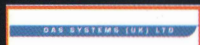

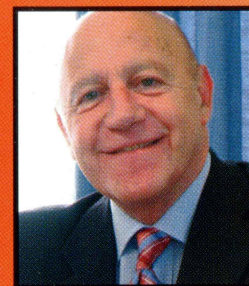

We will, of course, over the coming months, keep you the fans fully up to speed on this key subject, vital to the long-term future and development of the club.

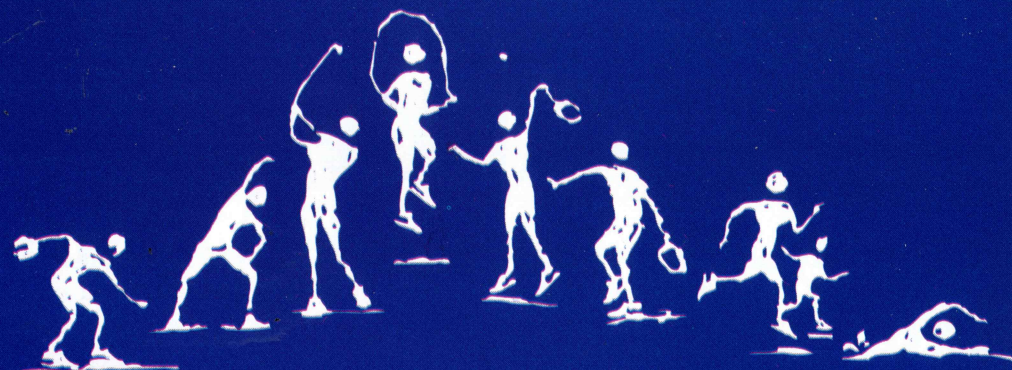
Your vocal support was tremendous last Saturday and I look forward to hearing it again at this afternoon's match.

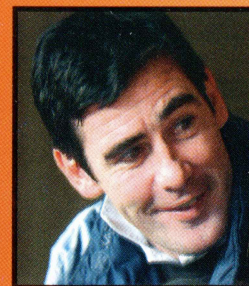

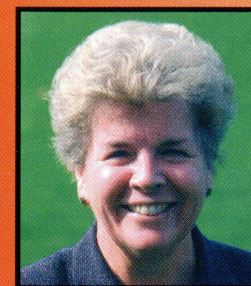

Last Thursday I attended one of the regular quarterly meetings of all Football League Clubs held at Walsall, where clubs are updated on all footballing matters, whether it is Regulations, Sponsorship, Funding etc.

One of the major items on the agenda is the possibility that The Football League will have to adhere to the "transfer windows" in line with the Premier League next season. Whilst the Board of The Football League continue to lobby FIFA, it does look as though we will not get further dispensation.

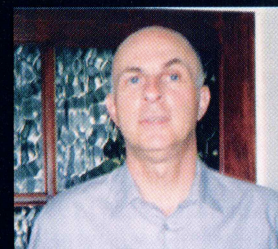

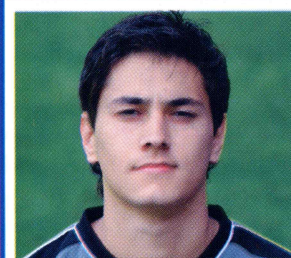


WELCOME ON BOARD

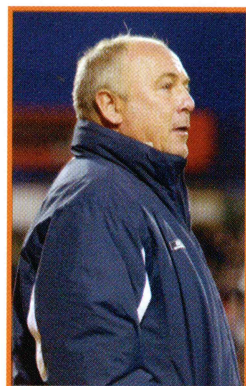

MANAGER

ANDY KING



Andy King started his managerial career at Mansfield Town where he spent four seasons with the Stags. In 1995, he took the stags into the Division Two play-offs, where the club were beaten by Chesterfield at the semi-final stages. Despite making an impressive start to his career with Mansfield, he was unable to match that achievement and the club had a number of seasons in mid-table.

King initially joined Swindon Town as assistant to Colin Todd in 2000 but took charge when the former Derby midfielder moved on to Pride Park. King lasted just 37 games before a change of chairman saw Roy Evans brought in as Robins boss. King was eventually re-appointed in December 2001 after Evans departed and since has been on a steady road to improvement season on season.

