# Talking Reds

Following numerous press reports surrounding the future of the Club, Oakwell Review spoke to owner Peter Doyle for the latest news.

"At the moment I have been in negotiations with the Football League because as far as I was concerned we had a settlement with them on December 12.

"I have a letter from the Football League agreeing a settlement but since then the Football Association has shifted the goalposts.

"I had an agreement with what we should pay the VAT and what we should pay the taxman. These offers were actually higher than suggested during negotiations. The only problem we have now is the FA changing the rules.

"As for debts before I bought the Club, such as Mr Parkin's, I wasn't even involved with the Club at that time. All the guidance I have been given from the Football League says they are not my responsibility. Mr Parkin is an unsecured creditor.

"The galling thing is that there are people sat out there now who were involved in putting the Club in the position it was in who know what they have done.

"When I came in to buy the Club I made it clear my aim was to secure the long term future of Barnsley Football Club. And to put a structure in place which ensures the Club never gets into the position it was in to start with.

"As the administrator said the two offers which were acceptable, including mine, all involved some kind of development.

"I have never said I wouldn't develop the Club but I am interested in 'sweating' the assets rather than selling them off.

"There are certain things which the administrator has said and done that I am not happy about. For example he said I wouldn't need to do a Creditors Voluntary Agreement but I have been subsequently told by the FA that I need to do.

"However, the administrator now says I have to foot the bill for that when it was him who advised me that I didn't need one. Maybe if he had done the job correctly in the first place issues such as this wouldn't keep cropping up.

"I repeat that my aim is to make the Club secure. I own Barnsley Football Club lock, stock and barrel so all the decisions are mine and mine alone. And that is not a responsibility I will shirk from.

"I have no intention of having a succession of managers sprinkled around Oakwell like confetti. I want stability and to move the Club forward.

"I have been silent in the media because I have found that everything I have said is twisted and distorted so that people and the public of Barnsley aren't given a clear picture of what is going on.

"With that in mind I am willing to have a public meeting where we can get everyone there to see who has been telling the truth in this saga.

"I assure you other offers for the Club were purely on a development basis and mine was the only one that put the Club at the heart of its plans. Enjoy the game today and thank you for your support of Barnsley Football Club."

# Glyn's Game

**There has been a lot of speculation surrounding matters off the pitch here at Oakwell in recent weeks.**

It shouldn't have affected the way the team was playing but I can't help but wonder if it has been on people's minds.

We had a meeting with Peter Doyle earlier in the week so hopefully that will have settled people's minds here on the playing side as to what is happening.

Obviously I'm still caretaker manager at the moment, Mr Doyle has said he wants things to remain as they are but he would like to see, as we all would, results becoming a little bit better.

This may be helped in coming weeks with the arrival of a few new faces. I am being allowed by the Club to bring in a few people. However, we have hit a stumbling block with the Football League.

## Working hard

We didn't know we had an embargo on us regarding transfers or loan deals but as I write these notes that is still the case.

Mr Doyle is working hard to remedy this situation, so with a bit of luck I will be able to do what I have wanted to do since I became caretaker manager and bring in some players.

With the situation being as it is people would have to leave the Club for anyone new to be accommodated.

Whenever a club is in the position we're in other clubs try to take advantage of it by taking away your best players. Bruce Dyer is just one player of many we have had enquiries about.

It's not ideal because it is distracting for the player and distracting for everyone at the Club. Bruce's contract is up at the end of the season so he is very much playing for his future and he doesn't need any other distractions.

I've said all along ever since I took over first team duties from Steve

Parkin I would like to be judged on my team, so hopefully I will be able to make some changes and start to build my team.

The start of the New Year has been disappointing results wise. Two straight defeats has left us needing to pick up points fast so we can move out of our current position.

## Game of two halves

The Northampton Town match on New Year's Day was typical of the way we have been playing here at Oakwell recently.

I was pleased with the first half performance but the second half was not acceptable.

They scored their goal with a lucky deflection, but I suppose you could say if you don't shoot you don't score, so maybe we can learn from that as well.

I'm looking for us to put together back-to-back good halves here at Oakwell and maybe then we can get something from the game.

Overall I was happier with what I saw at Queens Park Rangers. We had the lion's share of possession throughout the match without ever really looking like we were going to score.

Kevin Donovan hit the bar just before half time and at that stage I was still fairly confident of getting something out of the game because there was still plenty of time left. But it wasn't to be.

It was good to have Kevin back in the team. He has been unlucky in that he has returned over the Christmas period and the reserve team programme has shut down for a break.

Since then the fixture list has restarted but a couple of games have been called off due to the weather so he hasn't had much chance to get match fit. He will get that in time though.

I paired Kevin Betsy with Bruce Dyer up front last weekend to see how they gelled together. Kevin could be the ideal foil for Bruce because he is

Today's game is a very important one. Everyone can see our league position and work out for themselves what we need to start doing.

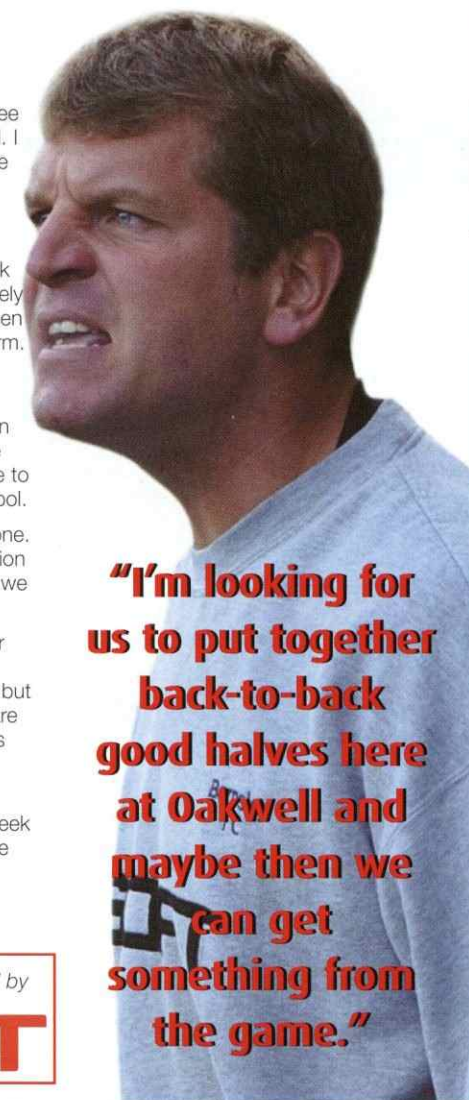

## in brief

### ROUND UP FROM DIVISION TWO

Blackpool manager Steve McMahon will step up his search for a new goalkeeper with number two Michael Theoklitos still out injured.

First-choice goalkeeper Phil Barnes is now fully recovered from the hip injury that sidelined him for three matches at the end of November.

