

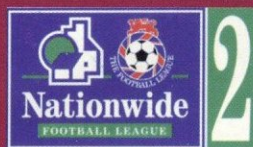

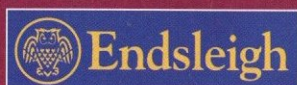

Luton are in the situation they currently are.

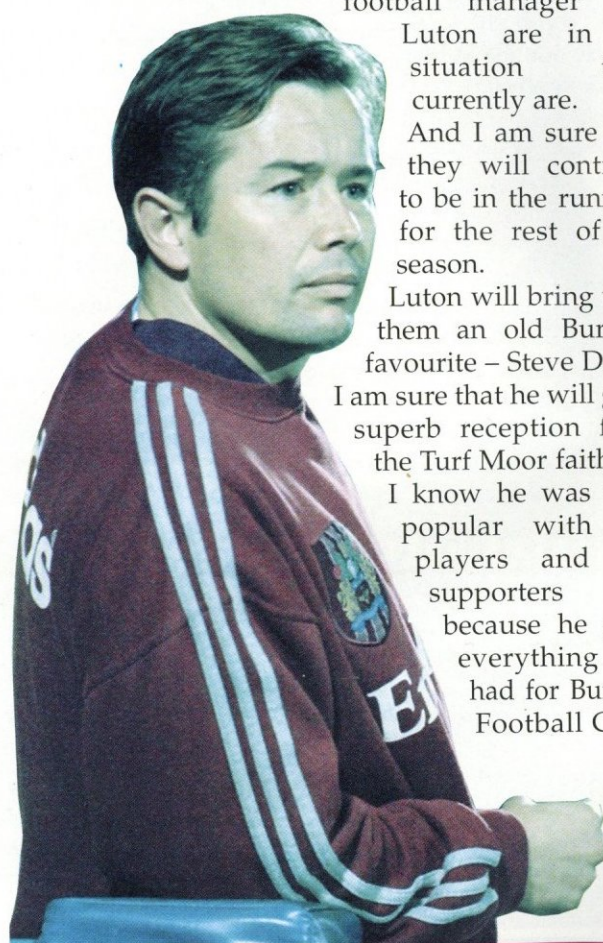
And I am sure that they will continue to be in the running for the rest of the season.

In terms of the desire to go out and win a game of football, you could not ask for any more than we have shown in those games.

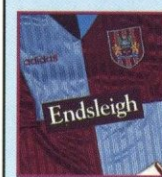
I now just want to repeat that this afternoon.

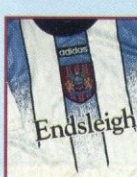

Clarets of old

The F.A. Cup Winners

BFC Historian Ray Simpson tells the stories of the men who brought the FA Cup to Turf Moor, for the only time in 1914.

THE FULL BACKS - TOM BAMFORD AND DAVID TAYLOR

Right back Tom Bamford was Burnley's only ever-present in league and cup during the epic 1913/14 season and, in fact, played in every competitive game for the club during the last two seasons before the Great War ended first class football in 1915.

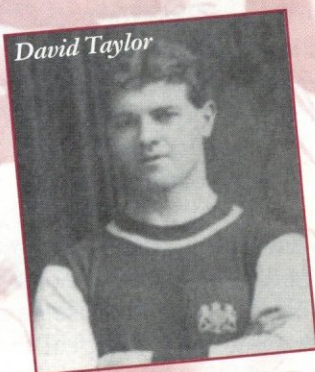
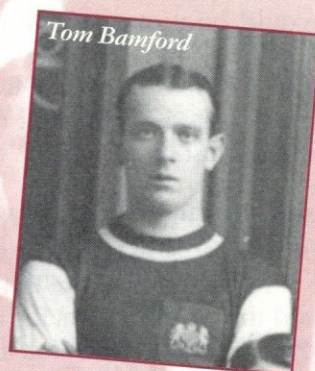
He was born in Horwich and came to Turf Moor from Darwen in the summer of 1909. The evergreen Fred Barron was the incumbent in the right back position but after impressing in the reserve team, Bamford made his Second Division debut in a 3-2 victory at Blackpool in March 1910.

