



THE CHAIRMAN

WELCOME to our supporters, and our visitors Port Vale, their directors, management, players and supporters for today's game.

Football will always strike contrasting moments of expectation and disappointment. The last ten days since our home draw against Doncaster Rovers coupled with our excellent result in the F.A. Cup against Wycombe Wanderers, where our impressive travelling support watched our players take us through to the F.A. Cup third round draw.

I am certain that many of us will have watched our last Tuesday's opponents in League One, held to a draw by Hinckley prior to the live third round cup draw coming from the F.A. offices in London. The magic of the entry of the Premiership clubs had us all on the edge of our seats in the hope of a big name home draw. As it turned out, it was Exeter and Yeading that carried the headlines the following day.

Once again, football has a way of surprising you. Having had the setback of playing with ten men in our League match at Griffin Park on Tuesday, we went to that game knowing that the ultimate two teams drawn out in the competition were Hinckley or Brentford to play Luton in the third round of the F.A. Cup in January. At least everyone was pleased that we were first out of the bowl giving us a welcomed, home tie. I cannot let the moment go, having travelled like many of our fans to our away match against Brentford. It was with some disappointment that in twenty-two years of involvement with professional football, we had to witness such continual intimidation and constant instruction from Brentford's football management during the whole of the ninety minutes.

They will no doubt argue that it got them a

result, with the loss of our Steve Howard in the eighteenth minute, perhaps so. I believe that style of management can do nothing for the image of the game and is a very short-term approach, directing one's attention away from what happens on the park. Looking back, that self-attention is probably what they were seeking anyway.

However, it was pleasing to see that our remaining players did not rise to the natural instinct to retaliate, that is not how we play our football.

On a commercial note, we are launching a trial of our new Luton Town stadium matchday TV channel today, in conjunction with our partner, Sports TV. This will be an exciting new media that will be exclusive, initially, to all of the club's suites and the executive boxes. If the trial is successful, it is our hope to extend the coverage to other areas of the stadium on matchdays.

It will be edited and produced on site, with manager and player interviews complimenting the matchday stats that you will see today. As well as the obvious benefits to our customers, this project will be an important source of revenue for the club, in addition to our official website and our Hatters World.



The lads that have played so far have shown a desire to achieve and a hunger for success. We want that hunger to continue, not just for the rest of this season but beyond it.


You have to set your sights high and have ambition and I believe there is a strength of character and a sense of togetherness in that dressing room that I have seen before in successful sides.



GOOD AFTERNOON and welcome to everyone for our last home league game before Christmas. We are pleased to welcome once again today, the Salvation Army Band, who will be playing before the match and at half-time.

There will also be a bucket collection today on behalf of the Mayor's of Luton Christmas appeal, which will be divided between her chosen charities which are the Friends of Luton and Dunstable Hospital, Mencap and the Multiple Sclerosis Society.

Regrettably, we were reported to the Football Association following the Doncaster Rovers match on 27th November where a home supporter threw a sweet onto the field of play. To throw any item is against the Ground Regulations and we would ask all supporters to observe them and ensure this does not happen again.

The home reserve match against Aldershot Town which was due to be played next Wednesday will now be played on Tuesday 21st (this is a variation of our normal home playing day) with a 2.00p.m. kick-off here at Kenilworth Stadium. This change is due to the youth team playing at Yeovil in the third round of the F.A. Youth Cup on Wednesday 15th December, a match that kicks-off at 7.00p.m.

Whilst appreciating that the New Year is not yet upon us, I would like to advise supporters that we are making efforts to change the date of our home game with Barnsley which is scheduled for Saturday 26th March, the same day as England play in a World Cup Qualifier match, I will keep you advised.







MARTIN FOYLE



AFTER taking over the reigns from the departed Brian Horton in February 2004, Martin maintained the Valiants run towards the play-offs and was devastated that his side just missed out on the final day of the season.

Respected throughout football, Martin plied his trade for a large majority of his career at Vale Park with a terrific goal scoring record. Spells at Oxford United, Southampton and Aldershot as a player have encompassed a fine career, one which he will be hoping to continue into management.

His honesty is his strong point and his aim to give young players an opportunity at a club where money will always be tight is refreshing. Martin has brought back the smiles to the dressing room and ably assisted by former team-mate Dean Glover, he will hope his side can build on the platform last season's lofty league position provided.

GOALKEEPERS

JONNY BRAIN

Arrived from an unlikely source in the form of North Eastern holiday camp last season and made his debut against Scarborough. Jon has made an impression in the team between the sticks, as much more than a stand-in for the luckless Mark Goodlad. The latter will find the Geordie a difficult fixture to remove, as Brain has been in fine form since signing on.

