ANYONE steeped in Port Vale would
want the club to remain where it is -
and that goes for me, too.

I think there is a case for ground
sharing in places, bearing in mind
how many times the pitch is used in a
season. It works on the continent but
I don't see it happening here and my
wish, along with many others, is that
Port Vale continue to play in Burslem.
The stadium is nice and it would be
excellent to see it finished. As far as a
merger is concerned I would be
totally opposed because of its
obvious implications for Port Vale.

The bottom line from my point of
view is that this business has been
going on for too long. I get on well
with the administrator, Bob Young, and
I am sure he is working in the best
interests of Port Vale, which everyone
appreciates. I just wish we were
nearing a conclusion.

As far as the football is concerned I
felt we were unfortunate not to come
home from Tranmere last week with a
point.

The general consensus was a draw
would have been a fairer result. We
played quite well in the first half and
could have gone two goals up. We
were more adventurous and made
chances with Ian Armstrong
contributing to much of what was
good about our play.

Ian is as bright as a button and,
hopefully, he can enjoy an extended
run in the side. He still needs to work
on his strength in the gym, but he is a
young lad and the hamstring and
groin problems he has suffered can
be down to growing into League
football.

Some might argue it has not been a
particularly good week for us in terms
of results with teams below us picking
up points but, as ever in football, it is
about looking after yourselves.

We cannot rely on teams below us
losing all the time because it will not
happen, but we have games in hand
and must make the most of them.

We have only played here once since
Boxing Day so there are a few home
games to catch up on and we have to
make them count.

Encouraging news on the injury
front is that Neil Brisco, who last
played against Crewe back in
September, is on the comeback trail.
He has been earmarked for a game at
Shifnal on Monday in the Staffs Senior
Cup.

We will be fielding a very young side
as we have a first team game here on
Tuesday against Chesterfield, which is
unfortunate for Steve Rowland.

Steve had again been called up by the
Wales under-20 squad to play Korea
but as we are still short of numbers I
need him here. Steve was forced to
pull out his previous selection due to
injury but hopefully his chance will
come.







Whatever Happened To?

The club's Past Players Co-ordinator Leigh Edwards traces former favourites

Tim Rawlings' goal gave Port Vale a 1-0 Third Division victory over Luton Town in front of 11,449 at Vale Park on 14th October 1963. Luton had triumphed 1-0 at home to Port Vale five days earlier and the 1959 FA Cup finalists were destined to plummet from the First Division to Fourth in the space of five years.

WHATEVER HAPPENED TO PORT VALE'S TEAM?

KEN HANCOCK: Highly-rated goalkeeper who made 241 League appearances prior to joining Ipswich Town in December 1964, then played for Tottenham Hotspur, Bury, Stafford, Northwich and Leek. Now living in Ipstones, he was a maintenance man for Dairycrest in Hartington until ill-health forced retirement.

SELWYN WHALLEY: Long-serving right-back who contested a first-team slot with Terry Lowe and netted seven goals in 178 League games during 13 seasons at Port Vale until a foot injury ended his career in May 1966. A part-timer who was a PE teacher at Hanley High School, he still lives locally in retirement.

ROY SPROSON: Long-serving defender who scored 30 goals in a record 760 League games for Port Vale before joining the coaching staff in May 1972. He was manager at Vale Park from January 1974 until sacked in October 1977, then became a newsagent and remained local until his death in January 1997.

TIM RAWLINGS: Former Walsall right-half who scored the winner against Luton Town and netted twice in 31 Third Division games for Port Vale prior to joining Nuneaton Borough in July 1965, then played for Coleshill. He subsequently worked for Lucas Industries and still lives in Birmingham in retirement.

JOHN NICHOLSON: Commanding centre-half who was ever-present in three consecutive seasons and scored once in 184 League outings for Port Vale prior to joining Doncaster Rovers in September 1965. He tragically died from injuries

suffered in a car crash whilst driving along the A630 in September 1966.


TERRY MILES: Versatile left-half who netted 17 goals in 365 League games prior to joining Sandbach Ramblers in July 1968, then played for Eastwood and Michelin before coaching Wolstanton Park Rangers. He spent 26 years as a production worker at Michelin until retiring in May 1996 and still lives in Stoke.

JOHN ROWLAND: Ex-England Youth winger who moved to Mansfield Town in September 1966, then played for Tranmere Rovers, Derry City, Linfield, Coleraine and South Shields. Settling in Belper, he spent 20 years as a sales agent for Ben Sherman shirts and is now an NDT inspector for Rolls Royce in Derby.

