



We are going through a spell of games at the moment which is stretching our squad to the limit, but I have been very pleased with the players who have come into the team.



Welcome back to Feethams for today's game against Luton Town.


The last week has been pretty disappointing for us. The only positive was the Cheltenham game where the lads battled brilliantly to get a point.

• Luton Town • • a brief history •

Luton Town Football Club was formed by the merger of two local sides, Excelsior and Wanderers, in 1885; originally playing at the former's ground, Dallow Lane. In 1891 they became the first fully professional club in the south of England becoming members of the Southern League in 1894. A move to a second ground at Dunstable Road in 1897 coincided with them joining the Second Division of the Football League but after only three seasons they returned to the Southern League on deciding not to apply for re-election. In 1905 they moved grounds again to Kenilworth Road, which remains their home to this day.

Along with most of the other clubs in the Southern League they were elected to the new Third Division South of the Football League in 1920, where they stayed until promoted to Division Two as champions in 1937. They maintained their Second Division status until 1955 when they were promoted to Division One and in 1959 reached the F.A. Cup Final only to lose 1-2 to Nottingham Forest. After this they slipped out of the First Division in 1960 and down the divisions descending to the Fourth by 1965 (when the Quakers first met them). They then had an equally rapid rise back up the leagues after winning the Fourth Division Championship in 1968, being runners-up in Division Three in 1970 and Division Two in 1974 to return to the top flight (albeit for just one season).

Seven more seasons in the Second ended in 1982 with a return to Division One, where they survived for ten years, reaching Wembley twice in Football League Cup Finals. In 1988 they won the trophy beating Arsenal 3-2 and the following year were runners-up to Nottingham Forest (again). In 1985 they became one of the first clubs to lay an artificial plastic pitch but after six seasons reverted to grass in 1991. They had four seasons in the new Division One from 1992 to 1996 but then dropped to Division Two, where they remained for five seasons until 2001 when they fell into the lowest of the Football Leagues for the first time in thirty three years.

Luton Town

David Bayliss

Defender

This centre-half was formerly the longest serving player at Rochdale, making over 200 appearances for the Dale. Originally brought in to solve a squad crisis David has now become a regular in the first team.

Emmerson Boyce

Defender



Came through from Luton's successful schools and youth development programme. A commanding defensive figure who has become a regular at full squad level over the past two seasons.

Ahmet Brkovic

Midfielder

Formerly with Leyton Orient this midfield playmaker joined Luton on a Bosman in the summer of 2001. He was disappointed that Orient didn't go up last season but hopes to do it this year with Luton.

Chris Coyne

Defender

This Australian centre-half was signed from Dundee for £50,000 in September last year. He had previously been with West Ham as a teenager.

Dean Crowe

Forward

Another who was brought in when injury hit the squad. He scored on his debut at Plymouth then another three in his next four appearances.

Naturally, he was signed on a permanent deal in the summer of 2001.

Stuart Douglas

Forward

A striker with excellent pace who has flourished as both a maker and a taker of goals.

Stuart Fraser

Defender

This product of the youth team was a first team regular until breaking his leg in January 2001. Was out for six months but has now started to get his place back in the squad.

Richard Dryden

Defender

This vastly experienced defender has played at all levels of professional football. He was snapped up on a free in February 2001.

Carl Emberson

Goalkeeper

Wanting two players to compete for the first team goalkeepers spot Kinnear moved swiftly to secure Embleton from Walsall.

Adrian Forbes

Midfielder

Joe Kinnear paid £75,000 for this right winger who added some much needed width to Luton's attacking formation. Noted for his ability to run at defenders and deliver crosses from out wide.

Andrew Fotiadis

Forward

An old fashioned centre forward with good physique, power and determination.

Steve Howard

Forward



This tall striker from Durham was bought for £50,000 from

Northampton Town. Previously with Hartlepool United this powerful striker netted one in every four to help Northampton win promotion to Division Two.

Carl Griffiths

Forward

Carl has an impressive strike rate scoring in every 2.5 games for seven different clubs. He was signed from Leyton Orient for a reputed fee of £65,000 in the summer.

Ian Hillier

Defender

This Welsh under 21 international was bought for a bargain fee of £30,000 from Spurs, where he was captain of the youth team. The right back's career was hampered by injury at Spurs but settled in quickly at Luton.

Peter Holmes

Midfielder

A lad from Bishop Auckland who is a product of the FA's School of Excellence. Luton signed this two footed midfielder from Sheffield Wednesday but he has struggled to make many appearances in the Luton first team.

