



THE THOUGHTS OF THE RANGERS MANAGER

Good afternoon everyone and welcome back to Loftus Road for this afternoon's game against Luton Town.

Since I last spoke to you on these pages we have played three games and won two of them, with both those victories coming away from Loftus Road. The only blemish was a 1-0 defeat by league leaders Wigan, here, three weeks ago. At the time, I was devastated by the result because I felt there wasn't much in it - they created the better chances though and their goal came about because we fell asleep at a corner.

Nevertheless, since then we have bounced back with two outstanding results and I am absolutely delighted with the players' efforts during the past fortnight. The 3-1 win at Blackpool was thoroughly deserved and when we needed a big performance from the team that is exactly what we got.

I cannot praise Richard Langley too highly for his efforts in that game. After taking a bit of stick the previous week he responded in the best possible fashion with a fine hat-trick. Once again, Tranmere pulled a result out of the bag and therefore it was vital that we didn't give them any ground.

And so to last weekend and another marvellous win - this time at Cardiff. This was a fantastic game and I was delighted that we managed to hang on after Cardiff

equalised. They put our defence under all kinds of pressure but we didn't buckle and then scored a great goal.

The defence kept Robert Earnshaw quiet for the game and that is no mean feat. We showed spirit and togetherness - qualities that bode well for the remainder of the campaign.

Tranmere failing to win was a big result and we knew that with them on our tail we couldn't afford any slip ups. But as I said after the game last weekend, there is still a long way to go and plenty of points to be won and lost.

Today we take on a Luton side who are by no means out of the running and they will be giving everything today to haul themselves back in to the picture. A win here today would give them hope and it

is up to us to make sure they don't have any hope after today.

When these two sides met at Kenilworth Road earlier in the season there were plenty of fireworks and I imagine this will be another competitive match. But we must be strong today and in every game we play between now and the end of the season.


Your support will continue to be vital as we push towards the play-offs. I would ask you to get right behind the lads this afternoon and give them every ounce of support you can muster. ROUNDING UP LATEST QPR NEWS 20.03.03 - 05.04.03



20.03.03

Ian Holloway swoops to bring a replacement for the departed Lee Cook, signing winger Kevin McLeod from Everton on a one-month loan. Holloway decides to act promptly after the injury to Tommy Williams against Cheltenham. Rangers Chief Scout Mel Johnson believes McLeod fills the gap on the left side.

'He is an orthodox left-sided player who can play on the wing, at full back or as a wing back. He can also play up front if required.'

22.03.03

A Nathan Ellington header early in the second half is enough for Wigan Athletic to defeat Rangers at Loftus Road, 1-0. Though control of the game was even throughout, Rangers' attack was stifled by the Wigan defence and a single weak moment in the QPR back line provided Wigan with the opportunity to take the spoils. Ian Holloway is understandably disappointed.

'I'm devastated with the result. There wasn't much in it, but they created the better chances and were very well

20.03.03

organised. I'm annoyed because everything we talked about at half time was forgotten - we didn't get tight and it cost us. They were just a little bit better in the end and we came up short.'

24.03.03

Over 4,000 Rangers fans vote for next season's home kit in a vote on the official QPR website. Seventy percent of voters select a classic design with hoops on the torso and sleeves. The chosen design will now go into production by Le Coq Sportif and QPR announces it will notify fans of a launch date as soon as the new kit is ready.

25.03.03

The Loftus Road medical team receives the results of Tommy Williams' MRI scan and it shows a slight tear to his ankle ligament. This is not as bad as first feared, but he will be out for at least two weeks.

Rangers also face problems on the right side of defence with Terrell Forbes a doubt for the Blackpool game. The right back took a knock to his ankle in the Wigan game. A scan later determines Forbes stretched ankle ligaments and experienced swelling around the tendons.



27.03.03

Tottenham's Stephen Kelly passes his medical and is signed on a one month loan. The 19-year-old Republic of Ireland youth international is brought on to take the right back spot of Terrell Forbes, who is hampered by an ankle injury. Kelly goes straight into the travelling squad for Blackpool.

The squad also includes Matthew Rose, now recovered from a series of injuries. It's been a tough few months for Rose with an ankle injury coming hot on the heels of knee ligament damage in January. After working his way back to fitness, he suffered an unlucky ankle injury while getting out of his car, causing him to miss three games.

29.03.03

Richard Langley recovers from an uncharacteristic performance against Wigan by scoring a a hat trick against Blackpool as Rangers win, 3-1. In addition to Langley's spectacular efforts, the game includes a disallowed Dan Shitlu goal and a bizarre goal line scramble that ended in a fight. Ian Holloway is thrilled by the victory.

like a draw was the most likely outcome. Ian Holloway is delighted by the effort and the win.

'It was a fantastic game and I am so pleased that after Cardiff scored we hung on, came out and scored a wonderful goal. The character wasn't there when they beat us 4-0, but it was today. There's a long way to go, but we're moving in the right direction. It pleased me more than anything knowing Tranmere were on our tail. A defeat might have crushed us, but we showed character and skill.'



