THE CHAIRMAN

A SPECIAL welcome to today's visitors Hull City, their Chairman Adam Pearson and his fellow directors, supporters, management and players. There is not a weekend in my home that goes by without reference to Peter Taylor's team and their results. I hope it is the same for them regarding our results.

From this point of the season every game for the two teams that are at the top of the league is crucial, and so it is for today's game, which has been a sell-out for home and away supporters for the last two weeks.

If it had not been for our limited capacity at Kenilworth Road we could have sold many more tickets, which highlighted the importance of our relocation plans for the club's long term future.

At the request of Hull City, and so as not to disappoint many of their travelling supporters who missed out on their away ticket allocation, we agreed with Hull's request to transmit the game live, back to their Kingston Communications Centre Stadium.

Competing at the top of our League continues to create an intense atmosphere and excitement, and the pressures that it brings to players and supporters alike. However, I am certain that none of us would have it any other way.

We were all disappointed that the referee at our away game at Huddersfield Town last Saturday saw fit to make a report against our goalkeeper Marlon after the conclusion of

the game. Marlon, who has not had any cautions in twenty-six games this season, faced a disciplinary hearing yesterday arising from that alleged report. He will of course be supported by the Club at the hearing and we are hopeful that the report against him by the referee will not affect his selection for today's game.

With such a highly charged match for both teams, arguably intensified by a number of unpopular decisions for both sets of supporters it resulted in a total of five bookings, four being handed out to our players. This was disappointing from the club's point of view, as the number of cautions at the end of January was down by thirty three per cent from the same period last season.

We have great strength and depth in our squad, but to keep our momentum going, and to guard against further suspensions and injuries, our manager Michael with the boards support has been looking to add to the squad through possibility of transfers and loans in the run up to the important last third of the season.

As always I look forward to you getting behind the lads

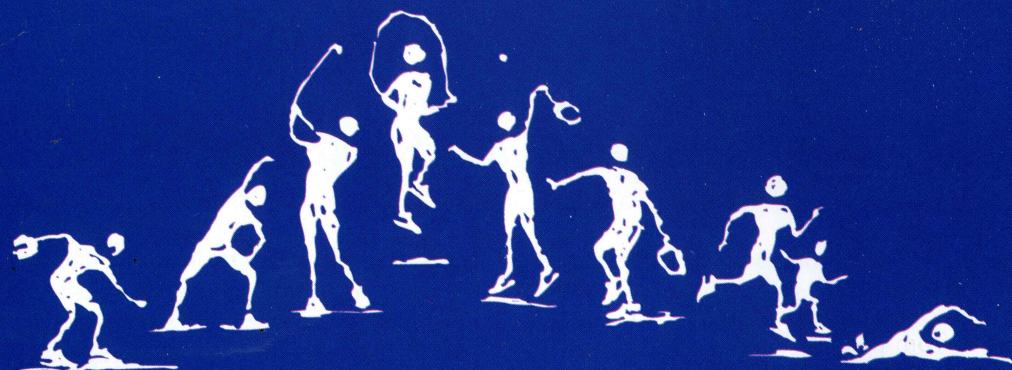

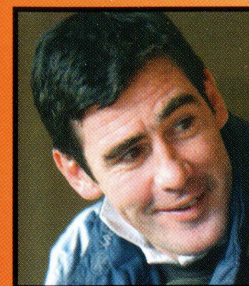

THE MANAGER

HELLO AND welcome to Kenilworth Road for today's game against Hull City. Welcome also to Peter Taylor, his staff, players, directors and supporters from the K.C Stadium. Peter has done a great job there in the last two years and may well be looking at successive promotions, which is no mean feat at any level of football. Today's encounter is one that has been eagerly awaited by our supporters for a while now and it promises to be a big day.

My comments in the media last week regarding the difficulty of bringing new players into the club, may well have been misinterpreted by many people as a lack of backing from the board. That is not the case. I have had their full support in everything I have asked for so far and I can assure you that if there was pots of cash to spend they would make it available.

Unfortunately it is a slow process following administration and there are still restrictions put on us by the Football League. The board's first job was to stabilise the club and to make it manageable which has proved to be a much bigger task than anyone could have imagined. They are well aware of the position we are in football wise and will do everything possible to help us in the final third of the season.

It would be crazy to assume that because of what we have achieved so far it follows that we can continue with what we have already. We do not doubt the players ability or resolve for one minute but we must be prepared for what's round the corner.

The story that has grabbed all the headlines in the last two weeks is the 'tapping' of a high profile player. There is talk of docking clubs points and other punishments but amazingly there is no mention of censure for the FIFA and FA licensed agents who are clearly involved in these matters. If clubs are accountable then so should agents be and for The FA and Premier League to ignore what some agents are doing and have done for the game, particularly at a lower level is not acceptable. They are there to represent players which I have no problem with but when they start representing clubs there becomes a conflict of interest which would never be allowed in any other business.

The next two games are crucial and we know we can count on your support. I'm sure that those of you thinking of making the trip to Hartlepool will be frustrated it's another evening game and a late trip back. We do appreciate the backing and we also know that those of you that can't make it will be eagerly glued to radios and web sites. We never know what the outcome will be but we are always sure that the players will give us everything

Enjoy the game and get behind the lads

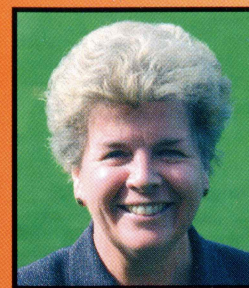

29 Luton claim their fifth draw from six league games with a 1-1 result against Tranmere Rovers. Kevin Nicholls' second-half penalty helps seal a vital point against our promotion rivals.

- 10** 10 Nobby Stiles MBE was the guest speaker at Luton's latest sporting dinner.

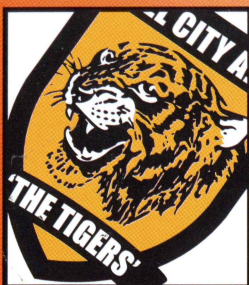

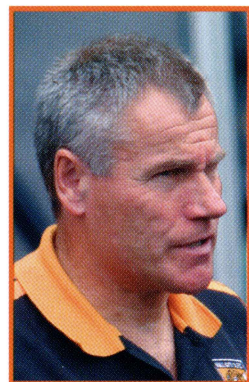

MANAGER

PETER TAYLOR



Peter Taylor returned to management with Hull City on October 14 2002, just five months after resigning as Brighton and Hove Albion boss. Peter replaced Jan Molby at Boothferry Park after the former Liverpool midfielder's six-month reign ended following a disappointing start to the season for The Tigers.

Since his first appointment to league management, with Southend, in 1993, Peter has enjoyed a varied career, which has seen him involved in every division in English football as well as the international set-up.

Peter was given charge of the England under-21 side in 1996 and enjoyed considerable success in the post before being controversially replaced in 1999 by the FA's Technical Director Howard Wilkinson.

His achievements with both the under-21s and Gillingham were recognized by a number of Premiership chairmen and Leicester snapped him up in June 2000.

After leaving Leicester in September 2001, Peter returned to the dugout with Brighton, taking the Seagulls to the Second Division championship before leaving his post just eight days after the club's final game of the season.

Peter's absence from the game was short-lived, and after working as a television pundit for a few months, as well as helping out Barry Fry with some coaching at Peterborough, he returned to the hot seat with Hull City.

GOALKEEPERS

MATT DUKE

Matt Duke joined Chesterfield on non-contract terms in January 1995 before moving on to Matlock Town and Alfreton Town. A dream came true in September 1999 when he joined Sheffield United - the team he supported as a boy. Although, he wasn't to make a senior outing for his beloved Blades, Matt did gain further recognition with a loan move to Bury. In September 2000, he joined non-leaguers Burton Albion and produced a string of consistent performances as the club gained promotion to the Conference for the first time in 2002. Matt made 94 appearances during his four-year spell at Eton Park before departing for a fee of £20,000 to make the move back into the Football League with the Tigers.

BO MYHILL

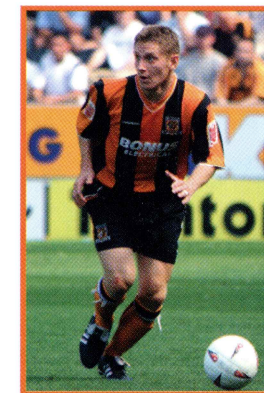
Bo Myhill began his football career at the tender age of 12 when he joined Aston Villa. The American born goalkeeper then had loan spells at Stoke City and Bristol City without making his first team debut but that finally came when he went on loan to First Division Bradford City in November 2002. Boaz got his first taste of Third Division football during a 16-game loan stint at Macclesfield Town at the start of the 2003-04 season. Shortly before joining the Tigers in a £50,000 deal in December 2003, he had also been on loan at Stockport County.

DEFENDERS

LEON COURT

Leon followed the Tigers in to the new Coca-Cola League One when he left Southend United to sign a two-year contract at the KC Stadium in July 2004. Signed by Millwall from non-league Dulwich Hamlet in January 1998, Leon enjoyed Conference experience at Forest Green Rovers and Stevenage Borough but had failed to make his Lions debut before moving to Southend in the 2001 close season. He immediately claimed a first team place and was selected in the Blues starting line-up in every Third Division game from September 2001 - an unbroken run of 130 league appearances.

ANDY DAWSON



At the time widely regarded as the one of the most outstanding performers in the Third Division, the Tigers brought Andy from Scunthorpe United in June 2003. Dawson, elder brother of the current Tottenham defender Michael, started his career at Forest before making a total of 225 appearances for Scunthorpe during five years at the club. Dawson moved to Hull in May 2003 and went on to be a key member of the promotion winning team with his efforts recognised with selection in the PFA's Division Three Team of the Year.

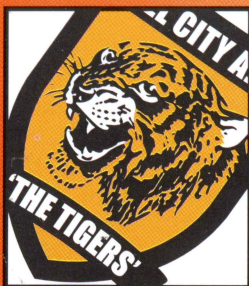
DAMIEN DELANEY



Having brought Damien across from Ireland when he was manager of Leicester City, Peter Taylor signed the Republic of Ireland Under-21 international on his first official day in charge of the Tigers. During his stay at Leicester, Damien went on-loan spells at Stockport County and Huddersfield Town. A further loan at Mansfield Town ended with his move to the Tigers. Damien became the last Tigers player to score at Boothferry Park before they moved to their new KC Stadium.

ROLAND EDGE

Roland returned south after a years stay at Scottish outfit Hibernian to team up with his former Gillingham manager Peter Taylor at the KC Stadium. Roland began his career with Gillingham and after making his debut against Chesterfield in September 1998, he went on to make over 100 appearances for the Gills.



HULL CITY

MARC JOSEPH

Versatile Marc started his career at Cambridge United where he made 175 appearances for the club, becoming a firm favorite with fans. After failing to score during his stay at the Abbey Stadium, the Leicester-born defender switched to Cambridgeshire rivals Peterborough United on a free transfer in the 2001 close season and soon became a regular starter in the Posh line-up. The defender was quickly snapped up by Hull in 2002 and has since gone on to become a regular in the Hull defence.