Paul Hughes

Midfielder

This promising midfielder's career was cut painfully short at Chelsea, where he had been earmarked as a potential England talent.

Adam Locke

Midfielder

A well travelled midfielder who joined Luton in the summer of 1999 to add experience to a predominantly young squad.

Lee Mansell

Midfielder

Injury forced this young midfielder into the squad. Just 58 seconds into an FA Cup tie against QPR he'd scored

his first senior goal. He'd been watched by Luton since he was 11.


Kevin Nicholls

Midfielder

This tough tackling midfielder began his career at Charlton and skippered the England u-18, u-19 and u-20 teams. He was bought from Wigan for £150,000.

Marvin Johnson

Defender



Longest serving player at Kenilworth Road, now in his 14th season as a first team regular. He is the only member of the Luton playing staff to play in all four divisions.

Mark Ovendale

Goalkeeper

Luton's chairman and board made cash available to secure the services of this excellent shot-stopper from Bournemouth for a fee of £425,000.

Russ Perrett

Defender

This big central defender helped Cardiff City secure promotion in 2001. After Hammam spent £600,000 on Spencer Prior Perrett's chances became limited and he was allowed to join Luton. Strong in the air with a good first touch.

Aaron Skelton

Defender

Was originally with Luton as a schoolboy but his career was plagued by bad luck and he joined Colchester. His luck improved and when he was offered the chance to join his first club in 2001, he agreed.

Matthew Spring

Midfielder

A competitive midfielder who has been at Luton since he was a schoolboy.

Matthew Taylor

Midfielder

Was thrust into the cash strapped team of 1999 and made an instant impact. Has pace and a fierce shooting ability which have made him a real crowd pleaser.

Peter Thomson

Forward

Formerly in Holland with NAC Breda he returned to England when Luton bought him for £100,000. But he is still trying to get a regular place in the first team.

Jean-Louis Valois

Midfielder

This left footed midfielder turned down the prospect of Champions League football because he wanted to play in England. He was signed on a Bosman after a brief trial with Luton.



Has the time come to use the technology available?

Now that referees are considering legal action against managers and players who publicly criticise their performances, maybe now is the time to suggest the introduction of the fifth official.

Apparently, there is now a serious suggestion that match officials should sue for libel or slander if they feel sufficiently aggrieved by after match comments by players and officials.

While perhaps sometimes those comments make great aftermath listening and reading, sometimes they can go a little over the top, but the old "where's your glasses, ref?" and "take your blue/red/white shirt off ref" have been part of the game for many years, and are part of its humour.

Referees know what they're letting themselves in for when they pick up the whistle, and for obvious reasons must have thick skins. And to be fair, it's quite understandable how some referees at the lower levels feel that the job isn't for them after they've been physically and verbally abused. But if referees are considering legal action, maybe

now is the time to introduce video replays at Premiership and Football League levels. Yes, that will break up the game, but it will stop the arguments about whether the ball crossed the line, if it was a penalty, if it was a sending off.

The technology is there, the FA and Football League have plenty of money - so maybe now is the time to implement video replays to stop some of the arguments.

Talking about the humour of the game, I think it's terrible that the FA have suspended a referee for putting his whistle in his pocket for a moment, and scoring a goal for a team that was losing 18-1 at the time.

Nobody who was present at the game complained, and indeed some spectators said that they admired his actions, and were in the spirit in which the game was played.

Maybe the powers-that-be thought that the referee's integrity was being compromised, but the chap was doing his best to encourage a team which was on the wrong end of a hammering - but I couldn't see Paul Alcock doing that at Scunthorpe, though!

On the up! Stadium Report

We read in Wednesday's Northern Echo speculation about a meeting between Chairman George Reynolds and Sunderland Chairman Bob Murray.

On Tuesday Bob Murray and his Chief Executive John Fickling did visit the Club, but not Feethams, they came to view the new Stadium and were genuinely impressed with the development. They join a long list of soccer luminaries who have visited the Neasham Road development, all of whom have been impressed (some surprised and other jealous) in the achievement of a third division teams aspirations.

Progress on the stadium continues in the internal fitting out as detailed in previous programme articles, with the only major external development being the creation of the stadium car parks. Literally thousands of tons of aggregate is currently being delivered to the stadium for the foundations of the car parks prior to the tarmac being laid. The weather to-date has been kind and progress in this area has not been hindered.

