# THE FIRST Word.....

**G**ood evening and welcome to Dean Court for tonight's visit of Luton Town. Luton have been in a similar financial situation to what we were and myself and everyone in football is delighted that they have come through. I believe like ourselves that they will have found strength in their adversity and that is a major factor as to why they have had a good start to the season. I'd like to welcome their Manager Lennie Lawrence who who has done an excellent job at Kenilworth Road through all their difficult times.

## TERRIFIC RESULTS

Matches between ourselves and Luton tend to be entertaining affairs and I can't see why tonight will be any different. Away from home they are proving to be difficult to beat after drawing at Notts County and Bristol Rovers and winning at Reading. All terrific results and those results prove that they are capable of having a good season and upsetting the pre-season odds.

## PRESSURE

I was delighted with the way that the team came back after an indifferent performance at Bristol in the last game here against Colchester. I felt that we were in control for the whole game and created chances throughout. It was always going to be difficult for Colchester when they went down to ten men and I was pleased to see us keep the pressure on which paid off and we were good value for the win.

## DOWNFALL

If anything, being 2-0 up so early was part of our downfall. After they got back into the game, we were still looking to score, right up to the last 30 seconds and that just shows what type of game it was. Barnet deserve credit for the way they made a game of it but the players know that they should have been looking to tighten things up after Barnet got a goal back. It was an exciting game for the supporters to watch as it was end to end stuff throughout, but we now have to learn from the match and ensure that we don't make those same mistakes again.

## **CHAIRMAN'S Message**

*In the last two seasons many Clubs have come close to going out of business, the result of the financial problems created in football over the past decade. Tonight we welcome Luton Town who, like us, came to the verge of losing their position as one of only 72 Football League clubs but survived at the death. We offered our support and it was tremendous to see their supporters do what we all did together and pull their team through.*

It is laughable how much money the Premier League needs to survive on and how different it is just 24 places lower on the professional football ladder. Here in the Second Division it is hand to mouth. Recent events in the Premier League have highlighted the growing divisions within their members. It is important that the Football League remains strong. We have seen many developments in recent times that have begun to take it forward. At present our head, Richard Scudamore, is considering whether to move to run the Premier League. I hope that he does not.

Most clubs we play have their own problems. Barnet offered great hospitality but are playing under the threat of extinction. Their ground holds 5,000, a thousand short of the minimum 6,000 capacity required in the Football League. Unless they get support across the community their existence is threatened. It is very similar to our own situation with the new stadium. Clubs at our level simply cannot afford to drag themselves into the 21st Century without assistance. Barnet are organising a conference for all League clubs that we will attend. We have also been asked to address a conference addressing what needs to be done to reform modern football.


Thank you again to all those who made the effort to travel to the two away games. Certainly at Barnet it was not an evening for the faint hearted. Wonderful to see Steino scoring two great goals, breathtaking to see Ian's leg telescope out to knock the ball off the line but not good for one's health to see such an end to end exciting game. In many ways it mirrored a year ago and the titanic struggle with Colchester United.

By now we will know who we face in the Second Round. The Barnet fixtures brought little financial benefit to the Club. It is a long time since we drew a big side in a cup competition. I hope this year we have. The magic of the cups is the chance to pit ourselves against top class opposition and to thrill at the spectacle of a top side coming to Dean Court in a competitive fixture. Either way, it is good to see us back in the Second Round, another chance to build on past success for the future and another vital cash injection to ease the financial constraints at our level.

I would like to thank Jason and his family who have kindly offered to sponsor me this season. When he asked if I would mind I was thrilled that he should even think of doing so. I am unaware of any other Chairman that have a personal sponsor and am very grateful. As a badminton international and coach Jason may be well placed to do what others have failed and help me to begin to recover some of my lost fitness! Thank you again Jason.

Tonight we have a terrific fixture which promises excitement as we continue to build on the progress made so far. Another three points and another chance to force that top six spot. Thank you for your support and do enjoy the game.

## WEDNESDAY 18 AUGUST 1999

The Reserve side lost 4-0 in their first Avon Insurance Combination match of the season against a strong Ipswich side. Tom Culshaw, a defender from Liverpool appeared on trial and local forward Nick Miles again appeared for the side.

