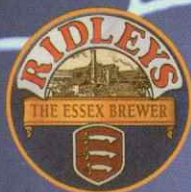

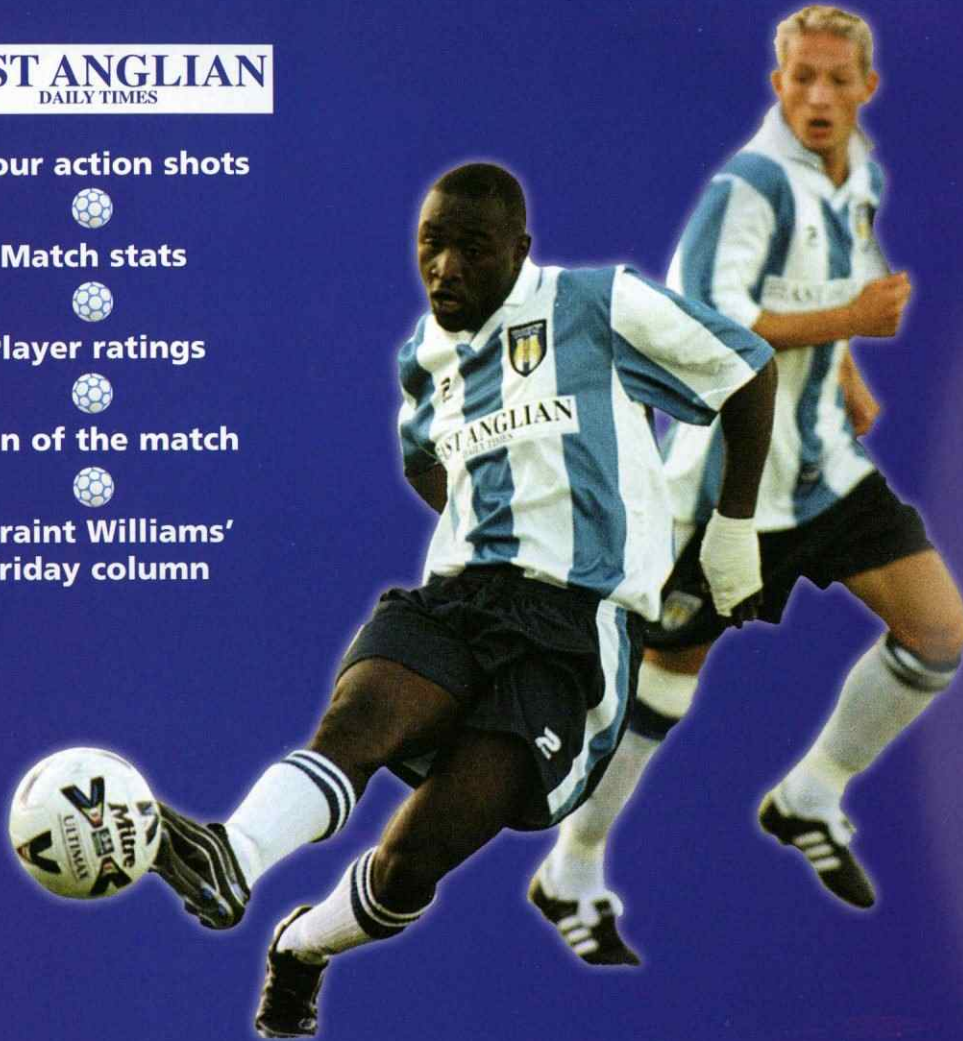

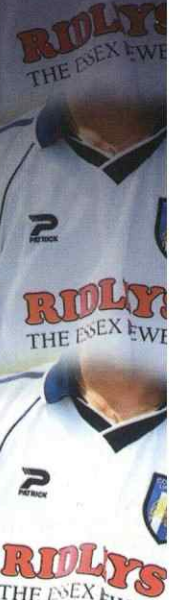

Steve's Message

Good Evening and welcome to Lennie Lawrence and his Luton team and their supporters. Our last home game against Chesterfield was a very important victory for us in terms of confidence and belief in our ability to win in front of our home fans, especially having lost 0-3 in our previous two home games. It wasn't our best performance recently but sometimes it's more important to get three points than to actually play well for 90 minutes. I thought it was a very nervy first half from both teams which Chesterfield probably had slightly the better of. However, the second half saw us relax a bit more on the ball and get the winner from Lomana, which I thought, we deserved. Then it was down to Swansea again in the Auto Windscreen Shield. Although we had five first team players out that night, it was a very uncharacteristic performance from our lads in the first half which saw an in form Swansea side carve us open on two or three occasions and, if the truth be known, they could have been four up at half time. We managed to get back into it after the interval but got caught on the break going for the equaliser. As people have said since, we can now concentrate on our League position. One positive thing to come out of the game was young Jack Wignall's performance having come on for Alan White, who was injured, in the first minute. He did not look out of place and I'm sure his dad would have been proud.