MARK GOODLAD

After a horrendous term, having had three operations on his finger last year, the Barnsley-born stopper will wish to rekindle the flame of a previously promising career. Still a youngster, he will look to battle Jon-Brain for the first-team berth at Vale Park having previously served Nottingham Forest and Scarborough.

DEFENDERS

RYAN BROWN

Suffered a horrific facial injury sustained against QPR last season severely halted his progress. Having been brought back into the picture by a change of manager, Martin Foyle received an instant pay back for his faith in the youngster. A discovery from the youth team, Ryan will be striving to put behind him the disappointment of missing out last term after initially bursting onto the scene in style.

CHRISTIAN HANSON

6ft 1ins defender who signed earlier this week on non-contract terms and will be hoping to secure a longer term deal with the club. Brought into cover Vale's ever-increasing injury list the former Middlesbrough man was on the bench against Tranmere on Tuesday night. Has served Torquay and Cambridge United on loan from Boro, as well as playing non-league football for Havant & Waterlooville and also Spennymoor.

SAM COLLINS

A tough, uncompromising defender, Sam has carved a niche for himself in Vale colours. Previous service with Huddersfield Town and Bury gave him grounding for the future and as the Club Captain, he has matured in the back line with George Pilkington, to provide the Valiants with a formidable partnership. Sam is also a useful long-throw exponent.

CRAIG JAMES

Martin Foyle's first signing after impressing in a couple of loan games, Craig's pace and crossing from the left was quickly noticed by the manager and he had no hesitation when offered the chance to make his loan period permanent. Signed from Sunderland after a spell on loan at Darlington.


TYRONE LORAN

The former Manchester City man is currently on a month's loan at Vale Park from Tranmere Rovers. The versatile Dutchman made over thirty appearances for Rovers last season.

JAMES O'CONNOR

Signed on a month's loan from Aston Villa, after injuries and suspensions left Martin Foyle with a shortfall of defenders. Made a very impressive league debut for the Vale at Bradford and looks to have a good future in the game.

GEORGE PILKINGTON



As an ex-Everton youngster, with his only league experience during a loan period at Exeter City to count on, 'Pilks' meteoric rise in the side last term was nothing short of amazing. George can progress further in the

future, as a defender who shows composure by the bucket load. Comfortable all along the back four, he has endeared himself to the Vale Park faithful, as many saw him as the most valuable player last term.

SIMON ROBINSON

Another product of Vale's Youth set-up, Simon is well known to Martin Foyle and has earned the opportunity to sign professional terms with the club. May have to be patient for a first team spot, but the manager will have no qualms about pitching him in if needs require.

STEVE ROWLAND

Steve has been at Vale Park for near on eleven years. As another product of the youth team, he made more starts last season than ever before. Another versatile player who can play anywhere in the back four, Steve will be looking to build on the progress he has made so far and make the Welsh F.A. notice him again, having been called up twice to their Under-21 set up.

DEAN SMITH




CHRISTOPHER BIRCHALL

A pocket-battleship on the right, Chris has shown some promise coming into the side at the end of last season. His belligerent style, often compared to former Vale star Gareth Ainsworth, has already appeased the fans and Chris has given notice to be a performer to be reckoned with this term.

MICHAEL CUMMINS

Martin Foyle welcomed the re-signing of the genial Irishman, as he put pen to paper on a two-year deal in the closed season. Vale captured him from Middlesbrough and will have no regrets, as his influence on the side is marked, as is his versatility.

ROBIN HULBERT



The former Bristol City and Swindon Town midfielder became Martin Foyle's fourth summer signing after impressing during a trial period in the summer. A 'busy' type of player who the Vale boss believes can become an important cog in the wheel this season.

LEVI REID

Came into the side late last season and whilst many thought he would progress quicker, he finally arrived with some eye-catching performances from midfield. More starts will be a target for the season and Levi's versatility could well make him a vital addition to the 'engine room' of the side. A product of the club's youth set up.

JEFF SMITH

Joined the club from Bolton Wanderers in the summer and will be hoping to impress Martin Foyle and Dean Glover, who believe they can get the best out of him. He joined the Trotters from Bishop Auckland and had a reputation as one of the best crossers of a ball in non-league football.

STRIKERS

SIMON ELDERSHAW

Highly-rated at the club, Simon will be a man on a mission this season, as he aims to appear in the

starting line-up occasionally, after not getting the opportunity last term. Another product of youth set-up, the Stone-born forward knows this an important season to further his progress.

DAVE HIBBERT

Dave has worked his way up through the youth team and was signed as a professional in September. Has shown what he can do in the Under-19's side, but will obviously need time to adjust to the step up, but is one for the future.

NATHAN LOWNDES

Signed from Plymouth Argyle in November 2004, Martin Foyle believes Nathan can lend his experience to a young Vale side and get amongst the goals once he has settled in. He had hardly played any first-team football this season before coming to Vale Park, but last season was a key figure in the Pilgrims championship success.

LEE MATTHEWS

Joined Vale from Bristol City during the summer and will be hoping for a little more luck with injuries. Has had a stop-start career up to now, but Martin Foyle believes the player is now over his injuries and can fulfill his obvious potential at Vale Park.

BILLY PAYNTER

Winning personal awards is Billy's forte at present. Twice winner of the Young Player of the Year award and also of the first 'Shirt off the back award' from Vale's female supporters, Billy's all-action style has made him a fans' favourite. Never shirks a challenge and has an eye for goal. The only statistic the manager will not want increasing is his nine bookings from last term. HATTERS HISTORY

DESPITE the fact that both the Town and Port Vale have been in existence for well over a century, meetings between the sides have been few and far between.

In 1898/99 we were enjoying our second season as members of Football League Division Two and entertained newcomers Burslem Port Vale at Dunstable Road. Despite having most of the play we failed to make a breakthrough and were undone by a solitary goal from the visitors two minutes from the end.

We managed only one point from our next three meetings with the Vale, who left the Football League in 1900, and then we went over 50 years before clashing once more. Apart from a brief reunion in 1954/55 our next meetings all took place in the 1960's starting in 1963 following our relegation from Division Two.

On 9th October 1963 we switched on our new £10,000 floodlights and welcomed the Valiants, who looked likely to steal a point after Town centre-half, Gordon Fincham, missed a penalty. Fortunately, we managed to snatch only our second victory of the season when Tom McKechnie stabbed home the winner with ten minutes left to play.

The return was played the following week, but this time it was Vale who scored the only goal when the Town's ex-England international goalkeeper, Ron Baynham, was beaten just before the interval to send the crowd of 11,449 home happy but push us down nearer the bottom of Division Three.

In 1964/65 both games were again played within days of each other and in the clash at Vale Park the Town were unlucky to go down to an Albert Cheeseborough effort four minutes from the end. This victory ended a run of eight games without a win for Vale, which included an earlier 1-1 draw at Kenilworth Road when David Pleat equalised just before the end with an unstoppable shot.

As can be gathered, both the Town and Port Vale were pretty poor sides at the time and they accompanied each other down into Division Four at the end of that season. We finally managed a victory at Vale Park in 1965/66 and followed this up with a 5-0 home thumping, with all the goals coming in the first half. We only took one point from our two meetings the following season but in our promotion season of 1967/68 a 0-0 draw at Vale Park was followed by a routine 2-0 home win courtesy of goals from Ian Buxton and Bruce Rioch.

It was to be another 26 years before we met again, this time in Division One, and we upset the formbook when winning 1-0 at Vale Park in September 1994 shattering the Valiants year long unbeaten home record.

Since then results have tended to go in favour of the home team with last season's pair of fixtures typical. In a highly entertaining game at Kenilworth Road, goals from Gary McSheffrey and Kevin Foley saw off the league leaders while in the return a cruel late winner earned all three points for the home side.


EVACUATION PROCEDURE

Please leave the area of the ground as quickly as possible, by the route directed. Your co-operation will be most appreciated.

LUTON TOWN BELLES

FIRST TEAM

AFTER a great start to the league season, Belles faced their toughest test yet with an away trip to double champions Reading Royals. EARLIER this week it was announced that the Powerade Player of the Month trophy for League One was on its way to Luton for the third time in four months this season when nineteen-year-old defender Curtis Davies became the third different player to pick up the accolade, following in the footsteps of front pair Steve Howard (August) and Rowan Vine (September).

"It was a nice surprise," commented the London-born defender. "The gaffer came up, shook my hand and told me I had won it. I never would have thought a defender would win a player of the month award like this, especially in a month when we scored so many goals because normally they go to a striker.

With his first award as a professional under his belt, he is looking to complete another goal, quite literally. Davies finds himself as the only outfield member of the side not to have found the target so far this season, a position that fellow defender Sol Davis was in last season but having watched the left-back notch his first career goal against Wrexham at the start of November he is hoping he won't have to wait too long before his first goal of the

season – if only for some peace in the dressing room.


"Sol keeps winding me up," stated the Town's number twenty. "I think he will keep doing it until I do score but I know that when I do, I'll have a better strike ratio than he has! Hopefully, he won't get anymore so it won't be too hard to overtake him before the season is out. He has scored one goal and now all of a sudden he thinks he is prolific!"

Reflecting on one match in particular in November, the former Wimbledon defender, who joined the Hatters at sixteen, after he had been released by the Dons, found the recent game against the Milton Keynes Dons a strange experience.

He explained: "It was a weird situation, I spoke to a few of the lads before the game but then when the match started we just didn't say anything to each other. You just treat it as though you don't know them.

"I was just happy that we won the game, on a personal note people will expect it was good for me to put one over them but I don't see it like that. The people who released me are not there anymore so I didn't see it as big a thing, it was just another match.

"I'm glad that things have turned out the way that they did and I am pleased to be at Luton, I am happy here and really enjoying my football."

TRAVEL INFO

HOW TO GET TO BRISTOL CITY



By Road: Leave Luton on the M1 south, then take the M25 west. Near Heathrow turn onto the M4 heading west. Leave M4 at junction 19, onto the M32. Follow this in to Bristol centre, following signs for Bristol Airport. The ground is well signposted all the way into Ashton, where the stadium is visible.

By Rail: The nearest railway station is Bristol Temple Meads, which is a few miles from the ground and far too far to walk. Taxi costs vary from £6-£10.

By Bus: Buses are supplied by Abus 'Service A' which costs a flat rate of 50p. The buses pick-up one hour before kick-off from the following places - Temple Meads, Old Market (Temple Way), Haymarket, Centre, Anchor Road, Hotwells. The buses return to all those destinations after the match, leaving from Ashton Road, by the Greville Smyth Park.

Parking: There are plenty of streets to park in around the ground.

By Coach with Town on Tour: Leaving Maple Road at 10am. The fare for LTSC members is £15, £13 for junior and senior members and £17 for non-members. HOW TO GET TO CHESTERFIELD



By Road: Head up the M1 all the way to junction 29 at the roundabout take the second exit A617, it's dual carriageway for 7 miles or so. At the end of the A617 get in the middle lane and at the roundabout take the second exit, still the A617, keep in the left-hand lane. At the next roundabout take the first exit onto the A619. Follow the A619 passed a retail shops at the West Bars roundabout in the right hand lane and take the 3rd exit, into Folljambe Road. At the top of the Hill go straight over at the traffic lights, follow the road round keep in the right hand lane and turn right onto Cross Street.

By Rail: There is a regular train service to Chesterfield. From the Station follow the path that leads past the Chesterfield Hotel and over a footbridge. Pass the Pomegranate Theatre on your left and at the Crooked Spire bear right. Follow the road round past a department store on your left. After 400 yards or so you will join Saltergate. The ground is situated at the far end, past the council offices.

By Bus: Plenty of local and national bus services into the town centre. Saltergate is a few minutes walk from the centre of town.

Parking: There are many carparks to choose from within five minutes walk from the football ground. There is a car park at the top of Ashgate Road which is a one-minute walk from Saltergate next to 'Manor College'. There are several town centre car parks, two next to the Chesterfield Town Hall which is, again, a one minute walk away from Saltergate. There is also ample street parking around Saltergate.

COMING NEXT

COLCHESTER UNITED may have surprised many with their impressive start to the season but manager Phil Parkinson, has assembled a strong group of players to certainly mount a challenge for promotion this campaign.

The U's provide Luton's next opponents at Kenilworth Road and although results have been disappointing in recent weeks, Colchester enjoyed a rich run of form at the beginning of the season to suggest they will provide tough opponents.

A 3-0 victory at Sheffield Wednesday on the opening day started a run of four victories from a possible five and saw United challenging Luton for top spot in the League One table.

The Layer Road club have struggled to maintain that form in recent matches but have pulled off impressive results away at Torquay United and a 5-2 success over League Two outfit Rushden & Diamonds in the F.A. Cup.

The goals of Craig Fagan and Greg Halford have contributed to Colchester's good form this season. Fagan has bagged eleven goals this season whilst Halford has also contributed with eight, including a hat-trick in the win over Rushden & Diamonds.

Former Reading midfielder Parkinson has worked wonders in his first managerial job and

has established the club as a hard-working League One side with players who can compete at this level.

Sam Stockley, the former Barnet and Oxford United midfielder, is highly rated at Layer Road whilst in the shape of Richard Garcia they have a young player who is already scoring goals at this level.

Luton have endured mixed results in games with Colchester in recent years. Many fans will remember the Town's excellent 5-0 victory over the U's on the final day of the 2002/03 season in which Steve Howard struck a memorable hat-trick.

Last season, the Hatters secured four points over Colchester with a 1-0 victory at Kenilworth Road thanks to a strike from Enoch Showunmi, six weeks after they had claimed a point at Layer Road in a 1-1 Boxing Day draw.