"I'm looking to bring any players in that can improve my squad, but the need for another 'keeper is important right now," said McMahon.

Norwich have completed the signing of Stockport County defender Keith Briggs for £65,000.

The 21-year-old rose through the ranks at Edgeley Park since joining as a trainee in 1996 and was the player of the year last season when the Hatters were relegated from Division One.

Canaries chief executive Neil Doncaster said: "We're delighted to have finally secured Keith's signature and would like to wish him all the best in his Norwich City career."

Bristol City goalkeeper Billy Mercer has decided to call time on his career after 15 years as a professional.

The 33-year-old has admitted defeat in his two-and-a-half-year battle against a serious groin injury which required six operations. Mercer was a £300,000 signing from Chesterfield in October 1999 and was voted City's Player of the Year in the 1999-2000 campaign.

"I decided I owe it to the club and the fans to be honest and say 'enough's enough'," said Mercer, who is now pondering a coaching role.

Colchester have taken Arsenal defender Liam Chilvers on trial with a view to a loan move. The 21-year-old will line up for United's reserves against Bristol City and could land a month-long loan deal if he impresses manager Steve Whitton.

Chilvers has had previous loan spells at Notts County, Northampton and Beveren in Belgium.

### ANALYSTS PREDICT WAGE CUTS

Football industry analysts have warned the harsh financial realities facing the game are finally having an effect as they delivered a cautiously optimistic outlook for 2003.

However, they warned the thorny issue of reducing overall player wages remains absolutely crucial if clubs are to stay in business in the next 12 months and beyond.

Dan Jones, an analyst on the football industry team at Deloitte Touche Sport, "There are still fundamental issues to be addressed, namely wages, but there's now a real will to do this and a realisation that there can be, in all but the most high-profile cases, no more big wage rises."

**TAKING A CHANCE**

## It's never easy being a player coming through the ranks at a football club.

Traditionally the player who signed when he was still a boy and then provided sterling service throughout a club's junior teams is often the lowest paid member of the squad and the first to be replaced when things go wrong.

Usually, though, the one thing a home-grown player can rely on is the support of the fans at the one club he has worked for so far in his career.

And that it is why it is so surprising that Brian O'Callaghan has been on the end of some abuse from sections of the Barnsley fans in recent weeks.

A more likeable character you are unlikely to find at a football club, Brian typically shrugs off the criticism.

He said: "It doesn't bother me to be honest. I try and pay no attention to anything bad being said. It would be more of a help though if people actually got behind the team."

## SOLID AT THE BACK

The poor run of form over the Christmas period means the Reds are in a genuine relegation battle. One that will require them to be solid at the back if the results are to be turned around.

With Mike Flynn on loan at Blackpool an opportunity for someone to stake a regular slot alongside Chris Morgan has become available.

During October O'Callaghan and Morgan looked like they were beginning to form a decent centre half partnership. Unfortunately Brian injured his stomach muscles away at Chesterfield and found himself spending too much time in the treatment room.

## Our questions answered...

### Q If you weren't a footballer what would be your dream job?

A. As a footballer you are not allowed many excesses so to live the life of a true rock star would be great. So I'd have to say someone like a member of the Red Hot Chili Peppers would be my dream job.

### Q And what would you have been?

A. I would have tried to be something in sport. I played a lot of rugby

when I was younger and had trials for Munster in Ireland. If football had turned me down I would have tried to make myself something at rugby. My position was centre.

### Q Away from football who do you most admire?

A. No one really stands out but I admire anyone who has come back from extreme adversity. Someone who has really turned their life around and made a success of it.

The big Irishman admits it was a frustration not to be able to build on the form he was showing.

"I was out for about five weeks after I injured myself. I did it after about half an hour of the Chesterfield match but I managed to stay on until half time. The injury is ok now but it was a shame because I was just starting to feel good in the team."

For his size, Brian isn't the typical ball-winning centre half. By his own admission he has a certain style of play and it is one that can give his manager on the touchline a few heart palpitations.

## ABILITY ON THE BALL

"I like playing football and at times I suppose I take a few risks. Managers don't always like the way I play and people have tried to change me but this is the way I am."

His ability on the ball has helped him in recent weeks to play right back. A position, which while not being his favourite, is one that he is fairly comfortable in.

"I think I am better off at centre half but like most players as long as I'm in the team I don't really mind where I play. A couple of seasons ago I played at right wingback, which was ok. Overall, I think I prefer centre half though."

Today's game against Luton, a team the Reds have beaten once this season, is one the home team needs to get a positive result from to try and build some momentum.

At the beginning of the season relegation was almost an unthinkable option and even now the players are reluctant to come to terms with what they see as a false league position.

Brian said: "We still feel we are a lot better than our league position suggests. We have more potential than we are

showing and we know we are capable of putting together a run to move us away from danger.

"No one is feeling too down at the moment and nobody knows why we are so inconsistent. I think sometimes we raise our standards to the top teams but lower our performances against the teams near the bottom."

## SPOTTED BY WALKER

Having started the season in the reserve team the appointment of Glyn Hodges to the role of caretaker manager ensured that Brian's ability wouldn't go unnoticed.

Another boost was Colin Walker moving into a more senior role, for it was Walker who spotted O'Callaghan's potential when he was playing in Ireland for the Irish under-16 team.

"Colin knows what I'm capable of because I was signed on his recommendation. And I have worked with Glyn for quite a while now. It's hard work for the two of them having look after all the professionals.

"But the training sessions we have had are always interesting even though with two coaches it must be hard to organise."

Being from Limerick, which is a rugby stronghold in Ireland, Brian could have made his name at the oval ball game rather than football. It was soccer, though, that always caught his eye and his dream became reality when he moved to Barnsley.

Graduating through the Academy a year before the likes of Rory Fallon and David Mulligan, Brian, who will be 22 next month, still has another year of his contract left to run.

"I don't get back home much to Limerick but my family try to get over when they can. Barnsley is a great second home though and I'm still very much enjoying my football."

### Q And in football?

A. When I was growing up I always admired Paul McGrath as a player. What he did off the pitch isn't exactly ideal but for his ability on it I have to say him. He did ok not having to train as

well because of his dodgy knees!

### Q What was the last CD you bought?

A. The Red Hot Chili Peppers latest album called 'By the Way'.

### Q What was the last movie you saw?

A. The last movie I actually watched was my favourite film, The Usual Suspects. I had it bought as a Christmas present this year on DVD.

### Q What was the last book you read?

A. Roy Keane's autobiography. I admire his football ability I just think he should learn when to shut up. However, having said that, at least he says what he thinks

### Q Who has the worst dress sense in the club?

A. Chris Morgan. He always either wears his Adidas tracksuit or a Grandad jumper to come to training in.

### Q What would be your perfect day?

A. The perfect day would be to win promotion and the celebrate with my family and girlfriend.

# The Skipper

**The last two matches leave me very much in a position where I feel like I am repeating myself in these programme notes.**

We were very disappointed with the way we played and the result against Northampton Town here at Oakwell on New Year's Day. Losing at home with two bad goals made it a poor start to 2003.

