the boss in black & white



If you read the papers plenty appears to be going on here off the pitch but, when the politics start flying around, I do what I always do and get on with the football. That is what I am paid to do - even if pay is on the agenda!

I am no stranger to working in difficult climates. When I was at both Oxford and Manchester City there were takeover bids going on, but I had to get on with the job so perhaps I am battle hardened.

The important thing is to focus on what happens on the pitch and we are facing an important run of games.

A glance at the league table shows that vital points are at stake today against Luton, then we have cup matches coming up against Canvey Island and Notts County plus a visit to league front runners Walsall.

We can do without distractions. I have fond memories of my three years as a player at Luton. I formed a midfield with former manager Ricky Hill and his successor Lil Fuccillo in a season in which we lost just four games and walked the old Second Division. The manager was David Pleat and I am still in reg-

ular contact with him at Spurs. THE LUTON OF TODAY ARE RATHER DIFFERENT. THEY ARE A YOUNG TEAM WHICH, DUE TO THE FINANCIAL STATE OF THE GAME, IS THE ROAD A LOT OF CLUBS ARE BEING FORCED TO GO DOWN.

Memories of FA Cup tie at Canvey Island last Sunday no doubt still linger but we are looking forward to next Tuesday's replay.

It is a very important game. The FA Cup is always special and I regard it as the best trophy in the world. As we are at home to non-leaguers with another home game in store for the winners (against Southend or Torquay) we would at least appear to have a chance of progressing to the third round, without wishing to take anything for granted. And then who knows?

The Islanders attracted a lot of media attention for their unlikely late comeback and all credit to them for sticking at it when they appeared to be down and out.

These games are potential pitfalls but I thought we played well but for a mad two minutes at the end.

We created chances aplenty and Jeff Minton marked his return to midfield by scoring with a shot and a header. I cannot remember him missing a penalty before but miss he did to deny him a hat-trick which would have been some comeback.

We have not exactly been over blessed with goals from the middle of the park so it was good to see not only Jeff Minton but also Dave Brammer (for the second game running) and Marc Bridge-Wilkinson find the net.

There is an art to winning games and one thing you do not do is to go 'bombing on' for more goals when the game is effectively over.

We have been creating chances and, until last Sunday been reasonably tight but, as Stoke and Colchester from our division found out these ties are never easy.

We had decent support at Canvey Island and by and large, people seem to be enjoying watching us play but quite simply we have to win more games. For all our improvement in form of late we still hover above the trap door and, although we have a couple of games in hand over teams around us, we urgently need the points.

The mood in the camp is good and the players are more confident. We also appear to be injury free which broadens the scope for selection and increases competition for places.

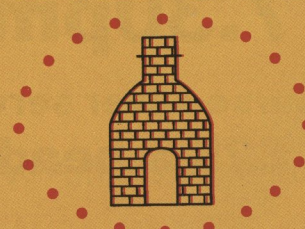

PETER OSGOOD

In a career spanning 16 years, Peter Osgood made 560 appearances for Chelsea and Southampton, scoring 220 goals and winning two FA Cup Winners Medals.

During the 69-70 season Peter was top scorer in the old first division with 31 goals.

He was a member of the England World Cup squad in Mexico and played in the Chelsea team that beat Real Madrid in 1971 to lift the European Cup Winners Trophy.

Even today he still holds the title of the last player to score in every round of the FA Cup including the final - a record he earned when Chelsea won the cup in 1970.



Of the managers concerned, none was English of course, perhaps explaining to some extent their reticence in releasing these players for a friendly. One of the individuals, however, the Scottish gentleman from Old Trafford, was actually promoted by some pundits as a possible candidate for the England job! Is it a mere coincidence that this same gentleman has never made much of an effort to sign Scottish players - having Scottish internationals in his team would perhaps have stretched his loyalties too much. Denying England is one thing but Scotland, now that's another matter!! Over the years there have been many English managers who were loath to release players to the international squad. Indeed one of the worst went on to become England manager himself and suddenly found out how it felt!

So if a number of the players aren't that bothered about England and the managers, many of whom are "foreign", don't give a monkey's, what do the fans feel about it? If I were to ask you the question, "Which would you prefer - England to win the World Cup or Vale to win the Premiership?" I suspect I wouldn't have to wait longer than thirty seconds for your considered opinion. That's not to say that we wouldn't all be absolutely delighted if the boys with three lions on their chests picked up that little gold trophy but it wouldn't actually be top of our collective wish list! Port Vale are still holding on to the second place

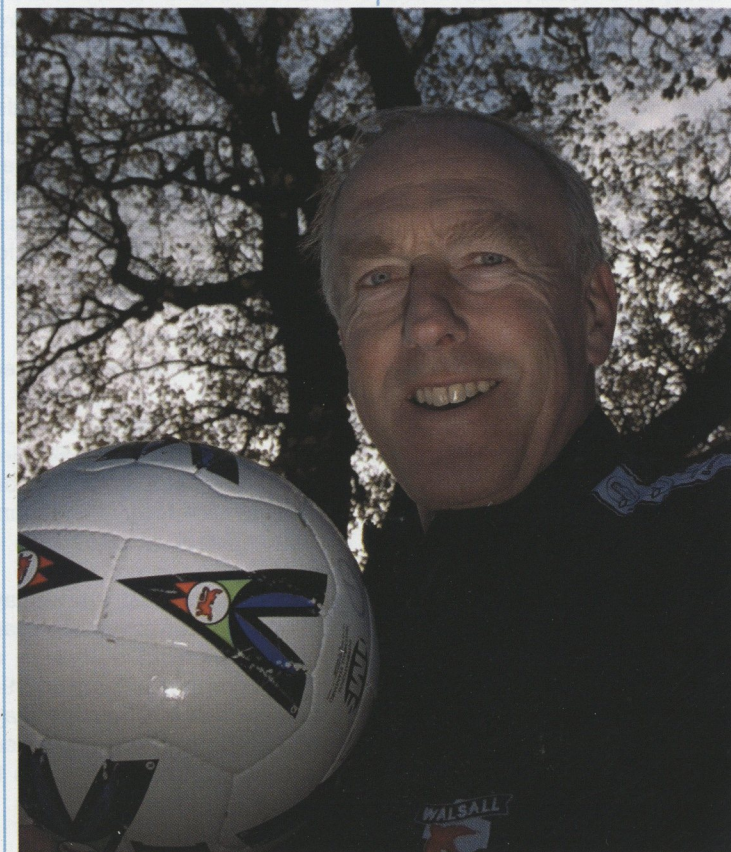
spot in the Fair Play league and are creeping up on Peterborough who are in top spot.

Luton Town, our welcome visitors to Vale Park for this afternoon's Nationwide League Division Two game, are struggling at the minute, unable to string a run of results together and as a consequence find themselves far too near the foot of the table for comfort!

They have only won two League matches in 17 starts so far this season - the first shortly after the start of the campaign, 1-0 at home against Bournemouth, and the second more recently, 3-1 v. Brentford, also at Kenilworth Road.

The Hatters have since replaced Ricky Hill, a former player, in the manager's seat with Lil Fuccillo, another ex-Town star. And he knows all too well what a difficult period from now until the turn of the year, this is going to be for himself, his coach and assistant John Moore, and moreso for his players.

Any more defeats could see the Hatters faced (even at this early stage in the proceedings) with a possible relegation battle on their hands as we enter 2001. In fact, if you glance at the League table, Luton Town are already five points adrift of the safety line!

They have been beaten in each of their last two home games - 4-3 to Wrexham (after holding a 3-0 lead with 35 minutes remaining) and 3-0 at the hands of in-form Bristol City. Their last away game resulted in a 1-1 draw against fellow strugglers Bury.

After last weekend's difficult but rewarding first round FA

Cup clash with Rushden & Diamonds of the Nationwide Conference, which ended in a 1-0 win, Luton MUST soon start recording League victories. But that's easier said than done - the Valiants know that and consequently even the club's staunchest supporters are expecting a long, hard winter at Kenilworth Road!

Former boss Ricky Hill rung the changes but to no avail. Injuries certainly didn't help matters and know his predecessor, Lil Fuccillo must inject some positive thinking and performances into his players - or else!!

In the summer Mark Stein returned to the club on a free transfer from Bournemouth. Goalkeeper Mark Ovendale, signed for £425,000, was also recruited from Dean Court, while two Sheffield Wednesday players, Peter Holmes and Dean Brennan along with Freidrich Breitenfelder on a 'free' from FC Polten moved to Kenilworth Road.

A handful of players departed, including Alan White to Colchester United, the experienced Phil Gray to Burnley, Michael McIndoe to Hereford United and Jerry Moses and Danny Tate (both released).

Fuccillo, who had a fine playing career at Kenilworth Road, was previously in charge of Peterborough United (1993-94) and is confident that his players will battle on and subsequently gain enough points to escape the drop.

