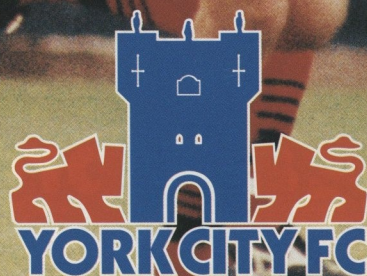



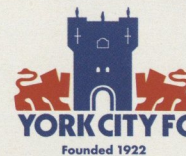

Jonathan Greening and Richard Cresswell are coming on, but are not up to 100% fitness yet and the same goes for Steve Tutill and John Sharples. Tut has had a couple of reserve outings, totalling about seventy minutes, while John is building up his knee with a series of runs.

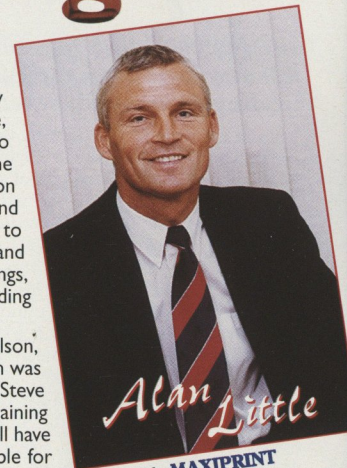
The other player on the treatment table is Neil Tolson, who is troubled by a groin problem. The decimation was compounded earlier this week when Gary Bull, Steve Bushell and Mark Tinkler were all missing from training suffering from flu and/or sickness. Hopefully this will have cleared up by today and these three will be available for selection this afternoon.

It seems like an age ago since our last home game and the three points against Wycombe, in which I thought we strolled the game and once we'd scored could have had a hatful. The Southport away game has had a lot written about it and it's not worth going over old ground again. Suffice to say that it was a bruising encounter which we were glad to come through without embarrassment. The reward of a trip to Wigan in Round Two provides us with an interesting game and one in which we know we can do well. Of course, Fulham are another team who have spent pots of money and we visited them ten days ago. It wasn't a great game, but for the twelfth match running we took the lead and were a touch unlucky not to hold onto it. I thought Martin Reed was fouled when he lost possession to Peschisolido, before the striker scored. It wasn't a great game however, between two tired looking sides.

At Blackpool last week we looked a lot sharper, in the first half especially and probably should have led at half time. The home side were a strong outfit and in the second half came back at us well. The injury to Mark Samways contributed to their goal and I believe a draw would have been a fair result.

As you may have read this week in the papers, David Rush has been granted a free transfer by the club. We didn't receive offers for the player and so the best thing for York City was to see if the striker could fix himself up. That is now the end of the matter as far as this club is concerned.

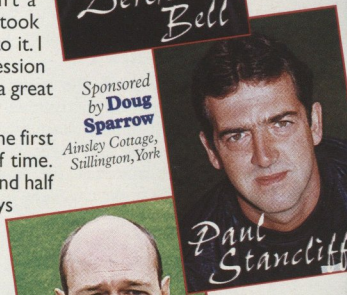
Finally, I would like to welcome Lennie Lawrence and all involved with Luton Town, who will be looking to kickstart their season this afternoon. Alan LITTLE



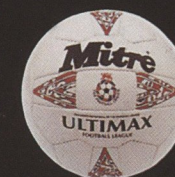
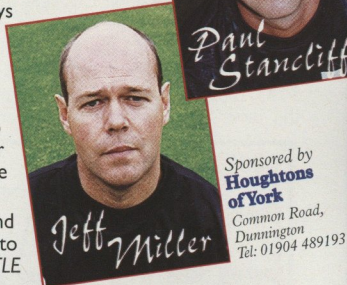

Spotlight on...

An £80,000 close season capture in 1996 NEIL TOLSON quickly won over the fans in his first season by finishing leading scorer with seventeen goals.

Born in the West Midlands, Neil quickly got into his footballing stride playing in a local under-10 side at the age of seven, on the right wing! There was a family background of football with his grandfather, Ray Westwood having played for Bolton Wanderers and England at inside left and his dad a regular in local football. "Me mum's not bad either," he smirks. Having got onto the YTS at Walsall, a debut goal in the FA Cup versus Yeovil Town quickly followed, with a first League goal against City at the Bescot on his fourth and last appearance for the Saddlers.

"I remember that goal well, Steve Tutill was pulling my shirt, but I still managed to knock it past Kiely from twenty yards", he exaggerates.

Out of the blue, Oldham Athletic paid £150,000 for the lanky nineteen year old striker and although first team appearances were rare Neil enjoyed his time working for Joe Royle. "They had Graeme Sharp, Ian Olney, Roger Palmer and Andy Ritchie in front of me for the strikers' positions, but I was given the odd chance. My favourite match there was an away game at Chelsea on the first ever day of the Premier League. I came on as sub and we drew 1-1."

Unfortunately for Neil, the team didn't fare well and his opportunities often arose in difficult circumstances. "The team were struggling and there was a lot of high pressure matches. Joe was very fair though and a great manager to work under."

When Sean McCarthy moved from Bradford City to Oldham in December 1993, Neil went the other way as part of the deal. "Again, there were plenty of

forwards at Bradford with the likes of Ian Ormondroyd, Paul Jewell and Mark Stallard, but I was given a fair crack of the whip and scored quite a few goals." Frighteningly for any centre halves under 6ft 5inches, Neil played a few games in partnership with Ormondroyd. "Yes, we actually played quite well together," he says with a cheeky smile.

Like Joe Royle, Lennie Lawrence left a lasting impression on the striker. He says of today's visiting manager, "He was very unlucky not to stay at Bradford longer. After all, we went up in the season he parted company with the club."

Although it was a great occasion, one of the biggest disappointments during that spell was not getting on, having been named as sub for the play-off final win over Notts county at Wembley. That turned out to be his Bantams swansong as the move to City followed that summer.

Unsurprisingly, Neil's highlights at York so far have been the two matches against Everton last season. "It wasn't just that I was lucky enough to score in both games, but the fact that we played really well and of course won the tie. I would say the football that the team is playing this year is similar to in those two games."

He continues, "there is a good team spirit this year and we are defending better as a whole team, and that includes the forwards."

So why the difference?

"I don't know why the team spirit is better, it's hard to pinpoint the reason." Then he spoils his answer... "If you cut one of us, we all bleed!" with a large hint of sarcasm.

"It may sound silly, but the good feeling in the squad can be illustrated by our nights out." Please explain yourself Neil. "Last year, if we sorted out an evening round town or something only six or seven of us would go but now it's more like fifteen or twenty." Watch out York town centre, then.

Changing tack somewhat, Neil responds to the accusation that he probably isn't a referees' favourite. "I just love to win so much that sometimes I get carried away. "It's not nasty, I just can't stand losing and if I think the refs wrong I tell him."

There is sympathy for the men in the middle however, "I would never do it, it's a really hard job. Especially now that the games getting faster and faster."

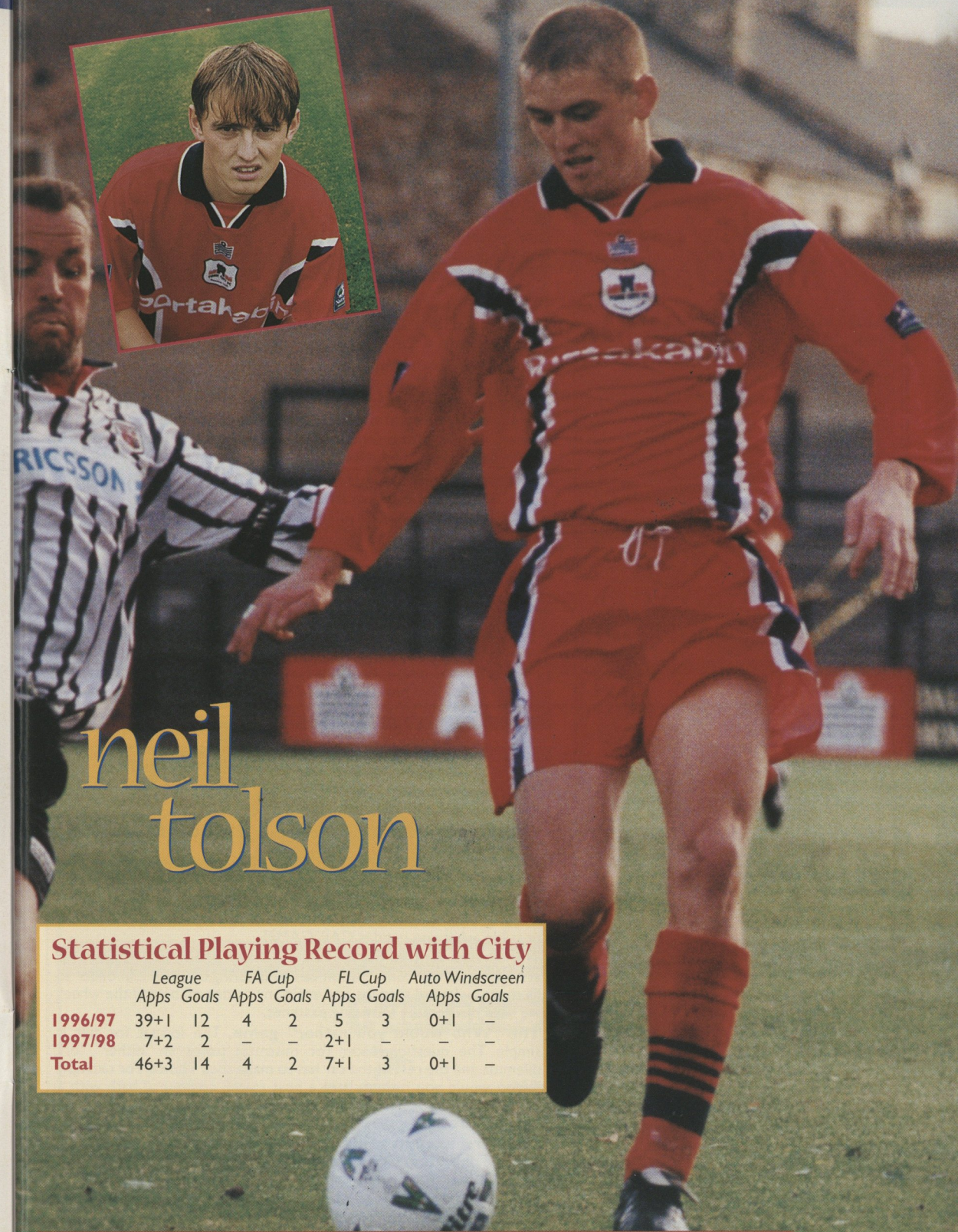
As we look around our interview room (the Club Shop!) Neil pipes up. "You just have to look at the players in here to see we've got a strong squad once everyone is fit." Passing time in the shop waiting for treatment are the likes of Steve Tutill, John Sharples, Andy McMillan and Paul Stephenson along with Neil himself.

"It's been frustrating this season because I've been lucky with injuries in the past. Any knocks I've taken have tended to be in the close season and by August I've been fit again. In the last four years I think I've only missed two games through being unfit."

There is a small crumb of comfort however for the injured striker. "Not playing does give me a chance to go and watch the Albion (West Brom) sometimes!"

With thoughts again returning to this season's campaign Tolly continues. "If we can get the injured players back in contention to pressure those in the side, and provide some healthy competition we can remain near the top. We've got some great utility players, giving us cover all over the pitch."

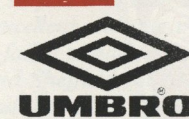

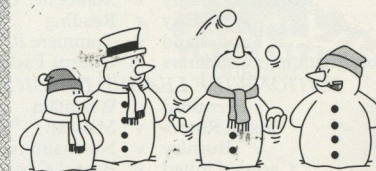

YORK CITY travelled to unbeaten League leaders Leeds United on Sunday and were shown exactly why Leeds are top of the League. Leeds played fluid passing football and City were constantly chasing the game. Leeds took full advantage of some dubious offside decisions in the first half and tore through the City defence time and again. They were 10-0 up by half time. City rallied in the second half though, played a lot better and seemed to control the runs through midfield far better than in the first half. The final score was 13-0. City's Abbi Webster and Claire Warren were named joint players of the match for their defensive efforts. City were well beaten by the better side on the day, but their team spirit is still good and they took their battling spirit into their next League game at home against Sheffield the following week.

CITY returned to form on Sunday 16th November with a solid 2-1 win over Sheffield Hallam. City took the lead after only four minutes when Jenny Garnett slotted the ball neatly past the Sheffield keeper. City return to League action tomorrow with a tough away match against Hull City. Having already beaten them 2-1 in a close game at York, City will look for a solid performance to secure maximum points again and consolidate their position in the League. After Sunday's other Premier Division games City are still fifth in the table, and will be looking to strengthen their position still further with a good win.

Second Division interest in the Coca-Cola Cup ended with the defeats of Grimsby Town and Walsall at Liverpool and West Ham respectively after brave performances.

Watford and Bristol City continue to stride out at the top of the table and have now opened up a sizeable gap. The Hornets' latest wins were at home to Oldham and away to Northampton. Tommy Mooney hit a late winner against the Latics whilst Peter Kennedy netted the only goal at the Sixfields Stadium. Bristol City marched on with home wins over Plymouth Argyle and Wycombe Wanderers. In the latter game Matt Hewlett netted twice. Millwall maintained their impressive away record when they chalked up their fifth win on their travels with a 2-1 success at Burnley but then again dropped home points when they were held to a 1-1 draw by Chesterfield. Chris Perkins equalised for the Spireites after Paul Shaw had given the Lions the lead. A last minute goal by Tony Ellis earned Blackpool a point at Gillingham and they followed this up with a win over City at Bloomfield Road. The Gills slipped further down the table when they lost 3-0 at Fulham in a Friday night fixture. Paul Peschisolido scored twice for the Cottagers. Successive home wins for Bournemouth lifted the Cherries several places. A 2-1 victory over Southend was followed by an exciting 3-2 success against Carlisle United. Steve Fletcher, Russell Beardsmore and Jon O'Neill scored for the Dean Court club whilst Billy Barr and Ian Stevens replied for the visitors. As a result the Cumbrians dropped to the bottom. Luton Town suffered their fourth successive home defeat when Walsall won thanks to a John Hodge strike. It was the Saddlers' first away victory of the campaign. Preston who had gone down to a home defeat in a midweek game to Bristol Rovers swept back to form with an impressive 4-1 victory at Wigan. Lee Cartwright (2), Lee Ashcroft and Ryan Kidd were their scorers whilst the home side could only reply through Ian Kilford. Brentford earned a vital point when they snatched a late equaliser at Oldham. Sean McCarthy gave the Latics the lead but Andy Scott grabbed a goal for the Bees. Burnley remained in the bottom four when they crashed 4-1 at Grimsby. Paul Weller gave the Clarets the lead but Town ran out comfortable winners with goals from Paul Groves, Tommy Widdrington, Jack Lester and Lee Nogan. Plymouth checked Wrexham at the Racecourse with a 1-1 draw. The Devon club were reduced to ten men when Adrian Littlejohn was sent off but then took the lead through Chris Billy. The home side fought back to equalise through Peter Ward. Substitute Peter Beadle netted Bristol Rovers' equaliser from the penalty spot at Southend in a 1-1 draw.

In midweek FA Cup replays Wycombe Wanderers, Plymouth Argyle and Burnley were all knocked out by clubs from lower divisions.

Cup success this season came in the Football League Cup, as in the first round of the FA Cup, City fell at Bradford City. En route to the quarter-finals of the League Cup they dismissed Third Division clubs Bristol City and Watford after two replays and Bournemouth. COLLAPSE OF ACCRINGTON League games cancelled

-£60,000 debt

ACCRINGTON STANLEY AFC, one of the founder members of the Football League, struggling under a £60,000 debt, to-day decided the club could not carry on any longer in the League and all the remaining fixtures are cancelled.

Accrington have resigned from the League. Mr. Eric Howarth, assistant secretary of the League, said to-day: "I have been told that there is a letter in the post from Accrington Stanley resigning their associate membership of the Football League. This has been reported to the League president but no further action will be taken until tomorrow. Nothing can be done about the match against Exeter until then."

"The matter will certainly be referred to the Management Committee at their meeting on Sunday if not before."

From Peel Park, Accrington, the club secretary, Mr. Jack Wigglesworth, reported: "There will be no more games for us. I am now waiting for further information to see exactly what we must do. The players are at home and will not be doing any training."

It seems probable that Accrington's current playing record as it affects all Fourth Division clubs will be expunged. That was the course adopted when Wigan Borough dropped out in 1931.

Creditors heard at last night's meeting that the club was £60,000 in debt and that unless £400 was found by to-day, the telephone, electricity, water and gas supplies at the ground would be cut off immediately.

York City, having beaten Accrington at Bootham Crescent, will have two points deducted. The away game was due on April 7. Colchester, the Fourth Division leaders, will lose four points.

Mr. Cliff Lloyd, secretary of the Professional Footballers' Association, said in Manchester to-day: "There is not much we can say, officially, about this. Obviously we shall see that the players are entered for, but it is really a matter for the club or the League. The League take over the registrations and conduct the transfers. It is terribly unfortunate."

It was a fine display by City and they even allowed themselves the luxury of a missed penalty. Scenes at the end of the match were reminiscent of the FA Cup games of the mid 1950s. Having done so well in the tournament it was a big disappointment when they lost to fellow Fourth Division side Rochdale at Spotland in the last eight.

At the end of the campaign two more of the famous cup giantkilling team departed - Billy Hughes and George Howe. Reliable understudy goalkeeper, Mick Granger, also left the club.

The Accrington Stanley club collapsed in March 1962 and resigned from the League. One of their players Alex Hamilton, assisted City in the closing weeks. At the Football League's AGM Oxford United were elected to fill the vacancy.

For the second successive season Luton Town finished thirteenth in the Second Division. Ipswich were First Division champions at the first attempt under the managements of Alf Ramsey. Liverpool were runaway Second Division champions and Portsmouth won the Third Division title. Tottenham Hotspur retained the FA Cup when they beat Burnley 3-1 at Wembley.

City pay big fee for Billy Rudd

SHORTLY before the start of York City's FA Cup tie against Bradford City at Valley Parade to-day, the Bootham Crescent club completed its second big transfer deal within a month by signing Birmingham inside forward, Billy Rudd.

Rudd is a nephew of Jimmy Rudd, former brilliant York City outside left, and made 18 appearances in Birmingham's first team last season. He joined Birmingham two years ago from Stalybridge Celtic. City have had Rudd under observation for some time. Ten days ago they watched him play on the Chelsea ground, and the club manager went to Birmingham this week to continue transfer negotiations. Birmingham would not release the player a fortnight ago because of injuries to inside forwards, but agreed at that time about the fee with City.

FIRST APPEARANCE

Rudd is a bustling type of player, is 20 years old, stands 5ft. 7in. and weighs 11 stone. He can play at inside or wing forward.

He was not eligible for to-day's FA Cup tie - 14 days registration is necessary - but is likely to make his first appearance for City, at Darlington, next Saturday.

This afternoon sees City return to Fortress Bootham having fulfilled three successive away fixtures. It seems like ages since Wycombe were vanquished here when in reality it was only three weeks ago when that sixth successive home win lifted us four paces to third. Even though we have since dropped to a 'mere' fifth, every sane-minded supporter would have settled for this position come the last Saturday in November. As Luton visit us today, it is not unfair to either side to reflect on our respective placings and suggest that most pundits would have expected City to occupy second bottom and Luton the loftier perch that is ours. Despite the setback at Blackpool last Saturday, City should still enter today's game with confidence, but it will not have gone unnoticed amongst club spies that Luton's away record is comparable to our own with only nine goals conceded and three games lost, so nothing should be taken for granted. In fact it is the Hatters' woeful home form which accounts for their current plight, but Lennie Lawrence's managerial record shows he is best mates with adversity so don't write them off yet in what is a very tight division.

Those three away games resulted in mixed fortunes for City, but even though only one League point was gleaned other results further compressed the top half of the table to the extent that City maintained fifth place. Happily, the club also retains an interest in the FA Cup following the 4-0 drubbing of Southport, although we survived the odd scare along the way in the best Cup traditions. It was a 'tough' game in every sense of the word, and I felt things were pretty evenly poised until the home side decided to try and lull us into a false sense of security by ensuring two of their men were sent off (how else do you explain it?). Alas, City were too professional to be fooled, and from that point on won in a canter when half an hour earlier victory by any margin was somewhat less assured. The only disappointment of the day out at Haig Avenue was the assault on Paul Stephenson, which resulted in nine stitches and put 'Stevie' on the sidelines at a time when he is playing arguably the best football of his City career. A further blow was the Second Round draw which unkindly sent City to Wigan next Saturday, although Lady Luck redressed the balance when, for the second successive season, City received a bye last week into the Second Round of the AWS. City fans on

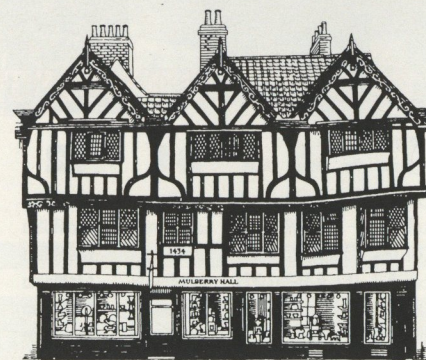
the cup trail a week today should remember to cancel any engagements planned for that evening, in view of the longevity of our League visit to Springfield Park earlier this month!

Back in the League, reports from Craven Cottage suggest that City battled for the point they earned to show that the financial gulf between Fulham and ourselves did not necessarily translate into southern supremacy on the pitch itself. Good job too, bearing in mind that the home side's equalising goal came from a man who cost almost six times more than the entire City team. More indicative of the way things are is the fact that the £1m Fulham paid for Paul Peschisolido was over twice City's total gate receipts for 1996/97, as revealed in the Club's accounts released last weekend. With more money than ever before swilling around a select few 'sugar-daddied' clubs in this division, any result against big-spending sides is to be welcomed as a sign that City's players have no inferiority complex – and on this season's form, why should they? It was again pleasing to see Tony Barras on target from the penalty spot, as I'd wager I wasn't the only one who watched with eyebrows twitching and a degree of trepidation as our inspiring number six first strode forward and put the ball on the spot! We need not have worried, as the accuracy of his latest spot kick hammered hard and low into the corner contrasted with his blast from twelve yards against Wycombe to suggest that there may be a whole repertoire of techniques yet to come. Whether these are as numerous a catalogue as his no-nonsense stand-clearing approach in times of danger remains to be seen though!

Our recent upturn in form has also seen a corresponding upturn in expectations, so the reverse at Blackpool was a disappointing one, particularly as many observers agree with Mark Samways' protestations that he would have been able to reach the home side's winner had he not been hindered by a knee injury. Hopefully, his injury won't be as bad as first feared and City will continue to win at home, and convert some draws into wins as our seaside tour continues at Bournemouth and Southend in weeks to come. So, as the festive season approaches, may the only 'dips' Alan Little's men taste be in the Yuletide buffets! Ho ho ho.

WE'VE MET before

Formed in 1885 **Luton Town** operated in the Southern League prior to their election to the Second Division of the Football League in 1897. They failed to gain re-election three years later and did not return to the fold until becoming founder members of Division Three in 1920. Champions of the Southern Section in 1936/37 they reached the top flight in 1955

and in 1959 were FA Cup runners up to Nottingham Forest. Relegated the following year by the mid 1960s they had dropped to the Fourth but by 1970 had bounced back to the old Second Division. For the next twelve years they remained in that League (apart from 1974/75 in the First) and then in 1981/82 they were Second Division Champions. The Hatters then enjoyed ten

seasons at the top level finishing a best ever seventh in 1986/87 and winning the FL Cup the following campaign when they beat Arsenal at Wembley. Relegated in 1992 they suffered further demotion in May 1996 and so dropped out of the top two divisions for the first time in over twenty five years. Last season they lost to Crewe Alexandra in the promotion play offs.

MATCH Remember

Fourth Division City sprung a surprise in the Third Round of the FA Cup in 1978/79 when they knocked out Luton then in the Second. The tie was staged on the evening of 9th January 1979 having been postponed because of snow on the previous Saturday.

City were away to a flyer and within three minutes took the lead. David Pugh started the move and when Kevin Randall crossed from the left Gordon Staniforth shot home from close range. The pressure was kept up and Town's keeper Jake Findlay was constantly in action in the early stages. The Hatters settled down, however, and began to get on top. Andy Clements cleared one shot off the line and then Bob Hatton shot wide from in front of goal. The experienced striker failed with another easy chance and City did well to survive some constant Luton pressure. They duly weathered the storm and with five minutes remaining clinched their place in the next round following a free kick just outside the penalty area. Pugh placed this to the far post for Steve Faulkner to head across goal and Randall nodded the ball home. The attendance was 6,730 and City went on to meet the reigning First Division champions Nottingham Forest at the City Ground in Round Four. After a gallant fight they went down 3-1. The teams lined up:

& ONE Forget

City went into their last match of the 1966/67 campaign needing to win to avoid having to apply for re-election to Division Four. The date was 13th May 1967 and it was their first ever visit to Kenilworth Road.

City made the best possible start and were a goal up within a couple of minutes. Les Collinson and Tom Spencer set free John Hawksby who ran on to beat Tony Read with a low shot. Luton were level, however, three minutes later when following a cross from Brian Johnson the ball was turned into the net by Keith Allen. Full back Fred Jardine crashed in a shot to give the home side the lead in the eighteenth minute and after half an hour Gerry Baker put through his own goal. Rowland Horrey and Andy Provan worked hard up front for City but Town were well worth their 3-1 interval lead. After the break Luton dominated proceedings and added to their lead with a couple of fine goals scored by Bruce Rioch. Only outstanding goalkeeping by Harry Fallon prevented a complete humiliation. City were restricted to isolated attacks with Provan missing one good chance and then having a "goal" disallowed for offside. The attendance was 5,196 and making his last appearance for Luton that day was David Pleat who recently was dismissed from his post as Sheffield Wednesday manager. The sides were:



The clubs first met in the mid 1960s in the Fourth Division. On Easter Saturday, 25th March 1967 City won 5-1 at Bootham Crescent with goals from Andy Provan (2), Les Collinson, Tom Spencer and John Goodchild. Town replied through Graham French and they gained full revenge when in the last game of that season they won 5-1 at Kenilworth Road (see *Match to Forget*). The following season the Hatters gained promotion and in their home win over City Bruce Rioch (2) and a Ray Whittaker penalty earned them a 3-1 success. Ted MacDougall netted for City and in the return game at Bootham Crescent a Keith Allen goal cancelled out a Tommy Ross effort. Paths crossed next in the old Second Division in 1975/76 when Town completed the double. In November 1975 they gained a comfortable 4-0 win with Jim Husband, Alan West, Andy King and Peter Anderson on the mark. The match at York in February 1976 was an exciting affair with Town winning by the odd goal in five. Ian Holmes (penalty) and Brian Pollard were City's scorers and Brian Chambers, Ron Futcher and Lil Fuccillo netted for Luton. In last season's encounter at Kenilworth Road, Dwight Marshall and Tony Thorpe were the scorers. The one FA Cup meeting between the clubs is featured in *Match to Remember*. Players who have appeared for both clubs over the years include Reg Stockill who scored City's first ever goal in League football and who remains their youngest ever player when he made his debut that day in August 1929 (fifteen years 281 days old). Winger Jimmy Weir and centre forward Jim Goldie represented both clubs in the 1960s and more recently Viv Busby and Rob Matthews. Former Charlton Athletic goalkeeper Sam Bartram managed City (1956-60) and then was in charge at Kenilworth Road until 1962.

A number of serious injuries have hampered Luton Town's bid to reproduce the form of last season. Having lead the division for much of 1996/97 the Hatters fell away as Bury and Stockport stormed into the automatic promotion places. In the play off semi finals they lost out to Crewe who eventually took the final Division One spot.

Lennie Lawrence (pictured right) was appointed manager of Luton Town in December 1995, following the departure of Terry Westley. His managerial career began at Charlton Athletic in 1982 and in the next nine years they spent four seasons in the top flight. Lennie left in 1991 to join Middlesbrough and then joined Bradford between May 1994 and November 1995. First team coach is **John Moore** who replaced Wayne Turner this week and he is aided by **Trevor Peake**.

Trevor is still registered as a player and holds the record as Luton's oldest player, which he extended when he appeared against Wrexham earlier this season. He began his League career at Lincoln in 1979 before moving onto Coventry in 1983, staying at Highfield Road until 1991 when he signed for Luton.

Twenty one year old keeper **Kelvin Davis** made his League debut for the Hatters at the end of 1993/94 in a 2-2 draw at Stoke. Has been thrust into the first team frame due to an injury to **Ian Feuer**, having been recalled from a loan spell at Hartlepool. Feuer signed for the Hatters from West Ham for a fee which could rise to £580,000 depending on appearances. The 6ft 7inch American arrived at Luton in September, spending three months on loan and ending up with the Player of the Year trophy at the end of



that campaign. Ian suffered a serious shoulder injury in August which lead to the signing of **Andy Dibble**. The much travelled goalkeeper is now in his second spell with the club having signed a short-term contract. The other goalkeeper on the books is **Nathan Abbey** who made his senior debut in the Coca-Cola Cup versus Colchester in August this year.

Defender **Julian James** joined Luton as a trainee and played First Division football at the age of eighteen in 1988. After over 300 appearances in a Hatters shirt, Julian was awarded a benefit last year. He can play in either full back position. **Marvin Johnson** also made his debut in 1988 and quickly established himself as a versatile defender. In

1994/95 Marvin began the campaign at left back but moved into the middle to form a reliable partnership with Trevor Peake. Has played most of his games since then in the centre, alongside the likes of **Steve Davis** and **Darren Patterson**.

Not to be confused with the Steve Davis we had on loan here earlier this season, this centre half joined Luton in 1995, costing £750,000 from Burnley. He began his career at Southampton, but following loan spells at Notts County and the Turf Moor club, moved north for £60,000. Steve now has over 100 outings for Luton under his belt.

Twenty eight year old Darren Patterson was signed in August 1995 for £150,000 from Crystal Palace. Having started his career with Wigan Athletic, Darren moved to Palace for £¼ million in 1992. Won a place in the Northern Ireland squad at the end of 1996/97 but an ankle injury has kept him out at the start of this season.

Left back **Mitchell Thomas** has also had problems with injury having had a hernia operation in August of this year. The former England Under 21 international played for three seasons in his first spell with the Hatters before following David Pleat to Spurs in 1986. He later moved onto West Ham and rejoined Luton in 1993/94. Mitchell broke his nose in the corresponding fixture here last season.

Another left back on the books is former England Youth player **Richard Harvey**. Despite signing in July 1986, injury has restricted Richard to just over 150 starts in a Luton shirt and he was subsequently given a 'free' at the end of last season. He remains on a month to month contract however.

In response to the decimation of his squad through injury, manager Lennie Lawrence has taken two defenders on loan from Premiership clubs. **Gavin McGowan** from Arsenal and **Bryan Small** currently with Bolton have both filled in at full back during the early part of the campaign.

Twenty one year old defender **Alan White** was signed from Middlesbrough for £40,000 in September. Was well known by Lawrence from his time at 'Boro although White never made a first team appearance while at the Riverside or at his previous club Derby County. He made his Luton debut in the Coca-Cola Cup defeat by West Brom.

Described as a defender/midfielder, **Graham Alexander** joined the Hatters in July 1995 from Scunthorpe United. A regular on the right side of the midfield, Graham missed only one of Town's League and Cup games last season, sometimes contributing spectacular goals.

Middlewich born **Simon Davies** joined Luton from Manchester United

over 150 times for the Kenilworth Road club.

Australian born **David Oldfield** returned to the Bedfordshire club six

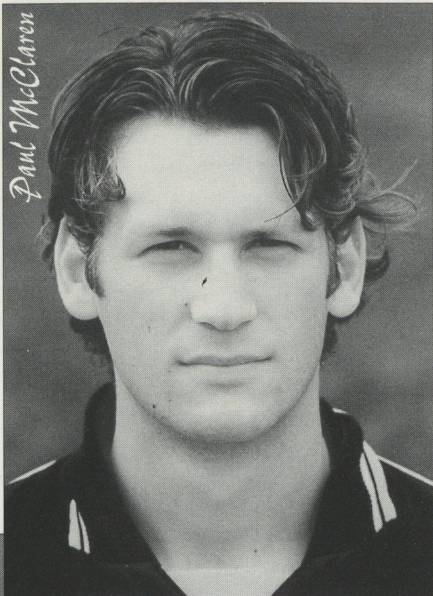
but missed most of the following seasons relegation due to injury. After netting over twenty times in Division One he moved to Sunderland for £800,000 in July 1993. Gray then had spells at Nancy (France) and Fortuna Sittard (Holland), prior to returning to Luton in September 1997. He is a regular member of the Northern Ireland squad.

Dwight Marshall signed in the summer of 1994 from Plymouth for £150,000 after scoring fourteen goals the previous season. Dwight broke his leg in 1996 having been the Hatters' leading scorer in 1995/96. He has played over 100 times for the team, scoring once every four games.

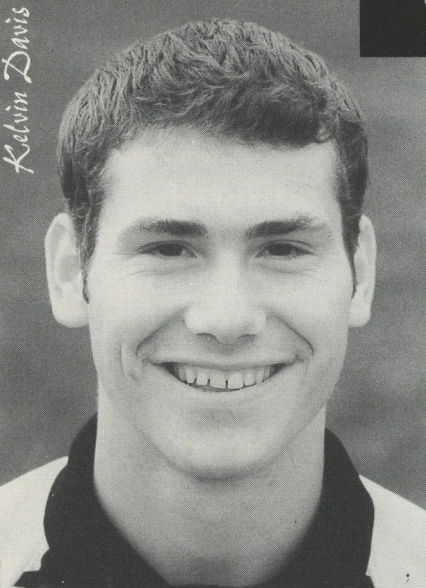
Yet another player to suffer injury problems in the early part of the season is **Paul Showler**, ex of Bradford and Barnet. The little left winger began his career at Goole Town before moving on to Altrincham, and then Barnet, with whom he gained promotion to the Football League. Paul signed for Luton fifteen months ago.

Three other young strikers looking to establish themselves in the first team

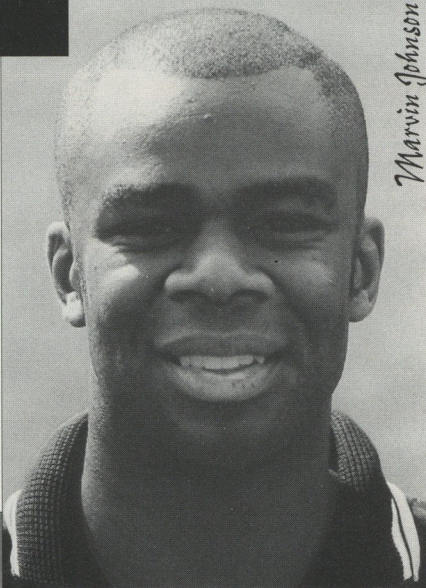

years after leaving Luton. He started his football career with the Hatters, breaking into the first team in 1988. In March 1989, he joined Manchester City for £600,000 and later moved on to Leicester City.

Twenty-three year old **Tony Thorpe** made an immediate impact in the Town side when he scored on his full debut at Newcastle in the FA Cup in January 1994. Last season he scored over thirty goals, the first Luton player to do so since Malcolm McDonald in 1970/71. Likely to be partnering Tony today is £400,000 signing **Phil Gray**. He first joined Luton in 1991

are **Andrew Fotiadis**, **Stuart Douglas** and **Gary Doherty** - who can also play centre half. Gary made his debut a couple of months ago against Millwall, when he came on as substitute.

Fotiadis has had problems with injury at the start of the current season having made an impressive entrance to first team football with three goals in nine League starts last year.

Stuart Douglas has an excellent scoring record in Reserve and Youth team football which earned him his first XI chance. He netted his first goal after forty-one minutes of his debut versus Oldham in November 1995 and also found the mark against Southend in August of this year.

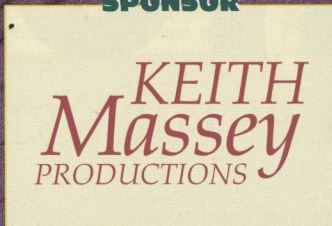

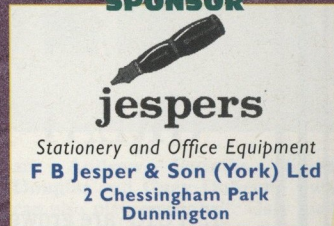