I think we did a lot better last Saturday at Queens Park Rangers. Similar to today's game, QPR were flying high in the league and we knew it was going to be a tough game.

In the end we were quite pleased with the way that we had played even though the result was again disappointing. Apart from their goal they didn't create much and we had far more possession.

We had a few players back for the QPR game such as Gary Jones, Steve Hayward and Kevin Donovan, which made us more solid across the midfield.

A midfield four of Kevin, Steve, Gary and Alex Neil definitely makes us a tougher proposition in the middle of the pitch because each player is different. It enables Gary Jones to get around the pitch because Steve likes to sit in just in front of the defence.

With Kev Donovan on the right it allowed Kevin Betsy to partner Bruce up front. With a few more games in that position Kevin could become a real threat because he possesses something which defenders hate more than anything - pace.

I told him before the game to not play directly against their back four but to drop a bit deeper so he could turn and run with the ball.

The one thing letting us down last weekend was the final ball. Either our final pass, cross or shot wasn't of the quality needed to break down their defence. It is something we have been working on this week so hopefully we can put that right today.

There has been talk of players coming into the

Club if we can sort the situation out with the Football League.

While on paper our squad looks good enough, new faces always help to bring new ideas and little bit of a buzz around the place.

We've had Adrian Littlejohn training with us recently and he has been looking very sharp. Someone like Adrian would be a welcome addition to the squad.

I think if people are brought in then some people may have to leave to balance the books a little bit. Mike Flynn has gone out to Blackpool for three months loan with a view to them offering him a further year's deal.

I think it is the correct decision both for Mike and for the Club. His contract is up in the summer so Blackpool are offering him a little extra security and the Club are able to bring younger lads such as Brian or Lee Crooks through into the team.

Things have been a little bit unsettled here recently because of a lot of talk in the papers.

We had a meeting with Peter Doyle which hopefully has cleared the air a little bit and people can settle down to their jobs again.

Mr Doyle was very honest with us and told us a lot that was going on which we didn't realise was happening. He said as long as he is here he is striving for stability and wants us to concentrate on winning football matches.

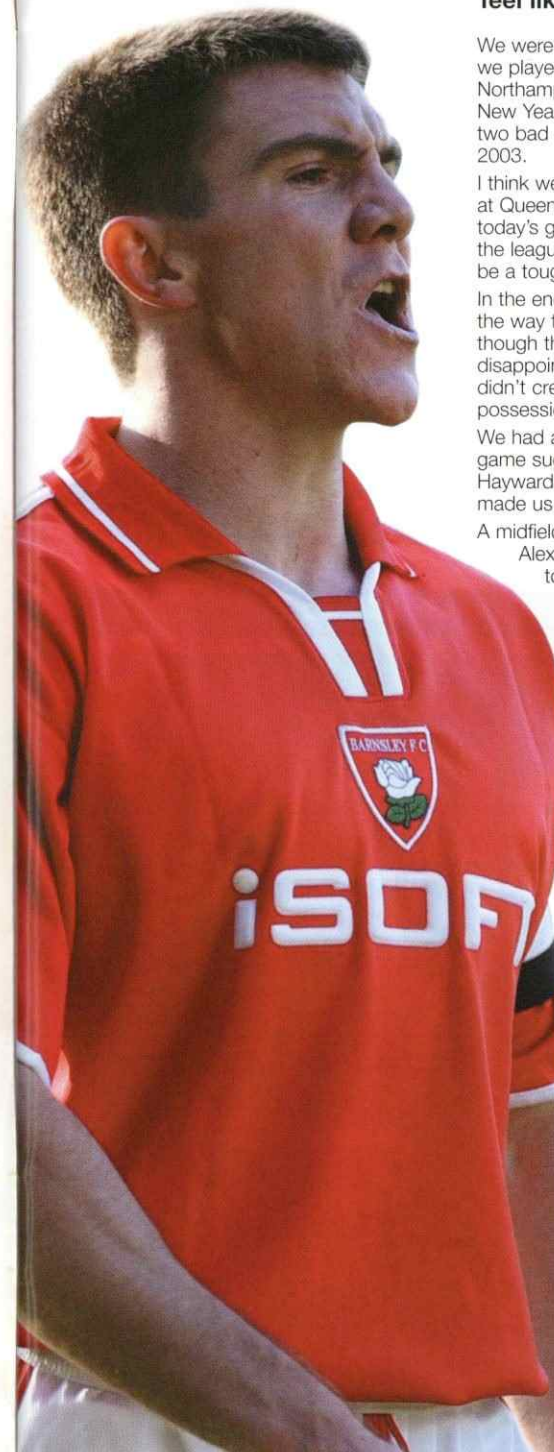
Although Glyn is classed as caretaker manager he is still manager of the football club and so we shouldn't think of it as being any different to him being made permanent.

I'd like to end by congratulating Andy Marriott and his wife Stacey on the birth of their baby daughter Amelia Rose.

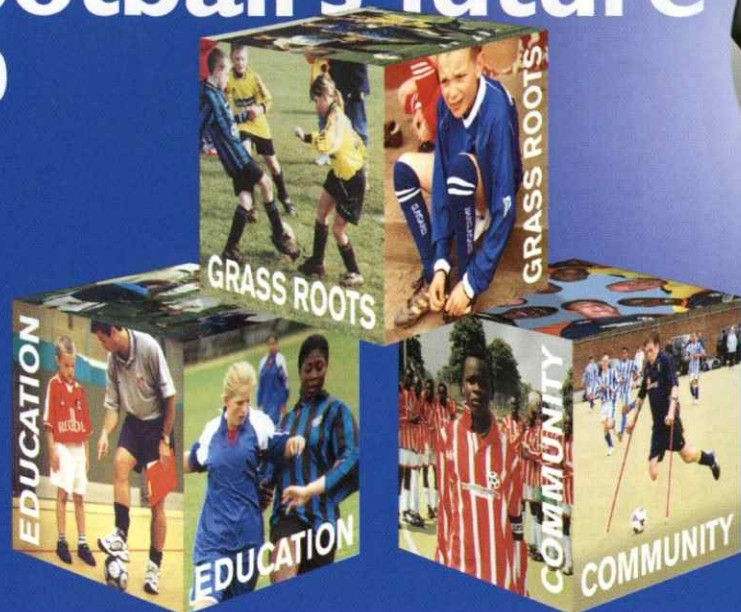

# Rich pickings

**The weather is often the subject of much debate at this time of the year.**

While we have not had a decent snowfall for a number of years the weather forecast these days is studied not only by the groundsman but also by the accountant.

