

From the manager's chair

TODAY'S game signals the start of the final lap of the race that will decide the promotion and relegation situation once and for all.

Everything will be resolved in the next fortnight, and with three home games out of four - starting with today's game against Shrewsbury, to whose supporters, players and officials we extend a warm welcome - we are still very much in contention for an automatic promotion spot as well as an obvious play-off place.

By chance we have two fixtures against teams battling for survival - Shrewsbury and Peterborough - and two chasing an automatic promotion place - Bury and Stockport.

Wycombe's recent run of good results, including a hard earned point here last Tuesday, means that Shrewsbury have dropped into the bottom four places and will be fighting for their Division Two lives today.

Peterborough, where we play next Saturday, are in an even worse position, but at the other end of the scale we entertain two opponents in the promotion battle and the matches against Bury and Stockport gives us the opportunity to peg them back.

I felt that results went reasonably well in midweek and although our fate does not entirely rest in our own hands, with the nature of the remaining fixtures for the top four teams, three points today could change that situation.

Looking back on recent results, the draw at Blackpool was well deserved.

We might have been 1-0 up at half-time, but were forced back in the second period. Ian made two good saves, and Blackpool missed one good chance, but that was the sum total of their efforts and had we lost it would have been a travesty.

The performance at Bloomfield Road is best described as 'solid and professional' unlike unfortunately last Saturday at Walsall, which became more of an end-to-end game than many we have played this season.

Credit to Walsall for producing their best form for some six months - something we seem to bring out in opposing teams - but once again we failed to hold a lead and lost the game 3-2.

For certain, that must be the very last time that occurs if we are to gain promotion to the first division.

The last two home games, against Bristol City and Wycombe, have been drawn, and whilst it felt like a victory against Bristol having come from two goals behind, against Wycombe we felt as though we had lost as our efforts to score in the latter stages of the game grew more and more futile.

The teams that succeed at this stage of the season are the teams that can perform to the best of their ability, with players that can shake off the tension, fear and frustration that affects sides involved in promotion and relegation issues.

There were bad signs in that respect at Walsall last Saturday, but Tuesday's draw at Blackpool was much more heartening.

But we must not underestimate Shrewsbury this afternoon, as they include a draw at Brentford among their recent results.

All talk of what we need to do in terms of games and points has been banned in the dressing room now.

The players need to relax, and just go out and play, and although at present our destiny is not in our own hands, if we can relax over the next four games there may yet be a twist in the tale.

On the injury front Andy Kiwomya suffered a re-occurrence of his hamstring injury on Tuesday, and is rated



doubtful for this afternoon.

So too is Ceri Hughes, who has missed the last two games with a thigh strain.

However we will be welcoming back Graham Alexander who missed the trip to Blackpool following the birth of his first child - a boy - on Tuesday afternoon.

Congratulations to Graham and his wife, and we wish the family good health and happiness.

Finally, to you the supporters I would say try to forget about the importance of the game; support the team as vocally as you can; and above all be patient.

BURY and Brentford currently occupy the two automatic promotion places after home victories on Tuesday, as Stockport's busy schedule finally caught up with them with defeat on Wednesday, writes Simon Oxley.

Bury maintained their unbeaten home record with a 1-0 win over Crewe, as Ronnie Jepson scored the game's only goal after just four minutes.

Chesterfield made nine changes from their FA Cup semi-final draw on Sunday as they travelled to Brentford, and the Bees won 1-0 with leading scorer Carl Asaba on target after 23 minutes.

Luton meanwhile were being held to a 0-0 draw at Blackpool.

Chances were few and far between at Bloomfield Road, with Tony Thorpe and Andrew Fotiadis going close for the Hatters, and Tony Ellis wasting Blackpool's best opening.

Burnley's play-off hopes received a blow as they went down 5-0 at Wycombe, as the home side eased their relegation fears.

But an 88th minute winner from Shaun Goater kept Bristol City in play-off contention as they beat Wrexham 2-1.

Already relegated Notts County beat Plymouth 2-1, to leave the Pilgrims facing a possible immediate return to Division Three.