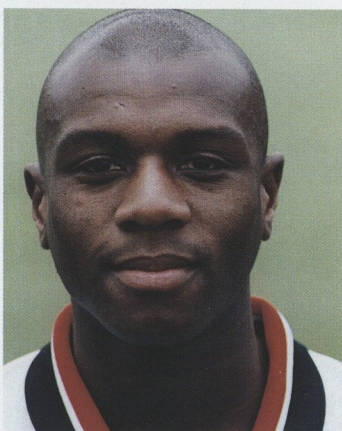
He will not have a full squad to

choose from today (owing to injuries and suspension) but those players who are likely to be in contention for a place in the line-up are as follows (listed in A-Z order)....

Islington-born goalkeeper **NATHAN ABBEY** (22) has graduated through the ranks at the club. He started this season with 45 first-team appearances under his belt, but now has newcomer Mark Ovendale to contest the number one position with.

ROCKY BAPTISTE (23) joined the Hatters last month and made his debut for the club in that 4-3 home defeat against Wrexham. A purposeful player with good vision, he is looking forward to making a name for himself this season

EMMERSON BOYCE (21) is another former YTS graduate who has risen up from intermediate class to make the Hatters' first XI. A talented right-back or central defender, he has made around 40 first team appearances to date and is on a contract that will keep him at the club until the summer of 2002.

Dublin-born midfielder **DEAN BRENNAN** (20) did not make the first team at Hillsborough but he has already figured in the Hatters' League side this season and looks to have a promising future ahead of him. He had been with the Owls since leaving school.

STUART DOUGLAS, aged 22, from Enfield, plays up front. Decidedly quick, with aggression and willpower, he has already scored 20 goals for the Hatters in well over 140 senior appearances. He has been a professional at Kenilworth Road since May 1996.

ANDREW FOTIADIS comes from Hitchen. He is a 23 year-old forward who is another graduate from the excellent Luton Town youth academy! A former England schoolboy international, he began this season with nine goals to his credit (in 88 appearances - 54 as a substitute). He is one for the future.

Right-back **STUART FRASER** (20) was born in Edinburgh and has developed via the YTS at Kenilworth Road. A resilient performer, he has now made over 25 first team appearances with plenty more to come!

LIAM GEORGE (Town's hero with the winning goal against the 'Diamonds' in the FA Cup) is yet another player who has risen through the ranks at Luton. The 21 year-old local-born striker has already appeared in 75 first team matches (16 goals) and has collected international honours with the Republic of Ireland under-21 side having

earlier represented his country at youth team level. He is a tireless and gifted player with a lot to offer.

Finnish international midfielder **PETRI HELIN** (24) was signed at the end of last month and has made an impressive start to his career in English football. He scored Town's goal in their 1-1 draw at Gigg Lane and looks a very useful acquisition.

PETER HOLMES (like Brennan) failed to make the first XI at Hillsborough. Aged 19, he is a midfielder from Bishop Auckland who is likely to be fighting it out in the engine-room for quite a while.

MARVIN JOHNSTON, on the other hand, is a vastly experienced professional with more than 400 senior appearances safely under his belt with the Hatters. Born in sight of Wembley Stadium in 1968, Johnson (32 last month) joined Luton Town on leaving school and signed professional forms at Kenilworth Road in November 1986. A very consistent performer, he is the

team captain and occupies a defensive position, although he can push forward into midfield if required.

Zaire-born **TRESOR KANDOL** (19) has developed through the youth system at Kenilworth Road to establish himself in the Hatters' first XI. A positive forward with a good attitude, he has already appeared in 15 first-class matches, having joined the club as a professional in September 1998.

ADAM LOCKE, aged 30, has been in League football for a decade. He joined Luton in August 1999, having previously assisted Crystal Palace, Southend United, Colchester United and Bristol City. A hard-working, forceful midfielder, he comes from Croydon and has now amassed well over 300 senior appearances at club level.

GAVIN MCGOWAN (24) from Blackheath (London) was a trainee with Arsenal before joining the Hatters in July 1998 on a free transfer from Highbury following two loan spells at Kenilworth Road.

PAUL McLAREN (23) from High Wycombe, joined Luton as a youngster in 1992 and turned professional two years later. A midfielder, with grim determination, he has been plagued by injuries over the last year but is now back to full fitness and eager to add to his tally of 175 senior appearances.