In these harsh financial times clubs such as Barnsley can be seriously affected if the weather closes in and home matches are postponed.

Take this month for example. If today's match had been postponed due to a icy pitch, or waterlogging or snow then the Club would have had only one match during the whole of the month. And that was on New Year's Day.

It would mean an entire month's budget for the Club is based on just one game. At this time when the Club is under new ownership I'm sure that would place a massive amount of pressure on the purse strings.

All clubs will, of course, play 23 home league matches this season. But it is naive to think each match will attract the same level of support. Finances, a little bit like luck, don't always even out during a season!

It's not just Barnsley who are in this situation. It's actually quite frightening when you look into the current cash crisis affecting the majority of football clubs.

Fortunately football still has, just about though, the goodwill of the public. I can't help but wonder if this was any other business

how many clubs would now be closed down.

But it is not worth pushing your luck so hopefully the Reds' excellent ground staff can keep matches on here at Oakwell and minimise the cost to the Club who, after all, still have bills and players to pay.

## Pitch Battle 2

An interesting development cropped up during the week when Charlton Athletic formally requested the Premier League to look into their match at Stamford Bridge against Chelsea.

The Addicks, you may remember slumped 4-1 on a pitch that Claudio Ranieri described as a beach.

On the face of it it may appear a touch of sour grapes on the part of Charlton but when you look deeper into it you begin to see the point they are trying to make.

Apparently the 'pitch' wasn't actually a pitch at all. It was in fact the base for new turf, which was due to be laid.

Now, given that Premier League rules state all matches must be played on a grass surface, Charlton may have a point of appeal.



The Addicks' chief executive, Peter Varney, makes the very valid point that Charlton's players were totally unprepared for the surface in terms of their footwear, which played very much like artificial turf.

I think the issue here is one of rather than the pitch just being bad, as it was at Walsall where the only goal of the game was a direct result of an horrendous playing surface, or is it plainly against the Premier League rules.

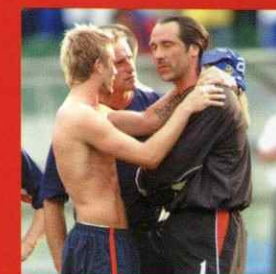
I'm very much looking forward to the verdict on this one because I think it is a case that isn't as clear cut as it may appear at first glance.

# The week at Oakwell

**What's been happening at Oakwell in the New Year? Catch up with events here...**

## Wednesday 1st January

It was a disappointing start to 2003 for Barnsley as the New Year brought with it yet another defeat - this time at the hands of Northampton Town at Oakwell. It was going well for the Reds as they went in front on 25 minutes when Chris Lumisdon smashed in his first goal since August to make it 1-0. But disaster struck just before the half-time whistle when Paul Harsley's 20-yard shot took a horrible deflection off Lumisdon to nestle in the bottom corner for an equaliser completely against the run of play. In the second half things started to go wrong for the Reds as Northampton pushed forward. Their winner eventually came on 70 minutes when Daryl Stamp slotted the ball past the on-rushing Andy Marriott to give the visitors a 2-1 victory.

Reds caretaker boss, Glyn Hodges, gave his thoughts on today's defeat. He said: "I think we have been unlucky today and we have not been getting the rub of the green for a while now. That equaliser was a joke wasn't it? It was unbelievably bad luck but our reaction afterwards was disappointing. They got their tails up in the second half and then suddenly we looked very, very nervous. It was a comical second half and we made it easy for them."

## Thursday 2nd January

Steve Hayward was forced to miss yesterday's game due to a hamstring strain sustained during a fitness test shortly before kick-off. It is hoped he will rejoin the squad on Monday. Also missing from the game was Paul Gibbs who fell ill overnight and was not well enough to play.

Additions to the injury list following yesterday's defeat by Northampton Town include Neil Austin, who received a knock on the shin, and Dean Gorre who suffered a nasty looking shin wound. But with ten days until the next first team match against QPR they should both be OK.

## Friday 3rd January

Saturday's reserve team game with Huddersfield Town has been postponed. Rain and snow in South Yorkshire over the last few days has left the pitch unplayable and the match was called off following an inspection earlier today.

## Saturday 4th January

Glyn Hodges has revealed that he wants the manager's job at Barnsley on a permanent basis. Speaking to the Yorkshire Post, Glyn said: "I have spoken to the chairman and hope to speak to Mr Doyle soon. I can improve this football club and I have players ready who will improve it. I need to get a contract first, but I need to be judged on a Glyn Hodges team."

## Monday 6th January

Mike Sheron is fighting to be fit for Saturday's trip to QPR after suffering with a thigh strain. Mike is joined by Steve Hayward, who has not yet returned to training, and Dean Gorre who missed training today due to illness.

Paul Gibbs and Gary Jones have both returned to full training so are back in contention for Saturday's match.

## Tuesday 7th January

The Reds' postponed Avon Insurance League Cup-Tie against Huddersfield Town has been rearranged. The game, which has already been called off twice due to bad weather, will now be played on Wednesday 22nd January, KO 7pm.

Barnsley have brought in striker Adrian Littlejohn on trial. The 33-year-old will look to play his first game in tomorrow's reserve match with Rotherham United.

## Wednesday 8th January

Tonight's reserve team match against Rotherham United at Don Valley Stadium has been postponed. A pitch inspection took place earlier this afternoon and it was decided the ground was unplayable. No new date has been set.

The FA Youth Cup Fifth Round draw has been made and Barnsley or Middlesbrough have been drawn away at either Luton Town or Bradford City. The tie must be played on or before Saturday February 15th 2003. But the Reds Academy must face Middlesbrough in the Fourth Round to book their place - this game is on Monday February 3rd.

## Thursday 9th January

Saturday's game at Loftus Road is on although the pitch will be subject to an inspection should conditions worsen, according to QPR.

Jerry Lonsdale, Operations Director at QPR, said: "As a precaution against extremely cold overnight temperatures we are running the underoil heating system this week. Whilst the pitch is currently under a layer of snow the ground is soft underneath and playable. We are confident that Saturday's game will go ahead unless exceptional weather hits us in the latter part of the week."

## Friday 10th January

Barnsley defender Mike Flynn will today sign for Second Division rivals Blackpool on loan. Mike has made a total of 21 appearances for the Reds and has featured at the heart of the Barnsleys defence for the last seven matches. He has agreed a three-month deal and is expected to make his Seasiders debut at Swindon tomorrow.

## Saturday 11th January

Barnsley's poor start to 2003 continued as Glyn Hodges' men slumped to a 1-0 defeat at Loftus Road. The only goal of the game came on 10 minutes when QPR's Richard Paequet found space in the area to volley past a stranded Andy Marriott. The Reds pushed forward in the second half but as the seconds ticked away another defeat was inevitable.

