THE MANAGER


HELLO and welcome to Kenilworth Road for today's F.A. Cup third round tie with Brentford. Welcome also to Martin Allen, his staff, players, directors and supporters from Griffin Park.

The F.A. Cup is always special and both sides will see this as an opportunity to progress to the fourth round and possibly a more glamorous draw or certainly a more profitable one.

The cup comes at a good time for us and provides a welcome rest bite from an arduous league programme. The Christmas and New Year schedule was hectic to say the least and even in my time as a player I can't remember playing two games in three days for two weeks running and then having to play the F.A. Cup third round in the same week.

We appreciate the following we had at Chesterfield and Peterborough and also the full house against Sheffield Wednesday. It is an expensive time of year and supporters pay good money and it is unreasonable to expect teams to produce their best quality four times in eight days.

The fact that we have slipped to second in the league doesn't bother me one little bit. The pessimists and doubters out



there and those who like to see teams fall after building them up will be ready to say everything has gone pear shaped. The facts are that Hull City have won their last nine games and should be given credit for that. We have lost one game out of the last eleven games and picked up twenty-two points. That is averaging two points per game, which is promotion form in anyone's language or league.

I have complete faith in our players and their character and belief. You don't drop points when you draw, you gain one and for those who believe it is better to lose the odd game and win one rather than draw a few, I would say you have obviously not experienced the feeling of getting beaten. There are twenty league games left and a possible sixty points to play for. That is more than we have got now.

The biggest factor we have in our favour is that when everyone was telling us how good we were and how good a job we were doing, we didn't listen to it or believe it. And when those doubters or doom mongers start questioning us, we won't be listening to them either.

Enjoy the game and get behind the lads.





MARTIN ALLEN



FORMER Queens Park Rangers midfielder Martin Allen took over from Wally Downes as Brentford manager in March 2004, leaving his post at Conference side Barnet to take up the position.

In the final seven games of last season he oversaw his side pick up eighteen points from their final nine matches to ensure their Second Division status. That form has continued this year and the Bees currently sit on the fringes of a play-off position, something they will be keen to build on over the coming months.

As a player Allen served QPR, West Ham United and Portsmouth before he took up coaching and held the position of assistant manager at Reading and Barnet, prior to his full-time appointment in the hot seat at Underhill.

GOALKEEPERS

ALAN JULIAN

Alan has graduated through the youth ranks at Griffin Park, and during the past three seasons has earned international recognition with the Northern Ireland under-19 and under-21 squads. The 21-year-old has proved to be more than competent cover when called into the first-team.

JOSH LENNIE

Josh is in the third year of his Scholarship this season and made his debut for Brentford on the bench for the LDV Vans Trophy match at Barnet last October.

STUART NELSON

Brentford signed Stuart from Unibond Premier side Hucknall Town in February 2004 for an eventual fee of £10,000. The former Cirencester goalkeeper forced his way into the first team after the departure of Paul Smith to Southampton. Has also been on the books of Millwall, Oxford City and Doncaster Rovers.

DEFENDERS

MICHAEL DOBSON

Michael, who has been with the Club since the age of ten, was handed the captaincy of the side two years ago. He has shown tremendous leadership qualities, and together with his insatiable appetite for the game he has the ability to progress still further.

SCOTT FITZGERALD

Experienced centre-back who signed permanently for the Bees after a two-month loan spell from Colchester United. Has now made over 330 League appearances in a fifteen-year career which has spanned five clubs; Wimbledon, Sheffield United (loan), Millwall, the U's.

ANDREW FRAMPTON

A former Crystal Palace player, Andy joined the Bees in October 2002. Injury prevented him from staking a regular place in the side his first season at Griffin Park, but the left sided defender or midfielder has made amends with a string of impressive performances.

SEAN HILLIER

Right back who was a regular in Brentford's under-19 side last season. Broke into the reserves and has impressed enough to earn a squad number.

LUKE MULDOWNEY

Luke is now in the third year of his scholarship, and is developing into a bright prospect. He displays good passing attributes and awareness.

ANDY MYERS

A summer signing from Colchester United, Andy returns back to his local roots, having been Hounslow born and bred. Won a European Cup Winners' Cup medal with Chelsea in 1997. After leaving Chelsea he joined Bradford, where he had a loan spell with Portsmouth before joining the U's. He is expected to fill the left-back role this season.

JAMIE PALMER

Jamie, a third year Scholar, is a strong and solid centre back, giving 100% to the cause and there when needed. He can also operate at right-back.

MIDFIELDERS

SAM SODJE

Sam signed in the summer from Conference side Margate. He has performed at centre-back regularly for the Kent side, and won player of the year in 2002/03. The 25-year-old is the brother of former Hatter and current Huddersfield player Efe Sodje.

MICHAEL TURNER

Centre-back who originally signed on loan from Charlton Athletic. Has since been signed permanently until the end of the 2007 season. Spent a successful loan period with Leyton Orient in 2002/03 plus a six-month work experience with Italian giants Internazionale in 2000/01.

MIDFIELDERS

CHRIS HARGREAVES

The hardworking mid-fielder spent four successful seasons at Northampton Town before being snapped up by the Bees in the summer. An experienced campaigner, Chris can operate

on either the left or the centre of midfield. Prior to joining the Cobblers he has had spells with Grimsby Town, Hull City, West Bromwich Albion, Hereford United and Plymouth Argyle.

STEPHEN HUNT

Steve, a former Republic of Ireland under-21 international, joined Brentford from Crystal Palace in the summer of 2001. His bubbly personality has enamoured him to team-mates and supporters alike. He ended last season as Brentford's top goalscorer.

EDDIE HUTCHINSON

Eddie, signed four years ago from Sutton United, is expected to feature strongly for the Bees this year, having played in most of Brentford's League games last season. A strong running midfielder, his ability in the air is rarely equalled. Runner up in last season's "Player of the Year" voted for by the supporters.

JAMIE LAWRENCE

The 34-year-old midfielder made his debut for Brentford against Port Vale, as a non-contract player. However since then he has been secured on a short-term contract. He began his career with Sunderland and then went on to play for Doncaster Rovers, Leicester City, Bradford City, Walsall, and Grimsby Town before signing for the Bees. He's a current Jamaican International having represented them in the World Cup qualifying stages earlier this season.

JAMES MORRISON

Jamie is a midfielder who shows good endurance and passing abilities. He is a third year scholar.

KEVIN O'CONNOR

Kevin has made tremendous progress since signing professional forms as a seventeen year old.

He made over 50 appearances for the Bees last season and he has subsequently become a mainstay of the side. His performances earned him deserved recognition in the Republic of Ireland Under-21 squad.

RYAN PETERS

Ryan, a seventeen-year-old left winger, has performed admirably in his spells with the reserve team last season. Ryan played for both the under-17 and under-19 youth sides. He is quick and energetic and is tipped to make his first team debut before long. This is his second year as a scholar and he is currently gaining experience while on loan with Gravesend & Northfleet.

JOHN SALAKO


Ex-England International, who joined Brentford on a one-year contract in August. Worked his way through the youth ranks at Selhurst Park to represent England five times, making over 200 appearances for the Eagles. He then signed for Coventry, spending a time on loan with Bolton before moves to Fulham, Charlton Athletic and Reading followed.

MATTHEW SOMNER

Matt, like a number of his teammates, has graduated through the Bees youth team. However his appearances have been limited and he is currently on loan at Cambridge United in League Two.

JAY TABB

He has shown himself to be a player of tremendous ability and has now forced his way into the reckoning on a regular basis. A product of the Bees youth set up, he made his debut for the Republic of Ireland



under-21 side in May, just days after being named as Brentford's "Player of the Year".

STEWART TALBOT

Stewart joined Brentford on a free transfer in February 2004 on a two-and-a-half year contract, making his debut against the Hatters in last season's league game at Kenilworth Road. A former club captain with Rotherham United,

Stewart is a combative midfielder with long range shooting ability, who started out at Moor Green and then joined Rotherham from Port Vale.

STRIKERS

DEON BURTON

Jamaican International striker, who has recently represented the 'Reggae Boyz' in their 2006 World Cup qualifying campaign. Deon signed a one-year contract with a further year's option from Premiership Portsmouth in the summer. Starting out there in 1993, he left Fratton Park in August 1997 for Derby County in a deal worth over a million pounds, re-joining Pompey in December 2002.

STEVE CLARIDGE

The experienced forward with over 200 goals and 700 first team appearances to his name, joined the Club in December 2004 after a brief spell at Brighton. Began his career with Bournemouth and went on to play for Weymouth, Crystal Palace, Aldershot, Cambridge United, the Hatters, Birmingham City, Leicester City, Portsmouth, Wolves, Millwall before he took over as Player/Manager at Weymouth.

MATT HARROLD

Matt was signed from Ryman's League side Harlow Town in the summer of 2003, having impressed in two reserve outings for Brentford. He hit the headlines when scoring a hat-trick in the Bees F.A. Cup 1st Round tie last season

against Gainsborough Trinity, in only his third start for the Bees. He is currently on loan with Dagenham & Redbridge.

SAN LEE

San, a former Korean under-20 International, joined Brentford this summer on a one-year contract from West Ham United. The striker made his Bees' debut in the 3-0 pre-season behind-closed-doors friendly win over Hornchurch

BEN MAY

Ben re-joined the Bees on loan from Millwall earlier this month, having spent the whole of last season at Griffin Park on loan. He scored seven goals in forty starts for Brentford last season and added to his tally in his first League game upon his return, scoring the second against the Hatters at the start of December.

ISAIAH RANKIN

26-year-old Isaiah joined Brentford in the summer on a one-year contract from Grimsby Town, where he scored four goals in twelve starts for the Mariners. A former Arsenal striker, he moved to Bradford City in 1998 for over a million pounds and had loan spells at Birmingham City and Bolton Wanderers while with the Bantams.


ALEX RHODES

Signed by Brentford from Newmarket Town in November 2003 having scored twenty goals for the Eastern Counties Premiership club last season, including four hat-tricks. Netted the winner against the Bees against AFC Bournemouth on the last day of the season.

TEAM NEWS

Striker Alex Rhodes has been ruled out for at least a month with a serious knee injury and he joins hamstring victim Michael Dobson, who has been out since August, on the sidelines. In recent weeks, Brentford have been boosted by the return of midfielder Eddie Hutchinson from a groin injury having previously missed the majority of the season so far. Scott Fitzgerald is another long term absentee to return to the first team picture, the former Wimbledon defender made his first start for three months in their 3-2 defeat away to Bournemouth on New Years Day.



CLUB CAPTAIN

ALTHOUGH the year has not got off to the start we would have liked with two draws in the league we have extended our unbeaten run to six matches now. Sheffield Wednesday was a tough game for us, but we always knew that it would be, because it is one that jumps out of you when you look at the fixture list. It was our biggest home crowd of the season and unfortunately we could not start the year with the three points that we wanted.

It was a sloppy goal to concede but the players have done well and responded in the right manner, we got ourselves back into the match through Howie and I think that it was a fair result, given the chances that both teams created in the second half.

A lot of people might think that at the start of the season you would take a point against a side like Wednesday but the lads were not happy with it, especially coming on the back of a draw with Colchester United. When we went to Hillsborough early in the season we felt a draw was a good result up there because, although it brought an end to our 100% record, it kept our unbeaten record going. We wanted to get back to winning ways at home, they came here fourth in the league and it was a difficult match for us.

But then every game at this level is tough, as we found at Peterborough. Over the Christmas period we were playing every two days and that does take a lot out of you, which is why the Gaffer decided to freshen things up. Although we didn't play as well as we are capable of, we took the lead with a free-kick but after that they penned us in and made it difficult for us to add to that. That is the



sort of team Peterborough are, they score a lot of their goals from set-pieces; putting players in the box to hit from free-kicks and Andy Legg's long throw.

It showed the character we have as a team to get back into the match after we had fallen behind. The important thing was that we were able to get something out of the game although we left London Road disappointed not to have picked up three points.

It meant that Hull over took us at the top of the league but that is not something that worries us, there are twenty games to go and just because they are top now does not mean they have won the league. There are a lot of the teams around us who will have to come to Kenilworth Road and they won't fancy that. It is never easy and I am sure that the fans know that, you only have to look at Chelsea, Ipswich and Scunthorpe who have been in the same position as us in the other leagues.

This afternoon we have a nice break from the league before our game with Stockport next week and we hope that we can get a good result this afternoon and earn a place in the next round. It would be nice to win and get a good draw in the fourth round, we want to do well in this competition but our main aim is to win this league and that will always be our priority.





HATTERS HISTORY

WE HAVE to go back to 1952 to record the last time the Hatters took on the Bees in the F.A. Cup, with the tie eventually going to three gruelling games before Luton emerged as the victors.

The first game in this fourth round tie saw Gordon Turner net after 18 minutes at Kenilworth Road and then watch as Brentford's veteran goalkeeper Ted Gaskell performed miracles, keeping out three goalbound efforts from Bert Mitchell, George Stobart and Jack Taylor.

When Taylor scored the second soon after the interval the game seemed over but the Bees Billy Sperrin, whose son was later to play for the Town, turned the tie on its head netting twice to force a replay.

The replay almost did not go ahead on the allotted day of 6th February due to the death of the King that morning but frantic phone calls to the F.A. confirmed that the match should take place and in the event 31,143 turned up at Griffin Park in sombre mood but were soon roaring their approval as the contest swung from end to end.

The Town started the brighter but the Bees came into the game as the interval approached with

Billy Dare hitting the woodwork twice. The Luton defence stood firm and were then able to set up attacks with Taylor proving a thorn in the side of the home side.

Extra-time could not separate the teams who were still going at it hammer and tongs as the referees blew the final whistle with the ball bouncing around in the Bees penalty box.

No penalty competitions in those days and a second replay was quickly arranged with both teams travelling to Highbury to resume this marathon contest. This time an intrigued crowd of 37,269 were present to see the Town take the lead after only thirty seconds when Taylor's shot was deflected past Gaskell by full-back Kenny Horne.

Dare levelled on the half hour but within five minutes Bernard Moore put the Hatters back into the lead. With seven minutes remaining Dare levelled the tie once more and again the punch drunk supporters were about to witness another period of extra time.

Finally, the pace of the game began to slacken off and the battle was confined to the midfield area. With only seven minutes left of extra time Bob Morton picked up the ball on the halfway line and with no-one challenging him advanced to the edge of the area before unleashing an unstoppable left foot shot for a goal which deserved to win any game.

Brentford conceded that the Town had deserved to win this third clash and wished us well as we set out to take on Swindon in the fifth round. For the record we saw off the Robins 3-1 before going out to Arsenal at Kenilworth Road in the quarter-final in front of a then record crowd of 28,433.



On leaving the stadium, you will find some roads closed to pedestrians, to enable swift and unobstructed access for the emergency services. Please leave the area of the ground as quickly as possible, by the route directed. Your co-operation will be most appreciated.

KEVIN FOLEY

FOR the second season running the Hatters are playing for a place in the fourth round of F.A. Cup and with better odds of drawing a Premiership side at stake for the victors, it is a big afternoon for all the players and in particular, Kevin Foley.

The 20-year-old, in only his second season in professional football, has already made over sixty appearances for the club despite only graduating from his teenage years last November.

"Just to play in the F.A. Cup is a fantastic opportunity because it is such a famous competition, known throughout the world," stated the Town's Young Player of the Year. "It was exciting for me last year to get to the fourth round and although we weren't able to progress further, I realised I had already achieved something that not every player will do in their career by getting to that stage of the cup."

"It is something I naturally want to better this year and if we win, who knows what might be waiting for us in the next round. As a youngster you hope that you will play at the highest level you can so just to get to play against a top side, for one match, would be an incentive to do well in the future. Everyone wants to play in front of big crowds in the best stadiums during your career."


"We know we need to do well against Brentford first and then hope

that the draw is kind to us. For the players and the fans, it is nice just to have a home tie because we have hardly played a cup game at Kenilworth Road in the last couple of years, certainly since I've been part of the first-team squad and our home form is something we can be proud of.

"Having said that, form doesn't mean anything in this competition, which is perhaps part of its attraction and Brentford are a strong side, they will have the same hopes that we do of getting through so it will be a tough, physical game."

The game brings with it added spice for the Hatters youngster as he finds himself up against his Republic of Ireland Under-21 team-mate, Jay Tabb. The pair were called into the squad together at the end of last season and made their debuts in a 3-1 win over Scotland in May.

Foley added: "He is a good player and we got on well, we were thrown in together and shared a room while we were away. Both being in the same situation helped us hit it off. Neither of us had represented Ireland at school boy level but because most of the other lads were from Premiership sides we went into the squad as two of the most experienced players because we had both had a season of regular league football."



CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE

THE beginning of a new year marks the start of the decision making process for the scholarship intake for the next season and the break in youth team matches over the festive period gave Youth Development Officer, Mark Ridgway, the chance to reflect on the progress in the Club's Centre of Excellence.

The start of the current campaign saw a change in the age groups at youth team level with the two senior age groups dropping down a year from under-19's and under-17's.

"At the beginning of the season the under-18's were quite strong because Marvin Johnson was able to field his four overage players," commented Ridgway on the initial impact of the change. "The knock on effect of that, along with the third year scholars, meant that the under-16's were also at full strength at the start of the year because there wasn't the usual requirement for players to step up.

"For the last few years we have played youngsters who have had the chance to progress to a scholarship in our under-18 side because it has always been a benefit for our schoolboys to appear for the older youth team in their final year, this season that has happened a good six weeks earlier than usual.

"The way things are working now some of the stronger under-13's are playing regularly for the under-16 squad, this is not something we have done before but we are not alone as several clubs are progressing their younger players along the same lines."

With both the first-team and the reserves competing at the top of their respective leagues, the impact of this has naturally affected the make up of the youth sides.

Ridgway explained: "With a strong first-team squad there is good competition for the reserves as well. The reserve team is a natural progression for the youth team players to aim for, but our under-16's need to establish themselves in our under-18 side first.

"So far, I am pleased to say, that having stepped up to that level, they have not looked out of place, which means there are seven or eight boys with an opportunity of a scholarship.

"It also means we have enough choice within the club structure, that we do not need to look outside of the club, which says a lot about the progress we have made because there are clubs at this level who rely on the intake of scholars from outside their own centre of excellence programme."



Finally, I was pleased to see Calvin do well for the first-team over the Christmas period, he was involved in a couple of the games and from what I have seen he demonstrated his ability.





LIFELONG Town supporter Phillipa Titmuss enjoyed a surprise in October last year when she visited Cleethorpes and attended the annual Cleethorpes Golf Club Dinner and Dance, whilst visiting relatives for the weekend, and unbeknown to her initially she found herself in the company of a former Hatter.

"On arrival we were allocated tables for dinner and we proceeded to all sit down for the meal," she explained. "I sat with my partner and to my right was a gentleman I did not know, we started talking. With his Scottish twang and my southern accent, it became apparent that we were both not from the area, although he had settled in Cleethorpes thirty years ago.