STAN STEELE: Inside-forward who moved to South African side Port Elizabeth in April 1965 and briefly returned for a third spell at Port Vale in January 1968, scoring 88 goals in 335 League games overall. He then played for Eastwood and Armitage before coaching Great Harwood and lives locally in retirement.

TERRY HARKIN: Young centre-forward who moved to Crewe Alexandra in June 1964. The Northern Ireland international later played for Cardiff City, Notts County, Southport, Shrewsbury, Finn Harps, Toronto Metros and Dundalk. He was a director of Derry City and has since managed a shoe shop in Derry.

ALBERT CHEESBROUGH: Former England U-23 international who netted



This afternoon we welcome Luton Town - the Hatters - to town for what is a vital game for both clubs in different ways...they need a win to keep in touch with the teams chasing a play-off place while the Valiants require three points as they bid to pull clear of the relegation zone.

Three months ago Luton were languishing just above the halfway mark in the Division with 25 points from 17 games.

Since early November their form has improved ten-fold and now they are on something of a roll, having gained 19 points from their last 11 matches to edge upwards and confidently into eighth position.

Their away form is useful - seven wins and four draws from 15 attempts with their last trip on the road ending all-square at Peterborough.


Manager Joe Kinnear - in charge at Kenilworth Road for a little over two years, since January 2001 - has assembled a pretty useful squad, on limited resources it must be said, and he believes it's now good and strong enough to win promotion.

Said the former Tottenham Hotspur right-back and Wimbledon boss: "We are a very hard working side. We train with grim determination, defend well and overall we cope with confidence. Our attack is perhaps not as lethal as I would like it to be, but the midfielders certainly do the business and I feel that is a key department where a lot of matches are won and lost.

"We were put under a lot of pressure by Wycombe Wanderers recently. They tossed in a lot of long throws and high centres and my defenders dealt with everything in a positive way. Prior to that, when winning at Barnsley - for the first time in 51 years incidentally -

The players who have grafted hard and long for the Hatters over the past month have been goalkeepers **Carl Emberton** (ex-Millwall, Colchester United and Walsall - he is likely to be suspended today following his red card at Oakwell) and **Mark Overdale** (formerly of Northampton Town and Bournemouth); defenders **Emerson Boyce** (almost 150 games for the club), **Dave Bayliss** (once of Rochdale), **Ian Hillier** (signed from Spurs in 2001), **Russell Perrett** (72 League outings for Portsmouth and 29 for Cardiff before moving to Kenilworth Road), Welsh international **Alan Neilson** (ex-Newcastle, Southampton and Fulham), Aussie **Chris Coyne** (the former West Ham and Dundee star), **Alan Kimble** (now aged 36 who has almost 650 senior appearances to his credit, amassed with a variety of clubs), **Aaron Skelton** (who has 150 League games under his belt), **Steve Robinson** (signed from Preston six months ago) and **Sol Davis** (a 23 year-old from Cheltenham), midfielders **Matthew Spring** (over 200 League outings for the Hatters), **Kevin Nicholls** (a former England Youth international, once of Charlton), the Croatian **Ahmet Brkovic**, **Paul Hughes** (who in the past has served with Chelsea, Southampton and Norwich City), teenager **Michael Leary** and another youngster, **Lee Mansell**, and strikers **Tony Thorpe** (in his third spell at the club), journeyman **Carl Griffiths** (a former Vale player of course), **Steve Howard** (top scorer last season), **Andrew Fotiadis** (who has over 70 substitute appearances to his name) and **Dean Crowe** (ex-Stoke City, Northampton Town and Plymouth Argyle). Prior to that French 'keeper **Cedric Berthelin** had also played.

ONES TO WATCH


• **MATTHEW SPRING**, aged 23, has been at Kenilworth Road since 1995 and a professional with the Hatters since July 1997. A 100 per-cent competitor in the engine-room, he has now appeared in almost 250 senior games for the club and has netted his fair share of goals (25). He is on a two-year contract with Luton and already this season has produced some exhilarating performances.

• **STEVE ROBINSON** was signed from Preston North End last summer having earlier played twice for Tottenham Hotspur in the Premiership and also for Bournemouth as well as having a loan spell with Bristol City. A Northern Ireland international at five different levels (including five appearances in the senior side) he was born in Lisburn in December 1974 and was at White Hart Lane until 1994. He then appeared in 286 first-class matches for Bournemouth (60 goals scored) and although he never really settled down at Deepdale, he is now back on the goal trail and to date has netted more than 70 times in major competitions for his five clubs.

