GOOD AFTERNOON and welcome to our supporters and our visitors, Blackpool, their Chairman, Directors, Management, players and supporters to Kenilworth Road.

One of the excitements, and arguably the frustrations, of football is its unpredictability. Following the important point gained at Oldham, everyone was looking forward to getting back on track on Easter Friday with Sky's live coverage of our game against Barnsley. With expectations so high, it was not a good day at the office; that's not taking anything away from Barnsley. Hull City's late equaliser on Saturday meant they temporarily climbed above us on goals scored, albeit for only 48 hours, which added to the disappointment of the result.

The players' response to that result was wiped out by our visit to Torquay United on Easter Monday, when our 4-1 win put the club back to the top of League One. Our eleven hundred and nineteen travelling supporters played their part, as did the other results. Another couple of near misses could so easily have taken the score higher.

With the Directors Box located behind the goal it was like turning the clock back to an area of the ground I loved to watch my football, with the added bonus of seeing Marlon at close hand repeat his penalty-saving form by depriving Torquay of a goal at such an impor-

tant time in the game.

I would take this opportunity of welcoming our new signing Warren Feeney to Luton following his return from International selection with Northern Ireland. I have received so many letters, and email messages offering congratulations to the Manager's signing of Warren on the last day of the transfer window. It is much appreciated and we thank you for your kind letters of support.

Michael Newell looked at him when it was muted he was moving from Bournemouth, but unfortunately he had signed a pre-contract which committed him to Stockport County so we couldn't do anything at that time.

As I have stated publicly I was pleased that my discussions with a small number of executive members was fruitful. Without, their additional funding support it would have been difficult for us to complete his transfer of registration in time to meet the transfer deadline. We appreciate their involvement at this important run-in to the end of the season.

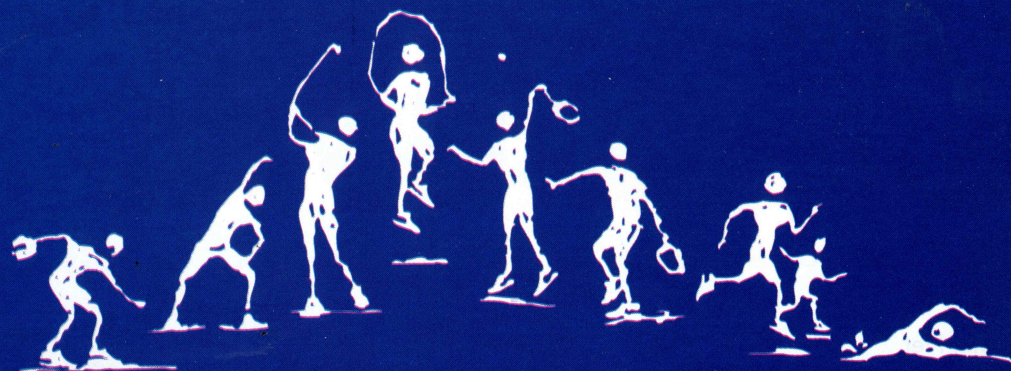

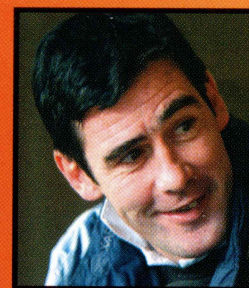

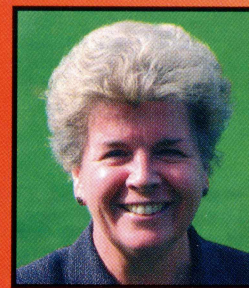

GOOD AFTERNOON and a warm welcome to everyone.

I have always thought of working in football as being on a roller coaster ride, with its highs and lows and that has certainly been true of the past week.

Deadline day on Thursday 24th March saw the excellent signing of Warren Feeney. This is the first player I have signed with a contact over the telephone and fax, due to Warren being with the Northern Ireland squad training at Mottram Hall Hotel in Cheshire, so between training sessions his agent was busy getting our paperwork signed and faxed back to us here at the club, for onward transmission to the Football Authorities in time for the 5.00 p.m. deadline. Some supporters have enquired why we had a 5.00 p.m. deadline and not a 12 noon as some other clubs. This was because Warren was not available for selection for us over the Easter period, due to his international call up, and the 12-noon deadline only applied to those Clubs who wanted to play players during Easter. With Warren playing for Northern Ireland last Wednesday evening, it must be the quickest time I have entered a name on our International Honour Boards.

The anticipation for Good Friday's match with Barnsley being live on Sky TV was immense, with all of us disappointed at the result, which also meant that we were for a short period of time, no longer top of the league. All our spirits were quickly raised (back on that roller coaster!) on Monday with the teams superb performance at Torquay and we were again on a high.

Last Tuesday very quickly brought those of us here at the Club back down to earth, when during our reserve match with Stevenage, the father of Stevenage's goalkeeper Jamie Waite was taken seriously ill in the main stand. Our thanks must go to our own medical staff who immediately attended Mr Waite, who was transferred to the Luton and Dunstable Hospital. Despite everyone's efforts, I regret to

inform supporters that Mr Waite sadly passed away at the hospital and we send sincere condolences to Jamie and his Mother at this sad time.

The match was naturally abandoned and all parties have agreed that the result should stand. The events of Tuesday brought home how precious our family is to each one of us, and how fragile life can be.

The Barnsley match saw us reported to The Football Association that a supporter had thrown a bottle onto the pitch, hitting an official. We must emphasise how dangerous this is and any one found throwing any object will be subject to a banning order. Whatever your frustrations at times, please remember the safety of all in the ground.

At the time of writing we still have no news of the tickets for our match with Doncaster, despite several telephone calls to my opposite number at Doncaster. As soon as there is any news we will advise everyone.

We also have a special date this month when the Club will celebrate its 120th birthday on 11th April, the nearest home game being on 16th April when we play MK Dons, it would be nice to celebrate this as a "Hatters Day" and everyone is invited to wear a hat to mark the occasion – there will be prizes for the best hats. So get your boater out and celebrate with us!

FEENEY SWITCHES HATTERS

On transfer deadline day Luton signed striker Warren Feeney from Stockport County in a £150,000 deal. The former Bournemouth player agreed a deal at Kenilworth Road that will tie him to the Club for the next two-and-a-half years and earlier this week joined up with the squad after being away with Northern Ireland for World Cup qualifiers against England and Poland.

The Belfast-born forward started his career as a trainee at Leeds United before making the move to Bournemouth where he averaged a goal every three games in just under one hundred appearances and that led to a £45,000 summer switch to Stockport in July 2004 and despite the club struggling at the foot of Coca-Cola League One, the striker has already netted 17 goals this season.

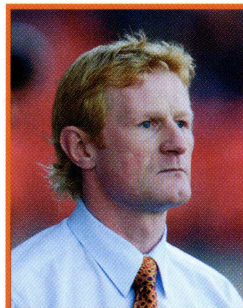

MANAGER

COLIN HENDRY



Blackpool marks Colin Hendry's first foray into the world of football management, which follows a long and distinguished career that saw him play almost 700 games, and winning over 50 Scottish caps.

He eventually retired as a player in 2003 after a brief spell as a player at Bloomfield Road, and he replaced former Liverpool midfielder Steve McMahon in the Tangerines' hot seat.

Colin has a wealth of experience, and is assisted by former Notts County manager Billy Dearden, and former Wolves and Blackburn coach Ian Miller.

Colin never took defeat lying down as a player and taking that mentality with him through to his managerial career. His playing career, which took in Blackburn, Rangers, Manchester City and Bolton, will stand him in good stead.

Hendry got off to a disappointing start as Blackpool boss, failing to win any of his opening ten games. However, the former Scottish international has turned the fortunes of the club around and have steadily moved themselves away from relegation danger.

GOALKEEPERS

LEE JONES



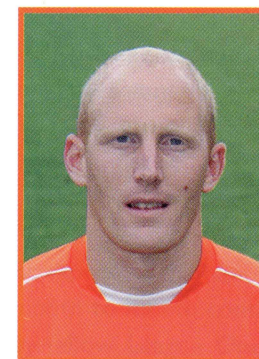
Born in Pontypridd, Lee is 6ft 3ins, and has an ideal temperament and agility for a keeper. Jones suddenly found himself out of favour at Stockport after falling out with boss Carlton Palmer, and quickly headed to Bloomfield Road. A number of

injuries kept him out of much of the 2003/4 season, and at the start of this season Jones was hit by another groin injury ultimately the big Welshman underwent a hernia operation, but he is now fit again and has since turned in a number of man of the match performances.

LEWIS EDGE

A young goalkeeper who has progressed through the youth ranks and made his first senior debut in the club's FA Cup defeat to Leicester City this season.

ROB EDWARDS



Rob became Colin Hendry's second signing of this summer when he joined Blackpool from Preston North end, where he was one of their most influential players in their 1999/2000 championship season. In the last couple of games Edwards has been outstanding alongside Clarke in the heart of the Pool defence.

GARETH EVANS

Gareth Evans came through the ranks at Leeds United only to be frustrated by the lack of first team chances. He made his way across the Pennines via Huddersfield Town, but the steady left back looks to have finally settled by the sea-side.

LEAM RICHARDSON

Former boss Steve McMahon signed Leeds-born Leam on loan at the end of 2002, with his stay first being extended before the move was made permanent in summer 2003. Despite missing large parts of last season due to injury, Leam has had his contract extended until 2005. His former clubs include Blackburn and Bolton.

MARK MCGREGOR

A surprise inclusion for Blackpool's tour of Northern Ireland this summer, Mark impressed sufficiently to earn a one-year deal from Colin Hendry and has also been appointed club captain. He began in Wrexham's youth side, moving on to Burnley after six years.

DEFENDERS

DANNY COID



A versatile young defender, Danny turned professional in the summer of 2000. His versatility kept him in the side on a number of occasions, and as well as defence. Although still young, he has made almost 200

appearances, and uses his pace to good effect from either the right or left back positions.



BLACKPOOL

MIDFIELDERS

STUART ANDERSON

Scottish Under 19 international Stuart Anderson joined the club from Southampton in mid December; calm and composed on the ball the 18-year-old has a bright future in the game.

MARTIN BULLOCK



The tricky winger joined the Seasiders from Barnsley in August 2001 and since then he has become a fans favourite at Bloomfield Road. With bags of pace and endless energy, Bullock on his day can terrorise defences single handedly, and is one to watch this afternoon.

JAMIE BURNS

Jamie is another graduate of the Seasiders youth scheme, and signed his first professional contract at the end of the 2002/3 season on the back of impressive youth and reserve team performances. A left-sided player, he has also played at fullback.

CIARAN DONNOLLY

The England Youth International joined the Seasiders two weeks ago from Premiership out-

fit Blackburn Rovers. An energetic midfielder he adds strength and depth to the Pool midfield.

PAUL EDWARDS

Signed during the summer, he arrived at Bloomfield Road on the back of an impressive performance against the Seasiders for Wrexham in the previous season. A skilful left-sided player, he has already picked up a number of man of the match awards for his gritty performances

SIMON GRAYSON



Much travelled Simon names Leeds, Leicester, Aston Villa, Blackburn, Sheffield Wednesday, Stockport, Notts County and Bradford as his previous clubs. He became Steve McMahon's first signing ahead of the

2002/3 season. He is a tenacious and enthusiastic player and will be a valuable member of the Pool squad. "Larry" was appointed caretaker manager for the final match of last season and has this season taken up the role of Reserve Team Coach.

KEITH SOUTHERN

Keith initially joined on loan from Everton,

which was firstly extended until November 2002, when he was offered a two and a half year deal. A tough-tackling player, Keith adds the necessary steel to the Seasiders' engine room.

STRIKERS

ZARKO GRABOVAC

Born in Serbia "Zorro" has played most of his football in the lower leagues in Holland. Measuring in at 6' 3" the striker impressed Pool manager Colin Hendry enough during a two week trial to be offered a contract until the end of the season, Grabovac's refreshing attitude towards the club has seen him become a favourite amongst the Pool faithful.

KEIGAN PARKER

Born in Livingston, Keigan was called up to the Scottish under-16 and under-18 teams after signing a professional contract with St Johnstone. Once compared in the Scottish press to Ally McCoist, he unfortunately suffered a bad injury at a crucial stage of his career, which halted his progress. Keigan was Colin Hendry's first signing this summer, and his pace and movement will add an extra dimension to Pool's attack.

JOHN MURPHY



A big strong centre forward who leads the forward line well, John was brought to Blackpool by ex-boss Nigel Worthington prior to the 1999/2000 season. He became top scorer in the 99/00 season, and was just beaten by Brett Ormerod in 2000/01. His partnership with Ormerod made him stop scorer the fol-

lowing season. He almost joined Stockport in 2002 before agreeing a new deal with Blackpool. He is a typical, old-fashioned centre forward, and is powerfully built and good in the air, Luton fans may remember the big striker from the game at Kenilworth Road in February 2003 when the big man plundered a hat trick.

MATT SHAW

Blackpool born Shaw has been at the club on a month to month contract having been released by fellow League One club Wrexham. The tall striker who began his career with Sheffield Wednesday has already netted several times in the reserve team.

MATTHEW BLINKHORN

Twenty-year-old Blinkhorn started this season with the Hatters on a three-month loan deal having previously started seven matches for the Tangerines since he made his debut as a substitute against Wrexham in October 2001, when he was called into the side because of an injury crisis. He was part of the Blackpool squad that won the LDV Vans Trophy last season, coming on against Southend for the final quarter-of-an-hour. A graduate of the youth system at Bloomfield Road he appeared regularly for his home-town club at reserve and Under-19's level and was rewarded with a three-year contract at the end of his scholarship. He returned to Blackpool at the end of his loan spell in November 2004 but a month later a dislocated shoulder brought a premature end to his season.

TEAM NEWS

John Murphy missed the Seasiders' Easter Monday draw with Hartlepool with flu, in his place, Matt Shaw made his full debut. That was the only change to the starting line-up from the team that had beaten Brentford in their last home match, although Steve Boyack took the vacant space on the substitutes bench.

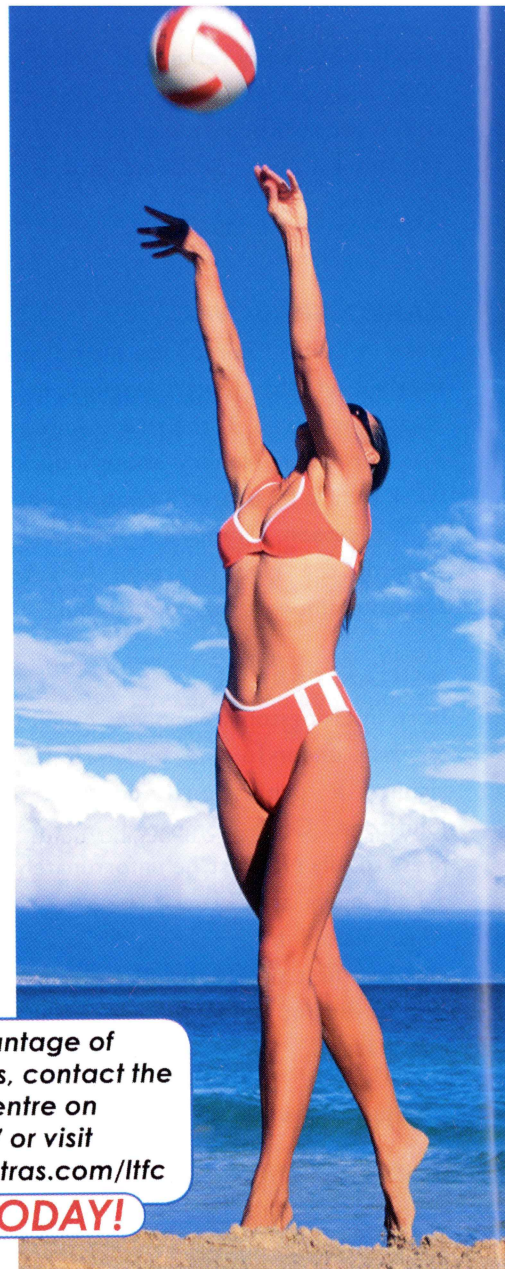

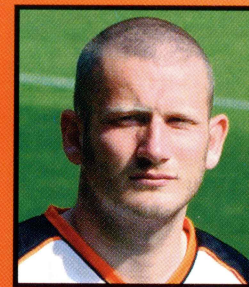

OBVIOUSLY the Barnsley result was a big disappointment in our last home match, we didn't do ourselves justice in front of the cameras,

We conceded three scrappy goals and the only plusses for us to take from the game was the good goal we scored and the great penalty save from Bez. It was one of those bad days at the office, we didn't particularly play well but fortunately there have not been many like that this season. He returned from international duty earlier in the week and with Chris Coyne back from suspension, and hopefully Robbo fit again, there is increasing competition for a place in the squad.