This week has also seen the final preparation of the sub-station site and mains electricity should be operative within the next six weeks. All other utilities are now in place.

The design and specifications for the kitchens is now completed and fitting out will commence shortly. The Chairman's wife Susan is also well on target for the fitting out of the function rooms, executive boxes and office suites.

A tremendous amount of unseen work is always underway to achieve the Chairman's objective of providing "not the biggest but the best Football Stadium in Britain". We remain on schedule to make that objective a reality.

talks to Alan Bennett

Wednesday January 16 saw the welcome return of Craig Liddle to the Reserves in the 1 - 0 win against Blackpool. Most fans that knew of his return could be heard sighing with relief halfway across the county. To say they've missed him would be an understatement.

Midway through my chat with him last week at a very cold Durham training ground young Mark Convery walked past and shouted, 'He's back!' My ego would like to think that it was me he was pleased to see but I suspect otherwise. "I hope they are glad to have me back," said Craig of his teammates whilst he did his warming down exercises. "Everybody likes to be missed. The lads have been playing well without me and just losing by the odd goal, hopefully I can add something to the team and we can keep some clean sheets."

We asked fans to send in their questions to ask Craig. Although a few replied the main response was just to say how great it was to have him back. "It's great to be back. I'm looking forward to playing and getting back to match fitness."

Did you ever think your career could be over with the injury? "The injury didn't scare me. I never had any doubts that I'd be back, I'm only 30 and still fit enough!"

You were expected to come back round about the end of January start of February. How come you managed to get back earlier? "I kept myself fit and I think that's why I've come back that bit sooner. A lot of people would just sit back and let nature take its course but, even when I had my pot on, I was exercising in the gym. I kept my fitness up and I think that made it easier to recover from the injury."

How do you think the first game went against Peterborough? "I thought when we were 2-0 up that that was it, we were through to the next round I honestly couldn't see them scoring, but maybe the lads became a bit too complacent. Their winger, Farrell, was very good in the second half. He gave them a lift and once they got their tails up they didn't look like they were going to lose it."

And after Peterborough? What about from now until the end of the season? "We just need to keep our heads and concentrate on the League. I don't think the gaffer will let us think about anything else."

We had a couple of questions from fans...

David Taylor wanted to know if Craig was disappointed with the quality of some of the signings and does he intend to see out his current deal or is he as unhappy as some rumours suggest?

"I'm certainly not unhappy. If I was offered another deal then I'd take it because I fully intend to see out my career at Darlington. As for the signings, that's not my job. I don't think the gaffer's had any money to spend so we'll have to see what he does when he does get some money."

Peter Marsh asked: How does this squad compare to that of the 1999/2000 play-off season?

"That was probably the best squad I've played in, certainly the most entertaining, we're a bit down on that but, hopefully, the gaffer can build us into a team that was as good, if not better than that one."







• what ever happened to? •

Football historian Leigh Edwards traces former favourites

Bobby Cummings' goal gave Darlington a 1-0 Fourth Division win over promotion rivals Luton Town in front of 11,155 at Feethams on 30th April 1966. The victory avenged a 2-0 defeat at Luton in the first-ever League meeting between the clubs three weeks earlier and the Quakers went on to clinch promotion that season.

TONY MOOR: Ever-present goalkeeper who made 239 League appearances for Darlington until retiring in May 1972. He spent 30 years with Scarborough Cricket Club while running four sports shops, then became master of cricket at Scarborough College. Now living in Scalby, he runs Lebberston Golf Club.

JOHN PEVERELL: Ever-present right-back who netted 13 goals in 419 League games prior to joining Stockton in July 1972, then played for South Shields, Shildon and West Auckland. Still living locally, he worked for Scottish Provident, Standard Life and Friends Provident until early retirement in October 1995.

BRIAN KEEBLE: Ever-present left-back who scored twice in 154 League outings for Darlington prior to joining Boston United in July 1969, then played for Brigg Town. Now living in Cleethorpes, he was briefly a storeman for Drakes Sweets, then a supervisor for Smyth Shipping until retiring in December 1999.

RAY YEOMAN: Player-manager who missed just one match during Darlington's 1965-66 promotion campaign and scored twice in 103 League outings before sacked in May 1970. He became Sunderland's youth team boss, then scouted for Northampton Town and Everton and has settled in Middlesbrough.