Stockport were in action on Monday and Wednesday, beating Watford 1-0 at the start of the week, but then losing 1-0 at Gillingham.

The goal conceded against the Gills was the first in seven league games, but they still have a game in hand on





MICHAEL BROWN - Joined the club from school, and has twice returned to the Shrews after transfers to Bolton and Preston.

DEAN SPINK - Signed from Aston Villa in March 1990 for £75,000, after making a name for himself with non-league Halesowen. Signed as a centre-forward, moved to centre-back, and then reverted to a striking role.

KEVIN SEABURY - Shrewsbury born player who signed professional for his home town club in July 1993. Established himself in the first team during the 1994/95 season, and has proved a versatile utility player.

RICHARD SCOTT - Joined Shrewsbury from Birmingham in 1995, after progressing through the junior ranks at St Andrews.

IAN STEVENS - Born in Malta, he had spells at Preston and Stockport before Bolton snapped him up after a trial at Crystal Palace. Moved on to Bury, and then to Shrewsbury. Leading scorer this season, and was set to move to Plymouth on deadline day only for the transfer to be called off.

MARK TAYLOR - Versatile player who made his Football League debut with Walsall during the 1984/85 season. Joined Sheffield Wednesday in 1989, playing a handful of games, and signed for Shrewsbury in 1991 after a spell on loan. Player of the Year for the past three seasons.

DAVE WALTON - Defender who joined Shrewsbury during the 1994 season from Sheffield United.


AUSTIN BERKLEY - Formerly with Gillingham and Swindon, moving to Shrewsbury in July 1995.






MARK DEMPSEY - Dublin born player who made his Football League debut for Gillingham in October 1990 at Scunthorpe. Signed for Shrewsbury from Leyton Orient in May 1995, for £25,000, and is an Eire Under-21 international.

PAUL EDWARDS - Liverpool born goalkeeper who started his career at Leek Town, later signing for Crewe. After a trial period he signed for the Shrews in September 1992. Nicknamed 'The Eagle'.

PAUL EVANS - Midfielder who has won Under 18 and Under 21 caps for Wales. Came through the junior ranks at Gay Meadow, signing professional in July 1993.

PETER WHISTON - Centre-half formerly with Plymouth, Torquay, Exeter and Southampton, who joined Shrewsbury in October 1995.

IAN REED - Joined Shrewsbury as a YTS trainee, and was set to challenge for a first-team place at the start of the season.

SHAUN WRAY - Had trials with Wolves before joining Shrewsbury, signing a YTS contract in July 1994. Signed professional in May 1995.

JAMES COPE - Came through the YTS scheme, and made his first team debut against Burnley in May 1996.

BENNY GALL - Has won international honours with Denmark at Under 18 and Under 21 level, and joined Shrewsbury from Copenhagen.

THOMAS NIELSEN - Danish born fullback who joined the Shrews from Arhus.

LEE TAYLOR - London born left-back who joined the club from London Spartan Ice.

NICK WARD - Wrexham-born forward who signed pro in July 1996.

MEET THE MANAGER

FRED DAVIES celebrated his first season as Shrewsbury's manager by leading the club to the Third Division Championship in 1994.

Mr Davies was a goalkeeper in his playing days. He made his league debut for Wolves in 1962, very quickly establishing himself as the number one choice at Molineux. During his Wolves days he played for Wales under-23s.


He made 156 league appearances for Wolves before moving on to Cardiff in 1968, and he remained a fixture in the Bluebirds' side until transferring to Bournemouth in 1970.

With 134 league games for the Cherries behind him, he retired to go into coaching and was taken on to Bournemouth's back room staff.

When manager John Bond moved on to Norwich, he took Mr Davies as his coach. The two later linked up at Swansea where Mr Davies was assistant manager. The partnership was resumed yet again when Mr Bond took over as Shrewsbury manager in 1991, Mr Davies eventually taking over as caretaker manager. The appointment was confirmed in February 1994 when Shrewsbury were well on their way to winning the Third Division Championship.

A Hatter and a Shrew.....

Born in Nottingham in January 1945, **DAVID PLEAT** starred for the England Schoolboys before being snapped up by Forest at 17, and then earning England Youth honours.

