Enjoy your day at the 'New' Den, John.


### VALENTINES PARTY AT THE DEN

## THE MANAGEMENT

**T**he win here against Wycombe last Saturday obviously gave everyone a bit of a lift before Christmas and I was pleased with a number of aspects of our play, particularly in the second half. We worked hard at keeping a clean sheet and defended much better even though we had one or two little scares, but overall I was happy with the attitude and commitment we showed. Kenny Brown did well as a third centre back in a different system, and I think in the future it might be something I'll do more often and be a bit more flexible in the way we play. Obviously we need the right people in the right areas and we're still a bit unbalanced on the left side. But once

I rectify that situation maybe we'll change things around from game to game to take account of the opposition. Against Wycombe, Lucas Neill showed that he is comfortable on the left and

the cross for the goal with his left foot was a quality one. He's still not quite as sharp as I would like to see him, but I'm hoping that there's a lot more to come.

I was delighted too with Paul Shaw's finish for that goal. I've told him that if he's going to play as a striker he's got to get six or seven goals from around the six yard box as well as the spectacular ones, and I think we're beginning to see what he's capable of now.

This afternoon against Luton, we have to carry on where we left off here last Saturday. I've kept saying that if we're going to do anything this season we've got to win our home matches and having brought that winless sequence at The Den to an end, we now need to get a good run going. We've got to be patient, we've got to keep clean sheets and make sure that we're in a good position to make a challenge going into the New Year. At the time of writing I don't know how we'll have got on down at Bristol on Boxing Day.

That was always going to be a tough game, but whatever happened at Ashton Gate, a win against Luton will probably take us into 1998 in the top six.

Looking back over the last few months, the only real disappointment has been that period before the Wycombe game in which we won just once in eight matches, and clearly we lost a bit of ground during that time. But it's not too late, we're still in a good position and a lot can happen between now and May.

Again, having to write these notes some time before the game and with the Bristol City fixture in between, I can't give you much informative news on the injury front. Paul Wilkinson who was carried off against Wycombe with an ankle knock didn't turn out to be as bad as we thought, and he might even have been fit to play at Bristol. We were also hoping that Alan McLeary might have been OK by Boxing Day, or if not, then certainly by this afternoon. Gerry Docherty's treatment room did look a bit like a scene from Casualty the Monday after Wycombe, but hopefully not too many of the problems were serious ones.

At the beginning of the week I was hopeful of getting someone in on loan before Boxing Day. Michael Black had to go back to Arsenal before the end of his loan period. He needed a cartilage operation and we won't be seeing Mike again, but I've thanked Arsenal for letting us have him.

Finally, as we come to the end of 1997, I'd just like to take this opportunity of wishing everyone a very Happy New Year, and let's hope we can go some way to making 1998 a memorable year for Millwall.

**T**here would surely be no better sight for Lions fans in 1998 than to see a fully fit Keith Stevens back to his best and leading Millwall's assault on the Play-Off positions from the front. There may still be some way to go yet before Rhino is fully charged, but he has certainly overcome some major hurdles already and it would now just appear to be down to some fine tuning.

The last fifteen months for Rhino have been the sort of nightmare which would have any professional sportsman waking up in a cold sweat, beginning with the injury itself, the operations, the lonely battle towards fitness, the unsuccessful comeback attempt and the nagging doubts as to whether he would play again. Now though, Rhino can finally see the light at the end of a very long tunnel.

"It's nice to be back training again with the other lads and not just in that gym on my own. Now I've played a few games the fear that the knee won't stand up is beginning to subside, but to be honest I won't be totally happy until I've played a load more. When I tried to come back the first time I played two Reserve games without any real problems, but in a first team game you have to extend yourself more, and after ten minutes against Bristol City I went for a header and my knee went again. That moment still lives with me, and I can still hear the geezer in the crowd shouting out, "You came back too early." At the time, though, I took the advice of the surgeon and he was happy for me to play again when I did, but unfortunately the knee still wasn't right. Having been through all that once I certainly won't feel that I've made it until I've played regularly in the first team again, always presuming that I can get back in the side.

The problem for me at the moment is that there aren't too many Reserve games over the Christmas period and I need to play as many games as possible. I'm not finding it too difficult combining the coaching side with playing again, although when you have a bad game yourself it's very difficult to criticise others. I'm sure that's something I'll get over once I'm fitter and back playing to the standard I expect of myself. On the playing side, I'm finding it a bit like starting as a small boy all over again having been out for so long. I'm having to re-learn things even at my age which I took for granted when I was playing consistently week in week out, but I know it will all come back to me.