JOE JACQUES: Versatile centre-half who scored five times in 153 League games before joining Southend United in October 1969, then played for Gillingham, Dartford, Hartlepool, Crook Town and in Swedish soccer. He settled in Hurworth-on-Tees and worked as a sales rep until his tragic death in February 1981.

DON RATCLIFFE: Versatile favourite who was an experienced figure in Darlington's 1965-66 promotion success and netted 12 goals in 85 League games before moving to Crewe Alexandra in January 1968. Later playing for Northwich Victoria and Winsford United, he now lives in Newcastle-under-Lyme in retirement.

GEORGE McGEECHIE: Ever-present winger who scored nine goals in 119 League outings for Darlington until a knee injury his career in May 1967. He spent 34 years with ICI and was operations manager at Billingham, then manager at Dumfries until retiring in September 1994 and now lives in Castle Douglas.

BARRY HUTCHINSON: Stylish inside-forward who joined Darlington from Lincoln City in February 1966 and helped to clinch promotion that season, netting 14 goals in 30 League outings before moving to Halifax Town in November 1966. He subsequently played for Rochdale, Bangor City and Hyde United.

BOBBY CUMMINGS: Centre-forward who was leading marksman in Darlington's 1965-66 promotion success and scored 43 goals in 74 League games before joining Hartlepool in February 1968. Also helping them to win promotion in 1967-68, he then played for Port Elizabeth and became a textile worker in Blyth.

ALAN SPROATES: Long-serving, versatile inside-forward who featured prominently as Darlington won promotion in 1965-66 and reached the League Cup fifth round in 1967-68. He netted 17 goals in 316 League games before joining Scunthorpe United in August 1974 and subsequently emigrated to Australia.

LES O'NEILL: Hard-working favourite who netted 35 goals in 179 League games before joining Bradford City in March 1970, then played for Carlisle United and Queen of the South. He later managed Penrith and Workington while a milkman, then was Swindon Town's chief scout and is now scouting for Blackpool.

Play-offs, Plymouth and Peterborough

It's not often we have much to shout about at Feethams but in 1996 and 2000 we did, briefly. 1996 saw Robbie Blake and Gary Bannister destroy most other teams in this division which led to Darlington's first ever appearance at Wembley. On May 25 we all went for a day out down in London and saw Darlington lose to Mauge's dubious goal for Plymouth. Disappointed but not disheartened we waited for our next opportunity. Four years and one day later it happened again. Only this time it was raining and it was Peterborough United's Andy Clarke instead of Ronnie Mauge but the result was the same and we lost 1-0. We can wait again.

Peverell, John

Darlington's runner up as player with the most appearances for the club, some 465 in total. John was born in Richmond, North Yorkshire in 1941 and came to us via Ferryhill Athletic in 1961. Though he only made two appearances in his first season this defender went on to make over 400 League appearances for Darlington until he left in 1972 for Stockton.

Prudhoe, Mark

Widely regarded as the greatest keeper to pull on a black and white shirt for Darlington, though Colly's making a push for it himself. Pruds joined us in 1988 from Carlisle United. He made his debut on March 18 1988, the same season that our Kevin Stonehouse was top scorer, in the 1-1 draw away to Peterborough United. From that day he became a regular in the squad missing only eight games through injury. He left in 1993 to join Stoke City.

Fantasy over Reality

Fantasy Football has become a popular contest in National Newspapers. But has fantasy overcome reality in the actual game?

In the real world of football globally 93% of professional Football Clubs trade in a deficit.

In Britain only five Football Clubs have reported profits during the year 2000. Yet this week we hear of proposed transfer fees and wage explosions.

Examples include Roberts Ayala's 10 million-pound move to Manchester United, Southampton's 4 million-pound interest in Marcus Allback, Everton's 8 million pound bid for Muzzy Izzet and Spurs 3 million-pound move for Wolves Joleon Le Scott.

Even these fees pale into insignificance when we hear of Roma, Lazio and Juventus ready to offer 40 million for Ruud van Nistelroy, and Real Madrid considering a 30 million-pound bid for Michael Owen.

However in the same newspapers reporting these activities we hear of 'cash-strapped' Everton, Spurs, Middlesbrough etc etc.

How can football be sustained when Clubs already in millions of pounds in the red continue to spend money when simply do not have. The adage of having to speculate to accumulate may or may not have credence, but how can any industry sustain itself when in many cases expenditure is 40% over income?

Football, whether the fans like it or not, it is an industry based on a sport. Just how long can the realities of business evade football, or do they truly live in a fantasy world.