For Barnsley's Academy side it was a completely different story as they started the year with a thumping 8-0 victory over Derby County at the Academy Complex. The Reds were rampant and have now suffered just one defeat in the past 12 matches. Goals from Griff Jones (2), Richard Carrington (2),

Dale Tonge, Tom Baker, Chris Cox and Gary Padgett gave Barnsley a deserved eight goal victory.

## Sunday 12th January

Reds caretaker boss Glyn Hodges gave his thoughts on the defeat at QPR. He said: "I can't fault the lads on their application and effort but we did not have the quality in the final third and I have told them that in the dressing room. They work hard in training and we have done extra work but they just did not do it in the game."

"I think we are missing the right ball or the right header and it is not just about luck because if we can get that quality then we would make our odds a lot better," he added.

## Monday 13th January

Reds skipper Chris Morgan is facing a race against time to be fit for Saturday's game against Luton Town after picking up a knee injury at Loftus Road. Paul Gibbs has also missed training today after picking up a groin strain in the same match.

## Tuesday 14th January

Trialist striker Adrian Littlejohn will finally get his chance to impress in tomorrow's reserve team game against Bury at Oakwell. The 32-year-old has been training with the Reds over the past few months and signed trialist forms earlier this month.

## Wednesday 15th January

Chris Morgan could go back into full training tomorrow after recovering well from a knee injury. Paul Gibbs is now the only major fitness worry ahead of Saturday's big game.

Reds caretaker manager Glyn Hodges has been handed a welcome boost with the news that the FA plan to consult clubs before naming their England U20 squad for the FIFA World Youth Championships, in the United Arab Emirates in March. Reds youngster Neil Austin has been a regular in the U-20 squad and if called up it could mean that he would miss some of Barnsley's matches.

David Mulligan is poised to join up with the New Zealand squad for the AFC/OFC Challenge Cup 2003 also in March. David has been named in the Kiwis provisional squad and will find out if he has made the final 20-man party in mid-February. He could potentially miss Barnsley's home match against Colchester United (March 22) and the trips to Bristol City (March 29) and Oldham Athletic (April 5).

Barnsley's reserves powered to within one point of league leaders Huddersfield Town thanks to a 4-0 thumping over Bury at Oakwell. Two goals by trialist Adrian Littlejohn and goals from Rory Fallon and Richard Carrington gave the Reds a well-deserved victory.

## Thursday 16th January

Barnsley's Academy face a trip to Luton Town in the FA Youth Cup Fifth Round if they beat Middlesbrough in the Fourth Round on February 3rd. Luton beat Bradford City, 1-0 last night to secure their place in the next round.

Now, this may be scoffed at by a lot of people out there but the facts are this is not the first time a top player has had to cash in his dream motor.

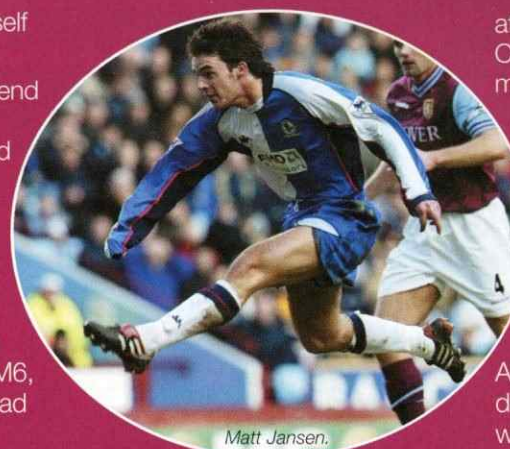
Aston Villa's Alan Wright had the same problem years ago when he finally saved up

There is going to be an addition to that number after Matt Jansen proved himself a good sport and thoroughly

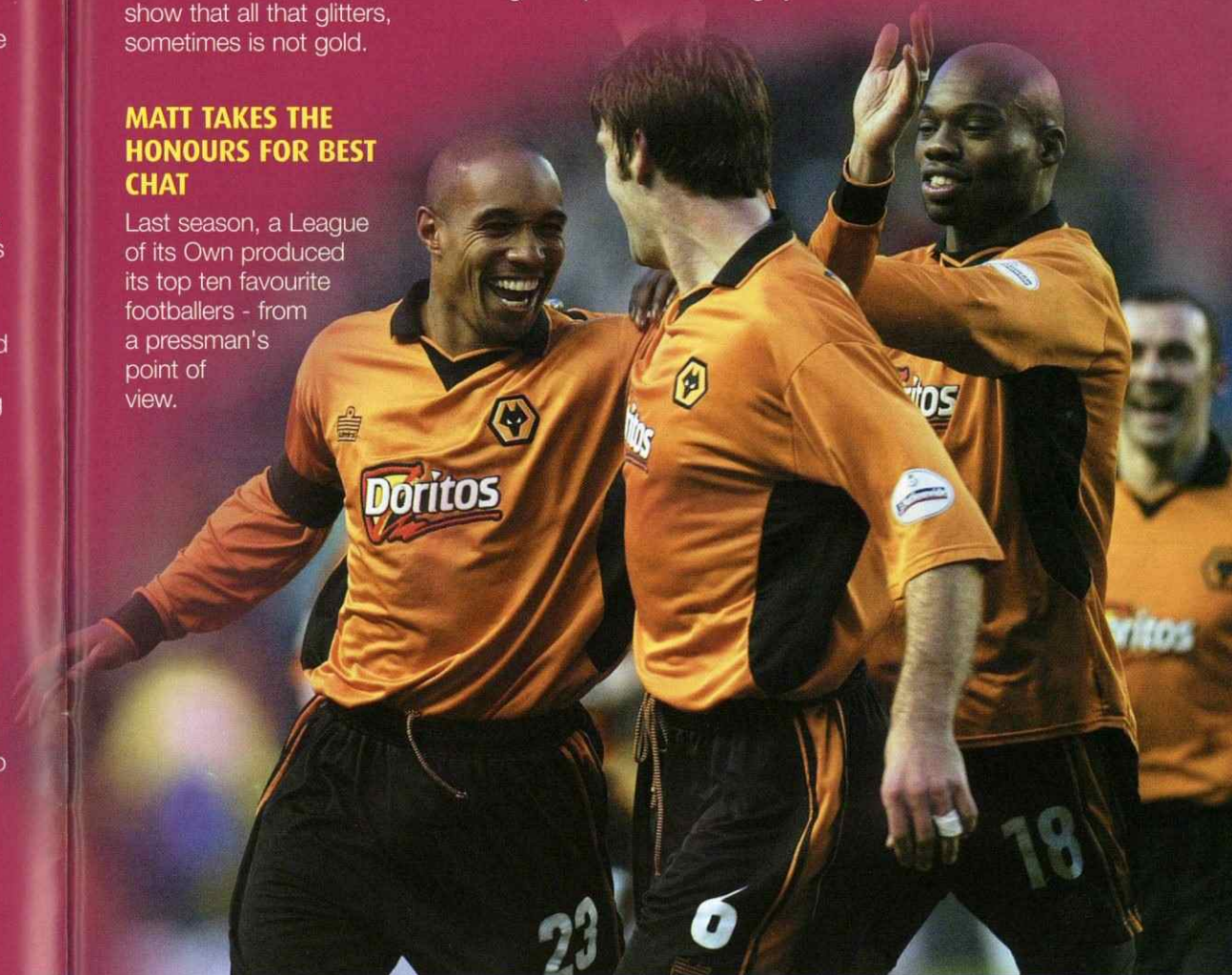
affable chap following his FA Cup heroics at Villa Park last month.