Another newcomer, Robert Reid seemed to win the vote however and Tom Bamford slotted in at left back for a time before winning back his favoured position on the right flank during the Second Division promotion season of 1912/13.

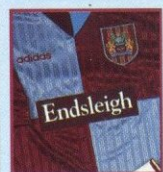
Back in the First Division, Tom Bamford was a model of consistency and played his part to the full in Turf Moor's most memorable season in the club's history thus far. He was a defender without frills, hard and uncompromising in the tackle and not afraid to use his weight and strength to good effect.

Bamford was one of the players whose Burnley career did not survive the First World War. Although he was still at Turf Moor when league football resumed in 1919, Len Smelt was the man in possession and Tom Bamford never wore the Claret and Blue again.

After 157 senior appearances for Burnley, Bamford signed for Rochdale, then in the Lancashire Combination, in September 1920. He was in the twilight of his career however and, although Dale became founder members of the Third Division North in 1921 Bamford retired from the game shortly afterwards.

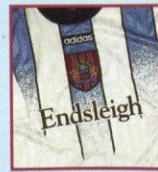

Left back David Taylor joined the Clarets in December 1911 from Bradford City for a fee of £1,800. He had only been at Valley Parade for a little over a year, but in that time had helped the Bantams to their only FA Cup success, Newcastle being beaten in a replayed final at Old Trafford in April 1911.

Taylor was born in Bannockburn and had been a professional with Motherwell and Glasgow Rangers before moving to Bradford City in 1910. He was a tall and well-built and comfortable on either flank or at centre half. He enjoyed a reputation as a fine sprinter both north and south of the border and was widely regarded as the fastest defender in league football before the First World War.

After his Clarets debut at Huddersfield in December 1911 he was a virtual fixture in the side that went on to win promotion from Division Two in 1913, also reaching the FA Cup semi-final.

Two days after the FA Cup Final success against Liverpool in 1914, David Taylor scored his first goal for the Clarets in Burnley's last league match of that epic season, against Bradford City!

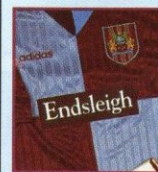
During the First World War Taylor played as a regular guest for Chelsea in the London Combination, also appearing for Glasgow Celtic during 1918/19.

He played only occasionally during the First Division Championship campaign of 1920/21, losing out to Cliff Jones before winning back a regular first team place in 1922.

After 250 senior appearances in Claret and Blue David Taylor retired in 1924 to take up the position as manager of St. Johnstone, newly promoted to the Scottish First Division. In the early 1930's he became a coach at Blackburn before managerial appointments at Dunfermline and Carlisle.

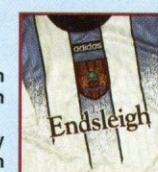
He retired from the game in 1940 and returned to his native Scotland. He died at his home at Bridge of Allan near Stirling in 1949.

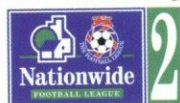
Another Query

Yes Sam, Peterborough have won twice at Turf Moor both times it was 2-1 - they must have played better on those occasions than they did the other week.

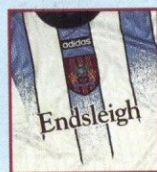

recent match review

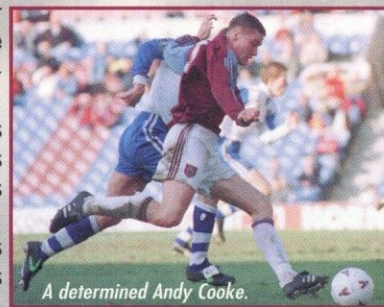
BURNLEY 5 PETERBOROUGH UNITED 0

That man Paul Barnes lifted Burnley's hopes of promotion with his third hat-trick of the campaign taking his seasonal tally to 22.

It took BARNES just eight minutes to get his name on the scoresheet, arching his back and flicking a header over Bart Griemink from Gary Parkinson's clever cross. The Clarets continued to pour forward but had to wait a further 22 minutes for another goal. Paul Smith galloped down the left before playing a one-two with Andy Cooke. Smith laid the ball inside for BARNES and he thumped a left-footer home. Three minutes later Barnes completed his hat-trick.

