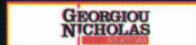

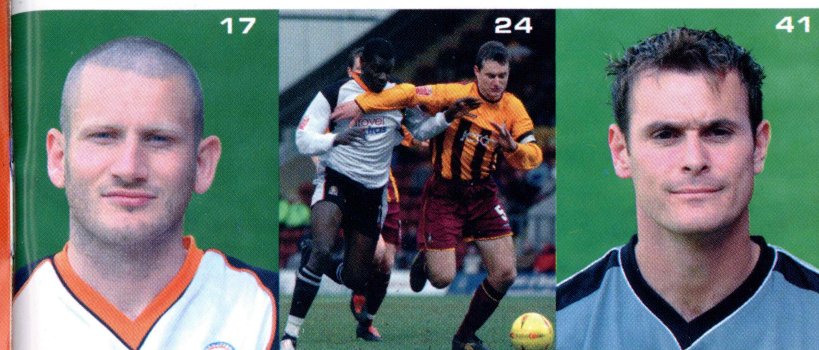

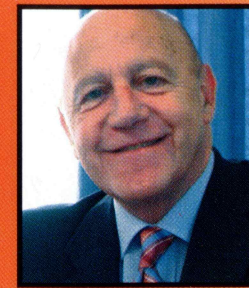

THE CHAIRMAN

GOOD AFTERNOON and a warm welcome to all our supporters to today's game, and our visitors Bristol City their directors, management, players and supporters.

The club and the local media have received emails from some supporters who are under the impression that the Board has decided that the club will be remaining at Kenilworth Road. I would like to reassure everyone that this is not the case. Our relocation plans are the club's future security.

This September marks the centenary of the club being at Kenilworth Road, which of course all of us will celebrate. Unfortunately our current home is no longer commercially viable. It was a Football League condition of the club's renewed membership following receivership, that Luton Borough Council granted the club a ten-year lease of Kenilworth Stadium. The current ground is required for inclusion into the Council's regeneration programme for the area, and the club's relocation is essential for that to happen. Therefore, the club has to move on to develop its full potential.

The relocation process is a complex mix of an agreement on the land, and the planning and highways aspects which I am pleased to say is moving forward in the right direction. Meanwhile, in the short term the club is outgrowing its present capacity. Therefore, we will be considering utilising the last remaining space at the Kenilworth Road end to increase the seating capacity by another six hundred or so seats, which is so essential for accommodating our growing supporter base.

On Wednesday the Sun published the Coca Cola Football League's top 50 list of players. We must congratulate Curtis Davis for making

sixteenth place and Steve Howard for coming in at number 21 – if I had my choice I would have included everyone in our squad for their contribution to a magnificent season so far.

As previously mentioned in our Walsall programme, we believe firmly in the grass roots of the Club's player development structure. Our School of Excellence once again has proved its value, in this case in respect of Lewis Baker, aged nine, which I was unable to talk about in my previous programme notes who played in the under ten's team, and who has just been signed up by Chelsea. As our football management say to me, "Who would stand in his way?" Not me! Lewis, we all wish you the best of luck in your future football career. We hope that you fulfil your playing dreams, and when you do, please remember the Luton School of Excellence that put you on that first rung of the ladder to be a professional footballer!

On behalf of the Board I have pleasure in announcing the appointment of Kelvin Dunn, who will be the supporters' representative on the Board of Directors of the Club. Kelvin is a JP, and a life-long supporter of Luton Town and a committee member of the Trust in Luton. Although Kelvin, will not take up his appointment officially until mid March, we will continue to keep him informed on all developments relating to the Club.

Enjoy the game and as always your vocal support will lift the players.