02.04.03

Loftus Road announces that 'Sir Les' Ferdinand, Ray Wilkins, Glenn Hoddle and Dennis Wise are all on board for Gavin Peacock's testimonial match against Chelsea on May 20th. Ferdinand is one of the all-time great QPR strikers, while Wilkins was a fan favourite in the early '90s and was also QPR player-manager in the mid-é90s.


Hoddle, the former England head coach, was also Peacock's manager at Chelsea, having made Gavin one of his first signings after arriving at Stamford Bridge. Wise was a teammate of Peacock's at Chelsea, and was also a boyhood fan of QPR.



After getting too much of the former in a three-year span, Clarke Carlisle is finally getting a taste of the latter. And he couldn't be happier.

"I was starting to think I was a bit of a jinx on teams that I've played for. This season, we've turned that around, hopefully, and I can experience the other side of the coin."

In the 1999-2000 season, Clarke was in a Blackpool side that was relegated and, the next year, on top of facing relegation again, he suffered a knee injury that kept him out of action for one-and-a-half seasons. Clarke said he is glad that is all in the past. With his play so far this season, QPR must be happy, as well.

With Dan Shittu, Clarke has formed a formidable partnership in the central defence, providing a virtual stone wall that is impenetrable to opposing attackers. Even Robert Earnshaw, the Cardiff striker who has scored over 30 goals this season, couldn't crack the back line a week ago.

"Not only did we match Cardiff for their work and effort, but we matched them with our ability on the ball as well, and

we just crowded them out of the game. Earnshaw is a very, very good player. He's lively. He's good on the ball. Danny marshalled him extremely well and, really, the guy didn't get a sniff."

By turning back the immense pressure Cardiff piled on Rangers after equalising in the second half, Clarke and the QPR defence allowed Rangers to continue their outstanding form and showed the rest of Division Two they are a force to be reckoned with.

"Everyone's feeling very upbeat. We're coming into this part of the season on the back of an excellent run of form. You usually find that it's the team with the best form going into the play-offs who ultimately are successful.

"I genuinely cannot see any reason why we shouldn't continue playing like we are, not just during the remainder of this season, but from here on in. The boys are working well together. We've gelled together."

The defence certainly has gelled, as the Cardiff win shows. That's no small feat considering the number of players who


have lined up at the back this season. Through a mix of injuries and attempts to field his best possible side, Ian Holloway has had to change defensive formations with some frequency this season. The changes, Clarke said, have not been disruptive because everyone who has come in knows his role.

"They're have been changes, but they haven't been wholesale changes and we work hard every week on the defensive line-up and what our jobs are and what we're expected to do."


"As long as everyone's paying attention, if someone has to step into the breach, then they should instantly know what their job is. Kenny and Ollie have instilled into us what they want us to do and it's starting to pay dividends now."

With such positive feelings in the dressing room and outstanding play on the pitch, it seems Clarke's days of bad luck may be through, with something brighter on the horizon.

"Promotion is something not many players get to experience in a lifetime and I hope I'm one of them."





after suffering another ankle injury against Cheltenham and he also enjoyed a run out with the reserves on Tuesday afternoon.


Likewise Terrell Forbes who also featured for Tim Breacker's team against Swindon. Both full backs will be pushing for a place in the team for today.

LOFTUS ROAD CHIEF EXECUTIVE

Good afternoon everyone and welcome to this afternoon's game against Luton Town.

In the intervening period since the notes for the Wigan game, there have been a number of reminders of the state that football is in currently. Not only have the players at Huddersfield Town taken the club into administrative protection, but also the League has had to administer a final warning to Notts County that they can no longer expect to remain in the League unless they find a new owner by the end of May.

At the same time there have been announcements from the Office of Fair Trading that the report will finally come out about the behaviour of Umbro, the FA and Manchester United over the vexed subject of replica kit pricing. At the same time, the game is expecting a final decision from the EEC on the implications of the continent's Leagues negotiating television rights collectively. The decision that lies in front of the EEC is whether this practice, which has been present in football for many years, is in direct contravention of current European competition laws.

During last week I attended and spoke at a conference of lawyers in which a representative of the EEC opined the outcome could be that this practice would be deemed to be illegal. The result would be that clubs would have to go out and negotiate TV contracts individually. The upshot of this would be that in the

Premier League, at least a third would not get a contract at all, another third would get a fairly low value contract, while all the wealth rested in the top six.

seemed much more perturbed when the representative from Europe suggested that the way round the inequality would be to invoke a wealth tax on the higher clubs with the revenues then being redistributed out to other clubs on a more fair and equitable basis.

It was clear from the discussion that things will continue to change within football and it's undoubtedly going to affect every club at every level as the implosion of TV fees continues to have a huge effect upon the game that's loved by so many.

On a related issue, we will be making announcements during today's game asking you to reduce our cleaning costs by picking up your own rubbish after the game is finished. This request has been brought about at the suggestion of a large number of fans who feel that the cleaning cost could be reduced if people were more helpful picking their own refuse up once the game's finished.