In 2003/04 he brought in several new signings that have steadily reversed the declining fortunes of the club and has now assembled a hard working side with a successful mixture of youth and experience. His side were unfortunate to not make it to the Divisional play off final last year after losing out to Brighton on penalties in the semi-final. He will be hoping to go one better this time around.

GOALKEEPERS

STEVE BOOK

Signed at the start of August 2004 from Cheltenham Town as a replacement for the departed Bart Griemink. An agile keeper, Book was part of Cheltenham Town's meteoric rise to the Football League and played over 200 appearances for the Whaddon Road side after signing from Forest Green Rovers in 1997.

RHYS EVANS

The promising young keeper joined Leyton Orient on a three-month loan deal in August 2002. He proved to be an excellent shot stopper and showed good command of his area. Rhys was unfortunate to pick up a leg injury, which cut short his period at Brisbane Road and saw him return to Chelsea. Later in that season he made his debut for the England Under 21 side against Serbia, but was eventually released by Chelsea last summer. Town manager Andy King swooped for the young stopper in 2003 to give first choice keeper Bart Griemink more competition for the number one shirt at Swindon Town. Since then Evans has been a regular between the posts for Town and has turned in many match saving performances.

DEFENDERS

DAVID DUKE

David Duke arrived on a free transfer from Sunderland in 2000 having never managed a start for the Black Cat's first team. Duke appeared regularly in his first season with the Robins and he has now amassed over 165 league starts for Swindon in a variety of positions.

SEAN O'HANLON

After impressing during an eight-game loan spell last season, Liverpool-born Sean O'Hanlon signed for Swindon Town in March 2004 on a permanent basis from Everton. Having come up through the youth ranks at Goodison Park, O'Hanlon left Merseyside in search of first team football and was a rock in the centre of defence towards the end of the 2003-04 season and is surely one of Town's brightest prospects.

MATTHEW HEYWOOD

It has been another consistent year for Town's most effective defender and after a slow start, he returned to the kind of form that saw him clean up in the 2001/02 Player of the Year

Awards. Strong in the tackle and good in the air, Heywood is proving to be a great asset to the club. It is no coincidence that Town's defensive record improved dramatically following his arrival and whilst he may not have scored as many goals as he would have liked, he can prove effective when sent forward as an extra body in the box.

ANDREW NICHOLAS

Andrew was a regular member of Liverpool's under-19 winning team in 2003 and won plaudits with his consistent performances at left back. At the time, his path into the first team at Liverpool seemed blocked and upon his decision to leave, King snapped him up in the summer of 2003. The left sided defender has never looked back and has given a number of solid performances so far. With good height, terrific pace and recovery he has made the left back slot his own during the last campaign.

ALAN REEVES

Before joining Swindon in 1998, Alan Reeves spent four years at Wimbledon. Reeves has also played for Gillingham, Chester and Rochdale where he is considered to be one of the best players in the club's history. Town's veteran defender enjoyed another fine season in 2002-03. Although initially not a member of the side, he forced his way into contention as the team hit some poor early season form and his uncompromising and committed displays helped the Robins turn their fortunes around. He has now made well over 400 league appearances and was rewarded last season with a playing/coaching role that has seen him turn around the fortunes of Town's reserve side.

MIDFIELDERS

MATTHEW HEWLETT

All at Ashton Gate once tipped midfielder Matt for the top. The former Bristol City player was called into the England Under 21 squad, but a number of injuries curtailed his flourishing career. In the end Hewlett made over 100 appearances for City, but left them to join Town on a Bosman in the summer of 2000. He was a regular for Colin Todd until being hit by injury once again and went on to play just 26 league games. Last term he was virtually ever-present (43 games in all competitions) and captained the side last season in the absence of the suspended regular skipper Andy Gurney.



SWINDON TOWN

LEE HOLMES



Exciting prospect Lee Holmes became Derby County's youngest ever player when he came on as a substitute against Grimsby Town on Boxing Day 2002. Aged 15 years 267 days at kick-off the youngster rewrote the Derby County record books in place of Steve Powell who previously held the record of youngest ever player for over 30 years after making his debut in 1971, aged 16 years and 30 days. Holmes is a Derbyshire lad with super close control, good ball skills and a thumping shot and he was signed by Town Boss Andy King in December 2004 and made his debut at Peterborough United on Boxing Day.

SAMMY IGOE



After making his way up through the ranks at Portsmouth, where he began as a trainee, Igoe went on to secure a first team spot at the south coast club and made his mark with some impressive performances. He moved to Reading in a £100,000 deal but found it difficult to break into the first team and spent much of his time on the substitutes bench. Sammy eventually joined Luton on loan on transfer deadline day and went straight into their starting line up. However after just two appearances

a training ground accident brought his stay to a premature close and he returned to the Madejski Stadium. After deciding he was no longer in then manager Alan Pardew's future plans, Igoe left to join Swindon in the summer of 2003. This season he has brought a fresh enthusiasm to the Town side and has quickly become a crowd favourite with his quick feet, skills and turn of pace.

STEFANI MIGLIORANZI

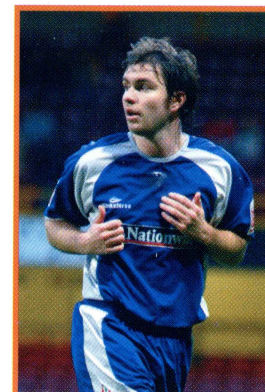
Miglioranzi is the product of the American College football system in which the most promising players are drafted into Major League Soccer. The 22-year-old is a Brazilian born American but holds an Italian passport. Miglioranzi is versatile; he can play in defence or as a central midfielder. Since joining the club in July, has impressed in the middle of Town's midfield. A classy player who always looks calm and collected, he has good body strength and also possesses a fine shot. He recently made his comeback from an adductor injury with an appearance off the bench against Blackpool in January and is back in the first team fold.

STEVE ROBINSON

Tough-tackling and energetic right-footed midfielder terrier signed from Birmingham City for £50,000 in February 2001, he was an automatic choice for the Robins for the remainder of that season and more recently, signed a two-year extension to his contract. A former Birmingham trainee, he broke into the Blues team under Barry Fry but has constantly been dogged by injuries. He made over 50 league starts for the Blues, but almost joined Sheffield United in 1999 only to fail the medical. He was involved at the start of the 2000-01 season, but was transfer-listed by Trevor Francis in November. He duly left for Wiltshire in the hope of first team football. His non stop attitude and one hundred per cent work rate for the team has

proved to be an outstanding asset and having missed the latter part of last season he has worked hard and is very much part of the squad once again.

GRANT SMITH



Grant, although fully involved in Sheffield United's pre season games, made just one start in their 2002-03 campaign, appearing as a striker against Wimbledon when things did not go his way. Occasionally on the bench, he was a regular in the Blades successful reserve side and in March he joined Plymouth Argyle in a

loan deal. Since joining in the summer of 2003, Smith was made to wait for his chance and having featured in the Carling Cup win at Southend United, was given an opportunity to impress at Leeds United in the Second Round. Began this season in the starting line-up at Wrexham before being relegated to the bench. He has now made a run of first team appearances and has put his left foot to great affect, scoring five goals in eight games.

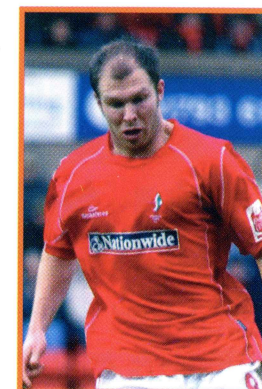
STRIKERS

RORY FALLON

A recent signing from Barnsley, the big striker made quite an impression against Town in the past two seasons, scoring on many occasions and catching the eye of Town boss Andy King. He joined Barnsley as a professional in 1999 after moving up through their trainee programme. Last season saw him score his first ever league goal against Blackpool and he quickly followed that up the following week in a game at Stockport. King had become a keen admirer of the striker by that point and Town eventually agreed a disclosed fee with Barnsley to bring him down to Wiltshire. Having waited patiently for his chance, has scored a number of goals including a brilliant overhead kick from the edge of the box to secure a point against Bristol City in early April.

SAM PARKIN

Young and very promising forward who joined the club from Chelsea in 2002. The transfer followed a mass of speculation, with Andy King, a



huge fan of the player, tracking him for several months. He joined Millwall in September 2000 and made his Football League debut for the Lions in a 5-0 demolition of Oxford United. He then went on loan to Wycombe Wanderers in November 2000 and scored twice in 13 games for the

Chairboys. He went on loan once again to Oldham Athletic before joining Northampton, again on loan, in 2001. Parkin more than repaid Andy King's faith in his ability by netting 26 goals during the 2002-03 campaign. He went on to finish third in the Division's goal charts and understandably he romped away with the majority of trophies when the clubs 'Player of the Year' awards were handed out in 2002-2003.