Antony Griffins transfer fee to Cheltenham will be £15,000 plus a further £10,000 after he has made 25 appearances for the Robins a Football League Tribunal decided.

## SATURDAY 21 AUGUST 1999



The day started well when the Youth team kicked off their SWEB South West League campaign with a 2-0 win over Plymouth at Chapel Gate. Matt Tubbs and Brian Stock the goalscorers.

It got even better in the afternoon as Colchester were swept away in a convincing 4-0 win. Mark Stein scored the first and that was followed in the second half by Claus Jørgensen's first goal in English football moments after United's Sagi Burton received a red card. The side finished the match with a flourish with Steve Fletcher scoring twice and coming agonisingly close to a hat-trick when he was denied by the feet of Simon Brown. Mark Stein almost made it five in injury time, but he was denied by the post. Assistant Manager John Williams was pleased with the way the side buried the ghost of the previous weeks match, "We were all so disappointed after the defeat at Bristol City, but the boys have put so much work in during the week and I think that showed today. We have to keep things in perspective, they went a man down and games can go either way then, but fair play to the boys, they kept passing the ball round well and deserved the win. I still don't think we've hit top form though, but as long as we

keep winning these games, we'll be OK."

Luton Town kept up their excellent start to their league campaign with a 2-1 win at Reading. The only 100% record in the league went as Preston could only draw at Wycombe.

## TUESDAY 24 AUGUST 1999

Fit again Steve Robinson is in the Northern Ireland squad for the matches against Germany and Turkey.

Robbo celebrated by being part of the side that reached the second round of the Worthington Cup with a 4-3 aggregate win over Barnet. With a 2-0 lead from the first leg, a superb double strike from Mark Stein had Barnet on the ropes at Underhill before the home side showed great resilience to force their way back into the tie. After the Bee's made it 3-2 on the night, the Cherries had to thank a fantastic goal line clearance from Ian Cox to prevent the tie going into extra time.

Gordon Watson made a second half substitute debut appearance for Bournemouth.

## AT THE HELM

**Lennie Lawrence** has now been in charge at Kenilworth Road since 1995. He has proved what an excellent manager he is by steering the club through harsh financial restraints and has developed a young side which has flourished. He has an excellent eye for up and coming talent which has paid dividends at Luton. His career as a player was spent in non-league circles, but coaching jobs at Plymouth, Lincoln and Charlton led to him taking charge at the Valley where he worked miracles on a shoestring. After nine years at Charlton, he moved for a short spells at Middlesbrough and Bradford City before returning south to Luton.

Assisting Lennie as coach is a well known man at Dean Court, **Trevor Hartley**. Trevor was manager here at Bournemouth when he was appointed in 1973 after the departure of John Bond, he was at the time the youngest manager in the Football League. A former Bournemouth player who made over 40 appearances in the League for the Cherries and he also served West Ham and coached in

Singapore. His association with The Hatters started in 1980 as Youth Coach. He then became David Pleat's right hand man, following him to Spurs. After spells in the Far East, USA, Canada and then four years as part of the England set up under Graham Taylor, he returned to League football at Sunderland before returning to Luton as a coach in 1998.

Also at the club as coach is **John Moore** who has enjoyed a long association with Luton. He has also managed the club and led them to seventh place in the top flight, the clubs best ever finish. He specialises in coaching the younger players but helps out with the first team too.

## BETWEEN THE POSTS

Goalkeeper **Tanny Abbey** has returned to Luton from a deal that went wrong with Antwerp during the summer. He felt that he needed to move after years as understudy to Kelvin Davis, but when Davis was sold to Wimbledon, he returned to the club with hope of becoming number 1 keeper. He first joined the club five years ago as a YT and prior to this campaign, made 8 appearances. Putting pressure on Tanny for the number one shirt is youngster **Daniel Tate**.