Please continue to get behind the lads, as you have done this season because it does make a difference.

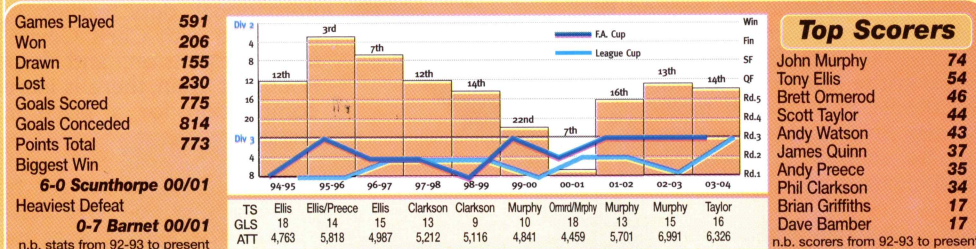

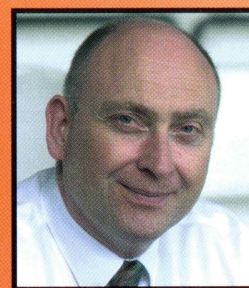
Blackpool's Last 10 Years

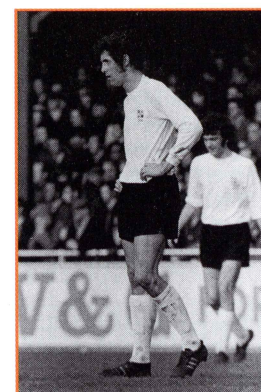

HATTERS HISTORY

AFTER four seasons of non-stop excitement the Town's hopes of a third promotion over this period ended with three poor displays over Easter 1971, but it had been good while it lasted.

The 1971/72 campaign was always going to be an anti-climax and so it proved. With ace marksman Malcolm Macdonald now banging in the goals for Newcastle following his record £180,000 move, the striker's role had been taken over by Don Givens and new signing Vic Halom but although both were good players in their own right neither had the explosive power of Supermac.

With goals hard to come by, extra pressure was placed on the defence with the result that too many games were ending 0-0 or in a narrow defeat. After a win over Fulham in late September the Town went on a run of eight games without a further victory leading up to the first visit to Blackpool since 1959/60.

Considering that the Hatters had lost at Watford in a dismal game the previous week and had slumped to just above the drop zone, a full trainload of supporters, taking advantage of the special £1.25 fare, set out from Luton along with the players and directors.

With snow starting to fall, the train ground to a halt at Warrington due to a derailment and there

we sat. The Town officials were told of the potential problem at Crewe and coach Jimmy Andrews telephoned through the team to centre-half Chris Nicholl who was already at the ground having stayed with relatives in the north-west. No mobile phones in those days!

With a potential fine now avoided the team still had to get to Bloomfield Road in time and the train finally arrived with barely twenty minutes to go before kick-off. The players were already changed and a coach with a police escort whisked them off to the ground scattering a carnival procession along the way.

We supporters had to walk and I got in just as the game kicked off in a blizzard. Blackpool had not set the division on fire since relegation from the top flight the previous summer but still had some household names in their side with Tommy Hutchinson and Micky Burns both going close in the opening minutes.

It was the Hatters, though, who opened the scoring after 35 minutes when Givens hit a shot from the edge of the area following a goalmouth scramble. The ball eluded everyone before ending up in the back of the net.

It was now backs to the wall as the Town defence battled against the elements and the Blackpool forward line but, although Fred Kemp hit a post towards the end, we managed to hold out and even had the luxury of seeing our own Viv Busby fire against the bar in the closing stages.

To cap the 'Train ride from Hell' the heating system broke down on the way home and I can assure you it was very cold!