ALTON THELWELL

Peter Taylor returned to one of his former clubs in securing the signature of the talented Tottenham Hotspur defender. Alton came through the ranks at White Hart Lane and was selected for first-team duties during George Graham's reign in charge. The versatile defender remained in and out of the first team squad before spending two months of the summer of 2000 playing for Swedish Second Division part-timers IFK Hassleholm. The 2002-03 season proved to be hugely frustrating as a persistent groin strain ruled him out for all but the last few weeks of the term. Taylor's friendship with the former England boss alerted him to Alton's availability, and he became the first player to join us directly and permanently from Tottenham Hotspur since 1937.

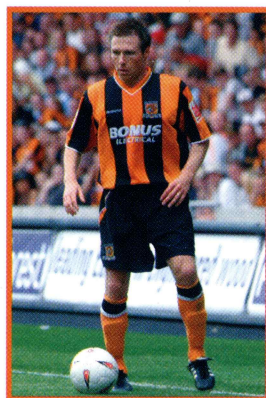
MIDFIELDERS

IAN ASHBEE

Following Stuart Green and Richie Appleby, Ian became the third signing in Hull's midfield. Having began his career at Derby County, Ian moved to Cambridge United to become Roy McFarland's first signing at the club in December 1996 and went on to become a key player at the

Abbey Stadium. A former England youth international, Ian won promotion with Cambridge to Division Two in 1999. Ian signed for the Tigers in 2002, signing a three-year deal with the club.

NICK BARMBY



Nick Barmby's signing in 2004 has been regarded as the biggest-ever signing in the club's history. The former Tottenham midfielder became one of the most sought-after young stars in the country. His tremendous ability was nurtured by Terry Venables at White Hart Lane in

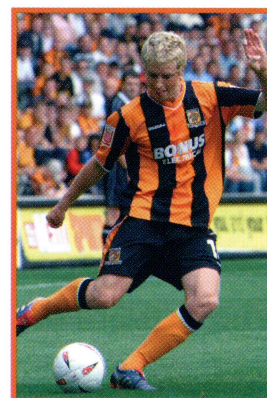
April 1991 and made his debut at Sheffield Wednesday in September 1992. After over 100 appearances in four years at Tottenham, Nick joined Middlesbrough for a club record fee of £5.25million in August 1995 with his sparkling skills perfectly suited to Boro's new home at the Riverside Stadium. The midfielder's stint on Teesside was to last only 15 months as he became Everton's record signing in November 1996 at £5.75million. His popularity continued at Goodison although it was undoubtedly diminished in some quarters in July 2000 when he made his controversial move across Stanley Park to join Liverpool for £6million. Nick was part of Gerard Houllier's squad that won the UEFA Cup and Worthington Cup in his first season at Anfield and then went on to team up with his old mentor Terry Venables at Leeds United in August 2002 before joining Hull. On the international scene, Nick made his full England debut - selected by Venables - against Uruguay at

Wembley in March 1995. He scored in both Glenn Hoddle and Sven-Goran Eriksson's first games in charge, was in the Euro 96 and Euro 2000 tournament squads and played in the memorable 5-1 defeat of Germany in Munich in September 2001.

STUART ELLIOTT

Signed for a club record £230,000, the Tigers fought off competition from a number of clubs to clinch Stuart's signature. The talented left-sided forward shot to prominence as a part-timer for Glentoran in the Smirnoff Irish Premiership. He won three caps at Under-21 level for Northern Ireland before giving up his job as a window cleaner to sign full time with Motherwell in July 2000 in a £100,000 deal. Although a firm favourite at Fir Park, Stuart became a victim of Motherwell's financial plight as it came to a head in May 2002 when they went into administration and was quickly snapped up by Hull. Despite a generally disappointing 2002-03 campaign for the team, he finished his first Tigers season as our top scorer with 12 goals. Stuart once again reached a double-figure goals tally last season and, with him receiving much greater attacking support, the Tigers achieved their goal of promotion from Division Three.

STUART GREEN



Former Hull boss Jan Molby made his first Tigers signing in snapping up young midfielder Stuart Green from Newcastle United on a year-long loan deal. Born in Whitehaven, he joined the Magpies as a trainee and went out on-loan to Carlisle United during his time at St James Park. On Boxing Day 2002, a couple of hours before the club's first-ever league game at the KC Stadium, Stuart signed a three-and-a-half year contract with the Tigers after a fee of £150,000 was agreed with Newcastle. He celebrated in style by netting Hull's second goal in the 2-0 win against leaders Hartlepool United before a crowd of 22,319. As the new Coca-Cola League One season began,

Stuart was the longest-serving member of the Tigers' senior squad.

STRIKERS

DANNY ALLSOPP

A strong and powerful frontrunner, Danny became the Tigers first 2003 close season signing only days after the end of the 2002-03 season. Described as an archetypal Aussie, he came to England five years earlier following an impressive month's trial with Manchester City shortly after the Maine Road club's relegation to the Second Division. Allsopp is an experienced striker having had spells at Notts County, Wrexham and Bristol Rovers. Allsopp was signed by Hull from Notts County in 2003 after hitting 50 goals at Meadow Lane in just over 100 appearances.

DELROY FACEY

Having assisted West Bromwich Albion in their return to the Premiership, Delroy left The Hawthorns to boost the Tigers' promotion bid this season. The Huddersfield-born striker put pen to paper on a two-year deal at the KC in July 2004 after arriving on a free transfer from Gary Megson's side. His career started at Huddersfield Town where he made 82 appearances, scoring 15 goals during his six-year spell with his home-town Terriers before joining Bolton Wanderers for £100,000 in July 2002. He had loan spells at First Division outfits Bradford City and Burnley before West Brom captured him on a permanent deal for a fee of £150,000 at the end of January 2004.

JONATHAN WALTERS

The Tigers increased their attacking options when a deal was agreed to bring the Bolton Wanderers striker to the KC Stadium on a permanent basis for an initial £50,000 fee in February 2004. Jon had already enjoyed a highly successful loan spell with the Tigers towards the end of the 2003-03, scoring five goals in Third Division 11 games. The 20-year-old also made all of his six appearances for Bolton in the 2002-03. He began 2003-04 on loan at Crewe Alexandra - although he failed to make a senior appearance for Dario Gradi's team - before moving to Barnsley in another loan stint in November. The Birkenhead-born forward's talents have taken him on to the international stage where he made his debut for the Republic of Ireland's Under-21s in October 2003.

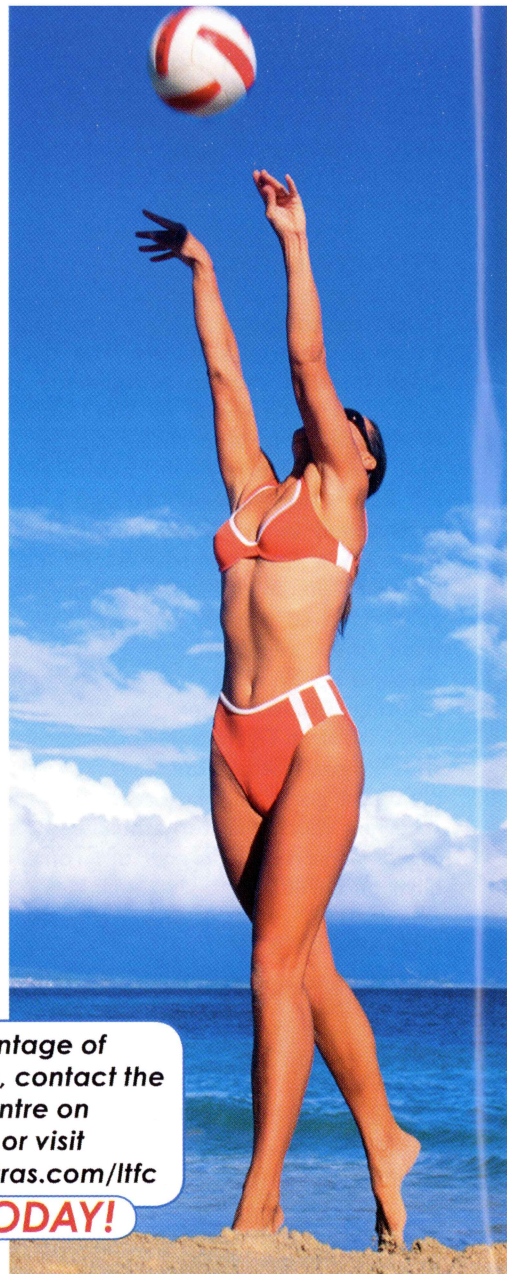

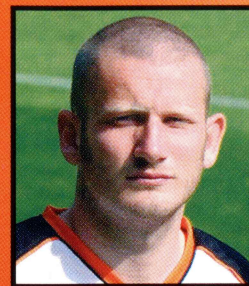

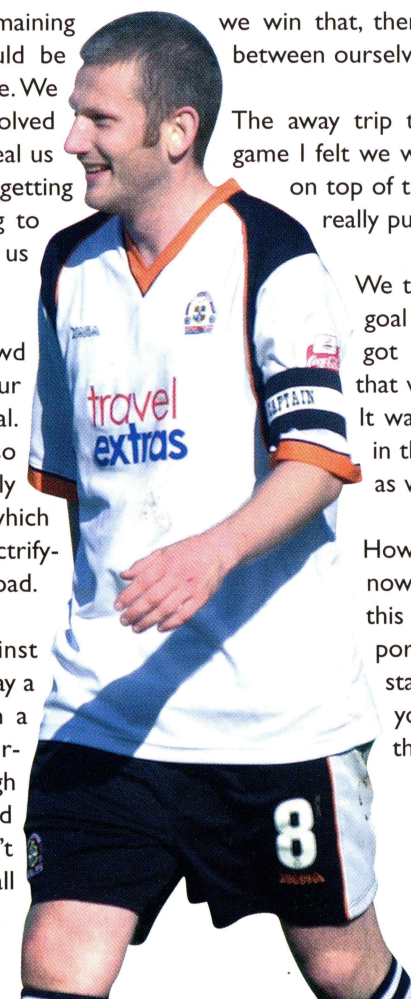
I felt it was an excellent game of football. The general feeling in the dressing room after the game was of slight disappointment as we felt we had done enough to get all three points.

HATTERS HISTORY

WHEN THE Hatters travelled to Hull on the 6th April 2002 they were attempting to smash all existing club records by going for their 12th straight win in what was already a record breaking season.

The Town, who had already clinched a promotion spot a week before following a 3-1 win at Swansea, were neck and neck with Plymouth at the top and were looking to take over pole position from their west country rivals.

Hull's season had petered out into major disappointment. The bookies favourites for promotion had looked a decent side when they won at Kenilworth Road in November but since then they had drifted into mid-table obscurity leading to the inevitable sacking of manager Brian Little.

Little's successor Jan Molby was in charge of Hull for the first time for the visit of the Town and an interested crowd of 9,379, including 1,674 from Luton, turned up at Boothferry Park to see whether the Tigers could put a hold on the Hatters headlong assault for top spot.

The Hatters went ahead on 23 minutes when Matthew Taylor's perfect cross into the six yard box found the head of Howard who made no mistake from close range. Jean Louis Valois then went close before Dean Crowe doubled the Town's lead before the interval after taking advantage of a poor Jason van Blerk clearance and stabbing the ball home.

Howard bagged his second goal on 79 minutes after feeding Taylor down the left and then charging into the penalty box to meet the talented 20 year old's precise cross with a close range side footed finish. Watching Newcastle manager Bobby Robson was no doubt impressed by Taylor's contribution in both of Howard's first two goals.

It was captain Kevin Nicholls, though, who turned provider for Howard's hat-trick effort a minute

from time. The big forward collected a clever through pass into the penalty box before coolly rounding Paul Musselwhite and finding the net.

The players and supporters were ecstatic as the final whistle sounded but none more so than Howard who marched off with the match ball having cemented his place at the top of the Division Three scoring charts.

As the Luton supporters made their way home they received the news that Plymouth had only drawn at home to Southend and their heroes were now in top spot.

Unfortunately the Pilgrims soon regained the status quo when winning their game in hand over the Town but the trip back from sunny Hull that spring afternoon will live long in the minds of the lucky Luton supporters present.

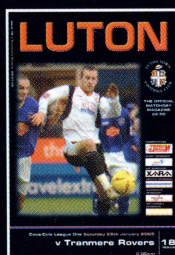

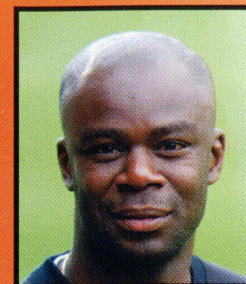
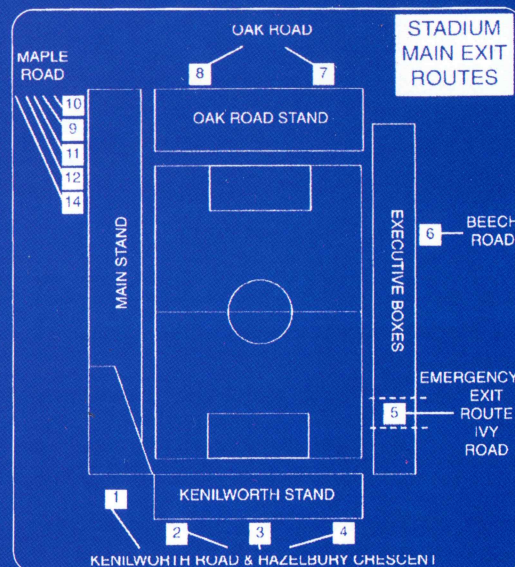

In an evacuation of the main stand you will be instructed to use the pitch. Stewards will direct you to the nearest exit. It may be that your normal exit route will not be available. On leaving the stadium, you will find some roads closed to pedestrians, to enable swift and unobstructed access for the emergency services. Please leave the area of the ground as quickly as possible, by the route directed. Your co-operation will be most appreciated.

HATTERS MIDFIELDER Paul Hughes has endured a torrid season. A virus has kept him in the treatment room for many weeks and has forced him to miss the majority of the season. The former Chelsea trainee has made only one appearance this campaign, completing 90 minutes of the LDV Vans trophy defeat by Swansea City.

However, Hughes' attitude and determination to beat the virus has been 'second to none'. The midfielder is regularly seen running around the Kenilworth Road turf trying to keep himself fit in a bid to be ready for consideration by Hatters boss Mike Newell when he has been given clearance to resume full training.

Hughes is now patiently playing the waiting game as he awaits news to when he can resume training with the rest of the squad. However, as Hughes explains, he has no idea as to when that might be.

"The problem is I'm not carrying an injury," commented the former Southampton midfielder. "I have just picked up a virus and it's taking a long time to get back. Some viruses knock your socks off and I think that is what has happened to me.

"I just need a little time to recover but I'm still doing my training although I can't participate with the lads. It's a case of leaving your body to sort itself out. I don't know why or the reasons as to the virus but sometimes

these things take longer than you would like.

"I suppose, in hindsight, it would be easier if I had picked up an injury and then people could treat it but I'm still feeling good about myself and I'm not letting it get me down.

"All I can do at the moment is running exercises. I'm in the gym doing a lot of weights and it keeps my general fitness levels up. Hopefully it won't be much longer for me to return to training with the lads.

"It's frustrating that I can't pinpoint a day for a return to action but I want to make sure that when the time comes, I'm in the best possible shape. I will continue to keep myself fit and I just want to get back out there playing as soon as possible."

Although not involved in this afternoon's mammoth fixture, Hughes will be getting behind his team-mates and firmly believes that home advantage could be a key to Luton extending their lead at the top of League One.

The midfielder added: "We have some big fixtures coming up but Hull at home is a massive game. We are strong on our own turf and if we can beat them it would put us in a good position. I haven't seen any better teams than us this season."

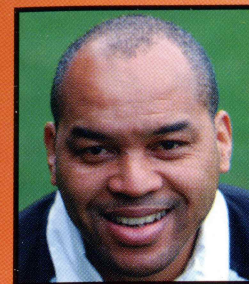



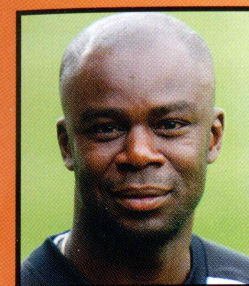

Supporters trusts have been in the news a lot recently. As soon as Ken Bates took over at Leeds, the first interviews were from the Leeds United Trust. Shareholders United continue to fight Malcolm Glazer's attempts to purchase Manchester United. Wrexham's trust organised a highly successful Clubs In Crises day, when hundreds of people from all over the country descended on the Racecourse Ground to show their support for their fellow fans who are battling to save their club from extinction.

Not all trusts are currently so high profile, but the work is going on behind the scenes all the same. There are now over 120 supporters trusts, each staffed with volunteers working their hardest for the clubs they love.

AFC Telford United began life last year as full Trust-owned club, after the liquidation of Telford United. The Griggs family at Rushden & Diamonds has offered to sell the club to embryonic supporters' trust, who are no endeavouring to set themselves up and secure the best possible future for the Diamonds. Mansfield's Trust are in early negotiations with club's chairman with regards to a possible acquisition.

Then there are the smaller but no less significant achievements. The Clarets Trust (Burnley) and RUST (Rotherham) have both got a board place.

Notts County's Trust have a 30% shareholding in their club, and have ex-players as Trust patrons, including Tommy Johnson and Craig Short.

So what of our own Trust? Well, since our spate of publicity back in October for the Trouble at the Top: Luton Kicks Off documentary, Trust in Luton continues to grow steadily, with our elected fans' representative maintaining a dialogue with the club. On a fundraising level, a webshop now brings in regular income. You don't have to be a current member to use the shop (although if you'd like to join up as well, that would be great!) – just log on to <http://buy.at/trustinluton>, and you can shop at many of the top internet sites around



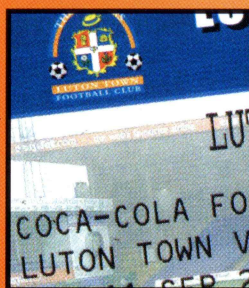

COMING NEXT

LUTON TOWN will know all about the danger Walsall may possess when they provide our next opposition in our first evening kick-off at Kenilworth Road since early October.

The Saddlers were 2-0 winners when the Hatters made the trip to the Bescot Stadium earlier in the season and have one of the strongest home records in the division, winning nine and claiming three draws from their 15 fixtures.

Unfortunately, it's their form away from the Bescot Stadium on their travels that have undoubtedly left Walsall struggling in the lower half of the division with their only success coming against bottom-placed Stockport County in November.

Other key members of the squad are former Charlton midfielder Mark Kinsella, who has provided some much needed experience in the heart of Walsall's side, Darren Wrack, a long serving member of the Walsall squad who continues to be consistent in the Saddlers midfield and Neil Emblen who has been in excellent form.

Walsall have plenty of experience in their side to push away from the danger zone this season and will undoubtedly be looking at improving their form away from home when they come to Kenilworth Road.