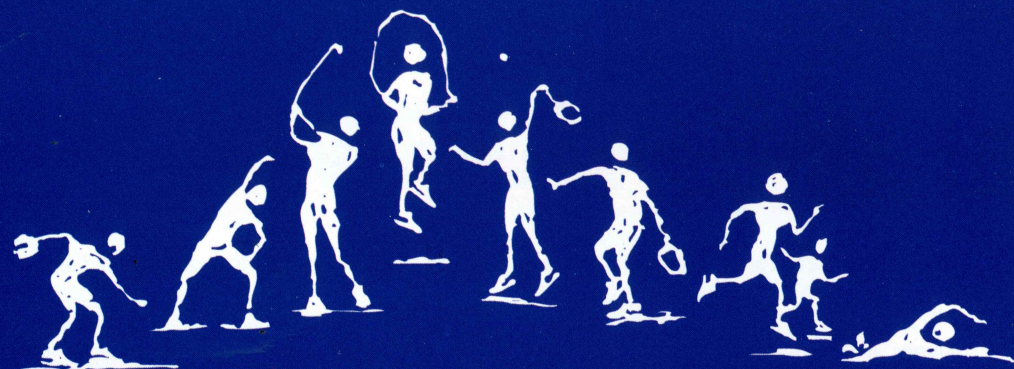

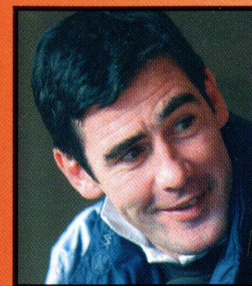

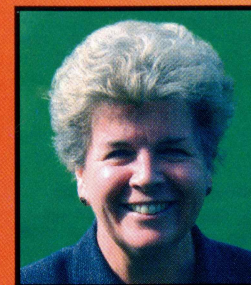

FEBRUARY

- 22** A late penalty from Kevin Nicholls helps the club seal their fourth league win on the spin against Walsall at Kenilworth Road. Chris Coyne is sent tumbling in the penalty area under the challenge of Neil Emblen on 88 minutes with Nicholls sending goalkeeper Mark Paston the wrong way from the spot to seal a hard-earned win.
- 26** The 14 match unbeaten run is broken at Port Vale despite Luton taking an early lead against Port Vale through Kevin Foley. Dave Hibbert scores twice for Vale on his home debut. Foley and Chris Coyne are both injured in the game to compound a miserable afternoon for the Hatters.
- 26** Luton's youth game against Leyton Orient is called off because of the weather.

MARCH

- 1** Hatters boss Mike Newell confirms that Steve Robinson will go for an operation on his injured groin on Thursday and could be out of action for three to four weeks.
- 2** Paul Underwood makes his return to action as he plays 45 minutes for the reserves in their 4-3 win over Wycombe. It's the first time the Luton midfielder has tasted action for four weeks after picking up a hamstring injury in the game against Colchester back in January. Goals from Enoch Showunmi, Danny Stevens and a brace from Calvin Andrew seal the win for Luton.
- 3** In an poll published in FourFourTwo magazine, defender Curtis Davies and striker Steve Howard are included in the top 50 best players playing outside the Premiership in England.
- 5** Mike Newell is a guest speaker at a Luton Town's Supporters Club speakers evening held in the Eric Morecambe suite.

MANAGER

BRIAN TINNION

Bristol City player/boss Brian Tinnion is the club's longest-serving player - he is currently in his 12th full season and in January 2004 made his 500th appearance for the club.

A £180,000 signing from Bradford City in 1993, Brian began his career at Newcastle United, where he played in the same youth team as Paul Gascoigne.

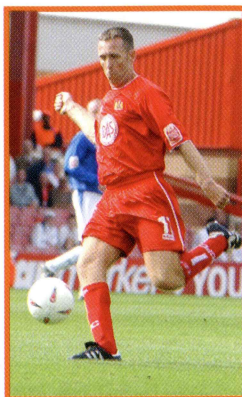
Brian made 36 appearances at St James Park but was sold to Bradford in 1989 for a fee of £150,000 and went on to make over 150 appearances for the club in the space of four seasons.

The City boss then made the move to Ashton Gate where he has enjoyed legendary status since scoring City's winner in the club's famous FA Cup win at Liverpool in January 1994.