MICHAEL PROCTOR

Signed on a month's loan from Rotherham United, in a move financed by a fan's initiative the Red Army Fund. Proctor wasted little time in scoring on his debut against Port Vale with a 25th minute winner. Joined Sunderland as a trainee in August 1997 but joined Rotherham in the summer of 2004. He has also had loan spells with Hvidovre, York, Halifax and Bradford City.

CHRISTIAN ROBERTS

Cardiff-born striker who joined Town on Thursday 14th October 2004 in a £50,000 switch from local rivals Bristol City. He is an aggressive runner and will add much needed pace to the Swindon frontline. Formerly with Exeter City where he scored 18 goals in 67 league starts for the Grecians from 2000 - 2002.

JAMIE SLABBER

Young striker signed in December 2004 on loan from Spurs until the end of the season. Made his White Hart Lane debut during the 2002-3 season as a substitute against Liverpool and wasted no time in setting up Teddy Sheringham to score. A robust player, Slabber made his debut for Swindon in the home game with Colchester on New Years Day.

HATTERS HISTORY

THE HATTERS started the 1994/95 campaign failing to fire on all cylinders due to their inability to score goals, especially at home where the players struggled against massed defences.

Away from Kenilworth Road things were more than a little different with the speedy Scott Oakes and Dwight Marshall able to catch teams on the break and by the time of the visit to Swindon in late November we had the best away record in the Football League.

Following relegation from the Premier League the previous season, the Robins were in freefall and during the week prior to the game had sacked manager John Gorman. His potential replacement, Steve McMahon, looked on as poor headed back pass by the Town's Trevor Peake led to Keith Scott giving the home side the lead in the 10th minute.

This early shock did not seem to worry the players though, and it was all Luton from then on as the Swindon goal led a charmed life. After several close shaves the equaliser came just before the interval when a clever Paul Telfer cross was headed home by Kerry Dixon.

The second half started as the first had ended and we went ahead on the hour when Oakes took advantage of a short pass inside the Swindon full-back to outpace the defence and drill the ball home. The Hatters then played a containing game, "Reminiscent of Liverpool," said manager David Pleat afterwards, as they marched up to sixth spot, the club's highest position since dropping out of the top flight in 1992.

By the time of the return, in mid February, we had been unable to maintain our play-off push and had just suffered a 0-5 league defeat at Grimsby as well as a 0-6 thrashing at Southampton in the F.A.Cup. Swindon, though, were staring a second consecutive relegation in the face and had probably allowed their concentration to slip as they fought through to the semi-final of the Coca-Cola cup.

With the second leg of the semi-final to be played during the week following the clash with the Hatters all at Kenilworth Road hoped that Swindon minds would be elsewhere.

And so it proved as, after the Town opened the scoring on 19 minutes when Kevin Horlock unfortunately deflected the ball into his own net, it was one-way traffic and the perfect tonic after the two hammerings.

Rough diamond John Hartson had been sold to Arsenal the previous month for £2.5 million and David Pleat had encountered difficulties in spending some of the windfall on a replacement forward leaving Dwight Marshall to assume the goalscoring mantle with Dixon now out of favour.

Marshall had a field day with his pace ripping the Swindon defence to pieces and netted twice in the second-half to earn a comfortable victory. We even had the luxury of missing a penalty with Oakes the fourth player to fail from the spot that season.

point cushion over third placed Sheffield Wednesday, who leapfrogged over Tranmere following their defeat against Hull.