• **STEVE HOWARD** is a 6ft 2in, 14st 6lbs striker who has now scored in excess of 80 goals in a 'League' career that began at Hartlepool in 1995 (following his transfer from Tow Law Town). After four years at The Victoria Ground (162 appearances) he was sold to Northampton Town for £120,000 and in his two years at Sixfields added a further 85 games to his tally before his move to Luton in March 2001 for £50,000. He was the Hatters' leading marksman last season with 24 goals and was voted the club's 'Player of the Year' and players' 'Player of the Season' in 2002. So far this term Howard, strong and competitive, has notched 14 goals and is again Luton's leading scorer.

THE BOSS

Joe Kinnear appeared in 196 League games for Spurs and 16 for Brighton & Hove Albion during a career that spanned 13 years (1963-76). Born in Dublin in December 1946, he started out with St Albans City and moved to Spurs (as an apprentice, turning professional in February 1965. An FA Cup winner in 1967 (v. Chelsea), a League Cup winner in 1971 (v. Aston Villa) and a UEFA Cup winner in 1972 (v. Wolves) he also won 25 caps for Eire and after retiring (in 1976) he coached in the UAE and Malaysia before becoming working as coach, assistant-manager and caretaker-manager at Doncaster Rovers. After a brief coaching appointment and then assistant-boss at Wimbledon, he was appointed manager at Plough Lane in 1992 and stayed until 1999 before suffering heart problems which forced him to relinquish his position. After a brief sojourn he returned to the fray with the Hatters and is now hoping to lift the Hatters back into the First Division where they haven't played since 1996.

Now let me see. Tranmere Rovers, Merseyside's finest well if you don't include Liverpool and Everton I suppose. A club that has had their share of problems in the past but are trying to look to the future.

Prenton Park - a ground with a multitude of newish constructions, from which to view proceedings. The steepest being the Bebbington End, from where players change into 'subbuteo-like' characters if you venture too high. Over the years the club, based close to Birkenhead, has had a youthful fraternity in its stands who generally try their best to annoy those who are slightly wiser and of sound mind. Maybe this is to do with the very reasonable pricing structure in the past, as Rovers attempt to wrestle a few from their more illustrious neighbours.




Vale Community Scheme SCORE again

The recent heavy rain, frosts and snow have restricted the games being played in the North Central conference that Vale's U19s play in. However the initial league stage is coming to a close with some clubs already having completed their fixtures whilst others still have 4 games to play. The current table shows Vale sitting at the top with only one game to play, however Mansfield are only a point behind with 2 games in hand and a home fixture against bottom of the table Wrexham to come next. The likely outcome is that Mansfield will finish top with Vale as runners up but we can but hope that they slip up in a couple of their final games and Vale win their final game, also at home to Wrexham, to take the title.

Vale's two games this year have seen a 3-2 win at Mansfield to complete the double over them in the league and a 1-0 win at Chester

Vale have also been to Chester and won 1-0 courtesy of another goal by Simon Eldershaw. Lets hope he can get on the sheet again at Tranmere in the 5th round of the FA Youth Cup in 10 days time. Vale will finish at least second as Rotherham have completed their fixtures and were the only team to get hear Vale and Mansfield. Once these fixtures are

completed the Merit section of the competition begins but hopefully we will be then be looking forward to a quarter final tie at Old Trafford in the Youth Cup.

Vale have reached the quarter finals twice before but not for 25 years. The first occasion was back in 1966/7 when after defeating a talented Coventry side including Willie Carr, Vale's youngsters were kicked off the Vale park pitch for a 0-0 draw with an uncompromising Scunthorpe side in the quarter final and lost the replay. The last time was 1977/8 when we went out at Crystal Palace who had a side including Terry Fenwick and Vince Hilaire. Vale's line-up included Phil Sproson, Russel Bromage and Neville Chamberlain but we still lost 0-3.

WHAT TO COLLECT - FOREIGN PROGRAMMES

Enthusiastic collectors clubs are run from Holland, Germany and Scandinavia, but the real hot-bed of programme collecting is to be found in the British Isles. Despite the European "Single Market" and the so-called shrinking globe, there is still a reluctance for programme collectors to embrace continental programmes.

The exception to this is when British clubs play in European competitions, and when clubs undertake friendly matches abroad. A brisk market for such items exists, with dealers and club shops making special arrangements to import sufficient quantities of programmes. While these are invariably expensive in comparison with domestic programmes, buying from dealers is considerably cheaper and more convenient than attempting to obtain programmes direct from the foreign clubs.

The best method of obtaining domestic programmes from overseas is by befriending a programme collector in another country. These people often write to British clubs, who in turn print their requests for new friends in their match programmes. A few of the continent's more prominent collectors make themselves known to British dealers, programme magazines and clubs etc. and they are invariably willing to assist, where possible, in obtaining foreign issues for your collection.

