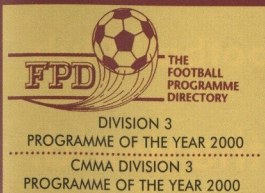

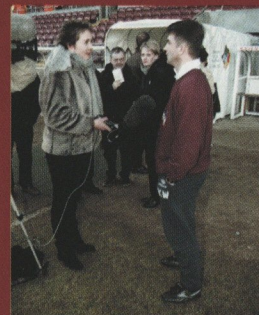

The Views Of The Manager

Good afternoon and welcome back to Sixfields for our second successive home local derby. Luton Town are our visitors and a warm welcome to everyone connected with the Hatters. It's been a season of struggle so far for the Hatters, but at this time of the season they will be scrapping for every point to try and stay in the Division so we know we will have to be at our best to claim the points.

This is my first chance to welcome Lee Canoville to Sixfields, although he is now half way through his month on loan here. Lee is a good athlete. He's 6ft plus and works hard with good pace. It's a big compliment to us that Arsenal trust us with their younger players. They respected the way we helped Liam Chilvers and they were keen for Lee to come here. He can play in a number of positions, and he gives us good options. I take it as a real compliment that Arsenal are prepared to let us help with the development of their younger players and it shows what high regard they hold us in.

Our last home game was the local derby with Peterborough

United and it was great to see more than 7,000 in the ground. I would like to thank all of you who attended and supported Claret Day 2 and those of you who really got behind us. It was a good game, and in the end I think a point was a fair result. We had a number of chances, and we came very close to snatching a win right at the death when Marco Gabbiadini's shot hit the post, but Peterborough also had their chances and with everything considered, I think we would all have settled for 4 points from the 2 games against the Posh. Marco Gabbiadini came back in to the starting line up for the last home game because I felt the time was right to bring him back in to the line up. He has worked very hard since he has been here and his attitude has been first class. Over the last few weeks, we have seen the real Marco as he has begun to find top form again. He can twist and turn defenders and cause problems for anyone. As we all know, he is a quality finisher and it says a lot for him that he has been patient and knuckled down before getting his chance over the last couple of weeks. As I said at the Media Conference when we announced the signing of Marco, Jamie Forrester and Chris Hargreaves last summer, we have 3 quality strikers on our books with Steve Howard, and I would pick whatever combination of the 3 suited us best at any one time. That is the way it has been and the way it will be over the last 17 games.

As I said to the players after last week's draw at Stoke, it was an excellent performance and a good result, but we need to start turning our draws in to wins and our one points in to three. We have been very hard to beat recently but we maybe need to rediscover that killer instinct that we had earlier in the season. Our performance at the Britannia was excellent and I felt we deserved all 3 points. Stoke had not been beaten in 10 games but we went there and passed them off the pitch.

As has been well reported over the last 10 days or so, I have placed Richard Green on the transfer list. This is not something I have done lightly, and is absolutely no reflection on Richard or his performances. Unfortunately, I will not be in a position to offer Richard a contract for next season, so I think it's only right and proper that we make that clear now rather than keep everyone hanging on. By making this announcement now, it gives Richard every opportunity to get himself fixed up for next season now, rather than in the summer when it could be more difficult. Richard has done very well for us. He arrived here just over a year ago and has hardly missed a game through injury. He came in at a crucial stage last season when we lost Lee Howey to injury and his performances were a key factor in us gaining promotion. He will still be involved until he does leave, but I think this is the right, open and honest way to do things and I am being as fair as

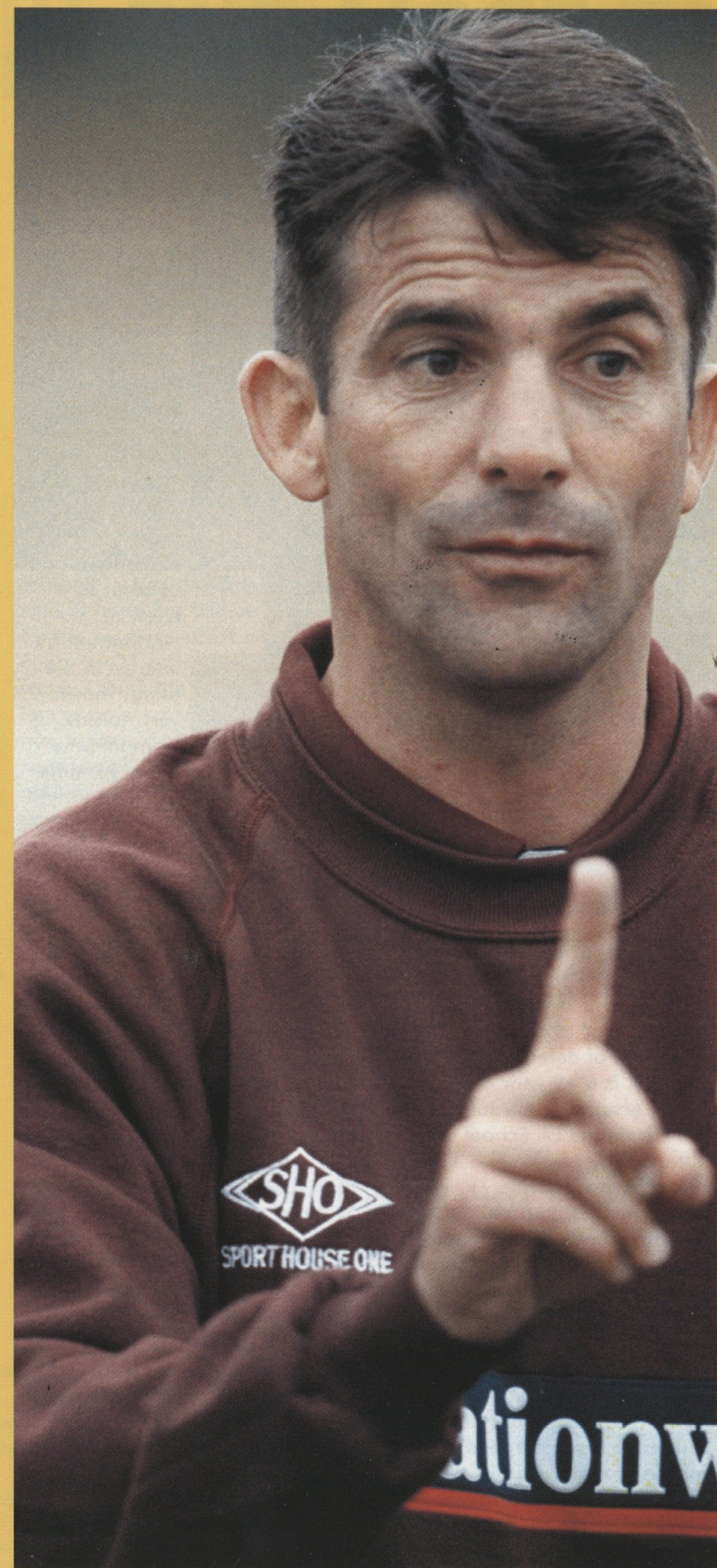
possible to the player. He showed what a great pro he is with a superb performance at Stoke last weekend. I brought him back in to the side because I wanted to match Stoke man for man over the pitch and we changed our system. Richard was superb at the back, and I know that whenever selected, he will continue to give his all for the cause.

