





Fast forward... Jimmy Gilligan

Interview



A welcome win last weekend, and from the FA Cup the MK Dons now take on the League-leading Hatters. Simon Heggie spoke to Jimmy Gilligan about his past seven days at the helm.

Jimmy, this is the biggest game of our season, how is the mood in the camp ahead of the visit of Luton Town today?

It's been good all week. We've worked tremendously hard in training and I think we will put on a good show today. There's no doubt that Luton will be a tough proposition, and I'd like to congratulate Mike Newell's side on how well they have done this season and welcome them to the National Hockey Stadium today. Luton have scored more goals than anyone in the league and are not top of the table by accident, I've watched them and they have some very talented footballers. We must show them the respect that a team at the top of the table deserve, but at the same time we must not fear them. We have proved on a number of occasions this season that we can match in-form teams. And despite our league position I've seen nothing to suggest there is anyone that we can not say that, at our best, we cannot match.

Have you been pleased with the way the players have responded over the past few weeks following the departure of Stuart Murdoch?

I've been delighted with their reaction. We've changed a few things, but mostly it's been a case of working them hard. And players don't always like that. The spirit has remained high among the players and they've done everything that has been asked of them. At the end of the day it is their job to go out and win a game of football and so far that is what they have done for me. There has been no problem with motivation or confidence, and hopefully we can build on that today.

Last Saturday was a big day for you personally with the 1-0 FA Cup win over Lancaster being a big boost. How did you find being a manager compared to being a coach?

The picking of the team was done in much the same way. Stuart and myself used to

consult on that, with Stuart making the final decision. This time it was myself and Steve Palmer, we had a long chat and worked things out and at the end it was down to me. But when it came to the day there were a few changes. I actually missed being out on the pitch before the game taking the warm-up. I could actually have done it, but I felt it was better for the players to have that time to themselves without feeling me watching them. I was in the dressing room waiting for them to come back so we could have the teamtalk.

With us facing non-league opposition against Lancaster City, some might have expected a massive scoreline, but we all know that's not the way the FA Cup always works. Was it was the case of the result being more important than the performance?

If you look at Saturday's results there were some shocks in there. Walsall losing to Slough Town was the big


one, and that should show people just what can happen. For me, it was all about the result for this football club and getting our name into the hat for the second round. I'll make no apologies for that and the fact that it wasn't a 5-0 win. Because Paul Merson and Walsall won't be thinking that, they'd just be delighted to have scraped past with a one-goal difference and still be in there. A win is a win and we've not had many of those this season. We need the winning mentality at home and the atmosphere in the dressing room was brilliant afterwards.

Taking on the league leaders will always be a big thing, but coming at this stage of the season makes it even bigger. And with us going to Tranmere next week it makes the situation even clearer, we need three points.

That's the case and I don't think it's far fetched to think we can beat Luton. It's definitely going to be a big

game, with it being the first local derby MK has ever seen. We're expecting a big crowd, and given the noise that our fans can make, we'll be taking every ounce of advantage that we can from our supporters today. There are no easy games in the league and it's important that we pick up some momentum in the next couple of weeks. Going into the christmas period the games start to come in quick succession, it would relieve a bit of pressure if we can get back to winning ways in the league today.

I wouldn't have thought there will be too many people in the football world who will be expecting us to beat Luton Town today.

They are flying high at the top of the league and we're in a difficult position at the wrong end, getting used to life without Stuart Murdoch.

But if there's one thing that has always held true about this club, it's that we never lie down and can always pull off a shock result when our backs are up against the wall.

I've got a sneaky feeling that we could do the same thing today. Luton are an excellent side on top form at the moment, their confidence levels will be sky high and we've taken a few knocks in the league.

Having said that, the mood has been pretty good this week following the FA Cup win over Lancaster last Saturday. I couldn't play in that game because of injury, but I watched it from the stands.

It's never easy playing a side from non-league in the FA Cup. It's their big day and you have to balance between giving your opponents respect but not being afraid to show your class. I think we were caught in that dilemma in the first half, but got through the tie without any real scares, and being in the hat for the second round was the main thing.

We've been drawn at non-league Cambridge City in the next round, and it gives us a great chance of being in the third round, which is one of the biggest days of the football calendar. It's been a long time that this club hasn't started their FA Cup run at that stage, so to miss out on it would be a massive blow.

As far as today goes, we must go out and do our best to stop Luton from playing. While we must be strong and resolute at the back, it's important to play to our strengths and make things happen at the other end.

There's only been three games this season that we've failed to score in and if we can get things right at the back we will always have a chance.

The boys have all worked hard in training this week and we're going to do our best for Jimmy Gilligan. As players we have to take full responsibility for what happens on the pitch, and no matter what happens with the manager situation, we need to give whoever

is in charge 100 per cent week in, week out.

The league situation is not good at present, and it sometimes takes a big win to turn your season around. If we can beat Luton this weekend, the feeling in the camp will be superb when we head up north to play Tranmere next Saturday. We're good enough to do it on our day, we just need that bit of luck which hasn't been with us on many occasions this season.

As well as luck, we need the MK Dons fans on our side. Through thick and thin they've been great to us this season, and today's a great chance to show the Hatters fans what we can do on the noise front. As always we appreciate what you do for us, and we'll be doing our utmost to give you something to sing about.

Focus on... Luton Town

Anyone who thought the wheels might be coming off the Luton Town promotion juggernaut after three defeats on the trot had better think again.



MIKE NEWELL

Since being beaten at Hull after losses to Walsall and Huddersfield, Mike Newell's chargers have won their last three games by scorelines of 4-0, 5-1 and 3-0 in the televised FA Cup clash at Southend last Friday evening.

The Shrimpers are no mugs this season, but were ruthlessly ripped apart by a free-flowing attacking display that could have been far heavier than the final scoreline.

Leading scorers Steve Howard and Ahmet Brkovic were both on target at Roots Hall, and with central defenders Curtis Davies and Chris Coyne keeping a tight watch on former Wimbledon striker Wayne Gray, the Hatters had few problems dealing with their League Two opposition.

Davies is one of a number of youngsters who have made rapid

progress for the club in the past year or so.

Luton's well-documented past financial problems forced manager Newell to consistently field players last season who might otherwise have been learning their trade in the reserves.

This season though the club is reaping the benefit as other young players such as Kevin Foley, Stephen O'Leary and Michael Leary have also contributed greatly to the Hatters cause.

Skipper Kevin Nicholls should return to action today after missing the past three games through suspension, but with regular keeper Marlon Beresford still likely to be sidelined through injury, on-loan Charlton keeper Simon Royce could well be between the sticks for the Hatters this afternoon.

Marlon Beresford

B: LINCOLN 2.9.69

Marlon is a very experienced keeper who rejoined the Hatters during the summer six months after leaving Kenilworth Road for Barnsley. He began his career as a trainee with Sheffield Weds, then had a 240-game spell with Burnley in the mid-nineties before time at Middlesbrough, Burnley again, York, Burnley again and Bradford City. He first joined Luton in October 2003.

Kevin Foley

B: LONDON 1.11.84

A highly-rated young prospect, Kevin has been a regular in the right-back slot in recent weeks. He made his League debut in April 2003 against Bristol City, has three times been a winner of the club's 'Young Player of the Season' award, can also play in midfield when required, and for good measure is now also a Republic of Ireland under-21 international.

Sol Davis

B: CHELTENHAM 4.9.79

Sol will come into tonight's game in good heart after scoring his first League goal last Saturday after 204 games. Formerly with Swindon, he made 117 League appearances for Town before joining the Hatters for £600,000 in August 2002, and is a tenacious tackling left back who reads the game well, and is a particularly useful crosser of the ball when getting forward.

AHMET BRKOVIC

Curtis Davies

B: LONDON 15.3.85

Another of the club's highly-rated youngsters, Curtis is a central defender who made his League debut last January against Stockport.

After just five more games last season he has quickly become a regular in the starting line-up this current campaign, is very strong in the air and for his age shows a good understanding of the game.

Chris Coyne

B: BRISBANE, AUSTRALIA 20.12.78

Chris is a commanding and very consistent central defender who was formerly with Perth SC in his native land before joining West Ham for £150,000 in January 1996. He made his League debut in August 1998 whilst on loan at Brentford, then had a one-game spell on loan with the Blues in March 1999 just before playing his only League game for the Hammers, as a substitute against Leeds United in May 1999. After an 18-month spell with Dundee he joined the Hatters for £50,000 in September 2001 and has hardly missed a game since.

Kevin Nicholls

B: NEWHAM 2.1.79

A former Charlton Athletic trainee, Kevin made a dozen League appearances for the Addicks and had a spell on loan with Brighton before being sold to Wigan Athletic for £250,000 in June 1999. He moved on to Kenilworth Road for £25,000 two years later and has since become the driving force in the Hatters midfield with his competitive, all-action style. Last season he struggled with a back injury but had been an ever-present this season until missing recently through suspension.

Steve Robinson

B: LISBURN 10.12.74

Steve is a Northern Ireland international right-sided midfielder who joined the Hatters from Preston for £50,000 in June 2002. He began his career with Tottenham and made a couple of appearances at White Hart Lane before joining Bournemouth on a free transfer in October 1994, where he was a regular for six seasons, scoring 51 goals from 240 League games. A £375,000 fee took him to Deepdale in May 2000, but he was then badly affected by a series of injuries and made only a couple of dozen appearances for North End before his move back south to Kenilworth Road.

Ahmet Brkovic

B: DUBRONIK, CROATIA 23.9.74

A skilful right-sided attacking midfielder, Ahmet was signed on a free transfer in October 2001 after having spent the previous two seasons with Leyton Orient. Formerly with the HNK club in Dubrovnik, he arrived at Brisbane Road in October 1999 after coming to London to marry his girlfriend, and after passing a trial with the O's went on to play 79 League games before his contract ran out in the summer of 2001. A regular member of the Hatters first-team squad since then, he has been on fine scoring form this season.



Paul Underwood

B: WIMBLEDON 16.8.73

Paul is a dashing left-sided defender or midfielder who was signed last March from Rushden, for whom he had been a key figure since becoming former manager Brian Talbot's first signing for the club back in June 1997. He had previously spent several years on the non-League scene with the likes of Kingstonian, Molesey, Sutton, Carshalton and finally Enfield before his £50,000 move to Nene Park. A hamstring injury on his Hatters debut caused him to sit out the end of last season, but he is one of five ever-present starters so far this current campaign.

B: BARNET 12.2.85

Another former trainee, Stephen made his League debut early last season against Port Vale and went on to play four more games, scoring his first goal last May against Sheffield Wednesday. He is a fast and direct central midfielder with good distribution.

Keith Keane

B: LUTON 20.11.86

A very promising youngster who can play either at right back or in midfield, Keith made his League debut last February at Wycombe in the defensive option and quickly chalked up 14 more appearances before the season's end. A brave tackler who scored his first League goal against Bristol City last April, he has been a sub in recent matches.





It's the game that many Milton Keynes Dons fans have been looking forward to, and it's sure to be played in front of a sizeable and passionate crowd. Have the Dons got what it takes to win the game? Our experts give their expert view.

LUKE ASHMEAD - BBC 3 COUNTIES. One place from the foot of the table, without a win in seven league games and no permanent manager in charge. Some might say not the best time to welcome one of the most 'in form' teams in the country. The Hatters have scored nine goals in their last two league games and rightfully come to the new City as favourites today, but what if?