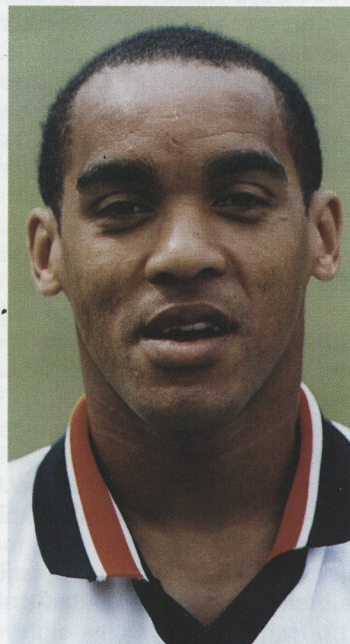
Goalkeeper MARK OVENDALE (26) from Leicester, started his career with Wisbech Town. From there he joined Northampton Town (1994) and made just eight appearances for the Cobblers before dropping down a peg to play for Barry Town. In May 1998 he re-entered League action when Bournemouth signed him for £30,000 and over the next two seasons he made 111 major League and Cup appearances for the Cherries before joining the Hatters last summer.

ANDRE SCARLETT (from Wembley) is a 20 year-old right-sided midfielder with heaps of energy and commitment. He has risen through the ranks at Kenilworth Road (like so many of his colleagues) and has now played in more than a dozen senior games - with plenty more to come one suspects.

Seasoned striker **MARK STEIN** is back 'home' at Luton where he started his League career

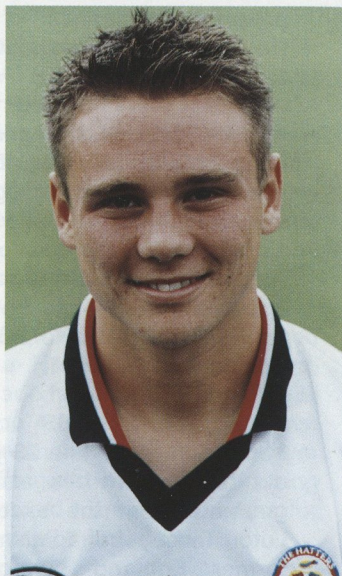

Solid, competitive, strong on the ground and in the air, Watts has now appeared in some 200 first-class matches and is regarded as a pillar of strength in the Hatters' back-division.

