




The hard work and the hours spent with the kids over the years often goes unnoticed and unrewarded, not by us though.





CLUB STATEMENT

INCREASED DEMAND LEADS TO MORE SEATS FOR HOME FANS

With the Club's continuing success on the pitch all home areas were sold out for last Friday's fixture with Hartlepool United. The Safety Advisory Group required us to sell out of all home areas by the Tuesday prior to the match, this would enable us to make application for the use of the un-occupied seating for home fans in the Oak Stand. Unfortunately, this restriction left some fans unable to attend the match because we did not sell out our home seating until 7.00 p.m. on the evening of the game. This was extremely frustrating for everyone as we had empty seats in the Oak Stand.

To try and alleviate this problem I contacted the Local Authority Safety Advisory Group and Peter Palmer, the Bedfordshire Police Football Liaison Officer and discussed the possibility of changing the present selling arrangements. They were very receptive to our request and accepted the proposals that we put forward.

Therefore a meeting of all parties involved took place, where it was agreed that once we have sold out of all the existing home seats, we will be allowed to sell up to 600 unreserved seats in the Oak Stand to home supporters, for certain games. The Tuesday cut-off date will be removed, and the Club will put in place procedures to cater for this beneficial change to enable a decision regarding the Oak Stand to be made much closer to the match.

Access to the home section of the Oak Stand will be by ticket only, which must be purchased from the ticket office. Prices are £17.50 for Adults and £10.50 for Concessions.

The Safety Advisory group have agreed this new arrangement is on a trial basis and it will be up to us as a club and you, as supporters, to ensure that it works well, so that we can continue to offer this facility throughout the season.

The first match this new scheme will apply for is Bradford City on Saturday 30th October, followed by Wrexham on Saturday 6th November and Port Vale on Saturday 11th December.

Now is the time to encourage friends and family to come along and support the Club and ensure that we fill all the seats now available to us.

MANAGER

PETER JACKSON



BRADFORD-BORN
Peter Jackson is in his second spell in charge of Huddersfield Town, having previously managed the Terriers between October 1997 and May 1999.

As a player, he started his career with his hometown club as an apprentice in 1978. He made in excess of 300 appearances for the Bantams before he made the switch to Newcastle United, following a couple of seasons at St. James Park he returned to Bradford in 1988. After the centre-back's second spell at Valley Parade, where he stayed for another two seasons, he arrived at Huddersfield Town.

His leadership qualities were soon recognised, taking over the captain's armband and after a three-year stint with the Terriers he finished his playing career at Chester City. A return to Huddersfield saw him take up his first managerial role and he led them to First Division safety in his first year in charge, followed up by a top ten position the season after however he was dismissed in May 1999 and since then - over a four year period - Steve Bruce, Lou Macari, Mick Wadsworth and Mel Machin have had spells in the hot seat prior to the return of the popular 43-year-old in the summer of 2003.

GOALKEEPERS

IAN GRAY

Experienced goalkeeper who became Town's third close-season capture in 2003/04. He was signed in the summer from Rotherham after been kept out of the starting line-up by the form of Mike Pollitt. Gray had been Town's regular first-team keeper until sustaining a hand injury in the game at Accrington Stanley. He has trained well pre-season and is expected to make a full recovery and reclaim the number one shirt.

PHIL SENIOR

Following an injury to first choice keeper Ian Gray, Phil became our regular first-team keeper. He came through the Academy system and was a pupil at Lilleshall, after which he represented England at youth level. Although only 5 foot 11 inches, he makes up for his lack of stature with his exceptional agility.

DEFENDERS

NATHAN CLARKE

A teenage centre-half who signed professional forms in September 2001 after impressing in the Academy ranks. Nathan was plunged into first-team action in the 2001/02 season and made an instant impact and established himself in the first-team. Missing most of last season through injury he made a return this season and quickly established himself in the first-team. Unfortunately, he sustained an ankle injury in March 2004 that kept him out for the rest of the season, but he is now on the road to recovery having featured in Town's pre-season campaign.


DAVID MIRFIN

Graduated from the Academy last season and made an immediate impression. Drafted in as cover for Nathan Clarke, the centre-back performed magnificently alongside the experienced pair of Sodje and Yates. As well as staunch defending, the 19-year-old maybe best remembered for his last gasp goal against York City when he played up front.