As you know, Tuesday night's game with Swansea was postponed because of a waterlogged pitch. Pete Walton attended early on Tuesday morning to call the game off. The decision was made in good time to stop Swansea travelling although I must say I have never seen conditions as wet as they were here on Tuesday.

I hope that Roy Hunter may be back in action for the reserves by the end of the month. It's been a frustrating time for Roy, but the time is right now for him to push on. The plan is for him to build his fitness in the reserves and to try and get a couple of first team games under his belt before the end of the season.

He has been a regular in Arsenal's reserve side this season, and played in their recent game against Nottingham Forest reserves, where Brazilian Edu made his first appearance in English football. Canoville, who has been allocated squad number 2, will

This move is no reflection on Richard or his performances, it's just that I am starting to turn my mind towards next season. I will not be offering Richard a contract for next season so I think it's fairer on the club and the player to tell him now and let him try and fix

himself up elsewhere. It will be easier for him now than in the summer. He has done a terrific job for us but I am looking to the future and for younger players of the likes of Richard Hope to take their chance. Richard Green will still be involved in the squad until he leaves because he has done very well here. There's been no fall out or disagreement behind the scenes. I like to do things right here and to be fair, open and honest with people and I think making this decision now rather than later on is being fair with Richard."

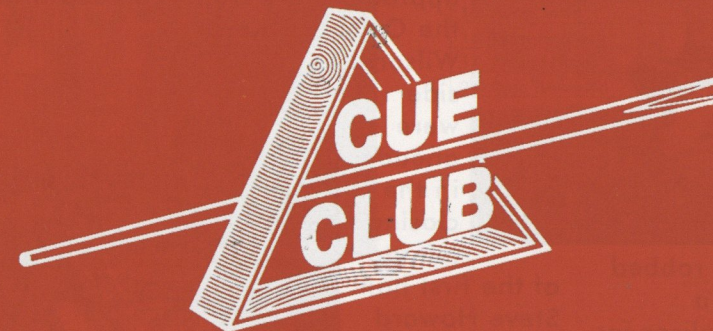
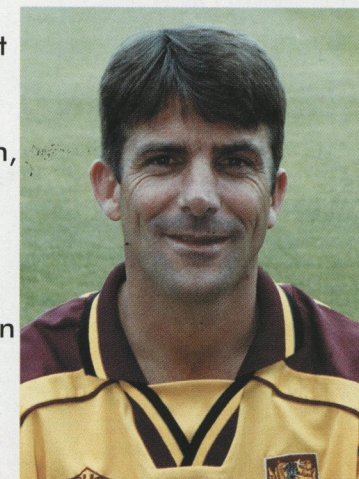

Brentford v NTFC

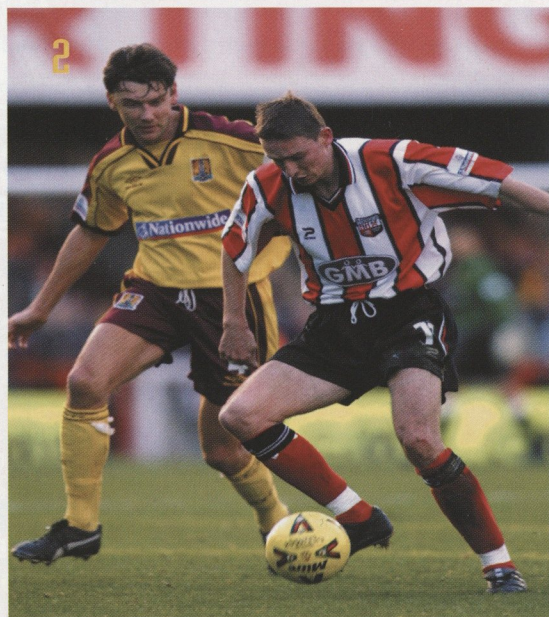

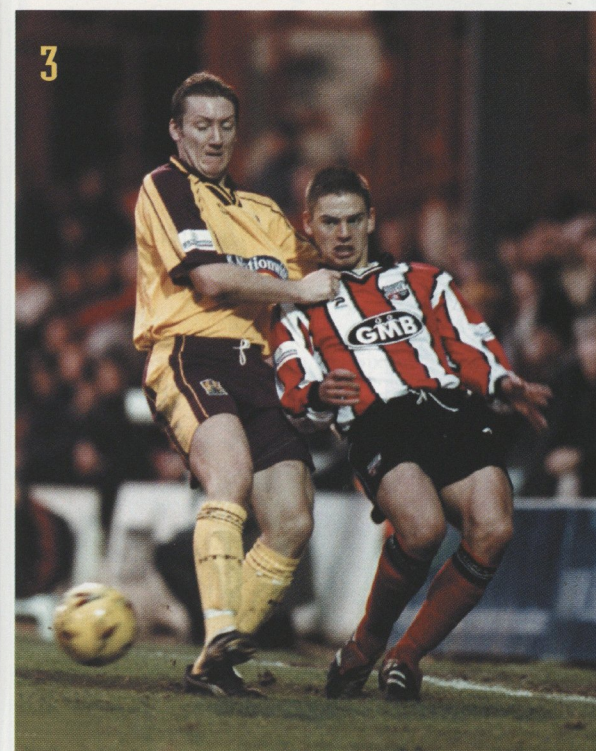

Spotlight On Our Opponents

A DECADE or so after mixing with this country's football elite, Luton Town had to cope with all sorts of difficulties in the last few years, including almost going out of existence. Their participation in the 1999/2000 season was in doubt until a few hours before it kicked off. For Hatters supporters that summer was a mixture of gripping fear, nagging worry, and eventually huge relief as disputes in the boardroom led to the club being put into receivership. It was not until 15 hours before the season's first league match that Luton knew for sure they would still be in the Football League. Eventually, new ownership stabilised things, and Luton had a reasonable season, finishing 13th in the Second Division.

