RITCHIE JOINS STAFF





CONTRACT TALKS

In these days of freedom of movement for players when they reach the end of their contracts, clubs are now planning further into the future than they ever did before and Albion are no exception.

John Wile is fully aware of what needs to be done and said: "We are very conscious of the fact that the Bosman ruling has dictated that the freedom of movement for players has changed, and as such is going to change the face of any future negotiations. Players are going to be negotiating contracts long before their current contracts expire, because the club has to be in a position to know what the player wants to do.

"It is certainly going to bring problems to an awful lot of clubs because players may decide to wait until the end of their contracts, and then see what is available elsewhere.

"As a club we will be endeavouring to make sure that the players that the manager feels are important to the club for the future, are tied up on contracts before that stage arises."

One such player at The Hawthorns is Richard Sneeckes whose existing contract expires in the summer next year, and John Wile has already had talks with the Dutch midfielder. Because Richard could move on a free transfer next year his personal position is a strong one, John said, "He's in a very strong position to negotiate from, and although we would like to extend his stay at The Hawthorns, there is always a limit to what we can offer anyone, but we are still talking".

— I'm sure that Albion supporters hope that both parties can reach an agreement!

ALBION'S RECORD IN THE FOOTBALL LEAGUE CUP (1965 TO 1997)

The Football League Cup was introduced in 1960-61, but Albion did not enter immediately. In fact, they did not participate during the opening five seasons, yet when they did take part for the first time, in 1965-66, they went on to win the star prize, beating West Ham United 5-3 on aggregate in the last of the two-legged finals and duly qualified for the Fairs Cup competition.

- Their best wins and heaviest defeat has been 6-1.... the victories coming versus Aston Villa and Coventry City both at home and the reverse at Nottingham Forest. Albion have also lost 5-0 at Tottenham.
- The Baggies have appeared in three finals, winning in 1966, but losing in 1967 and 1970. They also lost to Spurs in the semi-final.
- Albion and QPR played in the first Wembley League Cup Final in March 1967.
- Albion's first League Cup tie in 1965 saw them beat Walsall 3-1 at The Hawthorns and Tony Brown scored their first goal.



Luton Town

As is often the case, since winning this competition in 1988 — and then reaching the final the following year — Luton Town haven't had the most distinguished of cup records.

Last season, however, they went on a mini-run — beating Derby County before going out, after extra-time, to Wimbledon — that kick-started their league campaign, and saw them charge to the top of the Second Division. In that purple patch, they were everyone's favourites for promotion — and generally regarded to be playing the classiest football in their division.

In the end, they reached the play-offs — only to go out to Crewe, 4-3 on aggregate, at the semi-final stage. The bitter irony there was that they had walloped the Railwaysmen, 6-0, earlier in the season.

There haven't been huge changes in personnel at Kenilworth Road since last term. Ceri Hughes has departed for Wimbledon and Kim Grant — a scorer at

The Hawthorns when last the Hatters' visited — has joined Millwall. The only major acquisition has been Simon Davies — £200,000 from Manchester United.

Luton haven't had the most auspicious start to this campaign. However, they're notoriously poor starters — last season they were bottom of the table after the first three games. So three draws and one win from the first games may not be good, but it won't cause widespread panic. Goals have been hard to come by. However, with the prolific Tony Thorpe in the side, that is almost certain to change.

An extensive injury list hasn't helped continuity. To compensate, there have been a couple of loan signings — although they won't be available tonight — and goalkeeper Andy Dibble is back on a short-term contract, as cover for the injured Ian Feuer.

The Hatters should not be underestimated. They are, perhaps, a First Division team in all but name. And it's not likely to be long before that anomaly is attended to.

Lennie Lawrence, Manager

Lennie Lawrence was appointed manager of Luton Town in December 1995, following the departure of Terry Westley. A player with non-League Croydon, Charlton Athletic and Sutton United, he was assistant manager at Plymouth and Lincoln, before becoming manager of Charlton Athletic in 1982, having initially joined the Addicks as reserve team coach. Charlton finished as runners-up in Division Two in 1985/86 earning promotion to the top flight after an absence of 29 years. The following season saw them involved in the first promotion/relegation play-offs, overcoming second division Leeds United after extra-time to stay up but relegation came in 1990. He left Charlton in 1991, after nine years and headed north to Middlesbrough, where he took the Teeside club into the FA Premier League in 1992 in his first season at the helm. They returned to Division One

in 1993, and he departed in 1994, when Bryan Robson took over. Bradford was his next port of call in May 1994, but his spell at Valley Parade did not last as long as anticipated and he became the 21st manager in the history of Luton Town in December 1995.

Kelvin Davis, Goalkeeper

Born: Bedford 29.9.76

Highly-rated 'keeper who made his league debut for the Hatters on the final day of the 1993/94 season in a 2-2 draw at Stoke.

Kelvin was selected for the England Under-21 squad for the Toulon Tournament in June 1995 and was again in England Under-21 squads throughout the '95/96 season. He was farmed out on loan to Hartlepool at the start of the current campaign but made a swift return to Kenilworth Road following an unfortunate injury to the big American, Ian Feuer.

Steve Davis, Defender

Born: Hexham 30.10.68

Steve joined the Hatters in the summer of 1995 after making over 160 league appearances for Burnley. He joined the Turf Moor side in August 1991 for £60,000 from Southampton, and captained Burnley during their rise up the league into Division One. Steve was a commanding figure for the Hatters in '95/96, but again suffered the agony of relegation as Luton, like Burnley the previous season, dropped out of Division One. A reliable performer in the heart of the defence, Steve will be looking for another consistent season.

Julian James, Defender

Born: Tring 22.3.70

Arrived at Luton as a trainee, and was introduced to First Division football in 1988. A former England Under-21 international, he was a regular at left-back in the 1993/94 season, but made the right-back position his own in 1994/95 with a string of consistent displays which earned him the Player of the Year award from the Loyal Luton Supporters Club. Granted a benefit match in 1996, he was a regular at right-back last term.

Marvin Johnson, Defender


Born: Wembley 29.10.68

Marvin made his Football League debut against Wimbledon in 1988, and quickly established himself as a versatile defender. Started the 1994/95 season at left-back, but then switched to the centre of defence to form a reliable partnership with current reserve team coach, Trevor Peake. Marvin was one of only three players to play in every first-team match in the 1994/95 season, and was awarded the Players' Player of the Year trophy. He has been a consistent performer for the past two seasons, doing an efficient job for the club.

Mitchell Thomas, Defender

Born: Luton 2.10.64

The former England Under-21 international made over 100 appearances for Luton before following David Pleat to Spurs in 1986. He played in the 1987 FA Cup

final, and later moved to West Ham. Returned to Luton in 1993/94 after a successful loan spell, and was a regular at left-back in the 1994/95 campaign. Given a new lease of life by new manager Lennie Lawrence, he responded with an ever-present record until the end of the season. Did a good job at left-back last term as the Hatters made the play-offs.

Darren Patterson, Defender

Born: Belfast 15.10.69

Darren signed for the Hatters in August 1995 from Crystal Palace for £150,000. The Northern Ireland international started his league career with Wigan, and joined Palace for £250,000 in 1992. An Achilles injury ruled him out of the first two months of last season, and kept him out of the Northern Ireland squad. Made his first Luton appearance in the Anglo-Italian Cup defeat in Cesena in November 1995, but was allowed to go out on loan to Preston in October 1996. Came back into the Northern Ireland frame last season after some good displays.

Paul McLaren, Midfield

Born: High Wycombe 17.11.76

Paul made his debut in the Town first-team on the final day of the 1993/94 season. He is an England youth international who began his career as a centre-half but was converted into a central midfielder. Was an able squad member last season, grabbing his first-team chances with both hands, and as such he will be looking forward to cementing a regular place in the starting XI in the months to come.

Simon Davies, Midfield

Born: Middlewich 23.4.74

Joined the Hatters from Manchester United in the

summer of 1997, after limited chances to prove himself in the Red Devils' first-team. In fact he made 11 league appearances for United, finding the net once, in a European Cup tie no less as Galatasaray were beaten 4-0. Luton will be hoping that the youngster will bring some of his good United habits with him and prove to be a vital cog in the wheel.

Gary Waddock, Midfield

Born: Alperton 17.3.62


Gary completed a free transfer move from Bristol Rovers in December 1994, after a three-month loan spell at Kenilworth Road. Started his career with QPR making over 200 appearances, before a serious knee injury saw him quit the English game and move to Charleroi in the Belgian league. He defied many by overcoming his injury and headed back home to try his luck in the Football League once more. He had spells at Millwall, QPR again, and Swindon, before moving to Bristol Rovers. Gary missed only one game after joining the Hatters in 1994/95. His consistent displays in '95/96 were rewarded with the Players' Player of the Year Trophy, and his vast experience was used to full effect last season by him being made skipper of the side.

David Oldfield, Midfielder/Forward

Born: Perth, Australia 30.5.68

David returned to Kenilworth Road in the summer of 1995, six years after leaving the club. He started his career with the Hatters, progressing through the junior ranks to a two-goal senior debut in a 2-1 Simod Cup win at Everton in February 1988. He also scored on his full

league debut in a 2-1 home win over Watford in May 1988, and went on to make 29 league appearances for the Hatters, scoring four goals. Australian-born Oldfield, who played for England Under-21s, joined Manchester City for £600,000 in March 1989, before moving on to Leicester City.

Dwight Marshall, Forward

Born: Jamaica 3.10.65


Dwight signed in the summer of 1994 from Plymouth for £150,000, after scoring 14 goals for Peter Shilton's side the previous season. Started well for Luton, with two goals in a 5-1 win over Middlesbrough and despite being troubled by a shin injury late in the season he finished as the Hatters' leading scorer with 13 goals in league and cup. Scored 13 goals in '95/96, but suffered a broken leg in February 1996, ruling him out for the rest of the season. Returned in November 1996, and proved that he is still sharp in front of goal.

Tony Thorpe, Forward

Born: Leicester 10.4.74

Tony made an immediate impact in the Town side when he scored for the Hatters on his full debut at Newcastle United, in the fourth round of the FA Cup in January 1994. He joined the club following a spell at Leicester, but found it difficult to initially gain a regular place in the team. However he has gone on to prove his worth in no uncertain terms and put pen to paper on a new contract in the summer of 1996. He went on to enjoy a record-breaking season, becoming the first Luton player since Malcolm MacDonald in 1970/71 to reach 30 goals.


LEARNING THROUGH FOOTBALL

richard sneekes

player profile

One of the outstanding performers in the Baggies' season so far has been Dutch midfielder Richard Sneekes. The 23 year-old former Ajax, Fortuna Sittard and Bolton player looks to be at the peak of his form and has already found the back of the net twice this season.

Albion fans will recall his sensational arrival at the club, when he scored ten goals in the final 13 games of the 1995/96 season. Last season, despite spending some time as a substitute, Richard struck eight times and his goals and creative midfield play make him a highly influential member of the team.

Richard's successful start to the season has been mirrored by the team's own success under Ray Harford, and he feels that the changes made by the boss since he's been at the club are significant, as well as the dedication of the players:

"The manager has changed a lot since he's come here and the lads have shown lots of discipline to convert what we do on the training pitch into match situations and we're happy how this is working out."

"As far as my own form is concerned, it's a matter of having confidence — which I've always had. Unfortunately under the last manager he wanted me to play a little differently, which I couldn't really understand why, but things are going well for me now."

Some would say that Richard's form is allied to the fact that Peter Butler is closing down opposition like his life depends upon it, and Sean Flynn has also added extra bite in the "engine room", giving him the license to try and hurt teams further forward. That's not the way the Dutchman sees it:

"I've still got my defensive duties. The boss stresses that I have to do my share defensively and they (Peter and Sean) obviously have to get forward as well, so I have to cover them. As long as I've got the freedom to express myself, to do what I do best, I'm happy."

Away from West Bromwich Albion, Albion News wondered how Richard views the huge influx of foreign players to these shores and found that Richard has an interesting opinion on the subject:

"Fans want big names and big stars from abroad and I don't think that is a good thing. It's not good for young players coming through. In some countries, for example Spain, they are trying to restrict the amount of players from overseas and I think this might be a good policy."

Slightly surprising views for a player from the continent, but typically good sense from the intelligent Sneekes.

Still on a foreign theme, this son of Amsterdam must have been overjoyed at the Dutch national team's recent qualification for the World Cup Finals in France.

"It doesn't interest me that much, I'm playing for West Brom and I just concentrate on that."

Concentrating on the Albion at the expense of thinking about his country — this shows admirable commitment to the Baggies cause and anyone who has seen him play this season will testify to seeing Richard approaching each game with real zeal.

Having played in all of Albion's games this season, only one of which has resulted in defeat, how successful does Richard believe the Baggies can be this season?

"At the moment we are doing fine and hopefully we can produce this form week-in-week-out and if we do that, then there's no reason why we can't at least end up in the top six. If we are consistent, doing what we do well, we'll be there or thereabouts."

Like Richard, Baggies fans will be hoping the team can maintain the good form and give themselves a chance of promotion. They will also be hoping Richard Sneekes maintains his sparkling performances and continues to be a regular name on the scoresheet.

What other sports are you good at, if any?

I'm OK at most ball sports and, although it's not really a different sport, I always enjoy five-a-side and indoor football as in Holland it's played a lot more

If you played abroad, which team would you most like to play for?

I'm already abroad! As a kid I supported Liverpool so I always wanted to play for them, I'd also love to play in Italy

Whose talent do you most envy?

Nobody's. You should be happy with the talent you've got. It's up to you to use it as well as possible

My parents and my grandfather. More recently my wife



Coca-Cola Clash

Bob Taylor's goal equalised Stuart Douglas' opener as West Bromwich Albion drew 1-1 at Kenilworth Road in the Coca-Cola Cup Second Round First Leg fixture a week ago.

Goals by Bontcho Guentchev and Kim Grant gave struggling Luton a 2-0 First Division win on their last visit to The Hawthorns in April 1996. Lee Ashcroft and Andy Hunt had scored in Albion's 2-1 win at Luton six months earlier. West Brom last beat the Hatters here 1-0 in December 1994

when Kevin Donovan scored the decisive goal.

Hats Off To Harford

West Brom's manager Ray Harford guided Luton Town to three Wembley Cup finals, including their 1988 Littlewoods Cup triumph. He managed Fulham prior to joining Luton as assistant-manager in July 1986 and succeeded John Moore in charge of the Hatters in June 1987. Despite his success, he left by 'mutual consent' in January 1990 after it was claimed that he did not smile enough, subsequently managing Wimbledon and Blackburn Rovers before his appointment at The Hawthorns in February 1997.

In Safe Keeping

One-time Luton Town goalkeeper Tony Godden made a record 228 consecutive appearances (including 180 League games) for West Brom. Signed from Ashford Town for £3,000 in August 1975, he played for Albion in the 1977/78 FA Cup semi-final and three UEFA Cup campaigns. Making 267 First Division appearances overall while at The Hawthorns, he moved to Chelsea in March 1986 after playing 12 First Division games on loan to

Luton at the end of the 1982/83 season.

Promotion Winner

Former West Brom defender Jack Bannister starred at left-back alongside John Ryan and Chris Nicholl in Luton Town's 1969/70 promotion success. He signed professional for Albion in August 1959 and made nine First Division appearances prior to joining Scunthorpe United in June 1964. Moving via Crystal Palace to Luton in October 1968, he made 82 League appearances while at Kenilworth Road and joined Cambridge United in May 1971.

High Fives

Strikes by Gordon Turner (2), Jimmy Adam, Allan Brown and Joe Kennedy's own goal gave the following Luton Town team an emphatic 5-1 First Division win over West Brom in front of 15,365 at Kenilworth Road on 14th December 1957: Ron Baynham, Shay Dunne, Ken Hawkes, Bob Morton, Syd Owen, Reg Pearce, Jimmy Adam, Gordon Turner, Allan Brown, John Groves, George McLeod. The defeat ended Albion's excellent 17 match unbeaten run.

Albion's former England U-21 striker Andy King spent three spells at Luton Town in various capacities. An ex-Luton apprentice signed professional in July 1974 and netted nine times in 33 League games before his £35,000 sale to Everton in April 1976. Joining West Brom from QPR for £400,000 in September 1981, he scored four times in 25 First Division games before swapped for Everton's Peter Eastoe in August 1982. He briefly rejoined Luton Town from Wolves in December 1985, then returned as commercial manager.

Wembley Hero

West Brom's former loanee goalkeeper Andy Dibble made a crucial penalty save at Wembley in Luton Town's 1988 Littlewoods Cup final triumph over Arsenal. Signed from Cardiff City in July 1984, the Welsh international made 30 First Division appearances for Luton prior to joining Manchester City in June 1988 and recently rejoined the Hatters on loan. Other players who have appeared in the League for both clubs since the war include Ian Benjamin, Stacey North and Imre Varadi.







This evening we look forward to our next two First Division encounters, which take us to Gigg Lane, Bury on Saturday and then receive Oxford United here on October 4th. From here on our scarves will have a practical as well as symbolic value!

Bury is the smallest town with a league side in Greater Manchester and is famous for its black pudding. If Stan Ternent continues to weave his magic it may well become famous for its football club too. Since his appointment in September 1995 he has guided The Shakers to consecutive promotions and sees them nestling in the top half of Division One. In the recent game against Manchester City many noted that the Bury line-up had cost less than £500,000 while Mr Kinkladze alone was valued at £7 million plus. Honours were even in the match. Much of their

success has been on a steady defence with gifted man-markers such as Nick Daws and Lenny Johnrose and the excellent Dean Kiely (a £125,000 buy from York) in goal. In midfield ex-Tottenham man Andy Gray spreads the ball round well while David Johnson and Tony Battersby are dangerous running at defenders. Up front, look out for in-form Peter Swan who has been thrust into the forward line from his usual position as a centre-back, while hernia victim Dean West has been replaced by Ian Hughes. Ronnie Jepson and Rob Matthews are also sidelined with injuries. Looking at Bury's start to the season, we see they opened with a 1-1 draw against Reading at Gigg Lane, then picked up two 0-0 results at Stockport and at home to Charlton. They were beaten 4-2 at Wolves but bounced back with a 2-1 win at Crewe. A 1-0 home win over Tranmere was followed by the derby with Manchester City, a 11,216 crowd witnessing a 1-1 draw; Bury's biggest attendance for many a long year. What odds another draw at the weekend.

We should be seeing one of the games characters the following week now that Oxford have signed 39 year-old goalkeeper Bruce Grobbelaar on a short term deal. Manager Denis Smith was looking for a new 'keeper following the groin strain suffered by Phil Whitehead and he also considered Newcastle's Pavel Srnicek. With Matt Murphy out for six weeks and Martin Gray for five weeks, the U's have also taken French midfielder Franck Roye on trial. Meanwhile 32 year-old Stuart Massey has gone on the transfer list. Smith could have more to spend had Oxford not missed out on a £100,000 add-on clause by three months when Jim Magilton moved from Southampton to Sheffield Wednesday! Of the current team the partnership of Joey Beauchamp (two goals against Wolves recently) and Nigel Jemson looks threatening while the likes of Mark Angel, Nicky Banger, Bobby Ford, Darren Purse, Les Robinson and David Smith are all regulars and quality players. They started the season well with 2-0 win against Huddersfield at the Manor Ground, then lost four on the run (2-3 at Charlton, 0-1 at home to Forest, 1-2 at Portsmouth and 1-3 at Sunderland) before overpowering Wolves 3-0 at home. They came back to earth with a bump with a 2-1 defeat in the Thames Valley derby at Reading. If the game is as memorable as last year's 3-3 draw here we should be in for a corker!