"He continued to ask me where I lived and I replied, Dunstable, and he laughed, replying that he had lived there some years ago when he played for Luton Town. It turned out I was talking to Matt Tees who played for the Hatters as a centre forward in 1969.

"Obviously this was way before my time as a Luton Town supporter but I was amazed to be at a golf dinner 200 miles from home and end up sitting with an ex-Hatter! It turned out to be a very interesting evening reminiscing times Matt shared whilst at Kenilworth Road all those years ago!"

Tees originally joined Grimsby Town from Airdrie in 1963, before 36 goals during the 1965/66 season brought him to the attention of Charlton.

It was from the Valley that he arrived at Luton for £25,000, at the same time as Chris Nicholl joined from Halifax and the pair made their debuts in a 2-0 win at Gillingham on 30th August 1969. The Johnstone-born forward netted 15 times in 40 matches for the Hatters, proving to be a great foil for the young Malcolm Macdonald. Excellent in the air and a good targetman, he helped Luton

win promotion to the old Division Two at the end of that season but Tees found the step up just too much for someone over 30 and returned to his first love, Grimsby Town.

His second spell with the Mariners lasted a further three years where he cemented his legendary status before hanging up his boots in 1974 after a season with Boston.

SUPPORTERS will be interested to learn of Luton supporter Ian Stacey's experience in the New York marathon at the beginning of November.

The Hatters season ticket holder missed the victory over Wrexham to compete in the event and completed the 26.2 mile run in four hours, twenty-one minutes although he has claimed that the first seven minutes were spent just getting to the starting line because of the 37,000 runners who took part in the race. A stark contrast to his solitary training runs with his dog, Heskey.

His time saw him finish in a respectable 13,266th place overall, with the men's race was won by Hendrik Ramaala of South Africa in 2:09:27. England's Paula Radcliffe took the honours in the women's event in just over two hours and twenty minutes.




Having previously entered the Chicago and the London marathons, Stacey was pleased to complete his hat-trick of runs.


LIKE most football fans, BBC Match of the Day's Garth Crooks and Steve Wilson both regard the F.A. Cup as a special part of the football season, and have fond recollections of the competition through the years.

Both Crooks, twice an F.A. Cup winner with Spurs, and Match of the Day commentator Wilson, are in the enviable position of working at top football matches week in week out, but they both regard the chance to work on an F.A. Cup match as something special.

"It sounds a bit clichéd, but genuinely massive surprises are a little bit few and far between at Champions League and even Premiership level," commented Wilson. "For just a few hours on a Saturday afternoon, two or three times a year, almost anything can happen."

Likewise for Crooks, "It's the only competition that incorporates every single club in the country, simple as that."

"It invokes the dreams and aspirations of every football fan young or old. The possibility of winning this one cup competition brings everyone together. It really embraces the football family."

As a native of Stoke, and a former Stoke City player, Crooks still tries to follow his former club through the F.A. Cup, but this year he tips one of five clubs to lift the famous trophy.

He explains: "I always look at their results, it has always been the first result that I look for. I


don't have the same affection for Stoke as I do for Spurs, as Tottenham changed my life. But I do have an affection for Stoke, as it gave me a real opportunity."

"I think this year the Cup will probably go to one of five teams. Your first three are the usual suspects, Manchester United, Arsenal and Chelsea."

"I'd also stick in there Newcastle, as there's something in the way they play that suits cup ties. And of course Liverpool."

Wilson, who as a commentator is aware of the statistics through the years, also sees the big Premiership clubs as being the favourites.

"If you go through F.A. Cup finals in the last twenty-five years, you will always get one of what you would say are the big six in the final. By that I refer to Liverpool, Everton, Manchester United, Arsenal, Spurs and Chelsea."



"The last time one of those was not in the Cup Final was 1975, with West Ham against Fulham. So although you would expect there to be a healthy contingent of clubs from outside the Premiership in the last eight, you can probably expect that by the time it gets around to this year's final one of those six will be there."