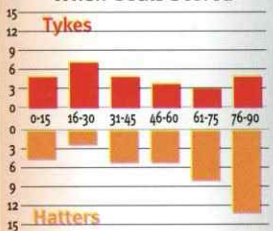

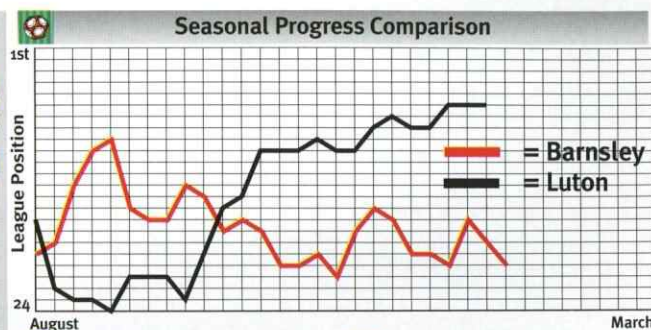

The players and supporters of Luton Town FC will be delighted to get their promotion push back on course today after a spell when postponed games have denied them the chance to bounce back from a disappointing defeat in their most recent outing.

The 2-1 reverse at Chesterfield on New Year's Day seems a long time ago and it's safe to assume the fresh legged Hatters will be out to bounce back here at Oakwell today. Under the guidance of the highly respected former Wimbledon manager Joe Kinnear, Luton are a force to be reckoned with once again and they do not accept defeat easily.

## Back challenging

Spring, Nicholls and Crowe were all involved in training this week and may be ready to play this afternoon.

This side always scores goals so the odds are they will add to their impressive tally this afternoon and Luton will no doubt have a hint of revenge on their minds today. Memories of the Tykes' win at Kenilworth Road back in August are all too painful for the Hatters and they will be desperate to get some payback in this game.

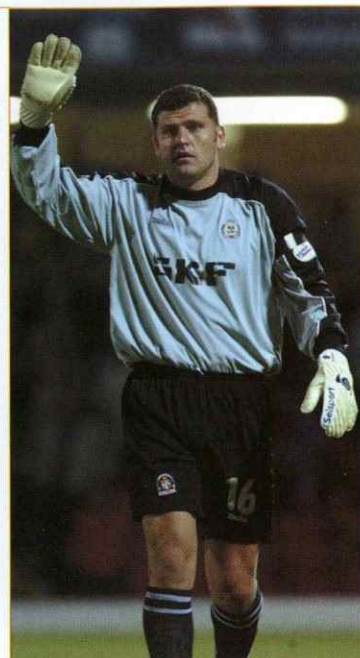

#### 22. DAVE BAYLISS

Born: 08.06.76

An experienced performer added to the Luton ranks last season, Bayliss played his part in the final push towards promotion from the Third Division. Started his career at Rochdale and played close to 200 league games for the club before making the move to Kenilworth Road in 2001. Just coming back into contention after a spell out with injury.

#### 23. IAN HILLIER

Born: 26.12.79

This youthful Luton defence has learned by its own mistakes in the

last year and is still prone to the occasional error. The goal scoring power of Kinnear's side has often got them out of trouble, but his back line are making progress all the time and Hillier has been one of those making big strides. Started out at Tottenham and has been capped by Wales at under-21 level.

### Midfielders

#### 11. STEVE ROBINSON

Born: 10.12.74

A summer arrival from Preston and Robinson has been in good form for the Hatters so far this term. Started his career at Tottenham and he managed a handful of first team appearances for the north London giants, notably playing in the 1993 derby clash with Arsenal at Highbury. A right-sided midfielder and who has been capped by Northern Ireland.



#### 8. KEVIN NICHOLLS

Born: 02.01.79

Joe Kinnear describes Nicholls as the driving force in his side and he will be pleased to welcome his skipper back for this game at Oakwell. A holding midfielder who has been inspirational since his arrival from Wigan in the summer of 2000. The 24-year-old has been out with injury for a couple of months and has been missed.

#### 21. PAUL HUGHES

Born: 19.04.76

Injuries disrupted Hughes' progress after he made the move to Kenilworth Road last season, but he fought back to contribute as they pushed for promotion. A tough tackler who is being given the chance to play in his favoured central midfield position as Kinnear looks to plug holes in his injury hit squad.

#### 32. LEE MANSELL

Born: 28.10.82

A youngster who made his first team breakthrough at Luton three seasons ago, but he has yet to establish himself in the first team. Lee has not made the progress many expected of him after impressing early on in his Luton career, but he still has time to shine. Scored just 37 seconds into his Luton debut in an FA Cup tie at QPR a couple of years back.

### Forwards

#### 9. TONY THORPE

Born: 10.04.74

In his second stint at Luton and scoring goals again, Thorpe has been in decent form in the first half of the season. He made plenty of headlines as he shot to prominence at Kenilworth Road in the mid-90s, scoring an impressive 28 league goals in the 1996/97 season. A spell at Fulham brought limited success and he was prolific for Bristol City before becoming a Hatter again.

#### 15. DEAN CROWE

Born: 06.06.79

Dean made quite an impact when he was thrown into the side last season, as he hit 15 goals in the promotion push. He started his career at Stoke and managed to establish himself in the side before falling out of favour and being forced to move on. A diminutive and pacy forward who can be clinical when a chance comes his way.

#### 14. ANDREW FOTIADIS

Born: 06.09.77

A product of the club's youth programme who has now got the experience to go with his raw talent, Fotiadis has proved his worth in the Second Division this season. Often used as a super-sub by manager Joe Kinnear, but he has still managed to fire home some important goals this season.

More than a few eyebrows were raised when Luton Town lured Joe Kinnear back into the game to take over as their manager at the start of 2001.

After all, this was a club who had been in steady decline for a lengthy period and did not seem to have the glamour to attract a respected figure such as Kinnear. Yet the former Wimbledon boss is never a man to shirk a challenge and fancied his chances of turning around the Hatters' fortunes.

