on Good Friday to boost the attendance to a best of the season 13,464, but in a lacklustre display against struggling opposition a single point was the only reward in a 1-1 draw.

The Town's goal was a rather scrappy effort from Jim Ryan which summed up an untidy game.

The following day we travelled to Sheffield Wednesday to play against another side struggling for points at the wrong end of the table.

The resulting 2-2 draw, with the Town coming back from two down, was seen as yet another point lost especially as the Owls had been beaten in two of their previous three home games.

Unfortunately the worst was still to come for in the return against Oxford at Kenilworth Road on Easter Tuesday, a crowd of 16,353 watched as the away side stole an early lead and then sat on it.

We were predictable in our sole tactic of thumping a high ball up to striker Barry Butlin and with a tall Oxford defence, dominated by the blond head of Dave Roberts, soaking up everything with ease, frustration set in both on the field and off it.

Oxford goalkeeper Roy Burton was in inspired form, as he had been on Good Friday, but although he and his defenders rode their luck at

times the win was fully merited and left us with a mountain to climb.

On paper we now had to win our three remaining games to be sure of promotion, starting with a home game against Millwall the following Saturday, and in preparation manager Harry Haslam and the team spent four hours studying the Oxford game on the club's newly acquired £1,000 video recorder.

We had already played Millwall twice that season with honours even. In the League Cup we had suffered a defeat in a fourth round tie at the Den, putting in a tepid performance in a midweek game played in the afternoon because of the three-day week and the resultant power cuts.

Revenge had been gained, however, when we returned to the Den a couple of weeks later and won both points with a 1-0 victory,

courtesy of a fit again Butlin who had been sorely missed from our forward line.

As it turned out the Lions caught the full backlash of our Easter and were beaten in every department with an easy 3-0 win the just reward for a sparkling display.

The Millwall defence was torn apart by man-of-the-match Peter Anderson, later to play for the Lions, who dictated the pace of the game from midfield.

In the eighth minute he won a corner conceded by the Lions' Barry Kitchener, and centre half John Faulkner headed home the flag kick.

Anderson himself lobbed a clever second a few minutes later and the game was as good as over.

Second Division top scorer, Alf Wood, who always seemed to play well against the Town was blotted out by Faulkner with the result that Luton goalkeeper Graham Horn had an easy afternoon.

The goalscoring was completed midway through the second half when substitute Gordon Hindson

raced through from the halfway line in a solo run, with the Millwall defenders appealing for offside, before slotting the ball under keeper Bryan King.

The scoreline did not fully reflect the run of play, with Alan West, another player later to join the Lions, unlucky with efforts that could have brought him a hat-trick.

When the results came through from other games affecting the top of the table it quickly became apparent that only one point would be enough to secure promotion to the top flight.

Haslam, however, refused to believe that he had crowned his second season as a league manager

by winning promotion to the First Division.

"We are not celebrating yet, let's get the points first," said Haslam, but then added, "I thought the lads did just about everything right today."

As it turned out we gathered the all important point the following week at West Brom, leaving Easter behind as a distant memory.




Deepdale wins Lottery funding & FIFA backing

A WEEK after the Heritage Lottery Fund announced their decision to provide a grant for The Football Museum at Second Division Preston North End's Deepdale home, the World's governing body of football FIFA have confirmed that they will be supporting the Lancashire club's project with their own display.

The FIFA collection of football memorabilia will form the centrepiece of The Football Museum - the quality of which is recognised worldwide - conveying the essence of our simple game in a powerful and visual manner.

Items include the oldest known football-related board game from 1886, the famous Thomas Webster football painting of 1839, plus vintage ceramics, bronzes, medals, shirts, trainers' bags, boots and, of course, classic footballs.

Officials at The Football Museum are hoping that this venture will be more than just a shrine for football fans across the World and that it will also shed light on every aspect of the game.

Special facilities for reference and project-based studies will ensure

that the Museum is a genuine education resource as well as the source of a memorable day out.

The anticipated cost of The Football Museum project is in excess of £7 million, although the Lottery Fund will provide £5.7 million with the balance coming from a wide range of areas including the Government's Single Regeneration Budget Fund.



"The Football Museum will combine the passion for our national sport with a unique collection representing every aspect of football from fine art to fanzines.


"I am particularly proud that FIFA are supporting this project which I believe will create a museum of international repute.

LTFC EVACUATION PROCEDURE


IN the event of any emergencies at Luton Town Football Club, the emergency services and the club have agreed on an evacuation policy which is designed to:


