



It was only left to me to protect the Club's position by finalising a compensation package for the loss of his services to close the business side of our relationship.

My fellow Directors and I recognise that success can bring its problems, when other clubs take notice of the quality of our players and of the football management.





There is a great spirit in the



CLUB SECRETARY

Good afternoon. Firstly, I am asked to pass on the sincere thanks to all our supporters from the Coronary Care Unit at the Luton and Dunstable Hospital who collected the grand sum of £505.04 at our match with Bradford City.

I have also received a letter from the Walsall Supporters Club who have also asked that thanks be passed onto our supporters for problems that arose due to staff shortages at their bar before the match with Walsall. Our supporters were very patient and good-humoured throughout and were a credit to our club.

Yet again, we had fantastic support away support, with 3,184 supporters in the away stands at MK Dons. I have been asked why I left the MK Dons match just before the end, this was due to the F.A. Drug Testing team being present and both Club Secretaries have to select two players for testing after the match and one reserve player. Each player on the team sheet is given a number, then for our own team we each pick three balls out of the hat to randomly select who is tested after the match.

The Youth team will now play Yeovil away in the Third Round of The F.A. Youth Cup and at the time of writing I am waiting to hear regarding a playing date. This round must be played by Saturday 18th December, so watch out in the local press, radio and website for full details.

Cup, the time between rounds does seem to get shorter, therefore making the time available for supporters to purchase their tickets much tighter and your co-operation has been appreciated. The Wycombe Wanderers allocation is 2,000 tickets and with 4,000 season ticket holders demand is sure to be very high.

A warm welcome to Peter Kemp who has joined us as Stadium Manager, we are already beginning to see improvements around the stadium and he has only been with us for three weeks.





MANAGER

DAVE PENNEY



HAVING initially taken over the hot seat at Belle Vue in a caretaker capacity, he assumed the permanent reigns in March 2002 and last season led them to the Division Three title, beating big spending Hull City for the honour.

The 40-year-old took over from Steve Wignall and although his managerial career didn't get off to the best of starts in the Nationwide Conference, suffering a defeat in his game, it was soon followed by six straight wins which kept Rovers in the title race and despite missing out on promotion on that occasion, he didn't have to wait too long to lead Doncaster back into the Football League.

The former Cardiff skipper's first full season in charge saw Rovers finish third and reach the play-offs, which they successfully won and then last season, they managed to better than achievement by taken the third division by storm.

With a return of eighty wins from little over 150 games since he took over, Rovers have a respectable return of 1.8 points a game under his leadership and are currently one of a handful of clubs who aren't far off the play-off pace.

GOALKEEPERS

ANDY WARRINGTON


Andy spent five years at York before Rovers signed him in May 1999, and has been the first team keeper for the vast majority of that time. He is a great keeper who has been a key part of the defence that conceded a club-record low number of goals last season as they raced to the Division Three championship.

STUART JONES

Another of Rovers' new signings this season, Stuart signed in August after being released by Brighton & Hove Albion at the end of last season. He started his career with Weston-super-Mare in the Southern League before being transferred to Sheffield Wednesday in March 1998. Two years later he cost Torquay United £30,000 when he moved down to the South coast for a similar stint before joining Barry Town before rejoining his first club. Brighton came in for him in February 2004, but he found himself without a club at the end of last season.

DEFENDERS

NICK FENTON



Born in Preston, he joined Manchester City as a trainee in 1996 but with first-team chances limited he signed for Notts County after a successful loan spell and became a key player in their defence. County terminated Nick's contract early in an effort

to trim their wage bill, with Rovers quickly stepping in to sign him during the close season, where he quickly showed his class in the pre-season games.

DAVE MORLEY

Began as a trainee at Manchester City before a move to Southend United followed in August

1998. From there he signed for Carlisle United in February 2001. A loan at Oxford United preceded a full transfer, and although he played most games in the latter part of that season, Rovers stepped in to sign him in the summer of 2002. He has proved a reliable central defender, who has also chipped in with a few key headed goals.

TIM RYAN

Tim began his career at a trainee with Scunthorpe United and made his Football League debut for them in October 1992. Rovers signed him four years after that following a stint with Buxton. The Stockport-born defender impressed with his speed and strong tackling from the left-back position. Spells followed with Altrincham and Southport before he returned to Belle Vue in June 2000.

MIDFIELDERS

JOHN DOOLAN

Liverpool-born midfielder who began his career as a trainee at Everton, moving through the youth team ranks to sign on as a professional in June 1992. Two years later he moved to Mansfield Town, where he went on to establish himself and made almost 150 appearances during his four-year stay. A £60,000 transfer to Barnet followed in January 1998, and he became a crowd favourite at Underhill. Joined Rovers on transfer deadline-day in 2003, and has since established himself as a key player in the Rovers midfield, directing play from the centre. One of the best passers of the ball in the game, he does like to try to shoot from long range.

PAUL GREEN


Born in Pontefract, Paul began his career with Sheffield Wednesday and joined the Rovers' youth team in the summer of 1999. He played a big part in the success of the youth team over the following two seasons and in 2002/03 he established himself in the first-team. Last season, Paul made 43 appearances in the League side, scoring 8 goals and produced some impressive

displays in his central midfield role. Works hard in a box-to-box role. Paul is still only 21, and is surely destined to play at a much higher level, as his undoubted talent deserves.

MICHAEL McINDOE



The former Hatters trainee is the reigning Player of the Year at Belle Vue and not only has his great form benefited Rovers since he signed but it also brought him to the attention of the Scotland coaching staff. He was given his chance in January 2004

when he played in the 'Scotland Future' team at Dundee, and as long as he maintains that kind of form, surely further international recognition cannot be out of the question. Michael began his career here at Kenilworth Road as a trainee, signing professional forms in 1998 but left in the summer of 2000 to join Hereford United in the Conference. In February 2001, Yeovil Town shelled out £25,000 to take him to the Huish, where he played a considerable part in their successes over the next two seasons before he completed a £50,000 move to Doncaster in August 2003.

JAMIE PRICE

Jamie is another product of the successful youth team policy at Rovers, having joined as a trainee in the summer of 1999. The former youth team

captain played a large part in the success of the juniors and his assured performances eventually earned him a professional contract in 2001. An ankle injury kept Jamie out of most of the 2002/03 season, with a short spell on loan at Halifax following as he regained match fitness. He bounced back once again last season to prove a very capable deputy at right-back. Jamie reads the game well, and is certainly capable of getting forward when the occasion demands.

FRANCIS TIERNEY

A product of Crewe Alexandra's famous youth team, Francis signed a professional contract in March 1993 but made only 87 appearances for Crewe over a five year period – which included a long lay-off after suffering a bad cruciate ligament injury which thwarted a big money move to Liverpool. The former England youth international then had spells with Notts County, Exeter City and Witton Albion. Rovers gave him the opportunity to resurrect his career when they signed him on a short-term contract in March 2001 but, having earned a permanent deal, injuries have halted his progress although a successful period of rehabilitation at Lillleshall this summer should mean that we can again look forward to seeing his skills and defence-splitting passes on the pitch in League One.

ADRIANO RIGOGLIOSO

Another of the Rovers squad to hail from Merseyside, Adriano began his career at a trainee at Liverpool, playing alongside Michael Owen and Jamie Carragher. Adriano left the Reds in 1998 to join UniBond League side

Marine – two years later a move to Conference club Morecambe followed. His performances for Morecambe, in an attacking midfield role, attracted the attention of Rovers and he signed for £30,000 in September 2003.

STRIKERS

GREGG BLUNDELL

Started his career as a trainee with Tranmere Rovers but was released after three years without making the first-team. He then joined Vauxhall Motors in the UniBond League for three seasons where his reputation for goalscoring was born and in January 2001 he stepped up to the Conference to play for Northwich Victoria, under the guidance of Jimmy Quinn his reputation continued to grow. His form attracted the attention of Dave Penney, who signed him on transfer deadline day in 2003 as Rovers looked to confirm their Conference play-off place.

JAMES COPPINGER

Signed for Rovers in a £30,000 move in the summer of 2004 despite interest from Irish club St Patrick's Athletic. The former England youth international began his career as a trainee at Darlington before Newcastle United paid £250,000 in March 1998. James struggled to make an impression on the first-team at the Magpies, making just one substitute appearance in four years, and spent two periods on loan at Hartlepool. He later joined Exeter City in the summer of 2002 and his move to Belle Vue followed once his contract expired. James quickly became a crowd favourite and he is a player with great potential and the ability to go past opponents with great ease.

LEO FORTUNE-WEST


Joined Rovers in the summer of 2003 and scored eleven goals as the club claimed the Division 3 Championship and promotion. He adds a key amount of experience to the Rovers forward line, and has an enviable reputation of gaining promotion at many of the clubs he has

served. He has now experienced promotion seven times in his career, with his most notable successes coming at Cardiff, Rotherham and Gillingham. Having started out at Tiptree United in the Eastern Counties League he moved up the non-league ladder via a handful of clubs to Stevenage, where Gillingham signed him for £5,000.

JERMAINE McSPORRAN

Signed during this summer from Wycombe Wanderers, who had released him following their relegation to Division Three. He had joined the Chairboys in November 1998 from Oxford City, but his career was blighted by long spells on the sidelines with cruciate ligament damage to both knees. Jermaine had a loan spell with Walsall last season before being signed by the Rovers in the summer. Reputedly one of the fastest players in the game, he possesses blistering pace which can trouble most defences.

NEIL ROBERTS



Capped by Wales at Youth, Under-21 and "B" level as well as three times as a full international, Roberts is Rovers most recent recruit. In October he signed a contract that will keep him at Belle Vue until the summer of 2007, having had a loan spell with

Bradford earlier in the season. After a big money move to the Latics from his home-town club Wrexham in February 2000 and four successful seasons at the JJB, he started the campaign down the pecking order at Wigan, behind the likes of Nathan Ellington, Jason Roberts and David Graham. It is hoped his experience and success at this level should make him a valuable addition to Dave Penney's squad.





HATTERS HISTORY

IT IS now almost 35 years since the Hatters and the Rovers clashed for league points and there are probably not that many Luton supporters here today who travelled up to Belle Vue in October 1969 to see a top of the table Division Three clash between the two sides.

We were top and undefeated over the first thirteen games of the campaign while Doncaster were in third spot with an unbeaten home record to protect. A crowd of 17,380, only bettered once in league games subsequently, packed into Bell Vue to see the Town make most of the early play but then go behind to a bizarre own goal.

Alan Slough, who had only been passed fit hours before the game, tried to clear a high ball but it skimmed off his head past the advancing Luton goalkeeper Sandy Davie. Stung by this the Town fought back and after several missed opportunities either side of the interval Matt Tees saw a towering header hacked off the line with the ball going straight down the other end where Graham Watson fed Stephen Briggs for a brilliant strikers goal.

The Town were unable to claw their way back

from this second goal and had to resign themselves to the first defeat of the season but were back to winning ways the following week with a 2-1 win at the home of another promotion hopeful, Brighton. Unfortunately, the Hatters were unable to maintain their good start to the season and as the wins turned to draws and in turn defeats, leading to a run of four losses in a row starting on Boxing Day, came a tumble down the table.

By the time of the return with Doncaster, in early February, the slide had been arrested but with no home win for nearly two months a good performance was needed to pacify the restless Kenilworth Road crowd of 12,828.

On a gluepot of a pitch the Town made hard work of a Doncaster side that had drifted way down the table after their heroics of the previous autumn, and it was not until just before the interval that Slough cracked in a shot from twenty-yards.

Having made the breakthrough the tension lifted, it was all one way traffic in the second half with Malcolm Macdonald shooting home after a Keith Allen effort was deflected into his path and then scoring from the spot after Tees was brought down by debutant goalkeeper Bob Wesson.

The final goal in a 4-0 victory that pushed the Town back into top spot went to the admirable and mud-spattered Tees who bravely raced through the Doncaster defence and netted despite several attempts to hack him down. Although there were plenty more setbacks over the remainder of the season the Town did eventually limp through to promotion, finishing runners-up to Orient.

FOOTBALL IN THE COMMUNITY



GOOD AFTERNOON and welcome to this afternoon's game against Doncaster Rovers. Following up my programme notes from the Wrexham match, this week we are looking at part two of the activities we provide as part of our 'Working with Schools' initiative.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS

These activities are available every weekday evening between 4pm and 5pm. These will take place on the school site and are open to the pupils from that school only. A nominal charge is made for these sessions, with the aim being to provide a familiar, safe and friendly place for children to go in the time between school finishing and parents returning home from work. In many cases this will mean the parents do not have to employ child minders. These fun based sessions will have the same coaching emphasis as the Curriculum Time Coaching. Children will be grouped according to age and ability.

INSET DAYS

Following requests from several schools over last year to deliver coaching to pupils on INSET days we have now made the decision to offer this as a regular service to local schools.

Unlike our Curriculum Time Coaching which is delivered free of charge and is still available to you on request, there would be a small charge to pupils on INSET days as this falls outside regular curriculum activities.

Assuming that your school would provide it's playing field, toilets and one classroom at no cost to Luton Town Football Club Football in the Community we would be able to keep the cost per child to a minimum. Should any pupils have family circumstances that would make payment difficult, we would be pleased to discuss this with you and the school.

The programme for INSET days would consist of fun/small sided games as well as our normal structured coaching. The service would be available between 10am and 3pm. Group numbers will only be limited by the safety restrictions imposed by your field size. However, we will work on a 16:1 coaching ratio.

To achieve the standard the club demand all of the above activities are only staffed by Football Association Coaches who are CRB checked and who hold a current Emergency Aid and Child Protection Certification. Our coaches are experienced at coaching at all levels and have the enthusiasm and expertise to provide the quality of service required. In addition we are able to provide coaches who carry the Football Association Disability Coaching Certificate






IF YOU were part of the seven thousand strong crowd for our last home match against Wrexham, you will have seen something as rare as some comets - and if his history is to repeat it's self it could be 2009 until you see it again. 
The magic moment for the former Swindon man arrived in the 17th minute of the match to put the Hatters two-up but the planned goal celebration never really materialised.

