



THE CHAIRMAN

Good evening and welcome to our supporters and our visitors Walsall they're Chairman, Directors, Management, Players and Supporters to Kenilworth Road.

We have had three hard-fought games in the last ten days, to maintain our position at the top of League One and increase our point total.

When we hosted Hull City at Kenilworth Road two Saturday's ago we were only one point ahead of them and that game was seen widely as the clash of the season between two clubs competing for automatic promotion. Thanks to our players the team achieved the result we all wanted. The atmosphere was electric because of you our supporters, and your contribution to the result made it the most exciting game of the season so far.

Midweek we were away to Hartlepool United, again an important result. The same applied to our away game on Saturday against Bradford City, and as always the club and especially the players really appreciated the travelling support that they received at both games particularly taking into account the length of the two journeys involved.

For most of us we naturally concentrate our attention on our first team squad of players and rightly so. However, the football business within the club is like an iceberg, ten percent shows above the surface but underneath there are dedicated and enthusiastic layers of player development from under

sevens teams up to Mark Ridgeway's under sixteen's team. Mark is Head of our Centre of Excellence and works closely with his Head Coach Roger Spicer who operates a team of committed coaches, recruitment officer's, and physio's. These ten teams of youngsters are part of the clubs policy of encouraging football at every level including Stuart Smith's Football in the Community programme financed in part by the Professional Footballers Association.

Our decision to reinstate the club's Reserve Team has had a visible impact on the progress of our players and in particular our youth squad. Football is a skill full and competitive sport and a rewarding one, so the early-years at the grass roots are where the skills and experience for young players start.

Football ability can be recognised very early in young players, through experienced scouts and coaches. Many of these boys end up playing for the club via our U16s and U18s youth teams under Mark and Marvin Johnson progress right up to our first team, as several of our current first team players can testify.

As always get behind the lads and thank you for your support.



Hello and welcome to Kenilworth Road for this evening's game against Walsall. Welcome also to Paul Merson his staff, players, directors and supporters from the Bescot Stadium.

Paul is one of a rare breed who has managed to combine managing and playing. Anyone who has done it will tell you it's the hardest thing in the world. They beat us at their place in the middle of our bad week earlier on in the season, so tonight could well be another tough test for us.

Last week could not have been any better for us with three wins, two of which were away from home and the other against second placed Hull. The performances against Hull and Hartlepool were excellent particularly the latter and although we weren't as good at Bradford we were certainly delighted with the effort and commitment.

Sometimes we expect too much from players and are too critical. They had a very tough week with a long trip to the North East after a top of the table clash and finished off with five and a half hours on the bus on Friday on the way to

Yorkshire. Most of the lads have played virtually all the games so it is a big ask to be constantly at your best.

We have nevertheless created a healthy gap between ourselves and third place which, at this point, is the most important one. Results in the final third are the priority as opposed to performances, and having played the top five teams twice, there is a danger of complacency and possibly an expectation to roll over everyone else in front of us. There will be teams fighting for their lives and with the play-off situation, these days everybody in the league will have something to play for.

We will need everyone with us between now and May. We have a crucial couple of weeks ahead when we might be able to put ourselves in a very strong position.

Enjoy the game and get behind the lads.





- 12** A late goal from Ahmet Brkovic gives Luton all three points over Hull City. Steve Robinson's cross it met by the Luton midfielder to seal victory and send Luton four points clear at the top of the table.





MANAGER

PAUL MERSON



Rated as the most significant signing in the clubs history, the former England International, who has 21 caps to his name, put pen to paper on a two-year deal at Bescot Stadium in July 2003 after helping Portsmouth achieve top-flight status.

One of the English games most popular figures, Merson burst onto the scene at Arsenal, signing professional forms in December 1985 and going on to win two League Championships, the FA Cup, League Cup and European Cup Winners Cup during 12 success-filled years at Highbury.

His next port of call was Middlesbrough as he joined the north-east club for £4.5million and proved to be an important figure in the heart of their side. His displays prompted Aston Villa to pay out £6.75million to secure his services in September 1998 and he went on to achieve legendary status at Villa Park as he became one of the main driving forces in the side.

In August 2002 he accepted the challenge to try and help Portsmouth achieve Premiership status, becoming Harry Redknapp's highest profile capture and after accomplishing his mission he set his heart on a move to Walsall.

Despite winning virtually everything the game has to offer, last season probably ranks as one of the most eventful in Merson's career, which ended with the 36-year-old taking temporary charge of The Saddlers for the final four games.

Merse could do nothing to prevent relegation but his positive approach to the game didn't go unnoticed, and he was awarded the manager's job on a full-time basis during the summer of 2004.

GOALKEEPERS

RICHARD MCKINNEY

Northern Irishman McKinney linked-up with The Saddlers on July 1st 2004 after putting pen-to-paper on a one-year deal. The 25 year-old shot-stopper began his career as a trainee at Manchester City before joining Swindon Town in the summer of 2001. He made just one appearance in the 12 months he spent at the County Ground and signed for Colchester in August 2002. In his debut season with The U's, the Ballymoney-born 'keeper competed with Simon Brown for the number one slot and went on to make 23 appearances. A knee injury in training restricted McKinney to just seven appearances last term, including a fine display in Colchester's FA Cup-tie against Coventry City. Having started the season as first choice following an impressive pre-season, he lost his place to Mark Paston before suffering a nasty knee injury playing for the reserves that has kept him sidelined for a lengthy period of time.

MARK PASTON

The New Zealand International became Paul Merson's second summer signing after being released by cash-strapped Bradford City. The giant goalkeeper figured in a total of 14 games for The Bantams over the course of the 2003/2004 season. He replaced long-serving goalkeeper James Walker who moved onto West Ham United after 10 years at Bescot Stadium.

DEFENDERS

ZIGOR ARANALDE

The Spaniard has turned out for Albacete, Marbella, Seville and CD Logrones in his homeland before being lured to these shores by The Saddlers in August 2000.


A committed and enthusiastic left-back who likes to get forward at every opportunity, he has settled down well to the demands of the English game over the past few years, playing regularly, and is an import member of The Saddlers' side who presence is greatly missed on the occasions that he does not play.

JULIAN BENNETT

A strong and dominant defender who has worked his way up through the youth ranks at Bescot Stadium before signing professional forms in the summer of 2004. The Nottingham-born central defender has made great progress in the last couple of seasons, being voted young player of the year in 2002/03 and becoming a

regular for The Saddlers' reserve team last season. His consistent displays for the second-string as we were narrowly pipped to the Pontin's Holidays League Championship in 2003/2004 did not go unnoticed and he was given a first division baptism of fire away at Wigan Athletic last term.

NEIL EMBLEN




The versatile performer launched his professional career at Millwall in 1993 after emerging as a bright star on the non-League scene with Sittingbourne. It wasn't long before he was snapped up by Wolves in a £600,000 deal where he went on to make almost 100 appearances at Molineux before securing a £2million

switch to Crystal Palace. His career at Selhurst Park failed to go as planned and soon he was back at Molineux for a second spell which this time consisted of over 100 games, during which time he played under former Walsall boss, Colin Lee. Following Lee's departure from Wolves, the Bromley-born player soon followed him out of Molineux as he completed a £500,000 switch to Norwich where he was promptly appointed Club Captain but suffered at the hands of injury and was never really able to establish a regular starting place. A loan move to The Saddlers came in January 2003, but this was also a disrupted spell before he was given special permission to play in our final game of the 2002/2003 season on a non-contract basis. He eventually signed a permanent deal at Bescot Stadium in June 2003, turning down other more lucrative offers in the process.

IAN ROPER

Working his way up through the Bescot Stadium ranks to sign professional forms in May 1995, he has given sterling service to the club over the years. Dominant in the air and strong in the challenge, he is a reliable figure who continued to put in a number of solid and no-nonsense displays during the 2002/2003 campaign which culminated with him deservedly picking up the Player of the Year award to add to the Young Player of the Year prize that he earned a couple of years earlier.



WALSALL

MIDFIELDERS

MARK KINSELLA

The Saddlers secured the services of Republic of Ireland International, Mark Kinsella on July 27th 2004. The 31-year-old arrived at Bescot Stadium on a two-year deal having helped West Bromwich Albion secure top flight status at the end of last season. Dublin-born Kinsella, who has 48 International caps to his name, arrived in England in 1989 with Colchester United. He was picked up by Charlton Athletic for a bargain £150,000 in 1996 and went on to play in 226 games for The Addicks, establishing himself as a key player in their rise to prominence. Aston Villa paid £750,000 for his services in 2002 before he was allowed to link up with West Bromwich Albion on a free transfer in January 2004 and helped the Baggies achieve top-flight status during the course of a total of 18 appearances.