An extra series of bags have been attached to the backs of the handrails in the concourses to enable you to do this. I've been able to enlist support of both supporters' clubs and this I recommend to you to help us reduce the cost further.

As this programme is the last opportunity prior to Easter, I wish every one of you a Happy Easter and hopefully we'll see you for the forthcoming match against Notts County.

There can be only one favourite season for me and that was the year we should have won the league. After all the fantastic games that we played most notably away from home, scoring 5 at Derby County. In the end we lost at Norwich 3-2 right at the death and the Championship slipped away from us. Who could ever forget the way the team of Thomas, Francis, Bowles and Givens mesmerised the fans? It was not the fact that we won games but the way we won games. I loved the opening move where the kick off took place and the ball was belted out to either Givens on one wing or Thomas on the other. We won over fans from all over the country as we were the team of the moment. To all come down to one final game, I can still remember praying we would hang on but three goals from the Reds did us in, life was so cruel and never to be the same until the 80's.


My favourite team of all time has to be Parkes, Clement, Gillard, Parker, McDonald, Bob Hazell, Thomas, Francis, Ferdinand, Bowles and Givens.

It is so hard to pick everyone but I started with **Phil Parkes**, a player who should have played more games for England except for being around the same time as Clemence and Shilton, an injustice if there ever was one. The full backs of **Clement** and **Gillard** looked after Rangers rearguard and were never afraid to get forward and join the attack; these guys took no prisoners but were never afraid to get stuck in when the going got tough.

Paul Parker came to us from Fulham before going on to Manchester United - another credit to us for playing for his country. We had the best years and his pace and willingness to get forward inspired many a generation. **Alan McDonald** was a lion and a brave one at that; he wore his heart on his sleeve.

Alongside was **Bob Hazell** with those terrific runs up field. He scared all defenders as he was rushing towards their goal. Will we ever forget how Bob, almost single-handed kept Cyril Regis at bay in the cup semi final? **Dave Thomas** mesmerised the opposing defence with his socks rolled down and behind him England Captain **Gerry Francis** our rock was patrolling midfield with venom and determination. **Les Ferdinand** scared the pants off so many defenders with his strong runs and bullet headers; he was a handful at the best of times. What Rangers could do with Les now terrorising the second division opposition.

But for me the dynamic duo of **Bowles** and **Givens** were the greatest partnership we ever had. Stan was everything we believe in football - graceful, artistic and decisive. For all those fans that longed for the days of Rodney, Stan was it but in his own style. How many times did Stan pop up and win a match maybe single-handed? Does anyone remember a last minute free kick in a Cup replay versus



Coventry City to win 3-2 when all seemed lost, or hat tricks in European matches?

Don was the foil but a master in his own right, dynamic and thrusting into the heart of the opponents area, Don scored a lot of goals but he did not always get the recognition he deserved.

A team of legends, but I missed out Roeder, Venables, Marsh, McIntock, Hollins, Sansom and Leach and Clive Allen - where could I fit them all in?

My special manager is still in football today. **Terry Venables** typified for me what you need from a manager, he brought flair and experience to guide us to our only F.A. Cup finals as well as promotion back to the First Division. In Terry, we saw all that was good about Rangers exciting blend of attacking football and knowledge of the game which saw us rise again in the 80's. If it was not for the opportunity he took in Barcelona who knows what may have happened, but the run to the F.A. Cup final and promotion the following year were brilliant and never to be forgotten.

A fantastic last minute goal from Richard Langley earned Rangers a thoroughly deserved win and all three points at Cardiff. After Peter Thorne had cancelled out Paul Furlong's second half opener it looked as if the spoils would be shared, but with the clock ticking down, an inch perfect cross from Gino Padula was met by the onrushing Richard Langley who fired the ball past Martyn Margetson to send the Rangers supporters in to dreamland.

Rangers had begun the game confidently and the first chance of the game fell to the visitors in the third minute. Spencer Prior misjudged a high ball and Gallen stole in before squaring the ball to Furlong who couldn't keep his first time effort down from five yards out. Two minutes later Rangers were threatening again and a spectacular effort from skipper Steve Palmer so nearly

opened the scoring. Palmer let fly from 30 yards out and Margetson did well to push a fierce looping effort behind for a corner.

But if Cardiff were surprised by this early onslaught they didn't show it and a minute later the dangerous Robert Earnshaw brought the best out of Chris Day. The little striker looked favourite to score as he raced towards goal, but Day made himself big and deflected his shot behind for a corner.

Then, in the 25th minute, Rangers had a goal ruled out when, not for the first time, Prior looked utterly ill at ease under a high ball played towards Kevin Gallen. The Rs striker shrugged off the challenge before lobbing Margetson for what appeared to be a perfectly legitimate goal. But the referee thought otherwise and disallowed the effort, much to Gallen's amazement.

MAN OF THE MATCH



A game full of heroes - where do you start? Day, Gallen and Palmer were outstanding - but the nod goes to **Gino Padula**. He dealt with antagonism both on and off the pitch, he defended coolly and set up both goals. Gino has been the revelation of Rangers' season and he just goes from strength to strength

It was the home side who came out of the blocks the quicker in the second period with an Earnshaw effort just clearing the bar and Chris Day then forced to tip a Gareth Ainsworth cross on to the bar and over.

But in the 65th minute, the breakthrough arrived. Paul Furlong won a free kick on the right and when Gino Padula swung in the dead ball it was Furlong who headed firmly home with no blue shirt in view.

As the clock ticked down the Bluebirds' attacks became more urgent. In the 76th minute Earnshaw's sharp strike was well saved by Day and Peter Thorne's first time effort was comfortably claimed by the Rangers stopper.

It looked as if Rangers were heading to a hugely impressive away win but with 12

minutes to go they were undone at a set piece. Andy Legg came on for Gary Croft and it was his corner that was met by Thorne with a firm header past Day.

Ninian Park exploded and the home side scented blood. They poured forward, buoyed by a goal that had looked unlikely to come, and forced a host of corners. Rangers were wobbling and needed every ounce of effort and concentration to keep out a home side transformed by the equaliser.

As full time approached though a draw seemed the most likely result. But up popped Langley to win the game in the last minute. Ninian Park fell silent, bar the 980 Rangers fans tucked away in the corner. Unsurprisingly, they went berserk - and could you blame them? A huge, huge moment in Rangers' season and a magnificent result.



Luton Town come to Loftus Road today on the outside looking in and with time running out.

Joe Kinnear's men are desperate to make one final push for a play-off spot and will need to beat Rangers today to have any hope.

The Hatters have been unable to maintain solid form recently, including recent critical losses to Brentford, Notts County, and Mansfield Town. In fact, all season long, Luton have been up and down, balancing a handful of three, four, and five-game unbeaten streaks with a four-game losing run

to open the season and further defeats spread through the rest of the schedule.

Similarly, Luton Town have been both up and down during their time in the Football League. After hovering in Divisions Two and Three for 35 years, they made it to the old Division One in 1955.

Ten years later, they were all the way down in Division Four, but by 1982 had reclaimed a spot in the top level. A place in the first Premiership season was not to be, however, as they missed staying up the year before the reorganisation

by just two points.

The long slide down continued in 1996 with relegation to Division Two and again in 2001 with a drop to Division Three, both of which were brought on by scores of injuries that disrupted the side and financial trouble that left Luton in administration.

Luckily for the Hatters, a permanent move to the bottom of the Football League was not in order, and they returned to the second Division last year. Also, the club's boardroom woes eased and Luton now have a young squad that is full of potential.

This year Luton's young squad have challenged for promotion, but their chances are waning; the Hatters are just as close on points to the middle of the table as the top and the rest of the campaign will not be easy. Loftus Road has been especially difficult on the Hatters, as they have not won here since 1984.


Strikers Steve Howard and Tony Thorpe have done their best to put Luton Town in front of their opponents by combining for 32 goals in all competitions. However, they haven't had much control over the defense, which has allowed 53 goals, a number that is only average when

compared to the rest of the division.


Though they may now need something special to make the play-offs, the Hatters have played remarkably well against the teams above them. Their loss to Crewe on March 22nd was their first to any team currently higher in the table.

Today Rangers look to reverse that trend, whilst Luton Town are determined not to give in. After the spicy encounter at Kenilworth Road earlier this season, today's game shouldn't be dull. Luton are at the last chance saloon - will they come out firing?

PICK OF THE SQUAD

CARL EMBERSON (goalkeeper) came to Luton in the summer of 2001 from Walsall because manager Joe Kinnear wanted competition for the goalkeeper's spot. He began his career at Millwall as a trainee, but made his name in a seven-year spell at Colchester.

IAN HILLIER (defender) made his League debut for Luton in the second game of last season. The day before he was in training for Spurs, where he was captain of the reserves, but was brought to Luton on loan due to several injuries in the Kenilworth Road side.

RUSSELL PERRETT (defender) helped Cardiff City win promotion to the Second Division in May 2001, but was squeezed out due to a huge recruitment drive at Ninian Park. Kinnear brought on the big central defender, and he slotted into the Luton side quickly and was a large part of last year's promotion-winning side.

CHRIS COYNE (defender) signed with West Ham as a teenager after coming to the Hammers notice during the 1994 youth World Cup. Because his chances with the Premiership side were rare, Coyne was eventually transferred to Dundee before moving to Kenilworth Road in September 2001 for £50,000. He has since become a Luton Town fan favourite.

SOL DAVIS (defender) left Swindon after his contract expired at the end of last season. Swindon boss Andy King failed to persuade him to sign a new deal, and Joe Kinnear added the tough-tackling left back to his squad. Davis joined Swindon as a trainee in 1998 and rapidly became a regular in the first team.

MATTHEW SPRING (midfielder) after a League debut at only 17, he soon became a regular in Luton's Second Division Team and had made 100 appearances by the time he was 20. He

was an influential part of last year's promotion-winning side and was convinced to stay last summer after his contract ran out.

KEVIN NICHOLLS (midfielder) began his career as a trainee at Charlton and skippered England's under-18, under-19 and under-20 squads. After two years playing at Wigan Athletic, Kevin was brought to Kenilworth Road for £150,000 in 2001. He quickly became team captain, and his enthusiasm and ferocious tackling have made him a favourite with Luton fans.

AHMET BRKOVIC (midfielder) is a Croatian player who came to Luton in the summer of 2001 on a Bosman free transfer. He played with Leyton Orient for two years, but left after Leyton failed in the play-offs to win promotion to Division Two. He thought he might have a better chance with Luton and was proven right with the Hatters move to Second Division



after last season.

PAUL HUGHES (midfielder) rose from being a trainee at Chelsea to being part of their Premiership team under Glenn Hoddle, gaining experience through several loans. Hoddle recruited Hughes after becoming manager of Southampton, but a serious groin injury left him out of football for nine months. Southampton, under new management by then, made him available for transfer, and he joined Luton just before last season.

TONY THORPE (striker) 'came home' to Luton as a Bosman free transfer in the summer, the fourth time he has signed for the Hatters. He first came to Luton in 1992 at the age of 18 after a traineeship at Leicester. A 31-goal campaign in 1996-97 led to his transfer to Fulham, but he could not catch on there or at Bristol City later and returned to Luton twice in 1999 on loan deals before a permanent deal could finally be reached this summer.

STEVE HOWARD

position: **STRIKER**

Howard was brought to Luton from Northampton for just £50,000 on transfer deadline day in March 2001. Howard had helped Northampton win promotion to Division Two and did the same with Luton Town after the bargain deal. Howard finished top in Division Three with 24 goals, and, not surprisingly, the fans voted him their player of the year.



So far this season, Howard has again been the catalyst as Luton's top scorer and has developed quite a successful partnership in the attack with Tony Thorpe. Howard is one of the main reasons Luton have reversed their fortunes and are challenging for promotion for a second straight year. Rangers' defence must be wary of this talented scorer.

I thought I'd leave it a week or two, just in case people were having trouble finding the right words for what they wanted to say, or were having trouble getting them out through such big mouthfuls of humble pie. Maybe it doesn't make the best headline ever: 'YOU WERE RIGHT AND WE WERE WRONG'

But I'd say we all, and the greater part of the media in particular, owe the England manager something more than has been on offer by way of apology. The defeat of Turkey at the Stadium of Light ten days ago was about as good as it gets in the course of European Championship qualifiers. Playing the third best team at last summer's World Cup, England absolutely dominated all but the first 25 minutes, ran Turkey ragged, outpassed a technically superior side, wound up the opposition's wind-up merchants and then found enough for the two goals which deservedly won the game and put England top of the Group.

According to the morning's papers, Sven Goran Eriksson had gone into that game with his job prospects hanging by a thread. On TV documentaries, on radio phone-ins, on the back pages, Sweden's answer to Peter Sellers in 'Being There' has taken a pasting, since we lost to Brazil in Japan - fierce enough, surely, to have seen off many lesser mortals. The baiting and condemnation reached new heights after the 2-0 win in Vaduz a fortnight ago. The fact that we beat

Liechtenstein, apparently, was neither here nor there. Popular opinion seemed to be screaming: Go! We'd come to the end of the road, it was being claimed, with yet another muppet in charge of the national team. All the Turks had to do was turn up in Sunderland on the Wednesday to beat us and see the clamour force Eriksson out of a job.

There'll be poor performances around the corner for the national team. Count on it. But one or two things might be worth remembering before we start tearing our hair out about them. Since That Glorious Summer, we've reached the semi-finals of major tournaments twice, under Bobby Robson and then Terry Venables, both of whom, you may recall, had resigned before those tournaments began and were thus immune to the slings of disgruntled fans and the English tabloids' arrows. If we make the finals in Portugal - or, indeed, in Germany - and Sven announces the week before that he'll be going back to club football at the end of the competition, trust me: that'll be the time to put the lot on England to win something again at long last.

The Wednesday before last, Argentina last summer and the 5-1 against the Germans in Munich; the fact that, when Eriksson took the job, England weren't likely to make a playoff, never mind head off to the 2002 World Cup as Group winners; just the one defeat by the odd goal in three, to the best team in the

world, in fifteen competitive games. That's a CV for a first couple of years in charge that puts Sven, plain and simple, no argument - out there on his own as an England manager. Nobody in history even comes close, even if one or two of his predecessors did eventually get the hang of the thing later on. Eriksson's England have already stirred enough pride about the national team to keep my faith in the bloke intact through any number of scrappy wins in the middle of nowhere.

Neither his words nor his actions ever seek to shift the blame for underachievement onto his players. He just stands there, blinking in the arc lights, while we all vent our frustrations. On a night like the one ten days ago on Wearside, though, he makes sure all the credit goes to the team and not their coach. Even on the touchline: he doesn't berate players' mistakes; likewise, in triumph, he tries not to react too strongly lest the camera should linger too long on him rather than on his players.

That's just one of many reasons why, whatever people may try to mislead you into believing to the contrary, those players both like and respect Sven Goran Eriksson. Which, in its turn, strikes me as a pretty sound argument for the rest of us to continue pinning our hopes, rather than the traditional donkey's tail, on the man who's making steady progress, trying to realise England's dream.



just before half time.

Substitute David Booles, on for Griffiths, was looking lively and saw a shot agonisingly hit the post as Rangers applied the pressure. Then Pacquette was taken off for Dennis Oli, to offer some further fresh legs up front.

Finally with a few minutes left, Booles' perseverance paid off with a shot that took a slight deflection before rolling in to the Cambridge net.

There was further trouble for Cambridge moments later when Brennan was stretchered off. With all United's substitutes used, midfielder Martin Shinn was forced to don the gloves.

Rangers did their best to test the new goalkeeper with a few high balls into the box. But the Cambridge defence held firm



Rangers enjoyed a great day at the seaside, recording a 3-1 win at Blackpool with Richard Langley grabbing his first ever hat-trick for the Superhoops. This promised to be a tough afternoon and indeed, this was by no means a one-sided encounter.

But the visitors took their chances and after a difficult game against Wigan the previous weekend, Richard Langley bounced back in style to produce a memorable display. The first time a Rangers midfielder has scored a hat-trick away from Loftus Road since Mark Lazarus in February 1967.

Langley opened the scoring on 36 minutes from a free kick after Paul

Furlong was fouled by Grayson. Langley curled the ball over the wall into the top left hand corner to cue some wild celebrations.

Dan Shittu thought he had doubled the Rs' lead after 40 minutes. He headed home Padula's corner but the linesman decided that there had been some kind of contact in the box and the goal was not allowed to stand.

Three minutes after the restart a crazy goaline scramble almost sparked a full scale brawl. Somewhere amongst it all Gallen had a shot tipped onto the crossbar, as did Dan Shittu.

Chris Day was forced to make a save from Taylor on the hour. The pacy number 10 broke through the QPR defence and Day made a comfortable save from Taylor's effort.

But Rangers soon doubled their advantage. Furlong showed great strength and perseverance to release McLeod who fed the ball wide to Langley. From the corner of the box Langley struck a low swerving drive to put Rangers two up.

Blackpool went on the attack and

Holloway responded by taking off Paul Furlong for Matthew Rose as QPR went to a 4-5-1 formation. But it was Rangers who grabbed the next goal. Langley completed his hat-trick on 86 minutes when McLeod burst forward and received a pass from Gallen.

He hit a low cross and Langley stooped to head home. A clearly delighted Langley ran to the Rangers fans as they celebrated in the seaside sunshine.

Blackpool managed a consolation through Taylor in injury time but this goal failed, however, to take the gloss off a fantastic win for the Rs on their travels.

Any side that entertains thoughts of gaining promotion needs someone to score big goals; someone who can get in the right place and put pressure on the defence; someone like Paul Furlong.

QPR's recent run of excellent form has been directly tied to the efforts of the attack, specifically Paul and his partnership with Kevin Gallen. In February and early March, Paul scored six goals in six games, none of which were losses.

Then, a week ago, Paul led Rangers' attack on Ninian Park, opening the scoring of a hotly contested match with the Bluebirds. He said it was a great feeling to score amidst the boisterous Cardiff crowd.

"It's always going to be a good atmosphere when you play at Ninian Park. They're our rivals and we want to get in the position they're in and it was certainly nice to score when I did."

Scoring big goals like the one at Cardiff and those throughout the past two months gives Paul more energy and incentive to go out and help his team. Still, he said he realises he's got to keep his mind on the task at hand, beating opposition like today's visitors and climbing up the table.

"I'm a pretty level headed sort of person. People say I'm pretty laid back and I just go out there and do the sort of job I'm capable of doing. I've played a run of games now and the confidence grows and I'm glad to be putting in some decent performances and scoring for the team."

"We're not gonna treat the Luton game as any different. We see Luton as in our way, so we obviously want to go out and get three points to pursue our mission."

Paul is happy to be in the position he's in now. Early in the season, when he and the team had trouble with injuries and couldn't sustain good form, Paul says, he was always confident that the side could turn things around.

I've always said since I came here that if we keep the players together and steer clear from injuries and suspension, then this side will do well, and we're proving that right now."

Paul's partnership with Kevin Gallen is proof enough. The way Paul and Kevin have worked off one another in attack recently has given opposing defences fits and has not only led to increased scoring from the two strikers, but has resulted in a more potent attack in general. Paul said

he feels comfortable working alongside Kevin, but thinks they can get even better.


"We work hard in the training field, trying to learn each other's game and the partnership is going quite well at the moment."

"Kevin's been the kind of player I've always rated whilst I've been at other clubs and I've seen him play. It was just good to come down here and play with him."

"But we're just going to keep working at our game. We're not silly, as soon as you think you've conquered it, it's got a habit of kicking you in teeth, this game has."

If Paul keeps working at his game and gets even better, Rangers may well find themselves in Division One next season. Paul said the chances look good.

"I feel we've got a good chance, but we're not gonna push too far. At the start of the season, we set out a plan and that was to get promotion and we're gearing ourselves towards that. We're going to take each game as it comes and at the end of the season we'll be there or thereabouts."

MAGPIES GET ELIMINATION THREAT

Notts County have been given until May 27 to come out of administration. If they fail to meet the deadline, they will be thrown out of the Football League.

The Magpies have been in administration since June 2002, and Football League officials have expressed dismay that the club have made little progress correcting their financial problems. The League's frustration led them to giving Notts County eight weeks to right the ship or be eliminated.

"The club have until May 27 to come out of administration," a League spokesman told the Nottingham Evening Post. "Otherwise they will no longer be a League club."

On the pitch, the Magpies appear to have avoided relegation this season, but with heavy pressure from the League to clear up the problems in the front office, the point may be moot.

"There is an increasing feeling that clubs in administration hold an advantage over other teams who have to work hard to clear their debts," the spokesman said. "Clubs have to cut their cloth accordingly."

"Notts County have been in administration for a long time now and there has to be a cut-off point."

TWO TERRIERS SENT OFF

Huddersfield Town have seen the first

casualties of their entry into administration.

Reserve coach Jeff Lee and reserve team physio Dave Buckby had their contracts terminated as part of cost-cutting efforts. Lee had been with the club for five years and Buckby for three.

Administrators felt sorry they had to make the move. A spokesman said, "It is regrettable that we have had to make these redundancies and it is nothing to do with Jeff or Dave's service to the club, it is part of our cost saving measures."

Huddersfield have been assured by administrators that their Academy will be spared and no further redundancies are expected.

ROBINS NOT APPEALING

Bristol City have decided not to appeal the fine levied by the Football League following their hiring of Tony Pulis as manager from Gillingham in July 1999.

"The Club have been left with no alternative but to bring this sorry episode to a very unsatisfactory end," Chairman Steve Landown told the Robins' official site.

"It is a hollow victory to say that the compensation we have been ordered to pay Gillingham is only £50,000, a decision which I still find staggering bearing in mind the current economic state of football, that these events

happened nearly four years ago, and Gillingham actually sacked Tony Pulis prior to his appointment as manager of Bristol City."

The Robins will now pay a £25,000 fine to the Football League, £50,000 compensation to Gillingham and 60 percent of the tribunal fees, with Gillingham paying the rest.

Pulis only led Bristol City for five months, leaving in January 2000 for Portsmouth.

INVINCIBLE OUT OF TOWN

Swindon Town have announced that Danny Invincible will be departing this summer, along with four other players.

Manager Andy King explained that Swindon Town's finances are not sufficient to keep Invincible after this season.

"I made one last offer to the lad this week, but he feels he can better his career elsewhere."

"The upside of these things is that the Club is now being realistic, they are now working within their means and such is the state of football nowadays that it has to."

MEETING OF THE MINDS

Oldham manager Iain Dowie has met with ex-chairman, Honourary President and majority shareholder Chris Moore to discuss the club's finances. Dowie said Moore assured him he will support the

club beyond the end of this season.

Dowie told the Oldham Chronicle, "It was positive - we know finances are difficult, but Chris is committed beyond the end of the season.

"He needs to drive down costs, but he is also prepared to stand a certain amount of losses for a number of years.

"I wanted assurance that his commitment was there, and I fully understand that he is losing money because of a budget we can't stick with."

"The club certainly isn't out of the woods yet, so it's a case of slow revolution rather than overnight change."

HODGES HOLDING ON

Barnsley manager Glyn Hodges has received assurance from owner Peter Doyle that he will stay at Barnsley after this season. Hodges took over after Steve Parkin was sacked and after Barnsley entered administration and has guided the Tykes clear of a second successive relegation.

"I think Glyn has done a splendid job and has proven the knockers wrong," Doyle said.

"I have stood by Glyn from day one and I haven't been looking for managers. That means I can't see anybody else taking his place."

PALMER READING


Stockport County manager Carlton Palmer is convinced six points are all the Hatters need to avoid relegation. Palmer's men stand just two points out of the danger zone with six games remaining, but Palmer thinks safety is close at hand.

"Looking at the table, I think two wins from the last six games will be good enough to make sure that we stay up," he told the Manchester Evening News.

"Saturday's game at Wycombe is massive for us in that we need to get those wins as soon as possible."







A goal 60 seconds in to the second half from Nathan Ellington earned all three points for champions-elect Wigan at Loftus Road. The Latics' travelling support erupted at the final whistle, acclaiming a win that takes them tantalisingly close to securing promotion to Division One. For Rangers, this was a frustrating afternoon with moments of quality too few and far between to inflict only Wigan's third away win of the season.

