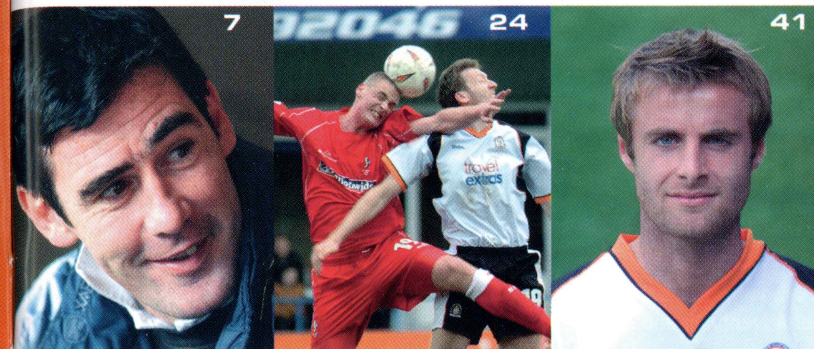

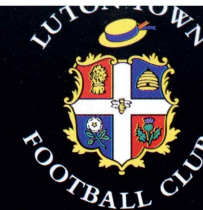

THE CHAIRMAN

WELCOME TO our supporters for our Good Friday fixture against Barnsley and welcome to their directors, management, players and supporters.

I was delighted with the final outcome of our hard-fought match at Boundary Park, coming away with an important point. With eight remaining games, four of them being at home, every point that we gain is crucial.

Congratulations to Kevin Foley on his selection for the Republic of Ireland Under-21 UEFA Championship qualifying match today against Israel at the Herzlia Stadium- Tel Aviv. While this is a great credit to Kevin and to the Club, unfortunately the downside of these important international games often affects a player's availability to play for the club. The good news is, with the support of Don Givens the Republic's Manager, that flight arrangements have been made to ensure that Kevin is available for selection for our away game against Torquay United on Easter Monday.

Following the local coverage of my recent meeting arranged by the Official Supporters Club held at the Vauxhall Recreation Centre and chaired by BBC Three Counties Radio presenter Ian Pearce, I am pleased that the feedback has been positive in keeping our supporters up to speed, in particular on our re-location position. In addition I had the opportunity to cover many of the points raised by the supporters the following morning to an even bigger audience and to another loyal Luton supporter, Roberto Perrone, on his well-known breakfast show. Roberto is always a tough

interviewer, but he is the voice of the fans on local radio, and I am pleased to have been pressed on important issues relating to the club's future.

An important issue facing Football League clubs is the potential rule change relating to the timing of transfer windows, which will have a major impact on how transfer business will be conducted in the future. Although the final version is still not available, the F.A. have obtained a final draft, which was submitted by FIFA last December.

The basic principle is that Football League clubs will fall into line with the rest of Europe with two registration periods, or 'windows'. One will be the close season (twelve weeks) and another will be in the middle of the season (four weeks in the month of January), as already applied to The Premier League. There are indications of restrictions, such as a player only being able to play for two clubs in one season; no provision for short-term loans or monthly contracts; and no provision for emergency goalkeepers. It is helpful, even now, to assess the potential consequences in the event that The Football League are unable to obtain any flexibility.

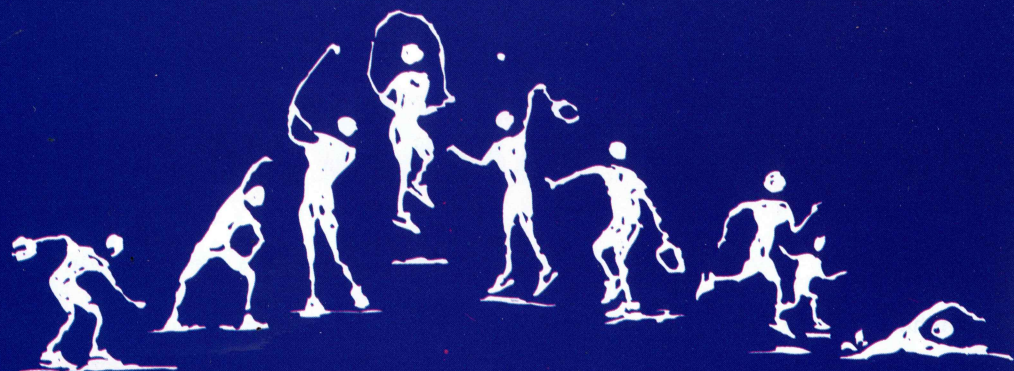

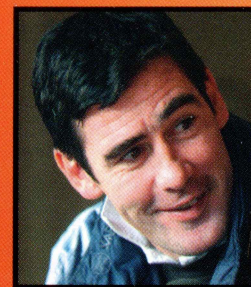

We had a good result against Swindon and picked up what could be a very important point against Oldham last Saturday. Although we may have deserved more over the 90 minutes it was certainly nice to salvage a draw so late in the day. It proves what we already know about our players, that they have a great desire to succeed and belief in one another, which enables them to keep going even when they are not having it their own way.

It was transfer deadline day yesterday and as I write these notes we have not yet managed to sign anyone. We have however made a number of offers for players despite what certain managers would have you believe. I don't understand why some clubs can't be honest and open. In today's day and age with web-sites and agents, very little can be kept quiet.

I am very old fashioned and would prefer to announce a new signing when he has actually put pen to paper. Unfortunately it is the agent that will have the final

say and the more options open to them the better it is for them.

We will not get involved in auctions or pay over the odds because we can't afford to. We will always try to bring in young hungry players which will, in the long run, make the club stronger and we will never have anyone forced upon us by representatives who believe their job is to find us talent. Some of them must think we sit on our hands all week waiting for phone to ring. We drive all over the country week in week out and are aware of what's out there. Getting what you want is a different matter.

At this stage in the season it becomes very difficult to find other topics to talk about and I am sure many of you are fed up hearing me harp on about agents. However it is something I feel very strongly about and it is something that the authorities are not addressing or dealing with.

Enjoy the game and get behind the lads.

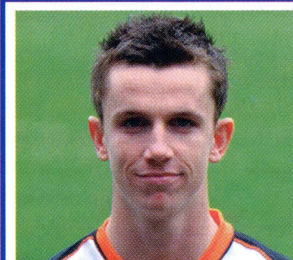

His new deal will keep him with the club until July 2007.

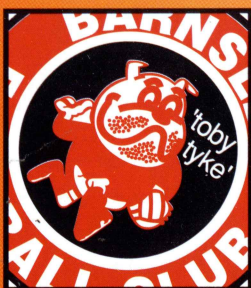

CARETAKER MANAGER

ANDY RITCHIE



As a player, Andy Ritchie came through the ranks at Manchester United where he hit 13 goals for the Red Devils in 42 appearances before joining Brighton in a six-figure deal in 1980. Moves to Leeds United, Oldham Athletic, Scarborough and a second spell at Boundary Park followed in a distinguished playing career that spanned 25 years and over 650 appearances, netting more than 200 goals.

It was at Oldham where Ritchie had a distinguished career where his stay at Boundary Park spanned over eight years, scoring over 100 goals. Ritchie was part of the Oldham squad which played in the Premiership and also took the Latics to an FA Cup semi-final appearance, losing to Manchester United, in the same year Luton reached that stage of the competition. Ritchie, who was born in Manchester, took over the reigns at Oakwell after Paul Hart's departure on March 4, 2005 and comes to Kenilworth Road this afternoon unbeaten in his opening three games in charge of the club with a win over Peterborough United and two draws. This is Ritchie's second stint as a boss after he followed up his playing career at Oldham with a three-year stay as manager recording 59 wins and losing 75 in a 179 games stint during the late nineties.

GOALKEEPERS

NICK COLGAN

Republic Of Ireland international goalkeeper Nick Colgan signed for the Reds in June 2004. Nick started his career with his hometown club Drogheda in Ireland before moving to Premier League giants Chelsea in 1992. He made just one appearance for the Blues and had spells on loan with Crewe Alexandra, Grimsby Town, Millwall, Brentford and Reading. The stopper joined Bournemouth in 1998 before moving to Hibernian in July 1999. He made 147 appearances for Hibs before going out on loan to Stockport County last season, turning out 17 times for the Hatters. Nick made his international debut for the Republic of Ireland in March 2002 against Denmark and has gone on to win eight full caps for his county.

DAVID SCARSELLA

Barnsley completed the signing of goalkeeper David Scarsella after international clearance was received from the Australian FA in mid-July 2004. The Aussie schoolboy international had been training at Oakwell since the start of pre-season and penned a two-year deal with the club. David joined the Reds from Australian football where he spent last season with Adelaide United.

ROSS TURNBULL

Ross Turnbull completed his return to Oakwell after signing a one-month loan deal with the club in October 2004. Ross spent a short time on loan with the club from Middlesbrough last season, making three appearances. He made his Barnsley debut against Brentford at Oakwell in April 2004 and also featured against Tranmere Rovers and Stockport County as cover for now Luton goalkeeper Marlon Beresford. The 19-year-old was born in Bishop Auckland and has been a regular with the England youth set up. He is now first choice for England's Under 20 squad. Ross has been with Middlesbrough since a schoolboy and has also spent time on loan with Darlington and Bradford City.

DEFENDERS

NEIL AUSTIN

Neil Austin signed a professional contract at Oakwell in 1999 after impressing through the junior ranks. The Barnsley born youngster has been a regular at youth level for the Reds and broke into the reserve team during the 2001/2002 season. He is highly rated at Oakwell

and by the English FA winning caps for the national team through to Under 19 level. Neil was handed a squad number for the 2002/2003 season and made his first team debut at Swindon on August 10. Neil went on to make 35 appearances in his debut season and won the club's coveted Young Player Of The Year award. Was again a first team regular during the 2003/2004 campaign, making 44 appearances under Gudjon Thordarson and Paul Hart.

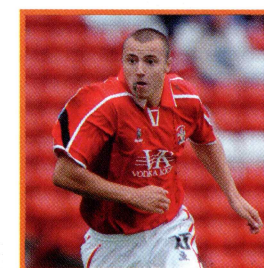
MATT CARBON

Barnsley moved quickly in the transfer market to sign experienced defender Matt Carbon in May 2004. Matt was released by Walsall at the end of the 2003/2004 campaign following the Saddlers relegation to Division Two and swiftly agreed a deal at Oakwell. The 28-year-old started his career as a trainee with Lincoln City before a six-figure move to Premier League Derby County in 1996. He left the Rams in 1998 to sign for West Bromwich Albion in another six-figure deal and spent three successful years at the Hawthorns. Matt featured against the Reds in both games during the 2000/2001 season before leaving West Brom in the summer. He joined Walsall and made more than 50 appearances for the Saddlers before leaving the club.

BOBBY HASSELL

Former Barnsley boss Paul Hart continued his summer rebuilding by signing full back Bobby Hassell in the summer of 2004. The 24-year-old was released by Mansfield Town at the end of the 2003/4 season and completed his move to Oakwell on July 1, 2004. Bobby joined the Field Mill side as a trainee in 1996 and made his first team debut for the Stags against Chester City in September 1997. An attacking right-sided defender, Bobby made 181 appearances for Mansfield, netting three goals, and was a virtual ever present for Keith Curle's side last season. He played in the Division Three Play Off Final at the Millennium Stadium in May 2004.

ANTONY KAY



Antony has been at Barnsley since junior school and has progressed through the ranks at the Academy. He was a member of the successful Barnsley U15 team, he signed for Barnsley despite the interest of a lot of

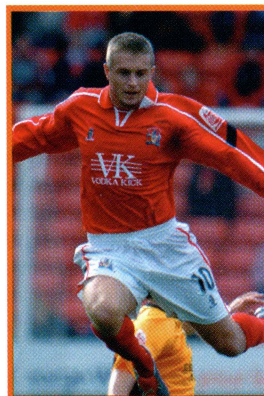
other clubs. His performances for both the reserves and the Academy saw him called up for England Under 18s, even though he was unfortunate not to get a game in their friendly with Belgium. He again won international recognition in May 2001, when he made his England U18 debut against Switzerland. 2003/2004 was really the year where Antony came of age as a Barnsley star, making 51 first team appearances, netting four goals. He swept the board at the end of season awards picking up the Reds Player Of The Year, Young Player Of The Year and Disabled Supporters Player Of The Year gongs.

MIDFIELDERS

JACOB BURNS

Former Leeds United star, Jacob joined the Reds during the 2003/2004 season and instantly made a big impression in the Barnsley midfield. An Australian international, he started his career with Paramatta Power in his native country before making the big move to Elland Road in 2000. Although he featured his ten times for the Whites, Jacob has experience of playing in the Premier League and UEFA Champions League.

STEPHEN MCPHAIL



Barnsley completed the signing of Republic Of Ireland international Stephen McPhail from Leeds United in early July 2004. The 24-year-old was born in London and joined the Elland Road club as a trainee in 1997. He impressed coming through the ranks with the Whites, making his Premier League debut as a substitute against

Leicester City in February 1998. He went out on loan at the start of last season, linking up with Paul Hart at Nottingham Forest. He made 16 appearances at the City Ground and also won international caps against Turkey and Canada. Stephen went back to Elland Road in late November 2003 and was a regular in the Leeds side that crashed out of the Premier League, making 12 appearances from December until the end of the season. Stephen won his tenth international cap in the Republic of Ireland's 3-0 defeat against Nigeria in May 2004.

PAUL REID

Paul Reid became the eighth new arrival of summer 2004 at Oakwell when he moved from Northampton Town in mid-July. The 22-year-old started his career with Carlisle United before a six-figure transfer to Scottish giants Rangers in 2000. He had a loan with Preston North End during the 2002/2003 campaign before arriving at Northampton Town on loan in December 2002. Paul made his Northampton Town debut at Oakwell in a 2-1 victory for the Cobblers in January 2003. The loan move was made into a permanent switch the following summer and Paul impressed during his time at Sixfields, wearing the captain's armband last season.

CHRIS SHUKER



Barnsley signed midfielder Chris Shuker from Premier League Manchester City in mid-March 2004. The highly-rated winger was Paul Hart's first signing when he was at charge at Oakwell. The 21-year-old is a product of the Manchester City Academy and was promoted to the City first

team by former England boss Kevin Keegan at the start of the 2001/2002 season. He featured against Barnsley in Manchester City's 3-0 win at Oakwell in October 2001. He made his Premier League debut against Leeds United in August 2002. Chris spent time on loan with Macclesfield, Walsall and Rochdale before arriving at Hartlepool earlier this season. He made 15 first team appearances for Pools, featuring against the Reds both at Victoria Park on Boxing Day 2003 and at Oakwell in early February 2004. Chris made his Barnsley debut against Port Vale at Oakwell on March 20 and was an ever present in the side for the rest of the 2003/4 season.

STRIKERS

MICHAEL BOULDING

The Tykes pulled off a massive coup in the transfer market, beating a host of other clubs to sign one of the hottest properties in Division Two, when they completed a deal for Michael in February 2004. Grimsby Town's 13-goal hitman Michael Boulding has completed a move to Oakwell for a fee of around £50,000 and penned a two year contract. Former boss Gudjon Thordarson has been chasing the former Aston Villa star for some time and has finally got his man after the two clubs agreed a fee yesterday. Michael started his career with non-league Hallam FC before moving to Mansfield Town and Grimsby initially in 2001. A big move to Aston Villa followed in 2002 before he returned to Blundell Park a year ago. He has hit 13 goals in all competitions this season. Michael suffered a knee injury shortly after joining the Reds and was limited to just six first team appearances during the final weeks of the 2003/2004 campaign.

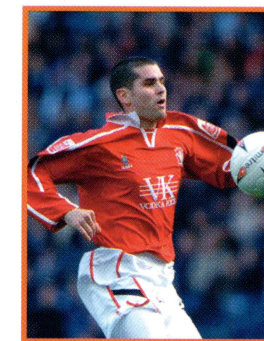

A regular with the national teams' youth sides, Michael played at Oakwell for England's U19s against Hungary back in November 2001. He has more than 35 international caps at youth level and captained the Under 20s in last years World Youth Championships in Dubai.

BARRY CONLON

Barnsley swooped to sign hitman Barry Conlon in the summer of 2004 after he was a target of ten clubs at the end of the 2003/2004 season but formally joined the Reds on July 1, 2004. The 25-year-old started his playing career with QPR and had spells with Man City, Plymouth Argyle, Southend United, York City and Colchester United before moving to Darlington in 2001. He netted 14 goals for the Quakers last season. Barry has made 264 career first team appearances, netting 70 goals.

DANIEL NARDIELLO



THE son of former Coventry winger Donato Nardiello, Daniel has been a prolific striker at youth level for Manchester United. In season 2000/01, he scored 14 goals (inc. 2 penalties) in 11 starts and nine sub appearances for the Under-19s. Daniel turned professional on 22 October 1999, only five months after starting his scholarship. Daniel made his first team debut for Manchester United on 5 November 2001, when he came on as sub for Bojan Djordjic in the Worthington Cup third round tie at Arsenal. Joined the Reds in January 2004 on loan, hitting two goals on his Barnsley debut. The Manchester United starlet was a massive hit on loan at Oakwell during the 2003/2004 campaign netting seven goals in 16 games before returning to Old Trafford. He came back to Barnsley in the summer of 2004 on a season-long loan deal that delighted supporters.

HATTERS HISTORY

SEASON 1965/66 saw the Town enter Division Four for the first time in their history and early results were mixed as the players tried to find their feet at this new level.

For some peculiar reason, never fully explained, we played our mid-week home fixtures at this time on Thursday evenings and the game against Doncaster Rovers in early October was no exception. The now customary fleet of managers and scouts, who were tracking ace marksman John O'Rourke, joined the Kenilworth Road faithful to see their man score a hat-trick and miss several more chances.

On a wet night, Alick Jeffrey opened the scoring for Rovers only for O'Rourke to equalise straight after with a shot from 20 yards. Ray Whittaker then put the Town into the lead from the restart. Rovers levelled once more in the 26th minute but from then on it was all Luton, with the Doncaster goal leading a charmed life as half-time approached, with shots from O'Rourke hitting the post and crossbar.

All came right in the second half as O'Rourke scored twice early on and a last minute effort from Jeffrey only served to give the scoreline an unrealistic look based on the balance of play.

Two days later, Barnsley were the visitors to Kenilworth Road and the ongoing exploits of O'Rourke, together with the entertainment served up in the Doncaster game, swelled the crowd by almost 1,000 to 5,948.

The crowd were not to be disappointed as Billy Stark, Tony Read, Whittaker and O'Rourke all flashed the ball past the bewildered Roy Ironside in the Barnsley goal in the first half-hour. Unfortunately, after putting themselves into a seemingly impregnable position, the players let Barnsley off the hook by fiddling in midfield with the result that by half-time two goals had been pulled back by John Bettany and Martin Ferguson. Luton manager George Martin had some strong words to say at half-time and the Town started the second period with more purpose and goal-keeper-turned- striker, Tony Read, scored a glorious fifth to lessen the crowds fears of a Barnsley fight back.

But fight back they did with George Kerr scoring a third 20 minutes from the end, before being carried off after colliding with Luton goalkeeper Colin Tinsley, and Martin Ferguson reducing the arrears still further in injury time.

Apparently the air was blue in the changing room afterwards due to the lack of concentration at the back although the Luton supporters could not really complain having seen 16 goals scored and two wins to boot. In the next three home games, however, 13 goals were scored by the Hatters with only two conceded giving rise to Martin's claim that you could play attractive, attacking football while at the same time remaining tight at the back.

SKY SPORTS

A WEEK ago today, Sky Sports broadcasted their 500th live match from the Football League when West Ham drew 2-2 with Leicester City. Seven days on and it is Luton's turn to appear in front of the nation, along with Barnsley, for this afternoon's League One encounter.

Since the first match was shown back in August 1996, over 1,250 goals have been scored in just under eight seasons, at an average of two-and-a-half goals a game and with Luton having netted three times in recent television appearances against Southend and Tranmere Rovers last season, history suggests that average should at least be maintained today.

If you often find yourself sat at home in front of the television, watching a match, it is a simple case of putting the TV on but have you ever wondered exactly what goes into bringing the game to your front lounge?

Most matchday broadcasts require ten cameras to be positioned around the stadium and the whole operation involves around fifty staff at the ground and Sky's headquarters to ensure the programme runs smoothly. Last season over 400 live matches were screened - which included, for the first time, ties from the UEFA Champions League. This tried and tested format built up over the last ten years means that, from planning to transmission, Sky's football output remains as smooth and as professional as ever.

A Production Manager is assigned to each live match, preparing every detail from the laying of cables to booking satellite links. They visit the ground in advance and draw up

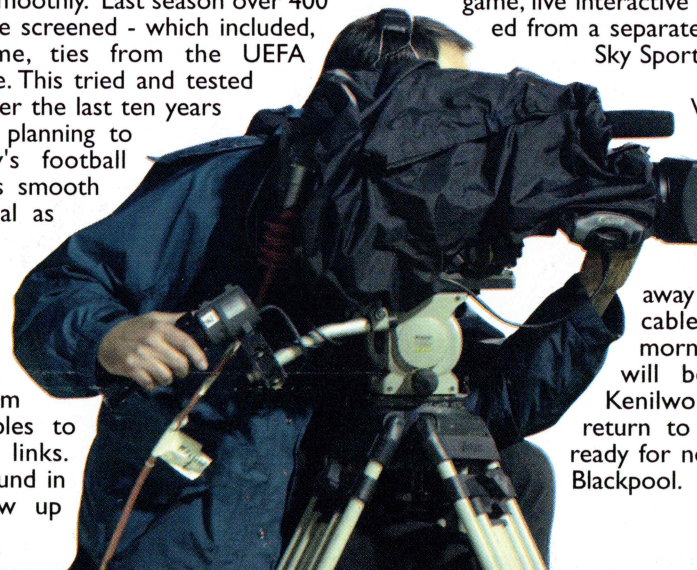
plans for camera positions, power requirements, and cabling routes.

In the week of the match any scaffolding, for camera gantries or the presenter's studio, will be erected. Then, on the day before the game, up to ten miles of cable for cameras, microphones and power are laid. Cameras are installed on a matchday with technical checks a few hours before the live production begins.

The Programme Director is responsible for the show surrounding the game. After days of preparation, when the running order, video pieces, statistics and highlights are prepared, his main role begins at the countdown from the adverts into the show. Seconds before kick-off he hands over to the Match Director, and prepares for the fifteen minutes of half time analysis.

During the game the Match Director is responsible for selecting camera angles and co-ordinating action replays. After the final whistle the Producer and Programme Director respond to what has happened and guide everyone through the post-match part of the show. Throughout the game, live interactive coverage is created from a separate control room at Sky Sports headquarters.

Within hours of the final whistle Sky will begin focusing on their next match, starting with packing away the cameras and cables; on Saturday morning the scaffolding will be removed and Kenilworth Road will return to its normal state ready for next week's visit of Blackpool.



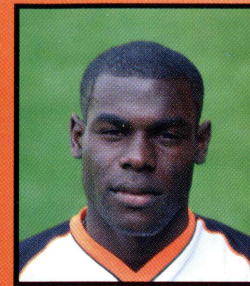
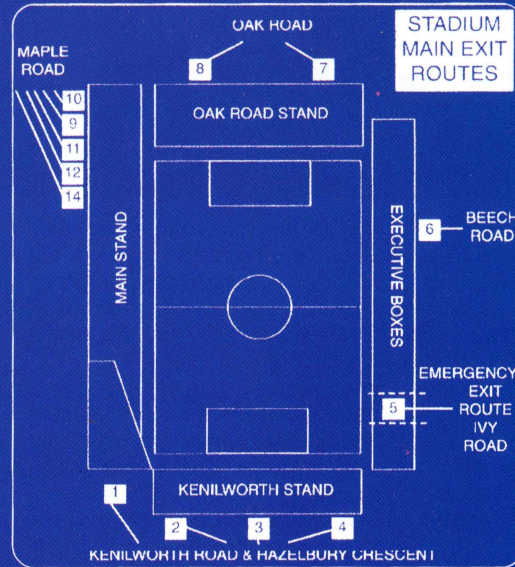

EVACUATION PROCEDURE

IN THE event of any emergency in the stadium, Luton Town FC and the emergency services have agreed on an evacuation procedure which is designed to ensure the safe and controlled evacuation of the crowd, and to ensure their safe dispersal from the area, to allow the emergency services to carry out their tasks.

In the event of evacuation from all or part of the stadium, you will receive instructions over the public address system on how you should leave. In an evacuation of the main stand you will be instructed to use the pitch. Stewards will direct you to the nearest exit. It may be that your normal exit route will not be available. On leaving the stadium, you will find some roads closed to pedestrians, to enable swift and unobstructed access for the emergency services. Please leave the area of the ground as quickly as possible, by the route directed. Your co-operation will be most appreciated.

WE SAW our lead at the top of League One cut to one point after Hull recorded an impressive 4-0 away win at Bournemouth.

Grant Smith put The Robins ahead for the first time on 80 minutes, and Parkin converted a last-minute penalty to complete his treble.

Blackpool and Doncaster shared the spoils following a 1-1 draw at Bloomfield Road, John Murphy responding to Tim Ryan's opener for the visitors.

The Milton Keynes Dons saw their recent solid form continue as they picked up a point at Barnsley, Michel Pensee-Bilong pouncing to cancel out Daniel Nardiello's opener.

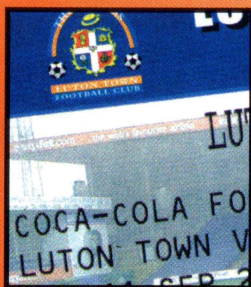

HOW TO GET TO TORQUAY UNITED



By Road: A trip to Torquay represents one of the longest journeys in the League One calendar for Luton supporters but with the match being played on Bank Holiday Monday, many may use the game to spend the weekend on the South Coast. Travelling to Plainmoore takes about four hours and it is advised that you head South West on the M5, or A303, which will join the M5. This then becomes the A38 and splits into two. Take the left hand split, A380 and head for Torquay. Stay on this road, across the first round-about, Penn Inn, carrying on along the A380 for Torquay. Expect queues along this stretch of road. Pass through Kingskerswell and carry straight on across a second round-about. The road then becomes dual carriageway. Stay in the left hand lane and at the third set of lights follow signs to the left for Torquay United FC.

By Rail: There are two stations in Torquay. These are Torre and Torquay. Torre is closer on foot but it is still quite a walk - about 30 minutes. Torquay Station is on the seafront and is further from the

ground but has a Taxi rank.

Parking: Parking is on the roads around the ground.

What's the ground like The ground is basic and small, but has steadily improved over the years. Differing from other clubs, the Directors Box is situated behind one goal, in the Westward Family Stand, rather than being to the side of the pitch. This is a neat, attractive, covered all seater stand.

The other end is a small covered terrace, built in 2000 to replace a former open terrace. It also boosted the atmosphere within the ground. Both sides are covered stands. At one side is the covered, seated Main Stand, with a small amount of terracing to the front. It runs for just over half the length of the pitch. The other side is a newish, small covered terrace, called the Carlsberg Popular Terrace.

Around The Ground: The Club has its own pub and restaurant called Boots and Laces. This is housed under the Family Stand at the end of the ground where the reception and club shop is. You can get food and drink in Boots and Laces and as away fans are more than welcome, there is no need to go anywhere else.

WHEN LUTON and Blackpool previously locked horns in a League One fixture back in August the seaside club were in a dour run of form, which already had supporters across the country tipping them for relegation.

However manager Colin Hendry has turned the fortunes of the Bloomfield Road club around and come to Kenilworth Road for our next home fixture in mid table looking increasingly likely that they have secured their League One status.

It took Blackpool eight games to record their first win of the season but since a victory over Port Vale, way back in September, Hendry and his team have continued to push themselves away from danger with a number of impressive performances.

In recent weeks, Blackpool have gone on to record important and impressive victories over Bournemouth, Walsall, Bradford and Colchester whilst they have also gone on to pick up precious points against Bristol City and Doncaster Rovers.

They recently upset the form-books by claiming a 2-0 victory over promotion hopefuls Brentford and look to be going from strength to strength after their disappointing start to the campaign.

Much of Blackpool's good success has come from the goals of Scott Taylor who has scored

14 from 28 games whilst Keigan Parker is three behind that tally.

Like the Hatters, Blackpool have been scoring freely with 13 goals in their past six games and have been getting goals from around the pitch with John Murphy, Peter Clark and Richard Wellens all pitching in with important strikes.

The record books suggest that when the two teams meet at Kenilworth Road in a week's time that it could be a high scoring affair.

An amazing 32 goals have been scored in the previous seven games between the two clubs, which included a seven-goal thriller back in 2002 when Blackpool scored five as Peter Clarke and Scott Taylor both bagged a brace.

The Seaside club don't have a particularly impressive record over the Hatters with Luton winning the last three games and only losing to Blackpool twice in the last ten fixtures.

The most recent fixture at Kenilworth Road saw Luton claim all three points in a five-goal thriller thanks to strikes from Emmerson Boyce, Peter Holmes and Enoch Showunmi. Former Luton loan striker Matthew Blinkhorn, who is still at Bloomfield Road, netted one of the goals for the visitors that afternoon.