SIMON OSBOURN

A hard working midfield battler who kicked off his career at Crystal Palace before going on to give service to Reading, QPR, Wolves, Tranmere Rovers (loan), Port Vale and Gillingham. The 33-year-old established himself as an important member of the Gillingham side in recent years and was all set to extend his stay at the club until Colin Lee - who he worked with at Wolves - came calling and he was lured over to Bescot Stadium. Last season, Osborn proved his commitment to the cause by playing with a broken toe for much of the second half of the season. His effort and desire did not go unnoticed by new boss Paul Merson, who immediately gave him the role of player-coach. With well over 300 games under his belt, his know-how and never-say-die attitude have served the club well and his experience is invaluable to The Saddlers' cause. Relinquished his coaching role earlier in the 2004/2005 season in order to concentrate on playing matters.

MICHAEL STANDING

PAUL Merson made his first signing as manager with the arrival of Bradford City midfielder Michael Standing on May 27th 2004. The 23-year-old arrives at Bescot Stadium having become a victim of the financial crisis that has forced The Bantams to make all of their players available for transfer as they face up to life in the second division. Standing burst onto the scene as a teenager when Aston Villa plucked him and Gareth Barry from the Brighton and Hove Albion youth ranks. The Villa Park outfit were forced to pay hefty compensation for the England Youth International, but he failed to break into their first-team and after almost four years at the club, he was allowed to link up with Bradford City in March 2002. A player that Paul Merson knows well from his time at Aston Villa where the pair were team-mates for three and-a-half years, his energetic and honest displays have served The Saddlers well and he has become a popular figure both on and off-the-field.

DARREN WRACK




Darren started his career with Derby County, where he signed professional forms in July 1994 before securing a £100,000 switch to Grimsby Town exactly two years later. During his time at Blundell Park he was loaned out to Shrewsbury Town in February 1997 but eventually made a permanent move to Walsall in August 1998, becoming one of Ray Graydon's first signings for the club. A wide-player of undoubted talent and ability who is a popular figure both on and off the field, he

has made a solid contribution to The Saddlers' cause over the subsequent years and as a result has been subject of plenty of interest from other clubs. However, he decided to put pen to paper on a new deal at Bescot Stadium in May 2003, much to the delight of everyone involved with The Saddlers. After a consistent 2002/03 campaign, last season was blighted by injury. However, despite featuring in just over half our league games, Wrack managed to finish as joint-second top scorer, with six goals to his name. His versatility and desire have once again proved key attributes to the side and he is an important and well-liked member of the first-team set-up.

STRIKERS

MATTY FRYATT



THE 18-year-old front-man enjoyed a prolific couple of seasons at youth team level, before breaking into the first-team last season. During the 2002/03 campaign, Fryatt's goalscoring prowess earned him a reserve team place and after continuing to find the net at that level, the club took the somewhat unusual step of awarding him a pro-


fessional contract at the end of his first year of a three-year Scholarship. Blessed with good skill, pace and sharpness in front of goal, the Nuneaton-born youngster is expected to have a bright future in the game. Last term Matty earned rave reviews during his first taste of Football League action, firstly whilst on loan at Carlisle United, where he scored his first professional goal, and then during his time back at Bescot where he opened his Saddlers account in a 2-1 away victory over Preston.

JORGE LEITAO

Jorge Leitao gave up his studies for a Sports Science Degree to come to Walsall in a £150,000 deal from SC Farense in his native Portugal back in August 2000. He made a very favorable impression in his first season at Bescot Stadium, finishing top scorer and scooping the Player of the Year Award. A popular figure who possesses great power and strength, he knows exactly where the goal is and has proved to be an important member of the side since his

arrival with his never-say-die attitude going down well amongst The Saddlers' faithful. Managed to find the net on 13 occasions in 2002/2003, and once again finished top scorer last season with nine goals to his name, taking his tally up to a total of 53 goals for the club. The Oporto-born forward agreed a new one-year deal in the summer and has been amongst the goals again this term.