## AT THE BACK

Newest recruit at the back for The Hatters is **Efe Sodje** who returns to the area where he plied his trade before in the Conference at Stevenage from

Macclesfield. Efe, who is known for his trademark bandanna as a sign of his mothers culture, appeared twice last term for the Silkmen against Bournemouth and after relegation, he declined a new contract and after impressing Luton during a trial spell, signed at the start of the season, missing the first couple of matches through suspension. Left back **Stuart Fraser** has been one of the stars of Luton's highly successful youth team and despite his age, has shown great maturity and looks a bright prospect for the future. In that side with Stuart was **Gary Doherty** who is another name to look out for in the future. An attacking defender who regularly finds the net as he proved with Luton's second

against Bournemouth at Kenilworth Road last season. He has represented the Republic of Ireland at youth level and has been on the subs bench for the full side. **Julian Watts** is currently on loan from Bristol City. Julian has served Rotherham, Sheffield Wednesday and Leicester in the past, he has been unable to gain a first team place at Ashton Gate and made his Luton debut in the draw at Notts County. Now into his twelfth season at Kenilworth Road is **Marvin Johnson**. A versatile defender who can operate as a central defender and is capable at filling in on either flank or in midfield. He originally joined the club as a schoolboy and only injuries have prevented him making more than his 360 appearances for the side.

Former Arsenal right back **Gavin McGowan** is now in his third spell at Luton, the other two being loan spells. He joined the club on a permanent basis at the start of last season. Looking to break into the side as a regular this season is former YT player **Emmerson Boyce**. **Alan White** will be looking to add to his record of over 70 senior appearances for the side. He signed from Middlesbrough in 1997 as a 17 year old when the Hatters has lost three of its back four and responded well to the challenge.


## IN THE MIDDLE

**Matthew Spring** has made a good start to the season by grabbing what proved to be the winner in the 3-2 win over Blackpool. The combative midfielder is yet another product of the clubs youth scheme and last season made an impressive 54 appearances. Former Scotland Under 21 midfielder **Ray McKinnon** joined Luton at the start of last season from Dundee United, the club where he started his career. After an unhappy time at Nottingham Forest, he moved back north to Aberdeen and then to Dundee United. A creative midfielder, he scored his only home goal for Luton last season in the 2-2 draw against Bournemouth. **Michael McIndoe** has made excellent progress since joining the club as a YT. The youngster made his debut a year ago and hasn't looked back since. **Matthew Taylor** made his Luton debut on the opening day of the season at Notts County. The former youth player only became a professional during the summer and is making excellent progress. **Landry Zahana-Oni** is an Ivory Coast born left-winger. He was at Le Harve with Roger Boli before joining Stirling Albion and then Bromley. Luton paid £25,000 for his services plus more on appearances. He made 8 appearances last season, including one as a substitute against Bournemouth. **Paul**


**McLaren** was still a schoolboy when he was playing regularly for Luton's youth team and was offered professional terms when he was just 17. Now a firm regular in the side, his forceful running is his trademark.

## UP FRONT


Looking to put a season of frustration behind him is **Liam George** who broke his leg a year ago. The former YT player has started the new season well and scored the first goal of his career in the 3-2 win over Blackpool and also forced the visiting keeper into conceding an own goal to give Luton the lead. A regular team mate of Steve Robinson in the Northern Ireland squad is **Phil Gray**. An experienced striker who after starting his career at Luton, went on to serve Tottenham, Sunderland, Nancy and Fortuna Sittard. Has suffered more than his fair share of injuries which has been a big blow for the club. When fit he is a great asset to the side and was top scorer last season with 13 goals. **Andrew Fotiadis** is a local discovery who stayed at school to gain his qualifications before embarking on a career as a professional footballer. A good, old fashioned centre forward with good physique, power and determination to worry opposing defences. Up and coming **Andre Scarlett** had a dream start to his Luton first team career last season. The 18 year old came on as a substitute to make his debut at Oldham and scored the second goal in a 2-0 win. A player who's trickery is eye-catching and he will be looking for an extended run in the side this term. **Stuart Douglas** made a name for himself in Luton's youth and reserve teams, finding the net on a regular basis and he made his debut against Oldham in 1995 as a 17 year old. He has had to battle against injuries but enjoyed an excellent 1998-99 campaign where he made 50 appearances and was top scorer in the league with 9 goals.

# IAN COX - I REMEMBER Luton Town

Cherries skipper Ian Cox has plenty of good memories of Luton Town, particularly last season when his second half goal ensured that the points stayed at Dean Court. It was a good match last season on Monday 28 December, but there was no tension like earlier in the year when Luton visited Dean Court on Tuesday 17 February 1998 when the Hatters provided the opposition for an Auto Windscreen Shield Southern Area Quarter Final tie.