But then came another summer of change. Another new owner took over, with Mike Watson-Challis returning to the club where he had been a director in Luton's glory years, a decade when they flourished in the old First Division, now the Premiership. He and his new colleagues on the board were determined to make a fresh start, and they began it by recruiting a new manager, Ricky Hill, who had been a hugely gifted and popular player in the 70s and 80s. Hill brought in a new assistant, Chris Ramsey, and together they are plotting a revival of fortunes for a club which once competed with the best, and would have been in Europe but for the UEFA ban following the Heysel Stadium disaster. Their hopes came to nothing, and with Luton languishing close to the bottom of the Second Division by November, both left the club, to be replaced by two former players already on the staff, Lil Fuccillo and John Moore. Luton went into the 1990s as a top club - they had ten glorious years in what is now the Premiership, and won the Littlewoods Cup by beating Arsenal in the 1988 final. But then came a decline, with a club in an antiquated stadium unable to compete with the big-money outfits. Missing the first season of the Premiership was bad enough, through relegation just before it was set up. Further relegation, to Division Two, was another blow. The summer of 1999 saw receivers force through unwelcome player sales, and restrict recruitment of new ones, but Luton got through the campaign without flirting with the relegation that was forecast in many quarters. And now, with a new board and management team in place, and plans taking shape for a new stadium, the supporters hope that at long last the Hatters really are set to move ahead again.

One of the oldest football clubs in England - they were the first in the south to turn professional - Luton Town have seen just about everything in football in more than a century of ups and downs.

Spotlight On Our Opponents

GOALKEEPERS



NATHAN ABBEY is a goalkeeper who has battled defiantly to keep his career going at Kenilworth Road. He joined Luton as a YTS boy after being spotted in local schoolboy football, but a succession of

good goalkeepers left Nathan as a near-permanent understudy. He nearly accepted a free transfer move to Holland in the summer of 1999, but decided to stay on, and was rewarded with the No. 1 shirt after the sale of Kelvin Davis. The arrival of a new board of directors at Kenilworth Road early last summer enabled Ricky Hill to break a mould that had been set over the previous three years. Then, with continuing financial problems, including spell in receivership, Luton had been unable to buy players, while selling talent worth more than £3million. That changed when Mike Watson-Challis became the chairman, and made cash available. The new manager moved swiftly to secure 26-year-old goalkeeper **MARK OVENDALE** from Bournemouth for a substantial fee. Previously with Wisbech, Northampton and Barry Town, he was immediately given the No. 1 shirt in Luton's squad-number list for this season.

DEFENDERS

One of the many to come through from Luton's schools and youth development programme, **EMMERSON BOYCE** was signed as a YTS boy in the summer of 1995, and made the breakthrough to the League squad last season after occasional appearances following a debut in the Auto Windscreens Shield in January 1999. Stylish defender and former skipper of the Luton youth team, **STUART FRASER** was given his league debut against Carlisle, in a 3-2 win, on the final day of the 1997/98 season and within a year was established as a regular member of the Luton squad.

Longest-serving player at Kenilworth Road, **MARVIN JOHNSON** is arguably the most popular member of the Kenilworth Road staff with his colleagues and with the fans. Always cheerful, even when recovering from injury setbacks, the defender is in his 13th season as a first-team regular at Luton, his only club, and skipper of the team he joined as a schoolboy. Looking for strength in the spine of his team, Ricky Hill went to Scandinavia for a centre-half who had served a solid apprenticeship in the Norwegian Premier League. An under-



21 international, **KENT KARLSEN** has five years with Vaalerenga brought considerable success, including a Norwegian FA Cup winner's medal. Keen to try his luck in England, Karlsen

went to Luton in the autumn for trials and training, and his ability as a dominating centre-half rapidly persuaded the Luton boss to offer the Norwegian terms before rival clubs moved in. A defender fighting for a Premiership place against very stiff competition at Arsenal, **GAVIN MCGOWAN** signed for Luton for the third time in June 1998. The first two were loan deals, one in March 1997 ending prematurely through injury. He re-joined Luton on loan again for three months, at the start of the 1997/8 season, but they could not afford a transfer fee to make the move permanent. But he was back a year later when Arsenal gave him a free transfer. When Luton were in receivership in the summer of 1999, players had to be sold or given away to save money, while severe restrictions were imposed on new recruits. So once more Luton had to look at the young talent coming up through the ranks, and wing-back **MATTHEW TAYLOR**, though still only 17, was given his chance, and immediately settled to become a regular in the team. Keen to get his career moving again after falling out of favour at Bristol City, **JULIAN WATTS** played a major part in Luton's

recovery from receivership restrictions last season, after joining on a free transfer. Rotherham gave the defender his first taste of league football, and he also played for Sheffield Wednesday and Leicester before going to Ashton Gate in 1998.

MIDFIELDERS

The lanky midfielder **FRIEDRICH BREITENFELDER** was one of many hopefuls who presented themselves for trials at Kenilworth Road before this season kicked off. He impressed in trial games, and the award of a contract ended a major problem for him, because he was out of work and with no hope of being recompensed by an employer who had gone out of business. He started with Rapid Vienna as a 15-year-old schoolboy, and moved up through the ranks to win an occasional place in their first team. At 18 he moved on to Casino Bregenz, before another Austrian club signed him. It turned out to be an unlucky move, because FCM St Polten went broke in March 2000, leaving all their players out of work, but free agents, and Luton came to the rescue with a one-year contract. After several years of penny-pinching caused by continual trading losses, Luton had only 19 full-time professionals on the books when Ricky Hill became manager, and he moved swiftly to strengthen the club at all levels. His long coaching career included three years looking after the youth squad at Sheffield Wednesday, and Hill went back to Hillsborough for two young midfielders. **DEAN BRENNAN** was doubly valuable because he can also play in attack, and was delighted to join up again with Hill when Wednesday offered him a free transfer. After a patchy start to this season, then manager Ricky Hill and chairman Mike Watson-Challis agreed that a young team needed experience and expertise to stabilise matters, and after looking at a lot of players available in this country, the manager went abroad in early November to sign two Scandinavian stars, Finnish international **PETRI HELIN** and Norwegian **Kent Karlsen**. Hill had been tracking Helin for months, before clinching the transfer, beating off competition from several other clubs in



