

From the manager's chair

OUR last two away games have seen contrasting results but similarly committed performances, resulting in three points which has maintained our good away record but left a slight feeling of disappointment as a result at Preston could have pulled us a little way clear of the relegation zone.

At Plymouth we gave a solid, professional performance. After a first-half played against a very strong wind, we gained a slightly fortuitous 2-0 victory in the second-half, but it was certainly a game we were always going to draw at the very least.

Tuesday's game against Preston was played on a vastly different surface, and indeed as heavier a surface as we have played on for a long time.

Once again the spirit and commitment of the players was excellent, but unfortunately a piece of sloppy defending from a corner allowed Preston to scramble a goal, and then sit on their lead until the final whistle.

Despite a number of scares in their goalmouth we were unable to gain an equaliser.

It was particularly disappointing as Preston's first-half performance had not caused us any problems whatsoever, and we dominated up until half-time, only lacking a goal.

But Preston's crowd came to their rescue in the second half, and together with a more physical approach they managed to win, despite only winning their first corner after at least an hour.

Had we drawn both at Plymouth and Preston, we would have been one point worse off, but another opportunity has been missed to

pull away from the relegation pack.

This afternoon we welcome the players, supporters and officials of Wycombe Wanderers, who have seen a recent change of management following John Gregory's departure to Aston Villa.

Neil Smillie has stepped in, and under his charge they have gained two home wins to pull them clear of any relegation worries.

For us a home win and three points is totally essential today.

Our last two home games have been drawn - against Bristol City, when we could have won or lost - and against Wigan when we definitely had enough chances to win.

Our defending has been steady, conceding few goals, but we need to develop a cutting edge to our play today, and in the remaining home games.

Everyone in the team needs to take part of the responsibility for scoring goals.

On now to two recent departures - both of whom will be missed.

The sale of Tony Thorpe was necessitated at this time by the financial situation at the club.

Once we had obtained what I felt to be an offer equivalent to the true value of the player in the current market, then there was no other decision to make.

Talk of waiting for a two million pound offer from a struggling Premiership club seems far-fetched to me, as there had not been any interest from a Premiership club and nobody has moved from this division for a fee in excess of what we received for Tony.

That may change in the future, and obviously we would have preferred to have sold nearer the deadline or at the end of the season.

But the offer from Fulham would certainly have been withdrawn in days, so circumstances conspired to hasten his departure.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Tony for his services to the club, and to wish him well for the future.

I hope he can continue his goalscoring exploits at Fulham, both in this division and at a higher level.

I would also like to take this opportunity to wish Trevor Peake well on his departure to take up a coaching position at Coventry, which although again untimely was too good an offer to turn down, especially from a club he served so well as a player.

He will be sorely missed, and is greatly liked and respected by myself and the players.

I'm sure he will progress quickly in football management, and once again we wish him



every success for the future.

In the meantime, John Moore will work with me with the first team until the end of the season, and we hope to bring someone in to work with the reserve and youth sides.

Finally, we all saw at first hand what a vocal and passionate

home crowd could do for a team at Preston, despite an indifferent first-half performance against us on Tuesday.

It would be a great help for us if you could offer the same sort of support this afternoon, and help us to three home points.

Night of surprise as top 3 slip

THE top three sides going into Tuesday night's programme of Division Two matches all slipped up at home, with Watford and Northampton beaten, whilst Bristol City were held by struggling Brentford at Ashton Gate.

Leaders Watford went down 2-1 to Walsall, despite a second goal in as many matches from Gifton Noel-Williams.

Northampton lost 1-0 at home to Wrexham, as the Welsh side strengthened their play-off claims and buried the jinx usually associated with winning the Manager-of-the-Month Award - the February prize having just gone to Brian Flynn.

Dean Spink scored the only goal of the game after 39 minutes.

Fulham were able to at last take advantage with a 1-0 home win over fellow play-off hopefuls Bristol Rovers.

Tony Thorpe netted his first for the Londoners, and his 20th in all for the season following his move from Luton.

The Hatters meanwhile went down 1-0 at Preston, despite having much the better of the first-half when David Oldfield, Mitchell Thomas and Phil Gray all went close to breaking the deadlock.