During his stay at Ashton Gate, Brian has gone on to score over 40 goals and at the end of the 2000/2001 season won a hat-trick of awards: Supporters Club Player Of The Year, PFA Division Two Player Of The Year and a place in the PFA Division Two Select XI

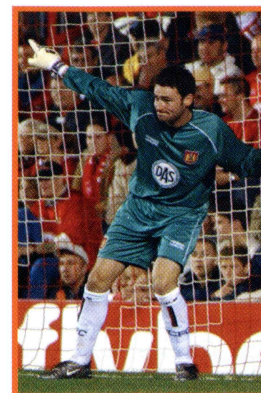
A UEFA qualified coach, he is presently in his testimonial year and signed a three-year deal as manager in June 2004, following the departure of former Luton midfielder Danny Wilson.

Tinnion recently announced that he would be stepping down from his playing career at the end of the season to concentrate on his managerial commitments.



GOALKEEPERS

STEVE PHILLIPS



Joined City in November 1996 from local non-league side Paulton Rovers. An excellent shot-stopper, he made steady progress at Ashton Gate under goalkeeping coach Mike Gibson, and earned his first-team debut in December 1998. Now established as the club's first-choice keeper, he signed a new three-year contract in autumn 2003.

MIKE STOWELL

Experienced goalkeeper signed in July 2001 after serving 11 years at Wolves, during which time he clocked up a club record number of appearances for a goalkeeper and set a mark for clean sheets. His long service was rewarded with a testimonial versus Aston Villa in July 2000. He signed a two-year player/coach deal in the summer of 2003.

DEFENDERS

MICKEY BELL

Snapped up from Wycombe Wanderers for a tribunal fee of £150,000 in the summer of 1997, he was a member of City's 1997/98 Second Division promotion-winning side. He started his career at Northampton Town, and is a free kick and penalty specialist. Signed a new one-year deal in the summer of 2004.

LOUIS CAREY

Youth product who made his City debut in October 1995 as a right-back. Partnered Shaun Taylor in central defence during the 1997/98 promotion season before reverting to a right-sided role under Danny Wilson, with whom he helped win the LDV Vans Trophy in 2003. Left the club to join Championship side Coventry in the summer of 2004 only to have a change of

heart and re-sign for his hometown club in February 2005. Capped once by Scotland at under-21 level.

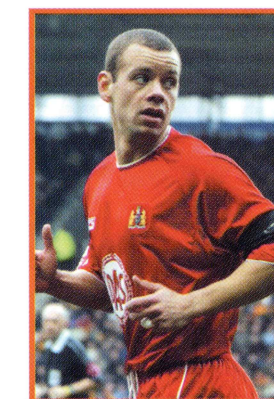
DANNY COLES

A product of the club's Academy who made his first team debut in April 2000, and has since signed an extension to his contract that will keep him at Ashton Gate until 2006, although his name has since been circulated to other Football League clubs. Voted Young Player Of The Year by the Supporters Club in 2002/03, he can also play at right-back.

CLAYTON FORTUNE

Utility player signed in March 2001 after being released by Tottenham Hotspur. Has impressed for both Academy and reserve sides since his arrival and made his senior debut as a substitute versus Peterborough United during a LDV Vans Trophy tie in December 2001. Has played in central defence, at left-back, in central mid-field and even up front. Turned down a £400,000 move to Championship side Preston North End in the summer of 2004 to stay at Ashton Gate.

JAMIE SMITH



Signed a one-year deal after arriving on a free transfer from Crystal Palace in August 2004. Started his career as a trainee with Wolves before moving to the Eagles in October 1997, and was a member of the Palace squad who won promotion to the Premiership last

season via the play-offs. Appointed on-field skipper in February 2005.

MIDFIELDERS

SCOTT BROWN

Started his career as a trainee with Everton whom he represented at youth and reserve level before being released at the end of the

2003/04 season. Following a successful trial in April 2004 he joined City on a short-term contract in August 2004 - since extended to the end of the season - and made his senior debut as substitute in City's home LDV Vans Trophy tie against Peterborough in September 2004. Capped by England at under-17 level, with whom he played in alongside former club colleague Wayne Rooney.