England and on the Continent. They had been alerted to the midfielder's skill by his regular appearances for his country, including the winning of his 18th cap in the draw with England in the World Cup qualifying competition. Helin had also captained his club, Jokerit of Helsinki, to runners-up honours in the Finnish Premier League. As well as being with Ricky Hill in the youth squad at Sheffield Wednesday, **PETER HOLMES** moved to Luton as one of Hill's first signings with a better than usual pedigree. He is a product of the FA's School of Excellence, in the same year as Michael Owen. But relegation from the Premiership in May 2000 left Hillsborough desperate to cut the pay-roll. Hill took full advantage, snapping up the two-footed midfielder for a nominal fee. Well-travelled in football terms, **ADAM LOCKE** joined Luton on a free transfer from Bristol City to add experience to a predominantly young squad in the summer of 1999. He began as a YTS boy with Crystal Palace, his local club, but could not get into the league team at Selhurst, and moved on to Southend, Colchester and Ashton Gate before becoming a regular with Luton last season. An injury crisis at Kenilworth Road thrust young midfielder **LEE MANSELL** into a dramatic debut in an FA Cup-tie. He had to make the transition straight from the youth squad to the first team in January, and was an instant success. He was just 58 seconds into his debut against Queens Park Rangers, in an FA Cup third round replay, when he scored his first senior goal. He is typical of many of the boys Luton have brought through the ranks - they had looked after him since he was an 11-year-old, and signed him as a soccer scholar (previously the YTS scheme) as soon as he left school. The midfielder **PAUL McLAREN** was still a schoolboy when Luton realised that he had enough talent and strength to play regularly in their youth team. A YTS offer was a formality, and he was offered pro terms while still only 17. Forceful and always ready to back up attacks, he soon became a regular after a 1994 debut. Looking for experience to aid an injury-hit team fighting to draw away from the relegation zone, Luton boss Lil Fucillo tracked former Northern Ireland international midfielder **KEITH ROWLAND** for several months before

persuading him to move from Queens Park Rangers to Kenilworth Road on a three-month loan agreement which began on January 27 this year. Capped 18 times by his country, Rowland began his career as a trainee at Bournemouth in 1989 and was sold to West Ham for £110,000 four years later. He moved across London to Loftus Road in January 1998. A competitive midfielder, **MATTHEW SPRING** was a driving force in the Luton side which reached the FA Youth Cup semi-finals in 1997, and after a league debut when still only 17 he soon became a regular in Luton's Second Division team.

FORWARDS

Having had to wait until he was 28 to break into league football, **ROCKY BAPTISTE** was keen to make up for lost time when he joined Luton for a nominal fee from Conference club Wealdstone in October. "He was a late developer who slipped through the net," explained the then Luton manager Ricky Hill, himself a Londoner who has maintained close contacts with football at all levels in and around the capital. Released as a teenager by Chelsea and Brentford, he settled for non-league football, and after emerging as a top striker in the Conference was delighted to accept Luton's offer of a contract until the end of the season. A striker with excellent pace, **STUART DOUGLAS** was a 17-year-old trainee when he scored on his league debut for Luton against Oldham in 1995, and he looked set for more than fleeting instant stardom. He was hit by a series of injuries before he could establish himself, but determination overcame all difficulties, and he won a regular place in Luton's league side in the 1998/99 season, flourishing as a marksman and also a creator of chances for his front-line colleagues. Another local discovery, **ANDREW FOTIADIS** chose to stay at school to gain GCSE A-levels before being a full-time soccer professional. He won England Schools caps at under-15 and under-18 level, and developed a style to delight Luton fans and worry opposing defences, as an old-fashioned centre-forward, with good physique, power, and concentrated determination to score goals. Full of pace and nimble footwork, **LIAM GEORGE** came through the ranks after joining Luton as a schoolboy, and became a regular member of the Republic of Ireland squad that progressed to the European youth championships final in the summer of 1998. George had made his league debut in September 1997, but



suffered a broken leg soon afterwards. He returned in triumph, to complete his first full campaign in the league last season, in which he was Luton's leading scorer and also progressed to win Ireland under-21 honours. Talent spotted by Luton playing in schoolboy football in London, **TRESOR KANDOL** is a lanky striker who became a YTS boy at Kenilworth Road in the summer of 1997. His first team debut was in the Auto Windscreens Shield in January 1999, against Walsall, and he made a Football League debut a month later, being on the fringe of the first team ever since. The then 18-year-old **ANDRE SCARELTT** made an unforgettable league debut in October 1998. Because of injuries the winger was on the subs' bench against Oldham, and was sent on with 20 minutes to go, with the score at 0-0. He helped set up one goal, and then netted the clincher in a 2-0 victory. Nearly 20 years after joining Luton as a schoolboy, **MARK STEIN** returned to Kenilworth Road in the summer to help out his old playing pal, new manager of Luton, Ricky Hill. Stein is the only man now at Luton who was a member of the team which won the club's only major trophy, the League Cup in 1988. Brother of Brian, another noted Luton striker, Mark had four years at Luton before enjoying a career as a popular goalscorer with QPR, Oxford, Stoke, Chelsea and Bournemouth. He was poised to join Swansea as a Bosman in the summer, but rapidly agreed to go "back home" when the call came from his old mate Hill, and he became the new manager's first signing. Striker **PETER THOMSON** hoped to make the grade with his home town club BURY, but after 18 months as a teenager at Gigg Lane he was allowed to leave, and joined neighbouring Chorley, in the Unibond Premier League. His scoring touch there alerted ambitious rivals Lancaster, and they reaped a rapid return after recruiting him. In six months he netted 24 goals, and Lancaster cashed in when Dutch club NAC Breda offered £25,000. A broken leg interrupted Thomson's career in the Dutch Premiership, but he recovered and regular goals persuaded Luton to sign him for a reported £100,000 in September 2000.

DID YOU KNOW?

When Luton played a Division Three South match against Thames at their ground in the 1930's the attendance was 469, Luton's share of the gate was 1/9 d (8 pence).

During 1966, the Hatters gave a trial to an ex Manchester United and Bolton winger, his name.....Barry Fry!

In the 1950's Mike Cullen was selected for both Scotland's first and 'B' teams, before he appeared in Luton's first team.

In 1965 Luton became the first club to fall from the First to the Fourth Division in the shortest time - five seasons.

Hugh 'Midget' Moffatt, a winger was signed from Arsenal in 1925. The 5ft tall player originally joined the Gunners from Workington, but was released without playing a game, after the Arsenal Chairman Norris insisted they signed no one under 5ft 8in tall or under 11 stone.

The 11 players who represented Luton in the 1959 F.A.Cup final v Nottingham Forest were also the same 11 that appeared in the previous EIGHT F.A.Cup matches.

Viv Busby was named as substitute for a match v Q.P.R. in 1970, while his brother Martyn was the number 12 for the Rangers.