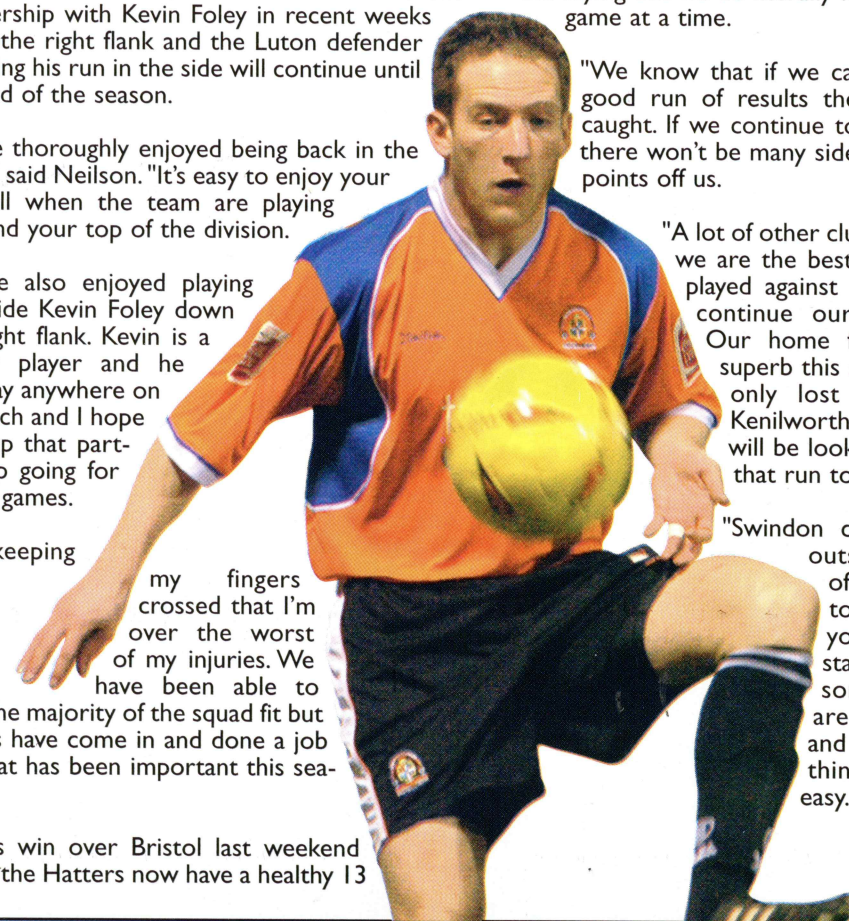

Brentford put behind them their disappointment of being knocked out of the FA Cup as a second half strike from Jay Tabb gave Martin Allen's side a 1-0 win at struggling Colchester United.

Bradford City got goals from Andy Cooke and Dean Windass to defeat Yorkshire rivals Huddersfield Town 2-0 at Valley Parade.

Andy Ritchie got his spell as Barnsley manager off to a positive start by heaping more misery on Peterborough United with a 3-1 win at London Road.

Torquay United have dropped into the relegation places after a 2-2 home draw with mid-table Chesterfield.

Second half strikes from John Murphy and Keith Southern gave Blackpool a 2-0 win over Walsall at Bloomfield Road.

Ronnie Moore got his career as Oldham Athletic manager off to a great start with an important 3-0 win over Port Vale at Boundary Park thanks to a first half strike from Will Haining and a second half brace from Kenny Cooper that gave the Latics three valuable points after a poor recent run of form.

Finally, Milton Keynes Dons are out of the relegation places after a 2-1 home win over bottom club Stockport County.

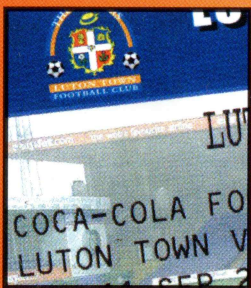

HOW TO GET TO OLDHAM ATHLETIC



By Road: To reach Boundary Park you need to leave the M62 at junction 20. The M62 can be reached via the M6 (Junction 21A) or the M1 (Junction 42). Once you have left junction 20 of the M62 you need to take the A627 (M) towards Oldham. After 2.5 miles at the large roundabout with A627/A663 take the long slip road to your left.

As you approach the roundabout you will find on your left a McDonalds and a KFC. For the club car park take the first exit off the roundabout onto Broadway (signposted Royton A633). Through the first set of traffic lights and the turn first right onto Hilbre Avenue. Then straight on into the fair sized club car park. The away fans stand is to your left. When you turn off Broadway into Hilbre Avenue there are some side streets on which you can park.

By Rail: There are two stations that you could use to get to Boundary Park, Oldham Werneth or Mill Hills. These stations are served by North West Trains on the Oldham Rochdale loop.

Parking: There is a large car park at the rear of the Lookers Stand.

Around the Ground: There is now a retail park just as you come off the A627 (M) towards the ground. Here you can find, Pizza Hut, McDonalds, Burger King and Kentucky Fried Chicken.

Visiting supporters: Away fans are housed in the Rochdale Road Stand at one end of the ground. The facilities in this newish stand are good, with a number of food outlets.

Where to drink: There is a pub 'The Clayton Arms' on one corner of the ground. This small comfortable pub serves Lees beers, reasonably priced food and has a large screen to show SKY Television. It gets extremely busy on matchdays.

