


I thought the players proved a point last Saturday-our approach play was just as good as it has been in previous games, but the difference


30 YEARS AGO.



Luton Town Football Club was formed by the merger of two local sides, Excelsior and Wanderers, in 1885; originally playing at the former's ground, Dallow Lane. In 1891 they became the first fully professional club in the south of England becoming members of the Southern League in 1894. A move to a second ground at Dunstable Road in 1897 coincided with them joining the Second Division of the Football League but after only three seasons they returned to the Southern League on deciding not to apply for re-election. In 1905 they moved grounds again to Kenilworth Road, which remains their home to this day.

Along with most of the other clubs in the Southern League they were elected to the new Third Division South of the Football League in 1920, where they stayed until promoted to Division Two as champions in 1937. They maintained their Second Division status until 1955 when they were promoted to Division One and in 1959 reached the F.A. Cup Final only to lose 1-2

to Nottingham Forest. After this they slipped out of the First Division in 1960 and down the divisions descending to the Fourth by 1965 (when the Quakers first met them). They then had an equally rapid rise back up the leagues after winning the Fourth Division Championship in 1968, being runners-up in Division Three in 1970 and Division Two in 1974 to return to the top flight (albeit for just one season). Seven more seasons in the Second ended in 1982 with a return to Division One, where they survived for ten years, reaching Wembley twice in Football League Cup Finals. In 1988 they won the trophy beating Arsenal 3-2 and the following year were runners-up to Nottingham Forest (again!). In 1985 they became one of the first clubs to lay an artificial plastic pitch but after six seasons reverted to grass in 1991. They had four seasons in the new Division One from 1992 to 1996 but then dropped to Division Two, where they have remained for the last five seasons.

A commanding centre-half who joined Luton as a YTS in 1996.

Rocky Baptiste - Forward

Only started playing football at 28. Signed from Conference club Wealdstone in October. On contract with Luton until the end of the season.

Emmerson Boyce - Defender

Signed as a YTS boy in the summer of 1995. Made the seniors last season.

Friedrich Breitenfelder - Midfielder

Began with Rapid Vienna as a 15 year old schoolboy and went to Kenilworth Road after impressing in pre-season trials and his last club, FCM St Polten, went broke.

Dean Brennan - Midfielder

Came from Sheffield Wednesday's youth squad on a free. Doubly useful because this midfielder can also play in attack.

Stuart Douglas - Forward

A striker with excellent pace. Scored on his debut, when he was 17, against Oldham in 1995. He can also create chances for his striking partners.

Andrew Fotiadis - Forward

An old fashioned centre forward with good physique, power and a concentrated determination to score goals.

Stuart Fraser - Defender

Stylish defender and former skipper of the Luton youth team.

Liam George - Forward

Full of pace and nimble footwork this striker came through the ranks after joining as a Luton schoolboy. Luton's leading scorer last season.

Petri Helin - Midfielder

Finnish international who won his 18th cap in the draw with England during the World Cup qualifying campaign. Was captain of his old club, Jokerit of Helsinki.

Peter Holmes - Midfielder

Born up the road in Bishop Peter joined Luton from Sheffield Wednesday youth squad. A good two-footed midfielder.

Marvin Johnson - Defender

Longest serving player at Kenilworth Road, now in his 13th year. Cheerful skipper of the team he joined as a schoolboy.

Tresor Kandol - Forward

A lanky striker who was a YTS at Luton in 1997 after being spotted playing schoolboy football.

Kent Karlsen - Defender

A dominating centre-half who is also a Norwegian Under-21 international. Won a Norwegian FA Cup winner's medal with his previous club Vaaerenga.

Adam Locke - Midfielder

Well travelled in football terms having previously played with Crystal Palace, Southend and Colchester before signing on a free from Bristol City in the Summer of '99.

Gavin McGowan - Defender

Signed from Arsenal after having had two previous loan spells at Luton in June 1998.

Paul McLaren - Midfielder

Forceful and always ready to back up attacks Paul was offered pro terms at 17.

Lee Nogan - Forward

Ex-Darlow lad who followed his younger brother, Kurt, to Luton. Previously with Brentford, Southend and Watford.

Mark Ovendale - Goalkeeper

Signed from Bournemouth for an undisclosed fee. Previously with Wisbech, Northampton and Barry Town.

Andre Scarlett - Winger

Helped set up one goal and scored another on his league debut against Oldham in October '98 when he was just 18.

Matthew Spring - Midfielder

Spring was a driving force in the Luton side that reached the FA Youth Cup semi-finals in 1997.

Mark Stein - Forward

Returned to Kenilworth Road after an absence of nearly 20 years this summer when he was signed from Bournemouth.

Mathew Taylor - Wing-back

Came through the schoolboy ranks and quickly established himself in the first team.

Peter Thomson - Forward

Spent 18 months at Gigg Lane then went and played in the Conference before moving to Holland. Joined Luton in September for £100,000.

Julian Watts - Defender


Joined a free transfer from Bristol City last season. This reliable defender also played for Rotherham, Sheffield Wednesday and Leicester.

Adrian Whitbread - Defender

Currently on loan from Portsmouth where he had been captain for four years. Spent some time in the Premiership with West Ham.