In 1955 Birmingham, Luton and Rotherham topped the Second division with 54 points. Luton won the second promotion spot with a goal average of 1.6 compared to Rotherham's 1.4.

Luton provided three players for the England v Ireland match in October 1921. Alan Mathiewson and Louis Bookman for Ireland and Ernie Simms for England. At the time they were only a Division Three South side.

After their historic 12-0 victory over Bristol Rovers in 1936, Luton won just one and drew three of their last 4 games, and were beaten to the third division South championship by a point by Coventry, with whom they drew with twice.

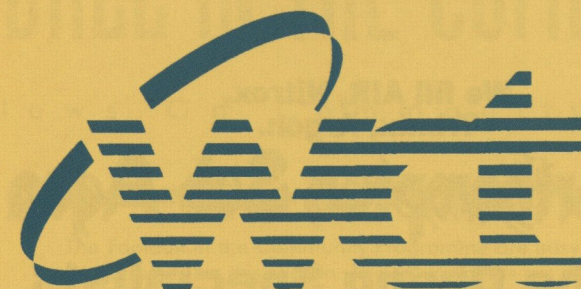
When the club was formed in 1885, their colours were blue and pink halves with caps of the same colour, which they had to wear.

In 1933 the Hatters reached round six of the F.A.Cup, losing 0-6 to Everton, yet they finished the season in 14th place, just 10 points off a re-election spot.

It was thought that when Harry Whitby accepted professional terms with Luton Town in 1890, he was the first professional player in the south of England.

Christmas Day 1926 saw Luton beat Millwall 6-0, and with the same 11 players travelled to the Den the following day, and lost 0-7!

In their first three seasons of Southern League football, Luton lost just three home games, and each was against Millwall.

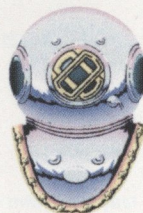

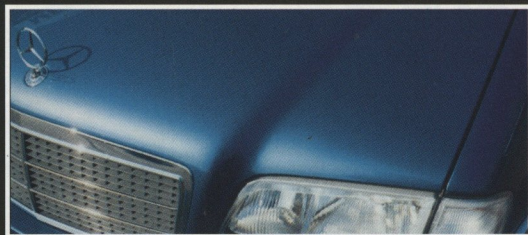

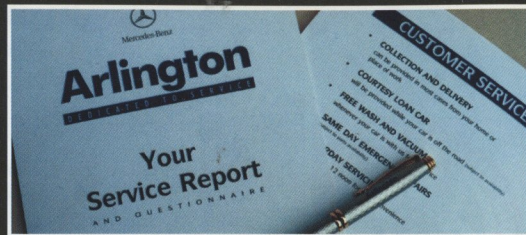

Talking Points

ADDIS A BYE-BYE

Disgraced German coach Christophe Daum legged it abroad after failing a drugs test. ZOOfootball salutes a side who left for an away game but never came back.

'Sport for Passports' goes the motto of the select band of sporting defectors. In nations where exit visas are rare, sporting excellence is one way to book your one-way ticket out of your homeland.

As Zerihun Biabegign, Secretary of the Ethiopian Football Federation (EFF) knows, it has been a particular problem in his country.

"We have lost over 100 very talented players over the last 25 years."

Losing half of your national side during an away game is unfortunate. Losing the entire squad a couple of years later is just careless.

The East African nation, famous for drought and political unrest was once justly proud of its footballing heritage. It was a disappointment, then, when news filtered back that their team had been pummelled 5-0 in their first qualifying game for the 1994 World Cup in Morocco.

Even more depressing, was that they had walked off the field with only six players. Their problem was not poor discipline but lax security.

In order to reach Morocco's home stadium in Rabat, the Ethiopians had to fly from Addis Ababa to Rome, then on to Casablanca and then drive to the ground. Few were aware that members of the squad of 16 planned to use their night in Italy as an opportunity to escape.

"When we set out we had very good relations and very good attitudes within the team," said assistant coach Getahun Wolbegiorgies. "I was not aware of any problem."

He was not alone. The Ethiopian

Embassy had made special visa arrangements to allow the squad to spend the evening sightseeing in the 'eternal city', unaware that the Roman night provided the perfect cover for fugitives to slip away.

The following morning, a quick head count showed that three of his squad had disappeared.

"We asked everybody where the players had gone but no-one seemed to know," Wolbegiorgies said. "We left for training in Rome with the remaining squad and the team manager went looking for the three who had disappeared."

The police and the Ethiopian Embassy were informed of the absentees but they were nowhere to be found. Nor indeed, were three other players who had mysteriously vanished between the team's training facilities and the airport.

"I couldn't believe it because all the players had prepared so well for the game," said the mystified assistant coach. "We telephoned from the airport and spoke to the President of the EFF. He told us to play the match with the remaining players."

Inevitably, with only eight outfield players, two goalkeepers (one playing as a make-shift centre back) and a 40-year-old deputy coach in midfield, Ethiopia's resistance to Morocco's attacks was fairly feeble.

They were 4-0 down at half time, at which point two of their players refused to come back on for the second half.

The remaining nine soldiered on for another 20 minutes before a fifth Moroccan goal heralded the departure of a further three players claiming untreatable injuries. The two half-time absentees refused to return to the pitch. Ethiopia were down to six men.

It was too much for referee Rachid Medjiba who, in line

with FIFA rules dictating that a side must have at least seven players, abandoned the match.

A year later the missing men were rumoured to be working in factories around Rome and playing amateur football but Biabegign had heard nothing from them:

"We have had no further contact with these players. We don't know their whereabouts. If we knew their addresses we could contact them and pick them to play in the national team"

He could have done with their services, too, for a couple of years later, en route to another game in Morocco via Rome, most of the sixteen man African Nations Championship squad disappeared.

Manager Mailissa Baihiro came to breakfast to find that 14 players, the club doctor and one of his coaches had vanished with their luggage, leaving him with a goalkeeper, a defender and four EFF officials to assemble a squad from.

"We looked around but could not find them," Baihiro said despairingly.

As the reduced party flew back to Addis Ababa, in the cold of a January morning, 16 men in Ethiopian Football Federation tracksuits turned up at a Rome police station claiming they were political refugees.

A year later two were still in Rome working as shop assistants while many others had relocated to Arezzo, 160 miles north of Rome, where they were working in local factories.

Some had trials for Serie A club Perugia but, in a telling irony, had been refused work permits because they hadn't played enough international games.