"Management is the same whatever level you work at," begins the Hatters' boss. "Sure, the quality is not the same here as it was when I was in the Premiership, but the basic principles don't change. Whether you are looking forward to a game at Liverpool or Cardiff, you still have to check out the opposition and make sure your players have their minds on the job when it matters. I'm enjoying the job at Luton."

It says much about Kinnear's character that he was willing to take up the challenge at Luton. Having turned down the chance to take over at Sheffield Wednesday due to their financial crisis, the former Tottenham and Ireland defender was keen to prove he was fit and well after the heart attack that effectively ended his highly successful stint in charge of Wimbledon. But he can see the potential of a club where he is the star employee.

"The away support we get says it all for me," continues the Dubliner. "We can get more people travelling away from home to watch Luton than Wimbledon used to get for some home games when I was there. The fans base here is massive and it will get even bigger if we keep winning games and the new stadium comes along."

Talk of the Hatters building a new venue at Junction 10 of the M1 has been muted for many years now and if they do make a return to the First Division for next season, it may come a giant step closer.

"That is when this club could really take off," believes Kinnear. "We have a chairman here who is a one man band in many respects and he wants to take this forward. I'll do all I can with the team and I'm confident we can be in the First Division in the next couple of years. By then, hopefully we get a new ground because Kenilworth Road is not a long term option for Luton."

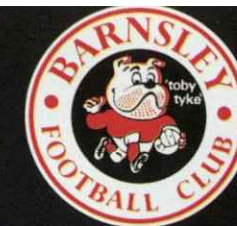
So what of their promotion hopes for this season? "I don't think we can consider automatic promotion after the start we had," he adds. "Cardiff and Wigan have the money in this league and will probably go up, but I would expect us to be in the play-offs, or certainly in the mix for a top six spot come the end of the season. We need a bit of luck with injuries and that has not come our way so far, so hopefully the squad remains fit for the rest of the year and then anything is possible."

"I've got a lot of players out of the club and a plenty in since I came here and things are starting to move in the right direction. There is a good buzz about the place again and long may that continue."

Luton Town are lucky to have Joe Kinnear as their manager and if those choosing the next Republic of Ireland manager had any sense, and that is in serious doubt, they would make a move to lure him from Kenilworth Road. Kinnear turned down the job when Jack Charlton left in 1996 and would be a fine choice to succeed Mick McCarthy now.

Hatters fans will be praying that doesn't happen.

## This day in 1969

DAVE COPPING REPORTS

### BARNSELY IN CONFIDENT WIN

When the Reds visited Gresty Road, home of Crewe Alexandra on the 18th of January 1969 both teams were relatively happy with the progress they had made during the first half of the season. Both clubs had been promoted to the Third Division at the end of the previous season and so were expecting a tough time at the higher level.

Barnsley under the management of JOHNNY STEELE had made a slow start but as the season had developed and they had become accustomed to their new surrounds had become a hard team to beat. Fire-power was proving to be a problem and when they went to Cheshire they had only netted eight in 12 away games, it was an obvious problem. To try to solve it STEELE had signed centre forward EDDIE LOYDEN from Shrewsbury just before Christmas. On Boxing Day he netted the game's only goal (a penalty) against his former club but he was still awaiting his first goal from open play.

Crewe on the other hand had started the season carrying forward their promotion form but in the weeks around Christmas had begun to find points hard to come by. They went into the game with 22 points from 24 games while the Reds were two points better off but had played one game more.

From the start the difference in confidence was apparent and the game was as good as over in the opening 10 minutes. Inside five minutes striker JOHNNY EVANS had given the Reds the lead and it was doubled within five minutes when LOYDEN added a second. The Reds were giving as good as a performance as they had all season. Midfield general JOHN BETTANY's slide rule

passing was cutting the Crewe defence apart with flying winger BOB EARNSHAW's pace being too much for them to handle.

Just before the half hour mark the two combined and it was left to LOYDEN, with his second and the team's third, to score with ease. Only the brilliance of Crewe's 'keeper WILLIE MAILEY kept the score to three at half time as he was exposed time and again as the Reds' forwards cut through at will. However within five minutes of the restart he was given no chance as the Reds added a fourth this time when EARNSHAW grabbed his due reward.

With the game now over as a contest Barnsley for the first time took their foot off the pedal and at last Crewe were seen as an attacking force. They were to gain some consolation when the experienced IVAN HOLLETT netted with 15 minutes remaining.

The game showed that the Reds on their day were an imposing team and would be more than a match for anyone in their division. They finished the season in a very comfortable high mid-table position. Crewe on the other hand were now on the slippery slope and they were to add only 13 more points from their remaining 21 games. It all added up to relegation back to the Fourth Division.

The fulcrum and skipper of the Reds' most successful team. Neil came to Oakwell after being discarded by Oldham manager Joe Royle where he had played a leading part in the team that won promotion to the top flight. Mel Machin was in the process of rebuilding his team at Oakwell and initially brought him in on loan but such was his impact he soon made the move permanent. Neil was a hard working, 100% trier who led by example and also scored many goals. His long range shooting being a feature of the majority of them.

He threatened to break the Club's consecutive appearance record and had reached 156 before injury forced him out.

He had played wide midfield at Oldham but at Oakwell he immediately moved into the centre of midfield. Apart from his ability around the opposition penalty area Neil was never one to shirk the responsibility of collecting the ball off the 'keeper or defence. After Danny Wilson became manager and then retired from playing he became his general on the pitch. The promotion season of 1996-97 saw him at his best and he ended it as the Club's leading goal scorer.

He finally got what he deserved when he led the Reds out in the Premier League against West Ham. Although the team struggled Neil was always to the fore driving them on. He scored the team's first and last goal at that level. His bullet 30 yarder at Crystal Palace also brought them their first win at the top level.

With Barnsley's relegation back into the First Division they lost their manager and more importantly to many they lost their captain who left for Charlton.

It is safe to say he has never been replaced.

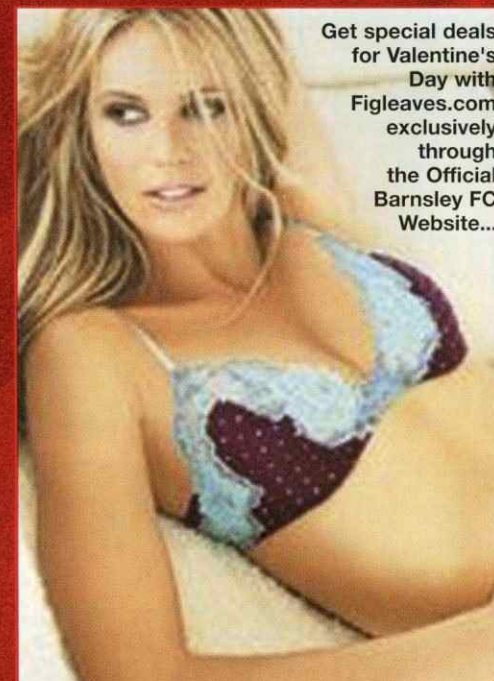

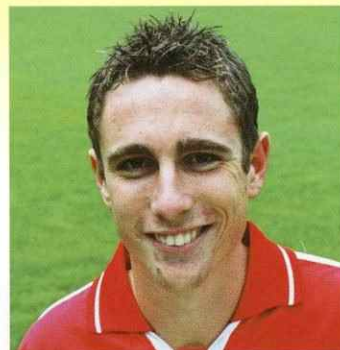

# Focus ON THE Future

He may have been the smallest player on the pitch but after little terrier Andy Seed had banged in four goals for the Reds' Under-14 side against Sheffield Wednesday, few doubted his stature as a player of considerable promise.