ROB EDWARDS

Returned to the McAlpine in July 2003 after being released from Chesterfield. He cost Town £150,000 the first time he joined the club from Crewe in 1996, where he had come through Dario Gradi's renowned youth system. He originally signed him as a goalscoring midfielder, playing 160 matches and scoring 17 goals. He was transferred to Chesterfield for a knock down £20,000 in September 2000, where he played 109 times scoring 7 goals. He scored the winner in the play-off semi-final to send Town to Cardiff last year.

STEVE YATES



The experienced versatile defender arrived from Sheffield United after a successful trial period. The ex-Tranmere player appeared in the League Cup final with the Merseysiders. His other previous clubs have included Bristol Rovers and QPR. He was Town's 'Mr Consistency' last season with impressive displays at centre-back.

EFE SODJE

The bandanna wearing Nigerian, who starred for his country in the last World Cup, was signed from Crewe Alexandra during the close season, where he played over 100 games. His previous clubs have included Macclesfield, Colchester and of course the Hatters. He made a big impression on the side after his debut against Derby County and became an immediate terrace favourite. Captained the side to the play-off victory in Cardiff.

ANTHONY LLOYD

Has been at the club since the age of 10, having progressed through the Terriers Academy system, he earned himself a professional contract this summer. Was a regular in our reserve team

last season, he made his first-team debut at home to Leyton Orient and scored his first senior goal in the home game against Boston United. He has now secured his place on the left of Town's defence.

JOHN McCOMBE

Another player to graduate from the Academy, the teenager is in his first-year as a professional having earned a contract with the Club in June. He is a tall, uncompromising defender and will be a valued addition to the squad.

MIDFIELDERS

TONY CARSS

Joined the club during the 2003/04 close season from Oldham Athletic. He was a former Blackburn Rovers trainee with his other clubs include Darlington, Cardiff, Chesterfield and Carlisle. He was a regular in the first-team last season, scoring an unforgettable goal at home against Torquay United.

JONATHAN WORTHINGTON



Arrived at the Club during the 2003/04 pre-A gritty midfielder who has been a regular member of the first-team squad. His workman like, professional performances in the centre of the park earned him the Player of the Season award in Town's promotion winning season.

DANNY SCHOFIELD

Arrived in the summer of 1998 from non-league club Brodsworth Town. He can operate on either flank or is equally effective as a striker and has an eye for spectacular goals. He was a regular member of the first-team squad last term, making the greatest numbers of appearances.

ADNAN AHMED

Began his footballing career with Bury before earning a dream move to Manchester United. He left Old Trafford after two years to sign a three-year scholarship with Town. Adnan worked hard last season to earn himself a professional contract. He made his first-team debut coming on as a substitute at the away game at Swansea in 2003.

LEE FOWLER

Signed a two-and-a-half year contract early last season after impressing during his three-month loan spell from Coventry. The young midfielder spent a month at hometown club, Cardiff City last season, and was also selected to play for Wales Under-21 side. Lee underwent hernia surgery last term and is well on the way to making a full recovery.

ANDREW HOLDSWORTH

Earned himself a professional contract last summer having developed through the Academy ranks. He made his first-team debut coming on as a substitute against Bristol Rovers at the McAlpine and scored his first senior goal in the Carling Cup game at Sunderland. He has now established himself in the first-team squad and

has a bright future in the game.

CHRIS BRANDON

Was one of two signings made by the Town boss during the close season, arriving from Chesterfield. A tricky midfielder, the 28-year-old has a keen eye for goal and his creative flair mixed with his combative style will make him a valued addition to the squad.

JOE WALSH

Along with John McCombe, Walsh graduated from the Academy ranks during the close-season. He is a combative and creative midfielder who enjoys playing in the middle of the park.

STRIKERS

ANDY BOOTH



Re-joined the club on transfer deadline day 2001 after a five-year stint at Sheffield Wednesday and following a loan spell at Spurs. Andy began his career as a trainee with Town and quickly established himself in the first-team. He made over 150 appearances for his hometown team, before earning a £2.7million move into the Premiership with Sheffield Wednesday. He quickly adapted to life in the top flight and earned rave reviews in his first season with Wednesday. Andy is a fan's favourite and has been a regular member of the first-team squad.

JOHN McALISKEY

Young striker who emerged through Town's Academy ranks, 'Macca' established himself as a first-team regular late on last season. Having bagged his first senior goal after coming on as a substitute against Macclesfield, he was rewarded with his first start against Scunthorpe United and the 19-year-old went on to score the equalising and winning goals in the 87th and 90th min-

utes. Already highlighted as one of Town's emerging young stars, comparisons with Jon Stead have already been made.