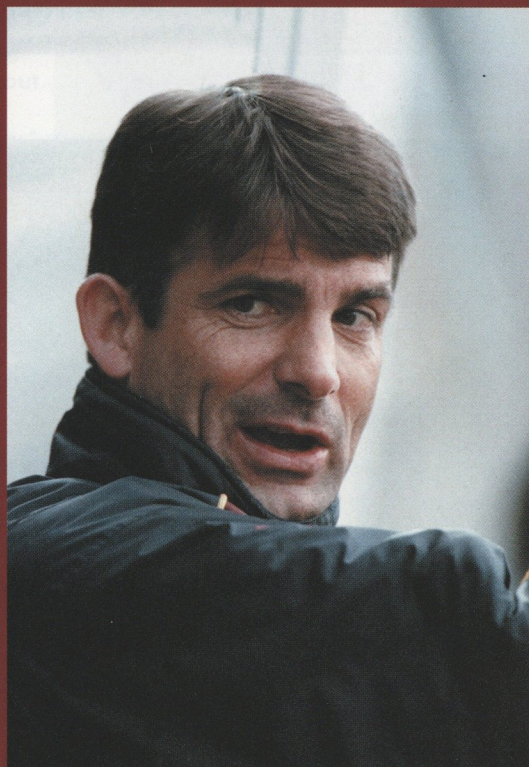

OLD HEROES



Ian Davies Traces Former Stars



I did not have to go very far to trace this week's old star. TERRY BRANSTON was sitting, as he does for every home game, a few rows away in the West Stand.

"The day I left Northampton Town was the worst day of my footballing life. I am not ashamed to say, I shed a few tears that day. The Cobblers have always been my first love, and today, forty-one years after I made my debut, I shall be here at Sixfields as a season ticket holder."

Terry Branston was arguably the best centre-half produced by the Cobblers. A tough defender, who took no prisoners, Terry almost slipped through the clubs hands. They dithered about signing the Rugby lad, and it was not until they heard that he was training at Notts County, that they stepped in and signed him.

"They were great days", said Terry, "It was Dave Bowen's second season as manager, and was to lead to promotion with a third place finish behind Peterborough and Palace. My first game at Peterborough, was in front of a 23,000 crowd at London Road. We were three up at half-time, but lost Tommy Fowler with an injury (it was before substitutes) and Posh came back to equalise late in the game. It was another four months before I played my second game, but after that I remained in the first team - except for injury until I joined Luton in 1967. And what moments there were in those six years. Two years later we won the Third Division title, and after 11th place in Division Two, we finally reached the top flight with a 4-1 win at Bury on April 17 1965," said Terry.

"Looking back, we had little chance in the first division

without some new players, but the money just wasn't there. But we did have some good scalps. A double over the Villa, two draws against Arsenal and home wins against Newcastle, Leeds, West Ham and Sunderland, before the inevitable return to the Second Division. The following season was a disaster. All confidence was gone and we finished one off the bottom, to return to the Third Division. I still had a year of my contract to run, but I was asked to take a pay-cut. I felt I

could not do this because I had a family now and a new home, and it just wasn't on. Rather than keep my wages as they were, the club gave me a free transfer. This upset me a lot. When we were on the up and up, Bolton and Wolves had both had offers of £45,000 turned down. But if I was feeling a bit down, I was soon in the thick of it again when Luton Town signed me. I had three happy years at Kenilworth Road under a great manager, Allan Brown. We won promotion twice in the three years I was there, before I moved on to Lincoln. I ended my career there with 99 games, to make a total of 444 league appearances, said Terry. Now this youthful 63 year old is far from inactive. He referees most Sundays in local Football.

But, as he says, his heart will always be with Northampton Town.

STAGING the Worthington Cup final in Cardiff next month looks like it could be a recipe for disaster. The clash between Birmingham City and Liverpool will be the first of a string of high profile football matches to be played at the stadium in the next couple of months. And if the reported crowd congestion and general chaos which greeted England's rugby fans travelling by train to the Six Nations rugby clash last weekend (train-long queues for the buffet car, no beer, no hot food) is anything to go by, we could be in for a few negative headlines following the League Cup final. The main problem is going to be that Liverpool fans travelling by train to Cardiff have to go through...you've guessed it, Birmingham! The prospect of 1,000s of Reds and Blues fans congregating at New Street and then Cardiff station before and after the game doesn't bode well, especially with the state of the train service at the current time. It's frustrating enough waiting for a train that's been delayed for what seems like three days at the best of times, never mind when your team's just lost a major cup final and the opposition fans on the platform next door are giving you a load of grief...

I can remember only too well trying to catch a train from Wembley Central after the 1995 League Cup final when Liverpool beat Bolton 2-1. It was a nightmare. That was also an occasion

when everybody wanted to catch a train going in the same direction at the same time, and the station was packed - sardines would have felt claustrophobic. It was only the fact that the beaten Bolton fans' accepted defeat with a smile and shrug of the shoulders that there wasn't any trouble. Let's hope whoever loses the Worthington Cup final accepts defeat as graciously...

OVER 60,000 supporters will cram into Celtic Park tomorrow lunchtime for the Old Firm clash between Glasgow giants Celtic and Rangers. For years now the Scottish game has been ridiculed south of the border. English football fans scoff at Celtic and Rangers, some even saying the pair are so bad they would be relegated from the English Premiership. But I happen to believe the opposite is true. It has often been suggested in the past that both clubs should be invited to play in the Premiership down south. I reckon it's a great idea, and I also reckon both clubs would enjoy real success. Now I'm not saying that either Celtic or Rangers could walk into the English Premiership and make an immediate impression of course. But given time, say three or four seasons, I think both clubs would challenge Manchester United for the big prizes. Both Celtic and Rangers are massive clubs with worldwide support to match that of Alex Ferguson's men. Basically, they have got the grounds, they've got the fans, and they've got the money - the problem for the Glasgow pair is the league they play in. They are simply not able to attract the cream of the world's footballers because, to be frank, the top players don't want to go and play at places like Dunfermline, Dundee or St Mirren every other week (and they probably don't fancy the deep fried Mars Bars either!) But stick Celtic in a 'British Premiership' and it would be a different story. Martin O'Neill would be able to attract the best players to one of the best leagues in Europe and the team would grow in strength accordingly. I mean, what player wouldn't want to play in front of over 60,000 every home game, and then travel to places such as Old Trafford, Highbury, St James's Park, Anfield or Villa Park for the odd away match? And

it would be the same story for Rangers. The sad fact is that both clubs will never be able to reach their full potential playing in Scotland. Mind you, that won't stop everyone of a green and white or blue persuasion treating tomorrow's game as if it is the most important football match ever...because every old firm game is!