in charge Lil Fuccillo

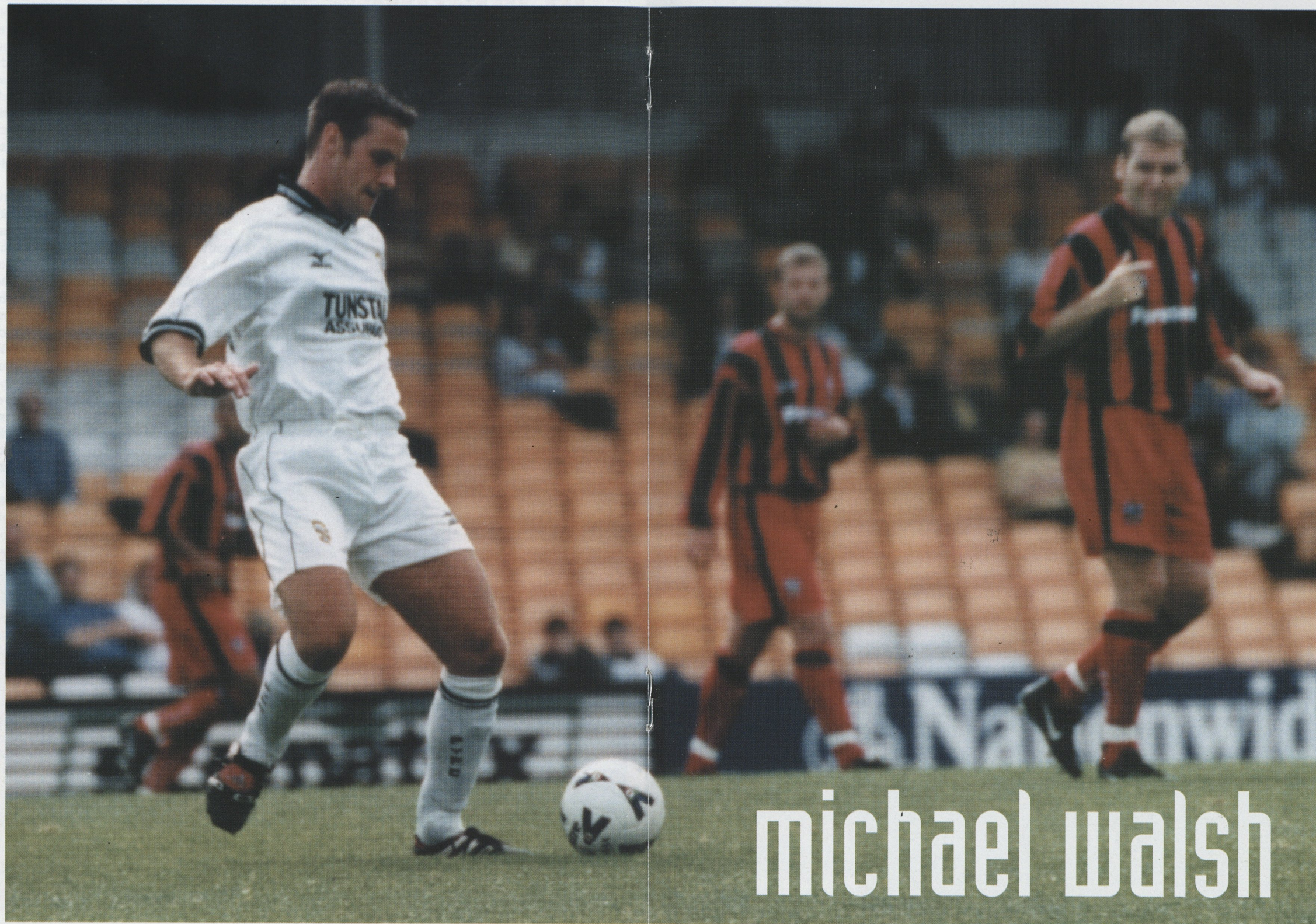


Following a brief spell as Ricky Hill's assistant, **PASQUALE (LIL) FUCCILLO** took over the reins at Kenilworth Road a fortnight ago after the Hatters had been beaten 3-0 at home by Bristol City.

Born in Bedford in May 1956, he joined Luton town as a professional in July 1974. After scoring 24 goals in 160 League games for the Hatters he went over to the States to assist Tulsa Roughnecks in April 1983, returning soon afterwards to sign for Southend United. In August 1985 he was transferred to Peterborough and then had spells with Cambridge United, Oxford United and in Malta before returning to London Road where he became Posh's assistant-manager in January 1991, taking over as team manager in December 1992. He gained his only club honour with Luton back in 1982 - winning a Second Division championship medal. He was replaced by John Still at London Road in 1994 and all told Fuccillo who was a competent, hard-working midfield player, accumulated 306 appearances in the Football League (33 goals).

in fact.....

- The Hatters hold the record for the biggest win in Third Division (S) soccer - 12-0 at home against Bristol Rovers in 1936. Joe Payne scored 10 goals in that game (also a record).
- In the mid 1920s the Hatters went 39 home League games without defeat (a record).
- In contrast during the late 1890s they played 32 League games away from home and failed to register a single win.
- Former Charlton Athletic goalkeeper Sam Bartram was manager of Luton Town from 1960 to 1962.