Our very next thought on the coach home, was a difficult trip back down the M4 to highflying Bristol Rovers. We welcomed back David Greene from suspension, Gavin Johnson, Fabrice Richard from injury and John Vaughan in goal for his last game of his loan period for us, which I thank him for and wish him luck in finding a new Club nearer his home in Leeds. Apart from one lapse in concentration, which led to their goal in the first half, we dealt with everything they could throw at us. Going out for the second half we were confident of getting back into the match with conditions in our favour, however we conceded again with a poor goal from our point of view. We have to work harder at defending and marking in and around our own box. Having said that from then on we started to play the ball around and got in some good crossing and shooting positions with Lomana giving the home side some new problems to deal with. Having got the next goal from Lomana, it looked highly likely that we would then go on and get some sort of result from the game, but the ball wouldn't quite fall for us in the last fifteen to twenty minutes when their goalkeeper was having one of those games. It was the home fans who were really relieved to hear the final whistle, so we must take the positives from this performance and improve on the bits and pieces, which are costing us goals.

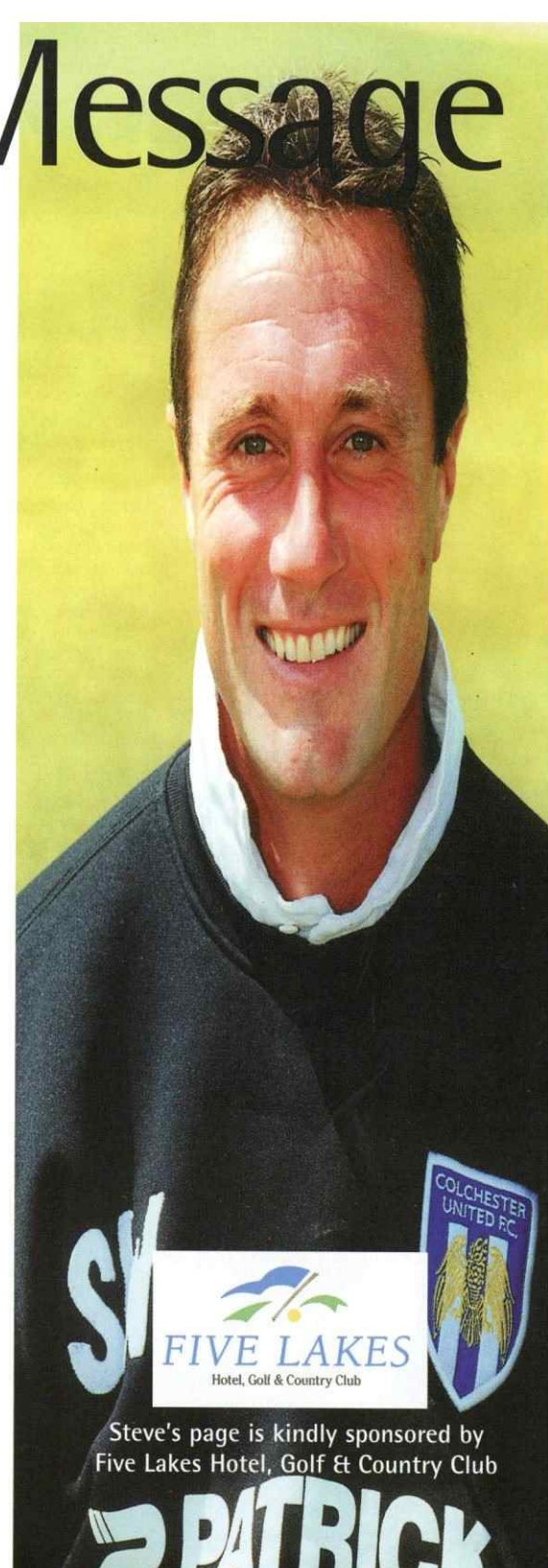

LUTON TOWN...

Young, gifted and hard-up!

Colchester have never beaten Luton Town in a senior competition and Lennie Lawrence's young side will be eager to extend that run to 11 matches this evening.

The Hatters are currently in mid-table, having slipped from their lofty top-six perch of the autumn. A lack of consistency can be put down to the youth and inexperience of the squad. Lawrence is a shrewd judge and knows only too well that youngsters, however talented, rarely produce the goods week in and week out in the hurly burly of Division Two.

Luton have regularly been naming a squad of 16 that cost absolutely nothing in transfer fees. The only men on the books to command fees are long-term

injury victim Phil Gray and Alan White - currently on loan here at Layer Road!

Last week the Hatters more than matched Fulham in the FA Cup at Craven Cottage, often dictating the play against a side that cost millions. The humble visitors that afternoon cost nothing whatsoever and all the 16-man squad were home-grown barring three free-transfer men.

When the Kenilworth Road babes hit form they are a match for anyone in this division and a play-off place remains a realistic target. Luton were relegated in 1996, making a return to the lower divisions after nearly 30 years alongside the bigger boys.