TONY DINNING

Midfielder who was initially signed on a month's loan from Wigan Athletic in October, a move made permanent when he signed a two-and-a-half year contract in December. He started his career as a trainee with Newcastle United but had to wait until a move to Stockport County to make his professional debut. Further transfers to Wolves and Wigan followed and he played a key role in the Latics' Division Two title-winning campaign in 2002/03.

TOMMY DOHERTY

Progressed through the youth ranks to make his first-team debut aged 17 in December 1996 and was a regular in City's Second Division promotion-winning side the following season. His no-nonsense performances have since made him a fans favourite - he was voted Supporters Club Player Of The Year in 2003/04. Capped eight times by Northern Ireland, for whom he qualifies through his grandfather.

MARC GOODFELLOW

Left-footed winger who arrived from Stoke City in January 2004 for an initial £50,000 fee rising to £100,000 depending on performance, signing a two-and-a-half year contract. A versa-

tile player, he can play on either flank and also up front. Scored the winner on his debut as a substitute at Notts County, and also netted on his full debut at home to Chesterfield. Has played on loan for Port Vale and Swansea City so far this season.

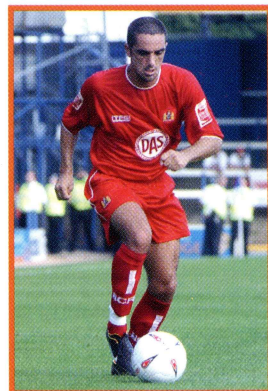
RYAN HARLEY

Midfielder who is in his first year as a professional contract after progressing through the club's Academy/reserve side in recent seasons. Can also play at right-back. Made his senior debut against Port Vale in August 2004.

CRAIG LOXTON

Central midfielder who is in his first year as a professional after progressing through the club's Academy. A regular for the reserves last season

SCOTT MURRAY



Popular right winger and club captain who was a transfer deadline day signing from Reading in March 2004, signing a three-year deal as he returned for a second spell at the club with whom he scored 61 goals in 271 games between 1997-2003.

He first arrived at Ashton Gate in a £150,000 transfer from Aston Villa in December 1997 and enjoyed his best season to date in 2002/03 when he netted 26 goals and was voted Player Of The Season by

the Supporters Club after City lifted the LDV Vans Trophy and finished third in Division Two. Capped by Scotland at B level, he started his career with Fraserburgh before moving to Aston Villa in a £35,000 deal in March 1994. Despite a £650,000 transfer to the Madejski Stadium in the summer 2003, he fell out of favour after manager Alan Pardew left to join West Ham.

BRADLEY ORR

Midfielder who was signed on a free transfer from Newcastle United in the summer of 2004. Began his career with Everton before moving to St James Park where he skippered the club's reserve side. Made his professional debut in the opening game of the 2004/05 season.

LUKE WILKSHIRE

Australian international midfielder, who signed for City from Premiership side Middlesbrough in July 2003 for a fee of £250,000. Can play across midfield, but has started mainly on the left this season. Capped three times by Australia, whom he also represented in the 2004 Olympic Games.

STRIKERS

STEVE BROOKER

Signed on a three-and-a-half year deal potentially worth up to £225,000 in September 2004. Started his career as a trainee with Watford before moving to Port Vale, where he spent just over four seasons, winning a LDV Vans Trophy winners medal in 2001. Describes himself as a "targetman" and was bought by Brian Tinnion to fulfill that role.

DAVE COTTERILL

A product of the club's Academy, for whom he was leading scorer in the 2003/04 season. Capped by Wales at Under-19 level, he made his City debut in the home game against Colchester United in October aged just 16 years and 330 days. Signed a professional contract in December, keeping him at Ashton Gate until the summer of 2007.

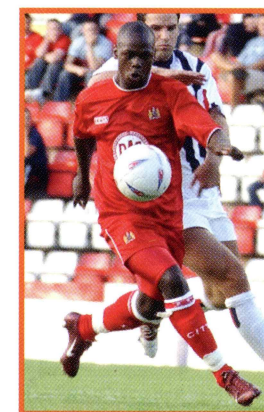
STEVEN GILLESPIE

Forward who was Danny Wilson's final signing as City manager when he arrived at Ashton Gate in May 2004, after being released by Liverpool. Had impressed on trial, scoring seven times in three games for the club's reserve side. Played alongside Euro 2004 Golden Boot winner Milan Baros whilst at Anfield. Made his City debut as a substitute in a League game at Bournemouth in August 2004. Scored four goals in five games on loan for Cheltenham Town in January/February 2005.

PAUL HEFFERNAN

Striker who was a £150,000 signing from Notts County in June 2004; although he was out-of-contract, City had to pay a compensation fee as he was aged under 24. Brian Tinnion's first signing as manager started his career with Irish club Newtown before moving to Meadow Lane in October 1999, netting 21 times for the Magpies during their 2002/03 relegation season. Scored his first goal for City against Stockport in September 2004.

LEROY LITA



England Under-21 international striker who was a prolific scorer for the reserves and Academy sides before being fast-tracked into the senior set-up, making his senior debut in August 2002. Spotted by City's Academy after being released by Premiership side

Chelsea and signed a professional contract in March 2003. Voted Supporters Club Young Player Of The Year in 2003/04. Scored on his England Under-21 debut versus Holland in February 2005.

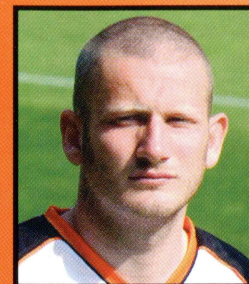
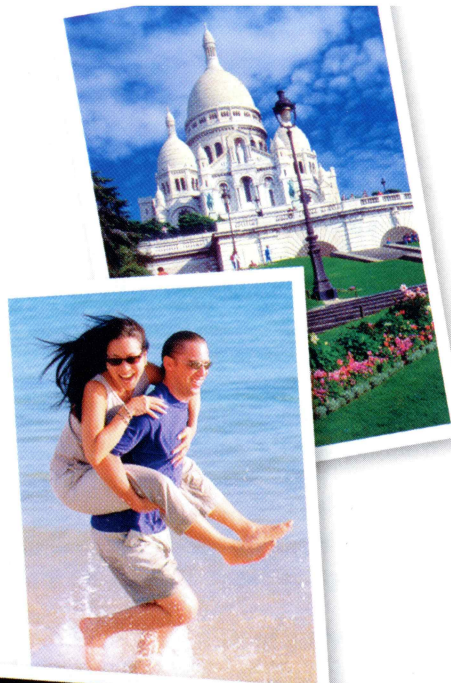

CLUB CAPTAIN

LAST WEEKS performance against Port Vale was obviously disappointing for everyone and brought to an end our 14 match unbeaten run. Perhaps the result is a kick up the backside we may need because we had won four on the trot but it is now up to us to start a new run of unbeaten results and respond from that defeat in a positive way

It probably was our worst performance of the season but it's been a long time since we haven't performed in a game. We got in front early on through Kevin Foley's goal but we didn't start particularly well and in the end I felt we just didn't perform on the afternoon.

The result at Vale Park is probably a reminder to us that we can't take liberties and we cannot take things for granted. There are no easy games in this division and every team is looking to beat us because of our position in the league.

Prior to our trip to Port Vale, we earlier in the week entertained Walsall. It was a tough game but I felt we played well in the first-half. We created some good chances and were unlucky not to take any.

The second-half fell a bit flat but, just like the Hull game, we kept plugging away and kept battling. Brkovic put a great ball in which led to the penalty and Chris Coyne, in my opinion, was fouled. I have heard people say that it was a penalty and some say it wasn't but their player certainly shoved Chris in the back.

It was a good all round solid per-

formance even though it was frustrating at times. The lads and the manager were OK for me to take the spot kick. I was always 100 per cent confident despite my miss at Bradford and I was just glad that the goalkeeper went the wrong way this time.

