

Today we are determined to continue in a similar vein and sign-off for the season at London Road with an emphatic performance in a game certain to be played in a real cup tie atmosphere with a big contingent of fans making the short journey from Luton.

I would like to extend a warm welcome to London Road to all the Luton supporters, their dynamic chairman David Kohler and his fellow directors and, of course, to manager Lennie Lawrence and his squad. Lennie arrived

too late to prevent Luton from being relegated at the end of last season and it will be a tremendous achievement if he can get them back into Division One at the first attempt.

Lennie is noted for getting positive results from less fashionable clubs and at Kenilworth Road he looks set to repeat the promotion feats achieved first during a long spell in charge at Charlton and then at Middlesbrough. But much as I respect Lennie's achievements and wish him luck in the race for promotion, we are deter-

mined to make them battle every inch of the way for the points this afternoon. And the same goes for our final game next Saturday when we visit another promotion chasing side, Brentford.

We had a great band of supporters making the trip to Bury last weekend and once again I can only applaud your loyalty and devotion to the club. The level of support has been magnificent all season, even through the recent difficult days when we have slumped so disappointingly. I can't thank you enough and assure everyone that this season's disappointments have only served to increase my determination to put the club firmly back on the road to success next season.

campaign opened and our sides have always included a fair sprinkling of younger players. Rest assured the lads will be really fired up and will be going all out to win us some silverware on Wednesday.






SOCER STUDIOS UP AND RUNNING







Automatic promotion target



LENNIE LAWRENCE

Out of the top two divisions for the first time since the early 1970s, Luton Town, under the shrewd guidance of Lennie Lawrence - and with a hatful of goals from Tony Thorpe - are making a determined bid to climb straight back into Division One. Already assured a place in the play-offs, they still have high hopes of getting one of the automatic promotion tickets and seem certain to be roared on today by a big contingent of travelling fans. Lennie Lawrence became Luton's manager in succession to Terry Westley during December 1995 and took over a side bottom of the First Division. An unbeaten run of eight games lifted the Hatters out of the relegation zone before a dismal run in the closing weeks of the season with just two wins in 17 games saw them back in trouble and finally condemned to make the drop. After nine years as manager of Charlton, during which he took the South

Londoner back into the top flight after an absence of almost 30 years, Lennie moved on to Middlesbrough in 1991 and his first full season saw the Teeside club promoted to the Premier League. He left in 1994 when Bryan Robson took over and then spent over a year in charge at Bradford City before becoming Luton's 21st manager. Last summer brought a number of departures from Kenilworth Road including the £425,000 sale of Scott Oakes to Sheffield Wednesday, but a further potential big money move by Ceri Hughes to Crystal Palace fell through and the Welsh International returned to Luton after a trial spell at Selhurst Park. The only major close season signing was Paul Showler from Bradford City but as the new campaign unfolded the Hatters' greatest asset emerged from within their own ranks, Tony Thorpe embarking on his prolific scoring spree.

IAN FEUER (Goalkeeper): Las Vegas-born understudy to Ludek Miklosko at West Ham made his league debut for Posh playing the last 16 games of the 1994/95 season on loan. The 6ft 7in giant was then on loan to Luton before being bought in December 1995 for a fee that could rise to £580,000 depending on appearances. He was the Hatters' 'Player of the Year' for 1995/96.

JULIAN JAMES (Defender): A former Luton trainee who suffered the dubious distinction of being sent off in his full debut at Leeds in the Littlewoods Cup in 1988. Completed 10 years of service last year and was granted a benefit.

MARVIN JOHNSON (Defender): Versatile defender who played at left back before being switched to a central role and has now played more than 200 senior games for the club.

MITCHELL THOMAS (Defender): England Under 21 player who started with Luton and the followed former manager David Pleat to Spurs. Later at West Ham he returned to Kenilworth Road on loan before a permanent free transfer move.

STEVE DAVIS (Defender): Commanding figure in the centre of the Hatters back line, Luton's club captain cost £750,000 from Burnley during the summer

before last. Originally with Southampton he had loan spells with Notts. County and Burnley before a full time move to Turf Moor in August 1991.

DARREN PATTERSON (Defender): Northern Ireland international was with Wigan prior to a spell at Crystal Palace from whom he was bought for £150,000 in the summer of 1995.

GRAHAM ALEXANDER (Defender/midfield): Luton had watched the former Scunthorpe United player over many months before he was Terry Westley's first signing for a £100,000 fee in July 1995.

PAUL MCCLAREN (Midfield): Former England Youth International who joined Luton from school. Started as a centre half before being moved into midfield and has really

established himself this season.

DAVID OLDFIELD (Midfield): Australian-born - although he played for England Under 21s. - David started with Luton before a £600,000 move to Manchester City in 1989 and was at Leicester before finally returning to Kenilworth Road after six years away in July 1995.

GARY WADDOCK (Midfield): Much travelled campaigner whose consistent displays last season earned him the players' 'Player of the Year' trophy.

Luton's skipper arrived on a free transfer from Bristol Rovers in 1994 and had two previous spells with Queen's Park Rangers, played in Belgium for Charleroi and was at Millwall and Swindon before moving to Rovers.

DWIGHT MARSHALL (Forward): Jamaica-born player who bounced back this season after suffering a broken leg in

February last year, having scoring 13 goals up to that point. He played non-league soccer with Grays and had three seasons with Plymouth Argyle before joining Luton in March 1995.

TONY THORPE (Forward): A prolific goal scoring record has helped to keep the Hatters in promotion contention. He has been with Luton since 1992 after previously playing for Leicester City but has astounded everyone as the Second Division's runaway top marksman this season.

BRUNO GUENTCHEV (Forward): Bulgarian international striker who played in the 1994 World Cup finals and last year's European Championship. Joined Luton in 1995 on a free transfer after three years with Ipswich Town.

ANDREW FOTIADIS (Forward): Joined the Hatters on a full-time basis last summer, aged 18, after staying on to complete his A level exams and has made a good impression.

ANDY KIWOMYA (Forward): Contributing his experience to the Luton cause on loan from Bradford City, Andy began as a trainee at Barnsley and was with Sheffield Wednesday and Dundee before suffering a severe injury. He returned to the game at Rotherham and was also at Scunthorpe before joining City.







LOOKING BACK with Matt Hill

Clashes few and far between

League meetings between Posh and Luton Town have been few and far between over the years, the clubs initially crossing paths in Division Three during the 1960s before renewing hostilities through Posh's two season sojourn in Division One in the early '90s. The first clash was a Third Division encounter at London Road in November 1963 when a crowd of over 10,000 went home disappointed after a dour goal-less draw. The return match the following March was much more entertaining, Posh returning from their debut visit to Kenilworth Road with a 3-2 win through goals by Keith Smith, Roy Horobin and a Luton defender. The following season a Tony Moulden goal ensured Posh a share of the points at Luton while one apiece from Ollie Conmy and Derek Dougan secured a 2-0 London Road victory in front of 12,946. The Hatters suffered the ignominy of relegation for the first time in their history at the end of the 1964-65 campaign, so beginning a break of 27 years until the next meeting in the new First Division on a stormy October afternoon in 1992. Despite being just one place off the bottom, the

Hatters deserved their 3-2 victory over ninth placed Posh, Tony Adcock and Gary Cooper scoring our goals while Phil Grey (2) and Paul Telfer were on target for Luton. A large contingent from Peterborough travelled to Luton for the return fixture, Posh's final game of the season and a goal-less draw was the outcome. The Hatters also had the better of things in 1993/94. Another 0-0 stalemate before 9,522 at London Road two days after Christmas preceded a 2-0 defeat at Kenilworth Road, Kerry Dixon scoring Luton goals that confirmed our relegation from Division One. The Hatters maintained their good record against Posh with a 3-0 home win in October with goals by Paul Showler (2) and Steve Davis.

DOUBLE VISION: Alan Slough

Midfielder Alan Slough joined home town club Luton Town as a professional in May 1965. He spent eight years at Kenilworth Road under the management of Alec Stock and was a member of the side that won the Division Four championship in 1968 and promotion to Division Two two years later. After 275 league appearances he left Kenilworth Road in August 1973, joining Fulham for £45,000 to once again team up with Stock. There he was an integral part of the Cottagers team including the likes of George Best, Bobby Moore, Alan Mullery and Rodney Marsh in their ranks. He was in the Fulham side that reached the FA Cup final of 1975, where they lost to West Ham, and in September 1976 scored

Fulham's 'other' goal in a 2-1 League Cup replay win over Posh on the night Best blasted arguably the best goal ever seen at London Road. Slough became a Peterborough player in July 1977 and made 105 league appearances in four seasons scoring 16 goals before joining Millwall in 1981. He is, perhaps best remembered by Posh fans for scoring a hat-trick of penalties in a 4-3 defeat at Chester's old Sealand Road home in April 1978. Alan finished his playing career at Torquay in 1983 and had a later spell with non-league Weymouth. These days he combines running a cleaning business in Torquay with managing a football side for the Christians in Sport movement.

How 54 Goals have been Scored