Relegation was undoubtedly hastened by a financial situation that enforced the sale of just about everything that came off the end of youth coach John Moore's conveyor belt. Fans have watched with growing anger over the past ten years as the club has sold home-developed assets like Tim Breacker, Kingsley Black, Iain Dowie, Paul Telfer, Mark Pembroke, Ceri Hughes, Scott Oakes, Kelvin Davis, Matthew Upson and Tony Thorpe, to name but ten.

Meanwhile, maverick chairman and chief exec David Kohler has now left the club, having presumably ploughed some of that transfer money into his doomed 'Kohlerdome' project. The club went into receivership around eight months ago, and almost went out of existence as the unpopular Mr. Kohler wrangled over a parting deal that was only settled hours before the new season kicked off. New chairman Cliff Bassett was left to pick up the pieces, and is already proving a far more acceptable leader in the eyes of the long-suffering fans.

Against this chaotic backdrop, manager Lawrence had to cobble a squad together from youngsters, trialists and 'Bosman' players. Youngsters like Liam George (12 goals so far), Matthew Taylor,

Gary Doherty, Nathan Abbey and Stuart Fraser have suddenly become first-team regulars and risen superbly to the challenge.

By virtue of being a fraction more experienced than the new boys, the still-youthful Matthew Spring and Stuart Douglas have had to assume extra responsibility in midfield and attack, respectively. Alongside Spring in midfield has been either Adam Locke or Paul McLaren.

Back-up players on the fringe of the first team are inevitably all under 20, including Emmerson Boyce, Andre Scarlett, Tresor Kandol, James Ayres and Michael McIndoe.

The calming influence has been provided by the older hands in central defence - skipper Marvin Johnson, Julian Watts and Effy Sodje. Incidentally, for those who don't get close enough to read it, Mr Sodje's bandanna bears the words 'against all odds.'

With Phil Gray, Andrew Fotiadis and Gavin McGowan nursing long-term injuries, former terrace hero Tony Thorpe has been recruited on loan and efforts were being made to secure a permanent deal.

Some 21 of Luton's 28 league points so far have been gleaned at home. On their travels they've chalked up wins at Reading (2-1), Oxford (1-0) and Lincoln 1-0. Perhaps best showing of all was last week's 2-2 at Fulham where they came within a whisker of victory at the first attempt. Winner of next Tuesday's replay gets a fourth round home tie with Wimbledon.

Victory tonight would be the U's first ever triumph over the Hatters in a senior match - unless, that is, you count the pre-season Watney Cup encounter in 1971 when Brian Lewis performed a penalty-area tumble that would have impressed David Ginola to create United's winning goal. The irony was that Lewis had earlier played for the Beds club and they'd often benefitted from his sudden attacks of giddiness in opponents' penalty areas! Several of today's staffs can boast service to both clubs. United's Aaron Skelton, David Greene, Gavin Johnson, Alan White and physio Brian Owen are all ex-Luton men, while the Hatters' Adam Locke is an old Layer Road favourite.

ROB HADGRAFT

Lennie Lawrence - Manager
Lennie Lawrence is an experienced manager who took over from Terry Westley in December 1995. It was his know-how of the Nationwide League and his ability to manage on a shoestring budget that attracted Luton to him. As a player, Lennie served non-league clubs Croydon, Carshalton and Sutton United and his first experiences in management were assistant positions at Lincoln City and Plymouth Argyle. He became Charlton Athletic's boss in 1982 and held the post for nine years before joining Middlesbrough in 1991. He led them to the Premier League a year later, but 'Boro were relegated the following season and Lennie was replaced by Bryan Robson. Eighteen months as Bradford's boss followed before joining Luton Town.

Nathan Abbey - Goalkeeper
In goal this evening is likely

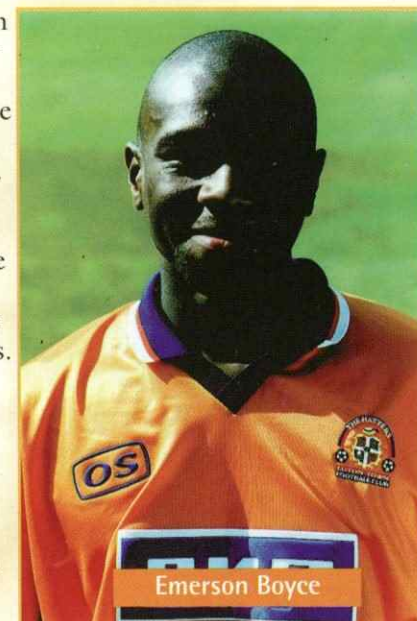

to be Nathan Abbey. Nathan has grasped the opportunity to step up into Town's first team following the departure of former number one Kelvin Davis to Wimbledon. Like Davis, Nathan came through the ranks at Kenilworth Road and before this season, the Islington born number one had made just two League appearances.