Midfielder Andy, currently on a one-year Academy contract at Oakwell, recalls the game with relish.

"We won 12-0 which, considering it was a local derby, was an amazing result. Scoring four did wonders for my confidence and it was great to be a part of a tremendous team effort."

Andy also enjoyed being in the Under-16 side that thumped Sheffield United 8-0 last season, although on this occasion he didn't make the scoresheet.

Influenced by his dad Rob, who was a regular with Ferrybridge Amateurs, Pontefract-born Andy was playing competitive football with Kellingley Welfare before he was seven.

His favourite position at that time was up front and it wasn't until later that he switched to midfield.

Young Andy stayed with Kellingley until, at the age of 11, a Barnsley scout spotted his skills and invited him to Oakwell for trials.

Since then, he hasn't looked back and now hopes that the Club will give him a further chance when his contract runs out at the end of the season.

So far, the season has been a little frustrating for him and he hasn't played anything like as many matches as he would like.

"I've been on the bench quite a bit for the Under-19 side and haven't had many run-outs. It's difficult to make a big impression when you're not getting the games but all I can do is continue

to work hard and make the most of my chances when they do come.

"I'm determined to do well here and want to be a successful professional footballer more than anything else in the world. I don't really mind the disciplined life style you have to follow to get on. I just feel privileged to have been given the chance."

Dad Rob, mum Denise and 18-year-old brother Steve are among his biggest fans and Andy is never short of encouragement. Steve was himself a promising footballer but a works accident put him out of action for a long spell and he doesn't play now.

Living in Knottingley, Andy grew up supporting Leeds United but, after signing for Barnsley, he saw most of the Reds' home games during the Premiership season and particularly remembers the thrilling FA Cup victory against Manchester United.

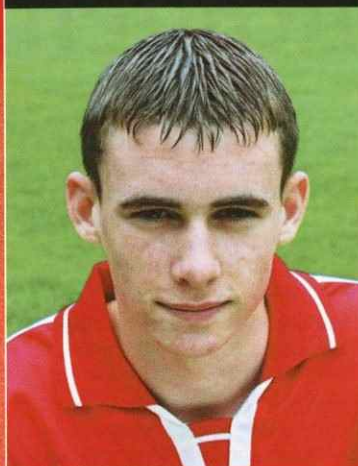
Andy is the boot boy for Bruce Dyer and Leo Bertos but, long term, hopes that one day a junior player will be cleaning his boots.

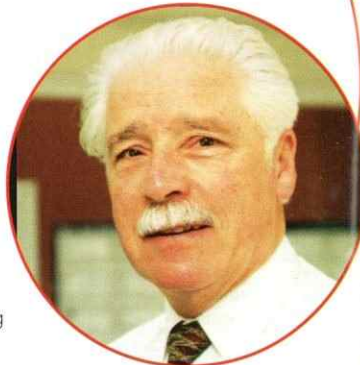




# Benny Hill's Stop Press

29th Season

**DUE to the final stages of the Second World War, my early teenage years were almost devoid of any type of football.**

However, when the end of hostilities arrived and football got back to something like normal, huge crowds shuffled their way to the terraces, with more than 35,000,000 attending league matches in the first post-war season.

Imagine how excited I was at 14 when my father took me to Oakwell for the first time. Barnsley lost 5-1 to Preston North End in what must have been a Division North fixture, as the league did not start properly until the 1946/47 season. The facts of the match didn't really matter. This was my initiation as a Barnsley supporter, which I have remained for 58 years.

In the early post-war years travelling from Mexborough to Barnsley could be awkward, with most buses full. The worst aspect was the return journey. At the bus station about four different queues would converge and it was pandemonium. So bad, in fact, that after a home match against Birmingham City (3-1?) me and my friends left my father queuing and we walked back to Mexborough. After stopping in Brampton to pick up a fresh turnip, and Wath-on-Deane to purchase the only thing the shop had left, a packet of ship's biscuits, we eventually arrived home just a few minutes after my father.

My earliest memories of FA Cup matches is when we beat Newcastle United 5-4 on aggregate in the 1945-46 two-legged season, Jimmy Baxter getting the winner in the 3-0 second-leg victory at Oakwell. Going out of the competition at home to Blackpool this season reminded me of the 1949 FA Cup match when Barnsley went down 1-0 to Blackpool at Oakwell. Recollections of a man with a pet duck, painted tangerine, and friendly banter from both sets of supporters, still lasts.

The previous season's FA Cup competition saw us travelling to Maine Road to take on Manchester City, with the great Frank Swift in goal. Alex Wright, who later moved to Tottenham, scored Barnsley's goal in a 2-1 defeat. City winger Billy Linacre (formerly of Chesterfield) shared our third-class compartment back to Sheffield.

Mention of Frank Swift revived memories of him in a match at Oakwell. He had the crowd roaring with laughter as he reached over the diminutive Gavin Smith and bounced the ball behind him. But we laughed last as Mexborough's 'Cocky' Bennett headed the ball out of Swift's hands for one of our goals in a 2-0 win.

After moving to Bridlington more than 30 years ago, my visits to Oakwell, sadly, have not been too often - although I made sure of a season ticket for the Premiership season. One reason for not travelling to Oakwell as much as I would have liked, was my involvement with the former Bridlington Town FC for around 20 years. In 1993, as chairman of the club, I jubilantly held the FA Vase aloft at Wembley after we had beaten Rotherham 1-0 in the final in Bridlington's finest season.

During my time at Bridlington Town, I became fed up of league scouts coming for our best players - so I sent a letter to Barnsley's secretary suggesting the Club should

take a look at a promising youngster. A few days later, manager Johnny Steele rang saying he would be sending a scout to our Queensgate ground.

One last anecdote. I regularly visit a barber in Scarborough, and he is well aware of my Barnsley FC connection. One day he was just finishing my haircut when the door opened. "I bet you don't know this chap," he said. I recognised him straightaway - it was former Barnsley 'keeper Harry Hough, who now lives in Filey. So engrossed did I get in conversation with Harry, I left without paying for my haircut. I quickly rectified the matter - honest!