Holloway's men were slow out of the blocks and it took Rangers 12 minutes to get their first sight of goal, but when it came they squandered a decent opportunity. Kevin McLeod slipped the ball past Nicky Eaden on the left hand side and fired in a low cross towards Kevin Gallen. His shot was blocked and when the ball ran free to Paul Furlong six yards out, John Filan spread himself to keep out

the big striker's snap shot.

But Wigan were soon on the move again and once again Ellington was at the centre of things, driving from midfield before unleashing a shot from 20 yards that beat Chris Day but cannoned back off the upright.

The visitors continued to play the more confident football with Neil Roberts taking advantage of a Shittu slip in the 22nd minute to fire in a looping effort from an acute angle that Chris Day had to stretch to push away.

As the half wore on, Rangers upped the tempo and were able to take advantage of some uncharacteristic slips from the away side and build attacks that, though they came to little, kept the pressure on the visitors.

But within a minute of the second half

Once again, Rangers slowly but surely eased their way back in to the game and came close twice before the hour mark. First a Richard Langley free kick after a foul on Gallen was well saved

by Filan and then McLeod stole in at the far post only for the Latics to be grateful to their 'keeper again.

Rangers continued to press, with Wigan adopting a more conservative approach to proceedings. They appeared happy to allow Rangers possession and soak up whatever the home side could throw at them.




The next two games Rangers play may seem like a respite from the clashes with fellow promotion hopefuls, but Ian Holloway and his men know better. Though QPR play Brentford and Notts County, two mid-table sides with long-vanished dreams of promotion, the games are important as ever with every point critical to Rangers' cause.

Also, both teams on the Easter weekend schedule would surely love nothing more than to spoil Rangers' hopes.

First up, in one week's time, is Brentford. As the Rangers travel to Griffin Park, the Bees stand well adrift of the play-off places, but still hopeful to derive some pride from a victory over their London neighbours.

While Brentford's days near the top of the old Division One are nearly 70 years past, the Bees have had reason to be proud of recent history, including a top finish in the

old Division Three in 1991-92 and an impressive recovery to regain Division Two status in 1998-99 after being relegated the year before.

Last season proved to be mostly successful, but heartbreaking at the end. Brentford finished just a point shy of automatic promotion after a late goal gave Reading a draw with the Bees: all the Royals need to win an invitation to

Division One. A loss to Stoke in the play-off final meant the Bees would be back in Division Two this year.

The heartbreak came earlier for Wally Downes' men this season: Brentford started out with good form and entered the new year just shy of a play-off spot, but then fell victim to injuries and lost their scoring touch. Winless runs of six and seven games erased any play-off aspirations they had.

Earlier in the season, Brentford came to Loftus Road and left with a 1-1 draw despite Rangers' spirited second-half effort. Next week, the Bees look to show QPR what they can do and begin a solid run of form to take them through the end of the season.

Two days after the short trip to Brentford, Notts County come to Loftus Road looking for a double over Rangers.

In December, Rangers paid the Magpies a visit and brought a gift for their hosts, as they did themselves in with a poor opening 15 minutes that led to a 3-0 defeat. Given Rangers' recent form, a repeat is unlikely. Still, the Loftus Road faithful could be in for a well-played match, considering Notts County's form of six wins and a draw in nine games, with a 5-0 defeat to Swindon being an aberration from the Magpies' solid football.

Throughout their long history, the Magpies have made stops at every level. They were founding members of the Football League and have spent 28 years in the top flight on four different occasions. They narrowly missed being founding members of the Premiership by finishing in the bottom three the year before.

A slide to Division Two was followed shortly by a quick visit to the bottom of the Football League, but now Notts County have returned to the middle of Division Two. Billy Dearden's men are young but improving, and in the near future may be ready to make another push towards Division One.

 Should you require medical first aid during your visit, contact the nearest steward who will arrange for qualified first aiders to assist you. First Aid teams are located at all four corners of the playing area.

The medical First Aid centre is situated under Block T at the rear of the Ellerslie Road Stand.

Behavioural policy

In the interests of public safety we would ask all supporters to co-operate with the following policy.

1 Under no circumstances are people allowed on to the pitch. This is an offence under the Football (offences) Act 1991.

2 Supporters must not use racial chants or indecent and abusive language whilst in the stadium. This is an arrestable offence under the Football (offences) Act 1991.

3 The throwing of any items on to or towards the pitch or in to an area for spectators is strictly forbidden. This is an arrestable offence under the Football (offences) Act 1991.

4 Possession of alcohol in view of the pitch is contrary to licensing regulations and will lead to ejection. This is an offence under the Sporting Events (control of alcohol) act 1985.

5 You are asked to observe ground regulations by not bringing in to the stadium any objects that might cause injury to others.

6 This is an all-seater stadium and persistent standing in the seated areas will lead to you being asked to leave or ejected.

7 In the interest of public safety you are requested to refrain from standing in, blocking or sitting in any gangways, exits or stairwells.

8 You are reminded that flash photography is not allowed in the stadium.