Preston stepped up a gear after the break, and Ryan Kidd put them in front on 64 minutes after a corner was cleared to him on the edge of the penalty area.

Luton forced six corners in the closing

minutes but could find no way through, as Finnish keeper Teuvo Moilanen earned North End their second win under caretaker boss David Moyes.

Bournemouth and Plymouth shared six goals at Dean Court in a 3-3 draw, with Steve Fletcher and Carlo Corazzin both scoring late on to keep the sides level.

Brentford's point in the 2-2 draw at Bristol City came from a Kevin Rapley goal with 11 minutes to play.

Earlier, City had gone 2-1 in front when Glen Cockerill put through his own net.

Carlisle continued their good run with

a 1-0 home win over Millwall, with Ade Akinbiyi netting the winner for Gillingham in the 2-1 home victory over Oldham.

Grismy and Chesterfield drew 0-0, and Keith Ryan scored Wycombe's winner for the second game in a row as they beat York 1-0 at Adams Park.

The games between Burnley and Blackpool, and Wigan and Southend, were postponed due to heavy rain which threatened Luton's match at Deepdale.





Sweet first victory for caretaker boss Smillie

WYCOMBE'S new caretaker-manager Neil Smillie enjoyed the sweet taste of success against Division Two form side Gillingham.

Midfielder Keith Ryan's 29th-minute header from David Carroll's sweetly-hit cross sunk the Gills, and with it ended their superb eight-match unbeaten run that's seen impressive victories at both Watford and Bristol City.

The Kent side opened as though they were going to swamp Wycombe, their leading scorer Ade Akinbiyi causing great concern for the home defence with his powerful, purposeful runs.

And after such a difficult week for Wycombe that saw both manager John Gregory and his assistant

Richard Hill leave, they were always going to be unsteady.

But, driven on by David Carroll and Steve McGavin's midfield work and Keith Scott's strength, they weathered all the pressure from Gillingham.

Smillie, who stepped in after John Gregory took over at Aston Villa, stressed: "The boys were fantastic."

"They were unsettled by John's departure, but they responded well."

Smillie admitted he would be happy to stay in charge at Adams Park. He said: "I'm ambitious, but it's the chairman's decision."

BRIAN PARKIN (Goalkeeper) Born 12/10/65, Birkenhead. Joined from Bristol Rovers on a free transfer in the closed season. Played 437 League and Cup games for Crystal Palace, Crewe and Bristol Rovers. Brian's contract is until the end of the 1997/98 season.

JASON COUSINS (Defender) Born 4/10/70, Hayes. A summer 1991 signing from Brentford where he spent four seasons making a total of 28 appearances. Scored the first goal in the 1993 FA Trophy Final and was included in the 1992-93 Conference Team of the Year and the 1993-94 PFA Division Three Team of the Year. Voted Supporters' Player of the Year in 1994, Jason has made 145 League appearances for the Club.

DAVE CARROLL (Midfielder) Born 20/9/66, Paisley. Signed in the summer of 1988 from Ruislip Manor following a short loan spell the previous season. Started out as a Fulham youth player before joining Wembley FC. Has represented England youth (3 caps), the FA and was a FA Trophy winner in 1991 and 1993. We were aiming for an automatic promotion place, whilst the






ABOVE: Paul McLaren, playing in his home town, is tripped as he takes on the Wycombe defence.





Record-breaker Peake rejoins the Sky Blues

LUTON coach Trevor Peake has left the club to join the backroom staff at his old club Coventry.

Trevor Peake, the oldest league player in the Hatters' history when he played at the age of 40 years and 221 days earlier this season, joined from Coventry seven years ago.

"I have enjoyed my time at Luton, and I'm sorry to be leaving in some ways, but this was an opportunity open for a limited time, and I have a strong feeling for Coventry," he said.

Town manager Lennie Lawrence commented: "Coventry made the approach quite properly, and although Trevor is still under contract with us I felt it would not be fair to stand in his way when he has the chance to join a Premiership club. He has been terrific for us and he is a diamond of a man."

Trevor started his league career at Lincoln City in 1979, before moving on to Coventry City in 1983. He enjoyed eight full seasons at Highfield Road, winning an FA Cup winners' medal in 1987 as the Sky Blues beat David Pleat's Tottenham 3-2 at Wembley.