What if the Dons players are inspired by the larger than usual turn out? What if caretaker boss Jimmy Gilligan has managed to galvanise his players into fighting for their League 1 status? And what if Luton Town have an off day? I've said on so many occasions this season that there is enough quality within the Dons side for the team to be higher in this division and if all the above swing the way of the home side then Jimmy and the boys do have what it takes to get a result against their new found rivals.

ALAN FELDBERG - MK CITIZEN. A few weeks ago Luton Town were apparently a team on the slide. Not quite. They have stormed to victory in each of their last three matches, scoring 12 goals and conceding just once - a consolation once the Hatters had gone 5-0 up.

Mike Newell's side are currently six points clear at the top of League One and have a vastly superior goal difference to anyone else. They are averaging two goals a game and Steve Howard and Ahmet Brkovic have already bagged 19 goals between them. Milton Keynes Dons then will need to produce their best form of the season to stand any chance of recording their first league win since September. Gary Smith's return from injury is a huge boost, as is Wade Small's good form - but the weakness is behind them and the Dons will probably have to score at least twice to get even a point.

LEE SCRIVEN - MK NEWS. On current form, the Hatters should stroll it by more than a few goals. However, with Jimmy Gilligan looking to secure the hot seat, plus the Dons now back to full strength with Williams, Smart and most important of all Smith back in the line-up, it might not be as easy as some are predicting.





Team play... Wade Small





What's the score? with Wade Small



“There's no doubt today will be a very tough game.. Luton are obviously an excellent side and they've scored loads of goals this season.”

Wade Small has hit his scoring form at just the right time with the visit of League One leaders Luton Town this afternoon, and the 20-year-old is keen to keep his run going.

After impressing a whole host of Championship scouts with his performances towards the end of last season, the midfielder turned striker looked set to join his friends Mikele Leigertwood, Nigel Reo-Coker and Jobi McAnuff on the list of departures last season, with West Ham reportedly keen on prising him away to East London.

But Small decided to stick with the MK Dons, and after an admittedly slow start to the campaign, has now scored in the last two games, including the winner in the 1-0 FA Cup First Round win at home to Lancaster City last Saturday.

He said: "I'm finding the target at the moment and I'm pleased with that. As a striker the main thing is to score goals and I feel like I'm improving with each game."

"My confidence is up and I'm getting in the right positions, so hopefully that can continue and the goals can keep going in for me."

"I used to be a striker when I was much younger but then Stuart Murdoch used me as a midfielder in the first team. So it's not a totally strange position for me, and in truth, I feel a lot more comfortable up front."

"I've got four goals this season and Izale's got ten, so I'm creeping up on him a bit. I'd like to finish the season with around 15, and if I stay in the team I'd like to think I can achieve that."

"There are a few options up front, with Allan Smart, Julien Hornuss, Izale myself and Serge Makofu. So if you're not doing the business for the first team you'll always be under pressure."

"At the moment things are going well for me, but I know I must keep improving and scoring if I'm going to be up front every week."

Small has plenty of reason for wanting to keep his scoring run going this afternoon, not least that his neighbour is a big Hatters fan. And Small wants to have the bragging rights of his neighbourhood come 2.30pm today.

He added: "No-one's really thought about it being a local derby, but I suppose it will be a big thing for the people of Milton Keynes. But we must just treat it as any other game."

"We can't go in fearing them, we must be confident and feel that we can go in and cause them problems. On our day we

have proved we can match the teams near the top, and we'll need to be in that sort of form this afternoon.

"I've got a neighbour who is a big Luton fan and this week he's been coming up to me saying they're going to beat us."


"So the best response for me will be to score against them and that will give him something to think about. There will be plenty of local rivalry going on in the stands and it will be a noisy atmosphere."

"There's no doubt that today will be a very tough game. Luton are obviously an excellent side and they've scored loads of goals this season. But it's an important game for us and hopefully we can take three points."

Despite his tender years, Dons fans have seen a lot of Small. After being blooded by Stuart Murdoch midway through last season, he has now made 51 appearances in total and is a regular name on the teamsheet.

"Although I'm still just 20, I feel like I have a bit of experience under my belt and know what first team football is about."


"Because of last year and the situation with administration we got plenty of games which we



probably wouldn't have at another club. So in a way that was a good thing from a bad situation."

"We had to grow up quickly and become players at the senior level. Some of the boys really took to it quickly, like Nigel Reo-Coker, Mikele Leigertwood, Jobi McAnuff. And look at where they've ended up, Mikele was on SKY the other day for Palace against Arsenal!"

"This club has always been known for its young talent, and it would be nice to think that can continue with people like myself, Dean Lewington, Malvin Kamara and the others. The only way we're going to get our names in lights is by doing our stuff for Milton Keynes Dons, and that's what I intend to do."

Golden oldies...

with MK Dons Club
Historian Reg Davis

Luton Town

Wimbledon and Luton were frequent adversaries in the late eighties and early nineties, when both clubs were members of the old Division One. The two teams also met on 9th April 1988, a definite golden day in the history of Wimbledon Football Club.

That was the date of the FA Cup semi-final, and though the attendance of 25,963 was by no way a sell-out at White Hart Lane, those that turned up saw a memorable match.

League position-wise there wasn't much between the Division One Dons and Hatters that season, and that was reflected in the level scoreline the teams produced for the first half.

Future Wimbledon striker Mick Harford eventually gave Luton the lead on 48 minutes, but just eight minutes later John Fashanu equalised from the spot after keeper Andy Dibble had felled Terry Gibson.

With the clock ticking down and replay looking on the cards it was

Dennis Wise who finally settled matters when he stabbed home an Alan Cork cross from close range to send the Dons on the way to Wembley.



And Charlie Emery, Craig Ewart and Mackie all went close to extending the lead in the closing stages as MK Dons held on without any real scares.




The next two League One opponents of the MK Dons met in the first round of the FA Cup last Saturday, and it was the home side Peterborough United who prevailed by a 2-1 scoreline against their visitors from Tranmere Rovers.



Brian Little's Rovers went into the game on the back of a 4-0 league defeat at Bristol City four days earlier, a reversal that dropped them one place to third in the League One table.

A strong cup-fighting team that got to the sixth round last season, Rovers went behind at London Road after ten minutes to a Peter Kennedy free-kick, but levelled matters just before the interval than to a goal from young prospect Ryan Taylor.

Matters then stayed level until just a minute from time, when Posh skipper Curtis Woodhouse headed what proved to be a superb winner, and which left Rovers manager Little (pictured below) to lament afterwards: "I'm gutted to be out of the Cup because I felt our second-half performance merited a replay. There were far too many disappointing performances in the first half."

By and large though Rovers have had far more good performances than bad this season, as their League One record of nine wins, five draws and just three losses would suggest.

Former Liverpool and Republic of Ireland midfielder Jason McAteer was a shrewd summer signing from Sunderland, while up front Canadian international striker Ian Hume has forged a good partnership with Frenchman Eugene Dadi.

Fit-again forward Simon Haworth adds good competition for attacking places after his recent recovery from a broken leg, and with a home record of just seven points dropped all season, the Dons will be in for a tough afternoon's work in Birkenhead next Saturday.

Before the home League One fixture against Peterborough on Tuesday 7th December, the MK Dons travel to Cambridge City for an FA Cup second round tie that will be played on Friday 3rd December with a 7.45pm kick-off time.

City are having a good season in the Nationwide Conference South, currently occupying fifth place, and got through to face the Dons by virtue of beating Leigh RMI 2-1 last Saturday.

A last-minute goal from substitute Jon Stevenson gave City their win, and on hearing that his team would be facing the Dons in the next round City manager Gary Roberts said: "It's really nice to get a home draw and it will be a big occasion. Milton Keynes Dons aren't having the best of times at the moment, and with a bit of luck in the Cup, anything can happen."

Hopefully anything will be a Dons win and then a massive big draw in the third round. Hopefully.