Davis explained, "We talked about it pre-season, Howie said to me, 'If you score, I'll probably faint' so we decided we would all do that if I scored. I totally forgot about it but Howie quickly reminded me and I think a couple of the other lads did as well. The plan was for everyone to do it but most of them forgot about it, I don't think they ever expected they would get the chance to do it."

Now Luton's left back is off the mark he is confident he can add to his tally and the Cheltenham-born defender admits he already has a target for the season in mind.

"I should have got one a few weeks before with a header but I managed to put that over the bar. I knew it was coming, the gaffer told me to keep getting forward. He said he thought it was going to come and I felt it was only a matter of time before it arrived. I've just got to get a few more now, I can't settle for just one."

"I don't think there is much danger of me catching Howie or Berky but maybe I can get another and pull away from Curtis."







THIS week's 'Supporters page' is written for you by former Programme Editor Brian Swain, currently enjoying his retirement in Devon. Founder members Brian and wife Rosemary have set up the Falmouth Branch of the Luton Town Supporters Club, albeit with a membership of only two, they recently made their first visit of the season to Kenilworth Road for our last home match. Brian picks up the story...

Meetings are short and to the point, usually taking place on Saturday mornings. The motion from the floor is that LTSC(FB) should organise a trip to the shops on Saturday afternoon. The Vice President opposes the suggestion, which ties the vote at 1-1, so he uses his casting vote to enable him to go to Bickland Park, home of the not-so-mighty Falmouth Town. The football is a bit iffy, but the company is good, booze and food is cheap, and the bar telly shows the league results coming in.

The trouble is, Kenilworth Road it ain't, and the VP who had watched more than 1,600 Town games on the trot until retiring at the end of last season was getting painful withdrawal symptoms – watching the Town on teletext from 300 miles away is a very poor alternative to the real thing. Thus it was that a few weeks ago the usual motion to organise an LTSC(FB) outing to Debenhams or Bickland Park was replaced by one which resulted in a return to Luton for the first time since last May to see the Wrexham game.

And what a brilliant weekend it turned out to be. So first, our thanks to the very many people who gave us a Kenilworth Road day to remember. Top of the list has to be the team that did a remarkable demolition job on Wrexham. Over the years I have often seen the Town struggle against the Welshmen. Who can forget the amazing day at Kenilworth Road when we were three up with 35 minutes to play, and contrived to lose 4-3? No danger of anything like that happening this time, was there?

And to be received back with such friendliness by all my old Luton Town friends, was a real bonus. I was fortunate to be allowed to watch the game from the Pressbox, and to sit there, in the back row, without having to do a stroke of work was a pleasure. I even allowed myself to stand and cheer the goals, an instinctive reaction denied to me for more than 30 years as a reporter – when the goals are scored you concentrate on getting the facts right, like who passed to whom, who missed the tackle, who was caught out of position and so on. The good football reporter concentrates for 90 minutes, and watches in silence. Twice in my career I lost a touch of professionalism in the Pressbox – when Raddy Antic scored at Maine Road in 1983, and when Brian Stein got the winner at Wembley five years later. I was broadcasting for Chiltern Radio in those days, and found myself screaming down the microphone.

Times have changed since then, of course, but for this old hack it was a delight to see how little had changed in six months at Kenilworth Road. I know the ground is ramshackle and in an unsuitable location. I look forward to seeing the Town in a 21st-century stadium, but I am still in love with Kenilworth Road, and always will be. It's down to happy memories and all the people involved. All the old feelings for the ground and for the club, swamped me long before I took my seat to see the game. A bit special, Luton Town, isn't it?



HOW TO GET TO WYCOMBE

HOW TO GET TO BRENTFORD

At Chiswick Roundabout after 0.7 miles, take 4th exit (s/p S. Circular A205, A316, M3 Richmond) onto Chiswick High Road/Kew Bridge Road. Straight on for 0.3 miles to junction/lights (Kew Bridge Junction). Here, keep in lane for the A315 and go straight on (s/p Hounslow, Brentford A315), towards 'The Plough'. At lights after 0.5 miles turn right (by McDonalds) into Ealing Road, which runs past Griffin Park.

By Rail: South West Trains run from Waterloo and Vauxhall to Reading via Brentford. When leaving the station on foot, head up to the main road and turn left. Take first main left turn into Windmill Road, and first right (s/p Methodist Church) into Clifden Road. The Stadium is then directly ahead of you.

By Bus: The E8 is a frequent service from Hanwell along Boston Manor Road, while the E2 runs from West Ealing along Windmill Road. The no. 65 runs from south of the river, over Kew Bridge. 




Michael Cummins