Unfortunately, his early promise did not materialise and after only six first team appearances at the City Ground he made the move to Kenilworth Road in August 1964, in exchange for £8,000, which was a fair amount of money at the time by Luton standards.

In a poor side, Pleat was a revelation and his genuine pace and skill on the wing would have set up many goals if we had forwards with the ability to put the ball in the net.

Unfortunately we did not, and relegation was suffered to Division Four at the end of 1964/65.

Pleat then broke a leg in a training accident before the start of the following season and, when being recalled too early, injured his back which killed his blistering pace for the rest of his career.

Third division Shrewsbury signed Pleat on a free transfer in the summer of 1967 and he made 12 appearances at Gay Meadow in a side that narrowly failed to win promotion, before moving to Exeter in July 1968 where he enjoyed two good seasons making 68 league appearances scoring 13 goals.


After a brief spell at Peterborough, Pleat was handed the manager's job at non-league Nuneaton, before he returned to Kenilworth Road in a general coaching capacity, gradually working his way up through the



Average Goals per Match





HAVING A BALL!

WHEN Tony Thorpe lobbed the ball over Rotherham keeper Kevin Pilkington to complete his hat-trick at Millmoor on April 5, he joined a select band of Luton Town players who have scored 30 or more goals in a season for the Hatters, writes *Simon Oxley*.

He became the first since Malcolm Macdonald to reach that landmark, and now has Gordon Turner's totals in his sights in the closing weeks of the season (see table below left).

Gordon Turner is of course Luton's record all-time goalscorer in league football, with 243 goals from 1949 to 1964.

Tony Thorpe may be in a rich vein of form at present, but still has some way to go to reach Joe Payne's 1936/37 figure of 58.

That season saw the Town win Division Three South, scoring a total of 103 league goals, with Payne netting 10 in one game against Bristol Rovers.

The last time a Luton Town player scored 30 goals in a season

- Arsenal won the League and FA Cup double, and broke the British transfer record by signing Alan Ball from Everton for £220,000.

- Admission to Luton Town matches was 14s for the Centre Stand; 11s for the Wing Stands; 8s (children 4s) for the Enclosure, Bobbers' Stand and Oak Road terrace; and 6s (children 3s) for the Kenilworth Road terrace.

- Liverpool signed a young striker from Scunthorpe for £35,000 named Kevin Keegan.

- Leeds United won the Fairs Cup (now the UEFA Cup) on the away goals rule after a 3-3 aggregate scoreline against Juventus in the final.

- Vauxhall advertised in the Luton Town programme for a Production Worker, earning just over £25 for a 40-hour week, with Skilled Craftsmen earning just over £29.

- Malcolm Macdonald was Luton's leading goalscorer with 30, but he was some way behind the leading scorer in the Football League who was Bournemouth's Ted MacDougall with 48. Colchester's Ray Crawford netted 32, which included

the winner against Leeds in the famous 3-2 FA Cup win over Don Revie's side.

- Burnley and Blackpool were relegated from the top division.

- Just weeks after finishing the season as Luton's top scorer, Macdonald was sold to Newcastle for £180,000.

- 66 people were killed, and 200 injured, at Ibrox just seconds before the end of a Rangers v Celtic derby.

- 16-year-old Birmingham striker Trevor Francis scored four against Bolton.

- Peter Bonetti played his 500th game for Chelsea.

- George Best was fined a record £250 for keeping the FA Disciplinary Committee waiting for 90 minutes.

- Arsenal won the League and FA Cup, but Spurs won the League Cup. The Gunners though did put Luton out of the competition, winning 1-0 at Kenilworth Road, in front of a crowd of 27,023.

- Current Town players Ian Feuer and Ceri Hughes were born.








62nd minute cross turned in at the near post by a combination of Luton skipper Matthew Upson and Leeds striker Tony Hackworth.

He has been working hard in the gym this week in a bid to be fit for this afternoon's match against Shrewsbury.


ANDREW FOTIADIS played at Blackpool, and did very well considering he suffered a freak accident in training on Monday.

WHEN the Town won 3-1 at Norwich over Christmas 1981 we were sitting pretty at the top of the old Division Two, seven points clear with two games in hand.