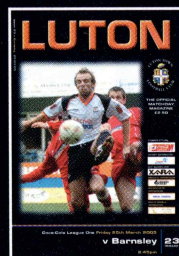

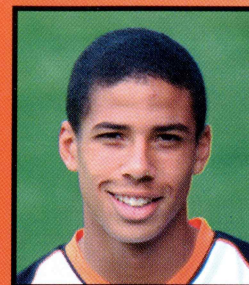

A: We go into every game wanting to win and we don't just want promotion, we also want the championship

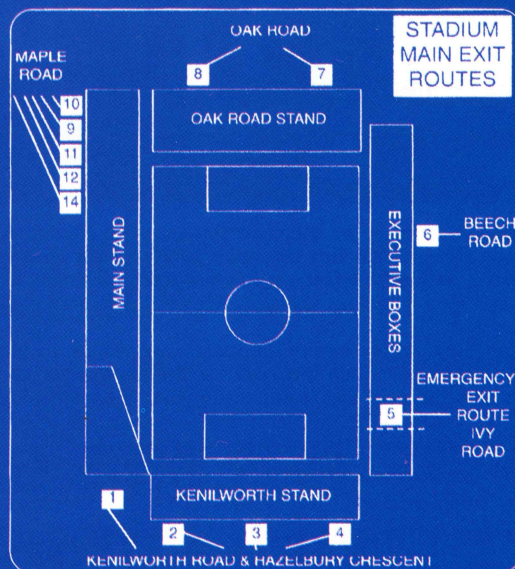

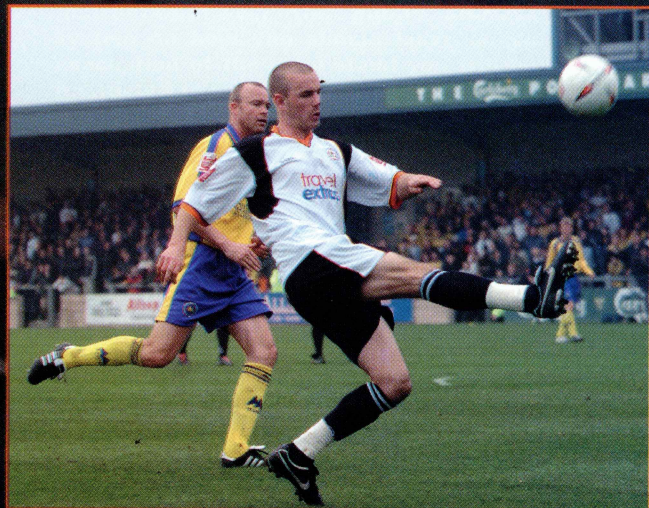

LUTON TOWN BELLES

BELLES returned to the top of the table following their 2-1 Easter Sunday win at Bracknell Town.

Luton were almost ahead within the first minute when Fay Howell's lob was turned just wide by the Bracknell keeper. The home side then had the better of the first quarter and took the lead in the 19th minute when a defensive error was punished with a low shot into the corner of the net. Michelle Byrne went close to pulling the Town level when she raced past the keeper to fire her shot narrowly wide. Kaylee Owen was also unlucky not to equalize with a chip, which missed the crossbar by inches, but Luton trailed 1-0 at the interval.

Belles came out for the second half showing a renewed determination to get back on terms and forced Bracknell to defend desperately to hold onto their lead. In spite of playing some good passing football the breakthrough would not come until Luton were awarded a free kick 25 yards out after 67 minutes. Aimee Barrable then set her sights before rifling her shot into the far top corner for her first goal of the season.

Town then piled on the pressure and won a succession of corners and when one was only half cleared the ball was returned into the area and found Janine Daly at the far post whose shot rebounded back off the foot of the post. Rebecca Kane then almost converted another cross at the near post before a long range free kick from Fay

Howell struck the inside of the post before hitting the keeper full in the face and bouncing clear for a corner.

Two more corners followed and from the third Barrable's inswinging corner bounced twice through a crowd of players before flying high into the far corner of the net. Bracknell had a couple of opportunities to level the scores late on but Belles were good value for their win and completed a league double over their fourth placed opponents.

Promotion for this young Belles squad is still a possibility and is in their own hands with four games to go although they will need to win all four to be certain and that must include another win over current champions, Reading Royals.

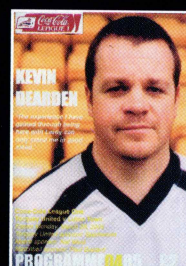

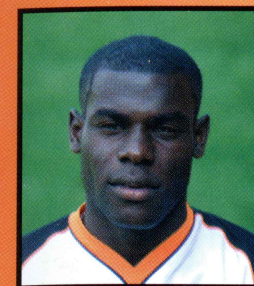

season, I can't really complain.