HATTERS HISTORY

LUTON MANAGER Harry Haslam saw all his hopes, plans and ambitions for a successful 1973/74 season shot to pieces when the Hatters went down 0-4 at Nottingham Forest on the opening day of the new campaign.

It was back to the drawing board for Haslam and what was said on the practice pitch over the next seven days has never been revealed but it seemed to work as poor Carlisle, the visitors to Kenilworth Road on the following Saturday, were thrashed 6-1.

Next up for the resurgent Town were Bristol City at Ashton Gate where the home side had started the season in sparkling form, boasting a 100% record with no goals conceded.

The sun-soaked crowd of 12,208 looked on in amazement as the Hatters shattered this proud record within three minutes. Firstly a cross from winger John Aston eluded everyone before close season signing Tom Finney dummied over the ball sending Ray Cashley in the City goal diving the wrong way. Straight after, a break through the middle by Barry Butlin ended with the big striker squaring the ball to John Ryan who blasted home from inside the area.

City had been badly stung and fought back with a purpose but Bobby Gould missed a glorious opportunity to put Robins back into contention before eventually finding the net when converting a spot-kick just before the interval after being brought down by Hatters full-back Don Shanks.

Luton supporters felt that City would come out for the second half with all guns blazing but it was the Town who made the game safe when Finney netted in the 47th minute leaving the rest of the match to be played out at barely quarter pace as the players gasped for breath in the fierce heat.

The weather was decidedly different when the return match took place in late December and so was the Town's form. Although we were still

clinging on to third spot we were one of a cluster of clubs behind runaway leaders Middlesbrough who were all intent on throwing away promotion due to inconsistency.

It needed a team to put a good run together and the Town had a brilliant opportunity to set such a run going with City not having won in six outings. As it turned out the Hatters put on a display of superb attacking football but were unable to turn their superiority into goals. Peter Anderson, who on his day was one of the best midfield players in the country, ran the show but all his promptings came to nothing as the forwards were thwarted time and again by Len Bond in the Robins goal who was playing a blinder.

Frustrated by all this, Anderson decided to show his team mates how to score and netted with a brilliant header after getting on the end of a free kick from Bobby Thomson.

City came into the game late on but the points were always destined for the Hatters as they stuttered and stumbled on their way to eventual promotion.

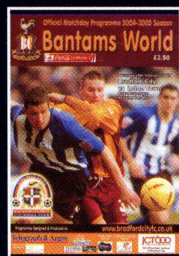

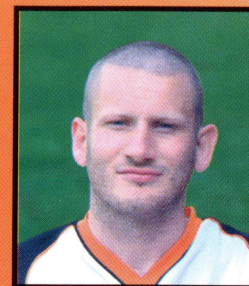

YOUR QUESTION'S

A: One of the key areas has been our luck with injuries and suspensions in the squad. The team has not been disrupted through long-term injuries and we have only had a few suspension. There has never been a question mark over team spirit – that has always been at the club.

Q: Do you think Luton can win the title this year and how do you think Luton will get on with life in the Championship?

Freya Nicholson, Luton

A: We are all desperate to win the league this season and it would be fantastic for the club. However, nobody is even looking ahead to next season until we are certain that we have won promotion.

Q: If you could manage any football team in the world, who would it be, why and who would you choose as your captain?

Karen Stokes

A: I suppose it would have to be AC Milan. I like to watch a lot of football and they are a side that play good football. Paolo Maldini would be my captain.

Q: Who is the best player you have played with during your time at Luton Town?

John Paul Walker, Edinburgh

A: Matthew Taylor was a decent player and he is an example to the young players at this club of what you can achieve. He was a vital player when we moved out of Division Three and he has a lot of ability on the ball.

Q: If you weren't a footballer, what would you be doing now?

Colin Enlander, Luton

A: I always knew I was going to be a footballer one day.

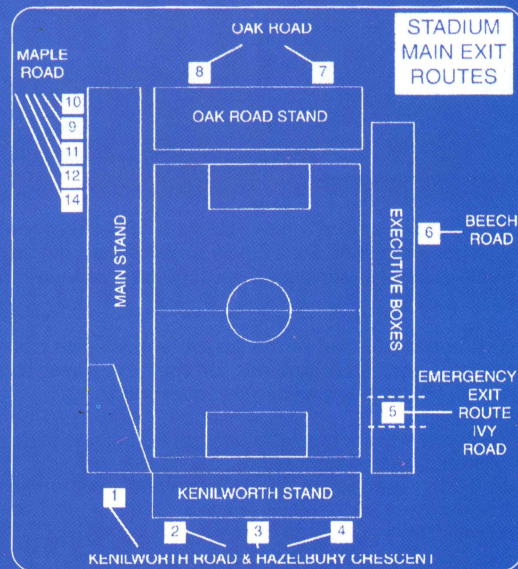

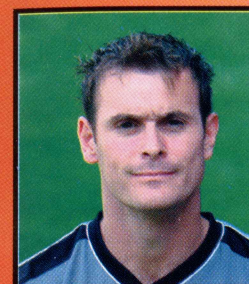
THAMESLINK

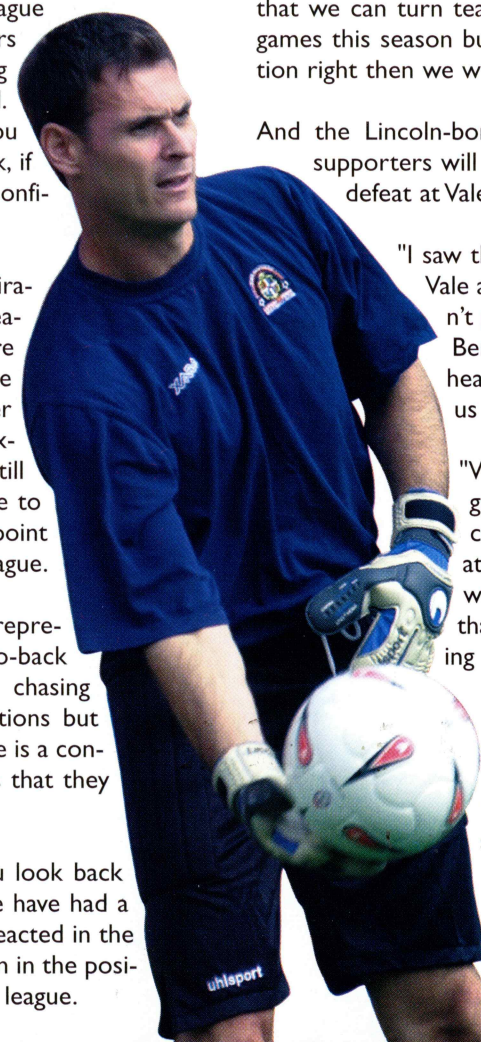
"Confidence is still high and we have the belief that we can turn teams over. There are no easy games this season but if we set out our application right then we will always get results."

A first half brace from Pawel Abbott gave The Terriers all three points, despite recent signing Guy Branston's second half reply for The Latics.

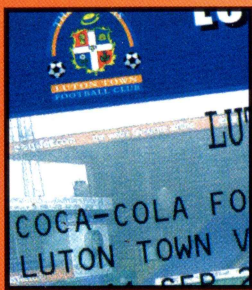
Oldham are a point above the relegation places, as are Torquay United, after they were thrashed 4-1 at Barnsley.

HOW TO GET TO OLDHAM ATHLETIC



By Road: To reach Boundary Park you need to leave the M62 at junction 20. The M62 can be reached via the M6 (Junction 21A) or the M1 (Junction 42). Once you have left junction 20 of the M62 you need to take the A627 (M) towards Oldham. After 2.5 miles at the large roundabout with A627/A663 take the long slip road to your left.