Consistency is the key word all round. It's what I'm trying to achieve myself, it's what the gaffer is looking for from the first team as I am from the Reserves. Now I know that in the Reserves we have different players in and out of the team, but we can consistently work hard, put in 100% in every game, and that's what I expect from them. That clearly wasn't the case against Charlton the other week which is why we were all in training again on our day off."

1997 probably won't live long in the memory of Keith Stevens, but if pure will, determination and hard work have anything to do with it, he'll make damn sure that he enjoys a better 1998.

**L**ike Brentford, Luton Town's achievement in reaching the Play-Off's at the end of last season has hardly been the springboard to greater things this term. Going into the Christmas period The Hatters were still entrenched in the bottom four, a position which has become familiar to them over the past few months. But in manager Lennie Lawrence at least they have a man well versed in plotting successful escapes from the clutches of relegation in his Charlton days.

Whilst Lawrence has come in for heavy criticism from some elements amongst the Luton support who cheered him to the echo when he so nearly took The

Hatters up last May, his job has been made particularly difficult by the catalogue of injuries which have plagued his squad all season. At this level, Clubs like Luton and ourselves cannot afford to carry the strength in depth which might enable some of the bigger boys to shrug off such an injury blight. That said, there are few who could cope when the number of senior players on the treatment table reaches double figures, which has been the problem for Lawrence at times. Fortunately the situation is beginning to ease, and results have begun to show a marked improvement, albeit that like ourselves The Hatters had been suffering a chronic case of home sickness prior to the Festive fixtures.

Still languishing in casualty corner and unlikely to feature today are **Julian James** who damaged knee ligaments at Chesterfield on December 13th, **Marvin**

**Johnson** (knee), **Phil Gray** (back) and **Paul Showler** (hernia). In addition **Dwight Marshall**, who has invariably given The Lions a hard time in recent meetings between the Clubs, has struggled with various niggles and after failing to make an impact this season has been placed on the transfer list.

Luton's regular keeper is American **Ian Feuer** who cost the club a substantial fee from West Ham in December 1995, which could ultimately rise to £580,000. At 6' 7" Feuer is one of the tallest players in the League and won the Player of the Year award at Kenilworth Road in 1995/96 when Luton were relegated from Division One along with ourselves. He is

currently holding onto the number one spot ahead of former England Under 21 international **Kelvin Davis**.

Defender **Darren Patterson** has just recovered from ankle and calf injuries to reclaim his place in the side. The 28 year old Northern Ireland international started his League career with Wigan Athletic before Crystal Palace paid £250,000 for his services in 1992. Patterson moved to Kenilworth Road for an initial £150,000 which could rise to £200,000 based on appearances in August 1995.

At 33 the evergreen **Mitchell Thomas** is still going strong. He originally made his name with Luton for whom he made over 100

## THE BOSS - LENNIE LAWRENCE

**V**astly experienced manager whose playing experience was at non-League level with Croydon, Carshalton and Sutton United. After spells on the coaching staff at Plymouth and Lincoln he became manager of Charlton Athletic in 1982, having initially joined the Addicks as Reserve coach.

He guided Charlton to promotion to the top flight in 1985/96 and then kept them there against the odds for several seasons. Lawrence left Charlton in 1991 for Middlesbrough whom he took into the Premiership in his first season. Relegation followed, however, and Lawrence moved on to Bradford City before joining Luton in December 1995. He was unable to save the club from relegation to Division Two that season, but in his first full campaign in charge he led The Hatters to the Play-Off's where they lost out to Crewe at the semi-final stage.

appearances first time round before following ex-Boss David Pleat to Tottenham in 1986. Thomas played for Spurs in the 1987 FA Cup Final before moving on to West Ham, returning to his home town club in 1994. He underwent a hernia operation just after the start of this season, from which he has now recovered.


Centre back **Steve Davis** suffered consecutive relegations from Division One, with Burnley in 1994/95 and Luton in 95/96. He joined The Hatters in the summer of 1995, and despite that setback in his first season, he has gone on

to become a commanding figure at the heart of the defence and gets his fair share of goals, particularly from set pieces.

21 year old **Alan White** was with Lennie Lawrence as a youngster at Middlesbrough and moved south in September 1997 for an initial £40,000 fee, making his Luton debut in a Coca Cola Cup tie at West Brom. He is likely to partner Davis at the heart of the defence today.

Former Lion **Garry Waddock** is another still defying the ageing process in Luton's midfield at 35. He made an FA Cup Final appearance for his first club QPR back in 1982, but a serious knee injury then appeared to have ended his career. However, he began playing again with Charleroi in Belgium and subsequently moved to Millwall where he was in the side which reached the Play-Off's in 1991. After spells at QPR again and Swindon he moved to Bristol Rovers, from whom he joined Luton on a free transfer in 1994 and has been team captain for the past two seasons.

Probably playing his last game for Luton this afternoon is former Oxford winger **Chris Allen** who completes his loan spell from Nottingham Forest today, unless of course an extension or a more permanent arrangement has been reached in the meantime.

**Paul McLaren** is a local boy, born in High Wycombe who made his debut as a 17 year old against Stoke City at the end of the 1994/95 season. He is just establishing himself as a first team regular this term with the departure of Ceri Hughes to Wimbledon. **Graham Alexander** was former manager Terry Westley's first signing when he paid up to £100,000 to recruit him from Scunthorpe United in July 1995. He has been a consistent performer on the right side of midfield ever since and missed just one game in all competitions last season.

Another face familiar to Millwall fans is that of **David Oldfield** who had a spell on loan at The Den in 1995, before ultimately re-joining Luton from Leicester for a £150,000 fee. Born in Perth, Australia, he won England Under 21 caps in his first spell at Kenilworth Road before Manchester City paid £600,000 for his services in March 1989. He can either play as a target man or in midfield.

Last season **Tony Thorpe** hit a rich vein of scoring form, netting 30 times to become the first Luton player to pass that milestone since Malcolm McDonald back in 1970/71. After a slow start this one club man is beginning to rediscover his goal touch and prior to the Bristol Rovers game had hit 11 so far this term.

Midfielder **Simon Davies** arrived at Kenilworth Road from Manchester United last summer after making 11 League appearances at Old Trafford. He gained European experience with United, scoring in a 4-0 European Cup triumph against Galatasaray in December 1994.

20 year old **Andrew Fotiadis** looks a very promising local product. Born in Hitchin, he won schoolboy caps at Under 15 and Under 18 level for England and signed for Luton in the summer of 1996 after completing his A levels. Another young

striker vying for a first team spot is **Stuart Douglas** who scored after just 41 minutes of his debut against Oldham in November 1995. Like Fotiadis, he has had his injury problems at the start of this season.

As we bid farewell to 1997, there won't be too many Lions fans who will shed a tear for the passing of the year at midnight on Wednesday. It certainly has been one of the more traumatic twelve months in the Millwall's recent history with the Club's very existence in doubt until the middle of May. There have consequently been a few changes around the place, not least a new chairman in Theo Paphitis and a new Board of Directors steering the Club, let us hope, towards calmer waters and a more profitable New Year both on and off the field.

1997 saw three managers in office at The Den, starting with Jimmy Nicholl who departed with his backroom staff in February as the administrators took action in an attempt to arrest a slide on the field after four successive defeats had seen The Lions slump to tenth in Division Two. Former Boss John Docherty then took the helm with David Kemp as his coach and their first five games produced four wins and a draw. There were no victories in the subsequent eleven outings, however, and Docherty resigned on the eve of the final game at Bury.

Having gained control of the Club, the new chairman appointed Billy Bonds as manager, and Bill set about rebuilding the squad. Prior to Christmas ten new faces had been recruited and a number of the old guard had moved on. The win over Wycombe just prior to the Festive season ended a run of six home games without a victory which had threatened to jeopardise an otherwise satisfactory first half to season 1997/98 and saw The Lions in fourth spot, ironically the same position in which they began the year. In spite of the incredible form of Watford and Bristol City, runaway leaders of Division Two, Millwall fans can look forward to 1998 with a realistic hope that Bonzo's boys will be in the Play-Off frame at least come May.

## CLUBCALL TRIBUTES

It would seem appropriate to acknowledge the contributions of certain individuals at the end of a difficult year. Firstly to **Theo Paphitis** who stepped in with a rescue package to keep the Club afloat when other supposedly interested parties appeared to have vanished. 



Alternatively, they may do so in writing or by phone to either Colin Sayer or Kenneth Chapman at the Club. The matter will then be investigated, always ensuring the strictest confidence.



### WOODWARD USES HEAD TO BEAT LUTON

Luton 1 Millwall 2

Saturday 20th March 1948

Luton's recent home displays have not been calculated to cheer their supporters but they reached a new low against Millwall. Their reorganised forward line was an abject failure.

Millwall, fighting grimly to retain Second Division status, had fewer opportunities, but made more of them. Mansfield gave them the lead after 32 minutes and Millwall held on grimly to this until 70 minutes from the end, when Daniels equalised after sustained pressure.

Luton then looked likely winners, but a Woodward header from a corner ten minutes from time finished them.

# THEIRS & OURS

A look back at the players who have assisted both Millwall and Luton down the years...

Today's installment of 'Theirs and Ours' pitches us against our old friends and adversaries Luton Town. Our first match against them in any form goes way back to season 1888/89.

The clubs are quite close geographically and this reflects the fact that over forty players have served both teams down the years. Where better to start than in the current season, with **Kim Grant** (bottom of page) who came in August, initially on loan. Kim's fellow striker here at The Den **Paul Wilkinson** played three matches on loan for The Hatters in 1996. **David Oldfield**, currently in his second spell at Luton had a 17 game loan period here in season 1994/5. Midfielder **Gary Waddock** who has 21 caps for Ireland, came to The Den in 1989, and since signing for Luton, he has continued to give them sterling service over a number of seasons.

**Peter Anderson**, who became Millwall's player/manager in December 1980 had earlier in his career been sold to a Belgian club to alleviate a financial problem at Luton. It was Anderson who brought Bermondsey Boy **Trevor Aylott** back to the manor in close season 1982, but seven months later he was on his way to Kenilworth Road, Trevor made 32 appearances for both clubs. Goalkeeper **Jim Standen** whose best days between the sticks were for West Ham where he won European and F.A. Cup winners medals. He kept goal for Luton on 36 occasions in the early sixties and joined Millwall in October 1968 after a spell in the U.S.A. with Detroit. **Frank Morrison** and **Billy Stewart** were a pair of Scottish centre-halves who both gave excellent service to the clubs in the late Victorian era. **Alan Garner** was a splendid prospect at half-back, but was unfortunate that the likes of Kitchener, Dorney and Burnett were around at the time. Alan was allowed to leave The Den in the summer of 1971, and went on to play in over 300 League matches for Luton,

Watford and Portsmouth. Another player to emerge in the late seventies was the late **Billy Holmes** who may have created some sort of record by making one sub appearance for either club.

**Paul Holsgrove** is a midfielder player who looked the part but never, for one reason or another, fulfilled his potential.

When Millwall's manager, Gordon Jago cast his eye upon Luton in his search for skilful players, signed **John Seaman** and **Brian Chambers** in 1976 and 1977 respectively. Luton born players to feature are Northern Ireland international **Kingsley Black**, who was on loan at The Den a couple of seasons ago and former Luton apprentice **Robin Wainwright** who never managed to hold down a regular place at either club. A different kettle of fish was **Alan Slough** who joined Millwall at a difficult time, but had given his local club immense service from 1965 to 1972. The one who did make an impact at The Den was **Bert Moody** who was around forty years of age when he retired in 1920. Commencing his career with Luton Town in 1901, he joined Leicester Fosse (now

City) in 1905 and stayed for two seasons. He rejoined The Hatters for another five years in which time he represented the Southern League against the Football, Scottish and Irish Leagues. Coming to Millwall in 1912, he completed 116 League and Cup matches up until the outbreak of the First World War. He appeared once more for the Southern League in 1915 and in Millwall's last season in the Southern League (1919/20) Bert recorded another seven appearances before hanging up his boots. His total goals for Millwall was 35. Some of Moody's team-mates around this period were goalkeeper **Henry Bailey**, inside forward

**George Porter** (killed during the war), **Tommy Quinn** and winger **Ernie Brown**.

Other players associated with both clubs in the seasons leading up to the First

World War were outside rights **Norman Brown** and Deptford born **Teddy Bassett** (a Football League Division Two champion with Notts County in 1914.) Along with them were inside rights **Bobby Walker** and **Arthur Wileman** and left winger **Joe Johnson**. Moving on to the 1920's and 30's, we meet up with centre forward **Jimmy Thompson**, full back

**Arthur Clement**, whose second and last game for Millwall was a 5-4 victory at Notts County, and 'keeper **George Harford** who had a very good spell at Luton. The forwards who wore the jersey for both clubs at this time were **Alf Black**, **Jimmy Corkindale** and Scotsman **Jimmy Yardley**, whose Luton career saw him score 76 goals in 172 matches. Two latter day centre forwards who had seen better days before they arrived at The Den were Welsh international **Ron Davies** who came in 1975 and his English counterpart **Kerry Dixon** who arrived some twenty years later. A couple of other strikers to mention are **Jimmy Jinks** who played nine games for Luton and **Joe Payne**, who never played in Millwall's first team after signing in September 1947, but is famous for scoring ten goals in a match for Luton against Bristol Rovers in 1936.

**George Stobbart** joined Millwall from Luton in August 1952, and went on to score 27 goals in 68 matches, a better return than his Luton one, 30 in 107. Former Fulham junior **Michael Brown** failed to make much impression at Kenilworth Road after starting 47 games for The Lions in the mid 1960's. Midfield general **Alan West** was another Peter Anderson import, signing for us in 1981 from Luton where he was a mainstay in over 270 appearances. Alan is now a

man of the cloth.

Finally there is **John Smith** (now there's a rarity) who scored 18 goals in 39 games for Luton and who joined Millwall from them in March 1911.





Steve Lovell was my guest along with his two teenage sons for the home game against Walsall, and like so many times, this season, The Lions failed to impress, here's what Steve had to say,

"The best team won on the night and I think the die hard Millwall supporters would agree with me. I think only one player stood out for Millwall and that was Paul Shaw, he created a lot of things out there tonight, tried a few shots and looked quite good but I'd have to give my Man of the Match award to Walsall's number eleven John Hodge who for me was excellent! That's why Walsall won, because basically they had width and Millwall didn't!"

I asked Steve if he thought Millwall could go up this season? and he replied "Not on tonight's showing, if anything I'd say Walsall could". He went on to say that Millwall are lacking confidence, and wondered if Billy Bonds had ever been up to the Press Box, to watch a game as he would get a much better idea of how the team were doing from a higher view.

Is this your first visit to the New Den? "No, I've actually been, and watched a few reserve games here and I must say it's a lovely stadium. But you can't beat the Old Den, you had four and a half

thousand, tonight, and it was silent, but four and a half thousand at the Old Place would be noisy and the opposing team would know it"!!

#### Your message to the team

"Get me as manager!! No seriously I'd say get more crosses in, because what's the point in having Wilkinson up front if you don't use him".

#### What are you doing now?

"I'm still playing football for Tonbridge, after being released by Gravesend and I'm also a second hand car dealer with (excuse the plug) the Hempstead Motor Company"

#### Do you still keep in touch with your old team-mates?

"Yes, there's Paul Sansome who lives in the same road as me and I also see Paul Hindshelwood and Alan Walker and Brian Horne who was here tonight, and has just signed for Farnborough".

#### Best goal scored for Millwall?

"I remember scoring against Chelsea once, I think we won 2 or 3-1 and I out jumped big Doug Rougvie and McLoughlin to head into the far corner of the net. There's also a volley I scored up at Portsmouth with a 20 yarder, but I particularly liked the headed goal I scored against Crystal Palace at their place in the F.A. Cup. They have the right attitude in the past alot of the Managers were negative but with Glenn Hoddle you can see that he's a lot more positive. I'd say the mixture in his team is just right, so yes they have a great chance.



**F**or most clubs in each of the three Nationwide Divisions, hopes of promotion or fears of relegation are still apparent even halfway through the season.

# FROM TOP TO BOTTOM

## AROUND THE LEAGUE WITH DENNIS TURNER

Since over one third of the clubs will eventually be involved in promotion, the play-offs, relegation or demotion from the League, everyone will have something to play for until the final weeks of the season. To see whether stepping up a Division should hold any fears for promoted clubs, or whether relegated clubs find life at a lower level any easier, it is interesting to check on the progress so far this season of the clubs that changed status last May.

On the basis of the evidence of the last few months of 1997 there is clearly a big gap between the First Division and the Premiership. Bolton and Barnsley, the two clubs promoted automatically last year have struggled most of this campaign. The Tykes, who seem unable to hold on to a lead (it happened again a fortnight ago at home to Newcastle), went into Christmas in the anchor position, whilst Bolton, the lowest scorers in the top flight (in only two matches have they managed to score more than one goal), are hovering on the fringes of the relegation zone.

The third promoted side, Crystal Palace, have the best away record in the top flight but are still awaiting their first win at Selhurst Park (Liverpool were the latest club to enjoy Palace's hospitality in the South London). Unless they can change this in the New Year, they could be joining the other two in the danger area.

There is a similar story in Division One with two of the three clubs promoted from the Second six months ago, now in the bottom six. Bury, champions last May and promoted twice in twelve months, have slumped alarmingly after a promising start. So far this month The Shakers

have lost at Huddersfield and Bradford (to a John McGinlay goal) and at home to Middlesbrough without scoring. Crewe, on the other hand, took time to adjust but are slowly gathering points. A 2-0 win at Stoke last weekend was as welcome as it was unexpected, but only one team has a worse defensive record in the Division than Dario Gradi's men. Stockport have made the best beginning, just two points off the play-offs and manager Don Megson was November's Divisional Manager of the Month. A pretty good record considering they lost several key players in the summer when previous manager David Jones went to Southampton.

Looking at the top of the tables it seems as if last year's relegated Premier sides are regrouping successfully after the disappointment of relegation. The top two places at the time of writing are currently occupied by Middlesbrough and Nottingham Forest. Boro' with wins over Bury, West Brom and Reading and a draw at Ipswich (who only equalised with the last kick of the game) in the last three weeks have opened up a three point lead at the top. Forest, who have been front-runners for most of the season, dropped five points in recent days against Bradford and Wolves, but they are good value for second place. Sunderland are starting to get it together with three straight wins over Tranmere, Q.P.R., and West Brom and they have edged into the play-off zone.

A cursory glance at the lower reaches of the Second Division suggests that there is a gap with Division Three. Carlisle, whose last stay at this level lasted just 46 games, are again looking up at the other 23 clubs. They managed a rare home win against

last season's promotion rivals Fulham, but having sacked manager Mervyn Day and lost midfield stars Hayward and Aspinall, the Cumbrian side could be in for a re-run of 1995/96. Wigan are at last starting to show the sort of form that won them the Division Three title last May, and recent wins over Bristol Rovers and Burnley have lifted them into 18<sup>th</sup> place, but they need to be far more consistent.

Fulham's money has not yet been turned into points and Northampton of the promoted clubs have made the biggest impact at the higher level, with a regular place in the top six. Of the relegated newboys in Division Two, Oldham have made the best showing, but have to do much better away from Boundary Park if they are going to bounce straight back. A mere seven points out of a possible 33 is not promotion form.


After a dreadful start, Grimsby are in a respectable mid table position but Southend could be looking at a second relegation in 12 months unless part two of the season is significantly better than part one.

Notts County and Peterborough, two clubs who were in Division Two last year, have occupied the top positions in Division Three for much of 1997/98. Rotherham are showing signs of life after a particularly impressive November which won Ronnie Moore the Manager of the Month nomination.

They still have a lot of ground to make up if they are to join the leaders, but not as much as the fourth relegated side, Shrewsbury.

They have spent the months since August in the bottom third of the table and, to be kind, this might be a season of consolidation.

A few years ago there appeared

accept that time was running out.  
Instead he set us new targets and  
1997 has probably seen more new  
initiatives than any other. As an  
example we not only took Reading  
Is Fundamental on board as a  
pilot, but later expanded it to a  
year round project with Greenvale,  
Tower Bridge and Kender Primary  
Schools. We've also expanded the  
number of holiday courses, after  
school clubs and girls only  
sessions.

None of this would have been  
possible without the continued  
support of Millwall FC and in  
particular the enthusiasm shown by  
Theo Paphitis as chairman. He  
approached us on taking control of  
the club to state his intentions for  
expanding the Community  
Scheme, not reducing it. To all the  
community staff that was a great  
relief and possibly the realisation  
that we were dealing with someone  
who understood the meaning of  
'looking for that opportunity'.  
**And long may it  
continue.**

## GROSS MISCONDUCT FOR SPURS?

**P**remiership side Tottenham Hotspur are likely to have a very distressing Christmas period. After recently dispensing with the services of Gerry Francis as manager, Tottenham were quick to appoint Swiss coach Christian Gross from Grasshoppers Zurich. This has stunned many Tottenham fans. They expected a big name to take Tottenham away from the relegation zone, like perhaps Terry Venables! (Although, I think it's fair to say that whilst Sugar is Chairman of Tottenham Hotspur FC, Venables will never have any involvement with the club).