A corner was worked to Chris Brass who hoisted a hanging cross into the area. Griemink dropped it and BARNES reacted quickly to bullet a right-footer in from a tricky angle and complete a perfect treble.

10 minutes after the break the impressive Damian Matthew slipped a great ball through for COOKE to waltz through the defence and finish in style. And the rout was complete when Paul Weller held up the ball in the Posh box and back-heeled into Matthew's path, MATTHEW duly ramming the ball home.

BRENTFORD 0 BURNLEY 3

Burnley, despite winning 3-0 at leaders Brentford, didn't get half the praise they deserved. Most of the press centred on Bees manager Dave Webb and his letter of resignation, which is waiting for chairman Martin Lange to arrive back from America. And some would have it that Brentford were sidetracked and lost as a result of this confusion.

Yes, Brentford looked demoralised, shell-shocked even. And, yes, they were apallingly poor. But credit that to one of Burnley's finest performances on the road in recent memory.

The Clarets haven't won by three or more on their travels in the league since returning from Wrexham with a 6-2 win five seasons ago in the Fourth Division Championship campaign. Burnley struck after only eight minutes to rock the home side.

Cooke had his heels clipped by Jamie Bates, Damian Matthew floated across a perfect centre between the goalkeeper and back four, and HOYLAND nipped in to nod home his first goal in 28 months. And just after the half-hour, the Clarets earned a two-goal cushion.

After a Paul Smith corner was cleared, Steve Thompson pinged the ball back to Smith out on the right. He spun and dinked a cross to the far post, where the unmarked Cooke headed downwards and up onto the bar, HOYLAND making sure from the rebound for his second. Griffin Park was silenced.

Remember, the Bees hadn't lost here since Boxing Day 1995 when Brighton won 1-0. And the game was all but sewn up when the Clarets added a third on the stroke of half-time.

This was the pick of the bunch, and a real goal-of-the-season candidate. A full 18 yards away from goal, MATTHEW reacted to Weller's centre to not only connect, but arrow a superb overhead bicycle kick into the top left hand corner.

The Clarets kept the Bees at arms' length after the break and could have extended their lead 10 minutes after the restart. Gary Parkinson played a free kick into the feet of Cooke, who killed the ball, turned and lashed a half-volley which beat Kevin Dearden, but came back off the base of the post. And with the title race hotting up, never mind the play-off race, the Clarets' first-ever win at Brentford saw them indicate, and pull out into the fast lane approaching the promotion junction.

WALSALL 1, BURNLEY 3

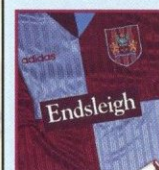
Burnley scored their first-ever win at the Bescot Stadium as they forced their way back into the top six. Andy Cooke scored two remarkable goals to send the Clarets on their way before Paul Barnes finished the job off.

COOKE set the ball rolling after 25 minutes with a thumping right-footer from the edge of the area. He made it 2-0 ten minutes after the restart with a curling chip from 40 yards that flat-footed Wayne Evans on the Walsall goal-line.

BARNES had a couple of chances to get his name on the scoresheet and finally managed it in the 85th minute. Damian Matthew whacked a free kick into the area and Barnes outjumped the home defence to flick a header past Jimmy Walker.

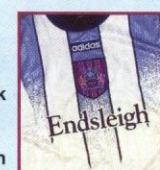
Kyle Lightbourne pulled one back for the home side in stoppage time — but that did little to dampen the spirits of the 3,000-plus travelling Clarets.



Commercial Report

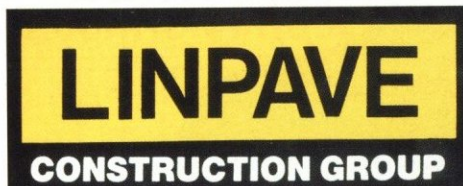
In the Commercial notes today we would like to pay tribute to the efforts of former Commercial Manager TOM SKELLY who has retired early from the club because of ill health.

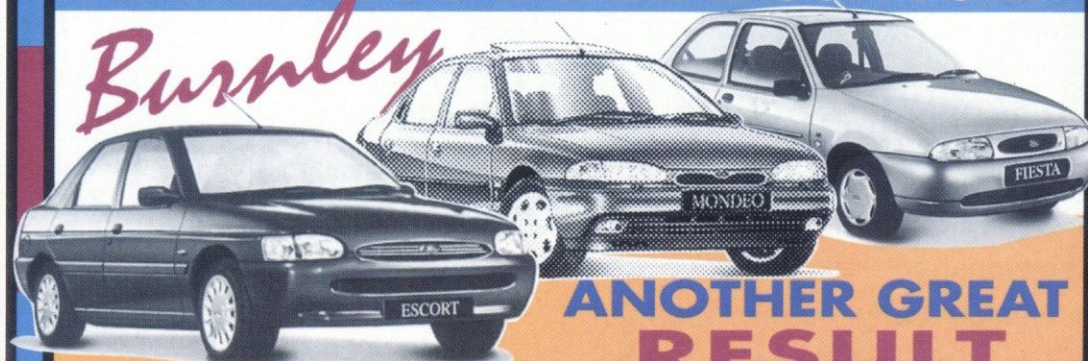

VINNICOMBE (Chris), one of the only players in Clarets history whose surname begins with V. Vinnicombe signed for the Clarets in the summer of 1994 as they embarked upon a return to the First Division.

He joined from Glasgow Rangers for £200,000, having spent almost five years at Ibrox. But he never really established himself in the first team up in Scotland, although he won a Premier League Champions medal in 1991.

He was signed by Graeme Souness as a 19 year old from Exeter City, where he won a Fourth Division Championship medal for his contribution early in the 1989-90 season. Vinnicombe can boast 12 England Under 21 caps, won alongside the likes of David James, Steve McManaman and Alan Shearer.

At Burnley he made the left back slot his own and impressed with his ability going forward, but a triple jaw fracture sustained at Reading in November 1994 kept him out for three months.

Again Vinnicombe was first choice at left back when fit in the following season, but a broken ankle sustained in March at Wycombe put him out until September, and he has recently returned to fitness after a back injury.

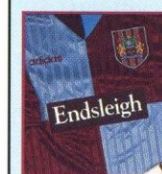
VALENTINE. In Ray Simpson and Edward Lee's "Burnley - A Complete Record", there is an F. Valentine who played between 1907 and 1910, featuring in 18 games and scoring three goals. However, no other details are available, not even his Christian name.

VFB Stuttgart. The Clarets met the West German side in their first European Fairs Cup campaign in 1966-67 at the first round stage. After drawing 1-1 in Stuttgart with a goal from Willie Irvine, Andy Lochhead and Ralph Coates struck at Turf Moor in a 2-0 win to ensure progress. Burnley went on to beat Lausanne Sports and Napoli before losing 3-2 on aggregate to Eintracht Frankfurt.

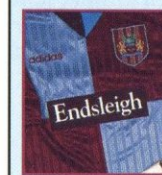
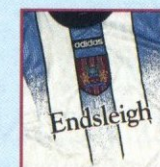

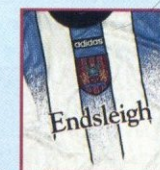

Looking Back

TWENTY YEARS AGO

Nottingham Forest were the visitors at Turf Moor on 2nd April 1977. Brian Clough's side was packed with players who would become household names over the next year or two (Viv Anderson, Frank Clark, John McGovern, Martin O'Neill, Peter Withe etc) but surprisingly they were still outside the Second Division promotion places at this stage of the season. However, their class was all too evident for Burnley on the day, and a second half goal from arguably the brightest of those emerging stars, Tony Woodcock, was enough to settle matters in Forest's favour. The Clarets could point to missed chances, but there could be no serious arguments about the final result. The last time Burnley played on Good Friday was on 8th April 1977, when Blackburn Rovers made their first League visit to the Turf for eleven years. A crowd of 17,266 saw Terry Cochrane back in the Clarets' line-up, replacing Billy Ingham, while Jim Smith's Rovers included Kevin Hird and their ever-present caretaker-manager Tony Parkes. The afternoon was all the Clarets' fan could ask for... A 3-1 win achieved with no little style, Burnley's goals being scored by Malcolm Smith, Peter Noble, and his first in League football, Peter Robinson. Having slipped back into the bottom three after the Forest defeat, Burnley moved back up to 19th with this win. At the other end of the Second Division table, Harry Haslam's LUTON had just ended a superb run of eleven wins from twelve games, which had lifted them right into the promotion frame. Ex-Claret Alan West was a main stay in midfield, while a Claret of many years later, Ron Fletcher, was the Hatters' leading scorer in 76/77. Sadly, the momentum, of that run was not maintained and Luton slipped to a final position of 6th.

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO

Alan Stevenson's ten years as Burnley's goalkeeper were rewarded with a testimonial game against Manchester City at Turf Moor on 24th March 1982. The result was 3-3, but the occasion was basically a fun one. Manager Brian Miller replaced his assistant Frank Caper in the Burnley side, while two of the City subs to make an appearance, were future Burnley managers, John Bond (who joined his son Kevin in the side) and John Benson, then manager and assistant respectively at Maine Road. Third Division action resumed on 27th March with a trip to Wimbledon, with Colin Anderson coming in for his first start of the season in place of David Holt. Stevenson proved his value to the side, saving a penalty as the Clarets battled for a 0-0 draw against Dave Bassett's team.

Andy Wharton took over at left-back on the following Wednesday, while Eric Potts and Paul Dixon returned for Derek Scott and Micky Phelan when the Clarets travelled to Lincoln. It was a meeting of the division's two form sides, with Lincoln unbeaten in 16 games and the Clarets having lost only one of the last 25. A 1-1 draw was therefore perhaps no surprise, but Burnley had to withstand tremendous pressure before Trevor Steven scored an unlikely equaliser just two minutes from time.

After facing the Third Division leaders, the Clarets' next opponents were the team in second place, Reading, who came to the Turf on 3rd April. This time there was no doubt about the outcome.... The Royals' stars Neil Webb and Kerry Dixon hardly got a look in as Burnley turned on the style to win 3-0 through strikes from Billy Hamilton (2) and Kevin Young. The Clarets now stood 5th, only a point outside the promotion places.

LUTON had led the Second Division table from early on, and there was never much doubt that David Pleat's side would go on to promotion and the title. Pleat had a fine attacking line-up with Ricky Hill and David Moss providing the service for Brian Stein and Steve White, and the Hatters lost only four League games in 81/82, scoring 86 goals in the process.

TEN YEARS AGO

Crowds of over 10,000 were rare on the Fourth Division in 1987, but there was one when Burnley travelled to Deepdale to face highflying Preston on 28th March. Never comfortable on the plastic pitch, Burnley effectively lost the game when North End scored twice in three minutes early in the second half. Derrick Parker, back in place of young Phil Devaney, scored a consolation but the Clarets were unable to break through again and it ended 2-1. That match was the final appearances of loan striker Mark Caughey, who was transferred to Hamilton Academical after failing to find the net for the Clarets. Leighton James was back for Cambridge's visit to the Turf on 4th April, and another sub-2000 crowd saw an inept performance "rewarded" with a 0-2 defeat. Burnley now stood fourth from bottom of the League, and the space between them and the bottom three, who all had games in hand, was reducing by the week.

No such problems at Kenilworth Road, where LUTON were heading for a best-ever finish of 7th in the First Division. Following the riot at their game with Millwall two years earlier, Luton were not admitting visiting supporters to their ground, this resulted in a ban from the League Cup.... But not the FA Cup, in which they put Liverpool out in an epic third round tie which stretched to three games. Brian Stein and Ricky Hill, both capped by England, were still regulars in a team who constantly defied the odds against them.

FIVE YEARS AGO



Chris Pearce returned in goal following the end of Nicky Walker's successful loan spell, and Roger Eli was also back in the side when Burnley travelled to Barnet on Tuesday, 24th March 1992. In difficult conditions on the Underhill slope, the Clarets performed well and held their normally free-scoring opponents to a goalless draw.

That point put Burnley second, level on points at the top of the Fourth Division with Blackpool, but the positions were reversed later in the week following the demise of Aldershot. Both teams lost six points in the redraw table, but Blackpool's greater loss of goal difference cost them top place. On the downside for Burnley, Aldershot's loss of League status meant the withdrawal from the record of the Clarets' win at the recreation Ground which had been part of the club record of seven successive away wins, a record now lost.

Transfer deadline day brought a new signing in Robbie Painter from Maidstone, and he was in the front line against his former club at Turf Moor on 28th March. The Clarets for once failed to produce the goods, and it was Maidstone who took the lead just after the break. Steve Davis equalised and it looked like a draw was the best the Clarets could hope for (or deserve) until sub Roger Eli popped up with the winner three minutes from the end. The suspension of John Deary brought about a rearrangement of the team for Hereford's visit on the following Tuesday. In came Mark Monington, Mark Yates and Roger Eli (who had made way for Painter), and out went Steve Harper and John Francis. Monington celebrated his return with only his second League goal.... The first had also been against Hereford.... and Mike Conroy sewed things up at 2-0 in a memorable game.

Deary returned, replacing Adrian Randall for the tricky trip to Crewe on 4th April. A generally poor game looked to be heading for a goalless draw until Alex scored from a superbly hit free kick five minutes from time. However, Burnley still topped the Fourth Division despite the defeat.

After three successive narrow escapes, time was finally up for LUTON in 1992. As ever, they put up a stern fight to preserve their First Division status but this time the task proved beyond them, and a 20th place finish cost them the chance of becoming inaugural members of the Premier League.

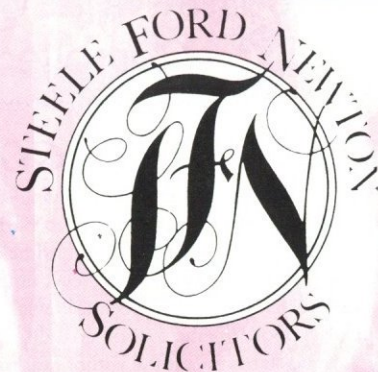

Turning back the clock On this date...



Burnley have been involved in three FA Cup semi-finals on this date. The first time they reached that stage was in 1913, and on 29th March they faced champions-elect Sunderland at Bramall Lane, Sheffield and played out a goalless draw. The replay was four days later at St. Andrews, Birmingham, and despite goals from Bert Freeman and Tommy Boyle it was the Wearsiders who reached the final, winning 3-2. Burnley had consolation a few weeks later as they won promotion to the First Division.

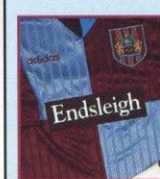
Bramall Lane was the venue again in 1924 when a Burnley side starting to fade after the glories of the immediate post-war years faced Aston Villa. A first trip to Wembley, opened only the year before, was a dream that would have to wait as Villa comfortably won 3-0.

Burnley were a Second Division side again when they

made the short journey to Ewood Park to face Liverpool, who were heading for the League championship, on 29th March 1947. A goalless draw took the game to a replay at Maine Road, and this time the Wembley dream came true as Ray Harrison scored the only goal on front of a 72,000 crowd.

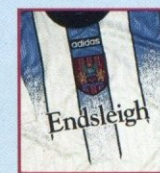
The Clarets faced today's opponents Luton at Kenilworth Road on this date in 1980. Luton had promotion to the First Division on their minds, while Burnley were battling against relegation to the Third. A Billy Hamilton goal gave the Clarets a creditable 1-1 draw, but both teams lost their battles at the end of that season.

The most recent game on this date was against Hull at Turf Moor in 1994. Burnley took a step towards the play-offs with a 3-1 win, the goals coming from John Pender and David Eyres (2) one of them from the spot.

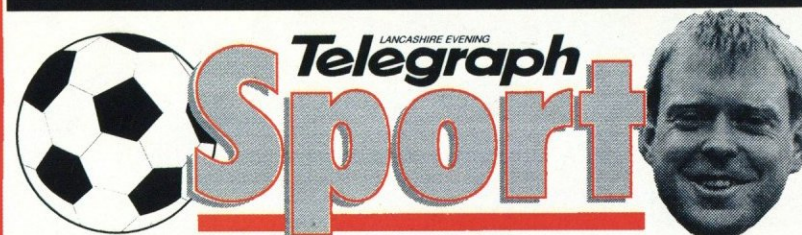

Meet our Visitors...

MANAGER LENNIE LAWRENCE



Lennie Lawrence was appointed manager of Luton Town in December 1995, following the departure of Terry Westley.

A player with non-league Croydon, Carshalton Athletic and Sutton United, Mr Lawrence was an assistant manager at Plymouth, where he was also caretaker manager, and at Lincoln, before becoming manager of Charlton Athletic in 1982, having initially joined the Addicks as reserve team coach.

Charlton finished as runners-up in Division Two in 1985/86 earning promotion to the top flight after an absence of 29 years. In the following season they were involved in the first promotion/relegation play-offs, overcoming second division Leeds United in extra-time in a dramatic play-off final replay, but were relegated in 1990.

Mr Lawrence left Charlton in 1991, after nine years with the club, which at the time made him the third longest-serving managers in the country behind Nottingham Forest's Brian Clough and Oldham's Joe Royle.

He headed north to Middlesbrough, where he took the Teeside club into the FA Premier League in 1992 in his first season with them. They returned to Division One in 1993, and Mr Lawrence left in 1994, when Bryan Robson took over at Ayresome Park.

He then joined Bradford in May 1994, leaving Valley Parade in November of this year. He is the 21st manager in the history of Luton Town.

Defence

IAN FEUER - Goalkeeper

Las Vegas born Ian signed for the Hatters from West Ham in December 1995, for a fee, which could rise to £580,000 depending on appearances.

The 6ft 7ins American arrived at Luton in September and spent three months on loan. Was Luton's Player of the Year for the 95/96 season. His Luton debut wasn't his league debut though, he was on loan at Peterborough in 1994/95, playing 16 games in Division Two.

STEVE DAVIS

Steve joined the Hatters in the summer of 1995 after making over 160 league appearances for Burnley, scoring 22 goals.

He joined the Clarets in August 1991 for £60,000 from Southampton, after loan spells at Burnley and Notts. County.

He captained Burnley during their rise up the league in Division One, and played in both their victories over Luton in the 1994/95 season.

Was a commanding figure for the Hatters in 95/96, but again suffered the agony of relegation as Luton, like Burnley the previous season, dropped out of Division One.

MARVIN JOHNSON

Marvin made his Football League debut against Wimbledon in 1988 and quickly established himself as a versatile defender.

Started the 1994/95 season at left-back, but then switched to the centre of defence to form a reliable partnership with Trevor Peake.

Marvin was one of the only three players to play in every first-team match in 94/95 season, and was awarded the Players' Player of the Year trophy. He was again a consistent performer on 95/96 at centre-back.

DARREN PATTERSON

Darren signed for the Hatters in August 1995 from Crystal Palace for £150,000, a fee that could rise to over £200,000 based on appearances. The Northern Ireland international started his league career with Wigan and joined Palace for £250,000 in 1992.

An Achilles injury ruled him out of the first two months of the season, and kept him out of Northern Ireland's final European Championship qualifying matches.

MITCHELL THOMAS

The former England Under-21 international made over 100

appearances for Luton before moving to Spurs, shortly after David Pleat, in 1986.

He played in the 1987 FA Cup Final, and later moved to West Ham. He was on loan at Luton in the 1993/94 season before a permanent free transfer move.

Recalled by new manager Lennie Lawrence in December 1995, and responded with an ever-present record until the end of the season.

Midfield

GRAHAM ALEXANDER

Graham joined the Hatters in July 1995, and was Terry Westley's first signing after being confirmed as Luton's new manager.

The Town coaching staff had been watching him for two seasons before deciding to make their move, with the fee in the region of £100,000, with further payments depending on appearances.

DAVID OLDFIELD

David returned to Kenilworth Road in the summer of 1995, six years after leaving Luton Town.

He started his career with the Hatters, progressing through the junior ranks a

two-goal debut in a 2-1 Simod Cup win at Everton in February 1988. He also scored on his full league debut in a 2-1 home win over Watford in May 1988, and went on to make 29 league appearances for the Hatters, scoring four goals.

CERI HUGHES

Ceri was a regular in the Town midfield in the 1993/94 season, and his performance earned a call-up to the full Welsh side.

He made his Luton debut at Aston Villa in 1990, and has also represented his country at youth and Under-21 levels.

Scored seven goals in the 1993/94 season, but damaged knee ligaments against Grimsby in November 1994 and was ruled out for the rest of the campaign after just eight league starts.