JAMIE Forrester will be searching for his first goal in six matches against Luton Town this afternoon. The 17-goal top-scorer hasn't ripped the net since the 2-2 draw with Wycombe Wanderers on December 30, but it is surely only a matter of time before he hits the goal trail again. Forrester did everything but score at Stoke City last weekend with a lively performance, and Town boss Kevin Wilson is convinced the former Leeds United, Scunthorpe ad Grimsby man's luck will turn. "Jamie just needs that bit of fortune, and it will come," said Wilson. "I have got no worries about that, he has got 17 goals this year and he is one of the reasons why we are in the top half." Forrester's goal in the 2-0 win at Luton Town in September saw him go on a scoring run of 11 goals in 12 games, a repeat of that little run would do very nicely...

FINALLY, two men with Cobblers connections return to Sixfields with Luton Town today. Former Town assistant boss Kevan Broadhurst is now the Hatters' reserve team boss while Richard Dryden has been signed on loan by the Kenilworth Road club. Dryden was on loan at Sixfields earlier in the season, ironically making his Cobblers debut in the 2-0 win at Luton, and he also played for Swindon Town in the Wiltshire club's 1-0 smash and grab win here in December. Broadhurst was joint manager alongside Kevin Wilson for a short while in the wake of Ian Atkins departure. He was then of course assistant to Kevin Wilson for 12 months, helping the team to promotion from division three, before his departure in November. Both Broadhurst and Dryden can expect a warm welcome from the Cobblers fans today and rightly so, but hopefully that is all they are going to get from their Sixfields return.

If that sixties icon Derek Dougan had passed away he would undoubtedly be turning somersaults in his grave - but as he is alive and well (conducting after dinner speeches last I heard) he must be having a good old giggle at the latest news to emanate from FIFA.

In the early seventies, County rivals Kettering Town were quite a force in the non-league game and they attracted the managerial skills of the controversial "Doog." His presence undoubtedly helped secure a lucrative shirt sponsorship deal with the local Kettering Tyres Company who had their name emblazoned on the Poppies shirts. Until that is, the FA. reminded them that this was not British, not the done thing and must cease immediately - shirt advertising indeed! Thus, a ground breaking marketing opportunity was strangled at birth (or at least until a few years later) and as a compromise of sorts Kettering supporters saw their team run out with 'KT' on the shirtfront. What 'KT' stood for depended upon whom you were talking to at the time. ('Tyres'- anyone from the FA or 'Town'- any normal football supporter!).

Yet the latest selling of the game has recently seen FIFA endorse the use of international shirts for promoting products and, wait for it, referees shirts will be allowed to carry adverts! As from next

season, our beloved match officials could well be running out bedecked in requests for you the fan, to use Specsavers - for clearer vision!! Talk about the wheel turning full circle. Mind you, there must be some great suggestions as to the products that certain individuals could promote on their kit - but I'll leave that to you.

Already this FIFA decision has caused problems in some countries, with the Mexican FA allegedly organising a blanket sponsorship deal for their officials in order to avoid individual refs setting up their own deals. (Isn't this restraint of trade?). We eagerly await details of the sponsorship deals our own match officials obtain - but let's hope they don't take as long as those negotiations for the LDV Vans Trophy!

Taking the natural progression of the marketing world, I expect - name changes will be next to tarnish the international game. We already have it in our national game - remember it's not the FA Cup or League Cup but the AXA FA Cup or The Worthington Cup. So how long will it be before we are hearing international results such as 'Wendys USA 2 Sainsburys England 3'? Sounds strange doesn't it? An England away win!

And who will win the first McDonalds World Cup?

Incidentally, our own Football Association has stated that the England shirt will not carry adverts (not the done thing) - which must be most disappointing for Longleat Safari Park as they could actually have put three lions on the shirt.

Personally, I think that the idea of match officials and

international teams running around suggesting that we purchase packets of particular brands of breakfast cereal is on a par with playing cricket in multi coloured clothing. But maybe I'm a moaning old traditionalist - unlike the Doog who can rightly be called visionary. Twenty-five years on I wonder what he thinks about this latest sponsorship opportunity?

A brief welcome to today's visitors Luton Town. Our cup defeats in both 1960/61 and 1961/62 are just about forgotten by Cobblers supporters now - although the Hatters banning of away fans and the plastic pitch experiment is still fresh in the memory of many football fans. Perhaps we were fortunate to be in the fourth division at the time!!

Finally, the recent programme for the game verses Bristol City, contained details of Christmas cards that football clubs send to one another. As a result of this, I have received an article from a 1973 publication concerning a gent by the name of Frank Perryman, then President of Hartlepool F.C. It transpires that Mr Perryman was responsible for writing their seasonal cards - and had been for the previous twenty-three years. 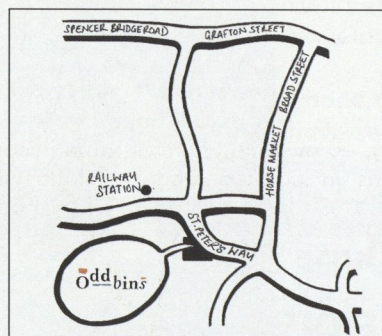

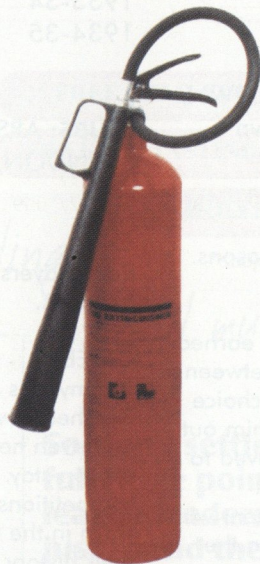

Goals from Jamie Forrester and Steve Howard gave Northampton Town a 2-0 Second Division win at Luton five months ago, the Cobblers first ever league win at Kenilworth Road. Carlo Corazzin scored as Northampton triumphed 1-0 on Luton's last league visit to Sixfields on 10 April 1999. Luton's last league victory at Northampton was 2-0 in December 1968 with two goals from Bruce Rioch.

EVER PRESENT

One time Luton Town striker Ian Benjamin was ever present in Northampton Town's 1986/87 Fourth Division title triumph. Moving to Northampton from Peterborough United on a free transfer in August 1984, he was leading marksman in two consecutive seasons and netted 58 goals in 150 league games prior to joining Cambridge United in October 1987. He joined Luton from Southend in November 1992 and scored twice in 13 league outings for today's opponents before moving to Brentford in September 1993.