NAT BROWN

Began his career as a trainee with Town as a striker however past management changed Nat's position to that of a central defender where he featured during last season. Since Peter Jackson's return to the club, Nat has reverted back to being a striker and he will therefore be challenging Andy Booth, Junior Mendes and Pawel Abbott for a goalscoring role.

PAWEL ABBOTT

Polish Under-21 international joined the club on loan from Preston North End in 2004 and scored on his debut against Bristol Rovers. He has quickly established himself as a terrace favourite with his keen eye for goal and his work rate. Deceptively pacey and with quick feet for a big player, Abbott is now a key member of the squad having signed an undisclosed fee in March.

JUNIOR MENDES

Came to Town on a free-transfer from Mansfield Town and was Jackson's second signing of the close season, having impressed the Town boss in his games for the Stags against the Terriers. He is very quick and is able to get in behind defenders and adds a different dimension to Town's attack. He is also a natural finisher making him a danger to defences and a valued addition to Jacko's team.

AKPO SODJE

Akpo Sodje, brother of defender Efe, joined the Club from non League Erith and Belvedere in September 2004 after training with the first-team since pre-season. The imposing frontman was handed his League debut for the Terriers against Port Vale after impressive displays in the reserves. A raw talent with pace, strength and a fearsome strike, he has proved a valued addition to the squad.




CLUB CAPTAIN

THE VICTORY over Hartlepool was another good win at home and it was good to keep a clean sheet. As the gaffer said after the game, we did ride our luck a bit but you have got to give them credit, they were in the play-offs last year and they are going for promotion again. They are a strong outfit and they were sharper than us in the first-half but we put it right in the second, the tempo was much better and we were cruising at the end. It was also good to see Sheff on the scoresheet again, he took his goal well, better than his first attempt! Not every game is going to be a walkover and they made it difficult for us in the early stages of the match, if they had taken their chances we could have been going in one or two down at the break, rather than a goal up. In the end it was another professional performance and now we have only conceded two goals at home in six matches.

As I said in my notes for Hartlepool, October is a tough month for us, the teams that we will play during the month are all teams who are up there. I think Tranmere and Hartlepool will be there at the end of the season, Huddersfield are on a high like all promoted sides and then you have got Walsall, who you would have thought would have done better than they have but maybe now they have turned the corner after their win over Colchester last weekend.

After that we play Hull, with their stadium and their resources; I have worked under Peter Taylor and he is a good coach. At the end of the month

we have Bradford here and it will be interesting to see how they play against us. If we stay unbeaten this month that is a third month unbeaten, we are not just looking at games now, we are looking at months. Confidence is high and we know that if we don't take liberties or take our foot off the pedal, we can achieve something this season.

I have seen Huddersfield a couple of times and they like to play football, which suits us and that will be good for the fans with two teams who want to play the game the right way. It is up to us to go out there this afternoon and get a result, we have been doing that since the start of the season but the games are getting tougher the longer we stay unbeaten.

Last Saturday morning, I went to watch the Under-18's beat Walsall 5-2, I always think it helps when the pros go and watch the kids, it certainly helped me a lot at Charlton. In a funny way it gives you a lift as a young lad to think the pros have come to watch you. It was like watching the first-team the way that they played. They were switching play, creating loads of chances and scoring freely, there were some really good performances.


All round things are looking good for the club and the confidence it breeds throughout the club and long may it continue.




HATTERS HISTORY

IT WAS all change at the top over the summer of 1972 with manager Alec Stock resigning to be replaced by Harry Haslam, who had originally come to the club as promotions manager three years before.

Haslam immediately began to wheel and deal and in came John Aston, Rodney Fern and Bobby Thomson with old favourites Mike Keen, Don Givens and Tony Read moving on to pastures new. The new man wished to make the Town more adventurous and devised a system which involved just one player up front supported by a 'floating' five in midfield.

Early season results were nothing to write home about as the new system bedded in but at the beginning of September, recently relegated Huddersfield were the visitors and the crowd of 8,133 was treated to a display of attacking football that was to vindicate Haslam for the time being.

The Town had the best possible start, scoring after 90 seconds. Full-back John Ryan raced 40 yards with the ball to force a corner and from the flag-kick a melee developed leading to a clearance hitting Vic Halom and rebounded into the goal.