Trevor was then signed by David Pleat, joining Luton for £100,000 in August 1991, and was appointed club captain.

He signed a new one-year contract in the summer of 1994, and for the first time in his career he maintained an ever-present record throughout the season, being voted the Supporters' Club Player of the Year; signed a further one-year deal in the summer of 1995, and was appointed reserve team coach during the 95/96 season. He beat his own record as Luton's oldest ever player, when he came on as a substitute against Wrexham in September 1997, and assumed a greater role in first-team affairs following Wayne Turner's departure at Christmas.

I'm sure all Luton supporters would wish to join me in wishing Trevor every success at Highfield Road, thanking him for his efforts both on and off the field at Kenilworth Road. - SO.



ALAN WHITE is improving following a recurrence of his knee injury which he suffered against Wigan.


He missed the matches at Plymouth and Preston, but has been better this week. At the time of writing it is difficult to say whether he will figure at the weekend.

Thorpe leaves Hatters

TONY Thorpe has left Luton, joining Fulham for £800,000 - a fee which could reach the million-pound mark depending on appearances and whether the Londoners win promotion.

Tony made an immediate impact in the Town side when he scored for the Hatters on his full debut at Newcastle United, in the fourth round of the FA Cup in January 1994. Newcastle were then managed by Kevin Keegan, who has obviously kept tabs on the striker before signing him for Fulham.

He joined the club at the start of the 1992/93 season, following a spell at Leicester. He was restricted to just five substitute appearances during the 1994/95 campaign, but scored Luton's winning goal at Southend in August 1995 - the Hatters' first win of the season, and their first under Terry Westley.

He signed a new contract in the summer of 1996, and went on to enjoy a record-breaking season, becoming the first Luton player since Malcolm MacDonald in 1970/71 to reach 30 goals.


Martin's moan after Jones gets red carded at City

He said: "Six points in two games shows you can sell £3 million-worth of talent and still keep performing."


Knighton has been stung by criticism after the big-money transfers of Matt Jansen and Rory Delap.



Those were the days!

BORN in Greet's Green, Birmingham in October 1908 Fred Roberts played his early football for Smethwick Highfield and Piggotts Works while at the same time trying hard to obtain a professional contract.

Trials at Wolverhampton, Stoke, Brighton, Cardiff and two at Birmingham came to nothing and so it was back, disappointingly, to works football.

Fred took up the story while writing for a local newspaper several years later: "Out of the blue Birmingham suddenly came back for me and offered me professional terms and within three weeks of signing I was in the first team.


"My first match was in October 1933 against Wolves at St Andrews when I played centre forward against my future playing colleague at Luton, Jack Nelson, who was operating at centre half for the Wolves."

Fred did not score in this game but opened his account in a 1-1 draw at Stoke the following week. In all Fred made 30 appearances for the Blues that season in the old Division One finishing as top scorer with eight goals.

"I played my first few games at centre forward but was then moved over to inside left for a game at Portsmouth where it was felt that Pompey's big centre half, Jim Allen, would have the beating of me in the air. From then on I played at inside forward apart from one memorable game at Liverpool where I had to go in goal.

"Our England International goalkeeper, Harry Hibbs, was injured during the game and conceded two soft goals that he would normally have saved with his eyes shut. He was taken off and I was asked to take his place.

"The weather was lousy, mud was oozing over my boots and my jersey was several sizes too big. Much to the amusement of the crowd someone on the Kop

took pity on me and an umbrella came whistling past my ear and landed on the pitch. Although I made a few saves I did let in two further goals but left to a standing ovation."

At the end of that season Birmingham felt that Fred was more suited to half back but as the Blues had a strong middle line at the time it was back to a period of reserve team football.

Fred was obviously unhappy and made his feelings known with the result that both the Town and Norwich made enquiries for him. "Luton manager Harold Wightman was more persuasive and I moved to Kenilworth Road in December 1934 and went straight in to the first team as an inside forward, making my debut in a 4-1 win at Millwall where I was lucky enough to get on the scoresheet.

"We scored four goals in each of my first three games and the crowd soon forgot that I was taking the shirt of one of their favourites, Andy Rennie.

"Soon after joining Luton I was involved in an incredible game which will always stick in my mind.