The Cherries had won at Kenilworth Road in a league match just 17 day prior to the cup tie, Bournemouth were favourites to win, but Luton were always going to make it hard with the twin towers of Wembley in sight. The Cherries found the Hatters tough opposition as the visitors packed the defence and tried to catch the Cherries on the break. It almost paid off until Frank Rolling smashed the ball home with four minutes left after Luton failed to clear a corner. The tension of the last few minutes was unbearable, and Ian Cox made a miraculous goal line clearance to ensure that it was Bournemouth who would face Walsall in the Southern Final. Ian looks back to that night, remembering just how tough it was, "It was a tense night. We went out to win and luckily we got the goal virtually at the death and we had a bit of a scare after that when I was lucky enough to be in the right place to clear the ball off the line. I can't remember too much about it, but the ball was just about to cross the line and I managed to scoop it away. It was a good night in the end though and I was just glad that we got through." The winners of the tie were favourites to reach Wembley and the importance of the night didn't escape the

Cherries skipper, "It was a great night and a good experience for us all. It was such a tough tie to get through and to win and get to Wembley was a great achievement."

### TYPICAL MATCH

Looking back on that one game, Ian feels that the game typified Cherries v Hatters matches, "We always tend to have good games against Luton because they like to play. We had a good result in the league here last season and I have good memories of that game because I scored the winner. It was my last game before suspension, so it was good to sign off on a good note. At their place they really got at us and soon went two up. We were quite fortunate that day to come away with a draw because they could have had a few more goals before the interval."

### GOOD START

People have already written Luton off this season, but their response has been superb with some excellent results including a great 2-1 win at Reading in their last away match and Ian knows that they will be a tough hurdle to cross, "There's some good young players at Luton and I'm not surprised that they have had a good start. All of us are so pleased that Luton are now safe. We know exactly what they have been going through and I'm glad they've sorted themselves out. On the pitch, it's just the three points I'm interested in, but away from the game tonight, I think everyone is just relieved that they are OK. We came through the experience stronger as a club and I'm sure Luton will too." Two sides then who have had experiences that neither will want again, and two sides with a hunger to win. Let's hope that after tonight, Ian Cox has more happy memories of Luton Town!


### TOUGH TONIGHT

# HEADLINER



## RICHARD HUGHES-A NAME TO REMEMBER

*"Richard who?" was the question on many peoples lips when Richard Hughes joined the Cherries at the start of last season from Arsenal. The midfielder gave a year of performances that belied his tender years and "Richard who?" is a question that no-one would dare utter now.*

### COMEBACK

A brilliant first season saw him make 55 senior appearances and also gain international recognition with Scotland with whom he scored his first international goal after last seasons domestic campaign finished. It was a blow therefore when he missed this seasons opener against Cambridge and only appeared as a sub against both Barnet and Bristol City. His full comeback match was dramatic to say the least as the side overwhelmed Colchester, "It had been frustrating for me when I picked up the pre-season against Wimbledon so to come back for a game that went so well was good. I'd come on twice as a sub but the problem was that I hadn't trained before the games and I still felt a bit of pain and I found it difficult to get into the games."

### INTERNATIONAL GOAL

If anybody told Richard a year ago that he would have so many games under his belt and be frustrated about missing the start of the season, he would have thought they were joking such is his phenomenal progress, "I came here with the intention of playing first team football but I couldn't have planned it out better if I could. Everything's gone well, touch wood, so far." Part of that progress is the Scotland call up that may have curtailed his post season break, but gave him the chance of the great experiences that international football can give, "I only had three weeks off after the Wrexham game at the end of last season, but I think anybody would give up their holidays to play for their country. It has been brilliant to be involved in the four games so far. It was a brilliant experience to score my first goal as well against the Czech Republic. They were a strong team and to score the goal that put us 2-1 up was superb."

### GOOD FOOTBALL

In the past, a move to Division Two would have almost certainly finished any international

aspirations, but that is certainly no longer the case, "When I came down here, Eddie was in the England Under 21 side and Robbo was in the Northern Ireland team so I knew that it was possible to gain international recognition here. Within the game, people appreciate that Bournemouth play good football and it's a club that's going forward and that's why we attract the attention."

### CHALLENGE

The latest challenge for Richard is tonight's visit of Luton, a side who have many admirers at Dean Court, "They have had a very good start to the season as far as the league goes. They are on form as they were at the beginning of the last season. I remember we played them at Christmas time here last season and they were up in the play-off positions. It was a very good game at Kenilworth Road when we drew 2-2. It was a game of two halves and conditions weren't the best as they weren't for the home game. They're a good footballing team with some good young players coming through so I imagine it will be a good game particularly as conditions will be far more ideal and both teams will be able to get the ball down and play".

### CLEAR RUN

For Richard he is pleased to be back in the first team and is looking for another year of good progress with the midfielder hoping to surpass what he achieved last season, "I would be delighted to do that! I'm now happy to be back involved in the first team. I only missed two games last season which I was delighted with and hopefully this season I can steer clear of injuries and suspensions and have a clear run." With time and age on his side, the only way for Ricahrd to go is forward- a direction that suits him down to the ground given his focused determination and mature attitude to the game.







After the game, stewards didn't know where the supporters coach would be parked and it took a great deal of running around to ensure all the travellers found the coach on Barnet High Street!! For rail users, the line goes past the ground and there was plenty of side street parking for everyone by car. Once in the ground, Cherries followers who made up a quarter of the crowd were grateful that the rain had stopped. The away end was rows of temporary seating out in the open and on a warm pleasant Tuesday night in August it was OK, but I wouldn't fancy it in the middle of winter.

CHERRIES ON TOUR: It was a great turn out from Bournemouth and although they tried to get behind the team, the acoustics of the away end were all wrong. Over 400 for a Worthington Cup tie though was excellent.

A GOOD DAY OUT? It sounds if it shouldn't have been, but it was really! You always expected Barnet to make a fight of it, but not quite as much!! It's a really friendly place full of people who really care about their club and are doing their best to save it and I think every Bournemouth supporter who travelled will be wishing them the best in their quest to remain in the Football League.




Gordon Watson came through a full 90 minutes and there was also a 30 minute outing for John Bailey who came through with no problems.

# SUPER Fletch

One of the most popular players at the club, Steve Fletcher has already shown this season why he is respected by supporters and players alike. With a reasonable start to the season, the likable and loyal forward is right to feel optimistic about the nine months ahead. Fletch is the one of the most experienced players in the side with tremendous attitude and willingness to the AFC Bournemouth cause, that experience is going to be used to the full as the side look to mount another serious bid for promotion.

## MEMORIES BURIED

The last match here against Colchester was one where there was a great deal of pressure on the players after the disappointment of the match seven days earlier at Ashton Gate, but the team responded in fine style. There were

memories to be buried as Fletch agrees, but was also quick to point out that the Cherries

had made a reasonable start to the campaign, "There were things we had to get out of our system, but listening to the radio on the way over to Dean Court for the Colchester game, they were saying how well the local teams had been doing and talked about Portsmouth and Southampton and then saying that Bournemouth had had a hiccup, but we've won our first two games and that seems to have been forgotten. I know we didn't play well at Bristol City, we lost our way and we lost our shape, but if we are going to play badly, it's good to get it out of the way early on and I can't see us playing as badly again this season. The way the media have portrayed that game was as if it was at a critical stage of the season! We weren't brilliant in the first three games, but we got results in two of them and surely it's a good thing when you can grind out results when you know you haven't played that well and can play a lot better. I feel that although we didn't play well at City, the criticism has been a bit harsh and we showed good character by bouncing back against Colchester and we have to maintain that form by keep going forward and playing good football. Two League wins and a loss and progression in the Worthington Cup in the first five games isn't bad and I think everyone would have settled for that before the season. We are getting a good rhythm here at home and as long as we do it away from home, then we can be up amongst the top teams again."