By Coach with Town on Tour: Leaving Maple Road at 10:00am, with a pick up at Milton Keynes at approximately 10:30am. The fare for LTSC members is £17, £15 concessions and £19 for non-members. To book seats visit the supporters kiosk or phone 07960 567465. You can also book online by visiting the fans section of www.luton-town.co.uk.

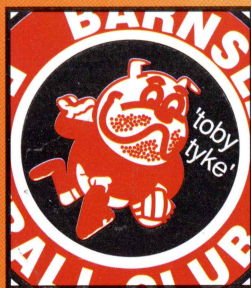

COMING NEXT

THE SKY television cameras descend on Kenilworth Road for our next home fixture against Barnsley.

It's the first time Sky will screen a game at Kenilworth Road since our 3-1 win over Tranmere Rovers in October 2003.

Barnsley will come to Kenilworth Road with a new man at the helm since we previously played the Tykes back in August.

Former Nottingham Forest boss Paul Hart left his post at Oakwell recently after a poor run of results and has been temporarily replaced by former Oldham striker Andy Ritchie.

And the new boss got off to a perfect start claiming a 3-1 win over relegation strugglers Peterborough United.

Barnsley's biggest problem this season has been their trouble to string a run of unbeaten results and although they did enjoy a 13 match undefeated run from November, the club only managed to pick up four wins in that space of time.

The Tykes have managed five victories on their travels this season, their most impressive coming in the shape of a 2-0 win over close rivals Huddersfield Town in September.

Matches between the two sides in recent years

have been high scoring affairs with 18 goals flying in during the previous five meetings.

In the 2002/2003 season, both sides shared 3-2 victories but the most recent game at Kenilworth Road saw the visitors grab all three points.

Anthony Kay scored a 90th minute winner in December 2003 to claim a 1-0 victory for the Yorkshire club and condemn Luton to only their second defeat at home that season.

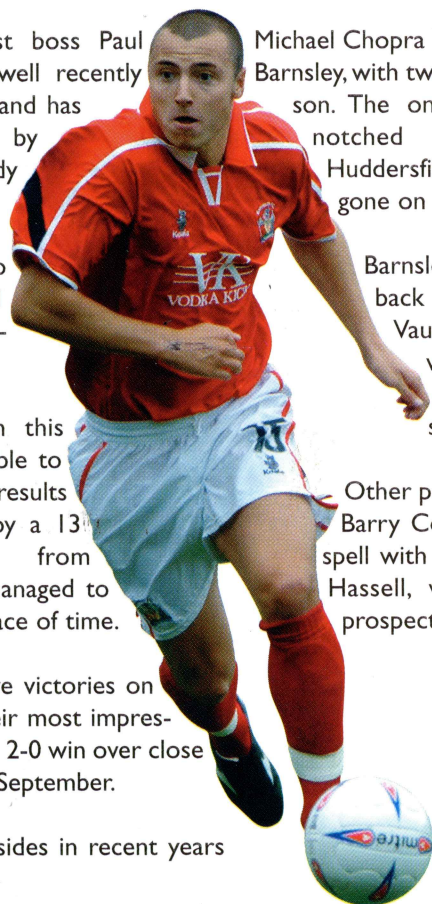
Michael Chopra is the man currently on form for Barnsley, with two hat-tricks to his name this season. The on-loan striker from Newcastle, notched hat-tricks in wins over Huddersfield and Peterborough and has gone on to score 14 goals this season.

Barnsley will go into this fixture on the back of the news that skipper Tony Vaughan is likely to be out of action with a groin injury and he has been influential for the club this season.

Other players who may catch the eye are Barry Conlon, who enjoyed a successful spell with Darlington and defender Bobby Hassell, who is regarded as a bright prospect at Oakwell.

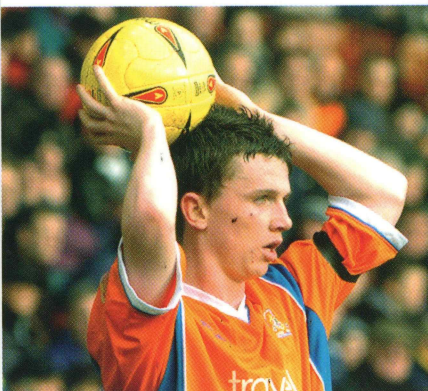