Halom doubled the lead on 25 minutes when Chris Wood in the Terriers goal dropped a corner at his feet but with the Town in cruise

control they were rudely awakened when Alan Gowling reduced the deficit with a low 20 yard shot. The Hatters moved up a gear and made the game safe when Jim Ryan lashed in a shot and Aston netted from the spot after Alan Jones handled in the area.

As it turned out, the big win over Huddersfield could not be repeated as the Haslam system, which encouraged counter attacking, was better equipped for away games. By the time of the return on 20th January 1973, the Hatters were still in the top six in the table but that was on the back of away performances rather than home form which had seen only one win since September. Huddersfield were on their way to a second successive relegation and their miserable record meant that only 3,871 were huddled on the terraces on a cold, snowy day.

The treacherous conditions meant that the game was going to be a lottery and it was against the run of play when Huddersfield took the lead with Geoff Hutt swinging a hopeful ball into the goal-mouth where Luton goalkeeper Keith Barber watched as it struck the far post and bounced in.

Almost before the cheers had died down the Hatters equalised, again from a freak goal. A back pass from Dennis Clarke stuck in the snow leaving Barry Butlin to surge through and shoot past the advancing Terry Poole in the Terriers goal. The Town were not finished, and after Jim Ryan dispossessed John Pugh he crossed into the goal-mouth where Lyon, trying to manoeuvre himself in the slippery conditions, could only watch as the ball hit his shins and bounced into the net.

The Hatters managed to hang on to their narrow lead as they fought to climb the table. For Huddersfield it was another nail in the coffin.

■ Katie Davis in action for the Under 11's





KENILWORTH ROAD season ticket holder Ian Stacey will be swapping the comfort of his seat in the Enclosure for the rigours of the New York marathon at the beginning of November. The change of scenery will coincide with the Hatters home match against Wrexham and whilst disappointed he will be missing the game, the chance to compete in one of the World's well-known marathons was not something he was prepared to pass up after he has patiently waited for this opportunity.

"I have entered the New York marathon three times in the past but each time my application has not been accepted," explained the man who plans to wear his Hatters shirt through the streets of Brooklyn, the Bronx and Manhattan. "I decided to give the New York marathon a go in the past but there is a limit on how many foreigners they let race so your place is chosen by a ballot, each time I just hoped for the best and I am delighted I will now be able to do it."

"I ran the Chicago marathon in 2000 and a year later I competed in the London marathon. I used to watch a lot of the running on television when I was a child and it was something that interested me, running the London marathon was something I was determined to do one day and it was a great experience."

"I am training indoors about five times a week and I go on a longer run outdoors at the weekend, I am running about 16 miles on a Sunday at the moment, just gradually building it up as I get near the event."



As one of 30,000 who will be running the New York marathon, his training runs are nowhere near as crowded, occasionally running on his own or being accompanied by his training partner, Heskey.

He added: "My dad is from Liverpool which is why he is named after Emile but I get plenty of ribbing from my mates over it. I did think about changing it to Enoch a while ago but Heskey has stuck so maybe if I get another dog in the future. He usually comes with me when I go for a run around my local lake, which is about four miles."

"I am raising money for Cancer Research, my girlfriend's mother was diagnosed with cancer a few years ago but thankfully she has now recovered but I wanted to do something, to raise money which they can use for research purposes."

"After a few niggling injuries which have delayed my training, I am still hoping to come in, in under four and a half hours and hopefully having raised some valuable funds for Cancer Research."



In an evacuation of the main stand you will be instructed to use the pitch. Stewards will direct you to the nearest exit. It may be that your normal exit route will not be available. On leaving the stadium, you will find some roads closed to pedestrians, to enable swift and unobstructed access for the emergency services. Please leave the area of the ground as quickly as possible, by the route directed. Your co-operation will be most appreciated.

TRAVEL INFO

HOW TO GET TO HULL CITY



By Road from the West: Approach Hull from the M62, which leads straight onto the A63. Continue on the A63 under the Humber Bridge. The road continues into the A63 Clive Sullivan Way. Continue along Clive Sullivan Way. Turn off onto the slip road just before the fly-over, sign-posted 'Local Traffic/Infirmary' and for KC Stadium. At the roundabout, take the second exit 'Rawling Way'. At the next main set of traffic lights (and with the Hospital in front of you), take a left turn onto A1105 Anlaby Road. Continue over the fly-over. At the foot of the fly-over, take a right turn into Walton Street. The Walton Street car park is located just over half way down this street, just after the Sports Arena.

By Road from the Humber Bridge: Once over the Humber Bridge, follow signs for Hull City Centre. The road follows round to the left to join the A63 Clive Sullivan Way and will take you under the Humber Bridge. (Continue as if coming from the West).

By Road from the North: Take the A1079 towards Beverley then follow signs for the Humber Bridge and the A164. Take the A63 sign-posted Hull City Centre. Continue on the A63 under the Humber Bridge. (Continue as if coming from the West).

By Road from the East & Hull Docks: The A165 approaches Hull from the East Coast and onto Holderness Road. Follow signs for A63/M62 Leeds. At the second large roundabout on the A63 Garrison Road, continue over Myton Bridge straight onto A63 Castle Street. Continue

along the A63. Just before the flyover, take the slip road sign-posted 'Infirmary/Anlaby A1105', and at the roundabout take the 3rd exit onto 'Rawling Way'. At the next main set of traffic lights (and with the Hospital in front of you), take a left turn onto A1105 Anlaby Road. Continue over the fly-over. At the foot of the fly-over, take a right turn into Walton Street. The Walton Street car park is located just over half way down this street, just after the Sports Arena.

By Rail: Paragon Railway Station is situated in the centre of Hull and is roughly a ten minute walk from the KC Stadium which is signposted.

Parking: Hull City advise visiting fans to use the 'Park and Ride' facility based at Priory Park. Priory Park is situated next to the Clive Sullivan Way coming into Hull and buses run to and from the KC Stadium every ten minutes. Costing £1 return. For those fans wishing to park their cars at the stadium, there is a car park on Walton Street which costs £2.

Around The Ground: There are plenty of places to eat and drink in the city centre which is only a 15 minute walk from the KC Stadium. The majority of the pubs in the immediate vicinity of the stadium are for home supporters only.

By Coach with Town on Tour: Leaving Maple Road at 1000am (the coach will make a stop at Milton Keynes Coachway about 30 minutes later). The fare for LTSC members is £17, £15 for junior and senior members and £19 for non-members. To book seats visit the supporters kiosk at the top of Kenilworth Road or phone the Town on Tour mobile 07960 567465. You can also book online by visiting the Fans section of www.lutontown.co.uk

By Coach with Bobbers Travel: Departs from Cranfield at 8.30am and Luton at 9.30am. Costs are £15.50 for Adults and £13 for Under-16's and OAP's. Please ring 01234 750996 for further information and to book your place.



COMING NEXT

THE FACT that Bradford City will provide our next opposition to Kenilworth Road is seen by many as a surprise after their well documented off field troubles throughout their relegation campaign last season.

The former Premiership outfit were, at one stage, close to going out of business during the bleakest period the Bantams have ever faced.

However, for the first time since they were in the top flight, Bradford are enjoying the dizzy heights of challenging for promotion when many were tipping them for another season fighting relegation before a ball was kicked.

Their success this season has undoubtedly come down to the transformation under former Bolton boss Colin Todd, who has guided the club into the top six on a shoe-string budget.

Although Bradford are still in administration, the loyal Bantams' fans are certainly more optimistic this season and three wins from their last four league games have sent the Yorkshire club flying high in the table.

Their most impressive victory to date is their 1-0 win at Hull City although Bradford have also tasted success on the road with maximum points at the MK Dons and Stockport County.

Todd has also transformed Bradford into a difficult side to beat on their own patch and only Port Vale and Chesterfield have left Valley Parade this season with all three points.

Much of Bradford's success this season has come from a side packed with experience and they were recently boosted by the news that midfielder Dean Windass and defender David Wetherall have committed their immediate futures to the club by signing new one-year


contracts.

Both players have made over 100 appearances for the club and played during Bradford's years in top-flight football. More experience in the Bradford camp comes in the shape of Nicky Summerbee. The former Sunderland and Manchester City midfielder has been very consistent this season for Bradford and added more experience to the club's midfield.

Historically the Bantams have had the upper hand in previous meetings, in league competition Bradford have won four and drawn three of the eight fixtures between the two sides. However, the last time the two sides met in league action, back in 1979, the Hatters recorded their only success against the Yorkshire outfit.
