

GW SAYS

I continue to believe that the squad here at Stevenage is capable of winning promotion. We are a disappointing 9th and you only need to look at the stupid points that we have squandered to know that I am right. We could so easily have earned another 8-10 points.

But results don't lie and we have to improve in what we're doing if we are going to give Stevenage any success this season. I don't plan to be talking about 8-10 more squandered points in 14 games time!

So what needs to change?
1. We need to get rid of our injury crisis and get important players like Westhead, Goodliffe, Watson, Carroll, Maamria back and available; if those players were fit and not selected then, with their abilities, this team would be on fire. Nothing is going to change without change so we are going to re-vamp our training programme to assist in the fitness of our players.

2. We need to learn to win at home; our home record is currently worse than our away record. That too has got to change so we're making alterations to the way in which we prepare for games and the way in which we approach games at home.

3. We need to get our fans right behind us as you were at the end of last season. 'Win and they'll be there' is a popular retort. But I think that we must re-create that urgency, trust and togetherness of last year and build upon it, home and away. The team didn't wait for the crowd and the crowd didn't wait for the team; we went at it together as one. Remember how we scored the second goal on Saturday after 5 minutes of atmosphere building noise from the East Terrace.

4. And finally, both the team and the individuals within it have got to perform to acceptable standards; individual battles have to be won. Success won't come to those who don't earn it. I believe in my squad but I'm not going to tolerate players that can't succeed under the pressure of being required to win. We've had the 'excuses' of being a 'new team'; of 'inconsistent selection through injury' etc. Now, I need players who are not only 'able' but who are 'capable' of performing to winning standards consistently. Most players here can do they

must let themselves. When I joined Stevenage we were 21st. We finished the season twelfth. Now we're ninth. I need to take similarly dramatic steps now to the ones I took when I first came here. And then, with the talent at the club I believe that we can go on and win promotion, which would be an amazing achievement for everybody at our club including our fans.

Keep the faith.

PHIL WALLACE

Welcome to this evenings game and a warm welcome to the directors, management, players, officials and supporters of Luton Town for this LDV 1st round tie. It's true that not many of the League sides take this as seriously as, say, the FA Cup - but they do when they get close to the Final stages and our guests tonight would probably feel they have a reasonable chance of making that stage of this competition. However, the difference in levels between the top dozen or so Conference sides and the lower half of the 2nd and all of the 3rd division is not that great and therefore we have every chance of doing very well in this, our first cup competition under Graham Westley (I'm not counting our FA Trophy game at Tamworth as he was just a spectator).

True, we've all been disappointed in the points dropped - particularly at home this season - but there's a long, long way to go yet. As long as we're around the top 7 or 8 come Xmas we'll have a great chance of making the play offs.

This week provides me with a couple of extra days to catch up on Conference work and spend some time at the Club. I'd planned to be in Cologne until tomorrow so I was well pleased to come back early at the weekend and have the chance to get some work sorted out Monday and today. I have a meeting at the FA tomorrow, representing the Conference in a meeting with the 3 feeder leagues and a Conference board meeting the following day, here at Stevenage. The 'Alliance' seems to be moving forwards well with all parties, except the Ryman League, genuinely excited by the move that will improve football at the high-

est level. The Conference has been improving standards at an incredible pace, with the majority of clubs now full time and stadia and commercial opportunities improving every year. The gap was getting very, very hard for clubs in the feeder leagues to bridge. Moving to national football has proved very difficult for most clubs gaining promotion with teams like Tamworth, Leigh and Gravesend all doing ok but finding the going hard after promotion. True, Aldershot have set off at an alarming pace, but they have a big set-up and a decent budget from good crowds. It is my firm belief that we need to put a stepping stone between clubs playing regional football and clubs playing

professional, national football. The new Conference South and Conference North allows for clubs to make that first step into 'semi national' football and adapt. The ground criteria is basically the same as the feeder A grade that exists now, although it will improve later, so there are no new barriers for clubs to jump. Change is refreshing and the new Alliance is good for the game. Yes, we could have left it the same, possibly tweaked a few boundary changes, but that's not change. We need to keep raising standards to attract customers. We can only do that if we move with the times.

THIS IS YOUR LIFE JIM BRISCOE

Tonight James Patrick Briscoe, SBFCSA President, 'A Team' founder member, Broadhall Way stalwart and now Octogenarian, THIS IS YOUR LIFE.

Whether you know him well, have met him only briefly, or are still to have that pleasure, be assured you will never forget the time spent in his company. Jim is to Stevenage football what Shankley was to Liverpool or Busby to United, he lives and breathes SBFC. Phone him at home and while most people answer with their number or perhaps a cheery "hello", not so our Jim. An adopted southerner for over 50 years and never losing his native Yorkshire accent he always answers with "Stevenage for League football". What the unsuspecting telesales person makes of him I shudder to think, but they will certainly know more about SBFC once HE has chosen to end the call.

Born 14th October 1923 in Swinton, Sth.Yorkshire, the younger of two brothers. Upon leaving school a career in engineering beckoned until WW2 intervened, signing up for the Fleet Air Arm he was sent on arctic convoy duty. It has been suggested that the posting had certain inevitability, the Russians being the only people who could understand him. Nevertheless while most folk celebrate their 21st birthday with a party, Jim spent his high


up in a freezing "Crows Nest" riding the wild North Sea.

1940 Jim signed amateur forms for Sheffield Wednesday but as the conflict escalated most people's lives were put on hold. His delayed debut arrived on Boxing Day 1943 in a local derby with Sheffield United. Weighing 12 stones and a towering 6'1" Jim donned the No.9 jersey for Wednesday's short trip to Bramall Lane.

Another posting took him north of the border to Donibristol and a loan spell with Raith Rovers. Reputed to be the first Englishman to score a hatrick against Glasgow Rangers (according to a Rangers yearbook) Jim eventually moved on to play for the Royal Navy. A match against the RAF at a capacity Villa Park was followed by a visit to the Olympic Stadium, Amsterdam (home of Ajax) where 132,000 people watched the first international to be played in Europe since 1939. Holland v The Combined Services seems an unlikely fixture by today's standards but these were extraordinary times. Jim's next move, to

Gainsborough Trinity had the local newspaper heralding "Best start for 30 years - 15 goals from 4 matches and Briscoe scores 9 of them". The next match at Bradford he broke his leg and missed the rest of the season, football can be a cruel game sometimes.

An offer to play for Ramsgate (with house included) was enough to lure Jim and Mary south. Making over 200 appearances for them between 1948-53 and breaking the Kent league scoring record twice, his 55 goals are unequalled to this day. Between 1953-58 he played 100 games for Margate finally hanging up his boots for a career manufacturing amusement arcade machines. The sea air and spare time were followed (although not too closely it would seem) by the patter of tiny feet as daughter Linda was born in 1948, followed by sons Lloyd in 1955 and Russell in 1959.


With time on his hands Jim started a football team which spawned a very successful youth club. Known as Ramsgate Sporting and with facilities that include canoeing, boxing,

wrestling, football and cricket it still exists today. Around this time he also helped to organise dances in a local ballroom booking some of the big pop names of that era such as The Kinks, Heinz and the Rolling Stones.

1968 he accepted an offer from Stevenage Town Manager Tommy Bickerstaff, to become the club's commercial manager, uprooting the family

from Kent to Hertfordshire. Jim was not to know that the club was in trouble and shortly afterwards Tommy departed for Cambridge City and the Town folded. Rising from the ashes, Stevenage Athletic was born with Jim becoming their first Manager. Long-suffering but staunchly supportive, wife Mary suddenly found herself in the position of landlady and surrogate mother to a succession of young footballers that lodged with them. Johnny Harley (eventually sold to Reading), Drew Noble (who's son David was a recent £1M transfer from Arsenal to West Ham), Jack Parks, Bobby Samuel and Mick Hennigan (eventually became How ard Wilkinson's No.2 at Sheff Wed and also Leeds Utd championship winning side), are just a few to have grown up with the family Briscoe.

His first interview in the Stevenage News on 20th August

1968 quotes 'Mr Briscoe's ultimate footballing ambition is to see Stevenage Athletic as an FA. League team...."I just cannot imagine us not being in it with 200,000 people living here within the next 15 or 20 years". Thirty five years on and while Stevenage are closing in on that Football League place, the population growth has somewhat to go but Jim's passion and enthusiasm has never wavered.

These days Managers tend to move on when replaced, but for Jim this was never an option. The day job became Marconi engineering, evenings and weekends were spent at Broadhall Way as groundsman until 1976 and Deja Vu this time saw Athletic follow Town into liquidation. Undeterred, Jim with his infectious enthusiasm immediately set about galvanising a small group of supporters together to form Stevenage Boro'. The rest as they say is history.

Passionate about sport, Jim also excelled at cricket, was a talented golfer, and even boxed whilst in the forces. He still thrives on his connection with The Boro and is a proud and loving father and grandfather.

"Old footballers never die - they just shout louder!"

Happy Birthday Jim and many more of them.

TODAY AT BROADHALL WAY



DAVID BAYLISS

Ex Manager Joe discovered to his great delight that Rochdale were prepared to release their longest-serving player. Centre-half Bayliss jumped at the chance to join the Hatters, and played a full part in the promotion campaign that followed. An inch under six foot tall, he had been at Spotland since he was a trainee, and made over 200 first-team appearances for Rochdale before deciding not to accept a new contract with them.

EMMERSOON BOYCE

One of the many to come through from Luton's schools and youth development programme, the defender was signed as a YTS boy in the summer of 1995, and made the breakthrough to the League squad at the age of 19 midway through the 1999/2000 season after occasional appearances following a debut in the Auto Windscreens Shield in January 1999. He became a regular at right back, with a liking to attack on the overlap, and signed a new contract in the summer of 2002.

AHMET BRKOVIC

Believing a move would be good for his career, the midfield playmaker refused new terms at Leyton Orient in the summer of 2001, to join Luton on a Bosman free transfer. He played a valuable role, mainly on the right flank, to help Luton return to the Second Division at the first attempt.

CHRIS COYNE

The centre-half was playing for Perth Soccer Club when he was selected for the Australian under-17 squad for the 1994 youth World Cup, and came to the notice of Harry Redknapp, then manager of West Ham. Coyne signed for the Hammers as a teenager, but Premiership chances were few and far between, and after loan spells at Brentford and Southend, Coyne went to Dundee. A £50,000 cheque persuaded the Scottish Premier League club to let the defender move to Kenilworth Road in September 2001 and Coyne rapidly became a crowd favourite in the promotion run that fol-

lowed.

DEAN CROWE

Dean made an immediate impact after signing on loan from Stoke City scoring on his debut, at Plymouth, and was soon signed on a permanent deal. His goals helped Luton win promotion last season. He was made available by Stoke after loan spells at Northampton and Bury.



SOL DAVIS

When Swindon boss Andy King failed in attempts to persuade Sol to sign a new deal Luton manager Joe Kinnear nipped in to add the tough-tackling left back to his squad. Davis had joined Swindon as a trainee in the summer of 1998, and made rapid progress through the youth and reserve teams to become a regular in the Nationwide League.

ADRIAN FORBES

Forbes is noted for his ability to run at and past defenders, either to deliver crosses from out wide, or to cut in and have a crack at goal. He had been at Norwich for four years, starting as a trainee, before his move to Kenilworth Road.

CARL EMBERSON

Embersons career began at Millwall as a trainee, but he made his name in a seven-



year spell at Colchester before going to the Bescot Stadium and Walsall in the summer of 1999. Wanting competition for the first team goalkeeper's spot, Joe Kinnear signed Emberson in the summer of 2001.

STEVE HOWARD

Howard exploded into action in his first full season with Luton after joining from Northampton and his 24 goals made him the Third Division's top league marksman, and played a major part in Luton's drive to promotion. Not surprisingly, the fans voted him their player of the year.

PAUL HUGHES

Hughes worked his way up at Stamford Bridge from trainee to Premiership, learning his trade under Glenn Hoddle's management, and gained experience on loan to Stockport, Norwich and Crewe. When Hoddle became manager of Southampton he soon recruited Hughes, but a serious groin injury put the midfielder out of football for nine months. Southampton, by then under new management, made him available for transfer, and he joined Luton just before last season kicked off.

LEE MANSELL

The young midfielder is hoping to make the permanent breakthrough into Luton's first team this season. Luton had looked after him since he was an 11-year-old,



and signed him as soon as he left school. He was rewarded with a full professional contract, but still goes into this season fighting against stiff competition for a permanent place in Luton's midfield.

ALAN NEILSON

Neilson's international career began with appearances for Wales at youth and under-21 level, followed by five full caps, and he enjoyed a good career in the Premiership, with his first club Newcastle and then with Southampton and Fulham, and established himself at right back for Luton in the closing stages of last season.

KEVIN NICHOLLS

A £150,000 offer from Joe Kinnear to Wigan led to him moving to Kenilworth Road. He quickly became team captain, and his huge enthusiasm and ferocious tackling soon made him a big favourite with Luton fans, although opponents did not always view his all-action style with similar relish.

RUSSELL PERRETT

Exeter City saw off Northwich Victoria 2-0 thanks to a Sean Devine double at St James' Park. Morecambe lost their 100 per cent home record as Jim Bentley's goal was cancelled out by Ben Abbey for

Stanley took just four minutes to breach basement side Farnborough Town, with Paul Mullin on target for the Reds. Peter Cavanagh doubled the lead ten minutes later, before Billy Beall halved the deficit with just 18 minutes played. Chris Senior then snatched a point three minutes from time for the visitors. Neil Grayson put Forest Green Rovers in front in first-half injury time at home to Burton Albion, but Gary Twigg made it 1-1 with 12 minutes left. Margate took a 14th minute lead at home to Leigh RMI, with Adrian Clarke netting from close range. Jay Saunders made it 2-0 midway through the second half as Gate took the points.

Leigh RMI goalkeeper Stuart Coburn has been told he can leave the club after losing his first-team place to veteran Gary Kelly. Coburn joined the Railwaymen from Altrincham in the summer of 2002 and was a regular until the arrival of Kelly at the beginning of the current campaign. Leigh boss Mark Patterson told the Bolton Evening News: "It's a tough decision to let Stuart go. "I know there'll be a lot of people in Leigh who are disappointed to see him leave, but I live and die by those decisions and I've chosen to go with Gary. "I don't want to detract from anything that Stuart's done, but Gary's got a better knowledge of the game and a better presence in the dressing room. "I'll be looking for a small fee for Stuart." Defender Nicky Hill has also left Hilton Park at the end of his short-term contract.

Take your preferred route to the M25 (My suggestion is to take the A1 joining the M25 at Junction 23). Head towards Heathrow Airport. Leave the M25 at Junction 15 joining the M4 towards Reading and Swindon. Leave the M4 at Junction 18 (Bath) and take the A46 northwards towards Stroud.

It is about a 17-mile drive on the A46 until you reach the village of Nailsworth. After entering Nailsworth, take a left at the mini roundabout signposted Forest Green (you can't miss it as it is the only mini roundabout in the whole of Nailsworth!!) You should now be in Spring Hill. The Lawn is approximately 3/4 of a mile up the hill on the left.

There is a car park adjacent to The Lawn, in the grounds of Stroud College, a few yards past the FGR Sports and Social Club. There is a capacity that caters for 250 cars, but it is often full,