Matthew Taylor - Defender/Wing Back
Taylor's rise to prominence and first team football with Luton underlines that this 17 year old wing-back has a very bright future in football. He was released by Oxford United at 14, but recovered from this disappointment to star in Abingdon United's youth side. Lennie Lawrence spotted the youngster whilst playing for Oxfordshire and quickly snapped up the promising Taylor. He has made rapid progress since joining Luton and he made his debut in the 0-0 draw at Notts County on the opening day of the season.

Julian Watts - Centre-Back
Sheffield born defender Julian signed for Town under the Bosman ruling this summer from Bristol City after falling out of favour with the Ashton Gate side. Watts began his professional career at Rotherham and after just 20 appearances for the Millers, he joined Sheffield Wednesday. His time at Hillsborough was one of frustration as he struggled

to break into the first team and he spent a loan spell at Shrewsbury Town to gain first team football. After four years and just 12 League appearances at Wednesday, Watts made the switch to Leicester. Whilst at Leicester, Julian made a promising start, before finding himself in the shadows again. Loan spells at Crewe Alexandra and Huddersfield followed before moving to Bristol City where he played just 17 League games. He spent further loan spells at Lincoln City and Blackpool before moving to Kenilworth Road.

Efetobore Sodje - Defender
Sodje is another defender whom Lennie Lawrence signed during the summer. He joined the Hatters from Macclesfield Town, for whom he played 41 matches, all of which came last season in what was his first in League football. Prior to joining Macclesfield, Sodje had been

playing in the Conference with Stevenage Borough and his commanding performances soon caught the attention of Macclesfield boss Sammy McIroy.

Marvin Johnson - Defender

Since serving his apprenticeship at Kenilworth Road, Marvin has remained loyal to his only club with over 250 appearances to his name. Johnson is a versatile defender who can play anywhere across the back-line. He is a former 'player of the season' at Kenilworth Road and his loyalty to the club has made him a firm crowd favourite.

Gavin McGowan - Defender

Gavin is a fullback who joined Luton from Arsenal where he found Winterburn and Dixon difficult players to displace. After just six appearances for Arsenal, McGowan had two injury ravaged loan spells at Kenilworth Road, but made the move permanent at the beginning of last season.

Andre Scarlett - Midfield

Born in Brent, Andre is a midfield player who looks to have a bright future. He was given his chance towards the back end of last season and he responded well to the opportunity presented to him by Lennie Lawrence, scoring once in six matches.

Paul McClaren - Midfield

Born in High Wycombe, Paul was still a schoolboy when he was playing youth team football. His astonishingly quick progress was continued when

he signed a professional contract whilst still only 17. He is a very attack minded midfielder who played 23 League matches last season.

Matthew Spring - Midfield

Like his team mate Paul McClaren, Spring was very highly rated as a youngster and was a member of the Luton youth team that reached the FA Youth Cup Semi-Final in 1997. Matthew made his League debut against Bristol City, coming on as a substitute and this was quickly followed with his full debut against Plymouth Argyle. He made great strides last season, making 13 appearances and is a hard-working, competitive midfield player with great potential.

Michael McIndoe - Midfield

Michael is yet another example of the thriving youth system at Kenilworth Road and of the faith that Lennie Lawrence is prepared to place in young footballers. Born in Edinburgh, Michael had not made a single appearance prior to this season but has been given his chance by the Hatter's boss this term. Michael is still only young, but he passes the ball well from the centre of the park.

Liam George - Striker

The pacey and skilful young striker is very highly rated at Kenilworth Road having made the step up from youth to reserve level last season. In Town's Avon Insurance Combination League side, the striker scored 12 goals in 18 games and he was rewarded with four appearances in the

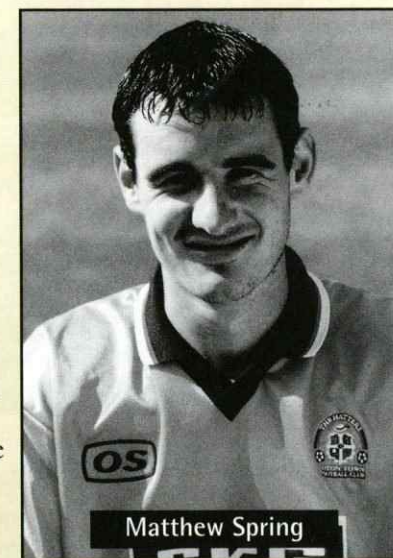
first team last term. He is a regular member of the Republic of Ireland youth team and is another younger Hatter with a bright future.

Stuart Douglas - Striker

Stuart scored goals galore whilst in the youth and reserve teams at Kenilworth Road and as a 17 year old, marked his Luton debut with a goal against Grimsby Town. He has a lot of pace and again, another bright hope for the future.

Tresor Kandol - Striker

Tresor has worked his way up through the ranks at Kenilworth Road and has scored plenty of goals at youth and reserve team level. He made his debut for the Hatters on April 6th 1999 in the club's home match against York City and Luton won that match 2-1. He has had a number of substitute appearances this season and Lennie Lawrence will be keen to see him progress over the coming months.