## 'FLETCHER FOR ENGLAND!'

In the last game here, the chants of 'Fletcher for England!' were heard as the striker hit two goals, including a glorious second and although the striker will be delighted with that, he knows how close he came to a first hat-trick, "I should have scored before my first one! I was a bit fortuitous when the ball hit me on the head and fell nicely for me. I hit it at the keeper who saved with his legs but I had time for a cup of tea before he had chance to react and I felt I was never going to score. It was rewarding when the first goal came because it was a move we've been working on hard in training and it was a bit like Eddies against Cambridge. The second one was another we've worked on in training. Eddie dummied it and I was supposed to leave it for Robbo! I didn't hear him shout till the last second and by then I'd already controlled it and because one of their lads closed me down, I hit it early and I saw it hit the roof of the net. A couple of minutes later, I was through one on one with the keeper and I decided to hit it low as the keeper was backing off and it hit his legs. Looking back at it now, I should have really taken it on and I should have had a hat trick. I'm not disappointed about it though because we won 4-0, it's just on a personal level I would have liked to have got a hat-trick at Dean Court for the supporters and myself. If we keep playing that way though, I may have other chances."

## DIVISIONAL EXPERT

Steve Fletcher is now an expert on Division Two as he is one of the longest serving players at this level and as he explains, it's getting tougher every year, "It does get harder every year. There are so many foreigners coming into the game that the better English players are having to come down divisions which has made the division so much more competitive. I started at Hartlepool as an 18 year old in the league and it's so much harder now. I'm a lot older and more experienced and what I've noticed is that players have better ability now and it's made it a difficult division to get out of. We're going the right way and we've gained respect. We pass the ball

round well and some teams tend to come here and sit with ten men behind the ball and we are now looking to break these teams down as our inability to do that cost us promotion last season. There are no big names in our division this season, but there is money in the league now. We have always proved in the past that teams with a reputation or clubs with the money, we can beat but then we tend to struggle against bottom of the table teams. I've been here for eight years now and it's still the same - look at last season, we beat Preston at home and away and lost at Lincoln and Northampton! I can't put my finger on why it happens, but we are trying to change it and get the consistency that we know we need."

## REAL MADRID OF DIVISION TWO!!

There were plenty of questions asked of the side by the supporters before the last match

here, and the team gave exactly the right answers in a game that they couldn't wait to play in, "We needed the Colchester game - not just the result, but the performance as well. The supporters appreciate the way we play and we have gained the respect of other players and when I speak to them, they refer to us as the Real Madrid of Division Two! We tried new things during pre-season and against Wimbledon we played more long balls than them, and that isn't our game. We had a couple of decent results

playing that way, but it wasn't us. We had to get back to our passing game. It was good to get Robbo back in the side because he is so important to the way we play. We all missed him because he always gives an option. When it was just me and Steiny, he always had two men on him and it's hard to pick him out, but when Robbo was back, it helped everyone. It's in him to go forward and if he's not scoring, he's creating. Him and Hughsie made a big difference to the team and now all we have to do is pray that we don't get too many injuries, we've got a good squad here and with luck, it should be a good season." With the team starting to show the form to sustain a challenge at the top end of the table, perhaps next season 'Fletch' may lose his tag of one of the longest serving players in the division!

# THE A TO Z OF THE CHERRIES



## **FRED MARSDEN**

Blackburn born full back who joined the Cherries in 1936 from Wolves. He spent 13 seasons at Dean Court becoming a regular in the side. He missed just one match in the 1937-38 season, two the following season and after the war he was ever present for the next two seasons before moving to Weymouth. He made 195

appearances for the side plus many during the war time matches. He scored just one goal in his career at Dean Court, a penalty against Bristol City on 15 October 1938.

## **CLIFF MARSH**

After starting his career with Winsford, Cliff joined Leeds United in 1948. He made just four appearances for Leeds and joined Bournemouth in May 1949. The forward found it difficult to establish himself in the Cherries first team and it wasn't until January 1951 when he scored his first goal for the side. Before moving to Yeovil in June 1952, he had made 39 appearances scoring twice.

## **ANDY MARSHALL**

Goalkeeper who joined the Cherries on loan from Norwich City in September 1996. At the time he was an England under-21 international and after making his debut in a 3-2 defeat at Bristol Rovers, he went on to make 11 appearances, keeping two clean sheets. He is now the number one keeper at Carrow Road.

## **KEN MARSHALL**

Local goalkeeper who had a brief spell at Bournemouth in the clubs first season in the Football League in 1923. He made 22 appearances before moving to Poole Town.

## **DENNIS MARTIN**

Southampton born half-back who joined Bournemouth as an apprentice, being taken on as a professional in 1947. The half back made 23 appearances before moving to non-league Folkestone Town.

## **BOB MASSEY**

Bournemouth born full back who was plucked from local league obscurity in 1958. He spent three years at Dean Court, making just five appearances before being released.

## **STEVE MASSEY**

After starting his career at Stockport in 1975, Steve joined Bournemouth in July 1978 for a £5,000 fee. He was a regular up front for the Cherries and scored six goals in his first season at the club. After four strikes in the 1979-80 campaign, he enjoyed his best season at Dean Court the next season, scoring 9 goals in 31 appearances. He left the club in 1981 to join Peterborough and went on to serve Northampton, Hull, Cambridge United and Wrexham. He made 97 appearances for the Cherries, scoring 19 goals. After finishing his career as a footballer, he moved to Cornwall where he has successfully run holiday camps near Looe and Helston.

## **NEIL MASTERS**


Current Gillingham left back who has suffered greatly with injury during his career. Born in Ballymena, he joined Bournemouth as a YT in 1988 and won international honours for Northern Ireland at youth level. He signed as a professional in 1990. He made his debut in a 0-0 draw at Wigan in October 1992 and went on to make 20 appearances that season. Despite having injury problems, he caught the eye with his powerful running, tackling and vicious shot. He made a total of 50 appearances for the Cherries, scoring 4 goals before signing for Wolves in December 1993 for a £300,000 fee. It was to be a nightmare time for him in the midlands though and he managed just 12 appearances in three and a half years because of injury. He rejoined his old boss Tony Pulis at Gillingham in 1997, but the injury problems continued. He has made just 12 appearances for the Gills, making none at all last season and he still finds himself sidelined now.

## **JOHN MEADOWS**

Lancaster born goalkeeper who joined Bournemouth from Burnley in 1950. He made 16 appearances between the sticks during the 1950-51 season, but after failing to register an outing the season later, he moved back north to Accrington Stanley.

## **SCOTT MEAN**

Crawley born midfielder who rejoined the Cherries at the start of the current campaign and marked his second debut with the equaliser in the opening day match against Cambridge. Scott started his football career with Bournemouth, signing as a YT in 1990 before turning professional in 1992. He made his debut on the opening day of the 1992-93 season at Preston North End on 15 August 1992. It was to prove to be a frustrating first season as he made just six starts. He did score his first goal for the club during that campaign, a spectacular effort at Swansea on 10 April 1993. After another frustrating campaign in the 1993-94 season, it was to be the arrival of Mel Machin that really saw Scott start to realise his full potential. He was thrown in at the deep end during the 'Great Escape' season and responded superbly. It was a season where players would either sink or swim and Mean did the latter. He made 40 appearances for the side, scoring six goals including both in a 2-0 win over Wycombe and vital strikes at Brentford and



Shrewsbury to ensure the side stay up. He kept up his fine form at the start of the next season before being struck down by injury in the televised 3-1 win over Brighton. He made a brief and scoring comeback in January until injury again struck at Bristol City. Despite the injury, Harry Redknapp came in to sign Mean and he moved into the top flight at West Ham in 1996. In the three years he was away, he started just one first team match. That game was for Port Vale against West Bromwich and it proved to be another frustrating day as he limped off after 74 minutes. In his time at West Ham he made three substitute appearances in the Premiership, but returned to Dean Court in the summer an even stronger player.

## **DON MEGSON**

Don took over as manager of the Cherries late in the 1982-83 season. It had been a difficult season with David Webb sacked and the side losing games heavily. As a player, he had served both Sheffield Wednesday and Bristol Rovers. He had also served Rovers as manager and had led them to Division Two during the previous decade. It was to prove to be an unsuccessful time at Dean Court. After ensuring the side stayed up, a poor start to the 1983-84 season saw him resign after less than a year in charge. Harry Redknapp took his place.

## **DICK MELLORS**

Mansfield born goalkeeper who joined Bournemouth in June 1934 from Reading. It took him a season to truly establish himself as the number one keeper at the club but he then missed just two matches from 1935 to 1937. In December 1937, he moved north to Dumfries, joining Queen of the South FC where he quickly established himself.

## **LES MELVILLE**


Ormskirk born half back. Les joined the Cherries from Everton where he had been an England Youth international. He was at Bournemouth during the 1956-57 season and made 25 appearances. He left the club for Oldham in March 1958 and made just two appearances before leaving the professional game.