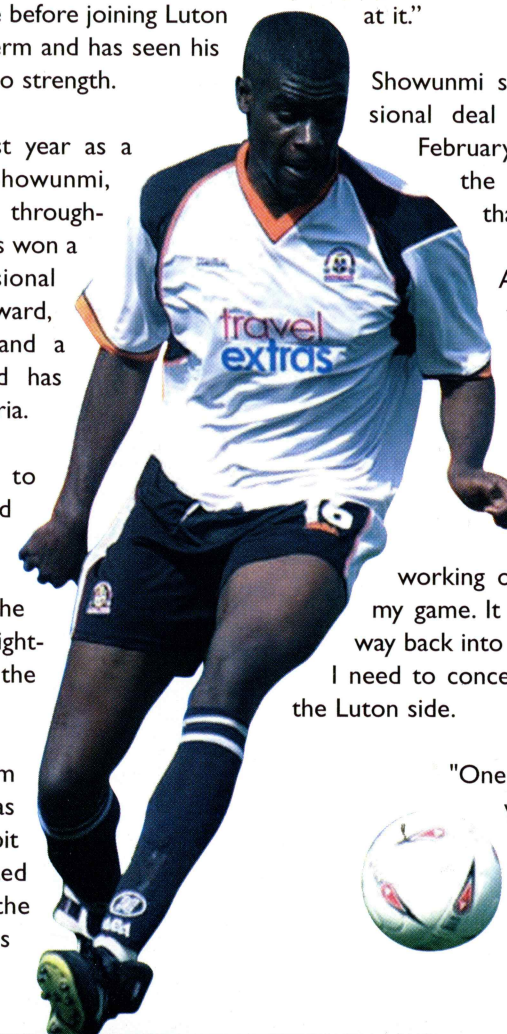

Showunmi signed his first ever professional deal at Luton at the end of February last year after playing for the club on expenses before that.

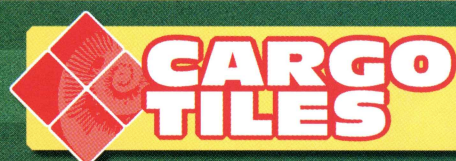
And on his progression, the tall Luton striker added: "I'm always being told that being 6ft 4 I should win my fair share of headers and I think I've done that more often this season.

Chris Killen's scrambled goal midway through the second half gave Oldham a vital 1-0 win over Hull to boost their chances of avoiding relegation. Doncaster Rovers are within three points of the play-off places after a fine 4-2 win at third place Tranmere Rovers. Dave Penney's side took a two-goal lead inside the first five minutes through Michael McIndoe and Gregg Blundell before Eugene Dadi pulled a goal back on eleven minutes for Rovers.

Dadi, however, then put his side at a disadvantage when he was sent off for throwing a deliberate elbow on Doncaster's John Doolan. Despite being a man short, Paul Hall pulled Tranmere level a minute before the break. Rovers, however, made the extra man count after the restart, as Ricky Ravenhill restored their lead on 52 minutes before Neil Roberts scored a fourth nine minutes from the end.

Hartlepool United were held to 2-2 draw by ten-man Blackpool at Bloomfield Road, with Keith Southern handing the Seasiders the lead from the penalty spot three minutes in. The home side, however, then went a man short when Mark McGregor was sent off on 26 minutes for two bookable offences. Adam Boyd then turned the match on its head with two goals in a minute just after

McGregor's sending off. But Colin Hendry's side earned a point when Peter Clarke made it 2-2 with eight minutes remaining.

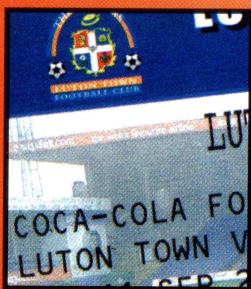
Milton Keynes Dons boosted their chances of League One survival with a 1-0 win at Bournemouth. The Cherries will rue that Garreth O'Connor's right foot penalty in the first half was brilliantly stopped by MK Dons goalkeeper Matthew Baker. That allowed Gareth Edds to strike the winner for Danny Wilson's side with 17 minutes left, as Bournemouth missed the chance to further secure their place in the play-offs.

Barnsley, however, took all the points with ten minutes left when on-loan Michael Chopra scored the winner for the South Yorkshire club.

Finally, a Marino Keith goal with a quarter of an hour remaining gave Colchester United a 1-0 win over Chesterfield at Layer Road.

HOW TO GET TO AFC BOURNEMOUTH



By Road: Leave Luton on the M1 south, then make a right turn on the M25 west. Just beyond Heathrow leave M25 to join the M3. Follow that to near Southampton where you join the M27 west. That road becomes the A31 and at Ashley Heath, 23.2 miles from the M3 turn-off, turn left onto the A338 towards Christchurch. After 7.7 miles, turn left on the A3049 towards Boscombe, and then immediately turn left at a roundabout and the ground is ahead of you.

By Rail: The nearest Station is Pokesdown. Take a left out of the station, go over the bridge and take another left. This road will take you into the park. Walk through the park in the direction you approached it from and you can't miss the ground. Some trains will not stop at Pokesdown and will go on to Bournemouth. Take a left out of Bournemouth Station and follow up to the main road. Take a left and go past a petrol station and Staples. Go straight over the roundabout and keep going along Holdenhurst Road for about a mile. You'll eventually reach a set of traffic lights next to the Queens Park Pub. Again go straight over, but turn right at the next roundabout and into Kings Park.

By Bus: National Express Coaches will stop at the travel Interchange opposite Bournemouth train station. Follow the directions as stated above from Bournemouth.

Parking: There is ample space in the council car park just beyond the ground in Kings Park. Be warned that it can take a while to get out after the game. Alternatively there is street parking around the local area, but restrictions are not the same everywhere.

Around The Ground: The away section is seated and fully covered and no seats offer restricted views. There are catering facilities within the stand offering a range of hot and cold snacks. There is also a bar under the stand.

By Coach with Town on Tour: Leaving Maple Road at 10:00am, with a pick up at Milton Keynes at approximately 10:30am. The fare for LTSC members is £15, £13 concessions and £17 for non-members. To book seats visit the supporters kiosk or phone 07960 567465. You can also book online by visiting the fans section of www.lutontown.co.uk.

COMING NEXT

MANY WILL say, that the visit of MK Dons to Kenilworth Road for our penultimate home game of the season represents the club's first local derby in Bedfordshire this campaign.

The history of the MK Dons has been well documented in the past but it's their achievements since a former Luton midfielder took over the reigns at the National Hockey Ground, which is getting the attentions of other clubs in League One.

Danny Wilson moved to Buckinghamshire in December 2004, taking over the reigns from Stuart Murdock, and took over a team who looked certain to be heading through the relegation trapdoor.

However Wilson, who played for the Hatters from 1987 to 1989, has turned around the fortunes of the club and has given them a realistic chance of maintaining their League One status with some impressive performances.

Their most recent victory away at Bournemouth has shown many that the MK Dons are moving the right direction and are currently on a ten game unbeaten streak, which has seen the move out of the relegation zone.

Narrow but equally important wins against Stockport and Huddersfield have also been achieved in that unbeaten run and although the club have had six draws as well, the MK Dons have

consistently been hard to beat.

At 6ft 7ins, goalkeeper Scott Bevan provides the biggest obstacle Luton will have faced this season; he is the tallest player in the Football League. The former Southampton stopper is a strong shot-stopper who commands his penalty area.

At the other end of the field the Dons offer plenty of attacking promise. Wade Small provides the threat from the flanks having graduated through the ranks at MK Dons, alongside current Hatters centre-half Curtis Davies who will be looking forward to renewing acquaintances.

The supply of the energetic attacking midfielder has benefited Izale McLeod on several occasions, the ex-Derby man has netted fifteen times for Wilson's side this season and he is beginning to develop an understanding with Clive Platt who joined in January from Peterborough United.

Luton will be hoping for a similar outcome to the one they enjoyed at the National Hockey Stadium back in November when a thumping effort from Rowan Vine set them on their way to a 4-1 win over their now near neighbours. Steve Howard was the other Hatter on target that day when he rattled in an impressive hat-trick to the delight of over three thousand happy Town fans.