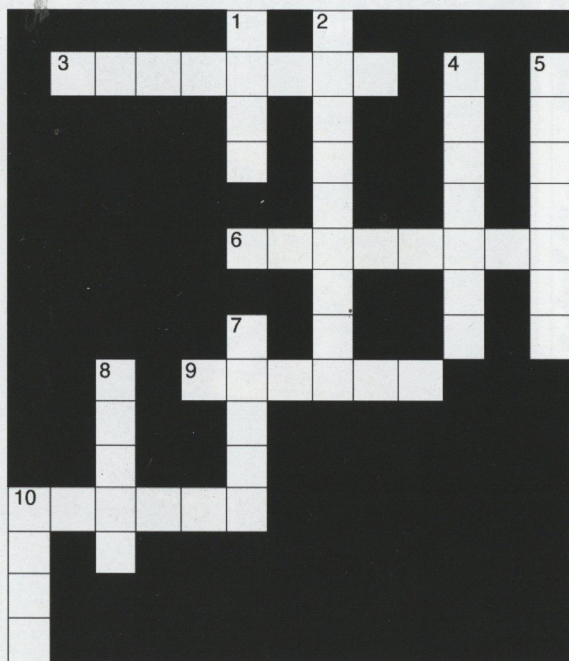

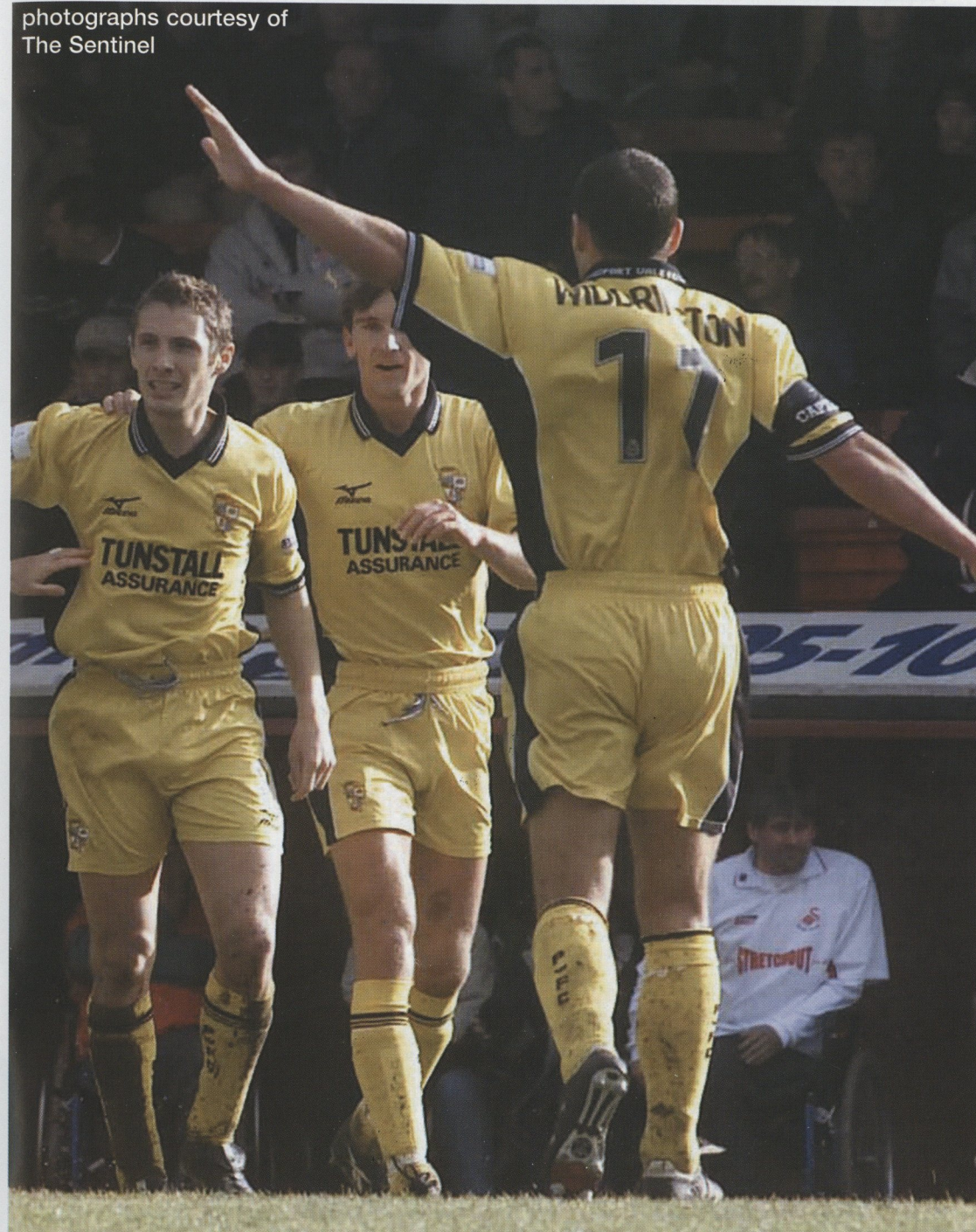

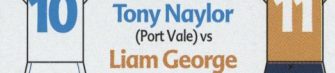


Goalscoring Head 2 Head

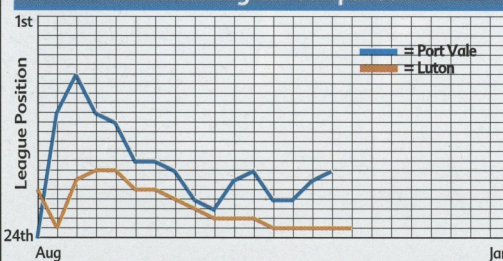

half full of teenagers, that would have done their confidence the world of good wouldn't it?!

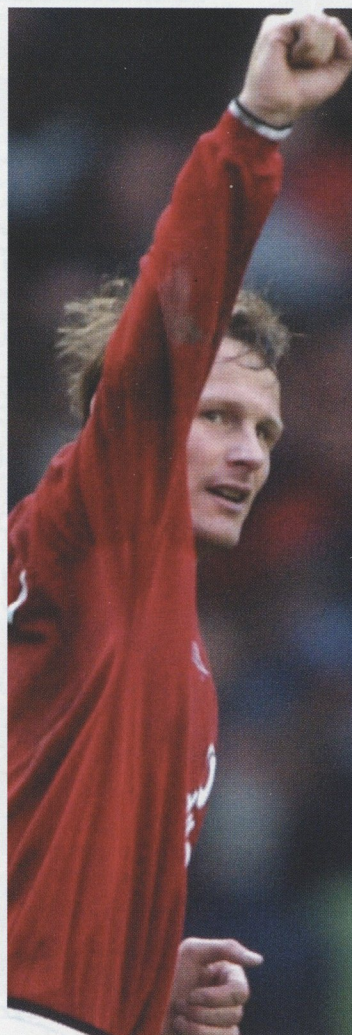

In January 1985, a third round FA Cup-tie took place between Burton Albion, then based in the Northern Premier League and sponsored by the brewery, Ind Coope, met Leicester City, who by coincidence were also sponsored by a brewery - Ind Coope!

Albion opted to play the game at The Baseball Ground, home of Derby County, yes, you've guessed it, a club sponsored by a brewery - Bass!

With almost 22,500 fans inside the ground, the atmosphere was rowdy from the start with several supporters from both the participating teams and from this home club chanting abuse at each other.

One chant echoed from behind the goal: 'Any Derby County supporters you stand by, 'cos after the match you're gonna die.'

Leicester scored - Burton equalised - and the scores remained level until a critical incident occurred just before half-time when things started to get out of control. Some boisterous fans began tossing beer/lager cans onto the pitch, along with a few spinning coins and what seemed like a large slice of wood. This flew towards the Burton goalkeeper Paul Evans and hit him on the back of the head. He needed treatment but against doctors orders, he carried on manfully, head plastered up Apache-style.

A group of supporters, who had paid good money to sit in the main stand, got up and left the ground at half-time as police moved in to try and calm things down!

During the second half luckless Burton conceded five more goals (three in the last 14 minutes) to lose the tie 6-1. Had Evans been completely fit it is doubtful whether Leicester would have netted three times. But we shall never know.

The chairman and directors of Burton Albion protested to the FA about the final scoreline, claiming that several Leicester City supporters had been responsible for missile-throwing and creating an intimidating atmosphere. The FA duly called a meeting and upheld Burton's protest....and when the draw for the 4th round was made it was incorrect....it should have read Burton Albion or Leicester city v. Carlisle United and NOT Leicester City v. Carlisle United.

This time, instead of a large audience made up of yobs and trouble-makers, the snowy terraces were occupied by 20 or so ball boys with 120 other spectators (mainly representing both clubs) sitting in the main stand.

This time, after a plucky display by the non-League side, the result went in favour of Leicester City by a goal (scored by Paul Ramsey) to nilwell they should have won really with a certain Gary Lineker, Alan Smith and Ian Wilson in their ranks!

Founded in 1926 their record was undistinguished until their meteoric rise of recent years. They have made huge progress both on and off the field. One way of knowing this is by looking at their excellent website. This contains a huge amount of information about Canvey Island with latest news about the club, club history, pen portraits of players as well as photographs of players and ground, plus a lively discussion board.

The Park Lane ground is also making progress, as it will have to do if they are to enter the Conference and then the League.

Manager Jeff King has been behind this spectacular progress through the leagues, although he would say it has been a great team effort. 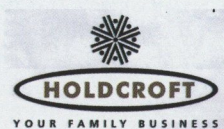

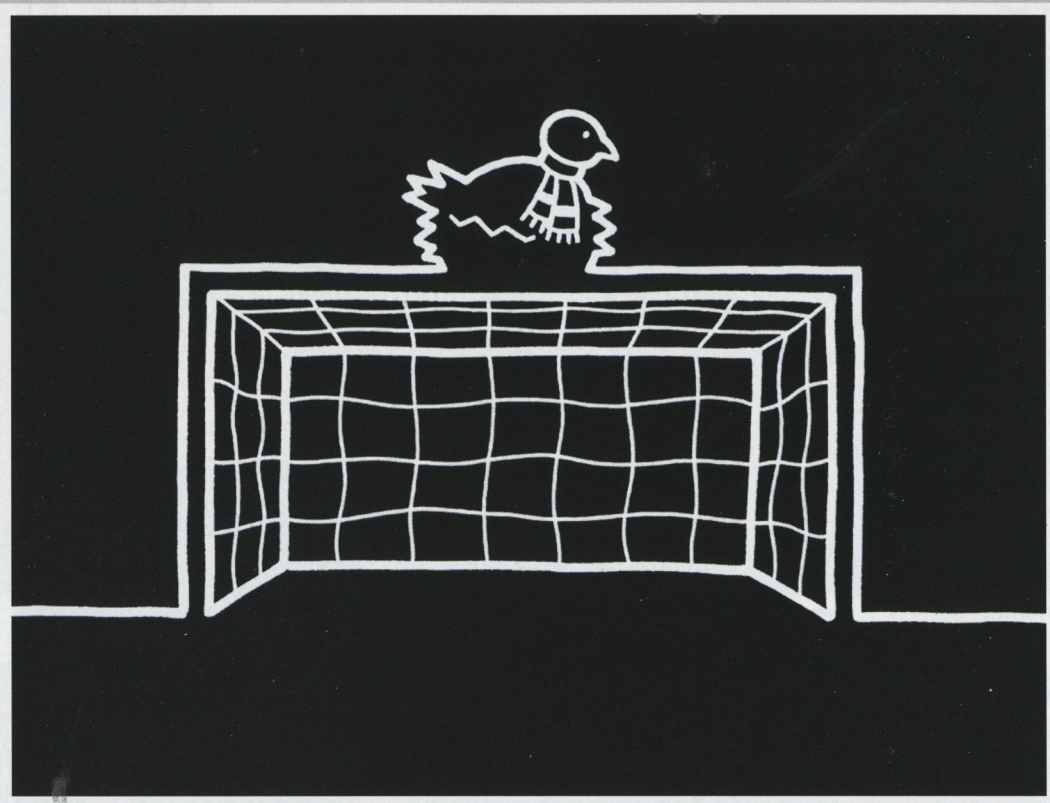

This game played on a perfect pitch at Bilston Town was a relatively ordinary game with a number of major incidents. Wolves started the night in 4th place with Vale a point and a place behind. All the early pressure came from Wolves with chances going wide of the post and bar and Donnelly getting in a saving tackle in the first ten minutes. However this was the prelude to the lead being taken by Wolves in the tenth minute as Burns failed to cut out a ball out to the wing and Mohamed Kamara, Titi's cousin, swept the ball into the middle where Proudlock sidefooted it home from close range

Vale had been finding problems relieving the pressure as, with no recognised strikers selected in the starting line-up, the ball was coming back into the Vale half very quickly. After the goal Vale did start to press a little more and a Donnelly cross was plucked from O'Callaghan's feet. Twiss missed an opportunity in the middle of the half when he met a cross to the far post with little conviction but with all the bodies in midfield it had become a little tight on a relatively small ground.

The incidents of note began with five minutes of the half left as Vale defended a corner. Burton in optimistically trying to get a head to the ball only succeeded in heading Alexandersson in the face and the Swede, on trial at Molineux, went down immediately.

The call for a stretcher came quickly but it was a long time before one was found and Terry Connor the Wolves coach was keen to see the damage himself.

The referee had other ideas and words were exchanged before Connor was escorted from the pitch and told to go to the stands. Eventually Alexandersson was stretched off and taken by ambulance to hospital for a broken nose and other damage and the game restarted. Just before the half-time whistle blew the referee noticed Connor was standing in the tunnel area and the game stopped again as Connor was dispatched out of sight to cool down.

Within two minutes of the re-start Vale were level as out of nowhere Brisco hit a 30-yarder which Stowell got his finger tips to, but was unable to stop hitting the top left hand corner of the net. Vale almost fashioned another good chance two minutes later as O'Callaghan almost controlled a difficult cross from Eyre but Wolves regained supremacy without scoring.

The second injury victim could not be put down to an accident however as Brisco turned from hero to villain as a flying two footed lunge in the corner of the park took out the Wolves substitute Clyde. Stowell and Kamara became involved with Brisco and the referee's red card for Brisco calmed matters down as Clyde was carried from the pitch and eventually to the dressing room as the Wolves club doctor was called for again.

Vale's ten men came under further pressure but another saving tackle from Donnelly halted the main threat from Wolves before at the end of normal time Proudlock was booked for a late challenge on Donnelly which was out of step

with the game in general. The game was heading for draw which was the fairest result all round. If Vale are going to call on the young strikers such as Farr and Olaoye, if Naylor or Viljanen are injured, they cannot be left sitting on the reserve team bench forever.