Purchasing programmes direct from clubs on the continent is comparatively difficult. British Postal Orders or cheques are unlikely to be accepted, and the main "currency" in such matters is International Reply Coupons, which are obtainable at any post office at a cost of around 40p each. These, in turn, may be redeemed at any foreign post office for the cost of

postage back to Britain. If you have obtained the address of a foreign club, a request for programmes should be accompanied by 4 or 5 IRC's in lieu of payment.

As stated before, however, such a method of obtaining programmes from abroad is painfully slow and unreliable. Using contacts within programme collecting, and searching for issues in dealers lists, is the best way of obtaining foreign issues for your collection.







As promised in the last edition I will begin today's article with a pleasant reminder of Vale's giant killing victory over Everton. I'm sure that the majority of you will require very little reminding of what was a magnificent evening. Of course, it all started on a freezing cold day on Merseyside where Vale got the result that was to set up the historical replay. I was unfortunate on that day in the fact that, despite having coach and match tickets, I was unable to attend due to the snow. Watching the final few minutes of that encounter unfold on teletext was pulsating so I imagine that being present must have been extremely exciting. Seeing Duncan Ferguson's late Everton goal appear on the screen was depressing and what followed was merely waiting for the screen to read full time just in case there was a reply, although this was by no means expected. There were scenes of joy in the Holdcroft household when it became apparent that Ian Bogie had somehow equalised for the Vale, as I am sure there was in the away stand at Goodison Park.

There were no such problems with the weather on the night of the replay, although the story of that game could have been very different had Steve Guppy not abandoned his broken down car miles from the ground and ran the rest of the way to the ground. If he was tired from this run whilst playing it certainly didn't show as he was a star performer in Vale's victory that night, setting up Jon McCarthy's winner with a pin point cross.

The game started brightly for Vale culminating in Ian Bogie's opening goal, struck from long range. It was somewhat baffling that Bogie was so reluctant to shoot from range throughout his Vale career given his strikes against Everton both finding the net, his goalscoring record at Leyton Orient prior to joining Vale was also good.

In-between Vale's goals was an equaliser for Graham Stuart, but Vale thoroughly

deserved to win the game after dominating for long periods of the game. There was an excellent crowd at Vale Park that night and, at this point, Vale were playing attractive, attacking football with the exciting two wingers, McCarthy and Guppy wreaking havoc in opposition defences. Guppy moved on to enjoy a successful spell with Leicester, which saw him capped by England, and is still a part of the first team squad at one of the biggest clubs in Britain, Celtic. McCarthy, on the other hand, didn't manage as big a move, joining Birmingham and never reaching the Premiership level he seemed destined for.

Two broken legs didn't help his cause, although he did have a short, successful spell in the team shortly after his move, including playing a major part in Birmingham's hilarious 7-0 win at Stoke. Despite the short length of 'Super Jon's' period at Vale at the beginning of this season it was great to see him in a Vale shirt again and he will always be a hero here at Vale Park.

Our visitors, Luton, our no strangers to cup upsets having taken the trip to Wembley for an FA Cup semi final against Chelsea whilst in the lower reaches of the First Division in the mid nineties. The notable scalps of West Ham and Newcastle were taken during this run, both of which were memorable games covered live on Sky. The West Ham game particularly is one that sticks in my mind, I can remember to this day lying in front of the

television fixated on an excellent game of football, rooting for Luton to record an upset. The name of Scott Oakes must be mentioned as he scored a hat trick from midfield and, if my memory serves me correctly, was also on the score sheet against Newcastle.

It is great to see Joe Kinnear back in football management after a heart attack, long may his return continue and I wish him every success with Luton, of course excluding this afternoon.

Clinic In A Box

Port Vale Football Club and local health services are teaming up to help young people have easier access to health information and advice. Nationally recognised as 'best practice' Clinic in a Box is a young person's health clinic that visits youth venues across north Staffs, but this is the first time a football club has opened its doors to the scheme.

Confidential clinic sessions will be held in the Physiotherapy room in the Lorne St Stand on home match days from January 2003. Viv Bradford, leader of this North Staffordshire-wide Teenage Pregnancy initiative says: "Port Vale FC not only has an excellent track record of working in partnerships with other agencies to the benefit of the local community, but sits within one of the local target areas, and was a natural choice for this innovative and ground breaking idea."

It is hoped that by working with the Football Club Clinic in a Box will attract a new group of young people who can take advantage of the expertise of a fully trained nurse and receive information and advice on their diet, how to reduce or quit smoking, drugs or alcohol and about cancer prevention, relationships and sexual health. They may also be able to receive condoms and emergency contraception following a discussion with the nurse.