"We were 3-0 down at Southend when our defender Tom Mackey was sent off. We rolled up our sleeves, however, and pulled all three goals back and would have won but for the ball sticking on the goal line in the final minute."

From then until the outbreak of War, Fred was virtually ever present in a side that won the Third Division South championship in 1937 and then took the old Division Two by storm.

He reverted to wing half in 1938/39, handing his forward line position to Eddy Connelly, but took on the captaincy of the side that almost won promotion to Division One.

"It came as a surprise to be handed the captaincy but I enjoyed the responsibility and I also soon warmed to a position at half back where I was facing

the play all the time rather than constantly twisting and turning up front. We had a tremendous team during my time at Kenilworth Road and we all fought for each other and never knew when we were beaten.

"When I am asked as to my best goal I always remember the one I scored at West Ham in the F.A.Cup in 1936.

"Winger George Stephenson put over a cross which I ran on to and hit first time with my left foot from 25 yards just as I was tackled by Jim Barrett. Luckily he was a fraction late as the ball fairly whistled in to the net. We drew that game 2-2 and won the replay at Kenilworth Road."

The War put an end to Fred's top level career and

after the hostilities had finished he played a couple of seasons at Kettering before hanging up his boots.

He was not, however, finished with the club as he carried out some scouting duties for the Town and was instrumental in bringing Syd Owen to Kenilworth Road when it was discovered he was surplus to requirements at Birmingham. Another signing attributed to Fred was Jim Pemberton who was spotted playing for Stourbridge.

Fred finished his working life as a courier at Luton College of Technology and sadly passed away in 1979 swearing to the end that Joe Payne did score all ten goals against Bristol Rovers in 1936!

5 YEARS AGO

6/3/93: After a run of eight games without defeat, the Town went down 2-1 at Portsmouth. Phil Gray scored the Luton goal in front of a crowd of 10,457.

10 YEARS AGO

5/3/88: In only our fourth league game since early January, we lost 2-0 to Wimbledon at Plough Lane. Making his Town debut that day was Marvin Johnson.

15 YEARS AGO

5/3/83: League leaders Liverpool visited Kenilworth Road and returned to Merseyside with all three points following a 3-1 win - their fifth victory in a row. Brian Stein was the sole Luton marksman in front of a crowd of 18,434.

20 YEARS AGO

4/3/78: After a run of seven games without a victory it was back to winning ways with Cardiff being seen off at Kenilworth Road. Phil Boersma, with two, and Bob Hatton were on target in the 3-1 win.

THE Football League will renew old acquaintances with the Italian League on Tuesday in a representative match which will be played at Charlton's The Valley ground.

The game, the latest in a series of fixtures at this level, will feature Under 21 players from the Nationwide League and Italian league Serie B.

Charlton boss Alan Curbishley has agreed to take charge of the Football League representative side for the match on March 10.

Following discussions with England coach Glenn Hoddle, it has been decided to continue the same approach as in the previous three representative fixtures between the two leagues, in order to identify and provide international experience for young English players qualified to play for their country.

The two representative sides last met in February 1997 where they fought out a 1-1 draw in Genoa.

Luton keeper Kelvin Davis was in that squad, and in a previous Anglo-Italian

encounter in 1994 the League XI was managed by the then Hatters manager David Pleat.

Goalkeeper Andy Dibble, who had a short spell back at Kenilworth Road earlier this season, returned to league action on Sunday when he was called up by Middlesbrough for their top-of-the-table Division One clash at Nottingham Forest.

Dibble was called in after a thigh injury ruled out Boro's regular number one Mark Schwarzer. It wasn't a happy afternoon for the hero of Luton's 1988 Littlewoods Cup Final win, as Forest won 4-0!

Striker Graeme Tomlinson, who was on loan at Luton two years ago, is currently on trial at Burnley.

Tomlinson, came here from Manchester United but the loan spell ended when he broke his leg at Port Vale, and he has continued to suffer from injury at Old Trafford.

Following his success with the Vicarage Road club, the former England manager has now won more monthly managerial awards than any other boss in the history of the professional game.


Taylor has now been awarded 26 managerial accolades





LTFC EVACUATION PROCEDURE


IN the event of any emergencies at Luton Town Football Club, the emergency services and the club have agreed on an evacuation policy which is designed to:


