





THE CHAIRMAN

A WARM welcome to all our supporters for today's game and our visitors Peterborough United, their Directors, management, players and supporters. A special welcome to Posh's owner and Manager Barry Fry, I have known Barry for many years and I am sure some of our fans will recall the 1965/66 season when Barry played for the Hatters.

Our incredible start to the season continued away to Stockport County, demonstrating the ambition of our players and the soundness of the strategy of the Football Management. The Directors, will continue to help maintain this impetus, and part of that is welcoming back Gary McSheffrey to the club.

Success can at times be a two-edged sword, as it gives our players and the club a higher profile that inevitably brings the attention of our players to other clubs. You only have to look at our Directors Box on match day to see the serious interest we are receiving from clubs at all levels, the downside is that interest can be very distracting. However, it is all part of professional football and like all problems they are there to be managed, how you manage the problem is the key.

On Wednesday, I attended the Football League's quarterly meeting represented by all of the seventy-two League clubs. Whilst several important matters were raised, the significant issue for all of us there was the announcement by the Chairman, Sir Brian Mawhinney,

that the Football League is taking legal action against its former legal advisers in connection with the disastrous consequences of the ITV Digital collapse in March 2002, owing the League £178 million for the remaining two seasons of its contract, an action that was supported in general by all the clubs.

At one minute to kick-off our thoughts will be directed to the sad news of the passing of Brian Clough, who will be remembered throughout football.

We continue to make progress on the Club's relocation to the Junction 10a site, the major matters regarding the traffic management and the electricity pylons, and the complexity of the other infrastructure requirements, are moving along satisfactory.

The next two weeks are important so that final contracts can be signed at the right time, on the back of existing heads of agreement between the Club, the Developer, and the land owner, Stockwood Park Holdings Limited.

Enjoy the day and as always continue to give your fantastic vocal support to the team.








THE MANAGER

GOOD AFTERNOON and welcome to today's match. I was privileged last week to be invited along with other management staff and players to the opening of the Nuclear Unit and Childrens Out Patient Department at the Luton and Dunstable Hospital. It was quite outstanding how much voluntary work had been carried out to make the new superb facilities available.



On Wednesday, the Chairman and I attended a meeting of the Football League and one item of particular interest was the continuing dialogue regarding transfer windows. Supporters will be aware that the Football League was given dispensation by FIFA to continue the internal transfer agreement for season 2004/05, but that we must become fully compliant to transfer windows for 2005/06.

Until now the Premier League had been fully supportive of the Football League's stance, so it was disappointing to be advised that this support has now been withdrawn. The Chairman of the Football

League, Sir Brian Mawhinney and Director of Operations, Andy Williamson will be going to Brussels in the very near future to put forward again the case for the Football League to FIFA.

We also received a presentation from the League's Commercial Department, who are actively involved in some exciting commercial partnerships, details of which will be announced shortly.

It was with sadness that we learnt of the passing of Brian Clough this week and as a mark of respect we will be holding a one minute's silence in his memory before the match this afternoon.

Today, we have a bucket collection on behalf of the Royal National Lifeboat Institution and I am sure, as before, supporters will give generously to this very important organisation. The lifeboat men and women are all volunteers and go to the aid of many sailors in distress around our coasts in all weathers.

Finally, just a reminder that the game with Hartlepool will now be played on Friday 8th October, with a 7.45pm kick-off, due to the England match on Saturday 9th October and the game at MK Dons on 20th November now has a 12.30pm kick-off at the request of the home side.







TODAY'S OPPONENTS



MANAGER - BARRY FRY

NOW starting his ninth season in the London Road hot seat, Barry Fry is the longest serving manager in Peterborough United's 41-year history as a Football League club. One of football's most flamboyant and animated characters, prior to his arrival in the Peterborough hot-seat he has managed at Hillingdon Borough, Barnet (twice), Maidstone, Southend United and Birmingham City.

Barry's own football career started in 1960 when he was signed by Manchester United, following a glittering run as a schoolboy international that included scoring for England against Scotland in front of a full house at Wembley. After four years at Old Trafford, without making it into the senior squad, spells followed with Bolton Wanderers, the Hatters and Leyton Orient before he dropped into non-league soccer with Gravesend and Northfleet. Following a brief return to Leyton Orient, Barry played for several non-league clubs including Romford, Bedford Town, Stevenage Borough and neighbours Dunstable Town, where he gained his first managerial experience and led them to promotion in his debut campaign as player-manager.



GOALKEEPERS

LUKE MCSHANE

Peterborough-born goalkeeper who won the Under-17 player of the season for his outstanding performances in both the Youth Alliance League and the FA Youth Cup run. The highly-rated shot-stopper was tracked by Premiership giants Chelsea during last season and signed a professional two-year contract towards the end of the 2002/03 campaign.

MARK TYLER



The fan's favourite is one of the reasons why Posh had such a good away record last-term as the club conceded one of the fewest amount of goals on the road. Rated by many as one of the best goalkeepers outside of the Premier League, he was rewarded by his fellow professionals with selection into the PFA Division Two team of the year a few seasons back.

DEFENDERS

SAGI BURTON

Powerful defender who was signed on a one-year contract from Crewe Alexandra. The versatile performer settled quickly at London Road with a string of impressive performances and he was a tower of strength alongside Simon Rea and Mark Arber in the Posh defence. A strong centre-back, the former Port Vale defender became an international during the summer when he was called up by St. Kitts and Nevis - an honour that should be repeated throughout this season as the Caribbean side try and qualify for the World Cup.

AHMED DEEN

Teenage defender who signed a one-year contract at London Road after a successful trial during the summer of 2004. Deen was released from Leicester City after his contract came to an end last season and the left-sided defender will provide cover for Peter Kennedy.

CRAIG IRELAND

Vastly experienced defender who manager Barry Fry signed from Barnsley after the centre-back's contract came to an end at Oakwell. Commanding in the air and comfortable with the ball at his feet, Ireland will prove a good acquisition at London Road.



GARETH JELLEYMAN


Welsh Under-21 international, who failed to keep a regular starting place last season after Tom Williams joined the club on-loan. The skillful defender loves to get forward and the highlight of his career so far was winning the 'Man of the Match' award at the 1999/2000 Wembley Play-off final. Spent a loan spell at Boston United at the start of this season.

STEVE JENKINS

Welsh international defender who made the move to Posh from Notts County in the New Year. Jenkins penned an 18-month deal at London Road after his month-to-month contract at County ended. A former Swansea City and Huddersfield Town player, he can play at right-back or across the back four. An experienced campaigner, he only made six starts last season and will be hoping for a good run in the team this time around.

CHRISTOPHER KANU

The brother of the former Arsenal striker Kwankwo signed for Posh from Alavas in the Spanish League. The exciting full-back has settled in at the club after appearing in several pre-season friendly matches, but was dis-

pointed with his form last term. Will be hoping to show his true colours this time and around to repay the faith shown in him by manager Barry Fry.

PETER KENNEDY



Northern Ireland international signed during pre-season from Wigan Athletic. The left-sided player has made 18 appearances for his country and brings plenty of experience to London Road. A former Watford defender, Kennedy scored his first Posh goal in the 2-2 draw at Bradford City.

ANDY LEGG

Experienced Welshman who joined Peterborough United in the summer of 2003 as player-coach after helping Cardiff City to promotion from Division Two. The long-throw expert is a keen fitness fanatic and has kept himself in good shape. Signed a two-year deal in June 2004 to extend his stay at London Road.

CHRIS PLUMMER

Defender who recently made the move to London Road from Barnet, signing a two-year deal in September 2004. The former Queens Park Rangers centre-back has settled quickly into life at Posh and has looked commanding in the air as well as talented on the deck.

MIDFIELDERS

ANDRE BOUCAUD

Talented young midfielder who was signed on a free-transfer from Reading during the close season. Boucaud spent some time on loan at London Road last season, scoring a memorable

goal at Brentford in a 3-0 win. Very skilful on the ball, he will give an extra dimension to the Posh midfield.

DAVID FARRELL

The flying winger scored eight goals during the 2001/02 season including a fine strike against Premiership Newcastle United in front of the Sky TV cameras in the FA Cup. The midfielder played as a supporting striker last-term and still remains a fans' favourite with some dazzling displays - earning him joint second place in the Supporters Club Away Travel Award.

ADAM NEWTON

The St. Kitts and Nevis international was signed by Barry Fry in May 2002 from Premiership West Ham United. The winger put pen-to-paper on a three-year contract and followed in the footsteps of Tom Williams and Jimmy Bullard who moved to Peterborough United from Upton Park. The former England Under-21 international was one of the most improved players at London Road last season with some fantastic displays from right-wing back.

STEVEN THOMSON

Scottish-born midfielder who agreed a move from Crystal Palace to Posh. A box-to-box player, Thomson spent nine years at Selhurst Park, scoring one league goal in over 100 appearances. The 25-year-old scored a memorable goal from 40-yards against Swindon Town last season - a goal voted the best of the campaign by Posh World viewers.

CURTIS WOODHOUSE

Energetic midfielder who signed a three-year deal at Peterborough United after a long-winded transfer from Birmingham City. The former England Under-21 star was once a £1 million pound player after moving to the Blues from Sheffield United. An uncertain few months in the summer has been forgotten as he looks forward to giving 100% for Posh.

STRIKERS

ANDY CLARKE

Will always be remembered as the man who scored the winning goal in Peterborough United's 1-0 Wembley victory over Darlington in the 1999/2000 Division Three Play-off final. The veteran striker made it into double figures last-term and signed an extension to his contract during the close season.

LEON CONSTANTINE

Striker who was snapped up by manager Barry Fry on a free transfer from Southend United after the former Brentford front man bagged 26 goals for the Shrimpers last season. Leon is a scorer of great goals as well as simple ones and his height will also be a big advantage to the London Road management as they have more options in attack.


CLIVE PLATT

Giant striker, who made the move to Peterborough United in January 2004 after his month-to-month contract at Notts County came to an end. The former Rochdale front man started his career at Walsall after coming through the ranks. Scored just two goals in 17 league starts last-term, but his hold-up play was a big plus for Posh.



CALUM WILLOCK

Young striker signed from Premiership outfit Fulham and the quick front man made his debut against Torquay in the LDV Van clash last season. Willock is exceptionally quick and scored seven league goals for Posh last year, including a vitally important goal in the 4-1 win at Blackpool in the final away match. Another member of the Posh squad who has also appeared for St. Kitts and Nevis at international level.



CLUB CAPTAIN


IT WAS another tough match for us against Chesterfield, they came to spoil the party and get something out of the game but we created a lot of chances and Rowan Vine took his goal very well. You have got to give them credit because, like Bournemouth, they came to do a job and nearly did it but thankfully for us we got the result.

We would like to be more comfortable at home but if teams are going to play like that and we can only beat them by the odd goal, we will still get three points for a win. The games at Kenilworth Road have been tight and sometimes it is more enjoyable to play away from home because teams will come at us and that means we can hit them on the counter attack and get in behind them.

On Saturday that proved to be the case, Stockport brought the game to us for the first twenty minutes and put us under a bit of pressure, which we expect teams to do because they all want to be the first to beat us. We came through that, stayed strong and got two quick goals.

Robbo took his goal really well after a great little knock down from Howie and then Viney got on the end of a ball from Kevin Foley and it was a great finish from him, he is looking really lively at the moment. The third goal came from another knock down from the big man - he might not have scored for a couple of games but he is working really hard for the team - and Ahmet Brkovic finished it with a clever little header.

Stockport's goal was a great free-kick, it was just disappointing that we did not keep a clean sheet



because of how well we had played and how commanding we had been. We felt that there were more goals there for us but you cannot really argue with 3-1 away from home and we have now won four out of the five games we have played on our travels this season. We have got to keep going, we are unbeaten and seven points clear. I feel that we have sent a message out to the clubs with what we have done so far, there are only five teams who are within ten points of us going into this afternoon's match.

It is very good to see Gary McSheffrey again, we all know what he is capable of and with Enoch chomping at the bit to get back in as well, we have two players who scored goals last season looking to force their way into the side. There is plenty of competition for places across the field and all the pros who have had injuries are back and they are looking fit and sharp in training. We know that if we have injuries and suspensions, which we will do, we have the players who can come in and do a job.

Everyone is fit and wants to be part of it and they will be over the course of the season. It is hard for the players who are not in the team at the moment but everyone will have a contribution to make to our season at some point.

We are expecting a big physical battle in today's game with Peterborough United. They will be a threat from set plays and long throws but if we play as we have been and as we are capable of, then I cannot see us going far wrong.







"We expected more from them in the matches against Millwall and Peterborough. On paper we fielded good sides but when it came to it we weren't able to compete. In the games against Reading and Portsmouth they have been up against good, experienced players, playing in nice stadiums and that gives all the players a lift.

"First and foremost, you have to be able to compete and it's only been in the last couple of

matches where we have done that and we've played two very good teams. We have gone there with the right attitude and that has shown in the results.

"We achieved a good win at Reading and we went to Portsmouth and started ever so well and we came away disappointed not to have won the game."

MARLON BERESFORD

ELEVEN months ago to the day, Marlon Beresford made his Luton Town debut against Peterborough United in a 1-1 draw after he had signed from Bradford City. Since then the Lincoln-born goalkeeper has gone on to establish himself as something of a talisman figure for the Hatters.

In twenty games he has only been on the losing side once in the league, against Barnsley, back in December 2003 when Anthony Kay's 90th minute strike proved to be the difference between the two sides at Kenilworth Road. It was the Hatters first defeat on home soil in over four months at the time and although Beresford was soon to swap Bedfordshire for the visitors that day, early in the New Year, he returned in the summer and he has carried on where he left off, playing his part in Town's remarkable run of form.

"When you look back at the start we have made to the season it has been incredible," commented the 35-year-old. "But we haven't got time to dwell on it, we have to keep pressing on and looking forward to the next game and doing as best we can.

"You cannot rest on your laurels, you have to keep pushing on and trying to improve. There are still parts of our game that we can improve on as a team. The spirit in the club has been fantastic, that was something I noticed last season more than anything.

"I have never had a start like it where we have won eight out of nine games at any of my previous clubs.


"We did expect to do well, I said when I signed that if we aren't in the top six we have under-achieved this season. I've always felt that the belief has been here, within the club and the young lads coming through are establishing themselves and they have got the belief as well."

The Hatters number one is also relishing the additional responsibility of coaching the club's goalkeepers.

"It is a new challenge for me, although I am doing the coaching, I also have to prepare myself how I want, in regards to playing on Saturday.

"I completed some courses years ago when I was at Sheffield Wednesday and did a little bit of coaching when I was at York but not a great deal. This is the first time I've been able to work with a group of goalkeepers on a regular basis but the coaching is something I will look to do in the future."






Claire Howe scores for U12's in their match at Hemel Hempstead Town

FOR the majority of the 7,532 who witnessed the Hatters recent 1-0 win over Chesterfield, the final whistle marked the extension of the Town's lead at the top of the table but to one loyal supporter it signalled the end of an era.

Martin Lord, a Luton Town fan since he was eleven had just witnessed his last win at Kenilworth Road – for the time being – after deciding to emigrate with his family to Melbourne, Australia.

It all began for Martin back at the end of March 1974 as he explains: "My grandfather and two great uncles took me to my first home game against Middlesbrough at the end of the promotion season. Although we lost 1-0, I was hooked and since then it has been a thirty year plus love affair through all the ups and downs of any normal relationship."

Having watched the Hatters in 58 different league grounds over three decades, what moments have stood out for him?

"My favourite goal was a 35-yard screamer scored by Frankie Bunn at Filbert Street on 31st August 1983. This sticks out even more than Tony Thorpe's F.A. Cup debut goal at St.James' Park and, of course, Matthew Spring's belter against Watford a couple of seasons ago."

"The trip to the Baseball Ground with Jim Ryan's team when we had to win and Sheffield Wednesday had to lose for us to stay up. I was standing next to my brother when we scored in the first minute – we got separated and didn't see each other until after the final whistle. Wembley 1988 of course, I was standing behind Ashley Grimes when he dinked the ball over for Brian Stein to put the winner in and Monday 5th October 2003, when my son Elliot was commercial mascot in the televised 3-1 win at home to Tranmere Rovers. This was my 40th birthday present from my wife – I still watch the tape now."

Having travelled to home games from various locations that he has lived in, throughout the UK, including Whitstable, Norwich, Spalding, Northampton, Lampeter in Wales, the Isle of Wight and Cranfield, sadly he admits that Melbourne will be one step too far.

"I will miss the buzz of Luton Town Football Club and everything that goes with it," explains Lord. "The smell of old tobacco in the wooden main stand, the atmosphere in the Bedfordshire Yeoman on match days, the rush of adrenalin when we score and the post-mortem conversations with Elliot as we drive home."

His new life in Australia began on Wednesday and he left the country knowing he would land the other side of the world with his beloved Hatters top of the league and "well placed for the type of season which Mike, Mick, Brian and all of the staff at the club deserve – a successful one." So the future now for Martin will see Saturday afternoons occupied without a ball in sight and his support will be restricted to following the Town on the internet and doing his utmost to spread the word Down Under.

A first-half goal from Mark Hudson maintained Chesterfield's unbeaten record on their own soil this season as the Spireites' beat Walsall to move into third. Tranmere Rovers came from a goal down to earn a 1-1 draw with Wrexham in an ill-tempered early kick-off at Prenton Park. Both sides finished with ten men after the Red Dragon's Chris Armstrong and Tranmere's Michael Jackson were both sent off for violent conduct while Wrexham boss Denis Smith was also sent from the dugout by referee Andre Marriner.

John Salako's first-half penalty gave Brentford a 1-0 win over Port Vale at Griffin Park and Milton Keynes Dons recorded their first away win of the season with a 1-0 success at Colchester United. Hartlepool United thrashed struggling Torquay United 4-1 at

Victoria Park as Joel Porter, Antony Sweeney, Mark Tinkler and Richie Humphreys got the goals for Neale Cooper's side, with Martin Gritton's first-half strike the only reply for the hapless Gulls.

Doncaster Rovers earned a 1-1 draw with Oldham Athletic at Belle Vue. Jamaican international Jermaine Johnson gave the visitors the lead six minutes before the break, but a Michael McIndoe penalty on the stroke of half-time meant the points were shared. Barnsley took the honours in their Yorkshire derby with Huddersfield Town after a 2-0 win at the Galpharm Stadium. Barry Conlon and an own goal from David Mirfin did the damage for Paul Hart's side and to compound the Terriers misery, Efe Sodje was sent off in the dying minutes.

Bristol City were brought crashing down to earth by a 4-1 thrashing at the hands of Bradford City at Valley Parade. Goals from Steven Schumacher, new loan signing Neil Roberts, David Wetherall and Dele Adebola gave the Bantams a comfortable win over their West Country opponents. Scott Murray scored a late consolation for the Robins, as their early season struggles continue.



IN THE event of any emergency in the stadium, Luton Town FC and the emergency services have agreed on an evacuation procedure which is designed to ensure the safe and controlled evacuation of the crowd, and to ensure their safe dispersal from the area, to allow the emergency services to carry out their tasks.

In the event of evacuation from all or part of the stadium, you will receive instructions over the public address system on how you should leave. In an evacuation of the main stand you will be instructed to use the pitch. Stewards will direct you to the nearest exit. It may be that your normal exit route will not be available. On leaving the stadium, you will find some roads closed to pedestrians, to enable swift and unobstructed access for the emergency services. Please leave the area of the ground as quickly as possible, by the route directed. Your co-operation will be most appreciated.

HOW TO GET TO SWANSEA CITY



By Road: Take Junction 42 off the M4, following signs for Swansea City Centre and Cork Ferry Terminal. Proceed along Mumbles Road, passing the Leisure Centre on your left hand side, Tesco Supermarket on your right hand side. The ground is situated directly behind the Prison, which is approximately 100 yards from Tesco store.

By Rail: Swansea High Street Railway Station is on the mainline route from Paddington Station, London. The railway station is approximately ten minutes walk from the football ground. Head towards the City Centre, and in a west direction towards the Mumbles.

By Bus: The Quadrant Bus & Coach Station is within view of the Vetch Field, and approximately three minutes walk from the ground. The Bus Station provides links to local, and national routes from Swansea.

Parking: There is a matchday car park in the County Hall (opposite the prison on matchdays), but there is also a lot of street parking available behind the West Stand (away section). Alongside the Quadrant Bus Station there is also two multi-storey Car Parks.

By Coach with Town on Tour: Please note that Town on Tour are not providing a coach facility to Swansea.

By Coach with Bobbers Travel: Departs from Cranfield at 12.30pm and Luton at 1.30pm. Costs are £18 for Adults and £14.50 for Under-16's and OAP's. Please ring 01234 750996 for further information and to book your place.

HOW TO GET TO TRANMERE ROVERS



By Road from the North: From Liverpool city centre, travel through Queensway Mersey Tunnel (signposted Birkenhead) and after the toll booths, bear right onto the flyover. There is a £1.20 car fee for tunnel use. The ground is signposted from here. Continue along Borough Road for 3m and the ground appears directly in front of you.

By Road from the South/East: M6, M56 and M53 to J4. Take the fourth exit from the roundabout onto the B5151 Mount Road. Continue for 2.5m when Mount Road becomes Storoton Road and turn right into Prenton Road West. The ground is on your right.

By Bus: Merseytravel (0151 236 7676). From Liverpool Queens Square Bus Station, catch cross-river services 417, 418, 441, 472 (Singleton Avenue), 464 (Prenton Park) or 488 (Mount Road). From Birkenhead Bus Station, catch the 3, 3A, 33B, 41C, 41D, 71, 72 (Singleton Avenue) or 42, 177, 464 (Prenton Park). All National Express Birkenhead services call at Birkenhead Bus Station

Parking: There is parking at the ground but you must arrive early as there are limited spaces available. Beware of a residents parking scheme which is in operation in the immediate area around the ground. For street parking, head away from the ground up Prenton Road East. Turn right at the junction (Sportsmans is on your right) and take the second exit off the roundabout into Bebington Road. Parking is available on the left or on the side-streets off to the right.

By Coach with Town on Tour: Leaving Maple Road at 10:00am (the coach will make a stop at Milton Keynes Coachway about 30 minutes later). The fare for LTSC members is £17, £15 for junior and senior members, and £19 for non-members. To book seats visit the supporters kiosk at the top of Kenilworth Road or phone the Town on Tour mobile 07960 567465. You can also book online by visiting the Fans section of www.lutontown.co.uk

By Coach with Bobbers Travel: Departs from Cranfield at 8.30am and Luton at 9.30am. Costs are £15.50 for Adults and £13 for Under-16's and OAP's. Please ring 01234 750996 for further information and to book your place.




STRIKER Gary McSheffrey returned to the Kenilworth Stadium on the eve of Luton's trip to Stockport on a one-month loan deal from Championship side Coventry City.

The 22-year-old enjoyed a productive three-month spell with the Hatters last season when he netted nine times in nineteen appearances and quickly established himself as a popular figure amongst supporters and team-mates alike.

"I spoke to Peter Reid on the Thursday and he said that he was prepared to let me out on loan to get some games because I wasn't in the team at Coventry," explained the man that Hatters fans dubbed 'The Sheff'. "There were a few clubs which expressed an interest but once I heard about Luton I had pretty much made my mind up where I would like to go.

"I thought it would be nice to come back because Luton are a side that play good football and apart from people like Matt Spring and Emmerson Boyce, who left in the summer, it is a very similar squad to when I was here last season, with a couple of players added to it. I knew it would be easy to come back and settle in with them again.

"I have kept an eye on Luton's results every week since I left and I was disappointed that they didn't make the play-offs last season, they had a spell towards the end of the season when they might have picked up a couple of results and that would have made all the difference.



"Hopefully this season will be a better one, I know what the players here are capable of and I haven't been surprised by the start that has been made because we are capable of beating anyone in this division. I suppose most people would think that for a club to still be unbeaten after eight matches, with seven wins, is most unlikely but the players here have done that."

Following his stint with the Town last season, McSheffrey returned to the Sky Blues and carried on where he left off at Luton, forcing his way into Coventry's starting line-up for their F.A. Cup match against today's opponents Peterborough. The former England Under-20 international curled home a 20-yard free-kick after an hour to open the scoring and never looked back for the rest of the campaign.

He added a further eleven goals in 21 appearances to give him a respectable record of a goal every two games last season, something that he is keen to maintain this year but his first target is to give Mike Newell plenty to think about over the next month.

"I haven't come here to sit on the bench and the manager knows that," stated a determined McSheffrey.

"I am up for the challenge of forcing my way in to the starting line-up because I believe I can add something to the team. The players have done well and I hope that I can come in and play my part in keeping the run going."