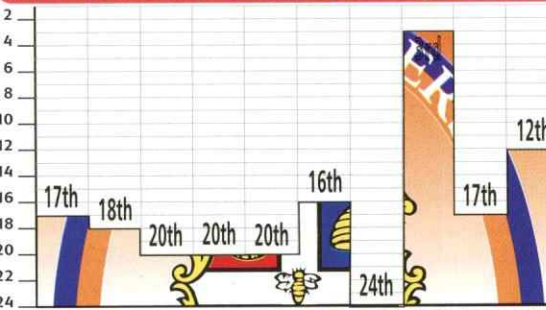

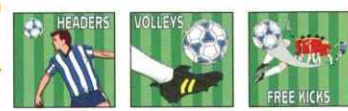

OPTA Nationwide Football League Player head-to-head **JOE KEITH** **v MATTHEW TAYLOR**

They say that you need experience but the performances of two youngsters at Colchester and Luton show that young guns can be key men in the tricky world of Division Two.

Joe Keith has risen to prominence at Layer Road this season with a series of sound performances that have belied his youth. He is a firm favourite with the fans, and after a few years of grizzled veterans he is an example of the Colchester youth and scouting systems.

Matthew Taylor of Luton is another fine prospect. Barely 18-years-old, he has hardly missed a minute for the Hatters this season and looks to have a fine future ahead of him. With Luton's well-publicised financial turmoil, Lennie Lawrence has had to use players of limited experience, but it has not backfired, as Town stand on the edges of the play-off zone. Both players have similar tackle success rates, though the Luton man has made more challenges. He has also blocked more shots and crosses, though Keith has made considerably more clearances. Going forward Taylor has been far more effective. He plays in a wing-back role for Luton and this has enabled him to get 16 shots on target. He has proved himself to be one of the most accurate dead-ball experts in the division this year. But his passing has not been as accurate as that of Keith's. The Colchester man has been relaxed and accurate on the ball and this shows in his stats. He has committed just 12 fouls all season and has yet to pick up a yellow card. As the U's fight for survival at the foot of Division Two, he should have plenty more opportunities to excel.

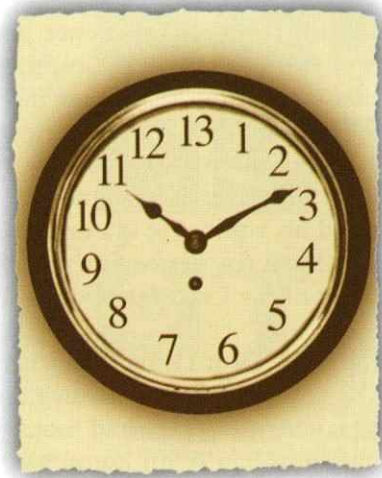

Football Historian Leigh Edwards Traces Former Favourites

TONY ADCOCK

Popular striker Tony Adcock played for Colchester United in the 1997 Auto Windscreens Shield final triumph at Wembley. Signing professional at Layer Road in February 1981, he was Colchester's leading marksman in four successive seasons before being sold to Manchester City for £40,000 in June 1987. He was swapped for Northampton Town's Trevor Morley seven months later then had a spell at Bradford City prior to rejoining the Cobblers for £75,000 in January 1991. Moving to Peterborough United with Bobby Barnes for £70,000 in December 1991, he helped them to clinch promotion via the Wembley play-offs in 1991/92. He joined Luton Town for £20,000 in August 1994 and made two substitute appearances in the First Division for today's opponents before

returning to Layer Road on a free transfer in May 1995. Top scorer in the following two seasons, he netted 126 goals in 318 League games overall for Colchester before being released at the end of last season. Tony is currently Caretaker-Manager at Heybridge Swifts.

IAN ALLINSON

Versatile winger Ian Allinson was Colchester United's leading marksman in two consecutive seasons. A former apprentice at Layer Road, he made his League debut at home to Preston NE six months before signing professional under Bobby Roberts in October 1975. He featured prominently in Colchester's 1976/77 promotion triumph and successive Cup runs, netting 69 goals in 308 League games prior to joining Arsenal on a controversial free transfer in August 1983. Gaining considerable top-flight experience, he moved to Stoke City in June 1987 and was sold to Luton Town for £10,000 four months later. He scored three times in 32 First Division outings for today's visitors, then rejoined Colchester in December 1988 and netted a further ten goals in 38 League outings before joining Baldock Town

as player-manager in December 1989. Subsequently manager of Stotfold, he is employed as a customer development manager for Carlsberg-Tetley in Romford.

ALEC CHAMBERLAIN

Big goalkeeper Alec Chamberlain was ever-present in four successive seasons for Colchester United. He impressed with Ramsey Town prior to joining Bobby Robson's Ipswich Town in July 1981 and followed Allan Hunter to Layer Road in August 1982. Given his League debut at home to Hartlepool United five months later, he starred as Colchester qualified for the Fourth Division play-offs in 1986/87 and made 188 League appearances (including 188 consecutive games) before being sold to Everton for £80,000 in July 1987. He was loaned to Tranmere Rovers prior to joining Ray Harford's Luton Town for £150,000 in July 1988 and was ever-present in two consecutive seasons while at

Kenilworth Road, playing 138 League games before moving to Sunderland on a free transfer in July 1993. Starring in their 1995/96 First Division title success, he joined Watford for £40,000 in July 1996 and was an experienced figure in their rise from the Second Division to Premiership.

TED PHILLIPS

Noted for his powerful shooting, inside-left Ted Phillips was an experienced figure in Colchester United's 1965/66 promotion success. Initially with Leiston, he joined Ipswich Town in December 1953 and returned from a loan spell at Stowmarket to score a record 41 League goals in their 1956/57 Third Division (South) title triumph. He formed a lethal partnership with Ray Crawford as Ipswich won the Second and First Division titles in consecutive years under Alf Ramsey and joined Benny Fenton's Leyton Orient for £8,000 in March 1964, then Luton Town in February 1965. Unable to prevent relegation that season, he scored eight times in 12 Third Division games for today's opponents before Neil Franklin swapped Billy Stark for him

in September 1965. He netted 13 goals in 32 League outings for Colchester prior to joining Maltese side Floriana as player-manager in May 1966. Subsequently with Chelmsford City, Lexden Wanderers, Brantham and Long Melford, he worked for British Telecom and still lives locally.

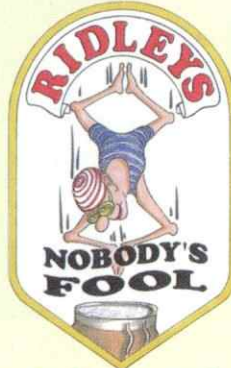

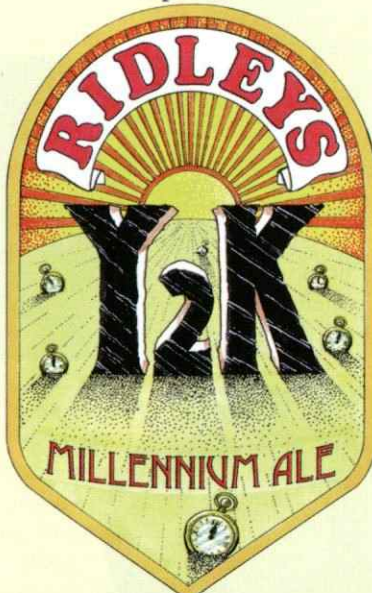

Welcome back Joe Dunne! The popular Dubliner is back at Layer Road after a seven-month absence and went straight into the squad for tonight's game. Defender Joe has signed an 18-month contract following a spell in the Conference with Dover Athletic, where he was skipper and played a key role in a recent unbeaten run of 10 games.

Joe, still only 26, was released last May by then-manager Mick Wadsworth in the infamous clear-out which saw nine players shown the door at Layer Road. Dunne's was certainly a departure that caused raised eyebrows among U's fans, who were sorry to see him go and he is sure to receive a big welcome from his fans on the Barside if selected this evening.

Manager Steve Whitton believes Dunne still has plenty to contribute and has brought him back for a nominal fee. Dunne, who spent nearly six years at Gillingham before first joining the U's, will be keen to add to his current tally of 216 Football League appearances (29 as a substitute), plus 37 in the three cup competitions (six as sub).

Dunne notched just four goals in his first spell in the blue-and-white stripes, but these were all vital strikes, particularly the two in 1998 against Lincoln and Hull that helped us gain a play-off place and subsequently promotion. With Eire Under-21, youth and schoolboy caps to his name, Dunne first arrived at Layer Road in March 1996 on a free transfer from Gillingham. He arrived in the same week that Martin Grainger was sold to Birmingham for £40,000 and his

first appearance came as a substitute in a 2-1 defeat at Hartlepool.

His full debut followed in mid-April in a 2-2 draw with Fulham at Layer Road. His second full game was a vital away encounter at Mansfield and he became the hero of the hour by notching a last minute winner to help us into the play offs.

He was a regular last season, but broke his arm in the home win over Walsall on April 10 this year, and a month later found himself rather surprisingly released. His painful exit against the Saddlers looked like being our last sight of him - until this week's happy reunion.

No Easy Ride For Lennie

Lennie Lawrence has conjured up the odd miracle in his time as a football manager, but if he can lead Luton Town to promotion this season the Second Division really will have witnessed something extraordinary!

Lawrence spent the late 1980s keeping Charlton Athletic in the top division for longer than anyone can reasonably have expected, and then led Middlesbrough to promotion before being ousted to make way for the charisma and pedigree of ex-England skipper Bryan Robson. Those colourful years at The Valley and Ayresome Park were a rare blend of success and failure and Lawrence could have been forgiven for arriving at Luton exactly four years ago this week thinking he'd seen just about everything. Not so. His 48 months in charge at Kenilworth Road have been a real education, even for this mature student of the game. Relegation, play-offs, cup giant-killings, off-field wrangling, amazing injury crises, official receivership - it's all happened at Luton since 1995. Lawrence has been criticised by the demanding Luton fans for doing badly in the transfer market, but in truth he's had so little to spend, shopping is not a task he's familiar with.

Thankfully the Luton youth scheme, marshalled by coach John Moore, has produced a high quality succession of talented teenagers - because Luton's off-field troubles have meant that no money has been available for players for many a month.

Lawrence must cast envious eyes towards the likes of Wigan, Bristol City and Reading, who have splashed out on new players in recent years - not always with successful results. And that's precisely why last weekend's splendid draw at Fulham in the FA Cup must have been hugely satisfying for the man who celebrated his 52nd birthday this week. Fulham's squad cost millions to assemble, yet they were second best at Craven Cottage to the youthful Hatters. The entire Bedfordshire side's squad of 16 that afternoon cost absolutely nothing in transfer fees and 13 of them were true home-grown players.

Luton nearly went out of existence in August while in receivership, yet within weeks of the new season starting their rather makeshift young side were up there in the top six. Naturally that exuberant start could not be maintained at full speed, but they remain realistic contenders for the play-offs. If Lawrence can keep the Premiership vultures away from his young talent and promotion is achieved, then he and chairman Cliff Bassett ought to copy their Nigerian defender Effy Sodje and start wearing one of those 'Against All Odds' bandannas!

GETTING TO KNOW... DAVID GREENE

David became the last U's player to lose the 'ever present' tag when he was suspended for last weeks Auto Windscreen Shield game at Swansea last Tuesday. The former Luton Town defender was the U's Supporters and U's player of the season last year but has, so far, struggled to reproduce the kind of form that made him so popular with the U's faithful. In recent weeks, however, the signs have been good as the U's have begun to climb away from the bottom of the Division, aided by Greeney's winner at Boundary Park last month.

As one of the Clubs longest serving players, David's experience will no doubt be called upon throughout the coming months and, who knows, he could be the U's fans number one again come the end of the season.

Q: David you must be looking forward to tonight's match against your former club?

DG: To be honest I look forward to every game but this one is a little bit special I suppose. I served my apprenticeship at Kenilworth Road and I still have some very fond memories of my time at the club. I still live in the area so I'm surrounded by Luton supporters and it would be nice to get one over my old mates. There's a bit of a Luton connection at Layer Road at the moment as we have Alan White on loan - although he won't be playing tonight - and, of course, Aaron Skelton who was also at Luton when I was there. Plus my old pal Adam Locke will be part of Luton's squad for the match and he was a former U's favourite and very popular with the U's crowd, so it should be an interesting evening. Last season we drew at Layer Road and lost in the away game, so hopefully it's our turn to gain a victory - it will be all the sweeter if we do.

Q: It's been a difficult season so far, especially in defence where there have been a number of changes. Do you think that the changes have been the major reason for our indifferent defensive record?

DG: The changes obviously haven't helped but as a unit we have been guilty of making unfortunate errors at key times in a number of games. We have had to shuffle the pack quite a few times and it is difficult to form an understanding when you make so many alterations. The majority of the changes have been enforced, and not by choice, so you have to get on

with it. I honestly believe that we are not far off getting it right, we just need to concentrate and cut out the silly mistakes.

Q: Last season you swept the board with the Player of the Year Awards but how do you feel you're doing so far this season?

DG: I think that everyone knows that I'm not playing to the best of my ability but I feel that my recent form has been a lot better. I didn't particularly enjoy the pre-season training as I felt that we were not worked hard enough and perhaps I've suffered more than most because of it. You also have to consider that we started the season with almost a new back five. 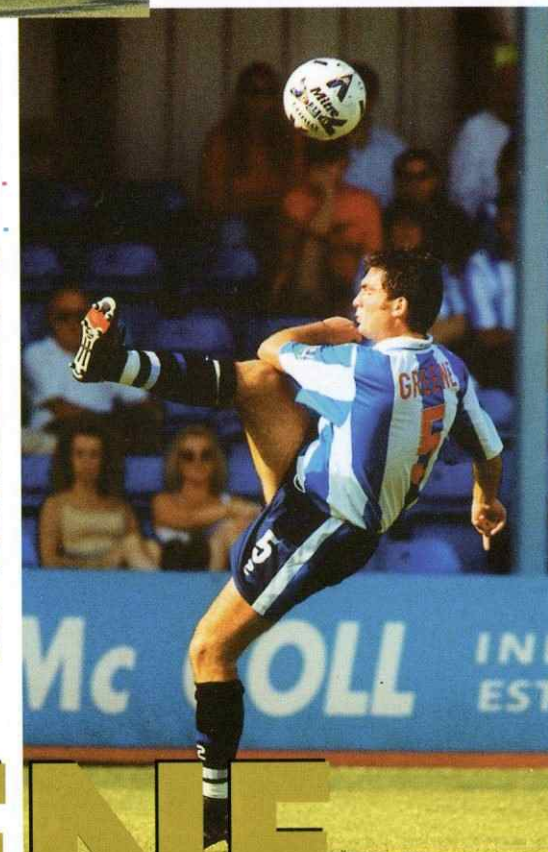
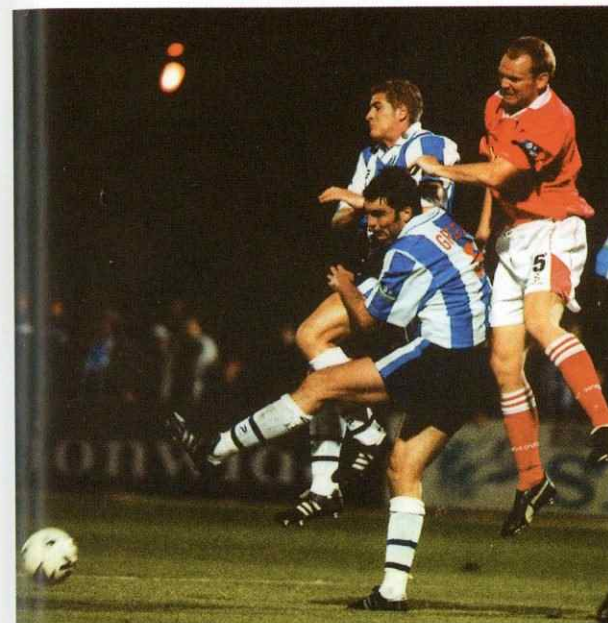
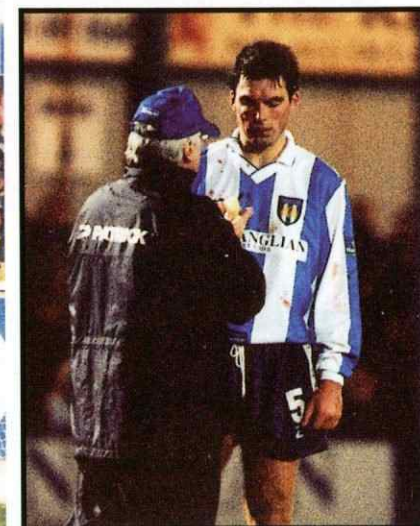
Q: You've picked up a few cuts and bruises this season - is there any truth in the rumour that you're sponsored by the stitch?

mark, and as County eased up a little, John O'Neill slipped home a consolation just before the end.

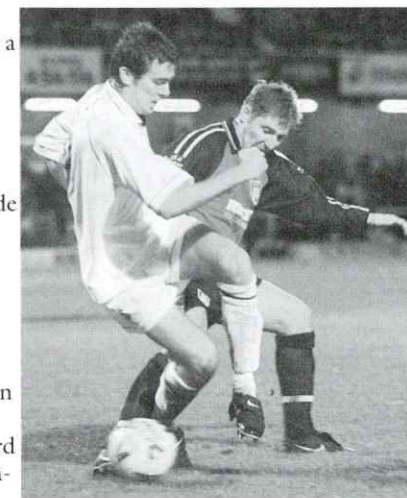

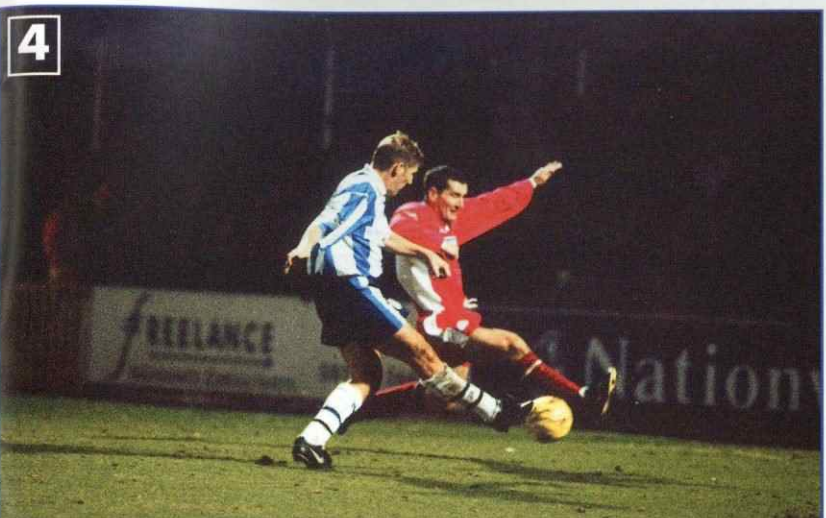