All this unrest seems to be having a detrimental effect on the team as well. Constant rumours of players wanting away circulate the tabloids daily. Stories doing the rounds at the moment include a possible £10 million player-exchange deal involving Sol Campbell to Liverpool, and a cash plus recently

signed David Ginola deal with Southampton's Matt Le Tissier. As of yet, none of these stories have yet to show signs of any substance. It may well also be fair to say that Gross brings with him some rather strict training and diet schedules that many players are having difficulty to adapt with. Results have deteriorated since the new coach's arrival, including defeats by Crystal Palace and a 4-0 hammering away to Coventry. At the time of going to press, Tottenham lie deep in the relegation zone and could well fall victims to their own impatience come the end of the season. Arsenal are scheduled to travel to White Hart Lane this afternoon, and I'm sure that despite some of the problems they themselves have, Gunners fans are probably laughing at every moment of Spurs' demise.

## MEANWHILE, BACK IN THE USSR...

**R**ussia's failure to qualify for the World Cup Finals, for the first time in 20 years, has sparked outrage amongst supporters. National Coach Boris Ignatiev has come under severe criticism from not only from the country's vice-president Victor Chernomyrdin, but also from the President himself, Boris Yeltsin. Chernomyrdin stated after the Italy play-off result "An intelligent coach must resign in a situation like this." He also made a point of outlining some of the mistakes that Ignatiev had made.

One of those mentioned involved former Millwall striker Sergei Yuran. Yuran was recalled to the national squad after vowing never to play for his country again. He turned up for training looking heavily overweight and certainly nowhere near 100% match fit, but still started in the match against Italy in Moscow.

The Russian Football Federation have given the former Spartak Moscow coach their full backing. However at the time of going to press, there was a committee meeting to due to take place on the 23rd December to confirm the future of their national coach.

Will Yeltsin and the Kremlin pressure the Russian Football Federation into sacking Ignatiev? Only time will tell, but I wouldn't go rubbing it in if I was Tony Blair next time they meet!



It's never any fun to be beaten by your local rivals but a humiliation at home to Charlton is always a bitter pill to swallow and after this display Billy Bonds and Keith Stevens had all those on duty back for extra training the following day.

Millwall, with Danish triallist Martin Nielsen in midfield, started brightly enough and after 7 minutes Nielsen sent Graham Robertson clear but Charlton keeper Ilic denied the Scot an opening goal. Instead The Lions found themselves behind a minute later when Kevin Lisbie, who looked suspiciously offside, beat David Nurse with ease. It was 2-0 before the quarter hour after Lisbie worked his way down the left before feeding Bradley Allen who provided the finish.

Lucas Neill was involved in most of Millwall's more promising moments in the first half, providing a cross which Danny Hockton headed just over on 22 minutes and then getting on the end of one from Paul Allen which was saved. Neill and Hockton then both went close again before Charlton added a controversial third to their tally when David Nurse pushed Bradley Allen's shot onto a post and appeared to grab the ball before it crossed the line. The Referee's Assistant, however, saw the situation differently and awarded a goal.

In the second half, The Lions gave little indication that there was any way back into the game, and indeed Dave Nurse made a brilliant one handed stop from Kevin Lisbie before the same player netted his second and Charlton's fourth on 69 minutes. To cap a miserable afternoon for Rhino, he was harshly sent off two minutes from time for a rather innocuous looking push which referee Hill deemed to be his second bookable offence after he had shown him a yellow card earlier in the half.

## HALF TERM REPORT

In fact ten of the squad, namely goalkeeper Phil Smith, Phil Eagle, Stephen Reid, Paul Ifill, Robert Davies, Leke Odunsi, Danny Edwards, Ronnie Bull, Lee Holsgrove and Tim Cahill are all making regular appearances in the Reserve side, Reid and Davies already having notched up their first goals at that level.

All things considered there have been some very encouraging and entertaining performances full of endeavour and application so far this term and there appears to be much to look forward to in the New Year.