As you approach the roundabout you will find on your left a McDonalds and a KFC. For the club car park take the first exit off the roundabout onto Broadway (signposted Royton A633). Through the first set of traffic lights and the turn first right onto Hilbre Avenue. Then straight on into the fair sized club car park. The away fans stand is to your left. When you turn off Broadway into Hilbre Avenue there are some side streets on which you can park.

By Rail: There are two stations that you could use to get to Boundary Park, Oldham Werneth or Mill Hills. These stations are served by North West Trains on the Oldham Rochdale loop.

Parking: There is a large car park at the rear of the Lookers Stand.

Around the Ground: There is now a retail park just as you come off the A627 (M) towards the ground. Here you can find, Pizza Hut, McDonalds, Burger King and Kentucky Fried Chicken.

Visiting supporters: Away fans are housed in the Rochdale Road Stand at one end of the ground. The facilities in this newish stand are good, with a number of food outlets.

Where to drink: There is a pub 'The Clayton Arms' on one corner of the ground. This small comfortable pub serves Lees beers, reasonably priced food and has a large screen to show SKY Television. It gets extremely busy on matchdays.

By Coach with Town on Tour: Leaving Maple Road at 10:00am, with a pick up at Milton Keynes at approximately 10:30am. The fare for LTSC members is £17, £15 concessions and £19 for non-members. The Wiltshire club lie just outside the play-offs and will be hoping to make it second time lucky after failing to win promotion last season via the same system.

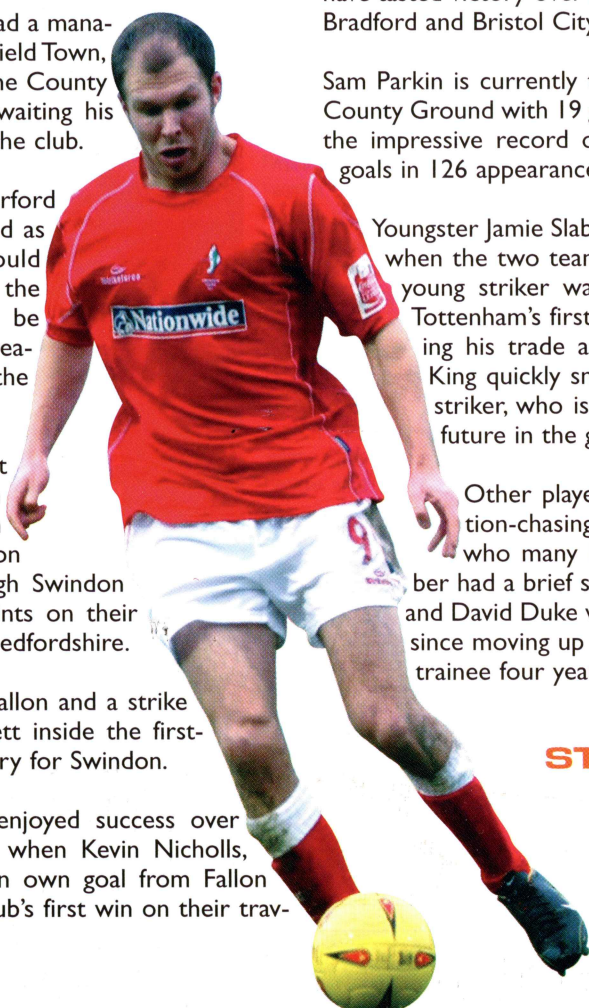
Andy King, who has had a managerial spell with Mansfield Town, is in his fifth year at the County Ground and is still awaiting his first promotion with the club.

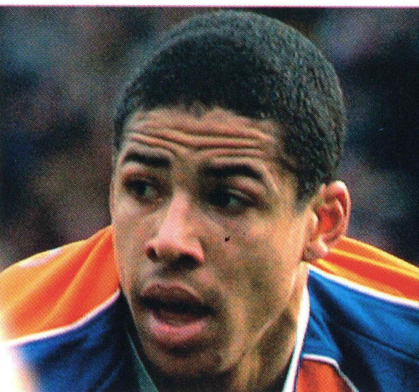