MARVIN ROBINSON



The Saddlers completed the signing of front-man, Marvin Robinson from Rushden & Diamonds on December 7th in a deal that runs initially until the end of the season. The 24-year-old was a highly-rated prospect at Derby County where he came through the ranks and made Premiership appearances before suffering

a badly broken leg during a loan spell at Stoke City which halted his progress. As well as his temporary stay at the Britannia Stadium, he has also gained much-needed experience in recent years with loan spells at Exeter City and Tranmere Rovers, before linking up with Chesterfield on a permanent basis at the start of last season where he scored six League goals from 17 starts before making a switch to Notts County earlier this season. At Meadow Lane he made just two appearances before being snapped up by Rushden and Diamonds on a non-contract basis at the start of November 2004.

LEROY WILLIAMS

A livewire striker whose development was rewarded in the summer of 2004 with a one-year professional deal, just a year into his Scholarship programme. Possessing plenty of pace and skill, the 18-year-old is a bubbly character and a player who has the ability to turn the course of a game and have the supporters on the edge of their seats. He made an explosive Football League debut against Port Vale on the opening day of the 2004/2005 season as he scored a fine goal shortly after coming on as substitute.




Enoch also took his goal well; he could have had a hat-trick. People forget sometimes that he hasn't been a professional footballer for very long, but the finish for his goal was top draw.


We then added our third through Kevin Foley and he has filled in superbly in midfield. Everyone knows that he is a good footballer and could probably play in a few positions.





HATTERS HISTORY

THE HATTERS made extremely hard work of winning promotion from Division Three in 1970 for, following back to back defeats at Bristol Rovers and Barrow in February, we looked dead and buried after a tremendous start to a season that was beginning to turn into a bit of a disaster. A brilliant and unexpected win at Reading was then followed by successive home draws against Mansfield and Bury and the depths of despair were plumbed when we went down to an awful 2-3 defeat at bottom club Tranmere.

Easter brought home wins over Rotherham and Reading but the victories proved to be a false dawn once more as a last minute slip by goal-keeper Alan Starling gifted the points to Barnsley at Oakwell.

A dismal 0-0 draw at Halifax, where we looked anything but a promotion side, left us with five games to play and needing to win them all to stand a chance of going up. It seemed an impossible task and so it was with heavy hearts that supporters travelled to Fulham where surely the final rites would be read.

In a breathless game Malcolm Macdonald scored the only goal against his old side and with all the other results going our way promotion was suddenly and unbelievably back on again.

Four games to go now with Walsall and Southport the visitors to Kenilworth Road and then visits to Mansfield and Rochdale to finish off the campaign.

Repeating a successful experiment of four years before, it was decided to play a home game on the evening of the F.A.Cup final and after watching Leeds and Chelsea fight out a 2-2 draw at Wembley on television 17,193 of us trooped down to Kenilworth Road to see if the final steps could be taken on the road to promotion.

The visitors, Walsall, had nothing to play for which made them doubly dangerous bearing in mind our performances against the lower lights that season but we need not have worried as we took the game by the scruff of the neck from the start.

New boy Viv Busby opened the scoring after eight minutes when he crashed home a Macdonald cross and the game was as good as over shortly afterwards when John Collins rifled the ball home.

Macdonald got the goal his unselfish play deserved when he headed in an inch perfect Graham French cross shortly after half-time before Starling had to limp off with a knee injury.

No specialist substitute goalkeepers in those days so Keith Allen, who had played in goal only once before during his days at Grimsby, took over between the sticks and to be honest had little to do although he twice let shots go out for a goal kick only to see the ball cannon off the post!

We managed to hold out to the end and then remained unbeaten in our final three games to ensure a promotion spot back to the old Division Two that had looked highly unlikely many times during that season.

"Playing in the game at Portugal was a great experience for me and will hopefully help me with Luton Town.


"The result obviously wasn't good, but being there was the main thing and now I want to keep playing well with Ireland and with Luton.

"You learn so much from all the different players and with all the different tactics. It's completely different to club football, because with Luton it's really quick and frantic, but the international football is more tactical. It's good to play in both and be able to adjust to the styles.

On the club scene, Foley has been adapting to life in midfield and notched up his first league goal of the season in our recent 3-2 win over Hartlepool United.

"I'm comfortable in midfield and like playing there," admitted Foley. "I'd play anywhere really – I don't mind as I enjoy playing further up field and getting on the ball.

"I don't mind playing at right-back and doing the defending, but getting forward, overlapping and putting balls into the box is the favourite part of my game."







late strike not enough for Chris Turner's men after Nathan Lowndes and Billy Paynter had put Vale in control.

Oldham were on the wrong side of 4-0 hammering down at Bournemouth, with Steven Fletcher, James Hayter and a Garreth O'Connor brace doing the damage. Juan Ugarte's ninth goal in ten games for Wrexham gave the Welsh side a 1-1 draw at home to Torquay after Jo-Osei Kuffour had put The Gulls ahead.



Clive Platt was another man to come up with a last-minute winner, as his goal gave MK Dons a 2-1 win at home against Huddersfield.


The Terriers had taken the lead after half an hour through Andy Booth but Izale McLeod drew the hosts level three minutes later.



TRAVEL INFO

HOW TO GET TO PORT VALE



By Road: Leave M6 at junction 15 and take the A500 north to Stoke-on-Trent. Continue straight across the two large roundabouts on the A500 heading north. After the second roundabout take the fourth exit signposted Tunstall A527. At the roundabout turn right (fourth exit signposted Tunstall A527, Longport Road). After 0.5 miles turn right on to the B501 (second exit, Newcastle Street) at the small roundabout. Carry on up to the next roundabout and go straight across to the cross-roads. Go straight across the cross-roads into Moorland Road. Take the second left on to Hamil Road and Vale Park is on the left.

By Rail: Longport station is the closest to the ground, but is a good 30 minute walk away and is not well served. Most fans end up at Stoke On Trent railway station, which is over four miles away and take a taxi (about £6) up to the ground.

Car Parking: There are few places to park once you arrive at the ground. There is a large car park located outside a superstore next to the ground, otherwise it is street parking.

Around the Ground: Vale Park is situated in Burslem, Stoke-on-Trent and has been the home of the Valiants for more than 50 years. The ground is made up of four major stands called the Lorne Street Stand, the Carling Stand, the Big Stand, which has the Disabled Stand to one side and the Family Stand to the other. The Phones 4U Stand is located on Hamil Road and houses up to 4,500 away supporters.

Where to eat: On the Hamil Road car park there is a burger van or if you prefer fans can get something from inside the ground where there is a kiosk. New lines have been introduced this season so there is lots of variety and the prices are very reasonable, with the most expensive Pie/pasty on offer at £1.40. There is a Burger King in the Centre of Burslem and the usual take away restaurants

By Coach with Town on Tour: Leaving Maple Road at 11:00am, with a pick up at Milton Keynes approximately half-an-hour later. The fare for LTSC members is £15, £13 for junior and senior members and £17 for non-members. In the first of our back-to-back home games, Bristol City provide the next opposition at Kenilworth Road with the Hatters going in search of completing another double.

Bristol City fans have suffered the heartbreak of missing automatic promotion during the last two seasons having finished in third spot in League One.

One of the favourites with the bookmakers to make it third time lucky for promotion, The Robins made a dreadful start to this campaign, failing to win their opening five fixtures.

However the club's fortunes have slowly turned around and manager Brian Tinnion has now pushed his side into the play-off picture following a string of good results.

Bristol City's threat in front of goal has been one of the main reasons the club are pushing for promotion. Already in this campaign, the club have scored four goals over Brentford, Milton Keynes Dons and Tranmere Rovers plus five in a match against Stockport County.

Youth product Leroy Lita is enjoying a fantastic season and has been one of the highlights for the club. The Congo-born striker has slammed home 20 goals this season after making the initial breakthrough into the first-team squad last year.

Captain Jamie Smith is another player enjoying a good season after moving to Ashton Gate in August last year and is highly regarded as one of the top defenders in the division.

Past fixtures between the two sides have always been tight affairs with three of the last five encounters ending in draws and the other two being settled by the odd goal.

Enoch Showunmi's late winner at Ashton Gate back in December sealed Luton's 17th win over Bristol City from a total of 58 games between the two sides down the years.

Bristol fans will have to go back to April 2001 to find the last time they claimed victory over the Hatters when Tony Thorpe was on target against his former club in a 3-1 win.

Luton's most recent victory over the Bristol club at Kenilworth Road was in April 2004 when Keith Keane grabbed an important 90th minute goal, which sealed a 3-2 win.

With both teams eyeing promotion this season, Luton will know they face a tough task in a game, which is likely to be tightly fought.