A spell at Carrow Road, when we scored three goals in the first few minutes during as devastating a spell of football as you would wish to see, was the culmination to a fine first half of the season which had seen us in record breaking form.

Unfortunately bad weather set in and it was to be over three weeks before we were to play another league game, and in a frantic contest played on a sea of mud at the Valley, we fought out a 0-0 draw in a less than convincing performance.

We followed up with a 2-1 home win over Leicester in front of the 'Match of the Day' cameras, and then went to Sheffield Wednesday where the home side, using brute force and ignorance, were only seconds away from gaining a valuable 'scalp' when Brian Stein stepped up to secure a point with an equaliser we scarcely deserved.

The free flowing football which we had witnessed in the period leading up to Christmas was no longer in evidence and was creating a few worries behind the scenes at Kenilworth Road as the chasing pack began to close the gap.

Another draw followed, this time at the home of our nearest challengers, Watford, and although Brian Stein was running rings around the Hornets defence all afternoon he could not conjure up that vital winning goal against the old enemy.

Oldham were seen off at Kenilworth Road, but the game was made easier for us when future Hatter Darren McDonough was sent off after 25 minutes for a bad foul on Lil Fuccillo.

Cambridge then came to Kenilworth Road and from the kick-off seemed set for a draw, employing a 10-man defence which we could not break down. As the game wore on we were becoming increasingly desperate and it took a wonder strike from skipper Brian Horton, with his first goal for the club, to settle the issue 20 minutes from the end.

There then followed possibly our worst spell of the

season, with a string of five games without a win, culminating in the loss of top spot to Watford. A dull 0-0 draw at bottom of the table Grimsby was followed by the ending of a run of nine straight home victories, when lowly Wrexham came away from Kenilworth Road with a point in another 0-0 score bore. We were beginning to panic a bit after we went down 4-3 at windswept Barnsley for our first defeat of the year, and our nerves were really jangling when we were pulled back from a leading 3-2 position at Crystal Palace by a late equaliser. The 0-0 draw at Derby the following week, in a game we should have won, signalled the end of our run at the top and the prophets of doom on the terraces were predicting a collapse of mammoth proportions.

Luckily the loss of our place at the top seemed to be the kick up the backside the players needed, and three days later we regained pole position after seeing off Orient at

Kenilworth Road. All was then set fair when we beat a physical Blackburn side at home the following Saturday to open up a lead again.

Over 4,000 Luton supporters made the short trip to Cambridge on Easter Saturday to witness a tense 1-1 draw before Norwich, on the crest of a wave, visited Kenilworth Road on the Monday and did everything but score in a one-sided first half.

The interval team talk, which went along the lines that the Canaries could not play any better in the second period, proved to be true as goals from Brian Stein and on-loan Billy Jennings settled the issue.

In a terrific game at Kenilworth Road, Newcastle took a 2-0 lead before Brian Stein stepped up to win the match for us, scoring a hat-trick, including two of the poorest penalty kicks ever seen on this ground!

Next in line were Chelsea who pulled in a crowd of 16,185 to Kenilworth Road and were fortunate to escape with a point from a 2-2 draw, as we laid siege on their goal for almost the whole of the match.

Despite the loss of two points we were still pulling away from the pack and promotion was looking an increasing certainty.



Our visit to Rotherham was seen as a tough test as the Millers had enjoyed a terrific second half of the season, and were seeking a first ever promotion to Division One. The match was petering out to a 2-2 draw when Rotherham were awarded a dubious penalty which was well saved by reserve goalkeeper Alan Judge - effectively ending Rotherham's promotion challenge.

When the dust had settled, it could be seen that a win over lowly Shrewsbury at Kenilworth Road the following Friday night would clinch promotion back where we belonged.

A tense crowd of 14,563 gathered to watch and transmitted their anxiety on to the pitch, where it became obvious that the Shrews were hoping for a point.

Nerves were settled for a while when Brian Stein latched on to a route one clearance from goalkeeper Jake Findlay in the 14th minute to cleverly lob the Town in to the lead.




LTFC EVACUATION PROCEDURE


