THE MANAGER

HELLO and welcome to Kenilworth Road for today's game with Chesterfield. Welcome also to Roy McFarland, his staff, players, directors and supporters from Saltergate.

After surviving on the last day of last season, when they beat us 1-0, they have made an impressive start to the this campaign and today will be another tough test for us.

We lost our 100% record last week at Hillsborough but it was certainly a game we could have won. It is an indication of how far we have come if we compare the performance to last season, when we had a makeshift back four with Howie at centre-half. We did well to hang on that day but this season I got the feeling that Sheffield Wednesday were quite relieved afterwards to have taken a point. Congratulations to Steve Howard who was named Coca-Cola Player of the Month for August. His goals and general all round play have helped us into the position we are in. We also managed to win Manager of the Month which I always believe should be called Team of the Month. It is recognition of how well the lads have started that everyone in the club should take the credit for it and so we are grateful to Coca-Cola for the honour. The support we had at Hillsborough was amazing and it looked to me as though there were even more there than we had last year.

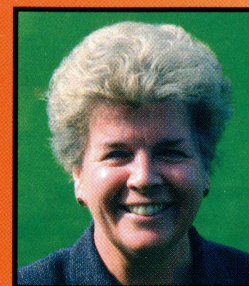

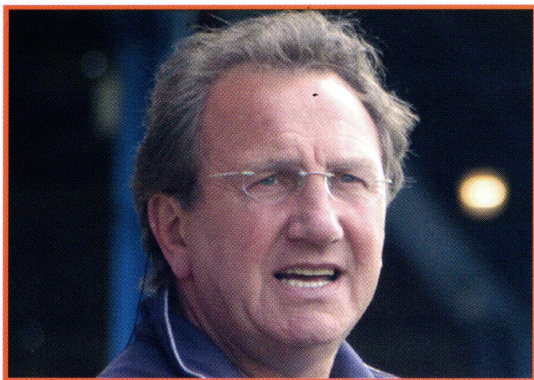

MANAGER - ROY MCFARLAND

ROY MCFARLAND had a tough start to his Saltergate career last season, pre-season relegation favourites' Chesterfield didn't win in their opening thirteen fixtures in Division Two, seemingly confirming the Bookies' feelings. However over the winter, McFarland gradually forged a unit capable of picking up points and a 2-0 win at Peterborough lifted Spireites side out of the bottom four for the first time in his tenure.

A run of eight games without a win during the Spring put Chesterfield back in the mire but Roy managed to lift the team's spirit again and with two wins from their last three games they were able to beat the drop, although Glynn Hurst's 88th minute winner in the final game of the season against the Hatters did cut things a little fine.

A former England International centre-half, he was captain of Derby County when they won the League title. Roy's playing career reached the heights most only dream of and he was equally successful when he switched to the other side of the touchline.

He took Bradford City up in his first season as a Manager before returning to Derby as Assistant Manager. He later became their Manager before having spells at Bolton, Cambridge United and Torquay

United. In his spell at Cambridge he saw them win promotion despite having a reputation as a selling club and he remains one of their most popular ever Managers.

GOALKEEPERS

CARL MUGGLETON

The Spireites first choice keeper, Carl has played for a host of clubs including Leicester City, Celtic, Stoke City and Cheltenham Town. He enjoyed a loan spell at Chesterfield in 1987/88, during which he made his League debut. A former England Under-21 International he's one of the more experienced men at Saltergate. Ever present in the league last season after he recovered from a broken leg that he sustained in December 2002.

ANDY RICHMOND

Has been the back-up to Carl Muggleton for the last two seasons, last term his only first-team appearance came in the LDV Vans Trophy but he had a few games the season before when Muggleton was injured. Big and strong, he's now in need of first-team experience if his game is to improve.

DEFENDERS

ALEX BAILEY

The London-born defender signed in the summer of 2004 after being released by Arsenal. Alex was a regular last season in the Gunners' reserves having joined them as a scholar in 2000. He as represented England at U16 level and can play at full-back or centre-half.

STEVE BLATHERWICK

The former Forest youngster is renowned for his non-stop battling at the heart of the Chesterfield rearguard. He is now in his seventh season with Spireites, having signed from Burnley and is the longest serving player at the Club.

BEN CRESSEY

Signed on a short-term deal after completing his scholarship, Ben is a left-sided defender, strong in the tackle and with a big heart but has yet to make his mark in the first-team arena.

KEVIN DAWSON

No nonsense centre-half or right-back who joined from Nottingham Forest where his younger brother Richard is still on the books. A superb chaser of lost causes who will go into the type of challenges others may shirk at.

AARON DOWNES

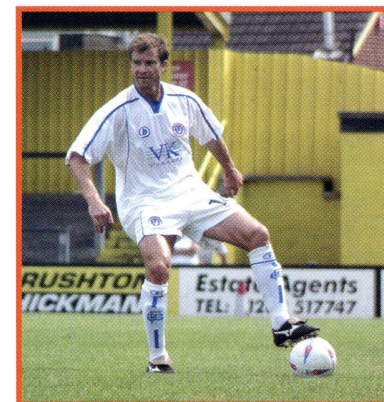
A former player with the Australian Institute of Sport, Aaron joined the Club, initially on a three-month deal at the start of the season. A centre-half with excellent ball skills, he had spells at Bolton and in non-league with Frickley Athletic.

IAN EVATT

Manager Roy McFarland's first signing for the Club, Evatt is a versatile performer who has also played in midfield, at the back and up front for Derby County, he even was an emergency keeper for them in a game against Oldham. Had a loan spell at Northampton Town in 2001 and returned to Pride Park to win a place in the Rams' first-team. He's tall and strong and has settled down into a central defensive role winning all of the Player of the Year awards last season.

SHANE NICHOLSON

The left-sided defender, who can also play in midfield, returned to Chesterfield in the



summer after being freed by Tranmere Rovers. He previously spent a season at Saltergate in 1998/99 after beginning his career at Lincoln, he

then moved on to Derby, more recently he's appeared for Stockport and Sheffield United.

ALAN O'HARE

A left-back who can also fill in at centre-half, he signed from Bolton Wanderers and had a tough

start. Alan took a bit of stick from the terraces during his early days but his pedigree shone through and he was named Young Player of the Year two seasons ago and was runner-up in the main event last year. A dedicated Spireite, he will be looking forward to continuing his improvement under one of England's most celebrated defenders of the last generation, Roy McFarland.

MIDFIELDERS

MARK ALLOTT



Joined from Oldham, his local club, where he was a striker but he has developed into an accomplished midfielder with a dangerous long throw. A great first touch, with good vision and sensible passing techniques he is steady and unspectacular, but the team is much more balanced when he plays.

JAMAL CAMPBELL-RYCE

The Lambeth-born winger is currently on loan from Charlton Athletic and he is a member of the Jamaican U21 and U23 squads, although he has been unable to link up with either international team due to injury. Jamel made his Premiership debut just before the end of 2002/03, in the last six minutes of the Addicks' 1-0 defeat to Blackburn. A terrifically skilful and determined player, he had a loan spell with Leyton Orient in 2002 and last season with Wimbledon.

GARETH DAVIES

Graduated through the Club's link with the Town's Technical College and can play in midfield or at full-back. A true competitor, fiercely loyal to his home town club, Gareth was in and out of the side last season, covering for injuries and suspensions and never letting the side down.

MARK HUDSON

Joined the Club on loan in August 2002 but was unable to agree terms to join permanently and went back to Middlesbrough. From there he was then loaned to Carlisle United but later returned to Saltergate permanently. A stylish central midfielder, his game improved when he became captain.

MARK INNES

Signed from Oldham Athletic, his only previous club. A left sided player, either at left-back, wing-back or midfield, he scored in both of his first two Chesterfield games adding to his only previous goal, which helped prevent Athletic being relegated. Has suffered with various injuries in his two-and-a-half seasons but his adaptability and ability prompted the Manager to give him another year.

DEREK NIVEN

Combative, box-to-box midfielder signed from Bolton Wanderers in March 2004 after spending two months on loan with the Spireites earlier in the season. He was a youngster at Raith Rovers and as a seventeen-year-old he moved to the Reebok for a substantial fee after less than ten minutes first-team experience. His signing, to 2006, was welcomed with great enthusiasm amongst Chesterfield fans.

STRIKERS

WAYNE ALLISON

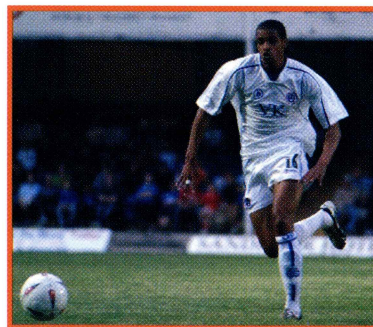
Signed on a two-year deal in the summer of 2004, "The Chief" has picked up masses of experience with Halifax, Watford, Bristol City, Swindon, Huddersfield, Tranmere and Sheffield United with combined transfer fees of over £2.25m. A strong target man, he will be expected to form the spearhead of the Spireites attack this season. His Chesterfield debut marked his 750th senior appearance, which he celebrated with a goal.

MARK DE BOLLA

Joined the Club on loan for a third month in March 2004 having spent two injury plagued months at Saltergate in the Autumn and the move was made permanent on deadline day last season. He damaged ankle ligaments on his first-class debut and was forced to have an operation after three more appearances during his second month. Began as a youngster with Aston Villa before signing for Charlton.

CALEB FOLAN

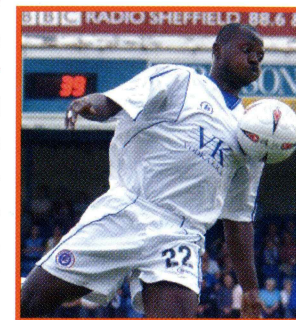
Signed in 2003 from Leeds United, Caleb is a quick player who loves running onto the ball rather. His strengths are bringing his colleagues into play and running with the ball. Having broken his ankle at



Grimsby in September 2003 which cut short his season he will be looking to make up for lost time this year.

TCHAM N'TOYA

Born in the Democratic Republic of Congo, Tcham was a surprise 2004 deadline day signing after leaving French club Troyes, a twin town of Chesterfield, to try to make his way in England. Unseen by Manager McFarland at the time of his signing, the youngster came recommended by Jim Smith after a successful trial at Portsmouth.



ADAM SMITH

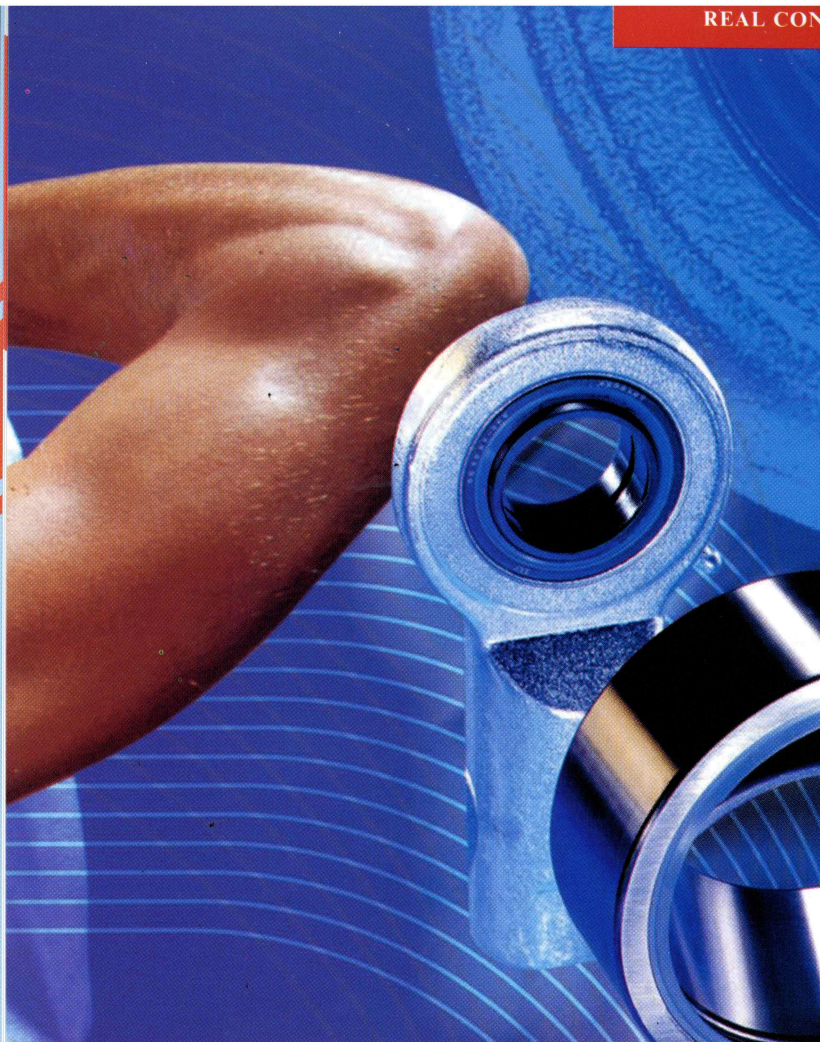
Played in the LDV game at Port Vale two seasons ago and, then just 17, was confident enough to take a successful spot-kick in the shoot-out. He made his League debut as a substitute against Notts County in September 2003 and has now signed a pro-contract until 2006.

TEAM NEWS

Chesterfield will be hoping that both Steve Blatherwick and Ian Evatt will be fit to face the Hatters this afternoon. Blatherwick had been suffering from tonsillitis earlier in the season but returned to the side against MK Dons last Saturday, only to be forced off during the first-half with a groin injury.

Mark Hudson (calf) and Caleb Folan (calf and groin) have recently returned to training after a spell on the sidelines and they may also feature.

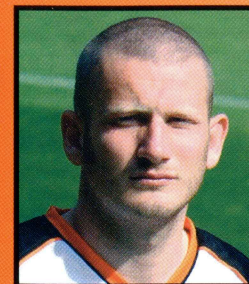

All we can do now is put it to the back of our minds, it is a big game this afternoon and we are unbeaten in the league and we want to turn in a good performance against Chesterfield and keep that run going.

break down. If their crowd gets behind them, particularly at home, they are a decent side. It is going to be a big game, it's first versus second and if we win and results go our way, as they did last weekend, that will put us eight points clear and give us a good hold on the league so early in the season.

HATTERS HISTORY

WHEN Allan Brown took over as manager at Kenilworth Road in early November 1966, replacing the tired George Martin, it was not long before he came to the conclusion that he had a major job on his hands.

Only seven short years before, the Town had played in the F.A. Cup final at Wembley but now looked likely to have to suffer the shame of applying for re-election to the Football League, which came about if you finished in the bottom four places of the old Division Four.

Brown's first game in charge saw the Hatters beat high-flying Crewe at home but the players had flattered to deceive and the honeymoon period was over as soon as the team had to travel away from Luton.

Defeats at Bradford City and Barrow were followed by an unexpected draw at Exeter in the F.A. Cup. For some peculiar reason the Town often played their mid-week games on Thursday evenings and the cup replay with Exeter proved to be over physical and although victory was achieved, it was at a cost as several players were injured.

Brown had little time to get players fit before the Saturday game in the league at Lincoln and what followed can safely be described as the blackest day in our history. Lincoln were bottom of Division Four and we were one place above them. To lose would have been extremely disappointing but to be thumped 8-1 was disastrous. The Hatters were simply overpowered by an Imps side that could not believe its good fortune to be playing against such a tired, unfit and ultimately demoralised side.

This time the directors realised that Brown was trying to manage with both arms tied behind his back and immediately made some money available to him. He wasted no time in spending it when he enticed no nonsense defender, Max Dougan, away from Leicester in exchange for a princely £7,000.

Dougan jumped at the chance of a move and made his debut in the Town's next game, at home to Chesterfield. Even though the Town had been hit for eight the previous week a respectable crowd of 5,096 turned up on a miserable afternoon to see the new man, who did not disappoint as he helped hold the Hatters defence together.

HATTERS RESERVES

The experienced Neil Harris doubled the advantage just after an hour before Michael Leary pulled a goal back with fourteen minutes to go. His thumping twenty-yard drive gave the Hatters hope but they weren't able to build on it and salvage a point.

"It was disappointing to lose," commented coach Brian Stein after the match. "But we had a lot of players on their way back from various injuries and it was important that they came through the game okay."

"Peter Holmes hasn't played since QPR, it was Stephen O'Leary first game for a few weeks and Lee Mansell hasn't played many times this season either. Russ Perrett and Ian Hillier at the back were also on their way back from injury."

"They all need to get games under their belt, none of them are anywhere near 100% yet but this how they will get their fitness. They will train during the week and then we'll see how they do in the matches."

"David Bayliss played against Peterborough reserves and he is running now with the first-team so I think he might be involved against Reading but we can't go into matches with five or six players on their way back from injury because we'll have no foundation to the team and it will be a lot to ask."

"I am not using the lack of match fitness as an excuse because that is why we brought the reserve team back and that is why it is important that we use these games to get them into a position where they can put pressure on the players in the first-team."

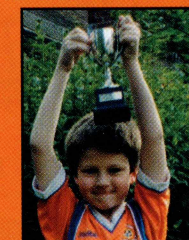

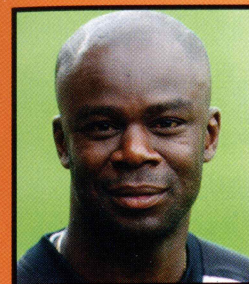

Stuart Richardson scored five minutes into the second half to give us the lead with his first ever goal for the Under-18's and we had further chances to build on that but West Brom finished the match strongly and scored with eight minutes left, once they got the goal it was all them for the rest of the match and we had to hold on.

We were disappointed that we weren't more than a goal up by then and we felt that we should have put the match beyond Albion. With them scoring late on in the game they gained the momentum and the strength to kick-on and in the end I was quite pleased to get a draw.

This morning we made the short trip to Rushden for our latest league fixture. We played Diamonds pre-season and we lost 2-1 but we were quite weakened on that occasion because the first-team had friendlies against Dunstable and Rugby on the same day and we fielded a side which consisted mainly of the schoolboys. Hopefully we will have put the record straight and got a bit of revenge for that this morning.

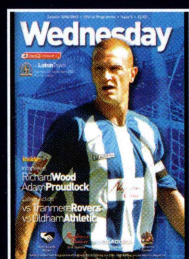

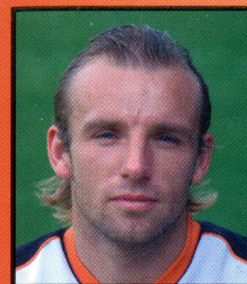

PAUL UNDERWOOD

THE last thing that Paul Underwood expected when he signed for Luton Town on deadline day last season was that he would have to wait over four months to make his full debut for the Hatters. He arrived from Rushden & Diamonds at the end of March but after twenty minutes of his first start against Queens Park Rangers he was forced off with a hamstring injury, which would rule him out for the remainder of the campaign.

"It was a fresh start for me when we reported back for pre-season training," stated the former Diamonds skipper. "I don't think you can count the start of my career here in minutes, so as far as I am concerned it began just after the summer against Oldham."

Keen to show the players and supporters of his new employers what he was capable of, he found the enforced spell in the treatment room difficult to take, especially so soon after he had signed. Underwood explained, "You earn respect by going out there and turning in performances, not by going in the changing room and cracking jokes so I was champing at the bit to get back."

"No-one likes pre-season training but I did find it a bit more enjoyable here because it wasn't monotonous. At some clubs you just do long distance running and you know what you'll be doing the next day but here it was a little bit different. After six years at Rushden I needed the change and I am really enjoying it."

"Obviously, I was delighted to score on the opening day of the season. I've got the goal on tape and the camera angle shows all the fans behind the goal celebrating - that was a special moment for me. It has been one of the highlights of my career to score on my debut for Luton Town, especially against my old boss."

"I know what Brian Talbot is like, he wanted to win the game but so did I and perhaps it was inevitable that I would come back to haunt him. It's one of those things that happen in football."

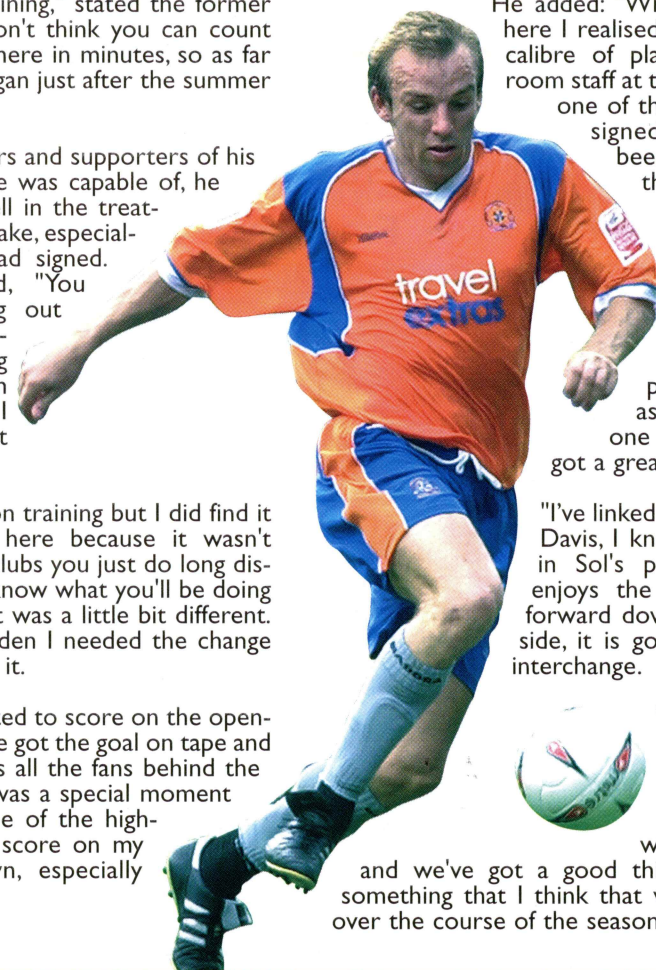
Having spurned the advances of a handful of clubs to sign for the Hatters, including Oldham, Underwood is sure he has made the right choice and the Town's early season form has justified his decision.

He added: "When I first came here I realised we had a good calibre of players and back-room staff at the club, that was one of the reasons that I signed, so I haven't been surprised by the start that we have had. It is just a case of getting out there and doing it on a regular basis, we had a good pre-season and as long as everyone stays fit we've got a great chance."

"I've linked up well with Sol Davis, I know how to play in Sol's position and he enjoys the chance to get forward down the left hand side, it is good that we can interchange."

"If Sol wants to push on, he knows that I will fill in for him. We get on well off the pitch

and we've got a good thing going on it, something that I think that we can build on over the course of the season."

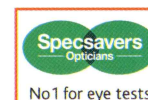


NEW COMMUNITY COACHING COURSE



LUTON TOWN BELLES

LAST MONDAY evening Kenilworth Road witnessed one of the most pulsating F.A. Cup ties seen in years when Town entertained London Premier outfit Brentford in an eleven-goal thriller.

Luton were first off the mark after nine minutes when the Bees goalkeeper cleared the ball as far as Kaylee Owen and she lifted the ball fully 40 yards over the stranded keeper to make it 1-0. Within a minute the scores were level when the Brentford striker shot into the roof of the net after her original shot had been saved. Minutes later Belles regained the lead when Michelle Byrne sprinted clear of the defence to slide the ball past the 'keeper from the edge of the area.

Again the away side responded, with a 25-yard free kick which made it 2-2 but Luton quickly regained the lead when the eagle eyed referee spotted a Brentford hand punch the ball clear from a corner and Stacey Connell stepped up to fire the ball home from the penalty spot.

Town's defensive frailties on the night were exposed when they conceded an equaliser within five minutes as the Bees just refused to lie down. The first-half action wasn't over yet though as one of the most open attacking matches fell back in Town's favour when Rhiannon Morgan's initial shot was saved but she netted from a narrow angle to give Luton a 4-3 half-time lead.

The second half plan was simple – stop conceding goals. Unfortunately that plan went out of the window within a minute though as Brentford equalised from another well taken free-kick into the bottom corner of the net.

Amazingly, the goals continued to flow as Fay Howell burst past three defenders before finish-

ing well from 15 yards. By 65 minutes Luton had not only conceded the lead for the fifth time in the match but had fell behind firstly to a very quickly taken free-kick and then to an individual goal as the Bees striker barged her way past two defenders to give them an incredible 6-5 lead. Belles then laid siege to the away team's goal but just could not find the vital finishing touch to take the game into extra-time.

On the plus side the tie was a real entertaining goal feast for the spectators but a real disappointment for Luton especially when we held the lead on no less than five occasions.

Perhaps the writing was on the wall from the previous weekend's last pre-season friendly when we took a two-goal lead against London Colney through two strikes from Fay Howell and then conceded two soft goals before fortunately winning the game 3-2 right at the death when Kim Hide touched in an 88th minute corner.

RESERVES

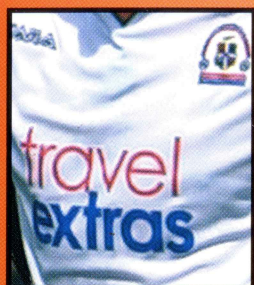

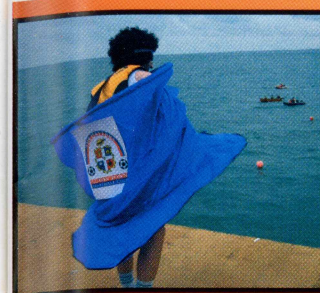

LUTON TOWN supporter Philip Beard entered 'The Birdman of Bognor' competition at the beginning of July. The object of the annual event is to see who can achieve the longest unaided flight from the top of Bognor Pier and having been brought up in the Luton area and being a keen Town supporter, he naturally chose to attempt this in a giant hat.

Phil decided to take part in the competition in order to raise money for the Multiple Sclerosis Society, a subject close to his heart as his mother is a sufferer. After successfully navigating the 37 foot drop into cold water, he was pleased to discover that he had managed to record a jump of 2.1 metres, spending 1.4 seconds airborne, but more importantly that he had raised in excess of £800 for such an important cause.

However after weeks of preparation and careful planning, it took him a while to convince himself to throw himself off the platform.

He explained: "I had second thoughts when I got to the top, I didn't really want to do it when I found out that there was a cross-wind of 18 knots because the organisers had said that they would postpone the event if it reached twenty knots; it was very windy at the top of the platform. I was very nervous and quite apprehensive, I didn't want to let anyone down and when I saw

my family and friends there I knew I had to do it. I just closed my eyes and walked off.

"Pretty much before I knew it I had hit the water but it was all worth it. We had a lot of fun doing it and in the end I raised a lot more money than I had originally hoped for.

"It was really good but looking back it was crazy, I was wearing a hat which was five and a half foot tall and about a one and a half meters in diameter. It didn't give me any leverage and I plummeted like a stone. There were about 75 competitors from all over the world and once I'd set the standard, I was disappointed not to finish last in the end - there were two people who managed to jump less than me."

The event formed part of Phil's stag weekend, but there was no keeping the bride to be away. The hardest part of the challenge had been to convince his fiancée that he should attempt this so close to the wedding. "She came along for the jump and went home shortly afterwards," commented Beard. "She just wanted to make sure that I landed safely and didn't break any bones, once she saw me back on land she was happy."

A Spireites victory looked very much on the cards at half-time as goals from highly-rated Frenchman Tcham N'Toya and debutant Aaron Downes gave them a 2-0 advantage. Milton Keynes showed real spirit in the second period and Izale McLeod pulled one back just after the hour and Wade Small levelled with two minutes left.

Port Vale climbed into third place with a 2-0 victory at Bradford City. Billy Paynter and Jeff Smith struck either side of the interval for The Valiants. Swindon also produced a shock result as Sam Parkin scored the only goal of the game over high-riding Colchester United.

Brentford went flying up the table as they continued their good start to the season following a 2-1 win over Bournemouth at Griffin Park. Hartlepool took advantage of the extra man and claimed a point when Adam Boyd pounced with 13 minutes left.

Bristol City made it two wins in succession as they won 1-0 at Peterborough. Curtis Woodhouse missed a first-half penalty and the Posh were made to pay as Leroy Lita struck the winner after 72 minutes.

Stockport County's poor start to the season continued as they slipped up to previously winless Torquay United. Martin Gritton bagged a brace, either side of a penalty miss from Stevie Wood.

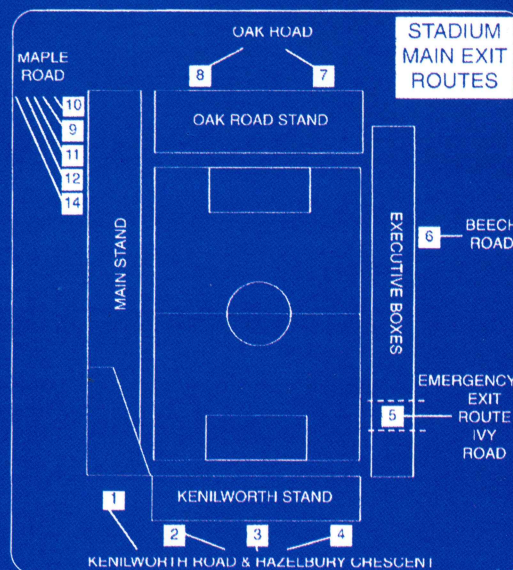

EVACUATION PROCEDURE

IN THE event of any emergency in the stadium, Luton Town FC and the emergency services have agreed on an evacuation procedure which is designed to ensure the safe and controlled evacuation of the crowd, and to ensure their safe dispersal from the area, to allow the emergency services to carry out their tasks.

In the event of evacuation from all or part of the stadium, you will receive instructions over the public address system on how you should leave. In an evacuation of the main stand you will be instructed to use the pitch. Stewards will direct you to the nearest exit. It may be that your normal exit route will not be available. On leaving the stadium, you will find some roads closed to pedestrians, to enable swift and unobstructed access for the emergency services. Please leave the area of the ground as quickly as possible, by the route directed. Your co-operation will be most appreciated.

HOW TO GET TO STOCKPORT COUNTY



By Road from The South (M6): Exit the M6 at Junction 19 (sign-posted 'Manchester Airport, Stockport A55, M56 East') and at the roundabout turn right onto the A556. At the Bowden roundabout after 4.2 miles, turn right (sign-posted 'Manchester M56') onto the M56 motorway. Exit the M56 motorway after 6.9 miles (sign-posted 'Stockport M60, Sheffield M67') onto the M60. Exit the M60 at Junction 1 (sign-posted 'Stockport Town Centre'). At the roundabout, follow signs to 'Cheadle A560' also 'Stockport County FC' into Hollywood Way. Go straight on at the first set of traffic lights and turn right at the next (sign-posted 'Cheadle A560, Stockport County FC') onto the A560 towards 'Ye Olde Woolpack' pub. After 1.1 miles, turn left (no signpost, by the 'Farmers Arms') onto the B5465 Edgeley Road. After approximately 1 mile turn right into Dale Street at the traffic lights and take the second left into Hardcastle Road for the stadium.

From the North (M62 from Leeds): Follow the M62 onto the M60 and continue south. Exit the M60 at Junction 1 (sign-posted 'Stockport Town Centre'). At the roundabout turn left following signs to 'Cheadle A560' into Hollywood Way. At the roundabout, follow signs to 'Cheadle A560' also 'Stockport County FC' into Hollywood Way. Go straight on at the first set of traffic lights and turn right at the next (sign-posted 'Cheadle A560, Stockport County FC') onto the A560 towards 'Ye Olde Woolpack' pub. After 1.1 miles, turn left (no signpost, by the 'Farmers Arms') onto the B5465 Edgeley Road. After approximately 1 mile turn right

into Dale Street at the traffic lights and take the second left into Hardcastle Road for the stadium.

From South & East (A6/A523 over Peak District): Follow the A6 towards Stockport/Manchester. Continue along A6 until reaching major traffic lights at Hazel Grove alongside the 'Rising Sun' pub. Follow signs for Stockport Town Centre along the A6 for approximately 2.8 miles, until reaching the traffic lights by 'The Nelson Tavern' and the Town Hall. Turn left (sign-posted 'Cheadle, Stockport County FC') into Greek Street. At the roundabout after 0.3 miles take the second exit (sign-posted 'Cheadle A5465') onto Mercian Way. Take the second left turning into Caroline Street for the stadium.

Car Parking: The official car park is for permit holders only and street parking is mainly restricted to residents. Two large public car parks are situated at each end of the Castle Street Shopping Precinct, a couple of minutes walk from the stadium.

By Rail: Stockport Station, a five-minute walk from Edgeley Park, has good connections throughout the country. Supporters travelling to Stockport by train should turn left on the station concourse (not right towards the ticket office). Proceed up the hill, turn left and then take the third road (Mercian Way) off the roundabout. Edgeley Park is situated on the left.

By Coach with Town on Tour: Leaving Maple Road at 10:00am (the coach will make a stop at Milton Keynes Coachway about 30 minutes later). The fare for LTSC members is £16, £14 for junior and senior members and £18 for non-members. To book seats visit the supporters kiosk at the top of Kenilworth Road or phone the Town on Tour mobile 07960 567465. You can also book online by visiting the Fans section of www.lutontown.co.uk

By Coach with Bobbers Travel: Departs from Cranfield at 8.30am and Luton at 9.30am. Costs are £15.50 for Adults and £13 for Under-16's and OAP's. Please ring 01234 750996 for further information and to book your place.

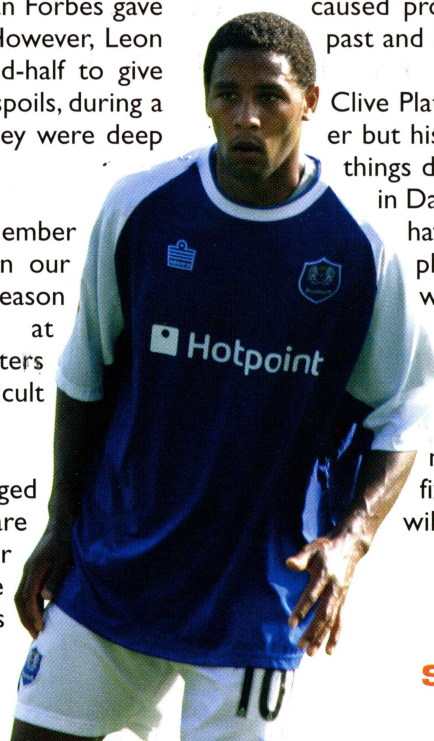
Luton will certainly be encouraged by the fact that Peterborough are renowned strugglers on their travels and have only won once on the road in their previous eight games.