PAUL MCLAREN



Paul made his debut in the Town first-team on the final day of the 1993/94 season, coming on as a substitute at Stoke City.

He joined the Hatters from school, and is an England youth international. Started as centre-half, but spent much of the 1994/95 season in the reserves in centre midfield.

GARY WADDOCK

Gary completed a free transfer move from Bristol Rovers in December 1994, after a three-month loan spell at Kenilworth Road.

Started his career with QPR making over 200 appearances, including an FA Cup



Final against Spurs in 1982, and the subsequent replay.

That was followed by a spell in Belgium with Charleroi as Gary recovered from a serious knee injury, and he also had spells at Millwall, and QPR again.

Forwards

KIM GRANT

Signed from Charlton where he made his debut under Lennie Lawrence, for £250,000 in March 1996, and scored on his debut against Ipswich.

Was selected for the Ghanaian national squad in the summer of 1996, playing against Egypt and Denmark. Also represented his country against South Africa in September, and is a regular member of their squad in the African Nations Cup and World Cup qualifying matches.

BONTCHO GUENTCHEV

The Bulgarian international signed for the Hatters after being released by Ipswich.

The 31 year-old striker, who played in the 1994 World Cup Finals in the USA when Bulgaria reached the semi-finals, had been at Ipswich for three seasons playing 58 games in the Premier League.

Scored vital goals for the Hatters in 95/96 and played for Bulgaria in the 1996 European Championships.

DWIGHT MARSHALL

Jamaican born Dwight signed in the

summer of 1994 from Plymouth for £150,000, after scoring 14 goals for Peter Shilton's side the previous season - his third campaign at Home Park after playing non-league football with Grays Athletic.

Started well for Luton, with two goals in the 5-1 win over Middlesbrough in October, and despite being troubled by a shin injury late in the season he finished at the Hatters' leading scorer with 13 goals in league and cup.

Scored 13 goals in 95/96, but suffered a broken leg in February, ruling him out for the rest of the season.

PAUL SHOWLER



Signed in August 1996, from Bradford City where he played under current Luton boss Lennie Lawrence.

Played non-league football for Altrincham and Barnet, with league appearances for the latter following their promotion from the Conference.

TONY THORPE

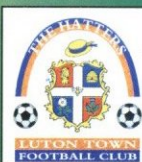
Tony made an immediate impact in the Town side when he scored for the Hatters on his full debut at Newcastle United, in the fourth round of the FA Cup in January 1994.

He joined the club at the start of the 1992/92 season, following a spell at Leicester. He was restricted to just five substitute appearances during the 1994/95 campaign.

Signed a new contract in the summer of 1996.

Past Matches:

Clarets v. Luton Town

Prior to this season all the League meetings between Burnley and Luton had taken place in the top two divisions of the League, twelve of them having been in the old First Division. Burnley have an excellent record against the Hatters, and the Clarets' last six visits to Kenilworth Road have included three wins and an unexpected draw in the League Cup at a time when the clubs were separated by three divisions.

The first ever clash, way back in November 1897, brought what is still Burnley's biggest win against today's opponents, but later that season Luton became one of only two teams to beat Burnley as the Second Division championship came to Turf Moor. It was forty years before our paths crossed again in the League, and the side have never remained together in the same division for longer than Luton's five year spell among the elite in the late fifties.

Luton have twice been involved in notable FA Cup runs for the Clarets, firstly when Burnley reached the semi-final as a Second Division club in 1935 and secondly in the famous Wembley and promotion year of 1947. The only league Cup clash threatened to throw up a giant killing, but a crowd of over 14,000 at the Turf (more than double the gate for the first leg at Luton) saw First Division pedigree prevail against a brave Claret effort.

The first day win at Kenilworth Road this season looks an excellent result for Burnley in the light of subsequent events, and today's game could have a crucial bearing on events a few weeks hence. History favours the Clarets.... here's hoping they live up to it.

We will watch the programme with interest.

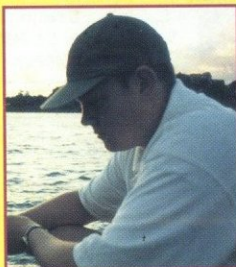