TITLE TRIUMPH

Former Luton Town centre forward Alec Ashworth was leading marksman in Northampton's 1962/63

Third Division title triumph. Moving to Kenilworth Road from Everton in October 1960, he netted 20 goals in 63 league games for Luton prior to joining Northampton in July 1962. He scored 25 times in 30 Third Division outings for the Cobblers before moving to Preston NE in June 1963. One time Hatters Terry Branston, Billy Hails, John Reid and Ray Smith also featured in Northampton's 1962/63 Third Division title campaign.

MUCH TRAVELLED

Much travelled striker Bob Hatton played for Northampton and Luton during his career. Moving to Northampton from Bolton Wanderers for £30,000 in October 1968, he netted seven goals in 33 Third Division games prior to joining Carlisle United for £15,000 in July 1969. He joined Luton from Blackpool for £50,000 in July 1978 and scored 29 times in 82 league outings for today's visitors before being sold to Sheffield United for £50,000 in July 1980. Ex Luton striker Tony Adcock had two spells at Northampton.

PROMOTION WINNER

Former Northampton Town central defender John Moore was an influential figure in

Luton's 1967/68 and 1969/70 promotion successes. Moving to Kenilworth Road from Motherwell in May 1965, he netted 13 goals in 274 league games for Luton before joining Northampton in August 1974. He made 14 Fourth Division appearances for the Cobblers prior to joining Milton Keynes in July 1975 and has since served Luton as both coach and Manager. Ex Northampton defender Steve Litt featured in Luton's 1973/74 promotion campaign.

IN SAFE KEEPING

Former Luton Town goalkeeper Alan Starling starred in Northampton's 1975/76 promotion success. Signing professional for Luton in April 1969, he featured in their 1969/70 promotion campaign and made seven league appearances prior to joining Northampton in June 1971. He was ever present in 1973/74 and played 238 league games before moving to Huddersfield Town in March 1977. The likes of Sean Farrell, Godfrey Ingram, Damian Matthew, Bert Mitchell, Gordon Riddick, Harry Walden and Paul Wilkinson have also played for both clubs since the war.

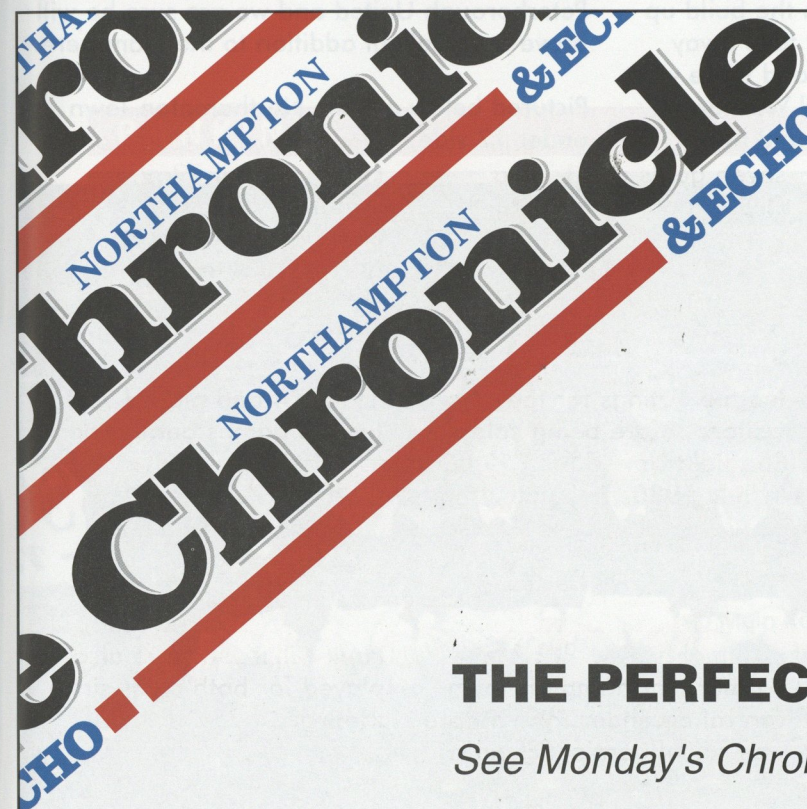

A fortnight ago, we met West Bromwich Albion at 4 age groups. As we wrote previously, these game are often a good yardstick to measure our progress by as West Brom are regarded as one of the leading Centre of Excellence sides and they teach their players to pass the ball around very well.

The under 15s were at home to their Baggies counterparts and recorded a comprehensive win in a very competitive game. We controlled the game from start to finish with the highlight of the game being a superb display from Jermail Dixon in a new position wide on the right hand side. Bury came back strongly and Chris Swailes headed wide on 17 minutes, before defender Steve Redmond fired over the bar from 25 yards. The visitors did pull level 10

minutes before the break, when a game of head tennis in the Cobblers box ended with Chris Swailes finding the corner of the net with Keith Welch beaten. The final action of the first half saw visiting striker Baichung Bhutia's 20 yard volley kicked off the line by James Hunt, who had kept his position from a corner.

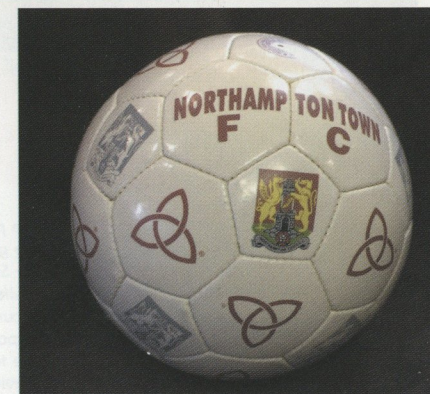

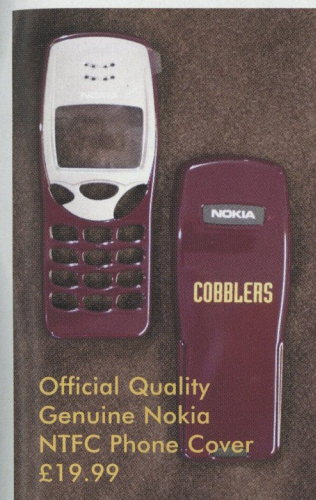

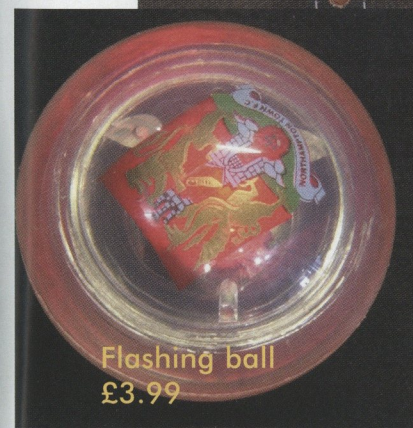