Phil Brumwell

Last Weekend Phil Brumwell returned to Feethams and was given a warm 'welcome back'. It didn't go unnoticed and as our featured player this week Phil wanted to begin by thanking YOU, the fans. "The reception I got was fantastic, it was a lot bigger than I thought I would get because I had a good relationship with the fans. It was awesome, it was fantastic, there was a great ovation and it was unbelievable, and it was a great feeling, so it's nice to be back!"

So what went wrong at Hull, that's where Phil was on Loan under Brian Little "Well I went there and there was a few promises that I would be playing football, but a new formation was played to start the season and I didn't get many chances to play in the first team and things got worse. I think it's worked out for the best in the end. I knew the club was struggling financially so they let me go to get me off the wage roll!"

It's not that long since he was in the side that lost at Wembley on that wet Friday in May and for Phil it's still a game he recalls vividly and struggles to understand how they lost "I think especially with the squad we had last year the players we had around us, I was still in shock of how we didn't get automatic promotion, but then we got a second bite of the cherry at Wembley.

We dominated the whole game and we should have won that as well, I was devastated because things might have worked out different for the other lads by getting promoted into the second division."

Today sees the visit of Luton Town from the second division and everybody is excited at the prospect of a good run in the FA Cup, "Yeah, it would be nice to get the win in the cup, but it's not the most important thing of our season, obviously the league is, but to get a good cup run gets the fans to Feethams, and it could give us a bit more confidence in the league. Every small team is desperate to get into that third round because that's when the big guns come in, and you know you could be drawn against any team from Manchester United to Liverpool."

One familiar face in the Luton squad is Lee Nogan and Phil thinks he could be the catalyst for Lee Nogan's side "Yeah, I know they're struggling and I know Lee Nogan's joined and there are a lot of young lads and it should be a good game. They're struggling at the bottom of the second division and we're good at home so obviously it's going to be a cracking football game."

Finally what's the spirit like in the camp, what with a bad run of results and all. "I went back last Thursday, a few of the lads said things were a bit down, but I went in they had a bit of a laugh and a joke and the atmosphere was quite good and obviously getting that win on Saturday, the team was buzzing, but we have to follow on from that win, it's got to be a couple of wins on the bounce to get things back up and get us working back up that league."

Phil Brumwell was talking to Ian Kenyon from 95FM BBC Radio Cleveland, the only place to get full coverage of the Quakers each and every game of the season.

What ever happened to

John Downie & Barry Hawkes

Much travelled inside-forward John Downie was an experienced member of Dick Duckworth's squad at Feethams.

Initially with Lanark ATC, he signed professional for Bradford PA in December 1944 and was 'Bevin Boy' at Castleford Colliery. He topped their goalscoring charts in 1947/48 and moved to Manchester United for a record £18,000 in March 1949, starring in their 1951/52 League Championship success. Sold to Luton Town for £10,000 in August 1953, he scored 12 times in 26 second Division games for today's visitors prior to joining Hull City in July 1954.

He moved to King's Lynn in July 1955, then had a spell with Wisbech Town and featured in their 1957/58 FA Cup run. Returning to Football League action with Mansfield Town in October 1958, he joined Darlington in May 1959 and scored twice in 15 Fourth Division outings for the Quakers prior to joining Hyde United in July 1960. He subsequently played for Mossley, Stalybridge Celtic and Halifax Town reserves, then ran two newsagents in Bradford until retiring in July 1985 and is now a keen member of West Bradford Golf Club.

Versatile inside-forward Barry Hawkes played alongside Bobby Baxter in Darlington's attack.

A former Huddersfield Town amateur, he had spells with Shotton Colliery and Murton prior to joining his older brother Ken at Luton Town on a two months trial in September 1955. Following national service in the infantry based in Germany, he made his league debut for Luton at home to Manchester United in April 1959 and gained further first-team opportunities prior to that season's FA Cup Final. His brother played at Wembley and is now a Luton season-ticket holder.

Barry featured in the hatters' 1959/60 relegation battle and made eight First Division appearances for today's visitors before moving to Darlington on a free transfer in June 1960. Scoring three goals in 13 League outings while at Feethams, he joined Hartlepools United in July 1961 and played alongside his brother again at Bedford Town and St. Neots Town while employed as a progress chaser at Vauxhall Motors. He subsequently played for Horden CW while as a sales rep for Tudor Crisps and has settled in Peterlee, now a self employed electronic cash registers salesman.



DARLINGTON GAIN STEWARDING AWARD

Last season, The Football League, The Football Association and the FA Premier League joined forces to launch a new award called the Football Stewarding Qualification.

Darlington is the latest club to achieve this accolade and the award will be presented at this afternoons game.

The Football Stewarding Qualification is designed to measure how effectively stewards' training has been carried out at clubs. The initiative has been developed in consultation with the Football Licensing Authority and the Football Safety Officers' Association, with financial support provided by the Football Foundation.

The Football Stewarding Qualification Scheme was launched in September 1999, when clubs were presented with details of the criteria they would need to satisfy in order to qualify for the award. Applying clubs are visited by a National Verification Manager appointed by the football authorities and the award is given to those clubs whose arrangements for the training and assessment of their stewards meet the criteria laid down.

Football League Security Advisor, Jack Crawford, who will present the award to Darlington said:


