

Good afternoon and welcome to Sixfields for our second successive Saturday home game. Luton are our visitors today in what is sure to be a keenly contested local derby. I had a few months in charge of Luton's Reserve team a couple of seasons ago before I took over at the Cobblers on a full time basis so it will be nice to pit my wits against a few of my old friends.

I hope that the players will show some pride and passion in the shirt today and put our home record straight after a disappointing defeat last weekend. It is nice to see Jamie Forrester back in form, he is looking sharp and scoring goals again. I think the spell out has refocused him and he has looked more like his old self in recent weeks. The chances are dropping for him at the moment and long may that continue. He has been our top goalscorer for the last couple of seasons and he'll be keen to catch up with Marco.

It is good to see the players who have been out for a while successfully returning to action, however we only have a small squad here and it has been stretched all season. We have five players who have long term injury problems and they have been missing for a quite some time. When we play Saturday-Tuesday-Saturday you find that players will pick up little niggles because of the close proximity of the games and that has hit us as much as any other side, probably more so because there are sides in this division that can afford to be without almost a quarter of the squad but not us.

The last couple of home games have been disappointing for everyone connected with the club and I know the crowd have been frustrated but this afternoon is a time when we must all pull together, get behind the lads and hopefully we can turn things around collectively. At Tuesday night at Oldham we showed there is not a lot wrong with an excellent performance that demanded so much more than we got, and we have to keep going knowing we are not a

million miles away. Please cheer the players on when things aren't going right, the lads appreciate that kind of backing and do respond to it. Anyone who has been to see us away from Sixfields this year will admit we've turned in some good footballing performances on the road and the support you have given us has been magnificent. Let's try and get that going at home again.

Records tumbled at Edgar Street as the Cobblers beat Hereford United 4-3 in the LDV Vans Trophy 11 days ago. Jamie Forrester opened the scoring after just 24 seconds with his 100th career goal, while the Cobblers scored four goals away from home for the first time since February 1995 and a 4-4 draw with Fulham at Craven Cottage.

The goal from Jamie Forrester that won the tie was the club's first ever golden goal, while the third goal at Edgar Street has been officially credited by the club to Richard Hope.


The Cobblers trip to Loftus Road next Saturday is ALL TICKET for Cobblers fans. The Cobblers have been given an initial allocation of 1,000 seating tickets costing £16 for adults, and £8 for junior/OAP/student. This allocation will rise to 3,100 tickets if demand requires. (To claim a student discount students must produce NUS card at time of purchase AND on entry to Loftus Road.) These tickets are now on unlimited general sale from the Sixfields Box Office.

Today sees the first use of the yellow Mitre Fluo Flare balls. They will be used through the darkest months of the year, up to the end of February. The white balls will return on March 1st 2003.

In a bid to keep costs down in the current climate, the club will be producing an 8 page programme priced at £1 for the Cambridge United LDV Vans Trophy round 2 tie on Tuesday week. Normal service will resume for the Boston FA Cup tie.

Bassett told the club's recent Executive Dinner that it is vital for clubs like Northampton Town to survive, and he wishes everyone associated with the appeal every success.







IT wasn't just the team that was below par during last Saturday's 2-1 defeat to Cheltenham Town, the atmosphere inside the ground wasn't much to write home about either.

There are times, mainly under the floodlights, when Sixfields is a real cauldron of passion, and there are other occasions – such as last weekend – when it is more like a library. Apart from the travelling Robins supporters chirping up with the odd song – including a well received 'stand up if you hate Rushden' – the noise inside the ground was at a minimum, Jamie Forrester's goal and late second-half rally by Town apart. It's a situation that raises an old argument: Is it up to the supporters to raise the players, or is it up to the team to do the business on the pitch and give the fans something to shout about?

Well, I'm a firm believer in the former. Of course the players are paid to entertain and do their best to do just that. And when things go to plan and the football's flowing as everybody wants it to be, then the supporters will be on their feet and making a rare old racket anyway. But it's when things aren't going to plan – as they didn't last weekend – that the supporters can come into their own and have their chance to have a real influence on proceedings. A player having a stinker won't be lifted by indifferent silence or abuse from the stands, but he may just be shaken from his stupor by some vocal encouragement. He will certainly try that extra bit harder to sort his game out. So although I appreciate that it is sometimes difficult to stay positive and upbeat when the team is playing poorly, doing just that can make a real difference and could well turn imminent defeat into a draw or a victory.

So come on everybody, no matter what the situation today, stay behind the lads and give them your full backing.

Times are tough at the moment, and it's a time when everybody with the Cobblers at heart needs to pull together to get the right result. So sing up and let the players know you are on their side...

BIG Steve Howard makes his return to Sixfields today and I'm sure he will receive a warm welcome from the home as well as the visiting supporters. Howard was always a big favourite with the Cobblers fans, with most of them probably wishing he was still with the club and banging in the goals. But unfortunately, that is

not the case. Howard is a fully-fledged Hatter now and in the past 14 months – after a difficult start at Kenilworth Road – has finally begun to deliver on the prolific goal-scoring promise he showed during his time with the Cobblers. Howard was once tipped by Kevin Wilson as being good enough to play in the Premiership, and I'm sure nothing would please most Cobblers fans than seeing the big man battling it out with the elite of the English game.

To do that he is going to have to keep hitting the old onion bag on a regular basis and I'm sure that won't be a problem – although I'm hoping he won't be able to hit a cow's backside with a banjo this afternoon!

THERE was much debate over Manchester United's decision to send a weakened team out to Cyprus for their Champions League clash in midweek. Some thought Alex Ferguson was wrong and was letting down the other teams in the group who would expect United to beat Maccabi Haifa rather than lose 3-0. I actually think it's a manager's prerogative to play whatever team he likes. United had already won the group and if Ferguson wanted to blood some squad players then he should be able to –

but I just hope the United boss remembers what he did on Tuesday later in the season. I can just imagine the fuss emanating from the hot-headed Scot if United are going for the title and one of their rivals comes up against a side that has nothing to play for in the league, but is perhaps looking forward to a cup final or semi-final. Yes, I'm sure if that happens then Ferguson will fully understand and accept it if the team with nothing to play for in the Premiership sends out a weakened team and gets smacked 3-0 to hand his rivals three points...not!

TUESDAY night's defeat at Oldham was one of those frustrating occasions when the whole world seemed to be against the team. The Cobblers played some good football and created a host of good chances against one of the best sides in the division – and got turned over 4-0! You could sense the disbelief among Kevan Broadhurst's men at the final whistle, but the players shouldn't get too downhearted. As the manager said after the game, if they can continue to play as they did at Boundary Park then they will soon be winning matches. And today against Luton Town would be a good time to start. Up the Cobblers.

1. MARK OVENDALE

Former Cobblers keeper Mark spent 2000-01 sharing the No 1 spot with Nathan Abbey and a year later after Abbey's departure, found himself in another battle, this time with new signing Carl Emberton. Emberton came off better with 33 League starts to Ovendale's 13, which was slightly disappointing after Mark was brought to Kenilworth Road in the early days of Ricky Hill's reign for £425,000 from Bournemouth. He cost The Cherries £30,000 from Barry Town in July 1998 and made 111 appearances with the Dean Court club, keeping an impressive 40 clean sheets on the way.

2. AARON SKELTON

Aaron is a very useful utility player, who can play a holding role in midfield, in central defence or at right back, and was Colchester United's Player of the Year before re-joining the Hatters. A trainee at Kenilworth Road in 1992, Skelton had few opportunities to break into the First Team squad. In days of cutting wage bills, manager Lennie Lawrence decided to let him go and in July 1997, Skelton joined Colchester United. He went on to play 144 times for the Layer Road team in four seasons that saw Colchester promoted from the Third Division and establishing themselves in the Second.

3. ALAN NIELSON

German-born Welsh defender Alan Neilson became manager Joe Kinnear's 15th signing since his summer rebuilding work began when he joined in February 2002. Joe turned to a man who had cost a total of £1million in transfer fees during a career spent mostly in the Premiership with Newcastle and Southampton. He played under Kevin Keegan at Newcastle, where he made 50 appearances between 1991 and 1995 before moving to Southampton for £750,000 in June 1995. He plays mainly at right back or in the centre of defence, but can also play a holding midfield role, sitting in front of the back four, and he seldom gives the ball away or makes mistakes. His experience and calm defending won him a two-year contract in the summer of 2002.

4. MATTHEW SPRING

Matthew Spring came close to leaving Kenilworth Road after his contract expired at

the end of the 2001-02 season, but after rejecting an offer from West Brom, manager Joe Kinnear was delighted to persuade the midfielder to sign on for another two years. Spring is now one of Luton's most senior players with more than 200 appearances for the Club and is one of the first names on the teamsheet.

5. RUSSELL PERRETT

Manager Joe Kinnear made Russell Perrett his seventh signing in the summer of 2001 as he began his rebuilding of the Luton squad. Perrett, a tall and intelligent centre half, made his debut at Carlisle on the opening day of the season barely 24-hours after joining the Hatters. Perrett began his pro career at Portsmouth after being spotted playing non-league football with Lymington, his home-town club. He moved on to Cardiff City in 1999 for £10,000 and helped them win promotion to Division Two. Then Cardiff spent big money during the summer, including £600,000 for Spencer Prior. Chairman Sam Hammam, a long-time friend of Kinnear from the days when they were at Wimbledon together, agreed to allow Perrett to come to Luton on a free transfer. Bournemouth made a late bid for him, but after hearing Joe's vision of Luton Town's future the defender moved to Bedfordshire.

6. MARVIN JOHNSON

There is only one Marvin, the longest-serving player at Kenilworth Road, now well past 500 career appearances for the Hatters in 14 long years. If his legs are not always up to three games in eight days any more, his heart is as big as ever and his presence in the dressing room with a young side around him is more than influential. Hatters fans just love to see Marvin surging forward over the halfway line and though he does not score too many goals, when he does they tend to be important. A one-club man since he joined as a schoolboy, Marvin took over the captaincy when Davis rejoined Burnley at the end of December 1998, and did much to keep morale high as a young team went through the trauma of receivership.

7. ADRIAN FORBES

Adrian in full gallop down the right wing gets Hatters fans on their feet like very little else. A real battler, who gives everything he's got for the cause, he also played up front in his first season at Kenilworth Road when there were suspensions and injuries. Forbes became manager Joe Kinnear's fourth summer capture when he signed a three-year contract in July 2001. He cost £60,000 from Norwich City and

the reaction of the Canaries fans revealed that he was a crowd-pleaser and that they were sorry to see him go.

8. KEVIN NICHOLLS

Luton's skipper and driving force just grew in stature in his first season at Kenilworth Road until his manager Joe Kinnear called him "the life and soul of the football club" as he led the players both on and off the pitch towards promotion. Brought from Wigan just before the start of the 2001-02 season, he quickly made the holding role in left central midfield his own and began a partnership with Matthew Spring that saw the two play together 38 times in the season. Tough in the tackle - sometimes too tough for referees liking, which led to four matches missed through suspension - Nicholls was also able to get forward and create many important goals with visionary passes out of defence. Nicholls signed a three year contract from Wigan for a staged fee that could grow up to £150,000 if he plays enough games.

9. TONY THORPE

Signed on a free transfer from Leicester, Tony Thorpe was originally played as an attacking midfielder with only limited success but when moved to a more advanced role he came into his own, scoring goals for fun. After scoring seven times in a poor side as the Town were relegated from Division One in 1996, Thorpe took Division Two by storm netting more than 30 times in all competitions, the first Luton player to do so since 1966, as the team narrowly failed to achieve promotion at the first time of asking. Quick-footed and confident, Thorpe was seemingly able to score at will as he displayed the single mindedness all top strikers possess. It was probably not a shock when a cheque for £800,000 took him to Fulham but he has returned to his spiritual home, on loan, on two separate occasions since to add to his goals tally for the Hatters.

11. STEVE ROBINSON

Northern Ireland midfielder Steve Robinson became the second of manager Joe Kinnear's new faces in the summer of 2002 when he signed his a two-year contract from First Division Preston for a fee of £50,000. He was brought in to strengthen the right side of midfield, a position that no Luton player had quite made his own in the season before. Robinson cost Preston £375,000 from

Bournemouth in May 2000. At Bournemouth, he scored an impressive 62 goals from midfield in 288 appearances, his best season being 1998-99 when he scored 16.

12. CHRIS COYNE

Aussie defender Chris Coyne had a few bad breaks but finished up in a dominant centre back partnership with Russell Perrett that helped to keep 10 clean sheets in the last 14 games - all unbeaten - as promotion was clinched. Like Perrett, Coyne is strong in the air and on the ground and he has plenty of courage as he showed when coming back from a bad knee ligament injury that kept him out for 12 matches. He started out at West Ham, but made just one substitute appearance before moving to Dundee after loan spells at Brentford and Southend.

14. ANDREW FOTIADIS

Joe Kinnear has called Andrew Fotiadis the unluckiest footballer ever as no matter what he does, he seems to pick up an injury. After six seasons at Kenilworth Road, he has made just 106 league appearances, 64 of them from the bench. He won England Schools caps at Under-15 and Under-18 level, and looked to be on the way to becoming an old-fashioned centre-forward, with good physique, power, and concentrated determination to score goals.

15. DEAN CROWE

The former Cobblers loanee joined Luton the day after Carl Griffiths' season ended at Leyton Orient in September 2001 - and he carried on where Carl left off, a poacher for a poacher. Small, but quick in the box, good at turning people and a lethal finisher, he first came to Kenilworth Road on a month's loan from Stoke City in September 2001. Crowe stepped up and scored four times in his first six games, winning over the crowd. When the loan was up, manager Joe Kinnear immediately signed him on a free transfer for two-and-a-half years, with a sell-on clause that Stoke City were to receive 50 per cent of any future transfer fee. He had loan spells here at Sixfields, Bury and Plymouth, but later had the chance to come to Kenilworth Road.

17. EMMERSON BOYCE

A strong and intelligent defender, Emmerson Boyce more than held his

place as Joe Kinnear just kept on signing defenders all around him. It says a lot that out of the squad that Joe inherited, Boyce was one of only three players who continued to be regulars. One of the many to come through from Luton's schools and youth development programme, Boyce was signed as a YTS boy in the summer of 1995, and graduated to the First Team squad after a debut in the Auto Windscreens Shield in January 1999.

19. STEVE HOWARD

Steve Howard struggled to win over the crowd more than he struggled to convince the manager that he was worth his place after joining the Hatters from Northampton in March 2001. A tall and powerful striker, who can be a real asset in both penalty areas, he began his Luton career in a losing battle against relegation, but once manager Joe Kinnear began rebuilding the Hatters side in the summer of 2001, Howard was an ever present on the team sheet. Sections of the crowd have booed him, but those who understand more about the game see his value. He ran into trouble early in the 2001-02 season when he insisted on twice taking a penalty against the advice of several senior players. He missed both and was disciplined amid hints from Joe that he had played his last match for the Hatters. But Howard battled back, scored three goals in his next four games and never looked back.



TOM SMITH: Manager Tom Smith brought some well known names to Northampton during his spell as manager. Internationals from England, Scotland, Wales and Ireland wore the claret and white during the war. He left in 1948 after a dispute.

RON JAMES: After spells with Wolves and Birmingham Ron joined the Cobblers in May 1948 but failed to hold down a regular first team place and returned to Birmingham. He later played for Kidderminster Harriers.

TOM SMALLEY: Tom was 30 when he signed for the Cobblers at the beginning of the war, yet he stayed until 1951 as the regular right back, forming a formidable partnership with Bill Barron. He became player coach at upper Gornal.

HARRY LOWERY: Harry was one of the three players transferred from West Brom in October 1945, for a combined fee of £4,500. During the war he had guested for Walsall, injury forced him to retire from the league, he joined Bromsgrove.

JACK ANSELL: 'Jack', real name William was signed from Bletchley brick works as cover but once he got a first team place he could not be shifted. It was a broken leg v Southend that saw him lose his place. He moved onto Oxford.

BILL COLEY: After spells with Wolves, Bournemouth and Torquay, Bill joined the Cobblers having been a guest for them during the war. His tough tackling often got him into trouble with referees and he was the first post war Cobbler to be dismissed.

EDDIE FREIMAN: Eddie came to England as

a translator during the war, he had represented his country 12 times. A prolific scorer with Peterborough in the midland league his stay at the County Ground was short, he moved on to Nuneaton.

JACK JENNINGS: This ex Preston, Cardiff and Middlesbrough wing half had visions of being a surgeon until the war changed his plans. He became a physio and coach, not only to Northampton, but to the British Olympic, and England Amateurs.

TOMMY FOWLER: 'Flash' was to spend 16 seasons at Northampton and play over 500 league games for the club, more than any other player, yet he only turned up at the County Ground after being stationed at Bromham recovering from wounds.

DAVE SMITH: Ex South Shields and Newcastle player Dave, played for Northampton during the war and was also prominent in the army side that toured the Rhine area. After playing he became the club secretary and manager for a spell.

BILL BARRON: Bill was to be the last man to play for Northampton and Northants C.C.C on a regular basis. He also guested for the club many times during the war. Although he started life as a winger he developed into a top flight defender.

BILL SMITH: After being released by Plymouth and Reading, Bill settled into the Cobblers side however competition for places saw him move on to Birmingham and Blackburn Rovers before accepting a position of player coach at Accrington.

GWYN HUGHES: Welshman Gwyn was living in Rugby when he was recommended to the club by ex player Len Hammond. He was to stay 11 seasons playing in all the five forwards, and three half back positions, before joining Bedford.

Director of Youth Development: Paul Curtis



Director of Youth Development Paul Curtis writes;

Last Sunday all of our scheduled games against Oxford United were cancelled because of the stormy weather. One of the unfortunate drawbacks of not playing local games was that Oxford travelled and had to be turned back. But, despite the weather, last Sunday was not a wasted day, and our Under 9's 10's and 11's had a tutorial session discussing diet and nutrition. Even at this age, it's important for the players to learn good habits, and to be aware of what they are eating. As the players enter the 14,15 and 16 age group their performance levels will be affected by health and fitness factors.

Obviously our scholarship players are given guidance on their food and nutrition in terms of training and match preparation within the course of a week. As can be seen by Charlie Brewster's report below on the under 9s, it's important to start the players off in their

careers as professionally as possible.

Youth Recruitment Officer Charlie Brewster writes;

During the recent half term our Under nine players took part in a residential course under the title - "The beginning for a young professional."

Arriving early Wednesday morning to the training camp near Peterborough the young players struggled to carry their bags up the stairs to the rooms (first lesson only pack what you need!). Having settled in I gave them a talk on how to get from under nine to under nineteen followed by our first training session. They responded brilliantly to our talk and had a great session. Having monitored what they

chose to eat for evening meal it was a great time for our diet talk, and the benefits and good habits to get into before packing them off to bed.

The next day breakfast was interesting - who had listened to the food talk? Mental notes taken we continued with our next training session, a balance and co-ordination session, in for lunch and departure to Staverton Park, Daventry for some matches before parents arrived to pick them up again.

Residential days like these are invaluable in learning about our young players and dealing with information learnt. It also implants small pieces of software into the players minds that will be of great use in future months and years to come. I know most of the young under nines enjoyed the days. I will see over the coming months who benefits the most from the information gleaned."







CHAIRMAN BARRY STONHILL WRITES:

It is now 8 weeks since we launched our SOS appeal, the aim of which is to raise £500,000 additional income for the club to ensure its survival during what is well documented as an extremely difficult time for ALL football clubs. Many people/organisations have either said they will pledge money or have promised a donation, but to date the response has on the whole has been disappointing.

As a guide I am setting out below how we broke down the £500,000 and have listed

along side the money received to date along the respected areas:-
I appreciate monies from organised events will trickle in over the next three months but to date the response from the public at large, (save for the few who have organised and supported events) and local companies has been cool to say the least.

Just think if 20% of our season ticket holders donated £100 this would produce £50,000. If 10% of the 40,000 that went to Wembley donated £20 that would produce £80,000! Surely it's not too much to ask to ensure the survival of what after all is an integral part of Northampton's history and hopefully future.

I would also like to address a couple of common questions that are often asked. What happens if the money is not raised and what about the future?

Firstly if the money is not raised it is doubtful that the Cobblers will be able to continue. Secondly the business plan produced by the club for the next two seasons addressing medium term problems and the club will be able to continue trading provided certain income/expenditure budgets are adhered to.

As a club we have always tried to be open with the public at large and fans in particular. We have nothing to hide and will shortly be holding a public meeting at Sixfields to answer any criticisms/comments.

In the meantime it is a particularly frustrating period on and off the pitch. We as a board are confident Kevan and his team will turn things round on the pitch and with your help we can do likewise off the pitch. However everyone at the club needs your support during these troublesome times.

Finally a big thank you to all those who have already donated or helped the appeal and if you have thought about a donation, please do it now!


